LOBO BASEBALL SEASON RECAP



LOBOS' STRONG START LEADS TO FIRST WINNING SEASON SINCE 2003

2006 NEW MEXICO BASEBALL RECAP: The 2006 baseball season could have turned out better for the Lobos but New Mexico fans had to be happy with the team's performance, which was visibly greater than the previous two years.

Ending a 23-game losing streak to the University of Arizona just two weeks into the season gave the Lobos a huge lift in momentum, sending them on a season-high eight-game win streak. Then the Lobos pounded 12th-ranked Oregon State, winning 13-2 as junior lefty Danny Ray Herrera struck out a career-high nine batters, including five in the first two innings.

UNM stumbled slightly over the next two weeks, losing its first home series of the season to San Francisco. Then at the Mountain West Conference Preseason Tournament in San Diego, Calif., the team dropped three straight after getting a huge 3-2 win over host San Diego State in extra innings.

Taking a break from collegiate action, the Lobos played the Albuquerque Isotopes in an exhibition game on April 4. The Lobos scored first but the Isotopes scored more thanks to a five-run third innings that lifted them to a 6-2 win. Junior center fielder Matt Foote and junior designated hitter Chris Carlson made a lasting impression, going 3-for-3 with two runs scored and 2-for-3 with a RBI, respectively.

The great outing against the Isotopes revived the Lobos spirits heading back into MWC action. The Lobos won the next eight of nine conference games, sweeping Air Force and Utah. With just a month left in the season, UNM was sitting at 27-13 overall and second place in the MWC race.

But things took a drastic turn for the worse after that as the Lobos went on a two seven-game losing streaks, winning just one of their final 16 games to end the season. Their position in the MWC dropped, leaving them 28-27 overall and 10-12 in the MWC, giving them a fifth seed heading to the tournament in Las Vegas.

The Lobos kicked off the MWC Tournament with a convincing upset of fourth-seeded host UNLV, downing the Rebels 17-2. Eventual tournament champion TCU defeated the Lobos, sending them into the loser's bracket where they held on for a win over Utah. The way the bracket was set up turned out unfair for New Mexico, pitting a rematch between the Lobos and Rebels of UNLV. The unfair part was that the game was the fourth of the tournament and second of the day for UNM while it was just the third game of the tourney for UNLV. The Lobos put forth every effort to win but fell just shy, ending their season with a 30-29 record, giving them their first winning season since 2003.

Early-season success is not the only thing the team and fans can look back on with fond memories. Herrera was the quintessential underdog who beat the odds, posting a perfect 10-0 record with a 2.24 ERA while standing just 5 feet and 7 inches off the ground and weighing in at roughly 145 pounds. Even more astonishing was that he accomplished all of this predominantly in Albuquerque with an elevation over 5,000 feet. Herrera was rewarded for his season performance with a spot on the Louisville Slugger All-America second-team, the all-MWC first team and the MWC all-tournament team. He was named MWC Co-Pitcher of the Year and was one of 10 finalists for CSTV's National Player of the Year honor.

Carlson also gave Albuquerque something to talk about. He earned a spot on the Louisville Slugger All-America first team, ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America first team, all-MWC first team and the MWC all-tournament team. He pounded out 21 home runs with 79 RBI for the season, hitting .366. Carlson ranked sixth in the nation in RBI per game, 10th in home runs per game and 17th in slugging percentage.

Next season could be even better for the Lobos, who only lose five seniors (shortstop Ryan Barba, outfielder Brandon Bingham and pitchers Darren Coltrinari, Nate Melek and Jesse Perez). It is likely that they will also lose Carlson, who was drafted by the Detroit Tigers in the 29th round but should return eight of nine starters and 12 pitchers, including Herrera. The coaching staff has also signed 17 talented athletes for next year, including three who were also picked in the draft.

