**Postgame Interviews**

The Navy locker room is closed at all times, both at home and on the road. Postgame interviews at home games will be conducted in the interview room, across from the visitor's locker room in Alumni Hall, while interviews on the road will be conducted either outside of the Navy locker room or else in a designated media area at the arena.

The postgame interview session will begin 10 minutes following the conclusion of the game.

In addition to the regular season slate of games, all Navy postseason games will be carried live by the network.

All broadcasts begin 15 minutes prior to tip with the Navy Pregame Show featuring an interview with Navy head coach Tom Marryott. The Navy Postgame Show, beginning immediately following the conclusion of the game, includes interviews with Navy players and/or a member of the Navy coaching staff.

**Annapolis**

The City of Annapolis has been home to the Naval Academy for all but four years since the founding of the school in 1845 on the grounds of what originally was the Army's Fort Severn. The Academy moved its location to Newport, R.I., from 1861-65 during the Civil War.

Originally just 10 acres, "The Yard" has grown to a size of 338 acres.

**Anchors Aweigh**

"Anchors Aweigh" was written by Lt. Charles Zimmerman, musical director of the Naval Academy, in 1906, with the lyrics provided by Alfred H. Miles '06 as a fight song for the 1907 graduating class. The song made its debut at the 1906 Army-Navy game and when the Mids won, the song became traditional at the contest.

*Stand Navy down the field,  
Sails set to the sky,  
We'll never change our course,  
So Army you steer shy.  
Roll up the score, Navy,  
Anchors Aweigh,  
Sail Navy down the field,  
And sink the Army,  
sink the Army Grey*

**Brigade of Midshipmen**

The 4,000-member student body at the Naval Academy is called the Brigade of Midshipmen.

The Brigade is organized into:

**Bill the Goat**

The first recorded use of a goat as the mascot for Navy teams was in 1893 when an animal named El Cid (the Chief) was presented to the Brigade by officers of the USS New York. El Cid helped Navy to a 6-4 win over Army that year and a goat became the permanent mascot of the Academy in 1904.

**Co-Ed**

Women were first admitted to the Naval Academy during the 1976 summer, with the 1980 graduation ceremonies being the first to commission female officers. Today, women comprise roughly 15 percent of the student body.

Graduates of the Naval Academy entering the Marine Corps (commissioned as 2nd Lieutenants) have the following service options available to them ...

- ◆ Aviation -- air command and control, anti-air warfare, aviation maintenance, aviation supply, pilot, naval flight officer.
- ◆ Ground -- armor\*, artillery\*, communications (information systems), engineering, financial management, infantry\*, logistics, military police  
(\* — not available to women)

**Midshipman**

The original 17th Century meaning of the word "midshipmen" designated those men who stood watch "amidships", or in the middle portion of a ship. The middle "s" was later dropped to give the current form of the word.

Midshipmen were originally young boys who were apprenticed to sea captains to learn the trade.

In the early days of the Navy, midshipmen were trained aboard ship until they were commissioned as ensigns.

**Nickname**

The official nickname for all of Navy's athletic teams is Midshipmen.

"Mids" is an appropriate abbreviation, while "Middie" is inappropriate.

**N-Star**

Members of varsity teams who qualify for the varsity letter receive an N-Star for their letter sweaters if they participate in a victory over Army in any sport-designated Star Game.

The varsity N and corresponding N-Star were initiated during the early 1890s.

**Fordham Preview**

Fordham enters the New Year in search of its first win of the season. The Rams have posted an 0-13 record this year, but have lost their last three games by an average of only 7.7 points. Included in this most recent stretch were a two-point overtime loss to George Mason and a 78-70 setback to Troy.

Fordham is averaging 51.5 points a game and is giving up 69.1 points per game. The Rams are connecting on 32.4 percent of their shots from the field and are sinking 5.1 three-point attempts a game, but are allowing opponents to shoot 43.7 percent from the field and convert 6.0 three-pointers a contest. Fordham also is being outrebounded this year by 7.1 caroms a game (40.1-33.0 rpg).

Individually, the duo of Megan Mahoney (13.2 ppg) and Annie Zopf (10.0 ppg) are averaging nearly half of the points scored by the Rams this season (45.0%). Takita Earl, meanwhile, is hauling in a team-best 7.8 rebounds a game.

**Navy vs. Fordham Series Notes**

Wednesday's game will mark the first meeting between the two teams since the Rams left the Patriot League following the conclusion of the 1994-95 season.

Fordham won seven of the 10 games contested between the programs during the four years the teams shared membership in the Patriot League, with two of the wins by the Rams coming in the Patriot League Tournament.

During its five years in the Patriot League, the Rams posted a 52-16 league regular season record and an 11-3 league tournament record. Fordham claimed Patriot League Tournament titles in 1992 and '94, while also advancing to the title game of the league tournament in '93 and '95.

