# Irish Head Coaches

## Bertram G. Maris 1907-08 to 1911-12



Maris is responsible for reviving basketball at the University of Notre Dame. The program started in 1898, but after the 1899 season, basketball was not played at the school on a varsity level until Maris restarted the team in 1907. In his first season at Notre Dame, he compiled a 12-4 mark and followed that with a 33-7 mark in his second year. Overall, Maris' teams were 78-20 (.794) in his five years but, most importantly, he brought Notre Dame basketball back to stay.

## Jesse Harper 1913-14 to 1917-18



Harper attended the University of Chicago and played football and baseball from 1902-1906. He played football under the immortal Amos Alonzo Stagg and captained the baseball team during his senior year. After graduation, Harper coached football at Alma College in Michigan, where he accumulated a 10-4-4 record from 1906-1908. He then moved to Wabash College, where he led the football team to a 15-9-2 mark over five years. In 1913, he became head coach of the Notre Dame basketball, football and baseball teams and also served as athletic director. Under his direction, the Irish basketball team went 44-20 (.686) and the football team compiled a 34-5-1 record over his five years. Harper coached Knute Rockne when the Rockne-Gus Dorais combination made football history. He resigned at the age of 33 in 1918 to live on his 20,000-acre ranch in Sitka, Kan. Harper became a member of the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame in 1971.

## Walter Halas 1920-21 to 1922-23



Halas attended the University of Illinois, where he starred in baseball, basketball and football for three years. After graduating, he immediately accepted the head coaching position at Somerset Central High School in Kentucky. He moved on to coach at Davenport (Iowa) High School before accepting the position at Notre Dame. In his three seasons as coach of the Irish, he struggled to a 25-39 record (.391). Halas was the brother of the famous Chicago Bear head coach George Halas.

## George Keogan 1923-24 to 1942-43



After serving as an instructor in World War I, Keogan became head coach of Allegheny College in Meadville, Pa., where his team won all 18 games it played that season. He moved to Valparaiso University and coached basketball, football, and baseball. In 1923, he was named Notre Dame's basketball and baseball coach and assistant football coach. In 20 seasons as the basketball coach at Notre Dame, Keogan won 327 games — second-most in Irish history — while losing just 97 for a .771 winning percentage. He led the Irish to back-to-back 19-1 seasons in only his third and fourth seasons as coach. He never had a season below .500 in his career and his teams lost more than 10 games only once. Keogan died of a heart attack during the middle of his 20th season as head coach of the Fighting Irish.

## Edward "Moose" Krause 1943-44, 1946-47 to 1950-51



Krause competed in track, football, baseball, and basketball while enrolled at Notre Dame from 1930-34. In three seasons as an Irish basketball player, he scored 547 points, led Notre Dame to a 54-12 record and was named to the All-American team in each of the years. Krause graduated cum laude with a degree in journalism in 1934. He accepted a job to coach St. Mary's (Minn.) College in basketball and football. He also served as athletic director and baseball, track, golf and tennis coach. In 1942, he returned to Notre Dame as an assistant football and basketball coach. When George Keogan died in 1943, Krause assumed the job as head basketball coach which he held for six seasons. He guided the Irish to a 98-48 mark (.671) in those six years, including a 20-4 record in his first full season. On Feb. 7, 1948, Krause was appointed assistant athletic director at Notre Dame. He was elevated on March 22, 1949, to the head position, which he held for 32 years. Krause was inducted into the National Basketball Hall of Fame in 1976. He passed away on Dec. 10, 1992.

## John Jordan 1951-52 to 1963-64



Jordan played basketball at the University of Notre Dame from 1932-1935 under George Keogan. Following graduation, he coached the Mount Carmel High School (Chicago, Ill.) basketball team from 1935-1949, except for a three-year tour of duty as Lieutenant in the Navy during World War II. Jordan became head coach at Loyola University in Chicago in 1950 and coached Loyola to a 15-14 record in the 1950-1951 season. At the end of the season, Jordan was released from his contract to take over the reins at his alma mater, Notre Dame. Jordan stayed at Notre Dame for 13 years and compiled a 199-131 record (.603). Four of his teams reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament, with his best season in 1953-54 when the Irish recorded a 22-3 mark. Jordan passed away on June 13, 1991.

