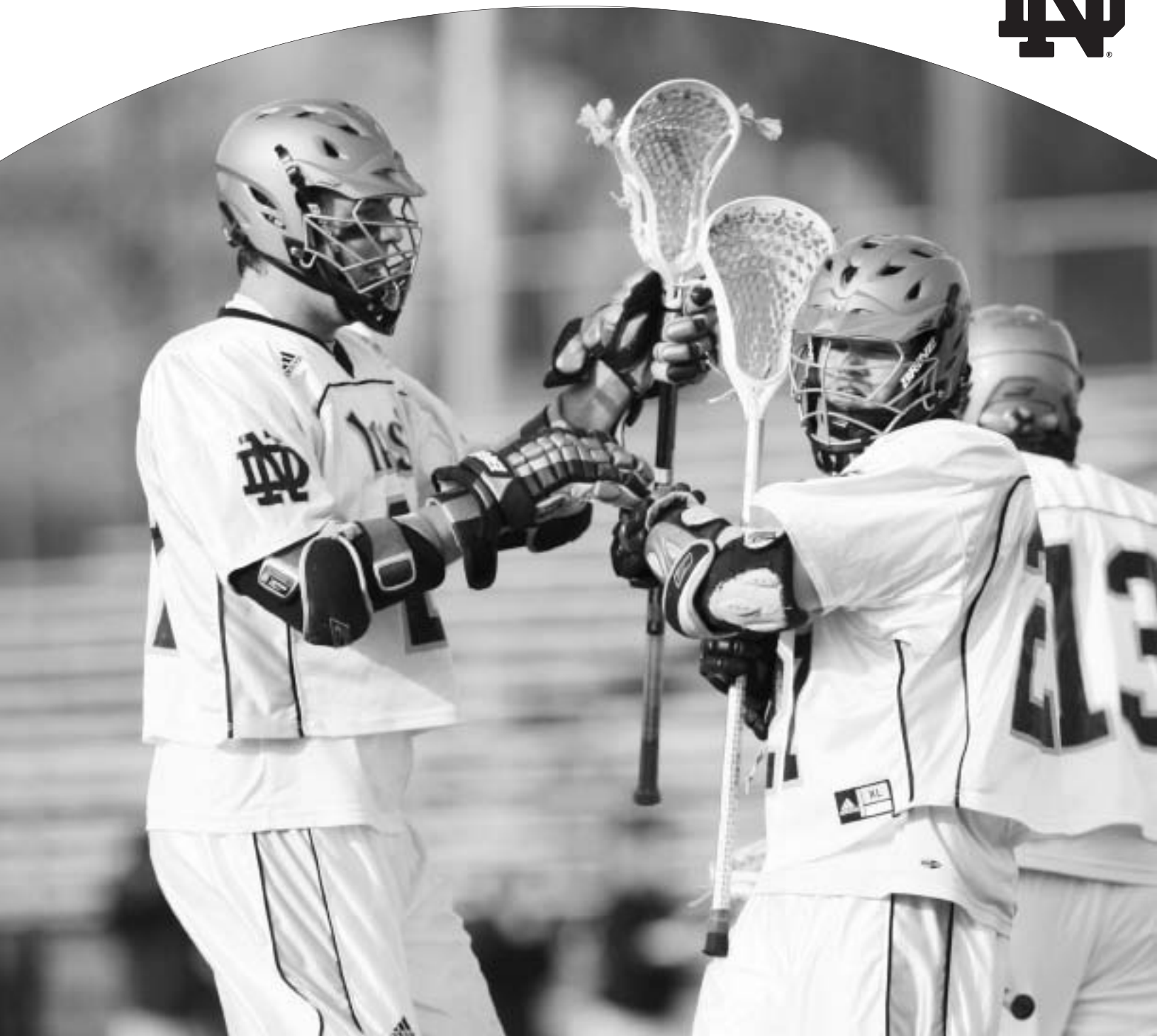


# NOTRE DAME **SEASON IN REVIEW**

## Taking Command of the Conference Once Again

*Irish capture first outright GWLL title since 2001 by posting perfect league record*

The 2007 season witnessed the Notre Dame men's lacrosse team win the program's 10th Great Western Lacrosse League (GWLL) title and make the 12th trip to the NCAA Tournament in school history. Accolades were abundant for the Fighting Irish, who boasted five All-America honorees and swept the major conference awards.

Unfortunately for the Irish, history repeated itself in more ways than one as they fell to the eventual national champion for the second straight season in the first round of the NCAA Championship. Johns Hopkins topped Notre Dame, 11-10, in a thrilling back-and-forth overtime affair in Baltimore, Md. on May 12, Notre Dame concluded the season with an 11-4 record, including a perfect 5-0 mark in league play.

