# NOTRE DAME **SEASON IN REVIEW**

*A win at the Wolverine Invitational marked the third straight Fighting Irish victory to open the 2007-08 season. Notre Dame would go on to capture two more titles, including the BIG EAST Championship. The Irish also had three golfers combine to claim four medalist honors.*



# One for the Record Books

*Irish rewrite several program records during the 20th season of varsity play*

The 2007-08 campaign marked the 20th season of varsity women's golf at Notre Dame and the Fighting Irish made it a special year for the program. Along with capturing a school-record five tournament victories, including the BIG EAST title, several other program marks were established along the way during the second season of the Susan Holt era.

Notre Dame surged out of the gate with three straight victories to open the '07-'08 ledger and that proved the Irish belonged among some of the nation's top teams. In the fall, the Irish enjoyed the highest ranking in school history as they peaked at No. 12 according to Golfstat. The Fighting Irish maintained a presence in the top-25 ranking throughout the majority of the season. Notre Dame put its consistency problems of the past to rest during the campaign and garnered the ninth seed in the NCAA Central Regional.

A young, yet talented, lineup that featured two freshmen, two sophomores and a junior in the five-person scoring lineup for the entire year led the Irish to a season stroke average of 300.47, which eclipsed the old school mark of 305.46. Depth was a strength for the Irish as three golfers combined to win four tournaments on the year.

"All in all, it was an exciting year to be a part of," commented Holt. "Each golfer got better at different parts of their game. There are certainly areas we can improve upon, but I just felt their progression throughout the year was neat to watch. It was just a good team dynamic. They all got along really well and they had a lot of respect for each other."

Freshman So-Hyun Park notched two wins en route to becoming the first All-America honoree

in program history as she received honorable-mention All-America recognition from both the National Golf Coaches Association and Golfweek magazine. Park recorded a school-record 73.63 stroke average and finished among the top-seven in nine of 11 events on the season.

"What can you say about So-Hyun," stated Holt. "We knew she was a special player coming in and we were excited about her arrival. She came in here wanting to make a difference. She pretty much rewrote the record book in one year and I think she'll rewrite it each year and continue to break her own records. She's a very focused and motivated individual."

A win at the season-opening Cougar Classic in Hanahan, S.C. was a sign of things to come for the Fighting Irish. Not only did Notre Dame take the team title against a strong 20-team field, but junior co-captain Lisa Maunu copped medalist honors by firing a school-record three-round total of 210 (-6). Her first-round six-under par 66 also was a program standard. The 54-hole score of 870 (+6) from the Irish shattered the previous school record of 889.

"The win at Charleston against that field set the tone for our season," said Holt. "The field had five or six teams that were preseason top-25 and we ended last season ranked in the 70s. For us to come in and win that tournament and play the way that we did and back it up every day really gave our players a sense of confidence."

The Irish made it another clean sweep of both team and individual titles at the Napa River Grill Cardinal Cup in Simpsonville, Ky. the following week. A 14-over par 878 won it for Notre Dame over the field of 17, which included the host Louisville, the team the Irish fell to at the 2007 BIG EAST tournament during the first hole of a sudden-death playoff.

"It didn't take much for the team to get up for Louisville because they were out for revenge after last season's BIG EAST championship," said Holt, whose team was named the Golfweek women's national team of the week for their back-to-back victories. "A significant part of the win was that we played Louisville at their home golf course. That win felt really, really good and I think it just added to their level of confidence because Louisville was coming off a 10th-place showing at last year's NCAA finals and most of their team was still intact."

Taking home the individual crown at the Cardinal Cup was Park, who was coming off a runner-up showing at the Cougar Classic in her collegiate debut. Park shot a three-under par 213 at the Cardinal Club. On the season, the Seoul,

South Korea native would pace the Irish a team-high six times.

Even with a bullseye on their back due to the blazing hot start, the Irish made it three wins in a row by taking the Wolverine Invitational at the University of Michigan Golf Course in Ann Arbor, Mich. Notre Dame carded a 904 (+52) to top the nine other teams in the field. Despite being denied a third straight medalist finish, the Irish still placed three golfers in the top-10 led by Maunu, who tied for runner-up honors with an eight-over par 221.

The remarkable start marked the first time in program history that the Irish had ever won three straight events during any point of a season, let alone to start out a campaign.

"During all three of those wins, we were not leading heading to the back nine of the final round," said Holt. "They really showed a lot of fight and I think they really showed their character. They weren't going to stop playing until the last putt went in the hole. That was encouraging for me to see and they really gained a lot of

respect for each other.”

A fourth consecutive win was not in the books as the Irish were runner-up to TCU at Furman’s Lady Paladin Invitational in Greenville, S.C. Notre Dame posted a three-round total of 910 (+46), which was 14 shots off the winning mark. Park paced the team with a tie for seventh by registering a nine-over par 225.

The fall season concluded at the Ann Rhoads Intercollegiate in Tuscaloosa, Ala. The Fighting Irish shot an 897 (+45) at the North River Golf Club to tie for fourth among the 18 teams entered. A two-over par 215 gave Park runner-up honors and marked her third finish of second or better in the five events of the first semester.

Notre Dame’s impact on the collegiate golf scene during the fall did not go unnoticed as the Irish were named Golf World’s most surprising women’s team at the midpoint of the season and Park was tabbed as the publication’s most surprising female player.

“I was really pleased with the fall,” stated Holt. “I felt that we really grew up a lot. We put ourselves in a good position for the spring.”

