<p>10 Notre Dame is 10-0 under Brian Kelly when playing an entire game without committing a turnover. (Page 10)</p> <p>9 Notre Dame has played 17 games decided by a touchdown or less since the arrival of Brian Kelly in 2010. The Irish went 2-5 in the first seven such games, but have since gone 9-1. Since 1966, every home game for the Irish has been a sellout except one – a 1973 Thanksgiving Day game vs. Air Force. Notre Dame has played in front of sellouts in 280 of its last 281 home games.</p> <p>▶ Notre Dame has played in front of sellout crowds in 256 of its previous 298 games (.859) overall. Notre Dame owns a 57-12-1 mark (.821) in games when the opponent was making its first visit to the Stadium. Fourteen of those teams previously had played at Notre Dame (prior to 1930), with the Irish owning a mark of 46-9-1 (.830) since 1930 versus teams making their first overall visit to Notre Dame.</p> <p>▶ The Owls are the 142nd different opponent in Notre Dame football history. SEASON OPENERS

- ▶ The Irish are 103-16-5 (.851) in season openers and have won 21 of their last 26.
- ▶ Notre Dame, which failed to score first in six consecutive season openers (2003-08), hit pay dirt first in 2009, 2010 and 2012.
- ▶ Notre Dame has captured its last 14 season openers when scoring first, a span that dates back to the 1986 defeat to Michigan.
- ▶ Notre Dame dropped both the 1985 and 1986 openers against the Wolverines, both times opening with the game's initial score.
- ▶ Since 1958, the Irish are 33-3 (.917) when scoring first and 13-6 (.684) when the opponent scores first.

OPENERS AN INDICATOR?

- ▶ The 103 seasons Notre Dame has won its opener, the Irish went on to post winning records 94 times (91.3%), with four losing seasons and five .500 records.
- ▶ The 16 seasons the Irish lost their opener, the Irish posted winning records seven times and a losing mark eight times (with one .500 season).
- ▶ The five seasons Notre Dame registered a tie in its opener, the Irish had four winning records and one losing record.

HOME OPENERS

► Saturday's game is the home opener for the Irish and the 83rd time Notre Dame Stadium has served as the venue. The Stadium opened for Knute Rockne's final season in 1930 and the Irish have compiled a 320-106-5 (.748) record in "The House that Rockne Built."

► Notre Dame is 98-20-5 (.817) in its home openers, including 66-17-2 (.788) at Notre Dame Stadium. There were no home games in 1929 due to construction of Notre Dame Stadium.

- ▶ In his four years at Notre Dame, **Brian Kelly** has helped the Irish secure a 23-3 record when entering halftime with a lead and 23-3 mark when leading after three quarters.

- ▶ Kelly is 168-11 in his coaching career when taking a lead into the fourth quarter and 104-5 since 2001. He owns a 155-13 record when taking a lead into halftime, including a 100-5 mark since 2001.
- ▶ Here are a couple other pretty remarkable win-loss records during Kelly's career:

FIRST-TIME VISITORS

► Temple will become the 71st different team to visit Notre Dame Stadium (since its opening in 1930) when the Owls face the Irish on Aug. 31. Notre Dame owns a 57-12-1 mark (.821) in games when the opponent was making its first visit to the Stadium. Fourteen of those teams previously had played at Notre Dame (prior to 1930), with the Irish owning a mark of 46-9-1 (.830) since 1930 versus teams making their first overall visit to Notre Dame.

► Notre Dame played one first-time visitor to Notre Dame Stadium in 2012 and the Irish routed Wake Forest, 38-0, in the home finale.
 ► Notre Dame played one first-time visitor to Notre Dame Stadium in 2011 and USF upended the Irish, 23-20, in the season opener.
 ► Notre Dame played host to a trio of first-timers in 2010. The Irish routed Western Michigan, 44-20, on Oct. 16, lost to Tulsa, 28-27, on Oct. 30 and upended No. 15 Utah, 28-3, on Nov 13.

► The Irish had not hosted three first-time visitors to Notre Dame Stadium in the same season since 1972 when Notre Dame faced Miami (Fla.), TCU and Missouri.

► Including the 2011 matchup with USF, four straight Irish opponents at Notre Dame Stadium were first-time visitors to the "House that Rockne Built." The Irish had not played four consecutive games against first-time visitors to Notre Dame Stadium since 1931-32 — the second and third year of the stadium's history. The Irish hosted Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, USC in '31 before opening with Haskell in '32.

