• **Lobos Ranked No. 5 in Power Rankings ...** The Lobos have gotten hot at the right time. Besides, qualifying 11 skiers for the NCAAs, just one short of a full squad, they have been ranked No. 5 in the NCAA power rankings by Skiracing Magazine. C.J Freehan of Skiracing Magazine offered this take on the Lobos:

• The Lobos are the only team unable to qualify a full 12-skier roster to still make the Power Rankings. They'll be running 11 gunners in Montana, missing one male Nordic skier. But their rallying performance at RMISA Championships, including a miraculous surge by their alpine squads, means they have their head in the game for the post-season. They've been racing with only three alpine females all winter, so the team restriction at NCAAs shouldn't feel very restrictive at all. Alaska was the only other team in the nation to qualify a full roster, but they have drastically fallen off in performance since their early season success, so the Lobos steal the spot with their passion and verve.

• RMISA Championships/NCAA West Regional (Feb. 23-25) ...

The Lobos saved their best for when it mattered most, finishing third overall at the Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Championships in Bozeman, Mont. The third-place finish is the highest the Lobos have had on the season, and a lot of the credit should go to

the Alpine team for stepping it up at the right time. Chris Acosta blazed down the mountain in a time of 1:55.41 to claim gold in the men's slalom race. On the women's Alpine side, Stefanie Demetz had an exceptional race in the slalom, claiming a podium spot with a second-place finish. On the Nordic side, Linn Klaesson led the way with yet another top-10 finish, claiming fourth place in the 15K classic race. The men's Nordic team saw Sjur Prestseater lead the way with a sixth-place finish. Christian Otto followed with a respectable 12th-place finish.

The University of New Mexico ski team placed four athletes on the All-Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association teams. RMISA Men's Alpine MVP Armin Triendl was named to the men's alpine first team, while teammate Chris Acosta found himself on the second team. Linn Klaesson matched Triendl by earning first team women's Nordic honors, while Stefanie Demetz grabbed second-team alpine honors like Acosta.

• **Triendl Earns RMISA Alpine MVP ...** New Mexico's Armin Triendl and Utah's Tii-Maria Romar were named the RMISA Alpine MVPs, as was announced at the annual regional banquet Feb. 25. Calcu-

lated using the NCAA Qualification points earned all season, each skier can earn a maximum of 50 points per race. For the men, there were 10 races, five giant slalom and five slalom. Triendl, a junior hailing from Oberperfuss, Austria, earned 442 out of a possible 500 points. He won two races, the two alpine qualifiers, and hit the podium twice, both at the Denver Invitational. He finished all 10 races with eight top 10 finishes and five top-five finishes.

• **Alaska Anchorage Invitational (Feb. 4-11)** ... The Lobos finished sixth overall in the competition with a score of 686 points ... Poor racing conditions at the Alyeska Ski Resort hampered the Alpine events; men's and women's slalom races were run, but the conditions made things very challenging. So challenging, in fact, that the men's Giant Slalom was cancelled ... The Alpine team finished fourth (358) and Nordic finished sixth (328) ... Alpine skier **Kate Williams** was superb, claiming second in the slalom and tenth in the giant slalom, earning RMISA Skier of the Week honors in the process ... Male Alpine skier **Joonas Rasanen**, also claimed skier of the week honors, after his performance at the Seawolf Invitational ... Like Williams, Rasanen nabbed a podium spot after finishing third in the men's slalom race ... His third-place finish was particularly important because the slalom race counted for double points in order to account for no score being tallied in the men's giant slalom, which got cancelled due to poor racing conditions ... On the Nordic side of things, **Linn Klaesson** was fantastic for the Lobos ... The junior recorded two top-10 finishes after placing fifth in the classic and sixth in the freestyle races ... Klaesson has finished in the top-10 in every race she has participated in this season.

