THE LAST TIME OUT

After trailing for a majority of the game, the Northern Illinois women's basketball team surged late in the second half to claim a 67-55 victory over downstate rival Southern Illinois on Sunday afternoon at SIU Arena.

With the game knotted, 45-45, late in the second half, junior Kylie York hit the first of her three treys in the final six minutes of the game with 5:41 left, giving NIU its largest lead of the game at the time. Then after an SIU miss, York grabbed the rebound and later in the possession bulleted a pass down low to a wide open Becky Smith for a lay-up to give NIU a 50-45 advantage with five minutes remaining.

After a jumper from SIU's Katrina Swingler, senior Jessie Wilcox made a three to increase the Huskie lead once again, 53-47, with 4:25 left. Then, York finished off the Salukis with back-to-back threes, putting NIU up 59-51 with 2:09 to go.

The Huskies outscored the Salukis 43-30 in the second half, led by York, who scored 14 of her game-high 17 points in the final half. After going 3-11 in the first half from the arc, NIU went 5-8 in the second half en route to victory.

NIU trailed by one at half, 25-24, after a 9-1 run erased a 24-15 SIU lead in which Wilcox tallied five points during the run, including a three to tie the game, 24-24, with seven seconds left.

For the game, NIU scored 15 points off 20 SIU turnovers and received 32 points from the bench, while the Salukis only had 12.

Two other Huskies reached double-digits as Wilcox scored 13 points along with a season-best eight assists and Smith notched season-highs with 12 points and seven rebounds. Sophomore Mauvolyene Adams led NIU with 12 boards, while also scoring nine points.

THE SERIES

Northern Illinois is 8-3 all time against Chicago State, winning eight of the last nine meetings. Chicago State won the last game between the two, 64-57, Nov. 12, 2007. NIU is 6-1 against the Cougars at home..

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Chicago State snapped the Huskies' eight-game winning streak over the Cougars with a 64-57 victory over NIU at home Nov. 12, 2007. Three Cougars finished in double figures, while Kylie York led the way for the Huskies with 12 points, while Jessie Wilcox also finished in double digits, adding 10. The Huskies committed 26 turnovers, which Chicago State cashed in for 24 points.

THE TEAMS

Northern Illinois returns to the Convocation Center looking for its third-straight victory. The Huskies posted wins over Southern Illinois and UIC in their last two games, marking the first time this season NIU has record back-to-back wins. It's the final game of five straight versus opponents from the state of Illinois. NIU is 3-3 versus teams from the Land of Lincoln. The Cougars are 3-1 against in-stats competition.

THE COACHES

NIU head coach Carol Owens is in her fourth season as head coach of NIU's women's basketball team, and has posted a 46-54 record. Chicago State's Angela Jackson is in her sixth season at the helm of the Cougar's women's basketball program and has a 65-91 record during that span.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

Kylie York has erupted with five straight double digit performances, with her most recent coming against Southern Illinois. The junior from Fishers, Ind. scored a game-high 17 points, going 5-of-7 from the field, all from three-point territory. She's averaging 15 points a game over the last five contests. Jessie Wilcox posted her sixth double digit scoring performance with 13 points in the Huskies' victory over Southern Illinois.

FOR THE RECORD

- In 51 years of women's basketball at NIU, the Huskies have posted a 553-536 record for a winning percentage of .508.

HOME SWEET HOME

- The Huskies are 254-160 all-time at home and are 26-15 under Carol Owens in DeKalb. Northern Illinois has posted a 45-36 record since moving into the Convocation Center Nov. 22, 2002.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- The Huskies are 298-377 all-time on the road and are 20-38 under Carol Owens away from the Convocation Center.

HUSKIE HONORED

- NIU head coach Carol Owens was named USA Basketball's 2008 Developmental Coach of the Year after leading Team USA's U18 National Team to the gold medal at the 2008 FIBA Americas U18 Championship for Women in Buenos Aires, Argentina this past summer. Team USA posted a 5-0 mark in the tourney and defeated Argentina, 81-37, in the championship game. It is the third straight gold medal Owens has captured, but her first as head coach. She was an assistant coach on the USA Basketball's Under 19 Women's Basketball Team that captured the gold at the 2007 FIBA U19 World Championship in Bratislava, Slovakia, and also took home the gold at the FIBA Americas U18 Championship in Colorado Springs, Colo. in the summer of 2006 as an assistant on Team USA's Under 18 Women's Team.

STILL WORKING THE BOARDS

- NIU head coach Carol Owens has emerged as one of the leaders in her profession. Not only has she served as a coach on three national teams, but she currently sits on the board of directors on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association and the Black Coaches & Administrators.