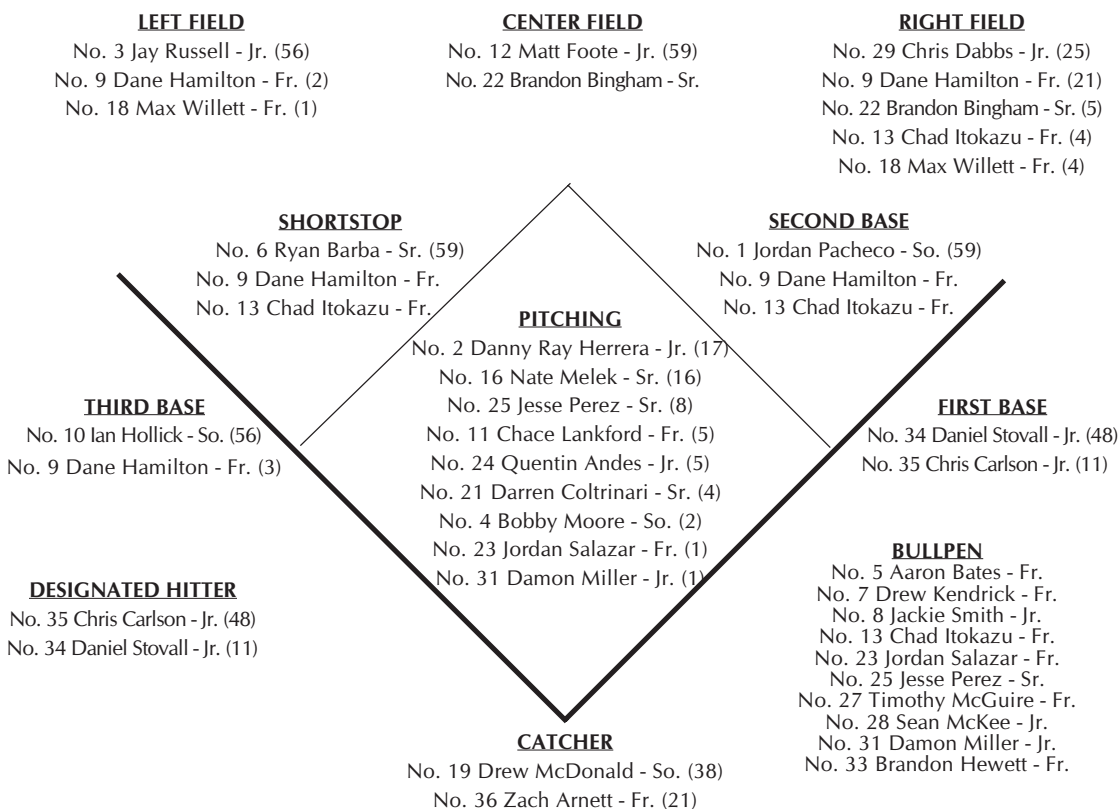

IN THE NATION: Once again, the Lobos are one of the best teams in the nation statistically. Through June 14, New Mexico leads the nation in double plays, turning 75 total for a 1.27 per game average. The Lobos are seventh in runs per game, averaging 8.6. UNM is also ranked in slugging percentage (.499, 10th), batting average (.324, 15th), home runs per game (1.18, 18th) and doubles per game (2.2, 22nd).

Individually, the Lobos are thriving as well. Junior first baseman/designated hitter Chris Carlson is ranked in the most categories for New Mexico. Carlson is sixth in RBI (1.34 pg), 10th in home runs (0.36 pg) and 17th in slugging percentage (.711). Junior first baseman/designated hitter Daniel Stovall makes the list in two spots, 12th in RBI (1.27 pg) and 13th in doubles (0.42 pg). Sophomore second baseman Jordan Pacheco also appears, ranking third in the nation in runs per game (1.34).

Head coach Rich Alday has continuously placed his team in the top-10 nationally in at least one category. This is the first year since 2003 that the Lobos have led the nation in a statistic, taking the crown for doubles that season. This season unfortunately ended the Lobos' four-year streak of ranking in the top-11 in batting average.

THE BEST IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST: As a team, the Lobos ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference in 12 different categories. They had the best batting average (.324), slugging percentage (.499) and on base percentage (.406) and the most runs scored (507), hits (696), RBI (471), doubles (130), total bases (1,071), times hit by a pitch (71), times grounded into a double play (50), most assists (732) and most double plays turned (75).