• **Seawolf Invitational (Feb. 9-11)** ... The Lobos finished the Seawolf Invitational in fourth place after wrapping up the Alpine races on Feb. 11 in Girdwood, Alaska ... New Mexico scored 695 total points, 361 (4th) in Alpine and 334 (6th) in Nordic ... After two long weeks in Alaska the Lobos finished competition with a solid performance from the Alpine team ... The Alpine skiers helped the Lobos move up from fifth place to fourth place on the final day, thanks in part to the men having, quite possibly, their best slalom performance of the season ... Joonas Rasanen had the best slalom finish, claiming third place for a spot on the podium ... **Chris Acosta**, who recorded his highest finish of the season, followed in sixth place, and **Armin Triendl** nabbed eighth to give the Lobos three top-10 finishers ... The slalom results counted for double points due to the giant slalom being cancelled thanks to poor conditions ... **Stefanie Demetz** was again the big story on the women's side, as the junior claimed two top-10 finishes: fourth in the slalom and 10th in the giant slalom ... The Nordic skiers also had better performances as **Christian Otto** recorded his best finishes of the season, 12th in the freestyle and seventh in the classical race ... **Clara Chauvet** also had her best finish of the season after placing fourth in the women's freestyle race ... Klaesson, once again, snagged two top-10 finishes, giving her eight in eight races this season ... The junior took fifth in the classic and sixth in the freestyle.

• **Denver Invitational (Jan. 14-21)** ... The Lobos finished the DU Invitational in fifth place after wrapping up the Nordic races on Jan. 21 in Tabernash, Colo. ... New Mexico scored 695 total points, 361 (4th) in Alpine and 334 (6th) in Nordic ... On the Alpine side, junior Armin Triendl had a fantastic meet after finishing third in the giant slalom and second in the slalom among collegiate skiers ... His performances earned him RMISA Skier of the Week recognition ... It is the second time in his career he has earned the honor ... **Juho Pekka Penttinen** also had a top-10 finish in the slalom, claiming sixth place ... On the women's Alpine side, Stefanie Demetz was fantastic after claiming third in the slalom and seventh in the giant slalom ... The women's Nordic ski team had an exceptional race, claiming second place in the 10K freestyle with a team score of 99 points ... The Lobos had three top-15 finishers, as Clara Chauvet placed fourth, Linn Klaesson finished 10th and **Anni Nord** claimed 12th place ... Klaesson and Nord also took 7th and 9th in the 5K classical, respectively ... On the men's side, **Sjur Prestseater** placed 14th in the men's 15K freestyle and 10th

in the 10K classical.

• **Colorado Invitational (Alpine/Jan. 7-8, Nordic/13-14)** ... The Lobos didn't have the type of meet they were hoping for after finishing in sixth place in the team standings ... New Mexico scored 706 total points, 379 (4th) in Alpine and 327 (6th) in Nordic ... Armin Triendl had the best finish of any Alpine skier after placing third in the men's giant slalom ... Linn Klaesson had the top finish for the Nordic squad, staking claim to third place in the women's 5K freestyle.

• **RMISA Qualifiers** ... The RMISA qualifiers for Alpine have been inserted into the schedule to match the number of races conducted by the Eastern schools ... **Giant Slalom (Jan. 6)** ... No team scoring for the qualifying races, but a few Lobos performed well ... Armin Triendl took second with a time of 1:54.80 and Juho Pekka Penttinen placed eighth, while **Mary Rachel Hostetter** placed 11th on the women's side ... **Slalom (Feb. 23)** ... The Lobos had a huge day at the Slalom qualifier. On the men's side Armin Triendl bested every skier wearing a bib, claiming his first gold of the season by crossing the finish line in a time of 1:52.88, nearly two seconds faster than any other skier. Triendl was followed by Joonas Rasanen (fifth), Chris Acosta (seventh) and Michael Bansmer (eighth). Sean Horner and Mark Miller also placed 20th and 21st, respectively ... For the women, Stefanie Demetz continued on with her great season, placing eighth. Her two other fellow women alpine skiers didn't fare as well, as Kate Williams crossed the finish line in 19th and Mary Rachel Hostetter claimed 25th.

