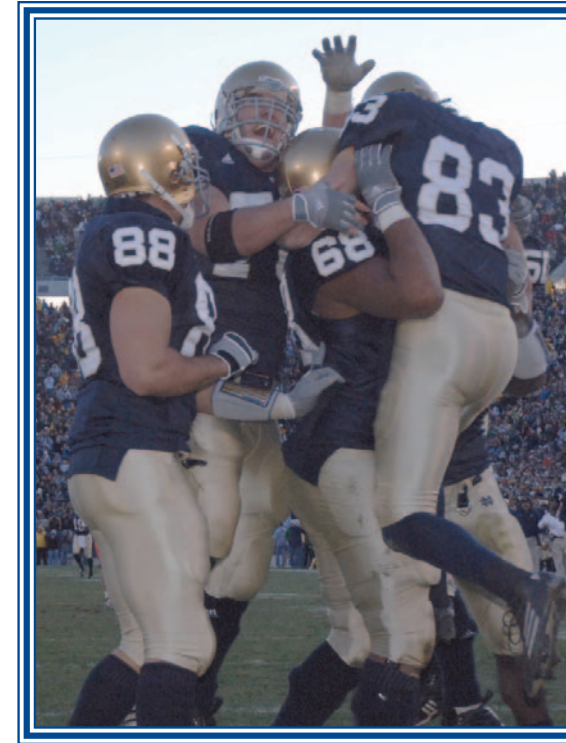

## DIRECTIONS TO NOTRE DAME STADIUM

### From O'Hare Airport

Take Route 190 east out of O'Hare to Route 90 east (Kennedy Expressway) toward downtown Chicago. Merges with Route 94 south (Dan Ryan Expressway). Take Skyway exit off the Dan Ryan and remain on Route 90 to Indiana Toll Road. Eventually merges with Route 80. Use Exit 77 (South Bend/Notre Dame).

### Note

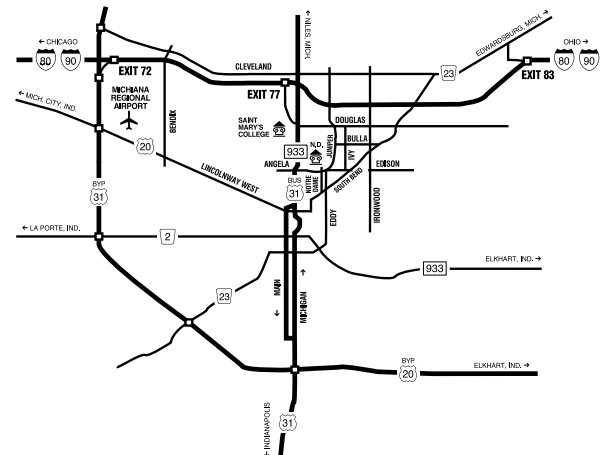
An alternative route: Take Route 190 east out of O'Hare to Interstate 294 south (Tri-State Tollway) and follow the signs for 80/294 and then Interstate 80-90 (Indiana Toll Road). Use Exit 77 (South Bend/Notre Dame).

### From Indiana Toll Road

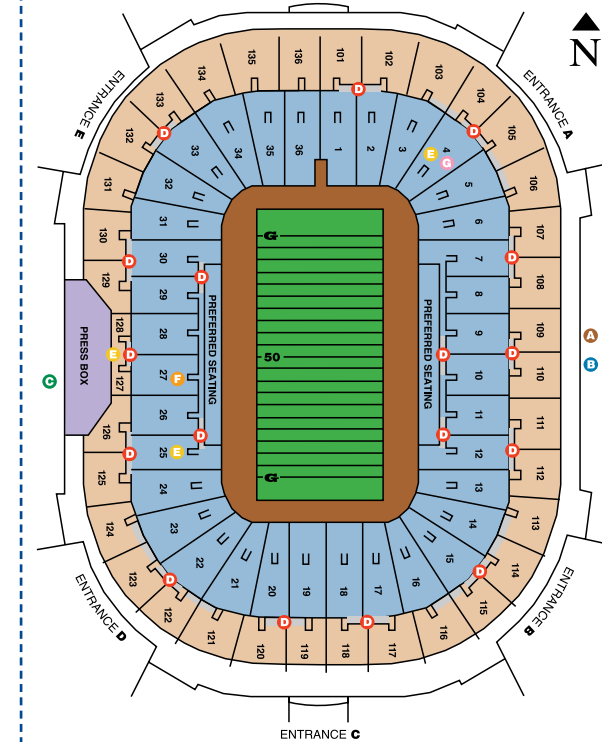
Use Exit 77 (South Bend/Notre Dame). Turn left (north) onto SR 933/Bus.31. Go north – third traffic light (Cleveland Road) turn right (east). At the first traffic light (Juniper Road) turn right, south on Juniper Road. Public Parking is just past the bridge. Please follow directions of traffic control personnel as you approach the campus area.

