### 2006-07 Game Notes

#### #9 Seed Charlotte Takes On #8 Seed Dayton in A-10 First Round

Two Teams Split Regular-Season Meetings; Winer To Face #1 Xavier

**THE ATLANTIC 10 TOURNAMENT:** The Charlotte 49ers (14-15; 7-9) are seeded ninth in the 2007 A-10 Tournament (Mar. 7-10; Atlantic City, N.J.). Charlotte will face #8 seed Dayton in the first round (Wed., 12:00 p.m.) with the winner advancing to take on top-seed Xavier (Thurs., 12:00 p.m.). Charlotte is 0-1 all-time in A-10 Tournament play. Last year, #2 seed Charlotte lost to #10 seed Xavier, in Cincinnati, Ohio, 59-55. Charlotte and Dayton split their regular-season meetings this year with each team winning at home. Charlotte is 2-1 in games at neutral sites this year (all three neutral games were played at the Rainbow Classic in Hawai'i, where Charlotte lost to Houston and beat Valparaiso and Wyoming). Head coach Bobby Lutz is one win shy of the 350th of his career.

**100-POINT CLUB:** With 29 points at Duquesne, Feb. 21, **De'Angelo Alexander** became the 21st player in school history to reach 1000 points and the first to do so since **Curtis Withers** and **Eddie Basden** joined the club in 2005. He is also the fifth 49er to reach 1000 in just two playing seasons (**Henry Williams**, **Lew Massey**, **Robert Earl Blue** and **George Jackson**). With 16 points vs. George Washington, Mar. 1, junior **Leemire Goldwire** became the 22nd 49er to reach 1000 points. Alexander and Goldwire are the first teammates to reach 1000 since Withers and Basden in 2005.

**HOT GOLD: Leemire Goldwire**, who had back-to-back 20+ games at Duquesne (22) and Temple (26), scored 20+ points six times in A-10 play. He averaged 16.0 points in A-10 play, shooting .450 from three-point range.

**"THREE"-MIRE & "THREE"-ANGELO: Leemire Goldwire** (6th all-time; 209 career threes) and **De'Angelo Alexander** (8th all-time; 172 career threes) are both among the 49ers' all-time top 10 in career three-pointers made. Goldwire, just the sixth 49er to surpass 200 career threes, needs 2 three-pointers to tie **Brendan Plavich** (211) for 5th all-time. Alexander needs seven treys to tie **Shanderic Downs** (179) for seventh all-time.

**DRAYTON ACES BOARDS: E.J. Drayton**, who had four of his team-high seven double-doubles in A-10 play, returned from a red-shirt season to lead Charlotte and rank second in the A-10 with 8.6 rebounds per game. His 16-point; 13-rebound double-double against UMass was just the second double-double recorded against UMass' Rashaun Freeman and Stephane Lasme. The 13 rebounds in

**20-SOMETHINGS:** In A-10 play, three 49ers have combined for 12 20-point performances. **Leemire Goldwire** led Charlotte with six 20-point outings in A-10 play, including a career-high 30 vs. Dayton, 26 at Temple and 25 vs. both La Salle and Richmond. **De'Angelo Alexander** had five of his team-high 11 20-point efforts vs. A-10 foes, including a career-high 35 vs. Fordham, 29 at Duquesne and 27 vs. St. Joseph's. **E.J. Drayton** posted the other 20-point effort, scoring a career-high 26 vs. La Salle.

## INSIDE THE STATS:

**REIGNING THREES:** Charlotte led the A-10 in three-pointers made (8.7/gm) and have hit 10 or more in five (3-2) of the last six games with a season-high of 13 vs. both Duquesne and UL Lafayette.

**MORE ON THREES:** Charlotte is averaging 8.72 three-pointers per game, the second-most in the 9-year tenure of head coach Bobby Lutz. The most came in 2000-01 when Charlotte ranked second in the nation with 9.24 threes made per game.

**SURPRISING:** Charlotte is only 5-7 when it hits double-digit threes. The 49ers have hit double-digit threes in 10 (5-5) of the last 16 games.

**NOT SURPRISING:** Charlotte is 7-1 when it shoots at least 40% from three-point range.

**OFFENSIVE REBOUNDS:** Charlotte is averaging 13.14 offensive rebounds, while opponents average just 9.14 (OF NOTE: Richmond was held to a season-low one offensive rebound, Jan. 13).

**CHARGE!:** E.J. Drayton leads the 49ers with 33 charges taken. He took a season-high four at Xavier.

**ROAD WOES:** Charlotte is just 2-10 in true road games, but was 2-1 in neutral site games.

**NO LEAGUE LEADER IN THREES:** For the first time since Bobby Lutz took over as head coach, a 49er is not likely to lead its league in three-pointers made. Leemire Goldwire leads the 49ers and ranks third in the A-10 while De' Angelo Alexander ranks fifth in the A-10. Rhode Island's Jimmy Baron tops the league.

