CARIN GABARRA

HEAD COACH

Carin Gabarra is a proven winner. Not only was she a success as a forward on the UC-Santa Barbara soccer team and later in her career playing for the United States national team, but Gabarra also had the golden touch to lead others by example.

It is the gift of leadership which has led her to become one of the newest household names within the collegiate coaching ranks.

Not because she was an eight-time All-America (four in high school and four at UC-Santa Barbara), and not because she was a member of the 1996 gold-medal winning U.S. national team, but because she has developed the Navy soccer program from ground level to one of the most competitive clubs in the Mid-Atlantic Region.

Since taking over the Navy program in 1993, she has taken the Midshipmen from a club-level organization to an NCAA Tournament team.

BUILDING FROM THE BEGINNING

Gabarra arrived at Navy in 1993, and led the Mids to a 2-5 mark in their first season as a varsity sport. In the process, Navy gained valuable playing experience before beginning Patriot League competition in 1994. The Mids showed great progress in their inaugural season in the league, as they missed the Patriot League playoffs by one game and finished with a 7-9-2 record. The improvement continued in '95 with Navy boasting a record of 10-7-1. With a third-place regular-season finish that season, the Mids made their first Patriot League Tournament appearance, falling in the championship contest. The team's success didn't stop there. The '96 squad produced an 11-6-2 record, finished fourth in the league and was invited to appear in its first postseason tournament with a game against Monmouth in the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Tournament. Gabarra guided the 1997 team to a 10-8 record and a third-place finish in the Patriot League, registering a 4-2 mark. Six Mids earned All-Patriot League recognition, including Defensive Player of the Year and Academic All-America honoree, Nicole Aunapu.

The 1998 season fulfilled dreams of many, as Gabarra led the Mids to a school-record 17 wins, 14 shutouts, 52 goals and Navy's first regular-season Patriot League title. Navy also knocked off Colgate for the first time in its history and broke the Red Raiders' 16-game winning streak versus league foes. In addition, an unprecedented nine Mids earned all-league honors, including eight first-team members. Justine Fisher earned rookie-of-the-year accolades, while Aunapu was dubbed Defensive Player of the Year for the second-consecutive season. Aunapu was just the sixth player in league history to earn First-Team All-Patriot League recognition all four years and concluded her season as an Academic All-American.

In 1999, Navy again made a run at the league crown, as the Mids shared the regular-season title with a 5-1 Patriot League mark. The Mids scored 51 goals on the season, nearly doubling their opponents' total of 26. In league action, Navy scored 17 goals, while holding its opponents to just two and without an assist in six games. While making a return trip to the Patriot League Tournament Championship contest, six Mids were dubbed all-league, including Fisher who became Navy's first player to be honored as the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year.

The year 2000 brought Fisher her third all-league honor, as the Mids captured a 10-9-2 record and earned a bid to the Patriot League Tournament for the sixth-consecutive season. Meanwhile, two rookies showed a glimmer of greatness to come in the likes of Amelia Sheveland, who tied the school record for goals in a game with four; and Stacy Finley who started 17 games and played virtually every position.

Just one win shy of the school record, the 2001 team found its share of success as it claimed a share of the Patriot League Regular-Season Title with a 16-5-1 overall mark and 6-1 league record. Fisher became Navy's all-time leading scorer, while Gabarra claimed her 100th-career victory all in one eventful day Oct. 28, 2001,

against George Mason. Navy swept the all-league honors, as Finley earned the offensive player-of-the-year title, Kate Macfarlane was deemed the defensive player of the year and Xochitl Piedra was co-rookie of the year. Meanwhile, both Macfarlane and Fisher garnered Academic All-America recognition.

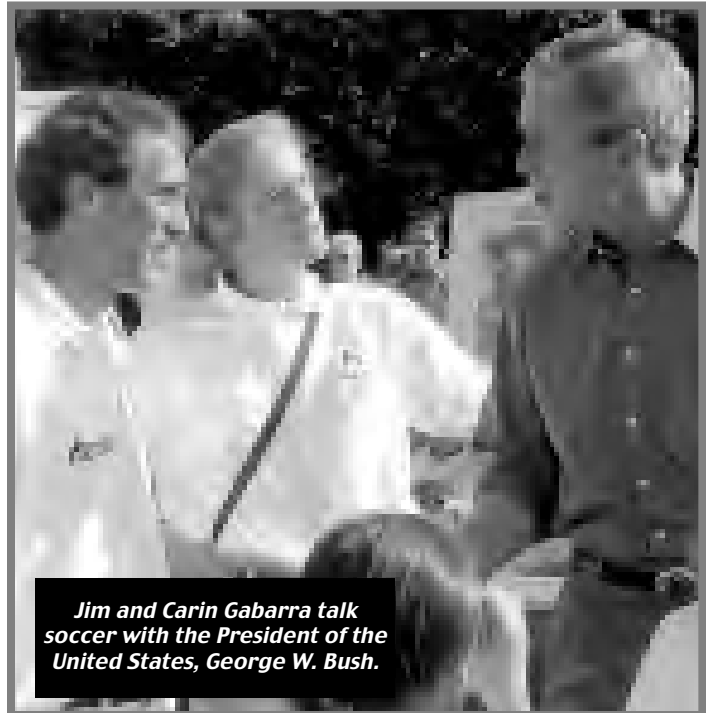
The Mids posted the program's first undefeated regular season at 16-0-4, before American upset Navy in the Patriot League Tournament to leave the only blemish on the Mids' 2002 record. Navy was the only Div. I school that finished the 2002 season without a loss in regular-season play. Finley garnered her second-straight Patriot League Offensive Player-of-the-Year award after setting single-season school records with 45 points and 19 goals. Defensively, Kim Bonafede was among the top three in the nation throughout the year in goals-against average, setting the Navy record at 0.36. Nadia Sheikh earned First-Team All-Patriot League recognition after breaking the Navy assist record with 27 in her last game of her career.

In 2003, Navy claimed its first Patriot League Tournament title and became the first Naval Academy women's team in any sport to earn a bid to play in the NCAA Tournament. En route to their 17-5-1 record, the Mids owned the nation's longest regular-season unbeaten streak (35 games) before dropping a one-goal decision to eventual national champion North Carolina. Over 6,500 fans witnessed the game, breaking the NCAA single-game attendance record. Stacy Finley was named First-Team All-Patriot League after becoming the Mids' all-time leader in career scoring, goals scored and shots taken. Classmate Amelia Sheveland garnered Patriot League Tournament MVP recognition, finishing her career as Navy's fourth-leading scorer all-time.

The year 2004 was a year of rebuilding on the offensive side of the field and its two marquee players, Meggie Curran and Carmen Myers, came into the year having undergone knee surgeries, and sophomore Molly Burd missed the entire season with a broken foot. Navy dropped its opening-three games in Patriot League play, but responded by winning four straight. Despite the Mids' valiant effort, they did not make the postseason league tournament. Senior defender Xochitl Piedra closed out her career by being named to the Patriot League First Team, just the third player in Academy history to be named all-league all four years. Curran and senior midfielder Stephanie Parker were named to the first team, while junior midfielder Sarah Hessinger and senior keeper Kim Bonafede garnered second-team recognition.

A STAR IN THE MAKING

A native of Palos Verdes, Calif., Gabarra graduated from California at Santa Barbara in 1987 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in business management. A stand-out forward for the Gaucho soccer team, she became the NCAA's all-time leading scorer with 102 goals and 60 assists. She held that post until 1993 when fellow

Olympian Mia Hamm broke Gabarra's record. Gabarra was a four-time All-America honoree and UC-Santa Barbara's Woman Athlete of the Decade in 1987, as well as Scholastic Athlete of the Year. In October of 1991, she was inducted into the UC-Santa Barbara Athletic Hall of Fame. She remains the record holder in every individual category at Santa Barbara excluding goalkeeper records most goals in a game, season and career; most assists in a season and career; most points in a season and career; most shots in a season and career; and most games played in a career.