## John Dee, Jr. 1964-65 to 1970-71



Dee attended Notre Dame from 1944-46, earning a spot on the Irish basketball and football teams. Dee is the only player in Notre Dame football history to play in just one career game and start that contest (vs. Georgia Tech in 1944). In basketball, Dee was a two-year letterwinner and played in the 1944-45 and 1945-46 seasons, when the team had a combined record of 32-9. Dee averaged over 10.0 points per game. He received his degree from Loyola of Chicago in philosophy and history in 1947. Following graduation, he coached four years in Chicago high schools and attended Notre Dame Law School during the summers. In 1951-52, Dee was an assistant coach at Notre Dame for John Jordan and received his law degree that spring. At age 28, he was named the head coach at Alabama and became the youngest head basketball coach in NCAA history at that time. In four seasons, he compiled a record of 68-25, including a Southeastern Conference title in 1956. From 1956-62, he coached the D-C Truckers in Denver, winning the NIBL title once and finishing second three times. Dee became the head coach at Notre Dame in 1964 and took the Irish to the NCAA Tournament in his first season. He collected an overall record of 116-80 (.592) in his seven years, including consecutive 20-win seasons in each of his last four years, the first 20-win seasons in Notre Dame history. Dee led his Irish teams to four appearances in the NCAA Championship and one NIT trip. Every student-athlete that Dee recruited to Notre Dame and Alabama received his undergraduate degree. Dee resigned from coaching after the 1970-71 season to practice law in Denver and served as auditor of that city. Dee passed away on April 24, 1999.

## Digger Phelps 1971-72 to 1990-91



Notre Dame's winningest coach played basketball at Rider College for four years from 1959-63. As a senior, he helped Rider to an appearance in the NAIA Tournament. Following graduation in 1963, Phelps remained as a graduate assistant and helped Rider gain national recognition for its

stunning 1964 upset of New York University which ended the Violets' homecourt winning streak that dated back to 1941. After a brief stint at St. Gabriel's High School in Hazelton, Pa., he moved on to Pennsylvania as an assistant in 1966. In 1970, Phelps left Penn to begin his head coaching career at Fordham. After leading Fordham to a 26-3 record, Phelps was named the head coach of Notre Dame for the 1971-1972 season. In 20 seasons at Notre Dame, he recorded a 393-197 mark (.666), including 14 20-win seasons. He led Notre Dame to its only Final Four appearance in 1977-78. Every player who competed for four years under Phelps received his degree, a perfect 54-for-54 mark. Phelps resigned on April 15, 1991. He was voted to the President's Commission on Volunteer Services in August of '91. In April of 1992, he was named Special Assistant to Governor Bob Martinez, Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP). In his role as Special Assistant, he served as a liaison between ONDCP and the Department of Justice in coordinating the "Weed and Seed" program, a Presidential initiative focusing on violent crime and neighborhood revitalization. In the summer of 1993, he was a United Nations election observer in Cambodia. After serving as a color analyst during the NCAA Championship for CBS in 1992-93, he currently serves as a studio host and analyst for ESPN.

## John MacLeod 1991-92 to 1998-99



John MacLeod came to Notre Dame after serving the previous 18 seasons as a highly-successful coach in the NBA. MacLeod led Notre Dame to appearances in the NIT in 1991-92, losing to Virginia in the finals, and 1996-97, as the team advanced to the quarterfinals. MacLeod ushered

