

# NOTRE DAME BASEBALL GAMEDAY NOTES

vs. North Carolina (NCAA Gainesville Regional; June 6, 2005)

**REMATCH** – Notre Dame and North Carolina will meet in an NCAA Regional rematch on Sunday, June 6, at 2:00 p.m. EDT (at Florida's McKethan Stadium) ... UNC beat ND 5-1 in to open the Regional ... the winner will advance to a game Sunday vs. host Florida (6:00 p.m.) and must win that game to force a decisive game on Monday (7:00) in the double-elimination format ... all games are being broadcast live by CSTV (South Bend's WHME will show a delayed telecast Sunday night at 11:00 p.m. EST, plans for Monday are TBA) ... Sunday's early game is slated to include a pair of sophomore RHPs on the mound (ND's Dan Kapala and UNC's Daniel Bard).

**AVOIDING 0-AND-2** – Saturday's 7-4 win over Stetson allowed Notre Dame to maintain the program's distinction of not going 0-2 in its past 35 postseason tournaments (21 in the 11-year Paul Mainieri era), dating back to 1960 ... the Mainieri-era streak now includes 11 conference tournaments, eight NCAA Regionals, the 2002 Super Regional at Florida State and the '02 College World Series ... ND has gone 0-2 just twice in 42 all-time postseason tournaments ... the Irish also have gone 0-2 just four times in 28 regular-season tournaments during the Mainieri era and had a stretch of 28 straight tournaments (regular-season and postseason) without an 0-2 start, spanning the '97-'02 seasons.

**SHINING STARTER** –Dan Kapala was a top setup pitcher for the Irish in 2004 and for the first half of the '05 season before being shifted into a weekend starter role, in part due to the injury problems with three pitchers (senior RHP John Axford and sophomore RHPs Jeff Manship) and a slow start to the season from two-sport standout Jeff Samardzija (a sophomore RHP who wrapped up spring football on April 23) ... the first start of Kapala's career was a tough task on the road, facing Boston College ace Mike Wlodarczyk (one of the top candidates for BIG EAST pitcher of the year) in the first game of that series ... Kapala allowed just one earned run in the first four innings that day before tiring in the 5th – but he went on to win his next three starts in fairly impressive fashion, with a 3.15 ERA and .276 opp. batting avg. in those games (20 IP, 21 H, 7 Ks, 5 BB, .276 opp. avg.), lowering his season ERA to 3.80 (.278 opp. avg.) ... Kapala beat UConn (8 IP) and Villanova (7 IP) in back-to-back complete games to give the Irish series-opening wins and owns 5 complete games this season ... he was a starter in high school while earning ABCA all-district honors (one level below All-America).

**PREVIOUSLY IN THE NCAA's** – Dan Kapala combined with LHP Joe Thaman and closer Ryan Doherty to back up Grant Johnson's elimination-game win over UC Irvine in the '04 NCAA South Bend Regional (1.2 IP, 2 Ks; 6-5) ... he then was tagged with loss to the 7-6 to Arizona the next day, in the regional title game (2 IP, H ,R, BB, K).

**SUPER SOPHS** – Dan Kapala is one of four sophomores who currently check in among ND's top-six leaders in season ERA (min. 20 IP), with three of his classmates (Mike Dury, Jeff Samardzija and Jeff Manship) also near the top of that list (Dury and Kapala rank 1-2 on the team ERA charts while Samardzija is 4th) ... the four have combined for a 3.45 season ERA and 17-5 record (4 saves), with 131 strikeouts, 73 walks and 208 hits allowed (.267 opp. avg.) in 201 innings:

**JUST THE STATS** – Dan Kapala ranks 2nd on the '05 staff in ERA (3.54), wins (6) and appearances (24), also 3rd in starts (8) and innings (73.2) and 4th in Ks (38) and low opp. batting avg. (.268).