Despite not advancing further in the national tournament, the Irish still had many accomplishments to celebrate. Notre Dame ranked fourth in both scoring offense and defense during the 2007 season. The Irish defense boasted a school-record 6.66 goals-against average, while the offense nationally averaged 11.65 goals per game.

Leading the charge on the defense was goaltender Joey Kemp, who earned his second straight honorable mention All-America honor. The junior tri-captain was also named the GWLL player of the year as he ranked fourth nationally in both goals-against average (6.78) and save percentage (.614). While Kemp was solid between the pipes once again, he also benefitted from a stingy defensive unit that included his classmate in fellow honorable mention All-American and first-team all-GWLL member Sean Dougherty.

Spearheading the powerful Irish offense was sophomore Ryan Hoff, who scored a team-best 40 goals, while freshman Will Yeatman had team-high totals in points (46) and assists (25). Hoff earned GWLL first-team honors as did Yeatman, who was named the GWLL newcomer of the year. The rookie also earned honorable mention All-America distinction.

The highest-ranked NCAA statistical category for the Irish was their man-up offense numbers. Notre Dame converted on 50-percent (29-of-58) of its man-up opportunities on the season and that ranked third nationally. Junior midfielder Michael Podgajny, another honorable mention All-American, led the Fighting Irish with nine man-up goals, while senior midfielder Lucius Polk had seven and Hoff chipped in with six. Both Podgajny and Polk were second-team all-GWLL selections.

Also earning second-team all-conference honors was junior defenseman Ross Zimmerman and senior midfielder Brian Hubschmann. In addition, Hubschmann earned honorable mention All-America accolades. The fifth-year senior finished second on the team in goals with 27 and tied for third in points with 39.

Completing the sweep of the GWLL hardware was Kevin Corrigan, who garnered his fourth GWLL coach of the year award. Corrigan steered the Irish to the double-digit victory plateau for the seventh time during his 19-year Notre Dame tenure. On April 30, he was named the US Lacrosse National Coach of the Week honors after Notre Dame clinched the GWLL title with a win at Ohio State.

The '07 season got underway with a key 9-7 home victory over No. 13 Loyola College in the Loftus Center on February 17. The 11th-

ranked Fighting Irish fell behind by three, 7-4, with 7:56 left in the third quarter, yet ran off five straight goals to take the victory. The Notre Dame defense showed early in the '07 campaign that it would be a force by shutting out the Greyhounds in the fourth quarter after the game was knotted, 7-7, after three periods.

Following a stellar 2006 campaign, Hubschmann picked up where he left off as he notched four points on three goals and an assist against Loyola. Hoff and Polk chipped in two goals and one assist apiece for Notre Dame. Yeatman had a fine collegiate debut as he scored the first goal of the game in addition to dishing out two assists.

Notre Dame opened the season 2-0 for the first time since 2003 with an 11-8 road victory against Penn State. After surrendering the first two goals of the contest, Notre Dame responded with 10 of the game's

next 11 scores to possess a 10-3 lead with 2:21 left in the third quarter. After the Nittany Lions netted five straight goals, Podgajny put a halt to the streak with his career-high fourth goal of the game. Hubschmann and Yeatman aided Podgajny in the scoring with two goals each.

After moving to No. 8 in the polls, the Fighting Irish would then embark on their second of five straight games away from home. A trip to Hewlett, N.Y. and a meeting with fourth-ranked Cornell resulted in a 13-8 setback. The Big Red claimed a 12-3 advantage with just over three minutes remaining in the third quarter before the Irish rattled off five of the game's next six goals to provide the final margin. Yeatman and Hubschmann led the Notre Dame offense with two goals apiece.

A second straight loss would come at the hands of the 15th-ranked North Carolina Tar Heels, who topped the Irish 11-8 in Chapel Hill, N.C. Notre Dame held a 5-3 lead with one minute left in the first quarter as Hoff deposited his second goal, yet the hosts would go on a 7-0 run to take command of the game and drop the Irish to 2-2 on the season.

Notre Dame got back to its winning ways with a 16-5 triumph of No. 19 Drexel in Philadelphia, Pa.

The 16th-ranked Irish used a school record-tying seven goals from Hoff to dismantle the Dragons. It signified the most goals for an individual during a road game in program history and it tied the overall mark established by Randy Colley in 1993. Hoff was not the only Irish player with a big offensive day as Hubschmann recorded four goals, which tied a career-high number. Yeatman produced a six-point performance on two goals and four assists, while Podgajny also chipped in with two goals.

The Fighting Irish then faced Dartmouth during a cold and snow-filled afternoon in Hanover, N.H. Notre Dame carried a 3-1 lead into the second quarter, yet that period would feature a 4-0 run by the Big Green and Dartmouth would take a 5-4 lead into the intermission. The Irish knotted the game, 6-6, by the end of the third quarter, yet surrendered the game winner with 8:18 left to play. Hubschmann scored a team-high three goals in the loss. The 7-6 defeat moved Notre Dame to 3-3 on the season, however that would mark the last loss of the regular season.

