VISIT THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

The College Football Hall of Fame, located in downtown South Bend, has extended hours on Notre Dame home football weekends (Fridays and Saturdays from 8 a.m. – 8 p.m., and Sundays from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.). Admission prices are \$9 for St. Joseph County (Ind.) resident adults, \$11 for non-St. Joseph County (Ind.) resident adults, \$8 for seniors and students, \$5 for children ages 5-12 and free to children under five.

NORTHERN INDIANA CENTER FOR HISTORY

The Northern Indiana Center for History presents *Rockne: A Notre Dame Legend*. STADIUM EXPRESS GAME DAY SHUTTLE TO NOTRE DAME STADIUM

Transportation to Notre Dame Stadium begins approximately three hours before kickoff and provides prompt returns following the game. Participating locations for the Stadium Express include: University Park Mall, area hotels, Town & Country Shopping Center, the College Football Hall of Fame, Studebaker National Museum, Washington & Main Streets (across from Holiday Inn), South Bend Regional Airport (and nearby hotels), Saint Mary's College, Holy Cross College and St. Joseph's High School. Fares are \$4 each way per person (\$2 from Saint Mary's College, Holy Cross College and St. Joseph's High School), or \$6 round trip with shuttle tickets purchased in advance.