► The eight teams that have travelled to South Bend for the first time and come away with a victory at Notre Dame Stadium include (AP poll began in 1936): USC (1931), Texas (1934), Iowa (1940), Missouri (1972), No. 14 Clemson (1979), No. 20 Florida State (1981), Connecticut (2009), Tulsa (2010) and USF (2011). Purdue (1933), Michigan (1942) and Penn State (1982) also won their first games at Notre Dame Stadium but previously had played the Irish at Cartier Field.

- ▶ Following the 1981 loss to Florida State, 12 consecutive opponents lost in their first trip to South Bend: Colorado (1984), Mississippi (1985), Boston College (1987), BYU (1992), Vanderbilt (1995), Rutgers (1996), West Virginia (1997), Arizona State (1999), Texas A&M (2000), Washington State (2003), San Diego State (2008) and Nevada (2009). Connecticut snapped that streak in the home finale in 2009.
- ▶ Nine teams that were ranked at game time in the AP top-25 poll (which began in 1936) have lost in their first visit to Notre Dame, with the Irish being ranked lower in five of those games:

- ▶ Notre Dame has played home games versus a total of 123 different teams, primarily at old Cartier Field (pre-1930) or Notre Dame Stadium, with an overall home record of 104-14-5 (.866) in games versus all first-time visitors to Notre Dame (regardless of the site).

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK

- ▶ Notre Dame and Temple will meet on the gridiron for the first time in school history. The Owls are the 142nd different opponent in Notre Dame football history. The Irish own an all-time record of 118-20-3 (.848) when facing an opponent for the first time.
- ▶ The Irish have already faced 72 of the other 125 teams currently competing at the FBS level (does not include Temple).
- ▶ Notre Dame posted a remarkable 38-game winning streak when facing an opponent for the first time in school history from 1921-76.
- ▶ The Irish have played a number of first time foes over the last five years. Notre Dame hosted San Diego State in the 2008 season opener, Nevada in the 2009 season opener and Connecticut in the '09 home finale. The Irish also hosted Western Michigan, Tulsa and Utah in 2010. Notre Dame hosted USF and traveled to Wake Forest in 2011.

ONLY THE BIG BOYS

- ▶ Notre Dame is one of just three NCAA FBS programs to have not faced a non-FBS opponent since the current setup was established in 1978. The two other remaining schools that have yet to play a non-FBS opponent are USC and UCLA.

ON THIS DATE

- ▶ Notre Dame has played two previous games in its history on Aug. 31. The Irish are 2-0 (1.000) all-time on this date.

2013 NOTRE DAME OPPONENT UPDATE

- ▶ Notre Dame faces four opponents that are ranked in the top 25 of both the Associated Press poll and *USA Today's* coaches poll, including Stanford (No. 4/4), Oklahoma (No. 16/16), Michigan (No. 17/17) and USC (No. 24/24).
- ▶ Two other Irish foes, Michigan State and Arizona State, find themselves just outside the preseason top 25. BYU is also receiving votes in both polls.
- ▶ The slate is even more difficult when you consider that three of those meetings (Stanford, Michigan and Arizona State) will come away from the friendly confines of Notre Dame Stadium.
- ▶ The Irish have a long history of playing challenging schedules - with Notre Dame ranking (since the NCAA began this rating in 1977) first in 1978, 1985, 1987, 1989, 1995 and 2010; third in 1986, 1999, 2003; and fourth in 1979, 1990 and 2012. That makes for 12 top-four finishes in that category in the 36 years the NCAA has calculated these numbers.

RIGHT DOWN TO THE WIRE

► Notre Dame has become accustomed to thrilling finishes. The Irish have been involved in 26 games decided by seven points or less since the start of the 2009 campaign. In fact, 15 of the last 22 losses for the Irish have been decided by a touchdown or less, including seven by a field goal or less.

► Notre Dame has played in 60 all-time games where the winning points have occurred in overtime or the game's final minute of regulation. Amazingly, 15 have come in the last five years alone.

► Notre Dame has played 17 games decided by a touchdown or less since the arrival of **Brian Kelly**. The Irish went 2-5 in the first seven such games under Kelly, but have since gone 9-1.

► Notre Dame won five games in 2012 by a touchdown or less. The school record for victories by seven points or less in a single season is six, which was set in 1939 when that Irish club had a 6-1 mark in games decided by seven or less. The 1937 team was 5-1-1 and the 2002 club was 5-1-0 in games decided by seven or less, while the 1929 (4-0), 1940 (4-1), 1974 (4-0), 1990 (4-3), 1997 (4-2), 1998 (4-1) and 2009 (4-6) teams all had four wins by seven or less over the course of the season.

► Notre Dame was 5-0 (1.000) last season in games decided by a touchdown or less. In terms of winning percentage in games decided by seven points or less, the '29 and '74 teams were both 4-0, while the 1926, 1928, 1954 and 1957 teams finished 3-0.