**GOOD AS GOLD:** Leemire Goldwire's .902 free throw pct. ranks 4th all-time for the 49ers and is the best since Jobey Thomas shot a school-record .909 from the line in 2001.

## TO WATCH FOR:

**Bobby Lutz** is one win shy of his 350th career victory.

**Bobby Lutz** is within 14 wins of becoming the 49ers all-time winningest coach. Lutz has 167 wins with the 49ers. **Jeff Mullins** holds the school record with 182.

**Leemire Goldwire** (209; 6th all-time) needs 2 three-pointers to tie Brendan Plavich (211) for 5th all-time in career three-pointers made.

**De'Angelo Alexander** (172; 8th all-time) needs 7 threes to tie **Shanderic Downs** (179) for 7th-place all-time in career threes.

**Ian Andersen** (39) passed **Diego Guevara** (38) for 5th-place all-time among 49ers freshmen in three-pointers made and needs 1 three-pointer to tie **Leemire Goldwire** (40) for 4th-place.

**E.J. Drayton** has 4 double-doubles in A-10 play, seven overall.

**E.J. Drayton** has pulled at least eight rebounds in 20 games.

The 49ers are 5-1 when **Carlos Williams** scores in double figures.

Charlotte hit a season-high 13 threes twice recently: vs. UL Lafayette and Duquesne. They have hit at least 8 in seven of the last eight games.

Charlotte is 0-6 in games in which it has stood at .500 (1-1; 2-2; 6-6; 8-8; 12-12; 13-13).

In three of the last four losses, opponents shot over 50%: Xavier (.636); Rhode Island (.611); Temple (.519). In seven of the last eight losses, opponents have shot at least .462. (GW shot .426 in their victory over Charlotte)

## LEAGUE FINISHES

Over the last three years, the 49ers own a C-USA regular-season title (2004: 12-4); a C-USA regular-season runner-up finish (2005: 12-4) and an Atlantic 10 runner-up finish (2006: 11-5), going 35-13 in league play. The 24-8 league record in the final two years of Conference USA matched Cincinnati for the best record over that span.

## 35 LEAGUE WINS IN 3 YEARS:

Charlotte has won 35 league games in the last 3 years, posting one regular-season championship and two runner-up finishes. Charlotte went 12-4 to win the 2004 C-USA regular-season title; 12-4 to place 2nd in the 2005 regular-season and 11-5 to place 2nd in the A-10, this year.

## THE NINERESSENTIALS

The 2005-06 season was the 49ers first as a member of the Atlantic 10 Conference. Charlotte spent 10 years in Conference USA, boasting the league's 2nd-most successful program (behind Cincinnati). The A-10 is the 49ers fourth Division I Conference (Sun Belt, Metro, C-USA).

Head coach **Bobby Lutz**, who coached his 500th career game against Indiana, last year, is in his ninth year at the helm. In the first eight years, Lutz has been to a school-record 5 NCAA Tournaments, posted 4 20-win seasons and captured 3 League Championships.

## CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Head coach Bobby Lutz has announced that seniors **E.J. Drayton** and **De'Angelo Alexander** and junior **Leemire Goldwire** have been named tri-captains for the 2006-07.

## NEWCOMERS

Charlotte's roster boasts a strong crop of newcomers, with two junior college players and three scholarshiped freshmen. Junior guard **Carlos Williams**, considered by many as the top junior college point guard, is tabbed as the Niners starting point guard and could have a profound impact on the team. Junior shooting forward **Sean Phaler** helped Fullerton J.C. to an unbeaten season, last year. Freshmen **Ian Andersen** and **Charles Dewhurst** provide the 49ers with versatile wing players who can shoot, rebound and run the floor. Forward **David Booker**, a preseason A-10 all-Rookie choice will see quality time in the 49ers frontcourt rotation.

## Head Coach Bobby Lutz:

The 49ers second all-time winningest coach, **Bobby Lutz** (pronounced "Loots") is **168-111 (.602)** in eight years as head coach of the Charlotte 49ers. He owns a 16-year **career mark of 349-202**. He holds the 49ers career coaching record with five NCAA Tournament trips. He is only the second coach in 49ers history to reach 100 wins (Jeff Mullins, 182-142). Lutz has advanced to post-season play in seven of eight seasons (NCAA - 1999; 2001; 2002; 2004; 2005; NIT - 2000; 2006); earned five berths to the NCAA Tournament (advancing to the 2nd round twice), won two C-USA Tournament titles (1999, 2001) and one C-USA regular-season title (2004).