**Last Meeting – Fordham, 70, Navy 55 (March 5, 1995, West Point, N.Y.)**

Fordham jumped out to a 32-22 halftime lead over Navy and went on to record a 70-55 win over the Mids in the semifinal round of the 1995 Patriot League Tournament.

Navy shot 50 percent from the field in the first half, but Fordham converted 40.6 percent of its shots and drilled six three-point field goals in taking the 10-point lead at intermission.

Four Rams scored in double figures, with Denise Hammersley's 17 points pacing all players in the game. The Mids were led in scoring by Jenny Thompson's 13 points.

**Common Foes**

Both Navy and Fordham have lost to Georgetown this season, with the Mids dropping an 81-56 decision to the Hoyas in Washington, D.C., and the Rams losing by the score of 89-43 in New York.

Additionally, Fordham has lost games to future Navy league opponents Lehigh (46-33) and American (65-51).

**Conference Comparison**

Navy has posted a 10-24 record against teams currently in the Atlantic 10 Conference, while the Rams have compiled a 72-57 record against teams in the Patriot League.

Since leaving the Patriot League, the Rams have a tallied 1-10 record against league schools (0-2 vs. American, 1-7 vs. Holy Cross, 0-1 vs. Lehigh).

**Ohio Preview**

The Bobcats, who are off from competition until traveling to Annapolis, have posted a 6-6 record this season. That record could easily have been much better as Ohio is just 1-4 in games decided by five or fewer points.

Ohio is outscoring its opponents this year by 4.1 points a game (69.6-65.5 ppg), but holds a decisive 9.2 rebounds-per-game advantage over its foes (43.8-34.6 rpg). The Bobcats are converting 41.1 percent of their shots from the field and are sinking 7.2 three-pointers a contest.

At 15.0 points per game, Lauren Kohn is the lone Bobcat to be averaging in double figures this year, with four additional players scoring over 7.0 points a game. Chandra Myers and Kohn are pacing the squad in rebounds with averages of 6.1 and 6.0 rebounds per game, respectively.

**Currier Selects Marine Corps**

The seniors at the U.S. Naval Academy recently received their service assignments for their military careers. Ali Currier, the lone senior on the women's basketball team, will become a member of the ground forces for the U.S. Marine Corps. She will be commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the Marine Corps upon graduating from Navy this May.

**Navy vs. Ohio Series Notes**

Saturday's game will be the third time the Mids and the Bobcats have faced each other, but it will be the first meeting between the teams outside of Ohio.

The young series initially began during the 2002-03 season when the Mids scheduled the game near the hometown of senior team captain Lisa Steinmetz. The homecoming was a successful one as Navy posted a 67-52 win that evening.

Ohio evened the series at one game apiece last year with a 72-49 win over Navy in Athens, Ohio.

**Last Meeting – Ohio 72, Navy 49 (Nov. 10, 2006, Athens, Ohio)**

Ohio closed the first half on a 30-17 run to take a 38-26 lead over the Mids and went on to record a 72-49 victory last year in Athens, Ohio.

Navy shot just 34.7 percent from the field in the game and converted only 1-of-7 attempts from behind the three-point stripe. Conversely, Ohio sank 41.4 percent of its shots and drilled 7-of-14 three-point attempts.

The Mids also turned the ball over 22 times while forcing Ohio into only 10 miscues with the ball.

Ohio's Rachel Frederick and Domenica Silva both scored 16 points in the game, with Margaret Knap's 12 leading the Mids.

**Common Foes**

Marshall has recorded victories over both Navy (70-58) and Ohio (78-74) this season.

Navy previously lost to Ohio's fellow Mid-American Conference member school Kent State (53-47), while the Bobcats posted a 67-53 win over Patriot League school Lehigh.

**Conference Comparison**

The Mids have compiled a 3-4 record against the Mid-American Conference, while Ohio is 3-1 against the Patriot League.

**Navy 72, Air Force 69 (OT) (Dec. 29, Annapolis, Md.)**

Navy rallied from a nine-point halftime deficit and an 11-point second-half deficit to outlast Air Force 72-69 in overtime this past Saturday in Alumni Hall.

The Mids trailed 32-23 at intermission and soon found themselves down 43-32 with 15 minutes remaining. The deficit was still nine points with 10 minutes left when Navy went on an 11-0 run to take a 50-48 lead with just under six minutes showing on the clock. Navy would extend its lead to five points at 59-54, but the Falcons tied the score at 61-61 with 14 seconds left to send the game into overtime.

In the extra period, Navy scored on five of its last six possessions and took a 72-69 lead on a pair of free throws by K.C. Gordon with 15 seconds left to play, then played great team defense and forced the Falcons into an off-balanced three-point attempt that fell short at the buzzer to seal the win.

The Mids overcame nine three-point field goals by the Falcons by connecting on 22-of-32 attempts from the foul line. Additionally, after being outrebounded 18-12 over the first 20 minutes of the game, Navy held a 31-22 advantage on the glass over the remainder of the game.