**HOME BOY** – Kapala posted a 4-0 record, 2.48 ERA and 2-to-1 K-to-walk ratio (19/9) in '05 home games (33 H/.236 opp. avg. in 36.1 IP) but is just 2-3 with a 4.58 ERA on the road in '05 (19 Ks, 17 BB, 43 H/.299 in 37.1 IP)

**FRIEND OR FOE?**

Several ND players are former teammates of players from UNC:

\* ND sophomore RHP **Jeff Manship** played alongside UNC's **Andrew Miller** (high school All-America game) and **Daniel Bard** (U.S. junior national team) on elite all-star teams.

\* ND junior CF **Alex Nettey** and UNC's starting LF **Jay Cox** were teammates with the Fayetteville (N.C.) Swampdogs of the Coastal Plains League, during the summer of '04

\* ND sophomore RHP **Jess Stewart** has former teammates on all three teams at the Regional, including UNC's **Jay Cox** and Florida's **Jared Kubin** (both with Harris Rangers, pre-college club team).

**QUICK NOTES FROM THE ND-STETSON GAME**

\* Junior SS **Greg Lopez** batted in the 2-hole for the second time in his career and first time since his freshman season ('03) ... Lopez responded with a pair of sac. bunts, a double and a run scored (1-for-3).

\* Junior DH **Matt Bransfield** was a late addition to the starting lineup and delivered by batting 2-for-3 (R, 2B, BB)

\* Sophomore C **Sean Gaston** came off the bench to hit an RBI single and score a run ... he now is hitting .409 (9-for-22) in the past 6 games.

\* Sophomore LHP Mike Dury (2 IP, H, 3 Ks) has produced both of his 2005 saves in the postseason and has not been charged with a run in his past 11 appearances (15.1 IP)

\* The ND bullpen now owns a 2.76 postseason ERA in 5 GP (16.1 IP, 16 Ks, 5 BB, 9 H, .196 opp. avg.)

\* The 2nd-longest scoring streak in ND history was extended to 208 games (439 of past 440; 678 of 684 in Mainieri era).

\* The Irish were HBP for the 55th game (of 61) this season (ND has at least on HBP in 26 of the past 27 games).

\* Freshman 3B **Brett Lilley** posted his 51st error-free game of the season (28 in 33 games at 3B, only 7 Es).

\* Freshman 2B **Ross Brezovsky** still has made just one error in the past 16 games (75 chances), with just 3 Es in his 32 games at 2B during second half of the season.

\* Junior CF **Alex Nettey** now is riding a 21-game errorless streak (69 chances).

\* Junior RF **Cody Rizzo** (0-for-2, HBP) saw his 7-game hitting streak (also had hits in 12 of previous 13 games) but was HBP for 21st time in '05 and 70th in his career (still 4th in NCAA history).

\* ND was HBP for the 124th and 125th 3rd time this season, tying the 1997 Nevada team (125) for 1st in the NCAA record book.

\* The team leading at the end of the 6th is 50-6 (.893) in ND's '05 games (46-3-1/.930 at the end of the 8th inning).

\* ND now has defeated four teams – Valparaiso (in '63), Mississippi State ('00), Florida State ('02) and Stetson ('05) – that the Irish had faced in previous NCAA's (the Hatters beat ND in the '96 NCAA's).

**ON THE BEAT FOR BOTH** – The Notre Dame baseball team has faced North Carolina just twice previously, separated by 50 years, but *South Bend Tribune* writer Forrest "Woody" Miller was on the beat during both of those seasons ... this marks Miller's 50th season of covering Notre Dame baseball (1956-2005), including trips to the College World Series separated by 45 years (in 1957 and 2002).

**KEYS TO VICTORY** – Notre Dame is batting 75 points higher in its 2005 wins (.325) than in its losses (.250) while owning a +24 plate-discipline ratio (BB+HBP-Ks) in the wins and -7 in the losses ... the bulk of ND's stolen bases (48) have come in the wins (just 19 in the losses) while the ND pitchers have limited the opponent to .252 batting in the victories (.335 in losses) ... defensively, ND has a solid .969 fielding pct. in wins but just .949 in losses ... five ND hitters have significant gaps between their batting averages in wins and losses ... Matt Edwards is hitting 150 points higher in wins (.409, 9 HR) than in losses (.259, 5 HR) while Craig Cooper is hitting at a clip 104 points higher in wins (.370, 6 HR) than in losses (.266, HR) ... others of note include Alex Nettey (.309 in wins, .228 in losses), Greg Lopez (.306 in wins, .211 in losses) and Steve Andres (.293-.119) ... here's a statistical comparison of ND's 2005 wins and losses:

