Media wishing to interview head coach Tom Marrayott or a member of the basketball team are asked to contact Justin Kischefsky at least one day prior to the requested interview date.

Coach Marrayott is available most days prior to practice, while interviews with players will be coordinated around their academic and athletic schedules.

No interviews will be scheduled on the day of a game.

Credentials

Media requesting credentials for a Navy home game are asked to contact Justin Kischefsky at least three days prior to the scheduled game. Requests for credentials to Navy road games must be made to the sports information office of the home team.

Postgame Interviews

The Navy locker room is closed at all times, both at home and on the road. Postgame interviews at home games will be conducted in the interview room, across from the visitor's locker room in Alumni Hall, while interviews on the road will be conducted either outside of the Navy locker room or else in a designated media area at the arena.

The postgame interview session will begin 10 minutes following the conclusion of the game.

Internet Access

Wireless internet is available to media in Alumni Hall for Navy home games. Please contact a member of the Navy sports information office for the password to access the wireless system.

In addition, a limited number of direct internet jacks are available for use in Alumni Hall.

Broadcast Information

Radio / Internet

A total of 11 Navy women's basketball regular season games will be carried on the radio by WNAV-AM 1430 and its corresponding web site www.wnav.com(.)

In addition to the regular season slate of games, all Navy postseason games will be carried live by the network.

All broadcasts begin 15 minutes prior to tip with the Navy Pregame Show featuring an interview with Navy head coach Tom Marrayott. The Navy Postgame Show, beginning immediately following the conclusion of the game, includes interviews with Navy players and/or a member of the Navy coaching staff.

National Television

Navy will appear on national television once this year as ESPNU plans on airing the Jan. 27 game against Army in Alumni Hall.

All-Access Features

Live streaming audio and video of the majority of Navy games this season is available to subscribers to Navy All-Access, found on www.navysports.com(.) This is in addition to the current features already available year round as part of the All-Access package which highlights many of the other 30 teams at Navy. Tom Marryott's 20 Years with Navy Basketball

- ◆ Was named as the fifth head coach of the Navy women's basketball program on May 22, 2003.
- ◆ Overall, is in his 10th year of coaching at the Naval Academy, as well as his 20th year of being associated with the Naval Academy.

Head Coach, Navy Women's Basketball, 2004-pres.

2003-04 Season

- ◆ During his initial season coaching both the team and on the women's collegiate level, led Navy to 13 overall victories and a 6-8 record in Patriot League games.
- ◆ Among the victories was the program's first over Holy Cross in Worcester, Mass.
- ◆ Navy competed at the prestigious Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii, where the Mids faced nationally-ranked Texas and Arizona, as well as Syracuse.
- ◆ Courtney Davidson was named First-Team All-Patriot League and garnered CoSIDA Academic All-America accolades for the second-straight season.

2004-05 Season

- ◆ Navy entered the season with only three players who had totaled over 100 points in their respective careers.
- ◆ The Mids ended the year with a 6-8 record in league play and won the program's first postseason game in six seasons.
- ◆ Nikki Curtis received Second-Team All-Patriot League honors.

2005-06 Season

- ◆ Navy posted a 7-7 record and a fourth-place finish in the Patriot League. The .500 record and the league placing were the best for the Mids in seven years.

Annapolis

The City of Annapolis has been home to the Naval Academy for all but four years since the founding of the school in 1845 on the grounds of what originally was the Army's Fort Severn. The Academy moved its location to Newport, R.I., from 1861-65 during the Civil War.

Originally just 10 acres, "The Yard" has grown to a size of 338 acres.

Anchors Aweigh

"Anchors Aweigh" was written by Lt. Charles Zimmerman, musical director of the Naval Academy, in 1906, with the lyrics provided by Alfred H. Miles '06 as a fight song for the 1907 graduating class. The song made its debut at the 1906 Army-Navy game and when the Mids won, the song became traditional at the contest.

