area, joining fellow seniors Becky Ranck (Radnor) and Heather and Lindsey Ferguson (Newtown Square) ... selected to Dean's List in fall of '06 and spring of '07 ... has played in 51 career games with 114 goals and 55 assists for 169 points ... owns 67 ground balls, 38 draw controls and 33 caused turnovers.