A standout at Palos Verdes High School, as well, she led the nation in scoring from 1980-83 by netting 226 goals and garnered high school All-America accolades four times.

COACHING ROOTS

Gabarra began her coaching career in 1987 as the head coach at Westmont College in Santa Barbara. There she guided the Warriors to a 6-10-0 record. From Westmont, she moved on to Harvard in 1988, serving as an assistant coach.

PRIDE OF THE UNITED STATES

While coaching at Harvard, Gabarra continued competing on the international level where she led the U.S. to its first-ever World Championship title in 1991 by scoring six goals and was the recipient of the "Golden Ball," presented to the outstanding player of the championship. She garnered United States Soccer's Female Athlete-of-the-Year honors in 1992, after winning the award for the first time in 1987. She was also tagged the 1987 and '92 United States Olympic Committee Player of the Year. Though retired from professional soccer these days, Gabarra was named to the Stars of the Century Team in the summer of 1999. The role call includes the best 11 players in the history of women's soccer in the United States Gabarra, Michelle Akers, Brandi Chastain, Joy Fawcett, Julie Foudy, Mia Hamm, April Heinrichs, Kristine Lilly, Tiffeny Milbrett, Carla Overbeck and Briana Scurry. Gabarra and her 1996 gold medal-winning teammates were inducted into the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame last June.

In addition to her coaching duties at Navy, Gabarra is active with the Olympic Development Programs that scout prospective national team players and is a member of the U.S. Soccer Athlete Advisory Council. She serves on the Athlete Advisory Board Project 2012 and is a member of the U.S. Olympic Committee Athlete Advisory Council. Additionally, Gabarra is a member of the Maryland Physical Fitness Council. She is also an honorary member of Habitat for Humanity: Women Building a Legacy.

THE LEGACY CONTINUES

Despite retiring from international competition in late 1997, Gabarra's legacy continues to live on. The first U.S. player to be named MVP of the Women's World Cup, Gabarra, along with former New York Cosmos superstar Giorgio Chinaglia, were inducted at a public ceremony Oct. 28, 2000, at the National Soccer Hall of Fame in Oneonta, N.Y. She is just the second woman player to be inducted, as former World Cup teammate April Heinrichs was the first to be enshrined in 1998.

THE GABARRAS

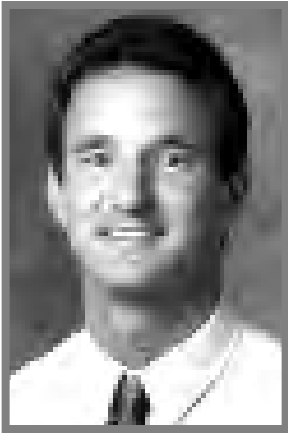
While her decision to leave the playing realm of soccer, the sport would remain an integral part of her future. In 1992, the former Carin Jennings married Jim Gabarra, no stranger to the soccer world, and incorporated her competitive spirit both as a player and now a collegiate coach. A former captain of the U.S. Indoor National Team, Jim played on the 1988 Olympic team, was a member of the 1990 World Cup-qualifying team and competed in the '89, '92 and '96 Futsal World Championships. He served as the head coach of the WUSA's Washington Freedom. The couple resides in Arnold with their son, Tyler (eight), and daughters, Abigail (six) and Talia (four-and-a-half).

ROB BLANCK
ASSISTANT COACH
11 TH SEASON

In his 11th season, assistant coach Rob Blanck has been alongside Carin Gabarra from nearly day one in building the Naval Academy women's soccer program. Blanck came to the Academy in 1995, just two years after the Navy women's soccer team was elevated to Division-I status. Blanck knows nothing other than winning, having been a member of the Williams College varsity soccer team which owned a winning record all four years in which he played, while in his 12 years as a coach, all of his teams have posted winning records.

Blanck's background as an All-America goalkeeper has been a key element in developing Navy's corps of goalkeepers. Under his tutelage, Navy has produced four all-league goalkeepers in three-time All-Patriot League honoree Amy Hakola, two-time all-league Sarah Wilson, 2001 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year Kate Macfarlane and three-time all-league Kim Bonafede. Hakola, Navy's all-time saves leader (479) was a four-year starter (1994-97) for the Mids, while Wilson (1997-2000) owns Navy's single-season record for shutouts (11.5). Macfarlane played just two seasons for the Mids (1999-01), but ended her career with a 1.00 goals-against average

and 10.1 shutouts. Bonafede, meanwhile, scorched the Navy record books with her 0.36 GAA in 2002, and set the Mids all-time shutouts record with 22 her senior campaign.

Over the last seven seasons, the Navy defensive unit has held its opponents to just 143 goals and produced a 0.93 goals-against average. In 1998, Navy set the tone with a then record-breaking 14 shutouts. Blanck was also instrumental in recruiting Justine Fisher, a four-time All-Patriot League selection, as well as developing Nicole Aunapu, the first women's soccer player to garner all-league recognition all four years.

In the summer of 2003, Blanck was selected to coach the United States in the CISM World Military Games in Germany. He guided the team, which included three former Naval Academy standouts Cristina Esposito ('98), Tara Refo ('00) and Sarah Wilson ('01), to a bronze medal with a pair of wins over neighboring Canada.

Prior to his arrival in Annapolis, he served as an assistant coach at Boston College three years with the women's soccer team and two seasons with the men's team. During his stay in Chestnut Hill, he helped guide the Eagles to postseason play three-consecutive years, while Boston College also appeared in the national rankings.

A native of Weston, Mass., Blanck graduated from Williams College in 1989, where he captained the soccer team to two regional titles and earned First-Team All-America honors after setting four national goalkeeping records. Blanck compiled a 46-4-0 record as a college goalkeeper. He also played baseball and received the Fox Award (in honor of a Navy pilot killed in the Korean War) for recognition of achievements of character and sportsmanship.

Prior to coaching full time, Blanck worked for the Boston Red Sox for two years and completed a Master's Degree in sports management at Massachusetts. He received a second master's in business administration from Babson College. Blanck has received his NSCAA advanced national diploma and his USFF "A" coaching license. He has also served on the staff for the Maryland Olympic Development Program for five years.

A LOOK AT THE 2005 SEASON

Two years ago, the Navy women's soccer team claimed its first Patriot League Tournament crown and earned the program's first NCAA Tournament berth. A year removed, the Mids were hit with numerous injuries and struggled to find the chemistry which made Navy a dominant force along the Eastern Seaboard.

Heading into the 2005 campaign, Navy has its health back, but the program will be challenged with replacing not only seven letterwinners, but six starters. Nearly the entire Midshipmen defense has graduated, leaving 2005 team captain Lindsay Adlam as the lone starter out of the back. But the offense returns more powerful and experienced with the vigor to stand up against its foes. All-Patriot League performers Meggie Curran and Sarah Hessinger will lead the team at the forward position with the rest of the squad to fall in line.

The following is a position-by-position outlook previewing the 2005 season.

Once again, Navy will field a lethal assemblage of forwards, though this season, it is a more experienced group. The Mids return two All-Patriot League selections at the position, while another was named to the Soccer Buzz Mid-Atlantic All-Freshman Team. It's a position ripe with talent and any one player can dominate.

Junior **MEGGIE CURRAN** garnered First-Team All-Patriot League recognition last fall after leading the Mids in scoring behind eight goals and nine assists. Ranked fourth in the conference in points per game (1.25), Curran wasn't at 100 percent at the start of the season after injuring her knee in the off-season. She targeted four game-winning goals for Navy, including three in Patriot League action. Through just two seasons, Curran already is ranked ninth on the Mids' career goals list with 17.

