# KATHI BENNETT

## Northern Illinois Head Women's Basketball Coach

Kathi Bennett, a veteran collegiate head coach who has guided three programs to eight NCAA Tournaments and five conference championships while posting a career winning percentage of .613, was named head women's basketball coach at Northern Illinois University, May 18 2010. Bennett is the ninth head coach in program history.

"Kathi brings experience, she brings knowledge of the game, excellent communication skills and above all, she cares about the student-athletes," said NIU Associate Vice President and Director of Athletics Jeff Compher. They will work hard, play hard and have a great experience. I am confident this program will make significant competitive strides and, under Kathi's direction, will achieve our goal to compete for conference championships in the near future."

In just one season, Bennett's impact has already been felt. Under her guidance, the Huskies went from a 10-win team in 2009-10 to a 13-win team in 2010-11, despite losing three starters. More importantly, NIU improved from a 4-12 record in Mid-American Conference play to a 7-9 mark last season.

Thanks to Bennett's signature pack defense, NIU held opponents to less than 40 percent shooting in 15 of 30 games. Opponents were stifled to less than 30 percent shooting on five occasions. Along the way, Bennett also collected her 300th career win to join her father, legendary coach Dick Bennett, on the 300-career-win list.

Bennett came to NIU after two seasons as an assistant coach at Wisconsin, where she coached the Badgers' defense and was instrumental in UW making its first NCAA Tournament appearance in eight years in 2010. Wisconsin finished tied for third in the league and led the Big Ten in scoring defense in 2010 after ranking 10th in the league in that category prior to her arrival.

A native of Stevens Point, Wis., Bennett is the sister of University of Virginia head men's basketball coach Tony Bennett; her father won 316 games as a collegiate coach at Washington State, Wisconsin, UW-Green Bay and UW-Stevens Point. Kathi Bennett played collegiately at both Stevens Point and Green Bay and earned her bachelor's degree from UW-Green Bay in 1986.

Bennett's 18 years of experience as a collegiate head coach include stops at Marycrest College (1988-89), Wisconsin-Oshkosh (1989-96), Evansville (1996-2000) and Indiana (2000-05). Her career record of 309-194 includes 12 winning campaigns and nine postseason appearances. Bennett is looking forward to developing another winner at Northern Illinois.

"I'm a builder. It's who I am. I know that's what is in me,"

Bennett said. "The opportunity to build this program... that thumps in my heart."

Fundamental to Bennett's formula for building programs are the "five cornerstones:" passion, servanthood, unity, humility and thankfulness. Developed by her father, Bennett has implemented the cornerstones in their current form since her days at Evansville.

"(The cornerstones) are intangible qualities that we want to instill and stand for in our program," Bennett said. "Hopefully when our players leave, they are things they will carry with them."

Bennett was successful coaching even before the cornerstones were inked into her coaching handbook. Under her guidance, UW-Oshkosh won the 1996 NCAA Division III National Championship with a perfect 31-0 record after playing in the national title game the previous season. She was named Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year five times and was the Women's Basketball Coaches' Association Division III Coach of the Year in 1996.

At Evansville, Bennett took over a program that had an all-time record of 18-113, engineered a 13-game turnaround and led the Purple Aces to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1999. She was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year that season. In 1999-2000, she led Evansville to a school-record 23 wins and a WNIT berth.

The next year, Bennett took over an Indiana program that went 10-18 the year before. Immediately, the Hoosiers embarked on a seven-game winning streak, their longest in two years. Under Bennett's guidance, the Hoosiers doubled their win total to finish with a 20-11 record, and tied for sixth in the Big Ten standings, their best finish since 1997-98.

A season later, Bennett's 2002 Indiana team won the Big Ten Conference Tournament title as the No. 5 seed, defeating No. 1 seed Purdue and regular season champion Penn State. It was the first trip to the NCAA Tournament for Indiana since 1994-95. In five years in Bloomington, Bennett's Hoosier teams defeated six Top 25 opponents and claimed a pair of victories over Top 10 foes. For her part, Bennett is confident that Northern Illinois' women's basketball team can and will be successful.