HELLO MY NAME IS

- Carol Owens hired Heather Oesterle as the Huskies' newest assistant coach. Oesterle brings with her a wealth of experience of Mid-American Conference basketball. She comes to Northern Illinois after spending the past five seasons at MAC East foe Miami (OH). During her five years in Oxford, the RedHawks posted an 80-72 record, won two MAC Championships (2004 & 2008), and made two postseason appearances.

WELCOME TO THE PACK

- NIU welcomes four new members to the floor this year. Marke Freeman, who sat out last season per NCAA transfer regulations, begins her first full season with the Huskies this year. She is joined by three freshmen, Sarah Rogers, Courtney Shelton and Tenisha Wilson.

BRAGGING RIGHTS

- Saturday's game with Chicago State is the final game of five straight contests against teams from the state of Illinois for the Huskies. NIU is 3-3 this season against teams from the Land of Lincoln, defeating Southern Illinois, 67-55, (12/28/08), UIC, 85-79, (12/20/08) and Western Illinois, 70-48, (11/18/08) while falling to Illinois State 89-67 (12/15/08), Bradley, 77-62 (11/25/08) and DePaul (12/18/08). The Huskies are 11-13 versus in-state rivals under Owens.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST

- Northern Illinois turned in its best offensive output of the season with 85 points against UIC (12/20/08). The Huskies shot a season-best 46 percent from the field, making a season-high 29 shots. It's the most points the Huskies scored since January 15, 2008 when NIU tallied 87 points in a victory over Central Michigan.

DEFENSE, DEFENSE

- Northern Illinois held Northern Iowa to 22.0 percent shooting from the field (11-50) in its 58-46 win over the Panthers (12/3/08). The last time a NIU team held an opponent to under 23 percent shooting was Nov. 26, 2000, when the Huskies held UC-Irvine to 22.6 percent from the field (12-53) in a 58-43 victory.

- NIU also held the Panthers to 0-14 from beyond the three-point line. The last time the Huskies accomplished that feat was Dec. 29, 2007 when NIU held IUPUI to 0-5 from downtown.

DUBIOUS DISTINCTION

- Northern Illinois and UMBC set the NCAA record for fouls in a game with 64, surpassing the old mark of 56 set by Eastern Michigan and Kent State Feb. 26, 1986. Three Huskies and two Retrievers fouled out of the contest.

DIALING LONG DISTANCE

- The Huskies have two players that are in the top 10 in the NIU record for three-point field goals made in a career. Junior Kylie York is fourth on the list with 155 threes made in three seasons. She's 35 shy of No. 3 and 66 from No. 1. Senior Jessie Wilcox sits in seventh with 108 and is six away from passing Charbea Haller who is in sixth with 113.

WHERE THERE'S A WILCOX THERE'S A WAY

- Senior Jessie Wilcox is 209 points away from 1,000 for her career. Her career-high for points scored in a season is 304. She finished last year with 248, but missed four games due to injury and two others that were cancelled.

- Wilcox leads the MAC and is fifth in the nation in free throw shooting, connecting on 93.8 percent of her free throw shots.

- Wilcox scored a season- and game-high 16 points at Western Illinois (11/18/08). She has 38 career double-figure games with her career high of 24 coming at home against Miami (OH) (2/3/07). She turned in 11 double-digit scoring performances last season, including two 20-point efforts.

- Wilcox led the team in assists last season with 92 and dished out a career-high eight assists at Miami (OH) (1/26/08). She has 256 for her career and needs six more to crack the list of NIU assist leaders.

FEEL THE SENSATION

- Kylie York was named MAC West Player of the Week after posting her sixth double-digit scoring performance of the season against Southern Illinois (12/28/08) scoring a game-high 17 points. She scored a season-high 22 points against UIC (12/20/08). She turned in 15 double-digit scoring efforts last season and has 26 for her career, including four 20-point performances.

- York is fifth in the MAC in three-pointers made with 30 and is 51 shy of breaking the record set Denise Dove who hit 80 during the 1988-89 season.

- She's made a three pointer in 11 of the Huskies' 12 games this season, making at least one three in NIU's first six games and has made a trey in NIU's last five games. The NIU record for consecutive games with a three pointer is 12 set by Whiteny Lowe in 2006-07.

DOUBLE E

- Ebony Ellis grabbed a career-high 22 rebounds against Wagner (11/22/08) at the Seton Hall Classic, tying her for fourth on the Huskies all-time list for rebounds in a game set by Doreen Zierer Dec. 1, 1979 against Bowling Green.

- Ellis leads the Huskies and the MAC in rebounding and is 37th in the country with 109 boards, averaging 9.1 boards a game. She led the Huskies in rebounding last season with 164, averaging 5.9 boards a game. She also led the Huskies in rebounding in 11 games last year.