Meggie has established herself as a top forward in the league and we expect her to continue to be a dominant force in our attack, Gabarra said.

Her explosive one-on-one abilities, combined with her desire and mentality to score goals makes her hard to contain. She is capable of taking over games and will be an impact player in every match.

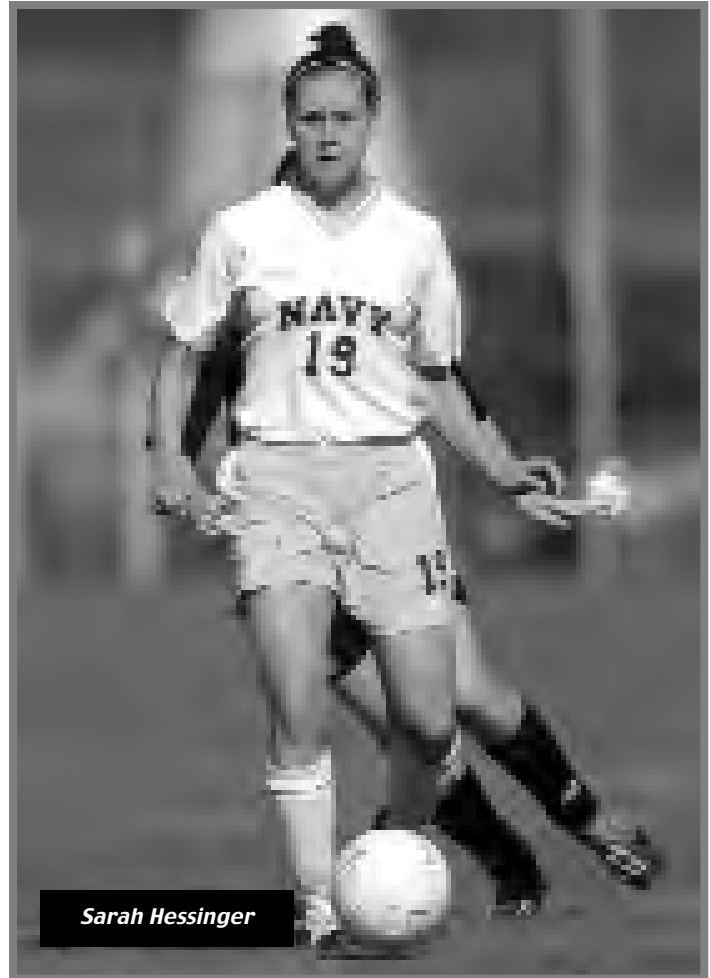
A 2005 Second-Team All-Patriot League selection, senior **SARAH HESSINGER** is coming off the best season of her career in a Navy blue and gold uniform. A starter in 16 of the 20 contests, she scored four goals and added a trio of assists. One of the Mids' most crafty players, she traditionally was known as a play maker. Last season, however, she became more versatile and took the ball to the goal on her own.

We expect Sarah to be a personality player this year, said Gabarra. She is extremely athletic, reads the game well and has an uncanny defensive presence for a forward. Her touch on the ball is outstanding and enables her to consistently serve the final pass, as well as create her own goal-scoring chances.

Sophomores **BRIGITTE FOX** and **KARI WENIGER** had tremendous rookie seasons. Alongside Curran, Fox led the Mids with her eight goals, while also turning in six assists for 22 points. An impact player, Fox started 19 of the 20 games and produced a pair of game winners for the Mids. Her 22 points tied with Curran's point total in 2003 as the second-best point efforts by a Navy freshman in program history.

Brigitte is a constant attacking threat with excellent acceleration, balance and ability, Gabarra said. She loves to run at defenders with an explosive one-on-one ability and consistently creates goal-scoring chances for herself and teammates. We give her a lot of creative freedom in the attack.

A dangerous one-on-one attacker, Weniger finished her freshman season fifth on the Mids' scoring list with 10 points on three goals and four assists. A starter in three of the 20 games in which she played, she had a sensational

game against Wagner in which she scored two of Navy's three goals and produced the assist on the third goal.

Kari is re-energized this fall and has the desire and motivation to make an impact in our attack, said Gabarra. Kari is very comfortable back to pressure, deceptive on the dribble and does a great job of breaking down the defense. She has a great first touch and is capable of scoring from anywhere.

Newcomer **IRIS BOIVIN** hails from Pittsburgh, Pa., and is expected to be an impact player for the Midshipmen. She led Upper St. Clair High School in scoring her senior campaign, and guided her team to the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic League Championship her sophomore year. A longtime member of the Pittsburgh Strikers club team, she and Naval Academy teammate Elise McCaskey, led the strikers to the State Cup Championship in 2001, 02, 03 and 05.

Iris comes to us with an exceptional ability to train at the highest intensity, said Gabarra. Her work rate has made her transition to this level very easy. She is very comfortable with the ball at her feet, crafty in the attack and will be a huge contributor up top.

Freshman **KRISTEN LARAWAY** joins older sister, Emily, as a member of the Navy soccer team. The younger of the two siblings was a three-time first-team all-conference selection, who also garnered First-Team All-Morris County recognition three times. The coaching staff feels her versatility will aid in her ability to adapt to the Div. I game.

Kristen can step into the flow of the game immediately, said Gabarra.

Her work rate is tremendous on both sides of the ball, and she is capable of generating goal-scoring chances for herself and teammates.

Though Navy returns four letterwinners to the midfield corps, it also has the most new faces entering the 2005 campaign.

HEATHER THOMAS returns as the veteran member of the group, having started 29 contests over the last three seasons. The senior hailing from Pismo Beach, Calif., scored her first-collegiate goal in last year's victory over Mount St. Marys, and added four assists over the course of the season.

We will again ask Heather to control our midfield possession and tempo of the game, said Gabarra. Her mobility, speed of play and possession are a key to our attack. Her defensive mentality has stepped up a notch and her play-making decisions are excellent.

Juniors **MOLLY BURD** and **CARMEN MYERS** will play a pivotal role for the Midshipmen at midfield. Burd, who had a memorable freshman campaign scoring six goals and adding four assists, was noticeably absent from the field last fall. The native of Englewood, Colo., fractured her foot during the summer and was forced to the sidelines the entire 2004 season. She will make an impact for the Mids this fall.

Molly has a great attacking mind and we really missed her creativity last fall, pointed out Gabarra. She is very crafty on the ball and makes some very good unbalancing runs off the ball. We want her to play-make for us and dictate our attack.

Myers, meanwhile, followed up her freshman season with a solid year. She scored three goals and added two assists a year ago, but was not 100 percent for most of the season. She suffered a knee injury in the spring and was not at full strength at the beginning of the fall season. With Burd and Myers at 100 percent heading into 2005, Navy will be a force to be reckoned with up the middle.

Carmen has worked extremely hard to improve her already well-rounded game, said Gabarra. She has a dominant presence in the air, as well as being one of our most technical players. She excels on the ball and her vision and play-making decisions will enable her to direct our attack.

Sophomores **JEANNETTE BENSON** and **KATIE TRASTER** will also provide direction out of the midfield for Navy. Benson came off the bench to play in 14 games for the Mids in her rookie campaign.

Jeannette has an extraordinary first touch and speed of play, Gabarra said. Her vision and play-making decisions will enable her to direct our attack. She took huge strides in her first year with her defending.

Meanwhile, Traster fought off injuries throughout the season to play in 15 games and earn six starts. Solid at both ends of the field, the second-year player scored the game-winner against Wagner and added a pair of assists during the season.

Katie has good speed, fitness and acceleration, said Gabarra. She is capable of continually getting behind defenses and to the endline. We expect her to make huge contributions in the width for us.