IRISH ON A PRETTY GOOD RUN

► Since opening the 2011 season with an 0-2 record, Notre Dame has won 20 of its last 24 games—good for an .833 winning percentage. The Irish have the seventh-best overall FBS and fifth-best BCS AQ winning percentage since Sept. 17, 2011.

NO TURNOVERS = VICTORIES

- ▶ Notre Dame is 10-0 under **Brian Kelly** when playing an entire game without committing a turnover.
- ▶ Notre Dame has won its last 10 games in which it failed to commit a turnover. The Irish have not lost a game with no turnovers since Oct. 17, 2009, when USC upended Notre Dame, 34-27.
- ▶ Notre Dame is 24-4 in its last 28 games in which it failed to commit a turnover.

TIDE TURNING IN IRISH FAVOR WITH TURNOVERS

- ▶ Notre Dame forced 23 turnovers last season. The Irish forced only 14 in 2011 – the fewest dating back to 1951.
- ▶ Notre Dame ended up on the wrong end of the turnover battle three times last season (Oct. 13 against Stanford, Nov. 3 against Pittsburgh and Jan. 7 against Alabama). The Irish committed seven turnovers in those contests, but managed to win twice.
- ▶ Notre Dame outlasted Pittsburgh, 29-26, in triple overtime on Nov. 3, 2012, despite a minus-three turnover margin. The Irish had not won a game with three or more turnovers without creating one of their own since Sept. 6, 1980 when Notre Dame defeated Purdue, 31-10.
- ▶ **Brian Kelly** understands the importance of turnover margin. He owns a remarkable record of 119-12 when his team wins the turnover battle. In fact, Kelly is 16-1 at Notre Dame when the Irish win the turnover battle.
- ▶ In 2012, Notre Dame ranked tied for 13th in the FBS in fewest turnovers (15), tied for 20th in interceptions (16), tied for 27th in turnover margin (+0.62) and tied for 48th in turnovers forced (23) – a remarkable turnaround when compared to 2011.

- ▶ Notre Dame went on the road against a pair of top-10 foes in 2012 with a first-year starting quarterback making his first couple career road starts and failed to commit a single turnover (vs. No. 10 Michigan State and vs. No. 8 Oklahoma).
- ▶ The Irish had not gone consecutive road games without a turnover since 2004 (Tennessee and USC).
- ▶ Prior to last season, Notre Dame had not played a turnover-free game against a top-10 foe on the road since Nov. 27, 2004 against USC.
- ▶ Notre Dame finished 2011 with 29 turnovers. The 29 turnovers were the most by an Irish squad since 1999. Notre Dame committed at least three turnovers in six different games.
- ▶ Notre Dame ranked 73rd or worse in each of the four FBS turnovers categories. The Irish were tied for 112th in interceptions thrown (17), tied for 73rd in fumbles lost (12), tied for 110th in total turnovers (29) and 118th in turnover margin (-1.15).

OFFENSIVE LINE PAVES THE WAY

- ▶ Notre Dame's offensive line is led by graduate LT **Zack Martin** and graduate LG **Chris Watt**. Martin is a candidate for the prestigious Lombardi Award and Outland Trophy. He was named a second-team All-American by the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 2012.
- ▶ Martin has started all 39 games for Notre Dame over the last three seasons. He has won the Guardian of the Year Award, presented by the Guardian Life Insurance Company, to the top Irish offensive lineman in each of the last three years. Martin is the 18th two-time captain in Notre Dame football history.

- ▶ Watt has played in 39 straight games during his career. He has started 26 consecutive games at left guard entering this weekend's season opener.
- ▶ Senior RG **Christian Lombard** made his first career start in the 2012 season opener against Navy. He started all 13 games last year at right tackle. Lombard moved inside during fall training camp. He has played in 26 consecutive games for the Irish.
- ▶ Sophomore RT **Ronnie Stanley** will likely make his first career start against Temple. He saw action in two games in 2012 before an elbow injury sidelined him for the rest of the campaign.
- ▶ Junior C **Nick Martin** will earn his first career start this weekend. He is the younger brother of Notre Dame starting LT **Zack Martin**.
- ▶ The Martins will be the first set of brothers to start for Notre Dame since 1990 when **Tony** and **Reggie Brooks** both started. The 1990 backfield was so overstocked with quality runners, junior Tony rushed for 451 yards while sophomore Reggie was shifted to cornerback and made a late interception to help preserve a 28-24 victory against Michigan.
- ▶ The Martins will become the first pair of brothers to start along the offensive line since **Dave** and **Tim Huffman** in 1978. They started next to each other in the last nine games, plus the Cotton Bowl. The Irish went 9-1 during that stretch, losing only to co-national champ USC on a controversial call in the final minute.
- ▶ The offensive line helped Notre Dame run for at least 200 yards seven times in 2012, including six of the last nine contests of the season.
- ▶ Notre Dame had not posted more 200+ yard rushing games in a single season since 1996 when the Irish registered nine games with at least 200 yards rushing.
- ▶ Over last nine games of 2012, Notre Dame combined to rush for 1,901 yards (359 attempts) for 5.3 yards per carry and 15 rushing TDs. The Irish rushed for more yards in their last nine games combined than 51 FBS teams did in their entire 2012 seasons).

