VANCE HEAFNER

1974, 1975, 1976

Three-time All-American ('74-'76) ... Two-time All-ACC selection (1975 and 1976) ... Completed in four NCAA Championships ... **1974 ACC Champion** ... First golf All-American at NC State ... Won two collegiate titles ... 72.09 stroke average in 1975-76 ranks fifth in school history ... Carded a 66 in the first round of the 1976 Chris Schenkel Invitational ... The CGRA Golfer of the Year in 1977 ... Won the North Carolina Amateur, Carolinas Open, Porter Cup and the Eastern Amateur ... Member of the 1977 Walker Cup Championship Team ... Played the PGA Tour for 12 years and won the 1981 Walt Disney World Classic

TODD SMITH

1979

1979 All-American and All-ACC selection ... **The 1979 ACC Champion** ... Was the NCAA Long Drive Champion and Driving Accuracy Champion in 1979 ... Won the 1980 North Carolina N.C. Amateur Golf Championship ... Won three collegiate tournaments

ROY HUNTER

1982

A 1982 All-American ... Two-time All-ACC (1980 & 1982) ... Won the Davis Memorial Collegiate Tournament in 1982 ... Finished third in the ACC Championship as a freshman ... Carded a 66 in the Davidson Invitational in 1982 ... Won the 1981 Cardinal Amateur ... Completed in the 1982 Savane All-America Classic

ERIC MOEHLING

1982

1982 All-American ... 1982 All-ACC ... Won three collegiate tournaments

NOLAN MILLS

1983

1983 All-American, the program's first first-team All-American ... **1983 ACC Champion** by notching an ACC record nine-stroke victory with a 205, the third-best tournament total in school history ... 1983 All-ACC pick ... Eighth in single season stroke average (72.3 in 1983) in school history, was second when he completed his career ... Won four collegiate tournaments ... One of two golfers to win three individual titles in a single season in school history (1983) ... Finished in the top-16 at the U.S. Amateur in 1980 ... East-West All-Star match participant in 1983 ... Won the 1983 N.C. Amateur and the 1981 CGA Amateur

JEFF LANKFORD

1986

1986 All-American ... Two-time All-ACC in 1984 & 1986 ... Wolfpack team MVP in 1984 ... NCAA All-District III-North selection in 1986 ... Ranks fourth in school history with 140 career rounds played ... 1986 East-West All-Star matches participant ... Won the North Carolina Amateur, North Carolina Open and the Metro Amateur ... Completed in the 1997 PGA Championship and was on the PGA Tour in 1988 ... Also played on the Nationwide tour

JOE GAY

1988

All-American in 1988 ... Three-time ACC Honor Roll selection ... All-ACC in 1988 ... GCAA All-Scholar in 1988 ... Competed in the East-West All-Star matches in 1988 ... Won the 1987 Wolfpack Invitational ... Fired a 66 in the 2nd round of the Wolfpack Invitational, tied for the third-lowest round in school history

BOWEN SARGENT

1988, 1990

Two-time All-American in 1988 and 1990 ... Two-time All-ACC in 1990 and 1991 ... Three-time NCAA All-District 3-North selection from 1989-1991 ... Won two tournaments in 1989-90, the Iron Duke Classic and the Southern Intercollegiate ... Holds the school record for most rounds played in his career, with 150 ... Played in four NCAA Tournaments, one of only three players in school history to accomplish that feat ... Finished fourth at 1990 NCAA Regional, one of only five golfers in school history to place in the top five at an NCAA Regional ... Competed in the 1988 Savane All-American Classic

KELLY MITCHUM

1990, 1991, 1992, 1993

Four-time All-American ('90-'93) ... Three-time All-ACC ('91-'93) ... **1991 ACC Champion** ... Completed in 54 tournaments, winning four, posting 37 top-20 finishes with 24 top-10 finishes ... Academic All-American ('92 & '93) ... ACC Honor Roll ('90-'93) ... Joins Nolan Mills as the only two golfers in

school history to win three titles in a single year (1991) ... Fifth in career stroke average (73.2) at NC State ... Played in four NCAA Tournaments, one of only three players in school history to accomplish that feat ... Had two top-10 finishes at NCAA Regionals (t-9th 1991, t-7th 1992) ... Tied for eighth at 1990 NCAA Championship ... Fired a 64 in 1992, the lowest round in NC State men's golf history ... Member of the 1993 Walker Cup Championship

MARK SLAWTER

1994

1994 All-American ... Three-time All-ACC ('93, '94, '96) ... 1993 ACC Rookie of the Year ... Played in three NCAA Championships ... 73.76 career stroke average ranks 10th in school history ... Completed 146 rounds in his career, the second-most in school history ... Won two collegiate tournaments ... Completed in the 1994 Savane All-American Classic

TIM CLARK

1996, 1997, 1998

Three-time All-American ('96-'98) ... Three-time All-ACC selection ('96-'98) ... 1997 ACC Player of the Year ... 1996 & 1997 NCAA East Regional Champion ... 1996 ACC Rookie of the Year ... 1996 CGAA National Freshman of the Year ... Member of the ACC's 50th Anniversary team ... Won five collegiate tournaments, a school record ... 70.87 stroke average in 1998 is a school record ... First in school history in career stroke average (71.83) ... Tied for fifth place at the 1996 NCAA Tournament, a school record

... Top-10 NCAA Championship finish in all three he played (t-5th in '96, t-10th in '97, t-7th-'98) ... PGA Tour member ... Won two BUY.com tournaments in 2000 and the 2002 Bell's South African Open ... Played for South Africa in the 2002 World Cup and played for the international team in the 2003 and 2005 President's Cup ... Finished third at the 2003 PGA Championship ... Won the 2005 South African Airways Open ... Tied for second at the 2005 Bob Hope Chrysler Classic ... Tied for third at the 2005 U.S. Open ... Won the 2005 Barclays Scottish Open ... Finished 32nd on the PGA money list for 2006 ... Has four top-10 finishes, including second at the Masters.