- Ellis was named to the Seton Hall Classic All-Tournament Team, averaging 12.5 points and 14 rebounds in the two games.

- Ebony Ellis posted her second double-double of the season in NIU's victory over Wagner, scoring 12 points and hauling in 22 boards. Her first double-double of the season came against IUPUI (11/14/08), where she finished with 15 points and 14 rebounds. She has four double-doubles for her career and has tied her season total from last year.

- Ellis has posted double-digit scoring performances in the Huskies first six games of the season. She scored 17 points in NIU's game with Milwaukee (11/29/08), tying her career-high set Jan. 15, 2008 against Central Michigan.

MS. SMITH

- Becky Smith reached a career milestone against Bradley (11/25/08) scoring her 300th career point. She is one of four Huskies to have scored at least 300 points.

- Smith is 69 points away from 400 for her career.

- She scored a season-high 13 points at Southern Illinois (12/28/08) and has six double figure games for her career.

- Smith is 10th in the league in blocked shots, with 10 and blocked a career-high three shots against Northern Iowa (12/20/07).

WELTON'S WORLD

- Shari' Welton scored her 400th career point against Milwaukee (11/29/08). She scored 105 points in two years at Wisconsin and 325 during her career at NIU. She's 69 points away from 500.

- Welton is second on the team in steals with 14 this season. She had 29 in 28 games, including two three-steal games last season.

- Welton posted her first career double-double and only one of the season in NIU's 60-59 victory over Western Illinois (11/15/07), scoring 10 points and grabbing a career-high 12 rebounds. She secured the feat on the final play of the game when she grabbed the winning rebound and scored the game-winning shot at the buzzer.

MAUVO-LOUS

- Sophomore Mauvolyene Adams scored a season-high 13 points in back-to-back games this season. She scored 13 in NIU's loss to Milwaukee (11/29/08) and in the Huskies' 58-46 victory over Northern Iowa (12/3/08). It's the first time in her career she has posted back-to-back double digit performances.

- Adams made her first career start Dec. 18, 2008 against DePaul. She reached a career milestone in that contest, scoring her 200th career point.

- Adams grabbed a career-high 13 boards at Western Illinois (11/18/08). She is third on the team in rebounds with 51.

COME ON AILEEN

- Senior Aileen Rossouw grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds against UMBC (11/21/08) at the Seton Hall Classic. She is third on the team in rebounds with 59 and has 204 for her career.

- Rossouw scored a season-high 11 points against Wisconsin (12/7/08), going 3-5 from the field and 4-6 from the free throw line.

MARKE PERFORMANCE

- Redshirt-sophomore Marke Freeman scored a career-high 19 points in the Huskies' 85-79 victory over UIC (12/20/08) and has 418 for her career. Freeman has five double-digit performances on the season.

- Freeman leads the team in scoring and is 30th in the MAC, averaging 9.8 points a game.

Carol Owens embarks on her fourth season at the helm of Northern Illinois University's women's basketball team. In that time, she has built NIU into a contender in the Mid-American Conference and has been recognized by her peers as one of the top coaches in the country.

In recognition of that fact, Owens has been selected to coach four national teams, spending two years as an assistant before being asked to lead two others, and two professional organizations have selected her to serve on their board of directors. While those accomplishments are impressive, they are not surprising. From her days as a player at Northern Illinois, through the years she has spent working her way up through the coaching ranks, Owens' passion for basketball and drive for success has led her to this point.

Since taking over, Northern posted its first winning season in five years, going 19-12 in 2006-07 and advanced to the semifinals of the 2007 MAC Women's Basketball Tournament. In 2006-07, the Huskies broke several school records, including three-pointers made (236) and attempted (639) and NIU set the single-season mark for free throw percentage, hitting 78.9 percent from the charity stripe.

The success Owens has achieved has not gone unnoticed, and earning the respect of those in your field is the highest compliment any coach can receive. In 2008, Owens was named to the Board of Directors of both the Black Coaches Association and Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Owens' national reputation has grown during her NIU tenure as she has twice been invited to serve as a coach with USA Basketball, beginning in April of 2006, when she was selected to serve as an assistant to DePaul's Doug Bruno on Team USA's FIBA Americas U18 Championship Team.

Owens spent the summer of 2006 in Colorado Springs, Colo. helping lead the red, white and blue to the gold medal. She was back on Team USA's bench in the summer of 2007, this time in Europe, coaching USA Basketball's Women's U19 World Championship Team. As they did the year before, Team USA cruised through the field and brought home the gold.