*Stand Navy down the field,
Sails set to the sky,
We'll never change our course,
So Army you steer shy.
Roll up the score, Navy,
Anchors Aweigh,
Sail Navy down the field,
And sink the Army,
sink the Army Grey*

Brigade of Midshipmen

The 4,000-member student body at the Naval Academy is called the Brigade of Midshipmen.

The Brigade is organized into:

- ◆ 2 regiments
- ◆ 6 battalions
- ◆ 30 companies

Bill the Goat

The first recorded use of a goat as the mascot for Navy teams was in 1893 when an animal named El Cid (the Chief) was presented to the Brigade by officers of the USS New York. El Cid helped Navy to a 6-4 win over Army that year and a goat became the permanent mascot of the Academy in 1904.

Co-Ed

Women were first admitted to the Naval Academy during the 1976 summer, with the 1980 graduation ceremonies being the first to commission female officers. Today, women comprise roughly 15 percent of the student body.

Graduates of the Naval Academy entering the Marine Corps (commissioned as 2nd Lieutenants) have the following service options available to them ...

- ◆ Aviation -- air command and control, anti-air warfare, aviation maintenance, aviation supply, pilot, naval flight officer.
- ◆ Ground -- armor*, artillery*, communications (information systems), engineering, financial management, infantry*, logistics, military police
(* — not available to women)

Midshipman

The original 17th Century meaning of the word "midshipmen" designated those men who stood watch "amidships", or in the middle portion of a ship. The middle "s" was later dropped to give the current form of the word.

Midshipmen were originally young boys who were apprenticed to sea captains to learn the trade.

In the early days of the Navy, midshipmen were trained aboard ship until they were commissioned as ensigns.

Nickname

The official nickname for all of Navy's athletic teams is Midshipmen.

"Mids" is an appropriate abbreviation, while "Middie" is inappropriate.

N-Star

Members of varsity teams who qualify for the varsity letter receive an N-Star for their letter sweaters if they participate in a victory over Army in any sport-designated Star Game.

The varsity N and corresponding N-Star were initiated during the early 1890s.

Bucknell Preview

Bucknell, last year's Patriot League regular season champion and the pre-season favorite to win the league this year, has posted a 5-9 record this season. Half of the Bison's 14 games have been decided by single digits, with the team compiling a 3-4 record in such games. Additionally, Bucknell is just 1-7 in games played away from home.

The Bison as a team are averaging 60.5 points and 36.2 rebounds a game, but are allowing foes to score 66.4 points and haul in 43.9 rebounds a contest. Bucknell is shooting 38.2 percent from the field and 30.5 percent from behind the three-point line, near identical numbers to that its defense is allowing opponents to shoot.

Though the Bison have a sizeable advantage over their foes in free throw percentage (71.0%-66.2%), Bucknell is averaging five fewer free throw attempts a game than its opponents are attempting (20.1-15.0).

Individually for Bucknell, Amanda Brown, Keshia Champion and Hope Foster all lead the Bison in both scoring and rebounding. Brown ranks first in scoring with an average of 13.1 points per game, with Foster's average of 6.9 rebounds a game leading the team. Champion ranks second in both categories (10.6 ppg, 4.9 rpg) and has swiped a team-best 23 steals this year. Foster, meanwhile, is tied with Navy's Cassie Consedine for the most blocked shots in the league this season with 36.

Navy vs. Bucknell Series Notes

Bucknell holds a 23-15 advantage in the all-time series with Navy, which dates back to the 1981-82 season, and has a 20-12 lead in Patriot League regular season games.

The Bison have won 18 of the last 20 games played between the two teams, a stretch that includes Bucknell wins in three league tournament games.

Bucknell also holds a 9-8 lead in games played in Annapolis, including a 9-7 advantage in games played in Alumni Hall.

Last Meeting – Bucknell 76, Navy 66 (Feb. 3, 2007, Annapolis, Md.)