"This is a place where we can contend for the MAC title, and become a player on the national scene," she said. "The university is diverse, it's strong academically and it is big enough - with 24,000 students - to offer a great atmosphere, but small enough to give its students personal attention. The location and the facilities are excellent. I'm excited to work with Dr. Peters, Jeff Compher and the rest of the staff to reach our goals."

## FRESE BIO

Renowned for her top-notch recruiting classes, NIU associate head women's basketball coach Marsha Frese enters her second season on head coach Kathi Bennett's staff. The former associate head coach at Illinois and 10-year coaching veteran brings far more to the table than her ability to draw in the nation's best talent.

"I'm very fortunate to have Marsha's feel for the game, her experience building programs, and her experience recruiting the Chicago area," Bennett said.

Frese's first recruiting class at NIU includes four all-state selections, three of which were McDonald's All-American candidates.

Thanks in part to Frese's wealth of basketball knowledge, the 2010-11 Huskies improved their win total by 30 percent, 75 percent in league games, from the year prior.

Coaching in the Mid-American Conference is familiar territory for Frese, who began here coaching career in the MAC. As an assistant coach at Ball State from 1999-2001, she helped deliver back-to-back winning seasons to the Cardinals for only the second time in school history. Tabbed with primary recruiting responsibility, she brought in 2001 MAC Freshman of the Year Johna Goff with in her first class at BSU.

A certified financial advisor, Frese provided an immediate return on investment in her next role as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Minnesota. The Golden Gophers posted an 8-20 record prior to her arrival. With Frese on staff, Minnesota turned around its basketball stock, winning 22 games. Frese also flipped the fortunes of Golden Gopher recruiting, signing the No. 15 class in the nation, as ranked by Blue Star.

When Frese's sister Brenda Frese, who had been with Marsha as the head coach at Ball State and Minnesota, was tabbed to lead the women's basketball program at Maryland, it was only natural for Marsha join her on the Terrapins staff. As recruiting coordinator, Marsha Frese brought two all-Americans to Maryland, resulting in the 10th-best recruiting class in the country, according to Blue Star.

Frese's growth portfolio at Ball State, Minnesota and Maryland yielded an assistant coaching position at Illinois. In her first two years in Champaign, she spearheaded two top-25 recruiting classes, Illinois upset three top-25 teams and the Illini fought their way to the WNIT. A promotion to associate head coach fueled Frese further. In 2005-06, Illinois won a WNIT game and upended No. 15 Oklahoma. The next year, she helped coach Illinois to the WNIT Round of 16 and a win over No. 16 Michigan State. She also coached two record-setting individuals: Lori Bjork and Jenna Smith, both Frese recruits. Bjork set a new single season three-point record with 84 makes and was named Second Team All-Big Ten. Smith set the Illinois freshman single-season rebounding record.

As a player, Frese excelled on both the high school and college levels. A former Miss Iowa Basketball, Frese helped Cedar Rapids Washington High School to the 1988 Iowa state title. During her prep career, she led the state in scoring twice (1989 and 1990) and was named 1990 Miss Iowa Basketball by both USA Today and Gatorade Circle of Champions. A two-time first team All-Stater, Frese finished her high school career as one of the Top 25 all-time leading scorers in Iowa history. She has since been inducted into the Washington High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

At Rice, Frese tore up the nets, lettering all four years and finishing her career ranked sixth in three-pointers made. She also left with the Rice school record for best three-point field goal percentage in a single season.

Before embarking on her coaching career, Frese spent four years as a television sportscaster. After graduating from Rice University, she was the first female sports anchor for KALB-TV in Alexandria, La., and also served brief stints as a color analyst for Rice University and Louisiana College radio broadcasts.

Frese is married to Jason Elliott. The couple's first child, Kylan Nicole, was born on July 29, 2005. On June 9, 2011, the family welcomed their second child, Camden J.

### CONROY BIO

A veteran of women's basketball, Joe Conroy enters his second season as a member of NIU head coach Kathi Bennett's staff. Known for his passion for the game and NIU, Conroy's expertise played a large role in the Huskies winning 30 percent more games, 75% in conference, in 2010-11 than the year prior.