### From Indianapolis

Follow U.S. 31 North. That becomes SR 933/Bus.31 just south of South Bend. Proceed through South Bend and continue north. DO NOT turn on Angela Boulevard but proceed north (past Notre Dame and the Toll Road entrance) and to Cleveland Road, turn right (east). At the first traffic light (Juniper Road) turn right, south on Juniper Road. Public Parking is just past the bridge. Please follow directions of traffic control personnel as you approach the campus area.

- G = Stadium Ushers Office

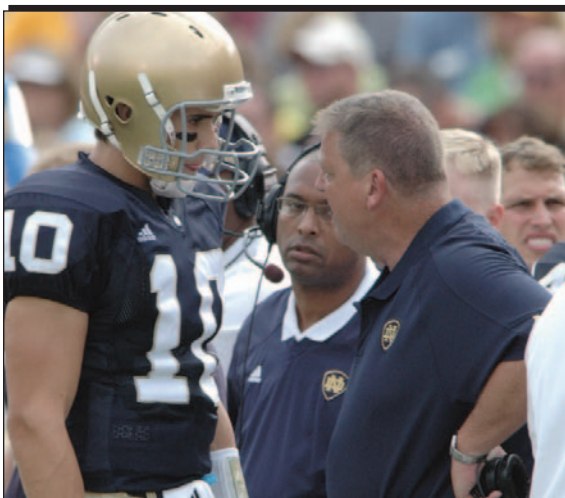

## WELCOME TO NOTRE DAME

We are delighted to be your host when you visit campus this fall for our home football games. In an effort to ensure that our guests enjoy the game and have a pleasant experience in comfort and safety, we ask that you note the following items:

## GATE AND TICKET INFORMATION

### Tickets

**All persons, regardless of age, must have a ticket for admission to the stadium. Passes are not available for child admissions into the stadium.** Spectators should be aware that student tickets are for Notre Dame, Saint Mary's and Holy Cross students **ONLY** and must be presented with a valid University I.D. for admission.

### Stadium Ticket Office

The stadium ticket office is located on the east side of the stadium, left of the Frank Leahy statue on Juniper Road. The office will open no later than three hours prior to kick-off.

### Will Call

General will call, windows 4-6, are located on the east side of the stadium at the stadium ticket office, left of the Frank Leahy statue. A photo I.D. is required for all will call.

Press credentials and press will call windows are located on the west side of the stadium, under the press box.

### Player Guests

Notre Dame and visitor player guests will enter on the east side of the stadium at the stadium ticket office. A photo I.D. is required to receive a player guest pass. This window will open 90 minutes prior to kick-off. **See Extra Benefits under Rules and Regulations in this brochure.**

### Gate Access

For direct and efficient access to your seat, please enter the stadium through the gate indicated on your ticket. Gates open 90 minutes prior to kick-off.

### Resale of Tickets:

The resale of tickets is prohibited on campus; and in all circumstances the sale above face value is strictly prohibited by the Notre Dame Athletics Ticket Resale Policy. (View the policy on [www.und.com](http://www.und.com), click on tickets).

### Alumni Association Ticket Consignment Program

The Alumni Association operates a ticket consignment program for individuals who are unable to use home game tickets. Tickets are accepted on a consignment basis prior to each home game and on the day of the

game. On game day the Alumni Association holds a sale of consigned tickets at the Joyce Center Gate 3 Box Office (Ice Hockey ticket office). If the consigned tickets are sold, the ticket holder will receive payment via check for the face value of the tickets. Checks will be mailed approximately two weeks following the game. All unsold tickets will be returned via mail to the ticket holder approximately one week after the game.

