Interviews

Media wishing to interview head coach Tom Marryott or a member of the basketball team are asked to contact Justin Kischefsky at least one day prior to the requested interview date.

Coach Marryott is available most days prior to practice, while interviews with players will be coordinated around their academic and athletic schedules.

No interviews will be scheduled on the day of a game.

Credentials

Media requesting credentials for a Navy home game are asked to contact Justin Kischefsky at least three days prior to the scheduled game. Requests for credentials to Navy road games must be made to the sports information office of the home team.

Postgame Interviews

The Navy locker room is closed at all times, both at home and on the road. Postgame interviews at home games will be conducted in the interview room, across from the visitor's locker room in Alumni Hall, while interviews on the road will be conducted either outside of the Navy locker room or else in a designated media area at the arena.

The postgame interview session will begin 10 minutes following the conclusion of the game.

Naval Academy at the Head of the Class for Graduation Rates

For the second year in a row, the United States Naval Academy is at the head of the class for graduating NCAA student-athletes on the Division IA level. Navy graduated 100 percent of its student-athletes in 16 of the 19 sports reported on and no sport graduated lower than 97 percent.

“Our student-athletes continually strive to set the standard on the playing fields, in the classroom and in Bancroft Hall,” said Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk. “The support and encouragement they receive through the Commandant and his staff and the academic dean’s office is extraordinary and provides tremendous motivation to be successful across the board. We are all proud to be leaders on the field, but even more so when we can prove to be leaders in the classroom as well. It clearly defines the true meaning of student-athlete.”

Annapolis

The City of Annapolis has been home to the Naval Academy for all but four years since the founding of the school in 1845 on the grounds of what originally was the Army's Fort Severn. The Academy moved its location to Newport, R.I., from 1861-1865 during the Civil War.

Originally just 10 acres, “The Yard” has grown to a size of 338 acres.

Anchors Aweigh

“Anchors Aweigh” was written by Lt. Charles Zimmerman, musical director of the Naval Academy, in 1906, with the lyrics provided by Alfred H. Miles '06 as a fight song for the 1907 graduating class. The song made its debut at the 1906 Army-Navy game and when the Mids won, the song became traditional at the contest.

*Stand Navy down the field,
Sails set to the sky,
We'll never change our course,
So Army you steer shy.
Roll up the score, Navy,
Anchors Aweigh,
Sail Navy down the field,
And sink the Army,
sink the Army Grey*

Brigade of Midshipmen

The 4,000-member student body at the Naval Academy is called the Brigade of Midshipmen.

The Brigade is organized into:

- ◆ 2 regiments
- ◆ 6 battalions
- ◆ 30 companies

Bill the Goat

The first recorded use of a goat as the mascot for Navy teams was in 1893 when an animal named El Cid (the Chief) was presented to the Brigade by officers of the USS New York. El Cid helped Navy to a 6-4 win over Army that year and a goat became the permanent mascot of the Academy in 1904.

Co-Ed

Thirty years ago this year, during the 1976 summer, women were first admitted to the Naval Academy. Today, women comprise roughly 15 percent of the student body.

Marine Corps

Graduates of the Naval Academy entering the Marine Corps (commissioned as 2nd Lieutenants) have the following service options available to them ...

- ◆ Aviation -- air command and control, anti-air warfare, aviation maintenance, aviation supply, pilot, naval flight officer.
- ◆ Ground -- armor*, artillery*, communications (information systems), engineering, financial management, infantry*, logistics, military police
(* — not available to women)

Midshipman

The original 17th Century meaning of the word “midshipmen” designated those men who stood watch “amidships”, or in the middle portion of a ship. The middle “s” was later dropped to give the current form of the word.

Midshipmen were originally young boys who were apprenticed to sea captains to learn the trade.

In the early days of the Navy, midshipmen were trained aboard ship until they were commissioned as ensigns.

Navy

Graduates of the Naval Academy entering the Navy (commissioned as Ensigns) have the following service options available to them ...

- ◆ Aviation -- flight officer, pilot
- ◆ Nuclear Propulsion -- ships, submarines*
- ◆ Restricted Line and Staff Corps -- civil engineering, cryptology, intelligence, maintenance, medicine, meteorology/oceanography, supply
- ◆ Special Operations -- explosive ordinance disposal, explosive ordinance management, mine countermeasures, operational diving and salvage,
- ◆ Navy SEALs*
- ◆ Surface Warfare -- conventional, nuclear powered
- ◆ Submarines*
(* — not available to women)

Nickname

The official nickname for all of Navy’s athletic teams is Midshipmen.

“Mids” is an appropriate abbreviation, while “Middie” is inappropriate.

N-Star

Members of varsity teams who qualify for the varsity letter receive an N-Star for their letter sweaters if they participate in a victory over Army in any sport-designated Star Game.