An eight-game win streak commenced with an 11-3 victory over Bellarmine in the GWLL opener at Moose Krause Stadium. Despite trailing 1-0 after the first quarter of play, No. 19 Notre Dame netted 11 of the game's next 12 goals to open a nine-goal margin after three quarters. Hoff and Yeatman both collected hat tricks, while Polk netted two scores and sophomore Duncan Swezey produced a career-high four points on one goal and a career-best three assists.

The Notre Dame defense would limit the opposition to just three goals for the second straight game in an 11-3 triumph at Brown. The contest was all Irish as they held a 7-2 halftime lead before extending the advantage to 9-2 in the early stages of the second half. Yeatman registered his second consecutive hat trick, while Polk added three points on a goal and two assists. Junior Taylor Claggett owned the faceoff X by winning 14-of-18 for Notre Dame.

Another dominating performance on both sides of the ball resulted in a 15-5 home victory over Villanova. Notre Dame scored the game's first five goals before the Wildcats edged back to make it 7-4 at the half. A six-goal third period put the game away and improved the Irish to 6-3 on the season. Hoff exploded for five goals, while Podgajny had a career-best seven-points on three goals and four assists, also a career-high total. Polk aided the Irish effort with his third two-goal game of the season.

Notre Dame returned to league play with a 16-4

win over Air Force. The Fighting Irish used a balanced attack as five players scored at least two goals. Junior Alex Wharton notched a career-high three goals along with dishing out an assist for a career-best four points. Hubschmann recorded his fourth game with three or more goals and Yeatman produced four points on two goals and two assists. Podgajny and Hoff both deposited two scores in the Notre Dame victory, which featured no second-quarter scoring from either team, yet combined for a 10-goal outburst in the third period. The Irish accounted for eight of the goals in the quarter.

Two days after besting Air Force, the Irish improved to 3-0 in GWLL play with a 14-6 home win over Denver. Notre Dame broke the game open with nine second-half goals after the contest was tied, 5-5, at halftime. Hoff and Polk both scored four times, while Podgajny and Wharton chipped in two goals apiece. Hubschmann matched a career-high total with four assists.

The winning streak reached six as the Fighting Irish stepped away from conference play with another stellar performance in a 14-2 win over Lehigh. The victory extended the Irish home win streak to a program record 13 games. Notre Dame registered the first 10 goals of the game before the Mountain Hawks got on the board with 12:27 remaining in the contest. Swezey tallied a career-high four goals and his classmate Hoff chipped in two. Yeatman, a tight end on the Irish football team, served double-duty on the day as he played against Lehigh before taking part in the annual Blue-Gold football spring game.

Following the win over Lehigh, Notre Dame climbed back into the top 10 of the national polls. The 10th-ranked Irish traveled to Columbus, Ohio, for a showdown with No. 20 Ohio State. Both teams entered the game with undefeated GWLL records. Notre Dame jumped on top, 5-1, before the Buckeyes sliced the lead to one at 7-6 with 11:46 left in the third quarter. The Fighting Irish then scored the final five goals of the game to come through with a 12-6 victory and secure at least a share of the GWLL crown.

Leading the charge against the Buckeyes was Polk who notched a career-best four goals. The senior midfielder was tabbed the GWLL player of the week for his performance. Swezey collected his second straight five-point game with two goals and three assists. Yeatman and Hoff also aided the result with two scores apiece.

Notre Dame headed to Hamden, Conn., for the regular-season finale against conference newcomer Quinnipiac. The eighth-ranked Irish carried a 7-2 lead into the intermission before eventually winning, 14-9, to claim their first outright GWLL title since 2001. Hoff had another big day with six goals, while Hubschmann contributed three goals and two assists.



Midfielder Lucius Polk had a breakout senior campaign in 2007 as he registered career-high numbers in goals (18), assists (9) and points (27). Polk, a second-team all-GWLL selection, helped the Irish offense rank fourth in the nation with an 11.65 goals per game average.

The victory against the Bobcats locked up another NCAA Championship bid for Notre Dame. The Irish were pitted against perennial power Johns Hopkins in the first round of the tournament. Notre Dame entered the contest ranked ninth, while the Blue Jays were ranked fifth along with being the third seed in the tournament.

The back-and-forth tilt featured two 40-minute weather delays due to lightning and heavy rain in the area. It also marked Notre Dame's first overtime contest in over two seasons and its first ever in NCAA Tournament play. Podgajny delivered with his second four-goal game of the season, while Hubschmann had three goals and two assists and Hoff also recorded two tallies.