Ticket holders wishing to participate in the consignment program should mail tickets to: **Alumni Association, Attention: Ticket Consignment, 100 Eck Center, Notre Dame, IN 46556.** Tickets sent to the Alumni Association Office must be received prior to 5:00 pm the day before the game. It is strongly recommended that tickets be sent via express delivery. Tickets may also be turned in on game day at the Consignment Window at the Joyce Center Gate 3 Box office, which opens 4½ hours prior to kickoff. ### The Alumni Association Game Day Ticket Sale

The Alumni Association holds a game day ticket sale for all Notre Dame home football games at the Joyce Center Gate 3 Box Office. Tickets are sold at face value plus a modest service fee. All sales are cash only and subject to ticket availability. The ticket sale opens to alumni and current Notre Dame students 4½ hours prior to kickoff. General public may purchase tickets beginning 3½ hours prior to kickoff. The ticket sale ends 30 minutes prior to kickoff. The ticket sale is held in conjunction with the Alumni Association ticket consignment program. Therefore ticket supply and ticket locations vary.

### Wheelchair Seating

Wheelchair seating is available throughout the stadium. These areas are for persons who use a wheelchair and their guest. No other person can be seated in this area.

All restrooms are handicap accessible. For more information on wheelchair seating, please contact the ticket office at (574) 631-7356.

### Pass-Out Tickets

Persons leaving the stadium will not be re-admitted. An **EMERGENCY** pass-out ticket may be obtained by contacting a gate supervisor.

## PARKING INFORMATION

Please observe posted University parking regulations on campus. Public safety and emergency vehicle requirements are not relaxed on home football weekends. Vehicles must be parked in designated parking spaces. All vehicles must be parked in a uniform direction.

**NON-PASSENGER VEHICLES AND VEHICLES WITH TRAILERS ARE PROHIBITED IN PARKING LOTS. TENTS, PICNIC TABLES, CANOPIES AND OTHER NON-VEHICULAR OBJECTS ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE PARKING LOTS.**

As a courtesy to other spectators and for safety reasons, it is requested that footballs, frisbees or other objects are not thrown in the parking areas.

### Grills/Fires

Grills using **CHARCOAL** will be prohibited from use on University property. Numerous fires and subsequent property damage have resulted from improper disposal of the charcoal. Grills using propane gas will be allowed. The maximum propane gas cylinder size allowed will be twenty (20) pounds. The University of Notre Dame Fire Department appreciates your understanding and cooperation in this matter.

### Handicap Parking

Handicap parking is available at the D2 parking lot on a drive-up basis. Shuttle service is available from the perimeter lots. Your state approved handicapped parking permit is necessary for access to all handicap parking areas. Please call the Ticket Office at 574-631-7356 for more information.

### RV Parking

There will be no overnight RV parking allowed in any of the University parking lots. The RV lot will open at 8:00 a.m. on game day and must be vacated three hours after completion of the game.

## IMPORTANT GENERAL INFORMATION

### Alcohol Policy

Alcohol or alcohol containers are prohibited in Notre Dame stadium. Stadium ushers will enforce this rule. Fans who are intoxicated or who are in possession of alcohol will be removed from the stadium.

### Containers

Non-disposable thermos containers are permitted if no larger than two quarts. These containers are subject to inspection and confiscation if found to contain any alcoholic beverage. NO large disposable containers or coolers of any type or size are permitted in the stadium.

### First-Aid

Emergency first-aid is available at three different locations in the stadium, under sections 4 and 25 in the lower bowl and behind section 128 in the upper bowl (see stadium diagram). Contact the nearest Usher or Police Officer to request medical attention. Ambulance service is provided at any first-aid room.

### Lost and Found

Lost and Found service is maintained at the Public Safety and Information Office, located under section 27. Articles that are found should be turned over to an usher or brought to this office. All items not claimed within three hours after the game will be available at the campus security building, or by calling (574) 631-5555.

### Lost Patrons

Lost patrons or persons looking for lost patrons should proceed immediately to the Public Safety and Information Office under section 27.

### Physicians Paging Service

Doctors anticipating calls during the game are asked to register your exact seat location at the Stadium Ushers Office under section 4 or by calling (574) 631-9529. To better serve physicians, it is strongly advised that they carry a personal pager and advise their answering service of their attendance at the game.

### Public Address

No appeals will be made over the public address system except under extraordinary conditions. Please do not request an announcement unless it is urgent.