The varsity N and corresponding N-Star were initiated during the early 1890s.

The road trip begins Monday night when the Midshipmen (3-6) play at North Carolina A&T (7 p.m.), and concludes Wednesday with a game at Charleston Southern (5 p.m.).

Neither Navy game will be aired on the radio, however live statistics from the latter game against the Lady Buccaneers can be found on www.csusports.com(.)

Navy Recap

The Mids closed out a stretch of five games in 12 days with a 51-34 loss to Georgetown (Dec. 4) and a 74-56 victory at UMBC (Dec. 6).

Navy's offense was never able to get on track against the Hoyas as the Mids shot just 20 percent from the field. The Navy defense played very well in the game, limiting Georgetown to just 16 first half points and to 34.5 percent shooting from the field in the game.

Kate Hobbs tallied half of Navy's 34 points and added six rebounds, while **Carly Meyer** shot just 3-of-20 from the field and missed all 10 of her three-point shots to struggle to just nine points in the game.

Two days later, the Mids matched their entire scoring output for the Georgetown game in the first half against the Retrievers on their way to recording the road victory. The Mids held a 34-33 advantage at intermission, but erupted for 40 second half points and limited UMBC to just 23 points after halftime to end a three-game losing skid.

Navy enjoyed one of its best all-around shooting nights of the season, connecting on 44.2 percent of its shots from the field, sinking eight three-point field goals and converting 20-of-23 attempts from the foul line.

Margaret Knap led the Navy offense with a career-high 22 points, while also tying a career-best effort with eight rebounds. Meyer bounced back from her subpar effort against the Hoyas by notching her first double-double of the season with 19 points and 10 caroms.

North Carolina A&T Preview

Utilizing a starting lineup all season of three freshmen and two sophomores, the Aggies enter a Saturday night home game against UNC Asheville with a 3-4 record on the year. One of their wins came over future Navy opponent Stetson (61-49), while two of the team's four losses have come to Georgia (117-63) and South Carolina (117-63).

The Aggies are being outscored on the year 74.9-62.3 points per game, with those numbers slightly askew due to the two large setbacks to the SEC teams. With removing the losses to Georgia and South Carolina, North Carolina A&T holds a 67.6-63.6 points-per-game scoring advantage over its remaining five opponents.

Even with those two large defeats, North Carolina A&T is averaging an almost equal number of rebounds as its opponents are (41.3-40.3 rpg) and is averaging 21.3 turnovers a game to 19.9 for its foes.

Amber Bland leads the Aggies in scoring at 16.1 points per game, one of three players on the squad to average in double figures, while Lamona Smalley has grabbed a team-high 7.3 rebounds per game.

Series Review

The Mids and the Aggies have met on two prior occasions, but Monday's game will be the first contest to be played outside of Annapolis. The first game between the programs took place in Dec. of 1998 when the Mids posted a 67-52 victory over NCA&T in the opening round of the 1998 Navy Classic, with the remaining contest taking place early in the 2005 season when Navy recorded an 80-69 victory over the Aggies.

Navy vs. North Carolina

The Mids have struggled on their previous trips to the state of North Carolina, posting just a 1-6 overall record in the state. The last time Navy journeyed to the state was in Dec. of 2000 for a game at Appalachian State.

Navy has compiled an 8-10 all-time record against teams from the state of North Carolina, however.

Conference Comparison

Navy has posted a 23-13 record against teams from the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, which includes a 77-67 victory over Howard earlier this year.

The Mids have compiled a 5-2 record against the MEAC under the direction of Tom Marryott.

In addition to the two losses to the Mids, the Aggies have faced a team from the Patriot League just one other time in its history, losing a game to Bucknell during the 1985-86 season.

Charleston Southern Preview

The Lady Buccaneers have posted a 2-5 record this year heading into a Saturday night game at Kennesaw State.

Despite outshooting its foes on the year, 43.4-41.4 percent, CSU is being outscored by 10 points a game (73.8-63.0 ppg). The Lady Buccaneers have struggled to get to the foul line this year, making 100 trips to the charity stripe while their foes have attempted 193 foul shots. CSU is being outrebounded by an average of seven boards a game this year (42.1-35.2 rpg) and is turning the ball over five more times than its opponents are (23.3-18.5 topg).

Keena Wicker leads the Lady Buccaneers in scoring (15.8 ppg) rebounding (7.9 rpg) and steals (2.3 spg).

Navy has posted a 3-0 all-time record against Charleston Southern and won the lone previous game played in Charleston in Dec. of 1994.

Kate Hobbs achieved a number of marks during Navy's 77-67 victory Nov. 18 over Howard.

✘ *Scored 21 points after halftime.* It marked the first time a Mid tallied 20 or more points in a half in nearly five years (Courtney Davidson, 22, at American, Jan. 29, 2002).

