

NOTRE DAME SEASON REVIEW

Notre Dame became the first school in BIG EAST Conference history to have three players named to the league's All-Freshman Team when the trio of Ashley Barlow (pictured), Melissa Lechlitner and Erica Williamson copped the honor.



Proving The Doubters Wrong

The 2006-07 season already was going to be a challenging one for Notre Dame, with two of its top three scorers graduating. Then, the Irish were handed the additional obstacle of losing their top returning scorer and rebounder, sophomore guard **Lindsay Schrader**, to a season-ending knee injury on Oct. 15. As a result, the BIG EAST Conference coaches gave Notre Dame little respect and little chance of success, ranking them 11th in their preseason poll, a survey that actually was taken before Schrader's injury.

However, when all was said and done, the Irish showed everyone that polls are about as worthless as the paper they're printed on. Notre Dame charged to a 20-12 record, including a tie for fifth place in the BIG EAST at 10-6, and earned their 12th consecutive NCAA Tournament berth (14th overall). As if that weren't enough, the Irish then knocked off California, 62-59 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, and had top-seeded North Carolina on the ropes late in their second-round contest before the Tar Heels escaped with a 60-51 decision, ending Notre Dame's season.

A History Lesson

The Notre Dame women's basketball program celebrated its 30th anniversary season in 2006-07, having compiled a 613-278 (.688) record during those three decades on the hardwood. The Irish have been remarkably successful through the years, posting 28 winning seasons, including a current string of 15 in a row and 19 of 20 during the tenure of head coach **Muffet McGraw**.

Notre Dame also reached a milestone on Dec. 16, becoming the 43rd NCAA Division I program to amass 600 all-time victories when Notre Dame downed IUPUI, 75-65 at the Joyce Center.

The Magic Number Is 20

One of the cornerstones in Notre Dame's tradition of success has been its consistency, and 2006-07 was no exception. The Irish posted a 20-12 record, registering their 13th 20-win season in the past 14 years, the 17th in the 20-year **Muffet McGraw** era, and the 21st in the program's 30-year history. Notre Dame has been especially strong in the past 11 seasons, ranking seventh in the nation with 267 victories (an average of nearly 25 wins per year).

Hard Work Pays Off For Irish

Each of the eight veterans on the Notre Dame roster made a personal commitment

to improve their production at both ends of the court in 2006-07, and every one of them lived up to their pledge. In fact, with the exception of injured sophomore guard **Lindsay Schrader**, every Irish player improved on her scoring average from the '05-06 season, led by junior guard **Charel Allen**, who doubled her output from 8.5 to 17.0 points per game. Classmate and backcourt partner **Tulyah Gaines** nearly doubled her scoring as well this season, finishing at 9.6 ppg. after scoring 4.9 points per night a year ago.

On the defensive end, Gaines swiped a team-high 66 steals, more than doubling her career high (28) set the previous year. She also was one of three Notre Dame players with 60 steals (Allen and freshman guard **Ashley Barlow** had 63), marking the first time since the 1996-97 Final Four campaign that the Irish had three defenders reach the 60-steal mark. Additionally, Barlow's 63 thefts tied the third-highest tally ever by a Notre Dame freshman, while the Irish team total of 335 steals equaled the fourth-best single-season mark in school history.

Generation Next

While the Irish veterans were a vital part of Notre Dame's success last year, the Irish got major contributions from their freshman class, which proved to be arguably the best in the BIG EAST Conference and one of the top rookie groups in the nation. Guard **Ashley Barlow** (10.3 ppg, 5.4 rpg., 2.0 spg.) finished second on the team in scoring, rebounding and steals, while guard **Melissa Lechlitner** (6.3 ppg., 2.7 apg.) was especially valuable down the stretch, averaging 8.6 points in her final nine games. And, center **Erica Williamson** (6.1 ppg., 5.3 rpg., 1.3 bpg.) blocked a team-high 39 shots, the third-highest total ever by an Irish rookie. In addition, all three players ranked among the top 10 true freshmen scorers in the BIG EAST during the '06-07 season.

Thus, it was no surprise that, in 2006-07, Notre Dame became the first school in BIG EAST history ever to place three players on the conference's All-Freshman Team.



For the first time since joining the BIG EAST Conference, Notre Dame led the league in steals (10.47 spg.). The Irish also had three players with at least 60 steals for the first time since 1996-97, including Tulyah Gaines with a team-high 66 thefts.

Never Retreat, Never Surrender

Notre Dame took on all comers last season and while the Irish didn't always come out on the right side of the ledger, they never backed down from a fight. In fact, Notre Dame played seven ranked opponents and came away with victories over No. 10/9 Purdue (67-58) and No. 17/16 Louisville (64-55), both at the Joyce Center. The Irish also defeated eventual Mid-American Conference champion and NCAA Sweet 16 participant Bowling Green (85-81 in overtime) three weeks before the Falcons moved into the polls.

Yet, it may be Notre Dame's performances in defeat that showed the team's resiliency and indomitable spirit. In each of their five losses against ranked opponents, the Irish either led or trailed by no more than six points for a good portion of the second half, including exceptional outings against three of the four participants in the '07 Final Four. At Tennessee, Notre Dame trailed by just two points at halftime, while in the home finale vs. Rutgers, the Irish were down 52-46 with eight minutes remaining. Then, in the NCAA Tournament vs. North Carolina, Notre

Dame led 41-33 with 12:54 to play, and after the Tar Heels regained the lead, the Irish got as close as 52-49 with less than a minute left before UNC won the game at the foul line.