RUNNING BACK POSITION DEFINITE STRENGTH ENTERING 2013, BUT INEXPERIENCED

- ▶ Notre Dame enters 2013 without its top two rushers from 2012 in **Theo Riddick** (190 carries for 917 yards, 5 TDs; 36 catches for 370 yards, 2 TDs in 2012; 244 career carries for 1,169, 5 TDs; 120 career catches for 1,263, 8 TDs) and **Cierre Wood** (114 carries for 742, 4 TDs in 2012; 450 career carries for 2,447, 16 TDs).
- ▶ Speedy junior **George Atkinson III** (51 carries for 361, 5 TDs) and junior **Cam McDaniel** (23 for 125, 1 TD) have the most experience of the returning backs. Junior **Amir Carlisle** (he transferred from USC after the 2011 season) qualifies as another option with solid potential after missing all of 2012 with injury. Sophomore **Will Mahone** (DNP in 2012) is another possibility.
- ▶ The Irish also added a pair of talented rookies - **Greg Bryant** and **Tarean Folston** - to the equation for 2013. Bryant was named second-team *USA Today* All-USA high school All-America, while Folston was named the offensive player of the year in Florida by *Florida Today*.

BY GEORGE, IT'S ATKINSON

- ▶ Junior RB **George Atkinson III** picked up his first career 100-yard rushing game against Miami on Oct. 6, 2012. He finished the night with 123 yards on 10 carries. Atkinson III registered a 55-yard touchdown run with 23 seconds left in the third quarter to give the Irish a 34-3 lead. It marked his second touchdown run of 50+ yards last season.
- ▶ The 12.3 per carry average (minimum 10 rushes) was the sixth-best in school history.

- ▶ Atkinson III had 99 yards on nine carries and two touchdowns in the rout of Navy on Sept. 1, 2012, including a career-best 56-yard touchdown.
- ▶ Atkinson III ran indoor and outdoor track for Notre Dame in 2012 and placed third in 200-meter dash at BIG EAST Indoor Championships, helping the Irish claim the team title. His time of 21.47 was seventh-best among all football players that ran indoor track and ranked third by a freshman football player in 2012.
- ▶ Atkinson III ran 10.36 in 100-meter dash in preliminary round at BIG EAST Outdoor Championships, the second-fastest 100-meter clocking ever by a Notre Dame track runner (**Raghib "Rocket" Ismail** ran 10.34 in 1991). His 10.36 time was the fifth-fastest time in the nation by a football player who ran outdoor track in 2012 and was the quickest run by a freshman football player.

DOUBLE CENTURY GROUND GAME

- ▶ Notre Dame has won 15 consecutive games when rushing for at least 200 yards. The Irish have not lost a game with more than 200 yards on the ground since Nov. 3, 2007 against Navy.
- ▶ Notre Dame is 27-1 since the start of the 2002 season when it gains 200 or more yards rushing.
- ▶ Notre Dame ran for at least 200 yards seven times in 2012, including six of the last nine contests.
- ▶ The Irish have not posted more 200+ yard rushing games in a single season since 1996 when Notre Dame registered nine games with at least 200 yards rushing.
- ▶ Notre Dame has rushed for at least 200 yards 10 different times over the last two seasons—more than the previous five years combined (2006-10).

IRISH TOUGH TO BEAT WHEN WINNING THE RUSHING BATTLE

- ▶ Notre Dame outrushed 10 of its 13 opponents last season. The only three teams to outrush the Irish were Purdue (Sept. 8), Michigan (Sept. 22) and Alabama (Jan. 7).
- ▶ Since the start of the 2005 season, Notre Dame has won 43 of its past 45 games when recording more rushing yards than its opponent.
- ▶ A 27-game winning streak for the Irish when outrushing their opponent was snapped in the loss at Michigan on Sept. 10, 2011. Notre Dame had not previously lost a game when outrushing its opponent since Dec. 28, 2004, when the Irish lost to Oregon State, 38-21, in the Insight Bowl. Notre Dame rushed for more yards than Florida State in the 2011 Champs Sports Bowl, yet ended up on the losing side of that contest.
- ▶ Third-year head coach **Brian Kelly** has his own fairly remarkable run when his teams outrush their opponent. He is 161-23-1 in his career and 23-2 at Notre Dame when winning the rushing battle.