✘ *Made 11-of-11 free throw attempts.* It is only the 10th time in Navy history a player has been perfect from the free throw line when taking at least 10 attempts. In addition, it is the third-highest number of free throws attempted by a Mid who was perfect from the line (17-17, Colleen Cassidy vs. Lafayette, Feb. 16, 1980; 12-of-12, Erica Hayes vs. Army, Jan. 31, 1998)

✘ *Added 10 boards for a double-double, giving her back-to-back double-doubles for the second time in her career (13/11, Colgate, Feb. 26, 2006; 14/16, vs. Colgate, March 2, 2006).*

20 Point Halves

After not having a player score 20 or more points in a half in over four years and 128 games, the feat was accomplished by two Mids in back-to-back games.

Entering this season, the last time a Navy player scored at least 20 points in a half was when Courtney Davidson scored 22 points Jan. 29, 2002, against American.

Kate Hobbs ended that streak when she scored 21 points in the second half of Navy's Nov. 18 game over Howard, then **Carly Meyer** scored 23 points one week later during the second half of Navy's game at Long Island.

Whitney Davidson

Whitney Davidson poured in 10 of her career-high 18 points Nov. 18 against Howard during the second half. Davidson, who totaled only six points during her entire 2005-06 freshman year, was 7-of-13 from the field and made all four of her free throw attempts against the Lady Bison.

Most recently, Davidson hauled in a career-high five rebounds at Saint Francis.

Kalen Kropa

Kalen Kropa set a career high with three steals against Ohio, then matched that high two days later against Marshall. She also added nine points against the Thundering Herd.

Kropa would then set career highs for both points and rebounds when she scored 13 points and grabbed five boards against Howard.

Her scoring output may have dropped recently, but she is averaging 4.6 assists and 3.2 rebounds a game over the last five games. Included during this recent stretch of games was a career-high tying seven assists at Saint Francis and a new personal-best tally of six rebounds against Georgetown.

Lauren Nelson

Lauren Nelson converted 4-of-9 shots from the field and 5-of-6 free throw attempts to produce a career-high 13-point effort Nov. 12 against Marshall. The junior, who previously had a scoring best of nine points last year against UMBC, shared the scoring honors (with Kate Hobbs) for the first time in her career.

She would go on to record a career-high four assists Nov. 25 against Mount St. Mary's.

30th Anniversary of Women at Navy

The 2006-07 academic year marks the 30th anniversary of women being admitted to the Naval Academy.

Basketball was one of the first sports offered to women at Navy, with 20 of the 81 women comprising the initial class trying out for the basketball team during the fall of 1976.

After compiling a 10-1 record on the junior varsity level during that first season, the program was elevated to varsity status the following year.

Hobbs Named Team Captain

Senior post player **Kate Hobbs** was selected as the captain of the 2006-07 Navy women's basketball team in voting conducted by her teammates.

- be a senior,
- have earned a varsity letter,
- have at least a 2.0 GPA in their academic careers and in the most recent semester of voting,
- and meet a set of minimum standards in both conduct and military performance.

Patriot League Tournament

Alumni Hall will serve as the host site for the quarterfinal and semifinal rounds of the 2007 Patriot League Women's Basketball Tournament, March 3 and 4.

The championship game of the tournament will be played March 7 at the site of the higher-seeded team playing in the title game.

Alumni Hall

The 2006-07 season is the 16th year in which the Mids have called Alumni Hall home. The Mids have posted a 117-67 overall record in games played in Alumni Hall, including a 54-40 record in Patriot League regular season games and a 3-2 record in league tournament games.

Construction began on the \$30 million building in Dec. of 1987 and it was dedicated in Oct. of 1991.

The women's basketball team began playing their league games in Alumni Hall starting with the 1991-92 season and moved all of its games into the structure starting with the 1995-96 season.

✘ Not Just the Home of Navy Basketball

In addition to serving as the home of Navy basketball, the building also serves as both a concert and lecture facility. Included on the list of speakers Alumni Hall has hosted is President George W. Bush (Nov., 2005), former Prime Minister of England Margaret Thatcher and Steven Spielberg. In addition, prominent artists such as Faith Hill, Bill Cosby, Hootie and the Blowfish, the Goo Goo Dolls and Toby Keith have all performed concerts in the building.

✘ Dave Smalley Court

The playing court in Alumni Hall was dedicated as Dave Smalley Court in Feb. of 2006. Smalley has been associated with Naval Academy athletics for over 50 years as a player, coach, physical education professor and administrator.

After serving as the head coach of the Navy men's program for a decade, Smalley was named as the first head coach of the Navy women's team. He compiled a 178-118 record during his 12 years as the program's mentor.

He remains at the Naval Academy as the senior associate athletic director in charge of academics, admissions and compliance.