Notre Dame jumped ahead 4-1 by the 9:52 mark of the second quarter. Johns Hopkins responded with four straight goals to take a 5-4 lead with 8:35 left in the third period. The Irish evened the contest before two more goals from the Blue Jays made it 7-5. The next seven goals alternated between both teams and Johns Hopkins led 10-9 as the contest approached the final minute.

Following a Johns Hopkins turnover, Hubschmann fed Hoff and he deposited the ball into the back of the net with nine seconds left on the clock to force overtime. The upset hopes of the Irish were dashed during the first minute of overtime as the Blue Jays scored to advance on and eventually take the 2007 NCAA title.

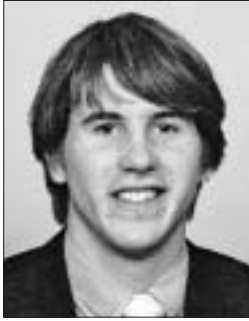

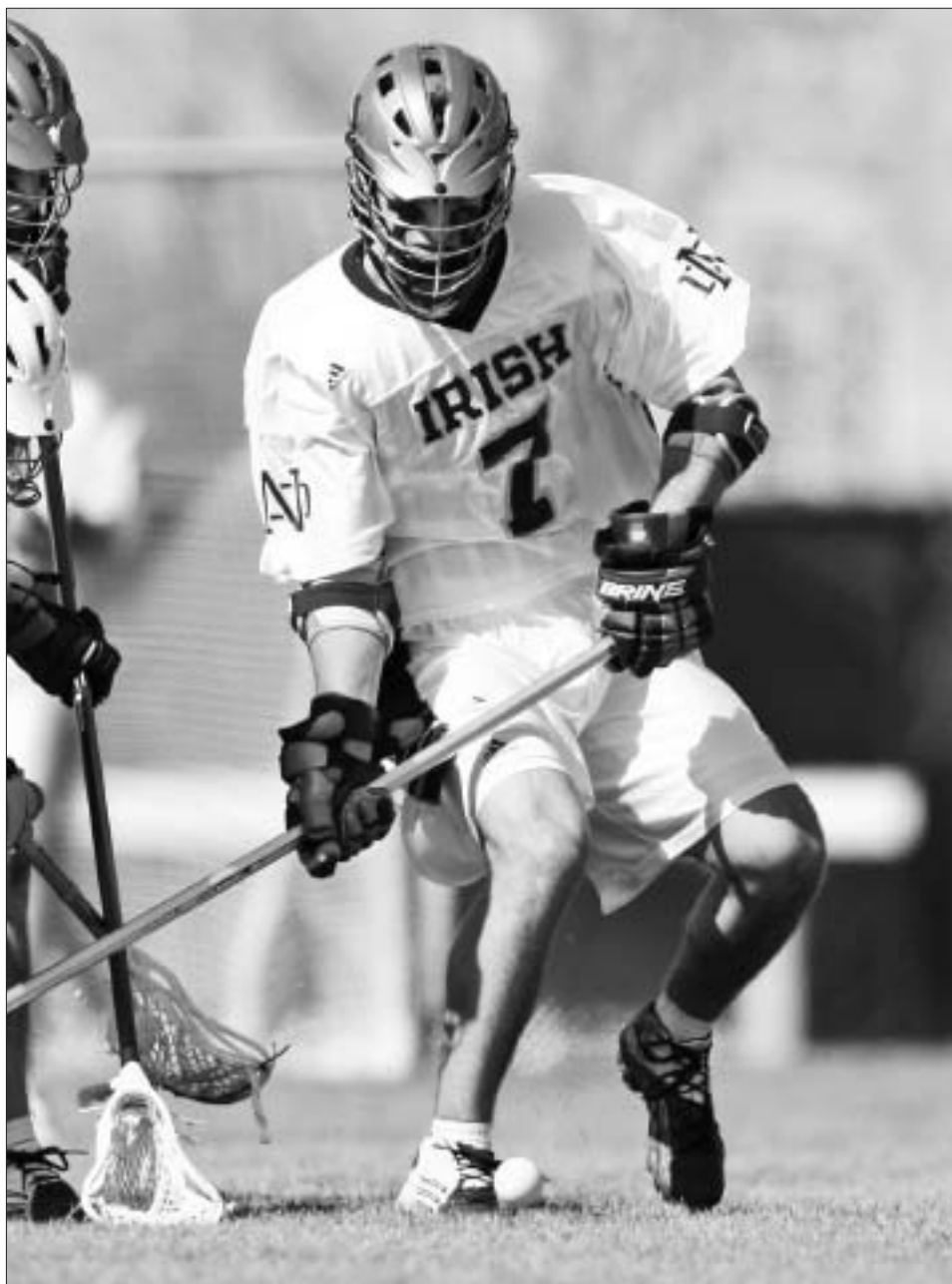