The Fighting Irish broke out the clubs for the spring campaign at the Central District Invitational in Parrish, Fla. A disappointing score of 929 (+65) that resulted in a 10th-place showing did not sit well with the Irish and they knew there was work that needed to be done.

“We pretty much beat ourselves,” said Holt. “I

think that was a wakeup call. They were really mad and they should have been. I was mad too. Every now and then you need that wakeup call. I think it was good to have it at that point of the season because we had time to recover from it.”

During the University’s spring break in early March, the Irish traveled to Arizona to get some valuable practice time on the course before competing against 17 other schools at the Rio Verde Collegiate Invitational.

The time was well spent as Notre Dame notched its fourth victory of the season at the Rio Verde Invitational by carding an 11-over par 875, which ranks second in the record books behind the Cougar Classic score from earlier in the season. Park captured her second win of the year with a season-best four-under par 212 at the Rio Verde Country Club’s Quail Run Course. Park’s sophomore teammate Annie Brophy was right behind her in second place, while fellow sophomore Kristin Wetzel joined them in the top-10 by placing sixth.

A trip to Austin, Texas was next in store for Notre Dame. The weather played havoc on the Irish and the entire 18-team field at the Betsy Rawls Longhorn Invitational. The 54-hole event was shortened due to inclement weather, yet even when play did resume the conditions were less than ideal on the course that would play host to the 2008 NCAA Central Regional.

Despite the obstacles, Notre Dame still tied for fifth at the University of Texas Golf Club with a 642 (+66). Park led the Irish with a 156 (+12) that tied her for seventh, while her classmate Katie Conway reached the top-10 as well by tying for 10th-place.

The Irish then set out for Miami Lakes, Fla. to take part in the Canes & Cards Classic at the Don Shula Golf Resort. In the final event of the 2007-08 regular season, Notre Dame placed fourth out of 14 teams with an 886 (+22). Park continued her stellar rookie campaign as she tied for second with an even-par 216.

Next up was the 2008 BIG EAST Championship at the Elks Run Golf Club in Batavia, Ohio. One of the season goals for the Fighting Irish was to remove any doubt that they indeed were the best team in the league.

The Irish led the seven-team field wire-to-wire and finished with an 899 (+35) to top runner-up and two-time defending conference champion Louisville by nine shots. That marked the third BIG EAST title for Notre Dame and the first since 2004.

Brophy edged out Park by two shots to take the conference’s individual hardware with a six-over par 222. The sophomore became the third Irish golfer to be named a BIG EAST champion, yet the first to do it outright. In all, a program-record tying four Fighting Irish teammates earned a spot on the all-conference team. Joining

Brophy and Park was Maunu and Wetzel as they both tied for fourth place.

“I knew they were going to leave no doubt at this year’s championship,” stated Holt about her team’s effort. “I was really proud of them in the way they showed up because they had to show up and they did to beat a good Louisville team by nine shots.”

With one goal already checked off the list, another one was in sight for Notre Dame. An NCAA regional bid was already locked up with the BIG EAST win, yet the Irish were now determined to advance past the regional and into the NCAA finals for the first time in school history.

On paper, the Fighting Irish were on the cusp of making it to the final stages of the national tournament since they were seeded ninth and the top-eight teams following the 54-hole competition would move on. Unfortunately, this would not be the year for the Irish to make the move. A three-round total of 925 (+61) had the Irish in 16th place (out of 21 teams) when it was all said and done at the University of Texas Golf Club. Maunu led the squad as she tied for 30th with a nine-over par 225.

“The five players we took to regionals had never been there before and they didn’t know what to expect,” said Holt. “We played a golf course that has beaten us up more times than we have beaten it. I just feel it was the right team but the wrong course and sometimes that just happens.”

Great things should be in store for the 2008-09 version of the Fighting Irish as they return everyone from the ’07-’08 scoring lineup. In addition, Notre Dame will welcome in two newcomers, Katie Allare and Becca Huffer, who should increase the competition level and make the squad even stronger.

“I told the team they need to work hard this summer,” added Holt. “I told them (the five-person lineup) it might be the last time they all travel together and that’s the reality of the situation with the class that we have coming in. They (the returnees) are going to have to step it up even more, but they were going to have to do that anyway if we are going to make it to the NCAA finals.”

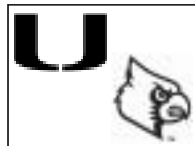

For the second straight week, the Fighting Irish made it a clean sweep by taking home both the team and individual titles at the Napa River Grill Cardinal Cup in Simpsonville, Ky. Freshman So-Hyun Park (right) claimed top honors in just her second collegiate tournament.



The 2007-08 campaign was a historic season for the Notre Dame women's golf program. In all, the Fighting Irish captured a program-record five tournament titles, including the BIG EAST championship, and had three different golfers combine to claim four medalist honors.



The Fighting Irish made it three wins in a row to open the campaign by winning the Wolverine Invitational in Ann Arbor, Mich.



The 2008 BIG EAST title marked the program-record fifth title of the season for Notre Dame. Sophomore Annie Brophy became the third Irish golfer to win an event on the year as she won the individual conference championship.

During the spring campaign, Notre Dame captured its fourth triumph by claiming the Rio Verde Collegiate Invitational in Rio Verde, Ariz. So-Hyun Park took home the individual trophy and became just the second golfer in program history to win two events in a single season.