CARL PETERSSON

1999, 2000

Two-time All-American ('99-'00) ... Two-time All-ACC ('99-'00) ... Tied for second at the 2000 ACC Championship ... 1999 NCAA All-District 3 - North ... 72.36 career stroke average ranks third in school history ... Ranked second in single year average with a 71.74 in 2000 ... Fired a 66 in the second round of the 1999 San Juan Shoot Out and a pair of 69s at the 2000 NCAA East Regional ... PGA Tour member ... Finished third at the 2002 Dubai Desert Classic before winning the Algarve Open de Portugal ... Played for Sweden in the 2002 World Cup ... Runner-up at the 2003 Buick Invitational ... Won the 2005 Chrysler Championship, the first Wolfpacker to win a PGA Tour event, and then tied for second the next weekend at the Southern Farm Bureau Classic ... Finished 18th on the PGA money list for 2006 ... Won the Memorial Tournament ... Had six top-10 showings, including eighth at the British Open.

CHRIS MUNDORF

2001

2001 All-American selection ... All-ACC pick in 2001 ... Fired a 65 in the 1999 Intercollegiate, the second lowest round in school history ... Shot the second-lowest tournament total (204) in school history at the 2001 NCAA East Regional ... Eighth in school history in career stroke average, 73.61 ... Set the USGA scoring mark with a 63 in the 2001 US Amateur, and his nine-under-par round broke the record for most strokes under-par in a championship ... Won the 2000 Cardinal Amateur

DAVID SANCHEZ

2001

2001 All-American ... All-ACC pick in 2001 ... Fired a 66 in the second round of the 2001 Intercollegiate, the third lowest round in school history ... Ninth in school history in lowest career average at 73.61 ... Led team with 72.32 stroke average in 2000-01, the ninth-lowest single season stroke average in school history ... Competed in the 2001 East-West All-Star matches ... 2001 NCAA All-District 3-North selection ... Earned a Nationwide Tour Card in 2007.

GARTH MULROY

2002

A 2002 All-American ... All-ACC selection in 2002 ... Fourth in NC State history with a 72.62 career stroke average ... 72.13 stroke average senior season ties for sixth all-time in single-year school records ... Fired a 208, the at the 2002 ACC Championship, finishing fourth to lead the Wolfpack ... NCAA All-District 3 North selection in 2002

... Competed in the 2002 East-West all-star matches ... Fired a 67 in his last round as a collegiate golfer in the final round of the 2002 NCAA Championship ... Played in two NCAA Championships and finished in the top-10 in both ACC Tournaments he played (9th in 2001, 4th in 2002) ... Earned a Nationwide Tour Card in 2007.

JUSTIN WALTERS

2002, 2003

A two-time All-American in 2002 and 2003 ... 2002 and a 2003 All-ACC selection ... Two-time GCAA All-America Scholar in 2002 and 2003 ... Second all-time in lowest career stroke average, 71.93 ... Only player in NC State history to record two sub-72 stroke average seasons, both years of 71.93 rank third ... Broke school record for lowest tournament total with a 202 at the 2002-03 Nelson Invitational ... Finished tied for sixth at the NCAA Tournament in 2002, second in school history ... Won three collegiate tournaments, one of only eight players in school history to accomplish that feat ... Fired three rounds of 66 and one round of 65 (second lowest score in school history) to set the school record for most rounds of 66 or lower ... Owns five of the 10 lowest tournament totals in school history (sub 208), another school record

JASON MOON

2003

2003 All-American ... Ranks seventh in school history with a career stroke average of 73.44 ... Finished in the top-5 at the NCAA Central Regional and in the top-10 at the NCAA Championship in 2003 ... Fired two rounds of 66 in 2003, third lowest score in school

history ... Played in three NCAA Tournaments ... 115 career rounds ranks 10th in school records

STEPHEN LEWTON

2006

2006 All-American ... A third-team PING selection by the Golf Coaches Association ... As a senior he had two tournament wins, and six top-10 finishes ... Earned All-ACC honors ... Placed 20th at the NCAA Championships ... Had final two rounds of 66 and 67 to finish 5-under par and win the Seminole Intercollegiate ... His tournament total of 203 was the second-best in school history ... Also won the Cavalier Classic shooting even-par.

MATT HILL

2008, 2009

Two-time All-American ('08-'09) ... 2009 NCAA Individual Champion ... 2009 NCAA Central Region Champion ... 2009 Co-ACC Champion ... Second golfer in NCAA history (Tiger Woods '96) to win conference, regional and NCAA titles in same season ... Named both the Jack Nicklaus Award winner and Golfweek's Player of the Year ... Also won the Golfstat Cup ... 2009 ACC Golfer of the Year ... Won eight tournaments during the school year, believed to have tied the NCAA record (Tiger Woods '95-'96) ... Won his last five, and seven of the final eight ... 70.1 stroke average set school record and was 20th best in NCAA history all-time ... A 2008 honorable mention PING selection by the Golf Coaches Association ... Named to the Division I PING All-Region and was an All-ACC selection as a freshman ... Led the squad with a 71.4 stroke average ... Posted a two-stroke victory at the Hootie @ Bulls Bay Invite.