"Joe is a Huskie through-and-through," Bennett said. "He has been in this area before and absolutely loves Northern Illinois University."

Conroy spent three seasons as the top assistant for head coach Sandy Botham and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. For the Panthers Conroy helped set the foundation for the team's second ever NCAA Tournament appearance. Milwaukee placed second in the Horizon League in each of Conroy's three seasons, achieving a 34-14 (.708) conference record during that period.

A 1990 DePaul University graduate, Conroy arrived in Milwaukee after serving as the top assistant and recruiting coordinator for head coach Linda Wunder at Eastern Illinois University. In Conroy's first year at EIU, the Panthers doubled their Ohio Valley Conference win total.

Prior to his stint in Charleston, Ill., Conroy, an active member of both the Women's Basketball Coaches Association and the National Association of Basketball Coaches, pioneered the Director of Basketball Operations position at Northern Illinois University under head coach Carol Hammerle.

Conroy spent a large portion of his coaching career at Illinois Valley Community College, a Division III junior college in Oglesby, Ill. The Spring Valley, Ill. native served as IVCC's head women's coach for eight seasons, manning the sidelines from 1993-1999. While at IVCC, Conroy led his squad to a third-place finish at the National Junior College Athletic Association national tournament in 1995-96. A recipient of the NFCAA Rose Bataglia Sportsmanship Award, Conroy successfully placed 100% of his junior college athletes at the university level.

Prior to accepting his current position at NIU, Conroy spent five years as a coach at Woodstock and Woodstock North High Schools. From 2005-08, he guided the WHS boys before venturing to WNHS, a new school at the time, to get its boys basketball program off the ground.

The 46-year-old Conroy is married to the former Cari Hoskins. The couple resides in Woodstock with their three sons, Ethan (14), Mason (12), and Porter (9).

## BAUGH BIO

After spending the 2004-05 season as an assistant coach for Northern Illinois, Baugh joins Kathi Bennett's staff after gaining valuable experience as head coach at the Division II Saginaw Valley State University from July of 2008 to February of 2011.

"I'm really excited about Shannon because she has a wealth of experience," Bennett said. "Her experience as a head coach will help a lot because she knows what it's like. To have someone who has gone through that is pretty special.

"She is a relationship-driven person. She has a great deal of energy and is very charismatic. The players have already bonded with her. She is very eager to learn and willing to do whatever it takes. That's what you are looking for. She's a great addition to the staff."

Not only does Baugh have a past at NIU, she is familiar with the Mid-American Conference as she served as an assistant coach for Buffalo for three seasons (2005-08) before moving to Saginaw Valley.

North Dakota finished the season ranked 12th in the WBCA Division II final poll.

In her initial coaching position, she helped lead UW-Green Bay to a 24-7 record and a berth in the 2002 NCAA Tournament after they won both the Horizon League regular season and tournament championship titles.

A 1994 graduate of Eastern Illinois, Baugh was a two-year letterwinner for the Panthers. Named a team captain during the 1993-94 season, she led EIU in scoring (15.1) and rebounding (6.9). Her 129 free throws made during the season still stands as a school record.

Before finishing her collegiate career at EIU, Baugh earned NJCAA All-Region honors at Lincoln (Ill.) College in 1990-91, averaging 12.2 points and 7.8 rebounds per game as a sophomore.

In between her playing and coaching careers, Baugh spent five years (1996-2000) as a sports reporter, producer and photographer at WFRV-TV, the CBS affiliate in Green Bay, Wis.

## SMITH BIO

As a four-year letterwinner for the Huskies (2001-04), Smith returns to NIU this year after coaching for the past eight years at the high school level. Most recently, she was the head women's varsity coach at Burlington Central in Burlington, Ill., where she tallied a 28-28 record.

"Stephanie is the most enthusiastic, energetic person," NIU head coach Kathi Bennett said. "She played here, so to have her come in as an alumnus is pretty special. All I know is that it beats in her heart to help this program win a championship. She wanted to win one as a player, and now having her on this staff, she's driven even more to win one.

"Her ability to relate to players is phenomenal. She is just kind of starting her young coaching career and I really have not seen any one hungrier to learn.