ELISE MCCASKEY, JULIE REYNOLDS and **CIANNA WEIKLE** are newcomers in the midfield and will get their opportunity to shine. A mem-

ber of the 2001 and 03 Butler High School soccer teams that claimed the Western Pennsylvania Region title, McCaskey was a member of the Butler Eagle Elite 11 Team. A longtime member of the Pittsburgh Strikers club team, she and Naval Academy teammate Iris Boivin, led the strikers to the State Cup Championship in 2001, 02, 03 and 05.

Elise has a phenomenal focus and intensity, said Gabarra. Her mobility and work rate will make things happen in the midfield. She has unlimited potential in our attack. She can certainly change the outcome of games both offensively and defensively.

Reynolds hails from the state of Connecticut where she was an all-state honoree as a sophomore and a senior. She garnered First-Team Connecticut South West Conference four times and was an all-area player her final three seasons.

Julie has a great presence in the midfield and will mesh immediately with our style of play, Gabarra said. Her work rate and training mentality will enable her to step in and immediately make an impact offensively and defensively.

Finally, Weikle led her Lakeville (Minn.) High School soccer team to three-

consecutive soccer championships and in 2004, it was the state-runner-up. She was named an all-state player twice, who was also a member of four-straight State Cup Championships won by the St. Croix Elite club team.

CiAnna's work rate and mobility are superb and will enable her to put relentless defensive pressure on the ball, said Gabarra. Her energy will allow her to go forward with and without the ball and join in the attack. We expect her to flourish in our system.

Emma Hagen, Claire Henry and All-Patriot League standout Xochitl Piedra were longtime starters for the Midshipmen and anchored a traditionally stout defensive corps. But the trio, along with three-year starting goalkeeper Kim Bonafede, have moved on to successful careers in the Marine Corps and the Mids must find their shape heading into the fall.

Leading the charge on defense for the Mids will be senior captain **LINDSAY ADLAM** who has been a starter for Navy since day one. A crafty player who is relentless with her defensive pressure, Adlam is an offensive threat and is a potent play maker. But perhaps the most important role

Adlam will have this season is that of a leader, which will be essential in guiding what will be a young defensive unit.

Lindsay is a top defender in the league and an impact player in every game, said Gabarra about her 2005 captain. She is a great one-on-one defender, but it is her attacking and possession skills that make her so enjoyable to watch.

KRISTI COONFARE enters her junior campaign having started 16 of the 41 games in which

she has played in her first-two seasons. An experienced defender who is a solid decision-maker, she has the versatility to play a variety of midfield and defensive positions. Coonfare will be asked to step up her play this fall as a starter and help Navy repeat as the league's top scoring defense.

Kristi will be part of the foundation of our defense with her experience and defending presence, said Gabarra. She is a top-notch one-on-one defender and tenacious tackler who dominates in the air and makes an impact going forward.

As a rookie, **LAUREN GRIEBEL** stood out. Not just because she is one of Navy's tallest players at 5-foot-11, but her tough tackling and dominance in the air set her apart. Last season, she started seven games, including four in league action. A proven offensive threat, she scored a pair of goals and added an assist.

We will ask Lauren to be a leader for us this year in the back, said Gabarra. She knows how to organize us defensively, has a fearless demeanor and is consistent with pressure on the ball. She will also be instrumental in all of our set pieces.

Sophomore **LINDSAY PARKER** saw limited time a year ago, but should step up and be a formidable backup.

Lindsay will continue to contribute to our attacking style of play, Gabarra said. Her technical ability is her strength, while her tactical knowledge and experience has improved dramatically. She is capable of stepping in and raising

our level of play.

Freshmen **JENN DUNBAR, SAMANTHA SCHROTH** and **CAREY YOUNG** round out the defensive corps. All three come to Navy with solid credentials. Dunbar was a member of the Bethesda Rowdies which claimed three state cups, Schroth was an All-Area (Pa.) member who led her league in scoring as a forward and Young is a solid team defender. All three will be afforded the opportunity to settle into the Div. I game and contribute.

"Jenn will have a great physical presence as a central defender, and will develop rapidly with regular high level competition, said Gabarra. She will be able to step in and make a difference, both defensively and in the attack. We have a lot of faith in her potential."

"Sam will add a great work rate and strengthen our ability to solve defensive breakdowns, Gabarra said. She has the ability to step into a competitive game and maintain our level of play."

Carey has the potential to become a solid defender, especially with her ability to train with intensity and dedication, said Gabarra. She has many top defenders to train with and emulate, and I think she will have an easy transition to Div. I soccer.

Perhaps the biggest question mark heading into the season is who will stand between the posts. Three-time All-Patriot League net minder Kim Bonafede graduated last spring, leaving the position wide open. Navy's stable is full of qualified keepers, however, experience is lacking. Senior **HALEY CRAIN** is the most veteran player having seen action in nine games for a combined 166 minutes. Crain played 90 minutes in four nonconference contests a year ago, which featured her first collegiate start in the Mids 4-1 triumph over Saint Joseph's. Crain did have the luxury of spending quality time in the cage during the spring season, gaining valuable game experience.

Haley had a good spring for us, said Gabarra. She is an offensive threat with long and accurate distribution, and will consistently compete with the other goalkeepers for playing time.

Junior **AUSTIN JONES** also returns to the keeping corps vying for playing time. Jones missed the entire 2004 campaign after sustaining a knee injury in the off-season, and as a freshman, she saw action in just one contest.

We have the utmost confidence in putting Austin in goal in any situation, Gabarra said.

Navy also has two rookie keepers that will likely challenge for the starting job. **LIZZIE BARNES** was a three-sport standout at Benjamin Franklin High School in New Orleans where she directed the soccer team to back-to-back state championship titles her junior and senior years. An All-State (La.) selection, she was also named the district's defensive MVP.

Lizzie is a talented goalkeeper who makes great tactical decisions, said Gabarra. She is a good shot-stopper and will add a huge component to our tough defense. She has the potential to make the difference between winning and losing.

Fellow rookie **JILL LYONS** has a laundry list of accolades she brings with her from Shenendehowa High School in New York. She produced a school-record 40 shutouts during her high school career, while maintaining a 92.4 save percentage. She guided her soccer team to a 66-9 record over four years and was named All-State (N.Y.) as a junior and senior. Navy's coaches have high hopes she will quickly adapt to the style and speed of Div. I soccer and be able to contribute.

Jill's athleticism and technical abilities will allow her to embrace the challenge of Div. I soccer, said Gabarra. She is a great shot-stopper and is very quick off her line. She does well with the ball at her feet and is capable of making the big save.

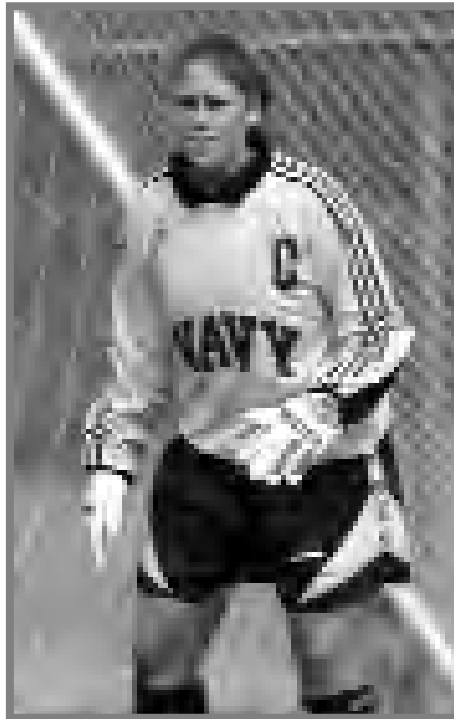

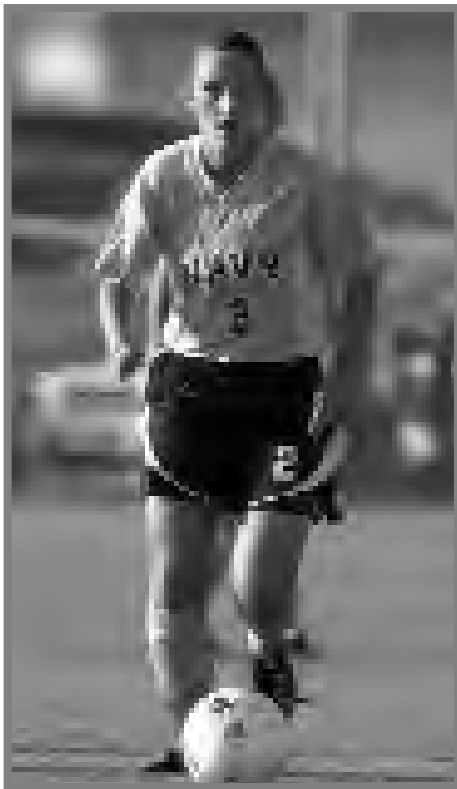

- ◆ Holy Cross men's basketball won a first-round game in the National Invitation Tournament.