In 2005, he was a finalist for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award after going 21-8 and advancing as high as #18 in the AP poll. In 2004, he was named the Mid-Atlantic Region Coach of the Year by Basketball Times after a 21-9 season that included a perfect 3-0 record vs. Top 10 teams.

In 1999, he became the third 49ers first-year coach to amass a 20-win season (Lee Rose; Melvin Watkins). He is 11-6 in conference tournament action; and 2-5 in NCAA Tournament action.

He produced a 23-11 record in his first season, capturing the Conference USA Championship with four wins in four days and an NCAA Tournament berth. That team produced the program's highest NCAA seed (#5), the program's highest RPI (#18) and a final AP rank of #24.

Lutz, a 1980 UNC Charlotte High Honors graduate, coached Pfeiffer University from 1986-95 and produced a program-best record of 181-91 (.665) including marks of 22-11, 29-4, 30-5, 23-6, 24-6 and 25-8 in his last six seasons for a combined mark of 153-42 (.785) from 1990-95. His Falcons played in six straight NAIA National Tourneys, including the "Final Four" in 1991, '92, and '95 (title game), the "Elite Eight" in 1990 and the "Sweet 16" in 1994.

Lutz joined the Charlotte program as an assistant in **Jeff Mullins'** 11th and final year (he retired), 1995-96, and was a **Melvin Watkins'** assistant from 1996-98. He was named head coach April 9, 1998 after being appointed Interim Head Coach, March 31 ... Lutz' current contract runs through 2008-09, which would give him 11 seasons as 49ers head coach, which will match Jeff Mullins (1985-96) for the longest tenure of a 49ers men's hoop coach.

## Awards and Honors for Lutz:

**Bobby Lutz** was a finalist for the 2005 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award after leading Charlotte to a 21-8 record and C-USA runner-up finish and a four-week stay in the national polls... he was the 2004 Mid-Atlantic Region Coach of the Year by Basketball Times after leading Charlotte to a 21-9 record, a share of the Conference USA Regular-Season Championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Lutz was inducted into the UNC Charlotte Alumni Hall of Fame, Nov. 9, 2002. In the summer of 2002, Lutz was named Carolinas "Father of the Year".

Lutz is on the Pfeiffer University Board of Directors. He was inducted into the Pfeiffer Hall of Fame, Oct. 9, 1999. Pfeiffer hosts the annual Bobby Lutz Tournament in Misenheimer, N.C. each Thanksgiving. Head coach at Pfeiffer for nine years, Lutz put Pfeiffer (N.C.) basketball on the map, taking the NCAA II school to six NAIA Tournaments, including three "Final Fours" and one NAIA National Runner-Up finish.

A resident of Harrisburg, N.C., Lutz was Grand Marshall of the 2001 Harrisburg, N.C. 4th of July Parade, and was presented a key to the city following the team's 2001 C-USA Championship.

## Lutz' Staff:

Associate Head Coach **Rob Moxley** returned to the 49ers after a one-year hiatus at Maryland. He was on Lutz' staff for seven years as an assistant before heading to Maryland, last year. He returned to take over the Associate Head Coach position, this year.

A former four-year letterwinner for the 49ers, **Bobby Kummer** is in his fourth season as a 49ers assistant coach, two of which came under Lutz. Kummer was an assistant under Melvin Watkins from 1996-98 before following Watkins to Texas A&M for six years. He rejoined the 49ers staff in 2004-05 as Director of Basketball Operations and was named assistant coach for 2005-06.

**Chris Cheeks**, a former standout at Virginia Commonwealth, is in his first year as an assistant coach with the 49ers.

## HONORS FOR DE'ANGELO ALEXANDER:

**ALEXANDER A NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR CANDIDATE:** Senior All-America candidate **De'Angelo Alexander** was selected as one of the nation's Top 50 candidates for the Wooden National Player of the Year Award and a Top 30 candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. As a Top 50 Wooden selection, Alexander is a Wooden Award pre-season all-America. Alexander is averaging 17.9 points (4th in the A-10) and scored 20 or more 11 times, including five A-10 games. He has also added three double-doubles: vs. Xavier (12 pts; 10 rebs), Houston (10 pts; 10 rebs) and Wofford (14 pts; 11 rebs). He pulls 7.2 rebounds. A first-team all-Atlantic 10 selection, last year, Alexander is a preseason first-team all-A-10 choice, as well. He is the A-10's top returning scorer. This is the third straight year that a 49er is on the Wooden Award list. Curtis Withers (playing professionally in Turkey) was on it the last two seasons.

**ALEXANDER UP FOR SENIOR "CLASS" AWARD:** **De'Angelo Alexander** is one of the nation's Top 30 candidates for the 2007 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award -- the nation's premier tribute to college seniors. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the award recognizes seniors who excel both on and off the court. The award, in particular, highlights performance in the four "C"'s: Court, Classroom, Character and Community.

