Eight newcomers, four of whom became starters, helped the new-look Niners elbow their way back into post-season play, back into contention in the Atlantic 10 and back into the national basketball picture. They won 20 games, earned a post-season bid and were among the league's top four teams. They did it by diving on floors, chasing loose balls, leaping press rows and banging the boards. They did it by making the extra pass, making game-saving stops and making game-winning shots.

You might say they did it the old-fashioned way.

Or you might say they did it the new Niner way.



## CHARLOTTE 49ERS BASKETBALL, 2008-09

The Charlotte 49ers are hot off head coach Bobby Lutz's eighth post-season tournament appearance and fifth 20-win season -- and they return nine of the team's top 10 players -- many of whom made up the Niners' 13th-ranked recruiting class of 2007-08.

Lutz, who has been at the 49ers' helm for 10 years, owns five NCAA Tournament appearances and three NIT showings. He became the 49ers all-time winningest coach as Charlotte went 20-14, notching the fifth 20-win season under Lutz and earning a spot in the 2008 NIT.

Now Lutz and the 49ers would like to win their first Atlantic 10 title since joining the league three years ago. Charlotte won three conference titles under Lutz as one of the top teams in Conference USA.

The 49ers strength will lie in their returning players -- nine of whom averaged over five minutes a game. The bulk of the returners helped make up the 49ers' 13th-ranked recruiting class of 2007-08 and includes four returning starters.

Experience will be on the side of the 49ers, who return their entire starting frontcourt: seniors Lamont Mack and Charlie Coley and sophomore An'Juan Wilderness. Mack was the 49ers second leading scorer (12.8 ppg) and rebounder (5.1 rpg), Coley, who averaged 8.7 points, was the leading rebounder (6.2 rpg) and resident shot-blocker (team-high 46 blocks), while Atlantic 10 all-Rookie choice Wilderness added 8.1 points, 4.9 rebounds and a .482 field goal pct. Sophomores Phil Jones and Gaby Ngoundjo give the 49ers presence in the post while versatile Charles Dewhurst complements the attack with the ability to make game-changing plays in the clutch.

The backcourt will be without Leemire Goldwire, who graduated after leading the team with an 18.6 scoring average, but its tandem of point guards DiJuan Harris and Michael Gerrity is back. Harris passed out a team-high 108 assists, led the A-10 with a 2.77 A-TO ratio and was third on the team in steals while Gerrity averaged 4.7 points and added a team-high 3.5 assists after joining the team at the end of the first semester.

Sharpshooter Goldwire, who ranks second all-time in three-pointers made, will be missed, given his high-scoring efforts and proclivity for making big shots, but the 49ers still have a strong corps of shooters: notably junior sixth-man Ian Andersen, who shot 37% from long-range, red-shirt freshman Javarris Barnett and Mack, who was second to Goldwire in three-pointers made.

outside and a stronger presence on the wing.

As noted, a key to the 49ers success, however, lies in the intangibles. The hustle. The guts. The stuff that doesn't show up in a box score but can be the difference between wins and losses. The defense produced more turnovers than the 49ers had seen in 17 years. The 40-minute effort kept the Niners in nearly every contest. During the regular-season, the 49ers lost just two games by double-digits and twenty-three games were decided by seven points or less. Now all those first-year players are veterans returning with a better understanding of what it takes.

Energy. Effort. Enthusiasm.

Charlotte has the depth. The experience. The athleticism. The basketball IQ. They have the numbers, they have the minutes and they can run, jump, slash and slice. They know the game. They play it well.

And they play it hard.

And that's when something fun to watch can become something special to see.

Charlotte, which finished tied for 4th in the Atlantic 10 and reached the A-10 Semifinals and the NIT, returns four starters and 10 letterwinners from last season's 20-14 campaign ... all four returning starters were first-year 49ers last year: **Lamont Mack, Charlie Coley, An'Juan Wilderness and DiJuan Harris** ... Wilderness was an A-10 all-Freshman team choice ... Charlotte returns nine of its top 10 scorers (73% of its scoring; 87% of its rebounding; 86% of its assists) ... Charlotte went 8-9 against top 100 teams, last year (see list below) ... Charlotte notched its 8th postseason appearance in head coach **Bobby Lutz's** 10 seasons with their bid to the 2008 NIT ... the 49ers posted their 5th 20-win season under Lutz ... Lutz became the 49ers all-time winningest coach ... Lutz signed a new five-year deal with the 49ers in March, 2008 that will take him through the 2012-13 season ... Junior guard **Michael Gerrity** became eligible at the end of the first semester, last year, after transferring from Pepperdine.