Individually, the Lobos claim the top spot in 14 statistical categories. Junior first baseman/designated hitter Daniel Stovall leads the most with five, holding the top spot in doubles (25), at bats (266), double plays ground into (9), putouts (483) and double plays turned (57). Junior designated hitter/first baseman Chris Carlson holds four No. 1s while junior lefty Danny Ray Herrera holds three. Carlson leads the MWC in RBI (79), home runs (21), total bases (167) and sac flies (10) while Herrera leads in ERA (2.24), innings pitched (128.1) and games started (17). Sophomore second baseman Jordan Pacheco led the MWC in runs (79)

2005 SEASON NOTES

- The Lobos ranked among the top 10 nationally in five offensive categories in 2005. UNM was second in slugging and triples, fifth in scoring and homers, and ninth in batting. The past four years, New Mexico has been ranked at least in the top 11 in the country in batting.
- Chris Carlson became the third Lobo in program history to earn All-America and Academic All-America honors in the same season (Travis Young, 1996; Dusty Young, 2003). Carlson was named a first-team All-American by Collegiate Baseball as a DH and a CoSIDA second-team Academic All-American for his 3.80 GPA in General Management.
- Jordan Pacheco is the first freshman to earn All-America accolades in UNM baseball history. He was a third-team selection by Collegiate Baseball and also earned Freshman All-America honors.
- The Lobos averaged over 900 fans a game for the second straight season in Isotopes Park. UNM drew 26,902 fans for 29 home games in 2005.
- The Lobos claimed their 1400th win in program history with their 11-6 win March 4 vs. Northern Colorado. UNM is 1420-1306-14 (.521) all-time in its history.
- Coach Alday, already the winningest coach in New Mexico history, claimed his 950th career victory May 13 vs. San Diego State. He won his 450th game at New Mexico on April 17 in the second game of a doubleheader against Air Force. Alday is 953-674-3 all-time, and 457-454-3 at UNM.

and senior shortstop Ryan Barba topped the MWC in assists with 202.

UNM also led the MWC in single-game team highs, cranking out nine doubles vs. Northern Colorado on March 5 and turning four double plays vs. New Mexico State on Feb. 21. Individually, junior center fielder Matt Foote stole a game-high four bases vs. NMSU on Feb. 21 and Pacheco was hit three times in a single game on Feb. 28 vs. the Aggies.

A SEASON OF RECORDS: As a team, the 2006 Lobos produced some of the best numbers in the program's history. Their .969 fielding percentage is the best season percentage ever, topping 2004's .967. Their 71 batters hit by a pitch and their 524.2 innings pitched are the second most ever with the record held by the 2003 team. The team racked up 2,147 at bats, 471 RBI and 399 strikeouts, the fourth most of an season. Their 696 hits was the fifth most recorded.

Several team performances made the single-game record list too. UNM cranked out nine doubles on March 5 vs. Northern Colorado, the second most in a single game ever. They blasted six home runs in one game on April 13 vs. Air Force, tying the third most and hit five vs. Air Force on April 14 and at Texas Tech on April 11. The team's 25 RBI vs. Air Force on the 14th is sixth most and their 25 hits and 26 runs on the 14th vs. AFA ties for the eighth most in a single game. The team played a 12-inning game vs. BYU on March 31, 2006, marking the sixth longest game ever. Overall, they played nine extra-inning games, the most of a season.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH: Junior Danny Ray Herrera is one of 10 finalists in the CSTV Player of the Year race. Currently Herrera, who is one of seven pitchers on the list, is in seventh place with 19 votes thanks to one first place vote. Keep track of the race on the Lobos' official website: www.GoLobos.com.

GOING OUT SWINGING: Seven Lobos ended the season with multi-game hit streaks in tact. Sophomore Ian Hollick had the longest at nine games while junior Chris Carlson was right behind with an eight-game streak. Senior Ryan Barba ended his career with a six-game hit streak, a season high. Junior Matt Foote hit in five consecutive games to end the season while Jordan Pacheco hit in three straight. Junior Jay Russell and freshman Zach Arnett hit in both games on May 25 for a two-game streak.

TWO (OR MORE) FOR THE SHOW: Of the 19 Lobos who had at least one at bat this season, 13 had at least two multiple-hit games and 13 also produced multiple-RBI games. Overall, the team had 131 two-hit, 48 three-hit, 16 four-hit and two five-hit games for a total of 197 multi-hit games. The Lobos had 58 two-RBI, 31 three-RBI, 16 four-RBI and 10 five-RBI games for a total of 115.

HEAD COACH RICH ALDAY

New Mexico head coach **Rich Alday**, the winningest coach in UNM history, is in his 17th year at the helm of the New Mexico program. Alday, who won his 900th career game in 2003, has collected a 457-454-3 record at New Mexico. In 33 years as a head coach overall, he has 953-674-3 lifetime record.