• **Overall Team Notes** ... UNM will be traveling to Bozeman, Mont., for the NCAA Championships ... The Lobos are coming off a third-place finish at the RMISA Championships ... The third-place finish is the highest the Lobos have had on the season ... The Alpine teams really came together to give the Lobos a huge push ... The team spent nearly two weeks in Alaska competing in both the Alaska Anchorage and Seawolf Invitationals ... The Lobos came away from Alaska with much better results than they had in their previous events ... The men's Alpine team was fantastic and had their best performance of the season at the Seawolf Invitational, placing three skiers in the top-10: Rasanen (3rd), Acosta (6th) and Triendl (8th) ... Woman Alpine skier Stefanie Demetz also had a fourth-place finish in the women's slalom ... Linn Klaesson had the best performances of any Nordic skier as she had two fifth place finishes and two sixth place finishes between the two invitationals ... **Clara Chauvet** (freestyle 5K) and **Christian Otto** (Classical 20K) had their best finishes of the season at the Seawolf Invitational ... UNM had a fifth place finish at the Denver Invitational, where they recorded 10 top-10 finishes spread out over the Nordic and Alpine events ... The Lobos' performance at the DU Invitational showed this team continues to improve as the season progresses ... UNM had a sixth-place finish in its first meet of the season, the CU Invitational ... It wasn't the ideal meet for the Lobos but there were some bright spots as Armin Triendl had the best finish of any Alpine skier, placing third in the men's giant slalom, and Linn Klaesson had the top finish for the Nordic squad, staking claim to third place in the women's 5K freestyle ... Triendl earned RMISA Skier of the Week honors for his performance at the DU Invitational Jan. 14-15 ... Last season the Lobos finished third at the RMISA championships and placed fourth at the 2011 NCAA National Championships in Vermont ... While Utah was the overall regular season champion, New Mexico won the overall RMISA Alpine title, and the men's RMISA Alpine title.

• **Men's Alpine Notes** ... Armin Triendl has had quite an impressive 2012 season ... He is certainly the spark plug for the Lobos this year ... He finished the regular season with eight top-10 finishes out of the 11 races held this year ... Chris Acosta started slow this season, but has really come on strong, claiming his first gold of the season in the slalom at the RMISA Championships ... He also finished in sixth place in the slalom at the Alaska Anchorage Invite and 10th in the giant slalom

at the Seawolf Invite ... Both Triendl and Acosta earned All-America honors last season at the NCAA championships ... Newcomer Joonas Rasanen looked superb during pre-season training and finally came through in a big way when he snagged a third-place podium spot in the slalom race at the Seawolf Invite ... Triendl and Penttinen were named All-RMISA last season ... Acosta was also an All-American in 2010.

• **Women's Alpine Notes** ... The Lobos have been running only three women down the mountains thus far in the 2012 season: Senior Stefanie Demetz, junior Kate Williams and junior newcomer Mary Rachel Hostetter ... Demetz recorded nine top-10 finishes in 11 regular season races this year ... Williams began slowly, but has come on strong recently, taking eighth in the giant slalom at the NCAA Regional and recording a second-place finish in the slalom and 10th-place finish in the giant slalom at the Alaska Anchorage Invite, earning herself RMISA Skier of the Week honors ... Hostetter has done well this season, and most recently nabbed a pair of 12th-place finishes in the slalom and giant slalom races at the NCAA Regional ... The newcomer recorded three top-10 finishes this season ... Demetz and Williams return from last season to form a strong core for the Lobos ... Demetz garnered All-America honors last season in the giant slalom, while Williams was an All-American in the slalom in 2010 ... Last year, Anne Cecilie Brusletto recorded All-America finishes in both the Slalom and Giant Slalom for the second-straight season ... Brusletto is also currently No. 3 all-time in career alpine wins at UNM with six ... Brusletto has not seen any time on the mountain this season, however, due to injury.

• **Tyler Shepherd** enters his second full season as the head coach of the Lobos' Alpine team ... He also welcomes a familiar face in former Lobo Gary Beresford, who will serve as the assistant Alpine coach ... This is Beresford's first season as an assistant coach.

