**Credentials**

**Postgame Interviews**

The Navy locker room is closed at all times, both at home and on the road. Postgame interviews at home games will be conducted in the interview room, across from the visitor's locker room in Alumni Hall, while interviews on the road will be conducted either outside of the Navy locker room or else in a designated media area at the arena.

The postgame interview session will begin 10 minutes following the conclusion of the game.

In addition, a limited number of direct internet jacks are available for use in Alumni Hall.

In addition to the regular season slate of games, all Navy postseason games will be carried live by the network.

All broadcasts begin 15 minutes prior to tip with the Navy Pregame Show featuring an interview with Navy head coach Tom Marryott. The Navy Postgame Show, beginning immediately following the conclusion of the game, includes interviews with Navy players and/or a member of the Navy coaching staff.

### Annapolis

The City of Annapolis has been home to the Naval Academy for all but four years since the founding of the school in 1845 on the grounds of what originally was the Army's Fort Severn. The Academy moved its location to Newport, R.I., from 1861-65 during the Civil War.

Originally just 10 acres, "The Yard" has grown to a size of 338 acres.

### Anchors Aweigh

"Anchors Aweigh" was written by Lt. Charles Zimmerman, musical director of the Naval Academy, in 1906, with the lyrics provided by Alfred H. Miles '06 as a fight song for the 1907 graduating class. The song made its debut at the 1906 Army-Navy game and when the Mids won, the song became traditional at the contest.

*Stand Navy down the field,  
Sails set to the sky,  
We'll never change our course,  
So Army you steer shy.  
Roll up the score, Navy,  
Anchors Aweigh,  
Sail Navy down the field,  
And sink the Army,  
sink the Army Grey*

### Brigade of Midshipmen

The 4,000-member student body at the Naval Academy is called the Brigade of Midshipmen.

The Brigade is organized into:

- ◆ 2 regiments
- ◆ 6 battalions
- ◆ 30 companies

### Bill the Goat

The first recorded use of a goat as the mascot for Navy teams was in 1893 when an animal named El Cid (the Chief) was presented to the Brigade by officers of the USS New York. El Cid helped Navy to a 6-4 win over Army that year and a goat became the permanent mascot of the Academy in 1904.

### Co-Ed

Women were first admitted to the Naval Academy during the 1976 summer, with the 1980 graduation ceremonies being the first to commission female officers. Today, women comprise roughly 15 percent of the student body.

Graduates of the Naval Academy entering the Marine Corps (commissioned as 2nd Lieutenants) have the following service options available to them ...

- ◆ Aviation -- air command and control, anti-air warfare, aviation maintenance, aviation supply, pilot, naval flight officer.
- ◆ Ground -- armor\*, artillery\*, communications (information systems), engineering, financial management, infantry\*, logistics, military police  
(\* — not available to women)

### Midshipman

The original 17th Century meaning of the word "midshipmen" designated those men who stood watch "amidships", or in the middle portion of a ship. The middle "s" was later dropped to give the current form of the word.

Midshipmen were originally young boys who were apprenticed to sea captains to learn the trade.

In the early days of the Navy, midshipmen were trained aboard ship until they were commissioned as ensigns.

### Nickname

The official nickname for all of Navy's athletic teams is Midshipmen.

"Mids" is an appropriate abbreviation, while "Middie" is inappropriate.

### N-Star

Members of varsity teams who qualify for the varsity letter receive an N-Star for their letter sweaters if they participate in a victory over Army in any sport-designated Star Game.

The varsity N and corresponding N-Star were initiated during the early 1890s.

**Air Force Preview**

The Falcons make the trip to Annapolis with a two-game winning streak and a 6-5 record on the year. Two of the team's losses have come to Oklahoma State (89-49) and Wisconsin (74-60), while Air Force has also recorded a victory over Army (68-60).

Air Force is both tallying and allowing roughly 65 points a game, while grabbing and giving up 39 boards a contest.

Alecia Steele leads the Falcons with averages of 16.0 points and 9.1 rebounds a game.

**Navy vs. Air Force Series Notes**

Saturday's game will mark the sixth meeting between the two service academies, with Navy holding a slim 3-2 advantage entering the game. The home team has won each of the four games contested in either Annapolis or Colorado Springs, with the Mids also tallying a neutral court victory.

The two teams were slated to face each other last year in Annapolis, but a snowstorm in Colorado forced the cancellation of the game.

**Family Affair**

Navy freshman guard Ashley Myers is the sister of Air Force sophomore guard Ashley Myers. The duo also has a sister, Alexys, who is a basketball manager at Army and a brother, Gary, who is enrolled at the Naval Academy Preparatory School and competed on the school's football team.

**Last Meeting – Air Force 72, Navy 62 (Dec. 30, 2004, Colorado Springs)**

After closing the first half on an 8-3 run to take a 30-27 lead at intermission, Air Force proceeded to open the second half on an 11-2 run to pull away from Navy in a 72-62 victory.

Navy shot just 27 percent from the field in the second half, while Air Force connected on 45 percent of its shots over the final 20 minutes. The Mids also turned the ball over 18 times in the game while forcing only 11 Air Force turnovers.

Navy's Carly Meyer led all players with 22 points.

**San Diego State 91, Navy 33**

A massive case of food poisoning slowed the Mids prior to and during its game against San Diego State Dec. 20 in San Diego.

Eight of the 12 players, three of the four coaches and two of the four additional staff members on the trip began suffering from the violent illness contracted during the team meal on Dec. 19 in the early morning hours on the day of the game.

Only five players — including just one player who has consistently started games this year — were able to participate in the team's shootaround on the 20th.

Navy's starting lineup included Ali Currier (two prior minutes played this year), Kristin Bowen (15 minutes) and Amanda Taylor (39 minutes).

With the game tied at 2-2, San Diego State scored the next 20 points on its way to taking a 45-14 lead at intermission.

San Diego State continued to employ a full-court press and trap while holding a 50-point lead (75-25) with 10 minutes left in the game. After calling off the pressure, the Aztecs still looked to run with ball on offense in an attempt to score on a fast break.

Following the conclusion of the game, two more players and one additional staff member came down with the illness, bringing the final tally of those infected to 16 out of the 20-member travel party.

"I want to say how proud I am of this team for the effort and heart they displayed tonight," said Navy head coach Tom Marryott after the game. "They could have easily layed down and given up at the start of the game or at any point during the game. Almost no one had slept or eaten all day. We had girls leave the bench during the game because they were sick. It means a lot to me to see how hard they competed. They played their hearts out throughout the 40 minutes, and everyone who played just wanted to do and play more. They did themselves, their teammates and the Naval Academy proud with their effort and determination."