Alday has been conference coach of the year three times (2000 - Mountain West; 1995 - WAC; 1992 - WAC) and was an assistant coach on the 1988 and 1996 USA Olympic teams. He has coached eight All-Americans and four conference players of the year in his tenure.

Sophomore Jordan Pacheco and junior Chris Carlson produced a team-high 26 multi-hit games. Pacheco's comprised of 16 two-hit games, six three-hit games and four four-hit games while Carlson pounded out 17 two-hit games, seven three-hit games, one four-hit game and one of the team's two five-hit games. Junior Daniel Stovall, who had 23 multi-hit games, was the other Lobo to have five hits in a single game.

Carlson also led the team in multi-RBI games with 21. He produced a team-high nine two-RBI games and three five-RBI games. Stovall, who had 20 multi-RBI games, led the team in four-RBI games with five. Sophomore Ian Hollick, recording 14 multi-RBI games, had a team-high seven three-RBI games.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: With senior Ryan Barba at shortstop, sophomore Jordan Pacheco at second base and junior Daniel Stovall at first, New Mexico opponents have run into trouble against arguably the best infield in the MWC and quite possibly the nation. The Lobos' 75 double plays fielded are more than any other MWC school's production with UNLV's 60 the next closest. Not to mention Stovall leads the conference in most double plays turned with 57. Pacheco and Barba are right on his heels, with 55 and 52, respectively.

KEYS TO SUCCESS: In order for New Mexico to win, they need to score early and score often, at least according to the statistics. The Lobos are 0-7 when scoring less than three runs and they are 0-23 when trailing after seven or eight innings. On the flip side, they are 15-3 when scoring 10 or more runs and 27-4 when leading after seven innings and 25-1 when leading after eight innings.

The Lobos are 12-19 when an opponent scores first and 8-14 when their opponent scores in the first inning. But, they are 12-10 when they score in the first and 18-10 when they score first. The Lobos are also 22-2 when they out-hit their opponents but 6-25 when they are out-hit.

STEADY STARTERS: The Lobos relied heavily on their starting rotation for innings and wins. The starters, 22-15 with a 5.83 ERA, threw 343.0 innings with 227 strikeouts. The bullpen, 8-14 with a 9.02 ERA, tossed 181.2 innings with 96 strikeouts.

BULLPEN BY COMMITTEE: Head coach Rich Alday used 13 different Lobos in relief this season. Junior Damon Miller made the most appearances (22), getting two wins with a team-high 18 strikeouts in 32.1 innings. Miller had three losses with a 8.35 ERA. Freshman Chad Itokazu, who had 16 strikeouts from the bullpen in 25.2 innings, was 3-5 with a 8.42 ERA in 20 appearances. Freshman Chace Lankford posted the lowest ERA from the bullpen, going 2-1 with a 3.77 ERA in nine appearances. Freshman Jordan Salazar produced the second best ERA in the pen at 4.76 in 17 innings (10 appearances) with 12 strikeouts.

Lankford, Miller, Itokazu and junior Quentin Andes all have wins out of the bullpen while Miller (3), Lankford (2) and Salazar (1) all have at least one save.

REWRITING THE RECORDBOOKS: In just his third season at UNM, junior Danny Ray Herrera started etching his name throughout the program's season and career recordbooks. In the season books, he tied the best win percentage (1.000) in a single season, going 10-0. His 128.1 innings pitched was the second most ever in a single season and tied for the second most starts and wins in a single season. In the career book, Herrera moved up to third in starts (44) and needs just four next season to break the record, fourth in wins (22) and needs just six to break the record, fourth in innings (294.0) and needs just 17^{2/3} to break the record and fifth in strikeouts (222) and needs 135 to set that record.

Junior Chris Carlson left his name in the recordbooks before leaving the program for a professional career. He set a new career record for slugging percentage (.736) and placed fifth in the career book for batting average (.380) and home runs (36). In the season book, his 21 home runs from the 2006 season places him third.

Also in the career book, junior Daniel Stovall moved into a three-way tie for fifth in doubles (60) and needs just 10 next season to set a new record.

Also in the season book, Stovall's 266 at bats ranked the third most in the program's history. Sophomore Jordan Pacheco's 79 runs scored placed fourth while junior Matt Foote's 18 hit by pitches was the second most ever in a single season.