### Notre Dame Merchandise

An attractive array of Notre Dame merchandise is available in and around Notre Dame Stadium. The Varsity Shop, specializing in authentic Notre Dame sportswear, is located inside Gate 3 of the Joyce Center. Hours: Friday, 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Saturday, 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Sunday, 12:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. Extended hours are posted during special events. The University Bookstore is the stadium souvenir vendor and operates several souvenir kiosks in and around the stadium on game day. The sale of any items by persons other than authorized University personnel in and around the stadium and its parking lots **is strictly prohibited.**

### ATM

An ATM machine is located in the outer concourse on the east side of the stadium and at Gate 10 of the Joyce Center.

### Umbrellas

As a courtesy to all spectators, the use of umbrellas is discouraged.

### Ushers

Stadium ushers serve the needs of our fans. Contact the nearest usher to request medical assistance or to register complaints about objectionable behavior.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

As a courtesy to our guests:

- Disruptive, unruly behavior will not be tolerated.
- No artificial noise makers in the stadium.
- Persons without authorization are not permitted on the field.
- No cans or bottles are permitted in the stadium.
- The use of intoxicating substances is strictly prohibited.
- Throwing objects in the stands or onto the field is prohibited.
- Please, do not bring stadium chairs, seat backs or other oversized or noise-producing items into the stadium.
- Limited use of cameras, portable/handheld televisions and portable radios is permitted.
- In accordance with a new St. Joseph County ordinance, there will be no smoking allowed in any part of Notre Dame Stadium. **-NEW!**
- All persons are subject to search, which includes clothing, jackets, bags and purses

**THESE RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED AND VIOLATORS WILL BE EJECTED FROM THE STADIUM. REPEAT VIOLATORS MAY HAVE FUTURE TICKET PRIVILEGES REVOKED.**

## NCAA RULES AND YOU

As it relates to NCAA rules compliance, the University of Notre Dame is responsible for the actions of University staff, faculty, student-athletes, fans, alumni and friends. By adhering to the letter and intent of all NCAA regulations, you will help Notre Dame maintain its long history of excellence and integrity, both academically and athletically. In supporting the Fighting Irish, we ask that you help Notre Dame maintain its commitment to excellence by reviewing this summary of NCAA rules and regulations.

### I. Representative of Athletics Interests

According to NCAA regulations, a "representative of Notre Dame's Athletics interests" is any person who:

- Has ever participated with or is currently a member of any organization that promotes Notre Dame's athletic programs (i.e. Quarterback Club, Three-Point Club, Fast Break Club),
- Has ever made a donation to the University of Notre Dame Athletics Department,
- Has ever been a season ticket holder in any sport,
- Has ever helped arrange summer and/or vacation employment for an enrolled student-athlete, or
- Has ever been involved, in any way, in the promotion of Notre Dame's athletic programs.

### II. Prospective Student-Athlete

According to NCAA regulations, a prospective student-athlete is any student who has started classes for the ninth (9th) grade. Moreover, any student who has not started classes for the ninth (9th) grade becomes a prospective student-athlete if the institution or representative of the institution's athletics interests provides such a student (or the student's relative or friend) with any financial assistance or other benefit(s) that the institution does not provide to prospective students generally.

### III. Recruiting

Only coaches and athletic department staff members are permitted to be involved in the process of recruiting prospective student-athletes. Representative of Notre Dame's athletics interests are prohibited from contacting a prospective student-athlete or members of his/her family by telephone, letter, e-mail or in person for the purpose of encouraging participation in athletics at Notre Dame.

Moreover, athletics representatives are prohibited from scouting prospective student-athletes on behalf of a Notre Dame athletic program. Consequently, it would not be permissible for an athletics representative to observe a prospective student-athlete in practice or competition and report their observations of the prospect's ability to a Notre Dame coach.

### IV. Extra Benefits

An extra benefit is any special arrangement by an institutional staff member or a representative of the institution's athletics interests to provide a prospective or enrolled student-athlete or his/her family with a benefit not specifically authorized by NCAA regulations. Extra benefits that are not authorized by NCAA regulations would include, but are not limited to:

- Cash or loans of any amount,
- Co-signing or arranging a loan,
- Gifts or free services (e.g., airline tickets, meals at a restaurant, use of an automobile, etc.),
- Rent-free or reduced-cost housing,
- Employment of a student-athlete at a rate higher than the wages paid for similar work, or
- Payment to a student-athlete for work not performed.

We appreciate your support of intercollegiate athletics at Notre Dame. We ask, however, that you also help to continue Notre Dame's tradition of integrity in athletics by following NCAA regulations. Your assistance will ensure that the eligibility of both prospective student-athletes and currently enrolled student-athletes is protected.