## BULLPEN REPORT

**LOFTY STANDARDS** – Junior RHP Ryan Doherty, who has failed to duplicate his 2004 All-America results this season, still remains firmly entrenched in the ND baseball record books ... the 7-foot-1 Doherty enters day-2 at the Gainesville Regional with the 9th-best career ERA (6th-best since 1970) in the program's recorded history while his 19 saves are one shy of the record held by 2000 graduate and current Eastern Kentucky pitching coach John Corbin ... Doherty also has allowed just 6.29 hits per 9 IP in his career (2nd in ND record book, best in 40 years) and ranks 3rd all-time with a 3.67 career K-to-walk ratio while his career average of 12.21 Ks per 9 IP ranks 2nd to Dan McGinn's 12.69 way back in 1964-65 ... Doherty has racked up 10.91 Ks per 9 IP this season, good for 5th on that ND top-10 list (his 12.18 in '04 ranks 3rd) ... he is one of three ND pitchers ever to post 6-plus saves in multiple seasons (12 in '04, 6 in '05; Corbin had 9 in '99 and 11 in '00, J.P. Gagne 6 in '02 and 13 in '03).

**Ryan Doherty** – has not allowed a run or hit in his past 4 GP, vs. USC, West Virginia, Pitt and UNC (6.0 IP, 9 Ks, BB) .. saved 4-2 win at UCF (1.2 IP, H, 3 Ks, HB) and BIG EAST winners-bracket game vs. Pitt (also 4-2; 1.1 IP, 3 Ks).

**Mike Dury** – riding streak of 11 straight games without being charged for a run (15.1 IP, 8 H, 4 BB, 11 Ks, ERA dropped from 3.38 to 1.38) ... saved BIG EAST title game vs. Pitt, taking mound after 2-hour rain delay (3.1 IP, H, BB, 2 Ks) ... also saved NCAA elimination game vs. Stetson (2 IP, H, 3 Ks).

**Scott Bickford** – LHP who threw total of 14.1 IP in '02-'04 seasons but has been key situational reliever, with nearly a 5-to-1 K-to-walk ratio (19/4) ... pitcher of record in 13-6 win over USC (IP, K).

**Derik Olvey** – was rated nation's #22 prospect among 2004 freshmen but missed most of season due to tendonitis ... looking to bounce back from rocky past two outings, vs. Michigan and USC (9.65 combined ERA).

**Tony Langford** – two-way player who has been used for key late-inning stints ... worked out of jam to win 12-inning game vs. Purdue (0.2 IP, BB, K) and came back next day to save win over Valparaiso (1.2 IP, H, 3 BB, K) ... helped beat Pitt in BIG EAST winners-bracket game (4-2; IP, H, K).