IRISH GROUND GAME CATCHES FIRE

- ▶ Notre Dame averaged 4.9 yards/rush in 2012, its highest per carry average over the last 16 years. The Irish have not averaged at least 5.0 yards/rush since 1996 when Notre Dame recorded 5.2 yards/rush.
- ▶ Notre Dame averaged 189.4 yards rushing yards/game in 2012, its third-highest per game average over the last 15 years. Only the 2000 (213.5) and 1998 (212.5) Irish squads averaged more per game.

- ▶ Notre Dame averaged 7.4 yards/rush in each of its victories over Miami (Oct. 6) and Wake Forest (Nov. 17) in 2012. The Irish have registered a higher per rush average on just one occasion over the last 15 years. Notre Dame ripped off 9.2 yards/rush against Air Force on Oct. 8, 2011.
- ▶ Notre Dame rushed the ball 51 times against Miami in 2012 and 50 went for positive yardage. In fact, the last 41 running plays for the Irish failed to lose a single yard. Notre Dame had nine different runs of at least 10 yards. The Irish had a total of 12 over its previous four games.
- ▶ The 376 yards rushing against the Hurricanes was the most for the Irish since they totaled 380 against Boston College on Nov. 11, 2000.

KOYACK, NIKLAS GIVE IRISH TWO MORE WEAPONS AT TIGHT END

- ▶ All-America and Mackey Award-winning tight end **Tyler Eifert** (co-team-leading 50 catches for 685 yards, 4 TDs in 2012; 140 career catches for 1,840, 11 TDs) has graduated and moved onto the NFL.
- ▶ Two-time letter-winning juniors **Ben Koyack** (3 for 39) and **Troy Niklas** (5 for 75, 1 TD; 7 starts in double-tight end sets) are the leading candidates to replace Eifert. They were each named to the watch list for the '13 Mackey Award (Eifert won the award in 2012).
- ▶ Senior **Alex Welch** (DNP in 2012) is another possibility.

JONES, DANIELS LEAD DEEP POOL OF WIDEOUTS

- ▶ Senior captain **TJ Jones** (team-high-tying 50 catches for 649 yards, 4 TDs in 2012) anchors the wide receiver corps. His top lieutenant figures to be junior **DaVaris Daniels** (31 for 490), coming off six catches for 115 yards against Alabama in the BCS title contest.
- ▶ Jones and Daniels give Notre Dame one of the top wideout tandems in college football. Both are candidates for the 2013 Biletnikoff Award. The Irish are one of 12 teams in the FBS with at least two wideouts on the pre-season list.
- ▶ Jones has 111 receptions and 1,321 receiving yards over his first three seasons. He has started 30 of 38 career games for the Irish. In his first season of action in 2012, Daniels registered 31 catches for 490 yards. He missed a couple games last season with a broken collar bone. Daniels led all Irish receivers with at least 20 receptions in yards per grab (15.8).

- ▶ Senior **Daniel Smith**, one of Notre Dame's biggest wideouts at 6-foot-4, has been hampered by injuries in his Notre Dame career but has flashed signs of being a good playmaker when healthy.
- ▶ Sophomore **Chris Brown** had just two catches last season, but one went for 50 yards and set up a critical fourth quarter touchdown in Irish victory at Oklahoma. He was the '12 South Carolina state champion in triple jump while placing second in the 100-meter and 200-meter dashes plus the high jump and could be the fastest receiver on the team.
- ▶ Freshmen **William Fuller**, **James Onwualu** and **Corey Robinson**, as well as sophomore **C.J. Prorise**, will add speed, athleticism and most importantly depth to the wide receiver position.
- ▶ Onwualu and Robinson each participated in spring practice as early enrollees. Prorise caught the eye of many throughout the spring, especially following his 35-yard touchdown reception in the Blue-Gold game.
- ▶ Robinson is the son of David Robinson, 10-time NBA All-Star and 2009 Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Inductee.

