

Tennis Camp Format

We will use 14 of the outdoor courts at Notre Dame's Courtney Tennis Center, and the 6 indoor courts on campus at the Eck Tennis Center.

On those 20 courts, we will assign 1 instructor to each court and have a total of 5 additional roaming instructors who will also substitute as needed.

Each of the 25 highly-qualified instructors will present the fundamentals and then initiate drills on a particular shot.

Discounts & Accommodations

Each group of eight persons submitting their registration Applications together receives registration for a ninth person free of charge (\$250.00 value). Registration is limited to persons 18 years and over.

This inaugural Notre Dame Adult Tennis Camp is expected to sell out quickly. Each camp (two presently scheduled) is limited to the first 120 adults registering and submitting all charges due.

If overnight accommodations are needed, campers have two options. St. Edwards Hall, located on the Notre Dame campus, offers a clean, safe, dorm environment for \$30 per room. St. Eds is not air-conditioned, so bringing a portable fan would be advisable. The Jamison Inn, located within walking distance of the ND tennis courts, is a lovely setting offering accommodations. Breakfast is included each morning. We have arranged a special rate for campers of \$70.00 per night. Room reservations for tennis campers must be made by May 28, 2004. Campers are responsible to reserve and pay for their own lodging. When calling to reserve a room, be sure to mention that you are with the Notre Dame Monogram Tennis Camp.