## QUICK NOTES FROM FRIDAY'S ND-UNC GAME

- \* Both teams put just one leadoff batter on base but UNC hit 5-for-11 with runners on, ND 2-for-11.
- \* Sophomore C **Sean Gaston** (2-for-4) had his 12th multiple-hit game of the season and now is hitting .381 (8-for-21) in the past 6 games.
- \* Junior OF **Craig Cooper**'s career-best 13-game hit streak came to an end (0-for-4, K).
- \* Junior DH **Steve Andres** (0-for-2, 2 BB) saw his 6-game hit streak come to an end.
- \* The ND bullpen now owns a 2.05 postseason ERA in 4 GP (12.2 IP, 12 Ks, 4 BB, 5 H, .156 opp. avg.)
- \* The 2nd-longest scoring streak in ND history was extended to 207 games (438 of past 439 | 677 of 683 in Mainieri era).
- \* The Irish were HBP for the 54th game (of 60) this season (ND has at least one HBP in 25 of the past 26 games).
- \* ND opened the scoring in the 1st but lost the game (prior to the UNC game, the Irish had been 19-8-1 when scoring in the 1st and 24-8 when scoring the first run of the game).
- \* Freshman 3B **Brett Lilley** posted his 50th error-free game of the season (27 in 32 games at 3B, only 7 Es).
- \* Freshman 2B **Ross Brezovsky** still has made just one error in the past 15 games (71 chances), with just 3 Es in his 31 games at 2B during second half of the season.
- \* Junior CF **Alex Nettey** is riding a 20-game errorless streak (65 chances).
- \* Junior RF **Cody Rizzo** (1-for-4, RBI) now has a 7-game hitting streak, with hits in 12 of the past 13 games.
- \* ND was HBP for the 123rd time this season, trailing just the 1997 Nevada team (125) and Long Beach State's 1998 squad (124) in the NCAA record book.
- \* **Lilley**'s 27th HBP of the season leaves him one shy of Rizzo's record (in '03) and ranks 12th in NCAA history (also already 9th on the ND career HBP list).
- \* ND now has totaled 56 runs in the 1st inning this season
- \* The team leading at the end of the 6th inning is 49-6 (.891) in ND's games this season (45-3-1/.929 at the end of the 8th inning).

**FLORIDA NATIVES** – The 2005 Notre Dame baseball roster includes three freshmen from Florida, in starting 2B **Ross Brezovsky** (Naples/Collier HS) and former Santaluces HS teammates: LHP **Wade Korpi** (Lake Worth) and RHP **Joey Williamson** (Lantana) ... head coach **Paul Mainieri** is a Miami native and graduate of Columbus HS (his father Demie was a hall-of-fame coach at Miami Dade North Community College) ... the ND baseball program's list of all-time monogram winners includes 16 Florida natives, with recent pitching ace Chris **Niesel** (Plantation) joining other noteworthy RHPs such as Mike **Pasilla** (Windermere/Bishop Moore HS; '87-'89), David **Sinnes** (Miami/Palmetto HS; '90-'93, 2.91 career ERA, 32-8 record, 315 Ks in 297.1 IP), closer John **Corbin** (Hollywood Hills HS; '98-'00, 20 saves) and Danny **Tamayo** (Miami/Ransom Everglades HS; '98-'01, 3.27 ERA, 141 Ks in 160 IP) ... Sinnes held ND record for career win pct. and Ks (best by Aaron Heilman in '01) while Corbin is the Irish career saves leader and Tamayo formed a potent 1-2 punch with Heilman ... other noteworthy ND players from Florida have included: SS Daniel **Cunha** (St. Petersburg; '33-'35), IF Joe **LaRocca** (Ft. Lauderdale/Gibbons HS; '70-'72), OF Mike **Galloway** (Cocoa Beach HS; '75-'77), 1B Henry **Valenzuela** (Tampa/Jesuit HS; '79-'82, hit .314 with 15 HR, 123 RBI), DH Ken **Meyer** (Ft. Myers/Verot HS; '99-'02) and catcher Javi **Sanchez** (Miami/Columbus HS).

**STAYING HOT IN FLA.** – The Irish baseball team now owns a 49-42-1 all-time record in the state of Florida but has found the Sunshine State to be an especially welcome home-away-from-home during the past six seasons, racking up a 27-7 record (.794) in Florida during that 2000-05 span.

**VETERAN SKIPPERS** – Notre Dame's Paul Mainieri became the 27th active Div. I head coach to reach 800 victories in his career as a college head baseball coach, after the 7-1 win over UConn on April 6, 2005 (he now is 818-474-3) ... Arizona's Andy Lopez and North Carolina's Mike Fox (now 827 wins) also had eclipsed 800 career wins earlier in the '05 season ... the Gainesville Regional featured yet another coach who has passed 800 wins: Stetson's Pete Dunn.