Margaret Knap scored a career-high 27 points for Navy, but it was not enough to overcome 26 turnovers by the Mids in a 76-66 loss to Bucknell, Saturday afternoon in Alumni Hall.

Navy held a 25-24 lead midway through the first half, but Bucknell went on a 13-2 run to take a 37-27 lead, then went into halftime holding a 43-35 advantage.

Navy was able to climb to within four points of the Bison at 47-43, but Bucknell slowly extended their advantage back to double figures and led by at least nine points over the remaining 10 minutes of play.

The Mids shot a healthy 45.6 percent from the field and made one more field goal than Bucknell did, but the Bison made seven three-point field goals to Navy's three and converted 19-of-24 attempts from the foul line compared to 11-of-13 shooting from the stripe for the Mids.

Navy's 26 turnovers, which tied a season high, led to 25 points for the Bison. In contrast, Navy tallied 12 points off of 16 Bucknell turnovers.

Knap scored 19 of her 27 points in the first half to top her previous scoring best of 22. Carly Meyer and Lindi Conner both finished the game with double-doubles, with Meyer totaling 12 points and 10 boards and Conner tallying 10 points and 10 caroms.

Common Foes

Both the Mids (71-50) and the Bison (89-79) have defeated Howard this season.

For Starters

Saturday's game will mark the beginning of Navy's 17th season as a member of the Patriot League. The Mids will open their league season against the Bison for the ninth time.

The top scoring players off of the Navy bench this season have been K.C. Gordon and Morgan Hill. Gordon is averaging 10.1 points a game when enters contests off of the Navy bench (132 points in 13 games), while Hill is scoring 8.3 points a game when she plays in a reserve role (75 points in 9 games).

Gordon's numbers include the zero points she scored when she could only play four minutes against San Diego State due to having food poisoning.

San Diego State 91, Navy 33

A massive case of food poisoning slowed the Mids prior to and during its game against San Diego State Dec. 20 in San Diego.

Eight of the 12 players, three of the four coaches and two of the four additional staff members on the trip began suffering from the violent illness contracted during the team meal on Dec. 19 in the early morning hours on the day of the game.

Following the conclusion of the game, three more players and one additional staff member came down with the illness, bringing the final tally of those infected to 17 out of the 20-member travel party.

Only five players — including just one player who has consistently started games this year — were able to participate in the team's shootaround on the 20th.

Navy's starting lineup included Ali Currier (two prior minutes played this year), Kristin Bowen (15 minutes) and Amanda Taylor (39 minutes).

With the game tied at 2-2, San Diego State scored the next 20 points on its way to taking a 45-14 lead at intermission.

San Diego State continued to employ a full-court press and trap while holding a 50-point lead (75-25) with 10 minutes left in the game. After calling off the pressure, the Aztecs still looked to run with ball on offense in an attempt to score on a fast break.

"I want to say how proud I am of this team for the effort and heart they displayed tonight," said Navy head coach Tom Marryott after the game. "They could have easily layed down and given up at the start of the game or at any point during the game. Almost no one had slept or eaten all day. We had players leave the bench during the game because they were sick. It means a lot to me to see how hard they competed. They played their hearts out throughout the 40 minutes, and everyone who played just wanted to do and play more. They did themselves, their teammates and the Naval Academy proud with their effort and determination."

Defensive Numbers

Despite its 4-11 record, the Navy defense has played well this season. The Mids are allowing opponents to connect on 39.8 percent of their field goal attempts and 30.7 percent of their three-point attempts. Those numbers are comparable to what the Navy offense is posting this season.

Morgan Hill entered Navy's Nov. 14 game against Howard having scored 39 career points (21 points during the entire 2006-07 season and 18 points during Navy's initial three games this season). Hill promptly scored a combined 31 points in Navy's games against the Lady Bison and the Broncs. She converted 7-of-9 shots from the field in scoring a career-high 16 points against Howard, then sank 6-of-12 field goal attempts on her way to scoring 15 points against the Broncs.