DRAFT DAY: Three Lobos were selected on the second and final day of the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Junior Chris Carlson (Topeka, Kan./Kansas State) was the first Lobo selected, drafted in the 29th round (No. 862 overall) by the Detroit Tigers. Senior Nate Melek (Minnetonka, Minn./Oklahoma State) was selected in the 43th round (No. 1,289 overall) by the Toronto Blue Jays and junior Danny Ray Herrera (Odessa, Texas/Permian HS) was taken by the Texas Rangers in the 45th round (No. 1,345 overall). As of June 15, Carlson and Melek had signed with the clubs, ending their collegiate careers.

The Lobos have had at least one player selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft 13 of the last 14 straight years. The trio are the 32nd, 33rd and 34th athletes

ANOTHER ALL-AMERICAN FOR ALDAY: Junior designated hitter Chris Carlson and left-handed junior Danny Ray Herrera were named to the Louisville Slugger NCAA Division I All-American baseball first and second teams, respectively, announced by "Collegiate Baseball" newspaper. The 17-man first team, chosen by performances up to regional playoffs and picked by the staff of "Collegiate Baseball" newspaper.

This is the sixth time in school history the New Mexico baseball program has produced two All-Americans in the same season and the first time in back-to-back seasons. The Lobos also had two All-Americans in 1980 (Duffy Ryan, Keith Hagman), 1985 (Jim Fregosi, Dean Duane), 1993 (Luke Ogelsby, Mark Gulseth), 2003 (Chris Alexander, Dusty Young) and 2005 (Carlson and Jordan Pacheco). Carlson and Herrera are the 11th and 12th All-Americans in UNM head coach Rich Alday's tenure.

CARLSON NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN: Junior designated hitter Chris Carlson was honored of the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America first team announced this morning by the College Sports Information Directors Association (CoSIDA). This is his second nomination to the All-America team, placing on the second team last season.

The Topeka, Kan. native maintained a 3.69 GPA in General Management while performing exceptionally on the field. He finished the 2006 season with a .366 batting average, 63 runs scored, 79 RBI and 21 home runs. Carlson ranks nationally in home runs (15th) and RBI (24th). He started all 59 games for UNM, seeing limited time at first base. He was also named to the All-MWC first team and the MWC All-Tournament team

LOBOS LAST TIME OUT: The Lobos looked like a rejuvenated team at the MWC Championships, hitting .397 with 41 runs on 62 hits in just four games. They had a chance to win every game but the pitching just couldn't hold out, producing a 9.53 ERA with 18 strikeouts and nine walks in 34 innings.

The Lobos snapped a eight-game losing streak to the Rebels and a seven-game losing streak overall, pounding on UNLV for a 17-2 win. New Mexico rallied from a 1-0 deficit to take the lead in the second, scoring four unearned runs on four UNLV errors and never looked back. Junior Chris Carlson went 5-for-6 with four runs scored and seven RBI. He set career highs in hits and RBI and tied his career high in runs scored and home runs in a single game. Junior Matt Foote went 4-for-6 with three RBI and two runs scored, tying his career high for hits in a game. Junior Danny Ray Herrera improved to 10-0 with the win, going 7 innings for five hits, one run, one walk and seven strikeouts. Freshman Jordan Salazar threw 2 innings of relief, allowing three hits and one run with three strikeouts in 2 innings.

Top-seeded TCU sent fifth-seeded New Mexico to the loser's bracket with a 18-6 win in game seven the following day. The loss, the Lobos seventh straight to TCU, came after UNM took a 5-4 lead to the bottom of the fourth. But the MWC champions fired back, putting six runs on the board in the bottom of the fourth en route to the win.

The Lobos stayed alive Thursday afternoon with a 12-10 win over Utah in the loser's bracket. UNM held a 12-7 lead heading into the ninth but the Utes refused to go quietly. Junior Daniel Stovall led the Lobos, going 4-for-6 with a RBI and a run scored. Sophomore Jordan Pacheco, senior Ryan Barba, Carlson and junior Chris Dabbs all collected three hits with Barba and Carlson scoring a team-high three runs. Carlson and Foote drove in a team-high two runs.

In an unbalanced bracket, the Lobos played their fourth game of the tournament and second of the day on Thursday evening. Up against UNLV, which was only on its third game of the tourney, the Lobos gave it their all but were just to drained, falling 8-6. The Lobos held a 6-5 lead heading through 5^{1/2} innings. But UNLV's Zach Borba tied the game with his first home run of the season in the bottom of the sixth. One inning later, Barba broke to cover second, expecting a throw from freshman pitcher Brandon Hewett but he went to the plate, giving Chris

Bonnell enough room to sneak a single back through the left side for the go-ahead run.