**STAYING IN CONTROL** – The 2005 ND pitching staff has uncorked just 22 wild pitches all season (compared to 66 by ND's '05 opponents), for an average of 0.36 wild pitches per game ... that WP rate would best the team record (0.39) set in 1993 ... the '04 pitchers also had a low WP rate (0.46, currently 2nd in the ND record book) ... Jeff Manship's touch curveball has produced 6 WPs this season while no other pitcher has more than 3 ... Mike Dury (26.0 IP), Scott Bickford (25.0) and Ryan Doherty (34.2) each have yet to uncork a WP in '05.

**BRIGHT FUTURE** – Pending the 2005 MLB draft, Notre Dame is set to return virtually its entire team for the 2006 season ... in fact, righthanded reliever Tyler Jones (7.1 IP in '05) is the only player who will run out of eligibility at the end of the '05 season ... the 11 players who have drawn most of the position-player starts include senior 1B Matt Edwards, six juniors, sophomore C Sean Gaston and three freshmen (Edwards can apply for a 5th year of eligibility, after missing most of the '02 season due to a broken leg) ... the pitching staff's 522.1 innings this season have the following class breakdown: 34.1 IP by three seniors (RHP John Axford and LHP Scott Bickford have eligibility left), 125.2 by five juniors, 251.1 by two sophomores and 111.0 by four freshmen.

**ND IN THE NCAAs** – The Irish now own a 41-40 record in the NCAA Tournament, including 19-16 in the Paul Mainieri era (10-10 away from home).

**20-20 ... 20** – Notre Dame is one of just four schools in college sports history to participate in at least 20 NCAA baseball tournaments (20), 20 basketball tournaments (37) and 20 bowl games (25) ... the others are (baseball-basketball-football): upcoming opponent UNC (20-37-25), Oklahoma (28-23-38) and Texas (49-23-44).

**40 FOCUS** – Notre Dame's current 9-2 streak leaves the Irish three wins shy of extending the program's streak of 40-win seasons (16) that stretches back to 1988 (Wichita State and Florida State, each with 27, are the only schools with longer 40-win streaks).

**POSTSEASON POISE** – Junior LF/DH Steve Andres, who shook off a .202 regular-season batting avg. to hit 4-for-9 as ND's leading hitter in last week's BIG EAST Tournament, has consistently elevated his offense in the postseason the past three seasons ... for his career, Andres is just a .262 hitter in the regular season but those numbers take a big 130-point jump in postseason action (.377 combined; .345 in the BET, .417 in NCAAs) ... he also owns a .508 career slugging pct. in the regular season but checks in 170 points higher in the postseason (.679; .690 in BET, .667 in NCAAs) ... here's a look at Steve Andres' career stats with the Irish, broken down into the three "seasons":

**TRACKING 'EM DOWN** – Junior CF Alex Nettey has averaged nearly three putouts per game in the 2005 season, now with 176 putouts for the '05 season ... that total already makes Nettey the runaway leader during the 11-year Paul Mainieri era ('95-'05) for most putouts in a season by an ND outfielder ... the previous Mainieri-era high was 155 putouts by future All-America CF Steve Stanley, during the 2000 season (in 64 GP; he then had 155 in 69 GP during the 2002 CWS season) ... here's at the most OF putouts by ND players, since '95:

**SUPER SLUGGER** – Senior 1B Matt Edwards (14 HR, 20 2B) is one long ball shy of becoming the third Notre Dame player ever to reach 15 home runs and 20 doubles in a season ... CF Dan Peltier had 15 HRs and an NCAA-leading 32 doubles during his All-America 1989 season while C/DH Jeff Wagner had 17 HR, 21 2B in his big 1997 season ... Edwards (12 HR in '04) also is the fourth ND player to hit 12-plus home runs in multiple seasons, joining Mike Amrhein (13 in '96, 14 in '97), Jeff Wagner (17 in '97, 14 in '98) and Brant Ust (18 in '98, 17 in '99) in that distinction.

**THE HBP HIGHWAY** – Notre Dame batters were hit-by-pitch nine times in the season opener vs. Florida A&M and the Irish have remained on a record HBP pace all season, as ND has collected at least one HBP in 55 of 61 games this season (with HBPs in 26 of the past 27 games) ... the Irish currently have a team-record 125 HBPs in 61 games played, tying the NCAA record set by Nevada in 1997 .
