Storylines

- The Irish will make their 24th consecutive NCAA Championship appearance Friday. The 24-year streak is the second-longest active streak in the country, with North Carolina having earned 35 straight berths.
- It will be the second meeting all-time between Notre Dame and SIUE, and first since 1991.

The Notre Dame women's soccer team will make its 24th NCAA Championship appearance in as many years, having claimed a No. 2 seed when the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship Committee released the 2016 NCAA Championship bracket on Monday. The Irish were regular-season co-champions of the Atlantic Coast Conference, and advanced to the ACC Championship semifinal last weekend.

The Irish have advanced past the first round in 21 of their previous 23 NCAA appearances. In 12 of those appearances, they advanced to the College Cup, which this year will be held at Avaya Stadium in San Jose, California. The Irish are eight-time NCAA finalists and three-time NCAA Champions, second-most in Division I women's soccer history.

Setting The (Golden Dome) Standard

When it comes to powerhouse programs in women's college soccer, one need look no further than Notre Dame. The Fighting Irish have won three NCAA titles (1995, 2004, 2010) to highlight a resume that includes eight NCAA national championship match appearances and 12 trips to the NCAA College Cup semifinals (second-most in tournament history). Notre Dame has earned 24 consecutive NCAA Championship berths (1993-2016), the second-longest active streak (North Carolina, 1982-2016) and third-longest run all-time in tournament history.

In their history, the Fighting Irish have developed four Hermann Trophy winners and 52 All-Americans, including 19 first-team selections. Now in its 29th season in 2016, Notre Dame owns an all-time record of 533-110-35 (.813).

Scouting SIUE

The Cougars earned the automatic bid to the NCAA Championship after winning the Ohio Valley Conference Championship. They enter the postseason with a 10-7-4 record as winners in three of their last four matches, and advanced on PKs in their first-round OVC tournament match against Austin Peay. SIUE defeated Eastern Kentucky 1-0 in the championship match on Sunday.

SIUE is led in scoring by Caroline Hoefert with 16 points (five goals, six assists), while Avery Anderson (13 points) and Peyton Roehnel (11 points) also have five goals. Emily Grahl has 12 points on three goals and six assists.

Goalkeeper Juli Rossi has the majority of the minutes for the Cougars, appearing in 15 games. She has a 1.36 goals against average with a .730 save percentage and four shutouts. Natalie Freeman has appeared in five matches with four starts and has a 0.75 goals against average with a .800 save percentage.

NCAA Nuggets

The Irish are one of seven ACC teams to earn an NCAA bid, with six earning seeds. Notre Dame and North Carolina each earned No. 2 seeds, while Clemson, Duke, Florida State and Virginia are No. 3 seeds. NC State earned an unseeded berth.

Last Time Out

The Irish advanced to the ACC semifinal match for the third time in four years in the conference, but fell 2-1 on a late goal to North Carolina on Friday.

The Tar Heels took a 1-0 lead in the 22nd minute, capitalizing on a rebound off a free kick, but the Irish evened things in the 72nd minute when senior forward **Kaleigh Olmsted** intercepted a Tar Heels pass in the backfield, juked goalkeeper Lindsay Harris and walked in her fourth goal of the year for the equalizer. The Irish couldn't hold on, however, as North Carolina scored with less than five minutes left on a cross in front of the net.

All-ACC Honorees

The Irish had five members make the All-ACC teams, announced Thursday. Senior forward **Kaleigh Olmsted** was named to the first time, with freshman forward **Jennifer Westendorf** selected for the second team and senior goalkeeper **Kaela Little**, senior midfielder **Sandra Yu** and junior midfielder **Taylor Klawunder** chosen for the third team. Westendorf was also named to the All-Freshman Team.

The five picks for Notre Dame were the most for the all-conference teams since the Irish joined the ACC, and the most since the Irish had six All-BIG EAST picks in 2006.

Following the ACC Championship, Olmsted was named to the All-Tournament team after scoring her fourth goal of the season against North Carolina in the semifinal.

Irish 'Round The World

Three players with Notre Dame connections will suit up for their respective national teams this fall at the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup, scheduled for November 13-December 3 in Papua New Guinea.

Sabrina Flores and **Natalie Jacobs**, who redshirted this season while in training, will represent the United States after playing key roles in the U.S. qualifying effort at last December's CONCACAF Championship.

Junior defender **Monica Flores** will play with the Mexico U-20 National Team, having seen stints at both the U-20 and full-team level in the past year. Monica Flores played with the Irish through October 14 before leaving to join Mexico in game. She started all 14 games she played for Notre Dame, logging key minutes on defense and in the midfield as the Irish have contended for the top spot in the conference.

Stacking Up

For the first time, the Irish are the regular season ACC Champions, sharing the title with Clemson (23 points). Because the Irish defeated Clemson earlier this season, they won the top seed into this year's ACC Championship.

At No. 11, the Irish are one of six Atlantic Coast Conference teams to appear in this week's NSCAA Division I Women's Soccer poll. No. 6 North Carolina, No. 10 Florida State, No. 12 Clemson, No. 13 Duke and No. 15 Virginia round out the ACC representation. Virginia Tech is also receiving notes.

Nationally, the Irish rank in the top 6 in four defensive categories: shutouts (second, 14), save percentage (fourth, 0.909), shutout percentage (third, 0.700) and goals against average (sixth, 0.428).

Individually, freshman forward **Jennifer Westendorf** ranks among the top five in the ACC in shots (third, 71 shots) and shots per game (fifth, 3.55/gm). Senior goalkeeper **Kaela Little** tops the league in save percentage (0.908), shutouts (12) and shutouts per game (0.60). She ranks second in goals against average (0.436) and also ranks third in the conference in saves (89) and saves per game (4.45). Little ranks fourth in the nation in save percentage (.908) and sixth in goals against average (0.436).

The (Almost) 2-0 Guarantee

Notre Dame is a combined 368-1-1 (.996) all-time when claiming a 2-0 lead, and has won 341 of its last 342 contests when going ahead 2-0 (since a 3-3 draw with Vanderbilt on Sept. 15, 1991, in Cincinnati). The only loss in that span was a 3-2 defeat in double overtime against North Carolina (9/20/14).

In fact, just three of the past 249 Fighting Irish opponents to face a 2-0 deficit have won or even come back to tie, something achieved by five opponents in Notre Dame history: Duke on Oct. 17, 1993, in Houston (ND won 3-2), Connecticut on Nov. 10, 1996, in the BIG EAST final at old Alumni Field (ND led 2-0, later tied 2-2 and 3-3, ND won 4-3), Duke on Nov. 30, 2007, in the NCAA quarterfinals at old Alumni Field (ND won 3-2), Villanova on Oct. 12, 2008 in Villanova, Pa. (ND won 3-2 in OT), and most recently, North Carolina on Sept. 20, 2014 at Alumni Stadium (UNC won 3-2 in 2OT).