**BIG THREE:** Charlotte's tri-captains: Seniors **De'Angelo Alexander** and **E.J. Drayton** and junior **Leemire Goldwire**, as expected, are the offensive leaders for the 49ers, this year. All three are averaging in double figures and the trio have combined for 22 20-point games and 12 double-doubles.

**... BUT:** Balance is the key to any team and Charlotte is 5-11 when only Alexander, Goldwire and/or Drayton score in double figures. If another 49er gets into double figures, as **Jerell Jamison (15 pts.)** did vs. Duquesne, Charlotte is 9-4.

Goldwire's scoring spree was highlighted by a three-pointer at the halftime buzzer over 6-10 Kurt Huelsman. Said Goldwire, "I couldn't even see the goal."

**LEEMIRE ON THE LINE:**

Junior **Leemire Goldwire**, who set the school record with 39 consecutive free throws, last season, hit 12-of-12 vs. Hofstra, including 10-of-10 in the final 67 seconds to ice the six-point win. He hit 10-of-10 vs. La Salle, including 6-of-6 in the final 31 seconds to ice the seven-point win and hit 8-of-8 in the final 44 seconds of the Niners four-point win over Fordham. **DRAYTON BOARDED UP:**

Senior **E.J. Drayton (8.6 reb/gm)** ranks second in the A-10 in rebounding. He was option #1 in the 49ers attempt to replace double-double-man **Curtis Withers**, who ranked fourth in the NCAA with 11.3 rebounds, last year. He has responded. Drayton has notched seven double-doubles and pulled a career-high 13 rebounds three times (Hofstra, N. Texas, UMass) and hit double figures in boards nine times (11 at Richmond; vs. La Salle, 10 vs. Fordham, vs. Richmond, at Mississippi State and Indiana.) He has pulled at least eight in 20 games. His career-high

entering the season was nine rebounds. He has matched or surpassed that number 14 times.

**HITTING THE BOARDS:** In its last five wins, Charlotte has won the battle of the boards, with two of those coming with double-digit margins: +24 vs. Richmond; +10 vs. UL Lafayette. Charlotte has won the battle of the boards in each of its victories and 17 times overall. Charlotte has enjoyed a double-digit rebounding margin seven times. The +24 rebounding advantage over Richmond is the 49ers' largest rebounding margin of the year. Charlotte is 3rd in the A-10 in rebounding (36.1/gm) and 5th in rebounding margin (+2.4). **E.J. Drayton** has hit double-digit boards nine times and is second in the A-10 with 8.6 rebounds per game. **De'Angelo Alexander** ranks 9th in the league at 7.2. **Jerrell Jamison** is third on the team in rebounding and pulls 5.5 boards in A-10 play.

**PHALER'S BREAK OUT:** Over a recent three-game stretch (UL-Lafayette; Rhode Island; Duquesne), **Sean Phaler** averaged 8.7 points while shooting .571 (8-of-14) from long range. He came off the bench to hit 3-of-3 three-pointers and score a career-high 11 points in the win over Louisiana-Lafayette. He also hit 2-of-4 threes for six points at Rhode Island and 3-of-7 threes for nine points at Duquesne. Considered a dangerous three-point threat, Phaler had hit just 2-of-21 long rangers prior to that spree. "When he believes in himself, he can't miss. We see it all the time. Top freshman **Ian Andersen** is the first freshman guard to see double-digit starts (14 starts) since **Jobey Thomas** in 1998-99. Thomas averaged 7.6 points and hit a freshman record 61 threes. Andersen is averaging 4.7 points and has hit 39 threes. (Note: teammate **Leemire Goldwire** averaged 6.2 points as a freshman, hitting 40 three-pointers, but he did not make any starts). Cited for his work ethic and energy, as well as his ability to quickly pick up the system, Andersen is one of five 49ers currently averaging at least 19 minutes (19.2). He has hit double figures three times: twice scoring a season-best 11 points: vs. Wofford 3-6 3FG) and vs. Georgia State (3-5 3FG) and adding 10 at George Washington (4-9 FG). #### **CAPS AND GOWNS**

In each of the last two years, the 49ers entire senior class has graduated. Last year, **Curtis Withers**, **Chris Nance** and **Marcus Bennett**, **Mitchell Baldwin** and **Tripp Miller** all graduated. The previous year's seniors: **Eddie Basden** (Africana Studies), **Brendan Plavich** (History), and **Chris Sager** (Business) also all graduated.

#### **GOLDWIRE SETS FREE THROW STREAK:**

With a pair of free throws at La Salle, last year, **Leemire Goldwire** broke all-time leading scorer **Henry Williams'** record (37, 1990-91) with 39 consecutive made free throws. Goldwire's streak ended at 39, one shy of the A-10 record (40, UMass' Donta Bright, 1996).