MWC ALL-TOURNEY HONORS: Juniors Chris Carlson and Danny Ray Herrera were named to the Mountain West Conference All-Tournament team for their performance at the MWC Championship last week in Las Vegas.

Carlson, a designated hitter, hit a team-high .667 (12-for-18) with eight runs scored and 11 RBI. He also had two home runs and three doubles. Carlson tied the MWC Championship record for most RBI in a single game with seven in the Lobos first game vs. UNLV, going 5-for-6 with seven RBI and four runs scored.

Herrera, one of three pitchers, two of which were left-handed, produced a team-low 1.29 ERA, allowing just one run, five hits and a walk with seven strikeouts in 7 innings vs. UNLV on May 23. Herrera was relieved after seven with the Lobos ahead 9-1.

HITTING FOR THE CYCLE: Sophomore third baseman Ian Hollick hit for the cycle in game two of the doubleheader vs. Air Force. Hollick is just the eighth Lobo to hit for the cycle in the program's history. Of the eight, four have come at the Falcon's expense.

STREAK STRETCHING FOR STOVALL: Junior Daniel Stovall began a personal-best 15-game hit streak Friday, April 7 at San Diego State. The streak came to an end in game two of a doubleheader at BYU on Friday, May 5.

CARLSON NABS NATIONAL AND MWC WEEKLY HONORS: Collegiate Baseball Newspaper announced Monday morning that junior designated hitter/first baseman Chris Carlson was one of its five Louisville Slugger National Players of the Week. This is Carlson's first weekly honor of the season and first weekly national honor of his career.

Later in the day, Carlson was named Mountain West Conference Player and of the Week for the second time in his career.

Carlson, from Topeka, Kan., hit .611 (11-for-18) from the plate with six home runs, three doubles, 14 RBI and 10 runs scored as the Lobos went 3-1 last week, including a three-game sweep of Air Force. He hit at least one home run, and tallied multiple hits, RBI and runs scored, in all four games played last week. Carlson opened the week going 2-for-3, with two home runs two RBI and two runs scored in a 14-7 loss to Texas Tech. In game one vs. Air Force, Carlson went 3-for-4 with a grand slam, a double, five RBI and three runs scored in UNM's 23-11 win. In game two vs. the Falcons, he went 3-for-5 with two more homers, a double, three RBI and three runs scored, and finished the series going 3-for-6 with a home run, a double, four RBI and two runs scored.

CARLSON, HOLLICK GARNER NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS: Junior designated hitter Chris Carlson and sophomore third baseman Ian Hollick were named College Baseball Foundation National Honor Roll 'Players of the Week' for the week of April 18. This is the second national honor for Carlson this week, while Hollick garners his first national recognition of the season.

Carlson, from Topeka, Kan., hit .611 (11-for-18), with six home runs, three doubles, 14 RBI and 10 runs scored, as the Lobos went 3-1 last week, including a three-game sweep of Air Force. He hit at least one home run, and tallied multiple hits, RBI and runs scored, in all four games played last week. Carlson opened the week going 2-for-3, with two home runs two RBI and two runs scored in a 14-7 loss to Texas Tech. In game one vs. Air Force, Carlson went 3-for-4 with a grand slam, a double, five RBI and three runs scored in UNM's, 23-11, win. Hollick, a Corona, Calif., native, hit for the cycle in the nightcap of last Thursday's doubleheader with Air Force, leading the Lobos to a 24-3 win. He is just the eighth Lobo to hit for the cycle in New Mexico's history. For the game, Hollick went 4-for-4 and drove in a team-high five runs. He hit a two-run home run to left, putting New Mexico on top 4-1 in the first inning, singled in the third, then tripled after the Lobos batted around. He led off the Lobo half of the seventh with a double to complete the feat. For the week, Hollick hit .688 (11-for-16), with two home runs, three doubles, one triple, 12 RBI and seven runs scored in four games played.

NOT YOUR FATHER'S ARIZONA WILDCATS: There is no doubt that the Arizona Wildcats are in a slump this season. The New Mexico baseball team was not intimidated by the unbeatable legend of the Wildcats. UNM won its first season series with the Arizona, claiming the final game 13-3 Tuesday afternoon at Isotopes Park. The Lobos, winning three of four, haven't won a series since taking two of three in Tucson in 1994.