Navy has dominated Army over the last 30-plus years, posting a winning record against the Black Knights 31 of the last 34 years and winning the N-star series nine-consecutive years.

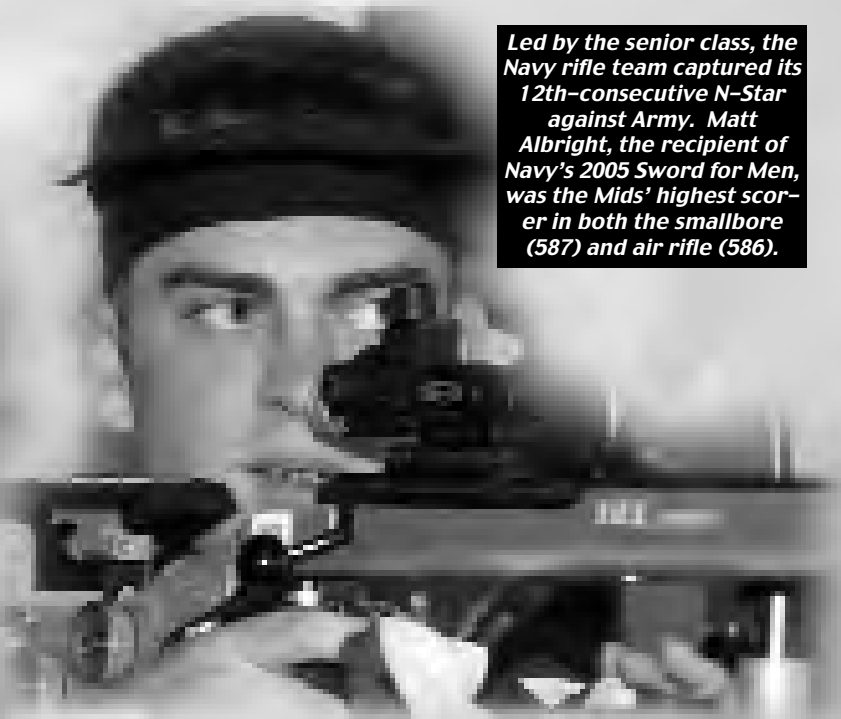
Over the past eight years the Midshipmen have won 67 percent of all athletic contests played against West Point, including an astounding 70 percent of all N-Star contests.

Taj Mathews closed out his career against his arch rival by scoring a career-high 26 points and leading Navy to an 84-69 Star Game victory over Army, Navy's 12th in the last 13 played. Mathews broke the Navy record for most three-pointers made (6) and attempted (14) in an Army-Navy contest.

Navy defeated Army in the outdoor season in dramatic fashion with the meet decided by the final event of the day. The 4x400-meter relay team defeated the Black Knights by four seconds and anchorman, plebe William Ricks, captivated the audience with a salute as he ran through the finish line.

Aubra Thomas has yet to lose an individual or relay race against Army, putting together a two-year 6-0 individual mark to go along with a 2-0 relay record. Thomas claimed wins last season in the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke events, along with the 200-yard individual medley. The victory over Army extended Navy's win streak to 16 straight over the Black Knights.



Led by the senior class, the Navy rifle team captured its 12th-consecutive N-Star against Army. Matt Albright, the recipient of Navy's 2005 Sword for Men, was the Mids' highest scorer in both the smallbore (587) and air rifle (586).

MIDSHIPMEN IN THE COMMUNITY

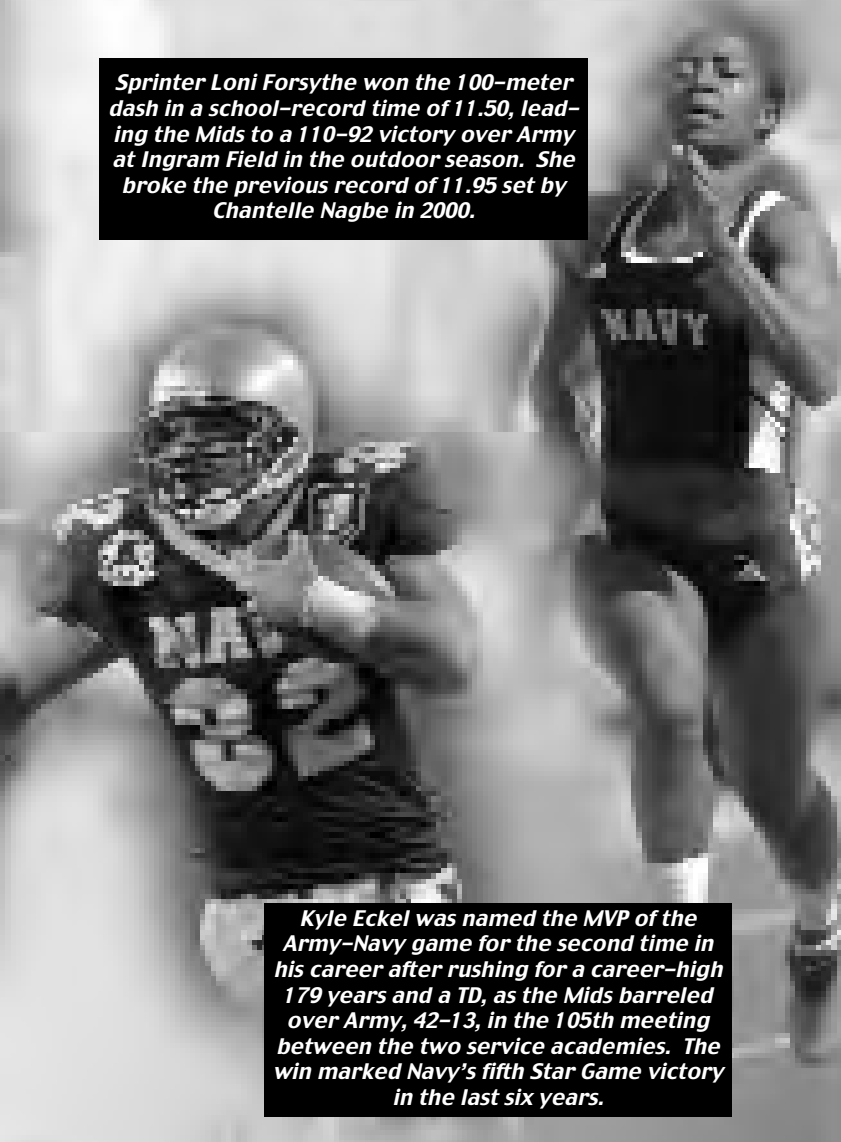
One of the challenges we continue to face is helping our children understand the importance of education and helping them realize that lofty goals are attainable. With an increasing number of collegiate athletes dropping out of school early to pursue lucrative contracts in the professional arena, we are left with the question "who are our children's role models?"