• **Men's Nordic Notes** ... The Nordic men had a tough regular season, but saw two of its skiers step up when it mattered most ... Christian Otto and newcomer Sjur Prestseater have both really begun to shine ... Prestseater and Otto both had great classical races at the NCAA Regional, placing seventh and 12th, respectively ... Otto recording his best finishes of the season at the Seawolf Invitational; a seventh-place 20K Classic finish and 12th-place 10K Freestyle finish ... Sjur Prestseater had the best meet of any male Nordic skier at the DU Invitational, placing 14th in the men's 15K freestyle and 10th in the 10K classical ... Now two event into the season, the Nordic men's team is still trying to find its rhythm ... Prestseater and Otto are the only skiers that have recorded top-10 finishes on the season, but head coach Fredrik Landstedt remains confident the men will pick up their pace ... The Nordic men had a tough showing at the CU Invitational Jan. 13-14 ... Freshman Sjur Prestseater had a nice classical race, finishing in eighth place and Christian Otto had a nice freestyle race, claiming 10th ... Coming into the season, the Nordic team lost a pair of excellent skiers in Martin Kaas and Tor-Hakon Hellebostad, but it still returns a wealth of experience, led by Pierre Niess and Christian Otto ... Eivind Solberg also returns and newcomer Sjur Prestseater looks to contribute as a freshman ... Kaas leaves the program after recording more Nordic wins (six) and garnering more All-America honors (five) than any other skier in Lobo history ... Hellebostad leaves UNM after recording four Nordic All-America honors in his career, which is tied for the second most in program history ... Three other Lobos have also garnered All-America honors four times in their careers ... Otto just missed out on All-America honors last season, finishing 12th in the classical race at the NCAA championships.

• **Women's Nordic Notes** ... Linn Klaesson has been the model of consistency for the Lobo women's Nordic team ... The junior now has recorded a top-10 finish in every race so far this season, capturing four more in her most recent races in Alaska ... Clara Chauvet seems to be taking notes, as the freshman recorded her highest finish of the season at the Seawolf Invitational, a fourth-place finish in the 5K freestyle ... The women's Nordic ski team

had an exceptional race in the 10K freestyle at the DU Invitational, claiming second place with a team score of 99 points ... The women had three top-15 finishers, as Clara Chauvet placed fourth, Linn Klaesson finished 10th and Anni Nord claimed 12th place ... Klaesson and Nord also took 7th and 9th in the 5K classical, respectively ... Klaesson performed very well at the CU Invitational Jan. 13-14, while the rest of the team seemed to experience first meet jitters ... Klaesson finished 10th in the classical and third in the freestyle races ... Chauvet had a decent performance as well in her first collegiate meet, finishing 10th in the freestyle race at the CU Invitational ... The women entered the 2012 season returning a very experienced skier in Klaesson, but they also lost All-America performers Sofie Jonsson and Martine Weng as well as All-RMISA performer Christina Loevald Hellberg ... The team is relatively young this year ... Klaesson is joined by newcomers Anniken Bratlie, Clara Chauvet, Anita Kirvesniemi and Anni Nord to make up the women's Nordic squad. Only Klaesson has NCAA experience ... Klaesson would have been joined by senior Ingrid Leask, who has had a very solid career at UNM so far, but Leask will be redshirting this season ... Kirvesniemi skied for the University of Eastern Finland last season.

• **Fredrik Landstedt** enters his fifth season as head coach of the Lobos and his 17th overall including his time as a former athlete and assistant coach ... During his five seasons as head coach Landstedt has seen his team finish 4th, 3rd, 3rd, and 7th over the previous four years during his tenure ... Landstedt is fielding a fairly young team this season and is excited to see where his Lobos stand in the competitive Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association ... Landstedt also welcomes a familiar face in Martin Kaas back to the team ... Kaas, like Beresford, will serve as assistant coach but for the Nordic team ... This is Kaas' first year as an assistant.

• **2011 Lobos Honored By RMISA** ... Eight Lobos were named to the All-Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association Team – Men's Alpine: Petter Brenna (1st team), Armin Triendl (2nd team), Juho Pekka-Penttinen (2nd team); Women's Alpine: Anne Cecilie Brusletto (1st team); Men's Nordic: Martin Kaas (1st team), Tor-Hakon Hellebostad (2nd team); Women's Nordic: Christina Loevald Hellberg (2nd team), Martine Weng (2nd team).

• Two Lobos earned MVP honors at the RMISA awards banquet. Martin Kaas earned regular season MVP honors in Nordic. Kaas finished in the top 10 in each regular season race, winning the classic at the Lobo Invitational in Taos. Kaas added three other podium appearances, in classic races at Montana State and Utah and the freestyle race at the Lobo Invitational. Kaas won by 13 points over Colorado's Jesper Ostensen.

Also earning MVP honors was Anne Cecilie Brusletto, who won the women's Alpine MVP honor as she had nine top-5 finishes in 12 races, and two of her other three finishes were in the top 11. She won two races, both slalom races at the Lobo Invitational and also