The Lobos added to Arizona's misery, tapping them for 18 hits, which ties with New Mexico's production on Feb. 19 for the most hits the Wildcats have surrendered all season. Not only that, UA's 10-run margin of deficit is the largest it has succumb to all season.

BOMBS AWAY: The New Mexico offense, sparked by junior Chris Carlson, has been dropping bombs on opponents and the record books lately. Tuesday at Texas Tech, Carlson belted two home runs, combining with his teammates for five in the game. The last time UNM had five homers in a game was April 18, 2004 at Air Force. In the series vs. Air Force, Carlson hit four home runs in three games, including two in game two of the doubleheader Thursday night. In game one, the team hit three and doubled that total in the nightcap with six thanks to two from Carlson and two from senior Ryan Barba, who hit his in consecutive at bats. To close the series on Friday, the Lobos sent five more bombs out of the park. They hit 14 in the series and 19 on the week.

In the sixth inning at Texas Tech, Carlson's second home run came on a 3-2 pitch that he blasted to left. The very next pitch junior Daniel Stovall took yard, making it the first time since May 28, 2004 vs. Utah that the Lobos had back-to-back home runs. Stovall was a part of the previous back-to-back bombs, hitting the first one that was followed by one from A.J. Spitaleri. If that wasn't enough, Carlson and Stovall went back-to-back in game one vs. Air Force.

Carlson has hit at least one home run in each of his last five games and six of his last seven.

RUN WITH THE LOBOS: There is no need to run with the bulls Spain when the Lobos are running plenty in New Mexico. They set a new program record for runs scored in a three-game series, scoring 73 times last weekend. The Lobos increased their run total in each game, scoring 23 in the opener, followed by 24 in game two and 26 in the finale.

FIRST TO 20: The 15-7 win at San Diego State on Sunday, April 9 gave New Mexico its 20th win of the season. Needing 31 games to reach 20 wins, the 2006 team ties with the 1993, 1984, 1982 and 1980 teams for the ninth fastest to 20. The 1969 and 1973 teams tie for the quickest, needing just 22 games to win 20. Under coach Rich Alday, the 2003 team was the fastest, needing 30 to win 20. This year's squad is tied for the second fastest to 20 with the 1993 team while coached by Alday.

EXTRA EXTRA, READ ALL ABOUT IT: UNM has played eight extra-inning games this season, going 4-4. The eight games sets a new program record for the most extra inning games. The previous record was seven, set by the 1984 team. The team to come closest to the mark since '84 was the 1991 team led by Alday, which played four extra inning games.

The longest extra inning game of the season was a 12 inning, 3-2 loss to BYU at the Mountain West Conference Preseason Tournament. The 12 inning game ties for the fourth longest in program history. The longest was a 4-3 loss to New Mexico State on Feb. 9, 2002 in 15 innings. The Lobos have also played one 14 inning game (a 9-8 win over Colorado State on March 17, 1973) and a 13 inning game (a 4-4 tie vs. Colorado State in 1964).

The New Mexico baseball team scored first but the Albuquerque Isotopes scored more thanks to a five-run third inning that lifted them to a 6-2 win over the Lobos in front of 3,171 fans at the exhibition game played at Isotopes Park Tuesday night.

Junior center fielder Matt Foote got the Lobos started in the top of the first with a one-out chopper to short. Foote moved to third on a double from junior first baseman Chris Carlson and then scored on a grounder from sophomore third baseman Ian Hollick.

Senior Jesse Perez, making his first start of the season, looked like a pro, allowing just one hit in 2 innings.

The Isotopes finally came alive in the third, plating five runs on five hits, including a grand slam from first baseman Jason Stokes. With the bases loaded and one out, designated hitter Mike Kinkade lined out to senior shortstop Ryan Barba. Barba flipped to sophomore second baseman Jordan Pacheco, turning the double play at second, catching third baseman Jason Wood to far off the bag.

One inning later, catcher Tom Wilson led off with a triple and scored on a single to left from shortstop Drew Niles for a 6-1 lead.

With one out in the sixth, Foote singled through the left side to stay perfect at the plate. Foote, who was caught stealing to end the third, swiped second and scored on a double from Carlson.

Foote completed the evening 3-for-3, scoring both of New Mexico's runs. Carlson was 2-for-3 with a RBI. For the 'Topes, Niles was the only player with multiple hits, finishing 2-for-2 with two RBI and a run scored.