At the United States Naval Academy, the Midshipmen have to balance the rigorous requirements of education, athletics and basic military training. With Navy athletes competing at the Division I level, the demands of their sports heighten the importance of maintaining solid grades. Navy is one of the few Division I schools in which all athletes must meet stringent academic expectations. This is what makes our Midshipmen such tremendous role models, successfully maintaining that balance between athletics and academics at a highly competitive level.

The Naval Academy Athletic Association works with local schools to expose youth to the Midshipmen, with the hope of providing a lasting impression. Typically, in assembly style, the Midshipmen speak to the students about life at the Academy, the experiences of competing in Division I athletics and what they've learned while at Navy, in addition to answering the multitude of questions that the students have.

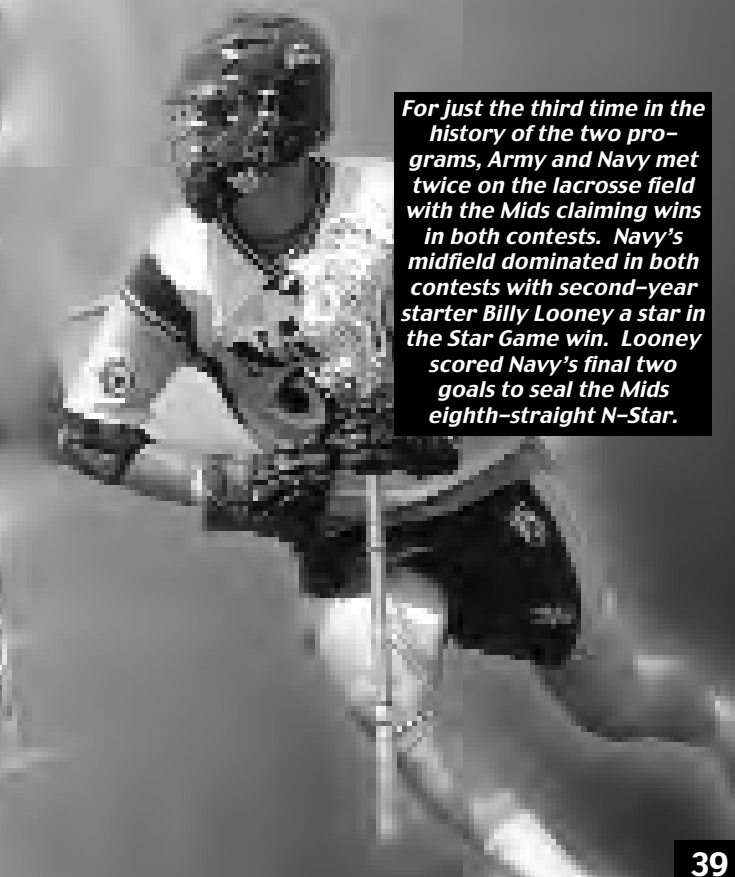


Sprinter Loni Forsythe won the 100-meter dash in a school-record time of 11.50, leading the Mids to a 110-92 victory over Army at Ingram Field in the outdoor season. She broke the previous record of 11.95 set by Chantelle Nagbe in 2000.

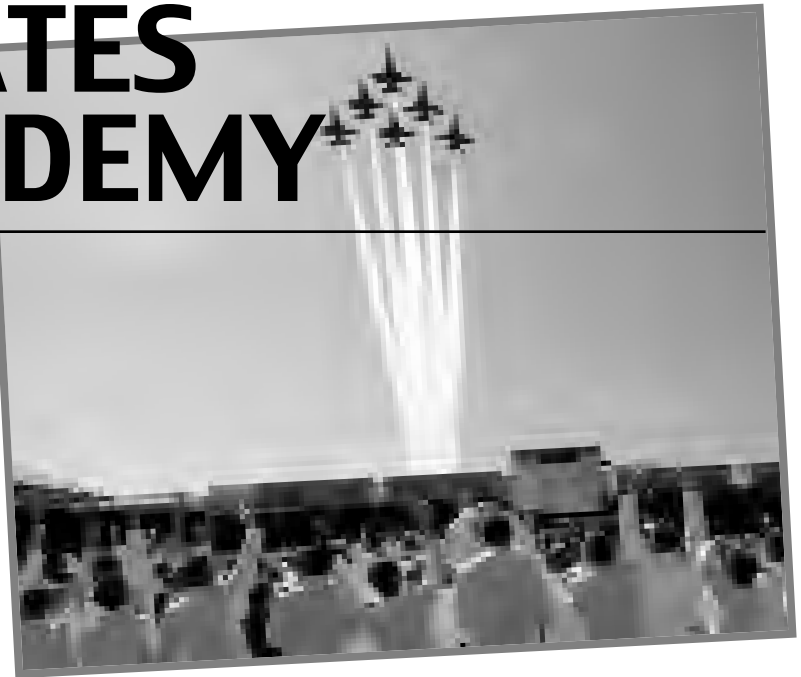


Kyle Eckel was named the MVP of the Army-Navy game for the second time in his career after rushing for a career-high 179 yards and a TD, as the Mids barreled over Army, 42-13, in the 105th meeting between the two service academies. The win marked Navy's fifth Star Game victory in the last six years.

For just the third time in the history of the two programs, Army and Navy met twice on the lacrosse field with the Mids claiming wins in both contests. Navy's midfield dominated in both contests with second-year starter Billy Looney a star in the Star Game win. Looney scored Navy's final two goals to seal the Mids eighth-straight N-Star.



UNITED STATES NAVAL ACADEMY



Secretary of the Navy George Bancroft laid the foundation for the Naval Academy when, in 1845, he established the Naval School at Fort Severn in Annapolis. Commander Franklin Buchanan served as the first Superintendent. His faculty consisted of four officers and three civilian professors. There were 50 students. Initially, the academic and professional instruction required five years the first and last at Annapolis, with the intervening three at sea.

In 1850, the Naval School became the United States Naval Academy. The following year, the Academy adopted its current course of instruction which includes four consecutive years at Annapolis, with at-sea training provided during the summers.

The Naval Academy moved to Newport, R.I., during the Civil War. In 1865, it was re-established at Annapolis under the leadership of Vice Admiral David Dixon Porter. During these early years, the Academy was one of the few institutions of higher learning offering a sophisticated undergraduate course in technical education.

The late 19th century saw immense changes in naval technology with the conversion from sail-powered, wooden ships to steam-powered vessels of steel, which also resulted in rapid developments in naval weaponry and tactics. With the Spanish-American War in 1898, the United States became a world naval power, and early Naval Academy graduates like George Dewey and Alfred Thayer Mahan made significant contributions to our national heritage.

The new century saw the nation's undergraduate naval college grow in size and academic prowess. The Class of 1895 had produced 41 graduates. By World War I, there were nearly 200 graduates each year, along with 2,500 reserve officers who received their training at the Academy.

With the entry of the United States into World War I, courses were shortened to three years, a program which remained in effect

until 1921.

Between the two world wars, the curriculum and training equipment were modernized to keep pace with rapid advances in the naval profession and American education. In 1930, the Association of American Universities accredited the Naval Academy, and in 1933, an act of Congress authorized the Naval Academy to confer the degree of bachelor of science on graduates, beginning with the Class of 1931. Congress authorized award of the degree to all living graduates in 1939. The Middle Atlantic States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools first accredited the Academy in 1947.

During World War II, summer sessions were instituted and the course was again shortened to three years. As during World War I, reserve officers, along with reserve midshipmen, also trained at the Academy.

In 1963, the Academy initiated the Trident Scholar Program, under which a number of exceptional students are permitted to pursue independent research during the first class (senior) year.

The 1964-65 academic year saw the civilian positions of academic dean and dean of admissions established and far-reaching changes made to the curriculum. The number of required core courses was reduced and, for the first time, each midshipman was allowed to pursue academic areas of individual interest for minor or major. Additional changes, introduced in the 1969-70 academic year, now require every midshipman to complete a major.