Notre Dame into its era as a member of the BIG EAST Conference and earned BIG EAST coach-of-

the-year honors in 1996-97. That same year, MacLeod saw forward Pat Garrity honored as the BIG EAST player of the year. During his tenure, three Notre Dame players were picked in the first round of the NBA draft — LaPhonso Ellis by the Denver Nuggets in 1992, Monty Williams by the New York Knicks in 1994 and Garrity, now with the Orlando Magic, in 1998. MacLeod spent 14 seasons (1973-87) as the head coach of the Phoenix Suns and only legendary Boston Celtics coach Red Auerbach had a longer stay with one team in the history of the NBA. MacLeod took Phoenix to the playoffs nine times, including a trip to the NBA Finals in 1976. MacLeod also served as the head coach of the Dallas Mavericks from 1987-90 and the New York Knicks in 1990-91. He led Dallas to the playoffs in 1987-88 and the Knicks in '90-'91. His 707-657 career mark makes him one of only 10 coaches to top the 700-win mark in NBA victories. He went to the playoffs 11 times in his 18 NBA seasons. Before joining Phoenix, MacLeod spent six years as the head coach at Oklahoma from 1967-73 and posted a 90-69 record at the school, including back-to-back NIT appearances in 1969-70 (19-9) and 1970-71 (19-8). MacLeod is a native of Clarksville, Ind., and graduated from Bellarmine College in Louisville, Ky. He served as the head coach of Smithville (Ind.) High School in 1963-64. During the 1999-2000 season, he was back in the NBA ranks as an assistant coach at Phoenix and currently is the associate head coach of the Denver Nuggets.

## Matt Doherty 1999-2000



In his only season at Notre Dame (his first as a collegiate coach), Matt Doherty led the Irish to its first 20-win season since the 1988-89 season as the Irish finished with a 22-15 mark and advanced to the final of the National Invitation Tournament. Doherty's squad began the season

with a win (59-57) on the road over '99 Final Four participant and fourth-ranked Ohio State in the first round of the Preseason NIT. That victory was the first of five against ranked opponents, most by an Irish team during the regular-season since 1991-92. Forward Troy Murphy became the second Irish player in three seasons to earn BIG EAST player-of-the-year honors and was Notre Dame's first first-team consensus All-American since Adrian Dantley (1974-75 and 1975-76). Doherty was named head coach of the Irish on March 30, 1999, following seven seasons on Roy Williams' staff at Kansas.

## Mike Brey 2000-01 to Present



Mike Brey, a 17-year veteran of the collegiate coaching ranks, has been the catalyst behind the resurgence of the Notre Dame basketball program. Hired on July 14, 2000, he has guided the Irish to an 85-44 record for a .659 winning percentage and postseason appearances in each of his four seasons

— three NCAAs (2001-03) and one NIT (2004). Brey is the only coach in the program's history to lead his teams consecutive 20-win campaigns and NCAA berths in each of his first three seasons. In 2002-03, Notre Dame registered a 24-10 record en route to the school's first appearance in the NCAA tournament Sweet 16 since 1987 after advancing to the second round in both 2001 and '02. Five of the 24 wins in '02-'03 were against top-10 opponents, the most in school history during a single season and most by any Division I school that year. Brey owns a glossy 184-96 (.657) in nine seasons as a head coach and has guided five of those teams to the NCAA tournament and seven postseason appearances. Prior to coming to Notre Dame, he was the head coach at the University of Delaware from 1995-2000 and served as an assistant coach at Duke from 1987-95. Brey's Blue Hen teams captured America East tournament championships in '98 and '99 to earn automatic bids into the NCAA field. During his eight season as an assistant at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four on six occasions and won two national championships ('91 and '92). Under Brey, Notre Dame has become one of the BIG EAST's most consistent teams as the Irish have compiled a 40-24 (.625) in regular-season contests, and along with Syracuse, is the only conference team to post a winning record each of the last four years. In his first season at Notre Dame, Brey led the Irish to BIG EAST West Division title after registering an 11-5 conference mark, the most wins since becoming a conference member since the 1995-96 season. Three players — Troy Murphy, Ryan and Humphrey and Matt Carroll — have earned first-team all-conference honors. Murphy was the '01 BIG EAST Player of the Year, while Chris Thomas copped the league's rookie-of-the-year and was the national freshman-of-the-year in '02. A native of Rockville, Md., Brey graduated from DeMatha High School where he played under legendary coach Morgan Wootten. He would also go become an assistant coach at his alma mater (1980-85) and received the school's Distinguished Alumnus Award in October of 2003. Brey played college basketball at both Northwestern Louisiana State and George Washington.