DEFENSE PRETTY STINGY ON THE SCOREBOARD

- ▶ Notre Dame ranked second in the FBS in scoring defense in 2012 – allowing just 12.8 points per game. The Irish were one of just three scoring defenses in the top 10 to face exclusively FBS competition.
- ▶ Notre Dame allowed 16 touchdowns last season (only 15 offensive touchdowns) – four fewer than any other FBS school. Alabama, Rutgers and Michigan State surrendered 20. Notre Dame allowed 34 total scores (16 TDs and 18 FGs), while Alabama allowed 25 (20 and five), BYU allowed 32 (22 and 10) and Boise State allowed 33 (27 and 6).
- ▶ Notre Dame's defense has allowed two offensive touchdowns or less in 24 of its last 30 games. The Irish have actually allowed one offensive touchdown or less in 15 of those outings, including nine of the 13 games in 2012.
- ▶ No FBS defense has allowed fewer rushing touchdowns than the 13 by Notre Dame over the last 31 games. Alabama has limited its opponents to 14.
- ▶ The only defense to allow fewer total touchdowns than the 52 by Notre Dame over the last 31 games—Alabama with 39.
- ▶ Notre Dame is one of six FBS teams that allowed less than 21.0 points/game over each of the last three seasons. The other five schools are Alabama, Boise State, Florida State, LSU and Wisconsin.
- ▶ Notre Dame has allowed an average of 17.90 points/game over the last three seasons combined, which ranks as the fifth-best average over 2010-12 of any team in the FBS.

The Irish were the only team in the FBS that did not allow a rushing touchdown over their first seven games of the season. Notre Dame still led the FBS in fewest rushing touchdowns allowed.

► Notre Dame has given up exactly 13 rushing touchdowns over its last 31 games (dating back to the Tulsa game in 2010). Even more amazing, only six of those rushing touchdowns have come from an opposing running back and two (Jonathan Lee's eight-yard TD run for Air Force came with the Irish leading, 59-27, with 33 seconds left in the fourth quarter on Oct. 8, 2011, and D.J. Adams' two-yard touchdown on Nov. 12, 2011, with the Irish leading Maryland, 45-14, with 37 seconds left) came against the Irish reserves.

► Quarterbacks' Mitch Mustain (USC, 2010), Denard Robinson (Michigan, 2011) and Blake Bell (Oklahoma, 2012) each snuck in from one-yard out. Signal callers' Tim Jefferson (Air Force) had a three-yard scoring run on Oct. 8, 2011, and Jarvi Cummings (Navy) had a 12-yard touchdown run with the Irish leading, 49-7, in the fourth quarter in 2011. Quarterbacks' C.J. Brown (Maryland) had a 24-yard touchdown run on Nov. 12, 2011, and Josh Bordner (Boston College) had a two-yard touchdown run on Nov. 19, 2011. Even crazier, nine of the last 14 rushing touchdowns against the Irish have come from quarterbacks (including Ricky Dobbs' two rushing touchdowns in the third quarter of the game against Notre Dame on Oct. 23, 2010).

► Over the last 35 games, only seven running backs have recorded a rushing touchdown against Notre Dame (Gee Gee Greene, Navy, 2010; Jon Lee, Air Force, 2011; Josh Harris, Wake Forest, 2011; D.J. Adams, Maryland, 2011; Ray Graham, Pittsburgh, 2012; TJ Yeldon and Eddie Lacy of Alabama, 2013).

► The 13 rushing touchdowns allowed by Notre Dame over the last 31 games is tops in the FBS. Alabama is second with 14.

DEFENSIVE LINE FITS THE BILL

► Notre Dame is led up front by All-America senior **Louis Nix III** (50 tackles, 7.5 TFL) and All-America junior **Stephon Tuitt** (47 tackles, team-leading 13 TFL, team-high 12 sacks).

► Nix III was named a third-team CBSports.com All-American in '12, while Tuitt was a first-team selection by CBSports.com, ESPN.com and *Sports Illustrated* and second-team honoree by Associated Press, Phil Steele, Walter Camp, *Sporting News* and *Athlon*.

► The duo has been included on just about every preseason All-America squad entering '13. Both are watch list selections for the Maxwell, Bednarik and Nagurski. Nix III will also challenge for the Outland Trophy, while Tuitt will be a leading candidate for the Hendricks Award.

► Nix III and Tuitt represent two of the six defensive players on the Maxwell watch list. Notre Dame is the only FBS program with multiple selections on the defensive side of the ball.

► Both Nix III and Tuitt are using their third season of athletic eligibility in 2013.

► Sophomore **Sheldon Day** (23 tackles, 3.5 TFL) takes over the starting role from graduated **Kapron Lewis-Moore**. Day was runner-up for Mr. Football in Indiana in 2011.

► They'll have help from seniors **Kona Schwenke** (5 tackles 1 TFL; started vs. Michigan State and Pittsburgh) and **Tyler Stockton** (DNP in 2012) at defensive line.

► Other options up front are senior lineman **Justin Utopo** (played in 10 games in 2012) and sophomore lineman **Jarron Jones** (DNP in 2012).