In 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed legislation authorizing admission of women to the service academies. The first women midshipmen entered the Academy in July 1976 and graduated with the Class of 1980.

MIDSHIPMEN LIFE

It all begins with fourth class year. From their first day at the Academy, the fourth class midshipmen, or plebes, undergo an intensive and unabated program of military training and indoctrination. Physical and mental demands on them and their time seem never-ending. But it all has a purpose: the development of leadership ability, motivation, moral strength, physical skills and stamina.

Plebe Summer is a time which most midshipmen will remember for many years. New midshipmen are kept constantly busy learning basic skills in seamanship, navigation and marksmanship. Their pride and company spirit are boosted through infantry drill, small arms train-

ing, sailing Navy yawls and cruising in yard patrol craft. Their competitive spirit and desire to win are developed in activities such as athletics, dress parades and seamanship.

Plebe Summer is highlighted in August during Parents Weekend, when parents visit the Academy and witness the progress of their sons and daughters.

The arrival of the upperclassmen in mid-August heralds the beginning of the academic year. The plebes embark on a four-year course of study while plebe indoctrination continues.

September brings the excitement of football and other fall sports. During the football season, only selected units of the brigade travel to away games, but the entire brigade attends all home games and the annual fall classic, the Army-Navy game.

Commissioning Week, in May, brings the graduation of the first classmen and the end of plebe year. Plebes signify the end of the first year at the Academy by scaling the smooth granite sides of Herndon Monument to replace, at its summit, a plebe cap with an upperclass cover.

Between plebe and third class years, midshipmen get their first taste of life at sea and their introduction to the enlisted men whom they will lead when commissioned as officers. Joining ships around the world, midshipmen perform a host of ship-board duties including standing deck, gunnery, operations and engineering watches. Midshipmen also have their first opportunity to visit foreign countries and experience different cultures.

Third classmen begin work in their academic majors and assume more responsibility in the military regimen at the Academy. Less emphasis is placed on indoctrination, leaving more time for studies, sports and extracurricular activities. It's a welcome change from the rigors of plebe year.

During their third summer, midshipmen get their first training in four warfare specialties which comprise the naval service. They learn about submarines at New London, Conn.; surface warfare at Norfolk, Va.; naval aviation at Pensacola, Fla.; and the Marine Corps at Quantico, Va.

Second class midshipmen are assigned still additional military responsibilities. They are selected and trained to direct the Brigade of Midshipmen during absences of the first class. They are also assigned an important role in indoctrination of the new plebe class, which develops their leadership skills. In academics, the second class midshipmen enter increasingly advanced areas of study.

During their final year at the Academy, first class midshipmen

complete the core curriculum and their academic majors course requirements. Many undertake independent research projects, and some begin graduate-level studies at nearby universities. The first class midshipmen also take over the responsibilities for plebe indoctrination. They also lead the brigade at parades, formal ceremonies and daily formations. They are responsible for the conduct, military smartness and competitive records of their units. The skills which the first class midshipmen develop this year will help them when they assume their leadership responsibilities in the Navy and Marine Corps following graduation.

One common denominator which binds the four years into a unit which will forever shape the life of an Academy graduate is the Honor Concept.

Established and administered by midshipmen, the Honor Concept is based on the principle that honorable individuals do not lie, cheat or steal. All midshipmen are expected to conduct their lives in accordance with the Honor Concept so that their decisions as midshipmen, naval officers and civilians reflect the highest levels of honorable conduct.

THE CURRICULUM

With the aid of academic and military advisors, midshipmen design their own blend of the curriculum's three elements:

- ¥ Courses providing the professional and leadership skills required in the naval service.

- ¥ Core requirements in engineering, social sciences, natural sciences and the humanities to ensure breadth in education.

- ¥ Completion of a major program in an academic subject chosen by each midshipman to develop individual interests and talents in depth.

The Naval Academy offers major programs in 19 subject areas: eight in engineering; seven in sciences and mathematics, including computer science, as well as information technology, the most recent addition; and four in the humanities and social sciences. Seven of the engineering majors are accredited professionally by the Engineering Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology.

Selected humanities and social science majors with excellent records are invited to enter the rigorous honors programs offered by the departments of Economics, English, History and Political Science.



Outstanding students also have the opportunity to engage in independent study and research during their senior year. Those selected as Trident Scholars carry a reduced formal course load so they can pursue a major research project and prepare a thesis. They are assisted by one or more faculty advisors who specialize in the field of study.

A number of first class midshipmen who complete academic requirements early are encouraged to enroll in graduate classes at area universities. This Voluntary Graduate Education Program gives them the chance to graduate and receive commissions with their classmates, finish their graduate studies locally and then go to their first assignments with a master's degree.

All midshipmen undertake professional military training, beginning on the first day of Plebe Summer and continuing through first class year. This includes classroom studies, drills and practical training at the Naval Academy and with Navy and Marine Corps units during summer programs. Navigation, seamanship, tactics, naval engineering, weapons, leadership and military law are among the areas studied. To advance and graduate, midshipmen must pass professional competency examinations covering general knowledge and subjects related to their service selection.

The Naval Academy's physical education program complements academic and professional development of midshipmen. Instruction and training aim to develop individual skills and competitive spirit, life-long habits of physical fitness, and the capability to withstand physical hardship when necessary. All midshipmen must complete the four-year program which includes the Physical Readiness Test (twice annually), water survival, physical development, personal defense and lifetime carryover sports. Women participate in the same curriculum, including boxing, wrestling and judo.

COMMISSIONING WEEK

Six days of parades, athletic events, colorful ceremonies, formal dances and receptions bring to a climax four years of challenging education and training.

One highlight of Commissioning Week is Color Parade. Each year, intra-brigade competition is conducted to determine which of the 30 companies stands highest overall on the basis of academics, intramural sports, professional drills and parade performance. During the parade, the color girl, who is selected by the Color Company commander, transfers the flags from the past Color Company to the new one.

The biggest social event of Commissioning Week is the ring dance for the second class midshipmen. An elegant formal affair, it is at this event that the midshipmen begin wearing their class rings.

First class midshipmen and their families attend the superintendent's garden party and reception, plus other social events. Athletic, academic and professional awards are presented in Alumni Hall. The evening before graduation, everyone is invited to attend the farewell ball.