The Steel City Scorer

In taking up the responsibility as Notre Dame's primary scorer with the absence of sophomore guard **Lindsay Schrader**, junior guard **Charel Allen** rose to the occasion throughout the 2006-07 season. Allen was the team's top scorer (17.0 ppg.) and rebounder (6.2 rpg.) and ranked second in the BIG EAST with 19.3 points per game in conference play. She also scored in double figures 29 times in 32 games (including each of her last 12 contests), and she cracked the 20-point mark 11 times with a career-high 31-point outing (on 14-of-19 shooting) against St. John's on Jan. 16. The Monessen, Pa., native went on to be named a first-team all-BIG EAST selection, and ultimately was tapped as a WBCA All-America Team finalist (and an honorable mention All-American), the 13th time in the past 12 seasons a Notre Dame player has earned that

status.

Allen also turned in two milestone performances during the season. From Feb. 11-17, the Irish wing was virtually unstoppable in wins over DePaul (25 points), Villanova (25 points) and Providence (26 points), becoming the first Notre Dame player in a decade to score 25 points in three consecutive games. Then, in the regular-season finale at DePaul on Feb. 26, Allen connected on a jumper in the lane with 4:19 left, making her the 23rd 1,000-point scorer in school history. She will enter her senior season with 1,053 points, which currently puts her 21st on the Irish all-time scoring list.

Jammin' The Joyce

For the seventh consecutive season, Notre Dame ranked among the top 20 teams in the country in terms of attendance,

checking in at No. 10 in 2006-07 with an average of 6,364 fans per game. The Irish also continue to be among the nation's most consistent women's basketball draws, having brought in at least 5,000 fans to 94 of their last 96 home games, including 15 crowds of 8,000 fans or more, and the first three sellouts (11,418) in program history.

Irish On The Small Screen

Notre Dame took its television coverage to unprecedented levels in 2006-07, as 21 of its 32 games were broadcast live either via commercial television (including seven nationally-televised games) or through the free Fighting Irish All-Access multimedia package on the school's official athletics web site, UND.com. Those coverage figures will only increase in the future, with plans in place to broadcast every Notre Dame home game live, either through commercial outlets or on UND.com.

The Irish now have made 92 televised appearances in the past six seasons (2000-01 through 2006-07), averaging more than 15 TV games per year in that span.



Charel Allen was a first-team all-BIG EAST and WBCA honorable mention All-America selection last year after doubling her scoring average to 17.0 points per game and ranking second in the conference with 19.3 ppg. in league play.

CAREER CAPSULE: Energetic guard who blossomed into integral part of Notre Dame lineup during her career ... was starter for better part of final three seasons ... known more for her strong defensive abilities and often drew assignment of opponent's primary backcourt threat ... quickness made her not only a threat on defense, but in transition as well ... after slow start to career, developed a reliable offensive game that included long-range arsenal as well as slashing drives through the lane ... even-keeled demeanor made her solid leader on the court and in the locker room for the Irish.

SENIOR SEASON (2006-07): Team co-captain ... started all 32 games, averaging career-high 6.8 points per game as well as 3.1 rebounds a contest while logging a personal-best 28.8 minutes a night ... opened season with strong 13-point effort (4-8 FG, 2-3 3FG) against Central Michigan ... registered six points, three assists and three steals in (then) career-high 38 minutes of overtime win vs. Bowling Green ... collected career-high three steals for second consecutive

game at Penn State ... scored all 10 of her points vs. Western Michigan in second half, while also delivering career-high-tying five assists ... was driving force behind win over No. 10/9 Purdue, setting new career highs for points (22), field goals made (8), three-pointers made (4), three-pointers attempted (7) and steals (tied - 3); scored seven points in game-turning 11-0 run late in second half, including go-ahead three-pointer with three minutes to play ... tied career high with five assists in victory vs. IUPUI ... scored nine points at Valparaiso, including game-winning free throw with 1.2 seconds remaining ... logged nine points and four rebounds at No. 4 Tennessee ... registered 14 points in BIG EAST opener at Seton Hall; canned pair of three-pointers, including left-handed (her off hand) mid-court shot at halftime horn — first bucket



from center stripe by Irish player in nearly five years (Alicia Ratay vs. Virginia Tech, 1/26/02) ... turned in strong defensive effort in OT loss at South Florida, holding BIG EAST Preseason Player of the Year Jessica Dickson without a field goal for 28:20 (no FG in second half) ... scored eight points (including 500th of her career) and swiped career-high four steals at No. 17/18 Marquette ... tossed in seven points (3-4 FG, 1-2 3FG) in victory over West Virginia ... piled up 12 points (4-9 FG, 3-6 3FG) in win vs. #17/16 Louisville; also played key role on defense, limiting BIG EAST Player of the Year Angel McCoughtry to 10 points (3-7 FG, 0-2 3FG, 4-6 FT) in second half ... had another sharp defensive performance in win over DePaul, limiting Blue Demons' leading scorer Allie Quigley to three second-half points (0-1 FG, 3-4 FT - two FT came on technical foul shots) ... posted second double-digit scoring game in three contests, finishing with 10 points (4-6 FG, 2-2 3FG) at Villanova ... snared seven rebounds at Providence, and had six rebounds vs. Georgetown ... collected eight points (3-4 FG, 2-3 3FG) and four rebounds against No. 21/22 Rutgers ... wrapped up regular season with 15 points (5-10 FG, 3-6 3FG) at DePaul ... came back with 17 points (7-13 FG, 3-8 3FG)
