Irish Rowers Earn Second Consecutive NCAA Championship Berth in Team Competition

Notre Dame wins unprecedented fourth consecutive BIG EAST Crown



Following their second appearance in program history in the team competition, the Irish finished 12th at the 2007 NCAA Championships in Oak Ridge, Tenn.

Nine Years Coming

The 2006-07 campaign marked the ninth year for the Irish rowing program. Rowing became the 26th varsity sport at Notre Dame with the start of the 1998-99 campaign.

Back to Back

The Notre Dame rowing program received a team berth to the NCAA Championships (in Oak Ridge, Tenn.) and ended up placing 12th overall. The varsity four placed 11th overall with a 5th-place finish in the Petite Final while the varsity eight and second varsity crews earned 12th-place finishes overall by finishing sixth in the petite final. It marked the second straight top-12 finish for Notre Dame, which earlier had placed ninth at the 2006 NAAs.

Four-Peat

Notre Dame won an unprecedented fourth consecutive BIG EAST championship in women's rowing, with the competition again held in Worcester, Mass. The Irish claimed victories in the varsity eight, varsity four and novice four races, while the second varsity eight, second varsity four and novice eight crews all took second.

Rowing with the Best

During consecutive races in April, Notre Dame's varsity eight crew defeated five top-10 boats — a first in the program's nine-year history. In head-to-head races at the Windemere Classic (in Redwood Shores, Calif.), the Irish beat fifth-ranked California, seventh-ranked Stanford and #9 UCLA. Two weeks later at a four-boat race in Princeton, N.J., Notre Dame finished first against Virginia (the new 5th-ranked team), Princeton (#7) and George Washington.

Poll Position

For the second straight year, Notre Dame's varsity eight boat finished in the top-10 of the final Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association (CRCA)/USRowing Poll with a sixth-place finish, one year after ending up fifth in the final 2006 poll. Notre Dame began the 2007 season 11th in the preseason ranking and then fell to 16th before climbing to a program-best third in the May 2 national rankings.

Back in the Boats

Several members of the Irish participated in the in the NAAs for the second time. Returning members of the varsity eight boat included coxswain Maria Romano, Amanda Polk, Mary Quinn, Laura Pearson, Allison Marsh and Megan Boyle. Christine Trezza was

Notre Dame's varsity eight crew took third at the Central/South Region Championships and finished the year sixth in the final Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association (CRCA)/USRowing ranking. The Irish also defeated five consecutive top-10 boats in back-to-back races to reach a program-best third in the CRCA/USRowing Poll in early May.

Ankica Jedry was a member of the varsity four crew, but competed with the second varsity eight boat. Returning members of the varsity four crew were coxswain Sarah Keithley and Shannon Cassel.

Three-Time All-American

Amanda Polk became the Notre Dame rowing program's first three-time All-American as she earned CRCA first-team honors for the second consecutive year. As a freshman in 2005, Polk was a second-team selection. The program also featured a rower who was named All-America for the first time in her career, as Allison Marsh collected second-team honors.

Regional Honors

Led by repeat first-team honorees Amanda Polk and senior coxswain Maria Romano, Notre Dame had five rowers earn CRCA all-Central Region honors for the second consecutive year. Allison Marsh joined Polk and Romano on the first while Meghan Boyle and Laura Pearson earned spots on the second team.

BIG EAST Staff of the Year

Notre Dame head coach Martin Stone and his assistant coaches Joe Schlosberg and Marnie Stahl were honored as the BIG EAST coaching staff of the Year in 2007 for the second consecutive season, after leading the Irish to their fourth straight BIG EAST title.

The Captains

Seniors Meghan Boyle, Eileen Froehle and Sarah Kate Hafner served as captains for the 2006-07 season. Boyle is the program's first-ever two-time captain as she served as a tri-captain in 2005-06.

National Scholar Athletes

Nine rowers were honored by the CRCA as 2007 National Scholar-Athletes. The nine rowers named as National Scholar Athletes were Meghan Boyle, Lauren Buck, Shannon Cassel, Erica Copeland, Jessica Guzik, Sarah Keithley, Mary Kate McNamara and Laura Petnuch.

The Notre Dame women's rowing team trains in the fall and spring on the waters of the St. Joseph River.



Although the weather can be somewhat challenging during the winter months, the University of Notre Dame and the Irish women's rowing team boast some of the nation's best athletic facilities. For most of the season, the Irish row on the St. Joseph River and for those times when they need to go indoors, they have full use of the Loftus Sports Complex and the Guglielmino Athletics Complex.

The St. Joseph River, which runs through downtown South Bend just a couple of miles from the Notre Dame campus, provides three miles of well-protected waters for the rowing team. A boathouse, built in 1984 near the banks of the St. Joseph River, houses the boats and equipment used by the team.

The Irish rowing program provides the latest in equipment and boats. Notre Dame's inventory includes six eight-person boats, including two Resolut eights, six four-person boats, including two Pocock hours, and six pair/doubles boats. The University added new boat racks in 1999-2000 and added a new 120' dock in 2001-02. It also has state-of-the-art video equipment, which is used on a daily basis.

For the colder months, the Irish have access to a number of indoor facilities, which house a full inventory of rowing machines called ergometers.

For dry-land training, Notre Dame rowers have access to 32 ergometers for use by the team year round. The Irish also have the ability to put together four eights of ergs on slides, allowing the athletes to row in simulated lineups. This allows the Irish to work on technical points in an excellent teaching and learning environment. There is also the capability to link the ergs via computer and have races between the four boats.

The 2004-05 school year marks the 19th full year of use of the Loftus Sports Complex, including Meyo Field and the Haggar Fitness Complex, by Notre Dame's athletic teams. The all-purpose indoor sports building, which was first opened in September of 1987, and dedicated on April 23, 1988, was designed for use by all Notre Dame athletic teams, as well as students, faculty and staff. The \$6.3 million facility measures 614 by 210 feet and stands in the trees just northeast of the Joyce Center.

In addition to housing the Haggar Fitness Center Complex and Meyo Field, which features a 100-yard Prestige Turf field surrounded by a six-lane track one-fifth of a mile long making it as large as any indoor track in the nation, the Loftus building features four large air-conditioned conference rooms that can be subdivided into nine smaller rooms by means of soundproof partitions. There

is also a 154-seat auditorium with audio-visual capability for academic lectures and team meetings. The facility also includes men's and women's lockers, plus a first-aid station.

The new Don F. and Flora Guglielmino Family Athletics Center, due to be completed by the fall of 2005, will be the new home of a weightlifting area that will be double the size of the current area and rank as one of the most comprehensive free-weight and exercise machine facilities in the country. It will also serve as the new central location for the athletic training and equipment facilities as to make everything more convenient for Notre Dame student-athletes so they are able to manage their time in a more efficient manner.

There are also weightlifting areas in both the Joyce Center and Rockne Memorial Building available for student-athlete use.

"We are extremely fortunate to have some of the best equipment in the country," head coach Martin Stone said.

"That is a testament to the support that we receive from the University and the athletic department. There are plans in the works to upgrade all of our facilities and the women's rowing program will benefit a great deal now and in the future."
