2008 Navy Girls Basketball Camp Schedules

Day Camp (Ages 8-13)

This camp is attractive for all local players who are available daily from 8:45-4:00 p.m. The purpose of the summer camp is to instruct players in the fundamentals of basketball and help develop the skills of a beginning player. This camp is appropriate for elementary and junior high students who are playing basketball for the first time and wish to have fun as they learn.

Individual Camp (Ages 8-18)

The Navy Individual Camp is open to all young women ages 8-18. The purpose of the camp is to instruct players in all aspects of basketball and help develop the skills necessary to become a complete player. Hundreds of current area high school and college players have attended Navy's summer camp. The camp gives you the opportunity to eat, sleep and live basketball ... and most of all, you will have fun while developing your skills.

Position Camp (Ages 13-18)

This camp is designed for point guard, wing and post players who want to concentrate on their individual positions. Campers learn offensive and defensive techniques and gain valuable experience by playing against and alongside some of the best young players in the Mid-Atlantic region. This camp is for high school players only.

Team/Individual Camp (High School)

This camp is designed for high school teams to be able to get a head start on the upcoming season. The camp will consist of practice sessions and games played in Halsey Fieldhouse. Navy coaches will be available for team and individual instruction during each day of camp. Help give your team that extra edge this season by attending team camp!

Note: individuals attending this camp will be grouped into a team to play games.

Camp Director Tom Marryott

Tom Marryott is in his fifth season as head coach for the Navy women's basketball team.

Prior to taking the helm for the women's program in 2003, Marryott served as an assistant coach with the men's program from the fall of 1998. In those five years with the program, Navy made three Patriot League championship game appearances and

reached the 1998 NCAA Tournament. The Midshipmen also won a pair of league regular-season titles and amassed an 80-65 overall record.

Prior to beginning his tenure at the Naval Academy, Marryott served as both head coach and athletic director for 10 seasons at the Naval Academy Prep School in Newport, R.I. His basketball teams recorded a 124-75 (.623) record in those 10 seasons.

A 1985 graduate of Castleton (Vt.) State, Marryott helped lead the Spartans to the NAIA Tournament in his final season and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2001.