Gordon, who finished 7-of-7 from the foul line in the game, scored 13 of her Navy-best 15 points after halftime. Morgan Hill scored 14 points in only 21 minutes of playing time, while Whitney Davidson drilled a pair of huge three-pointers towards the end of regulation and in the overtime on her way to scoring 13 points.

Cassie Consedine contributed a Navy-record seven blocked shots and tallied her sixth double-double of the year with 11 points and 11 boards, while Angela Myers dished out 11 assists.

**Alumni Hall Success**

Navy's games this week against Fordham and Ohio will close out the non-conference portion of its 2007-08 schedule. The Mids enter the week with a 3-1 record in home games this year against non-league foes, bringing Navy's record in such games to 18-8 (69.2%) during Tom Marryott's five seasons as head coach.

Since the start of the 2000-01 season, the Mids have posted a 33-12 record (73.3%) in home games against non-conference opponents.

**San Diego State 91, Navy 33**

A massive case of food poisoning slowed the Mids prior to and during its game against San Diego State Dec. 20 in San Diego.

Eight of the 12 players, three of the four coaches and two of the four additional staff members on the trip began suffering from the violent illness contracted during the team meal on Dec. 19 in the early morning hours on the day of the game.

Following the conclusion of the game, three more players and one additional staff member came down with the illness, bringing the final tally of those infected to 17 out of the 20-member travel party.

Only five players — including just one player who has consistently started games this year — were able to participate in the team's shootaround on the 20th.

Navy's starting lineup included Ali Currier (two prior minutes played this year), Kristin Bowen (15 minutes) and Amanda Taylor (39 minutes).

With the game tied at 2-2, San Diego State scored the next 20 points on its way to taking a 45-14 lead at intermission.

San Diego State continued to employ a full-court press and trap while holding a 50-point lead (75-25) with 10 minutes left in the game. After calling off the pressure, the Aztecs still looked to run with ball on offense in an attempt to score on a fast break.

"I want to say how proud I am of this team for the effort and heart they displayed tonight," said Navy head coach Tom Marryott after the game. "They could have easily layed down and given up at the start of the game or at any point during the game. Almost no one had slept or eaten all day. We had girls leave the bench during the game because they were sick. It means a lot to me to see how hard they competed. They played their hearts out throughout the 40 minutes, and everyone who played just wanted to do and play more. They did themselves, their teammates and the Naval Academy proud with their effort and determination."

**Overtime Games**

Navy's game against Air Force marked the first overtime game for the Mids in two seasons (Feb. 21, 2006 at American, L, 89-81), the first home overtime game for the program in five seasons (March 1, 2003, Army, W, 86-85 in 3 OT) and the first home overtime game against a non-league opponent in seven years (Dec. 20, 2000, McNeese State, W, 74-65).

The win improves Navy's record in overtime games to 18-13, to 13-4 in home OT games and to 9-1 in home overtime games against non-conference opponents.

**Halftime Rallies**

Navy's rally from a nine-point halftime deficit to defeat Air Force was one of the largest margins overcome by the Mids to win a game in the program's history.

**Morgan Hill**

Morgan Hill entered Navy's Nov. 14 game against Howard having scored 39 career points (21 points during the entire 2006-07 season and 18 points during Navy's initial three games this season). Hill promptly scored a combined 31 points in Navy's games against the Lady Bison and the Broncs. She converted 7-of-9 shots from the field in scoring a career-high 16 points against Howard, then sank 6-of-12 field goal attempts on her way to scoring 15 points against the Broncs.

Hill has also produced back-to-back strong efforts in Navy's recent games against San Diego State and Air Force. Despite suffering from food poisoning, Hill responded with 12 points and five rebounds. After returning from the holiday break, she scored 14 points and grabbed four caroms against Air Force.

**Rookie of the Week**

With a pair of double-doubles, a Navy freshman class blocked shots record and averages of 11.0 points, 9.7 rebounds and 3.0 blocks per game, Cassie Consedine was selected as the Patriot League Rookie of the Week on Nov. 12.

She becomes the first Mid to receive the honor in seven seasons (Maile Shimoda, F12, 2001).

Consedine also received the accolade from the league office on Nov. 19 after averaging 17.0 points and 11.5 rebounds a game in Navy's wins over Howard and Rider. She scored 19 points and tied her own freshman class record with five blocked shots against the Lady Bison, then tied for the Navy scoring honors with 15 points against the Broncs.

She is the first Mid to earn multiple rookie of the week honors from the league in nine years (Hilary Goodrich, 1998-99).

**New Starting Five**

Guard Kalen Kropa is the lone returning member of Navy's 2006-07 starting lineup. This marks just the second time since starts were recorded at Navy (1984-85 season) that the Mids have returned only one starter from the previous year (2004-05, Abi Campbell).