► The defensive front will also benefit from the addition of freshman linemen **Jacob Matuska** and **Isaac Roshell**.

STEPHON GETS TUITT

► Junior DL **Stephon Tuitt** collected 12.0 sacks in 2012. He ranked seventh in the FBS in sack yardage (89), tied for 14th in sacks/game (0.92), 13th in total sacks (12.0) and tied for 16th in solo sacks (10).

► Among FBS underclassmen, Tuitt led the nation in sack yardage (89), ranked second in total sacks (12.0), third in solo sacks (10) and second in sacks/game (0.92). He registered at least two sacks in three separate games (Navy, Purdue and BYU).

► Tuitt's 12.0 sacks were the most by an Irish player since **Justin Tuck** set the school record with 13.5 in 2003. They are also the most by an Irish underclassmen in school history and second-most overall.

► Tuitt recorded a sack in four consecutive games to open the '12 season. He was the first Irish player to accomplish the feat since **Ryan Roberts** had a sack in the first four contests of the 2000 season.

► Tuitt scooped up a fumble and rumbled 77 yards for a touchdown to give the Irish a 27-0 second-quarter lead on Sept. 1, 2012, over Navy.

► The touchdown fumble return was the longest since **Steve Lawrence** had a 79-yarder in 1985 and third-longest in school history.

► Tuitt is the first Irish defense lineman in 18 years to score a touchdown. The last time it occurred was a 20-yard fumble return by nose guard **Alton Maiden** on Nov. 9, 1996 in a 48-21 victory at Boston College. A week earlier, defensive end **Renaldo Wynn** had a 24-yard fumble return for a score — against Navy in Dublin, Ireland as well in a 54-27 win.

LINEBACKER CORPS AS EXPERIENCED AS ANY IRISH UNIT

► Graduate ILB **Dan Fox** emerged from a pack of contenders to earn the starting inside linebacker job opposite **Manti Te'o** last year and played well enough to start all 13 games. Fellow graduate ILB **Carlo Calabrese** split duties with Fox in '11-12, but moves into a full-time starting role in 2013.

► Fox has started 22 career contests and ranked fourth on the Irish with 63 tackles last year.

► Calabrese has played especially well against the run. No player on the team has more career tackles than his 146 stops.

► Senior OLB **Prince Shembo** (51 tackles, 10.5 TFL, 7.5 sacks) is somewhat overshadowed by Nix III and Tuitt, but is arguably one of the most disruptive 3-4 rush linebackers in college football. He leads all active Notre Dame players with 19.0 tackles for loss and is tied with Tuitt for the most sacks (14.0) among current Irish players. Shembo was named to the Bednarik watch list as well.

► Shembo has started 22 career games and has collected 97 tackles.

► Shembo, Fox and Calabrese were all named to the '13 Butkus watch list.

► Senior OLB **Danny Spond** was forced to retire from football after suffering another hemiplegic migraine during fall camp.

► Junior OLB **Ben Council** and freshman OLB **Jaylon Smith** will vie for the starting spot opposite Shembo. Council played in 12 games last season and amassed 10 tackles, predominantly on special teams.

► Smith, winner of 2012 Butkus Award presented by Pro Football Weekly to top high school linebacker in the country, was the first-team linebacker on the *Parade* prep All-America squad. He was also named first-team *USA Today* All-USA high school All-American and a finalist for American Family Insurance All-USA Defensive Player of the Year.

► Smith could become the first Notre Dame linebacker to start a season opener since **Kory Minor** in 1995.

► Senior ILB **Kendall Moore** and junior ILB **Jarrett Grace** provide quality depth at both inside linebacker positions. Each will see significant playing time on special teams as well.

► Junior OLB **Ishaq Williams** will help the Irish at both the outside linebacker position and defensive end spot. At 6-5, 261, Williams has the size and athleticism to be a significant force off the end for the Irish. He has played in 24 games over the first two years of his career. Williams has registered 28 tackles, including 22 last season. He added three and a half for loss and forced a fumble in 2012.

► Sophomore **Anthony Rabasa** did not play as a freshman in 2011 and saw limited action in 2012, but adds great depth to the position.

► **Romeo Okwara**, a sophomore from Charlotte, N.C., attended the same high school as Shembo and was a first-team all-state defensive player in 2011. He is extremely young (just turned 18) and raw, but his frame (6-4, 258) and athleticism helped him see the field in 2012.

► Okwara, who had a tackle for loss and forced fumble at No. 8 Oklahoma, registered seven tackles, including one and a half for loss in 2012.