The powers that be in USA Basketball must have been impressed with what they saw from Owens because in March of 2008, they asked her to become head coach of the 2008 U18 World Championship Team. Owens led Team USA to gold, defeating Argentina, 81-37.

Owens has coached some outstanding players during her career, sending four to the WNBA. At Northern Illinois, her most famous pupil was Stephanie Raymond. The 20th overall pick in the 2007 Women's National Basketball Association Draft, Raymond is the first Huskie in school history drafted by the league. Her selection by the Chicago Sky topped off one of the best seasons by a Huskie in recent memory. Raymond closed out her career at NIU as the school's fifth-leading scorer, and set the school record for steals and assists in a game. She also set the school record for free throw percentage in a season (90.1 percent) and career free throw percentage (83.9 percent).

Raymond is just one of four players she's help send to the WNBA. During her tenure in South Bend, Owens' coaching focus centered on the development of Notre Dame's post players. Her most famous pupil, Ruth Riley (1997-2001), capped off her Irish days as the consensus National Player of the Year (2000-01) and earned All-America status. Riley, Katryna Gaither (1993-97) and Kelley Siemon (1997-2001) were all selected in the WNBA draft upon completion of their Notre Dame careers.

NIU Women's Basketball Falls to Bradley, 77-62

PEORIA, Ill. - The Northern Illinois women's basketball team dropped a 77-62 decision to Bradley on Tuesday evening at Lorene Ramsey Gymnasium as Michelle Lund's four second-half three pointers sparked the Braves (3-1) to victory.

Tough Shooting Night Sinks Huskies at DePaul

CHICAGO – Despite three players scoring in double figures, the Northern Illinois women's basketball team dropped an 83-70 decision to DePaul, Thursday at McGrath Arena.

Poor shooting plagued both teams in the early going, as they combined to hit just 14-of-40 attempts (35 percent) in the opening 10 minutes. The drought left the Huskies (3-7) down 20-19, just a point behind their Big East foe. But the Blue Demons (10-2) heated up, hitting seven of their next 10 shots to build a 39-23 lead with 5:34 left in the first half.

Becky Smith answered the call by hitting the Huskies' first three-pointer of the game, sparking a 10-4 Huskie run that brought NIU with 10, 43-33 at halftime.

The Huskie defense started the second half in top form, forcing five DePaul turnovers in the first four minutes of the period. But NIU's rough shooting night continued, as the Huskies went 2-of-7 from the field over the same timeframe.

Northern Illinois' top-two sharpshooters, Kylie York and Jessie Wilcox (Oshkosh, Wis./West), combined to go 4-for-17 from behind the arc, with all four makes coming in the second half. As a team, the Huskies shot 37.5 percent (27-for-72) from the field, and just 25 percent (5-for-20) on threes.

Despite the difficult night from the three-point line, Wilcox led the Huskies with 12 points, and York chipped in 10. Forward Becky Smith also hit double-figures, pouring in 11 on 4-of-7 shooting.

Huskies Post 85-79 Victory Over UIC at Home

DEKALB, Ill. – The Northern Illinois University women's basketball team scored their first home victory of the season, defeating the Flames of UIC, 85-79, at the Convocation Center Saturday afternoon in overtime.

Kylie York (Fishers, Ind./Hamilton Southeastern) led all scorers with a season-high 22 points, going 8-of-14 from the field, including 6-of-12 from beyond the arc. York was one of three Huskies to finish in double figures. Marke Freeman (Springfield, Ill./Lanphier) turned in a career-high 19 points, while Mauvolyene Adams (Bolingbrook, Ill./Bolingbrook) added 10.

With NIU (4-7) down 44-38 to open the second half, the Flames (5-2) came out firing, going on a 7-0 run in the first two minutes of the second period to open up a 51-38 lead, their largest of the game. But the Huskies responded, rattling off a 9-0 run to cut the deficit to four, 51-47, with 14:42 to play.

However, UIC was able to regain control and pushed its lead to nine, 62-53, with 8:50 left to play on a Meghan Hutchens three-pointer. The Huskies clawed back on the strength of their three-point shooting. York and Freeman went on a 9-2 run, with York hitting two threes and Freeman's trey with 5:39 left to play tied the game at 64-64. Neither team could pull away in the final five minutes of regulation forcing a third frame.

Adams came up big for the Huskies in the overtime, scoring eight of her 10 points in the overtime period. The Huskies went 6-10 from the charity strip and 3-6 from the field in the extra frame.

The Huskies had a decided edge in rebounding, grabbing 42 boards to UIC's 27. NIU was out-shot by the Flames, 51.6 percent to 46 percent from the field, but the Huskies went 8-15 from beyond the arc good for 53.3 percent, while the Flames shot 23.5 from three-point territory.