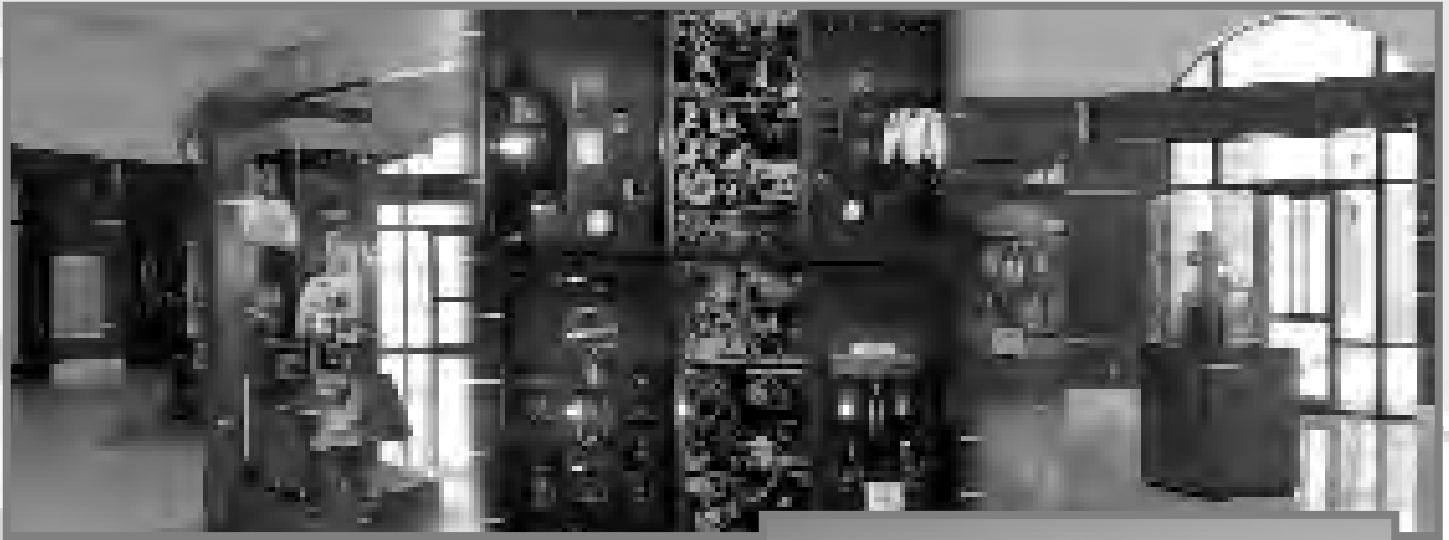
On graduation day, friends and relatives gather with the midshipmen at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. After the diplomas are presented and the oath of office is administered, the senior midshipman of the new first class leads three cheers for "those about to leave us." The graduates, led by the class president, reply with three cheers for "those we leave behind." On the last hooray of this cheer, the 1,000 graduates toss their midshipmen covers into the air. According to tradition, the honor of putting on the new Navy Ensign and Marine Corps Second Lieutenant shoulder devices is shared by mothers and Commissioning Week dates.

men's and women's varsity soccer teams.

"With my experience and the facilities that I've seen, this facility has to rank as one of the best in the country, if not the best," said former Navy men's head coach Greg Myers, who retired in the spring of 2004. "I have had a number of referees and coaches that have seen our facility and have said the same thing, that this is probably the finest in the country. For us to have an exclusive field and facilities that are ours year round, it is probably the best in the country."

"Once you have one of the best facilities in the country, you can attract better recruits and better opponents and that is what we are aiming for," Navy women's head coach Carin Gabarra said. "We want to be able to play in the best facility possible and now we get to train in this nice facility day-in-and-day-out. It will attract bigger and better recruits and help improve our program now and in the long run. It is gorgeous. Our goal was to have a flat field with bermuda grass and we now have one of the best soccer fields in the country. That was our biggest goal. Then we got the building, too and it has everything you could ever want in it."

The facility is named after Navy's legendary men's coach Glenn Warner, who guided the Midshipmen to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, four Final Four appearances, one national championship, 28 winning seasons and a record of 243-65-31 during his 30-year tenure. In a stretch from 1962-67, Warner's teams put together a string of 48 regular-season victories without a defeat (70-6-3) and qualified for five-straight NCAA Tournaments. Warner, who produced 26 All-Americans, was recently inducted into the Soccer Hall of Fame and is a recipient of soccer's top award, The Honor Award.

The cornerstone of the project is the Anders Hall of Honor, made possible by Maj. General William A. Anders, USAFR, and family, in appreciation of Warner and to recognize the leadership, character and commitment of former Naval Academy soccer players.

On Nov. 9, 2001, the United States Naval Academy dedicated the new Glenn Warner Soccer Facility prior to the Navy men's soccer game against Bucknell.

The \$4.5 million Glenn Warner Soccer Facility is a prime example of one of the Naval Academy's latest accomplishments, while raising the bar of excellence.

One of the finest college soccer facilities in the nation, the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility was financed entirely by private contributions, designed by the architectural firm of Cochran, Stephenson & Donkervoet and constructed by Whiting-Turner, Inc. The 16,300-square-foot facility houses the Naval Academy's



The Anders Hall of Honor features 13 trophy cases and display areas of cherry cabinetry that depict Navy's storied soccer history and tradition. From former Navy soccer players who achieved excellence in military service and leadership, to past Navy All-Americans and team captains, the "Hall of Honor" pays tribute to former Midshipmen and their military, civilian and athletic accomplishments. Designed by Murphy & Orr Exhibits, the 60-foot diameter lobby also features Navy's five men's soccer National Championships (1931, '43, '44, '45, '64). Warner's one and only unbeaten squad captured the 1964 National Championship. The floor of the lobby is terrazzo and features a 15-foot Naval Academy crest in the center. The Anders Hall of Honor gives the coaching staff a place to meet, greet and entertain recruits and midshipmen candidates, while experiencing the rich tradition of Navy soccer.

Former Navy Director of Athletics Jack Lengyel, who helped the project get off the ground before retiring, raved about the new facility and the support from Anders.

"I want to thank General Anders for his leadership and outstanding support of the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility," Lengyel said. "I think it is a great tribute to General Anders as a leader and a person that has never forgotten his roots of where he came from and also a tribute to his relationship with Coach Warner. This facility is a product of a coach-and-player relationship that Anders claims provided him the opportunity to be who he is and give him the chance to achieve what he was able to achieve."

The home team wing highlights Navy's commitment to soccer and the future with two spacious team locker rooms, coaches offices and locker rooms, a fully-equipped training room, laundry and equipment rooms. The 1,300-square-foot men's and women's team locker rooms are equipped with custom-made wooden lockers for each athlete, a video projector and screen for viewing and analyzing of practice and game film. The 375-square-foot training room contains training tables, modern whirlpool, ultrasound and physical therapy equipment, and provides Navy's scholar-athletes with the most complete and advanced treatment in the country. Five equipment storage spaces provide 600-square feet for storage space and laundry service.

The visiting team wing of 4,300-square feet contains two spacious locker rooms, officials locker room, ticket office, public restrooms and a concessions area.

The facility has a 120-yards by 75-yards flat bermuda-grass playing surface and a modern drainage system, allowing the field to withstand heavy rain. A state-of-the-art, scoreboard, funded by the Class of 1983, was erected at one end of the field. The stadium seats approximately 2,500 fans and provides fans with optimal viewing with room for further expansion.

Stacy Finley

1982-2005

On March 24, 2005, the Navy women's soccer program and the United States Navy lost a member of their family when Stacy Finley passed away of a sudden illness. She was 22 years old.

The daughter of Alan and Veruzina Finley, Stacy enriched the lives of many, including through her many years as an athlete. A truly unselfish player, teammate and friend, she often spoke of her team's achievements and shied away from her own personal honors and success.

Stacy finished her career at Navy as perhaps the most decorated player in school and league history. Honored three times as an all-league player, she was twice named the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year and twice named to the National Soccer Coaches Association of America Mid-Atlantic Region team.

She graduated as Navy's record holder in career points, goals and shots and owns single-season records in points, goals, assists and shots.

One of the proudest weeks of her collegiate career came during her senior season. She became Navy's all-time leading goal scorer with her game winner Oct. 3, 2003 against Delaware, while her hat trick four days later against American gave her Navy's all-time points title.

Stacy was instrumental in guiding Navy to its first Patriot League Tournament title in 2003 and as well as an NCAA Tournament berth — the first Div. I NCAA Tournament appearance by any women's athletic team at the Naval Academy.

Stacy's hard work in the classroom did not go unnoticed. She was named to the Commandant's List multiple times and acknowledged by the Patriot League twice for academic success. Additionally, she was recognized as a leader in Bancroft Hall, where she served as Regiment 1st Lt. in her First Class year.

Stacy graduated from the Naval Academy in May of 2004 with a degree in quantitative economics. Upon graduation, she was commissioned an Ensign into the United States Navy where she had planned a career in the supply corps.

To honor Stacy, the Midshipmen will wear her number - 14 - on their uniform this season. In addition, the Navy women's soccer program has established the Ensign Stacy M. Finley Memorial Award which will be presented to that 11C member of the women's soccer team whose courage, will to win, dedication, and love of her teammates will forever endure.