IT'S GOOD TO BE A PRINCE

- Senior OLB **Prince Shembo** had 10.5 tackles for loss and seven and a half sacks in 2012, both of which ranked second on the Irish. He led the team with 12 quarterback hurries (stat tracked at all Irish home games, but not every away contest). Shembo ranked sixth on Notre Dame with 51 total stops.
- Shembo ranked tied for 11th among FBS linebackers in solo sacks (seven), tied for 12th in sack yardage (55), tied for 13th in total sacks (7.5) and 15th in sacks per game (0.58).
- Shembo collected four tackles for loss and three sacks in the victory over Boston College in 2012. It was the most tackles for loss by an Irish player since Derek Landri had four and a half against Army on Nov. 18, 2006. It was also the most sacks by a Notre Dame player since **Victor Abiamiri** had three against Stanford on Oct. 7, 2006.
- No FBS linebacker had more sacks in a game in 2012 than Shembo had against Boston College. He was the sixth FBS linebacker to collect three in one game last season (list included eight players).

► Shembo finished with a career-high nine tackles, two for loss, one sack and a pair of quarterback hurries in the victory over No. 10 Michigan State on Sept. 15. He collected six tackles, two for loss and one sack by the 13:35 mark of the second quarter.

SECONDARY EXPERIENCED AT SAFETY, FAR FROM IT AT CORNER

- Junior S **Matthias Farley** (49 tackles, 1 int.) returns at one safety spot.
- Farley made the largest leap of any safety during 2012. In his first year at the position after playing wide receiver in his freshman year (entirely on the scout team as he did not see any game action), Farley started the final 11 games last season.
- Additional monogram-winners at safety are senior **Austin Collinsworth** (he missed all of 2012 with injury), sophomore **Elijah Shumate** (9 tackles, 3 PBU) and walk-on junior **Connor Cavalaris** (5 tackles).
- Sophomore **Nicky Baratti** (8 tackles, 1 int.) was lost for the season during fall practice following a shoulder injury.
- Junior **Eilar Hardy** (DNP in 2012) and sophomore safety **John Turner** (DNP in 2012) proved during fall practice that each is fully capable to help the Irish.
- Freshman **Max Redfield** will vie for immediate playing time.
- The Irish secondary began 2012 as the team's least experienced group but came on strong to provide more than its share of support. It ranked among the top 20 FBS schools in the following pass defense categories in '12: fewest passing yards/completion (9.95, 2nd), fewest touchdown passes (11, t-6th), pass efficiency defense (111.36, 16th), interceptions (16, t-20th), fewest passing yards/attempt (5.98, 13th) interception percentage (3.69, 24th) and pass defense (199.77, 25th).
- The defensive backfield will be paced by the squad's leading returning tackler in senior **Bennett Jackson** (65 tackles, 4 ints.), along with sophomore **KeiVaree Russell** (58 tackles, 2 ints.).
- Jackson, who was a Bednarik watch list selection, started all 13 games at cornerback last year. He recorded 45 solo stops and collected four interceptions. Jackson tied for 39th in the FBS in interceptions (0.31/game). He was the first Irish cornerback to record four interceptions in a season since Mike Richardson finished with the same amount in 2006. Jackson had four tackles, a key interception that prevented a touchdown and combined for another tackle on the crucial fourth-down overtime play that gave Notre Dame a victory over Stanford (Oct. 13).
- Russell, who switched from running back to cornerback in the '12 preseason, became the first freshman at Notre Dame to start at cornerback in the opening game of a season. He collected two interceptions and was named a freshman All-American by *Sporting News* and Scout.com powered by FOX Sports NET.
- In 2012, Russell was the first freshman ever at Notre Dame to start at cornerback in the opening game of a season.

- The previous closest freshman to start near a season opener was **Stacey Toran** in 1980 when he started the third game and the remaining nine for the Sugar Bowl team.
- Senior **Lo Wood**, projected to be a starter a year ago before a preseason injury sidelined him, is back as well.
- Freshman **Cole Luke** has quickly ascended the Notre Dame depth chart and will see the field in nickel packages.

NOTRE DAME FOOTBALL—A FAMILY AFFAIR

- Notre Dame players whose fathers also played for the Irish include senior WR **TJ Jones** (Andre, 1987-90) and junior OG **Conor Hanratty** (Terry, 1966-68).
- The Irish feature one player who had an elder sibling also suit up for Notre Dame. Senior WR **Nick Fitzpatrick** is the younger brother of former PK **D.J. Fitzpatrick** (2002-05).
- The Irish 2013 roster has two sets of brothers — **Zack** and **Nick Martin** and **George III** and **Josh Atkinson**. Zack is a graduate student OT and Nick is a junior C. George III is a junior RB and Josh is a junior CB.