Yuseiro Petit earned the win, allowing one hit while striking out one in 1 inning. Junior Quentin Andes suffered the loss, allowing five hits, five earned runs and three walks in 1/3 of an inning. Junior Damon Miller threw a hitless inning and recorded the Lobos' only strikeout of the night. Miller fanned center fielder Mark Little to end the seventh.

It's the second consecutive year the Lobos played an exhibition game with the Isotopes, Triple-A affiliate of the Florida Marlins. The two met for the first time in an exhibition game at Isotopes Park on Tuesday, April 5, 2005 before 3,692 fans, with the Isotopes coming out on top in seven innings, 17-4. All tickets for the event benefited UNM Athletics.

HERRERA NAMED MWC PITCHER OF THE WEEK AGAIN: New Mexico junior left hander Danny Ray Herrera was named Mountain West Conference Pitcher of the Week for the second time this season. Herrera, picking up his third career honor, is the only player or pitcher to garner a weekly honor from the MWC twice this season.

Herrera, from Odessa, Texas, improved to 5-0 on the season with his win over No. 12 Oregon State last weekend. In 8.0 innings on the mound, he gave up two earned runs on 11 hits, while striking out a career-high tying nine batters. Five of Herrera's nine strikeouts came in the first two innings, while he scattered only four hits over his last five innings, including one in the last three innings.

20/20: Not since May 27, 2004 had the New Mexico baseball team produced 20 hits or scored 20 runs. That was until Northern Colorado came to town. On Saturday, March 4, the Lobos shelled out 24 hits and scored 21 runs en route to a huge win over the Bears. The next day in the series finale, the Lobos just missed scoring 20 runs, putting 19 on the board but didn't miss the 20 hit mark, dishing out 21.

STOVALL NAMED MWC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Junior Daniel Stovall was named the MWC Co-Player of the week, earning his first accolade of the season and third of his career. went 15-for-21 (.714) from the plate with a home run, a triple, seven doubles, 16 RBI and 12 runs scored last week, as New Mexico tallied a 4-0 record, including a three-game sweep of Northern Colorado. He started the week off with a 3-for-6, two RBI, four run scored performance in a 15-12 win over New Mexico State. In game one vs. Northern Colorado, Stovall went 4-for-4, with two doubles, four RBI and two runs scored, as the Lobos defeated the Bears, 9-4. In game two, he was 5-for-6, with a triple, two doubles, a career-high six RBI and three runs scored in the Lobos' 21-1 win. The five hits vs. UNC tied a career-best. Stovall concluded the series with a 3-for-5, four RBI and two runs scored effort. He collected a home run and two doubles as the Lobos defeated the Bears, 19-6. Stovall also collected 31 putouts with no errors from the first base position.

COLLEGE BASEBALL FOUNDATION PLACES STOVALL ON NATIONAL HONOR ROLL: One day after being named Co-MWC Player of the Week, junior Daniel Stovall was placed on the College Baseball Foundation's National Honor Roll of the Week. Stovall was one of six first basemen honored on the 35-player list. It is the second consecutive week and Lobo has made the roll.

SWING AND NO MISS: On Sunday, Feb. 26, New Mexico sent 35 batters to the plate against Utah Valley State. The Lobos drew six walks, giving them 29 official at bats. Not once, did a Lobo strike out. The last time New Mexico went an entire game without a strikeout was April 18, 2004 vs. Air Force. UNM won that game 18-6, with no strikeouts in 44 at bats.

BOMBS AWAY: Sophomore Ian Hollick snapped the nasty losing streak UNM had to start the season when it hit a home run. Juniors Chris Carlson and Daniel Stovall and sophomore Jordan Pacheco had combined to hit seven home runs in three games of the team's first eight, which the Lobos were 0-3 in. Hollick's solo shot in the Utah Valley State game on Saturday, Feb. 25 led to New Mexico's 3-0 win. Just to prove it was safe to hit home runs and win at the same time, Carlson and Stovall both hit bombs to left in UNM's 9-6 win over the Wolverine the next day. On Tuesday at New Mexico State, Hollick again hit a home run in a win. This time however, it was a grand slam, the first hit by UNM since 2004.

HERRERA NAMED MWC PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Junior Danny Ray Herrera was named the Mountain West Conference Pitcher of the Week on Monday for the first time this season and the second of his career. Herrera pitched a complete game shutout vs. Utah Valley State Saturday, the Lobos' first of the season. In 9.0 innings of work, he struck out seven batters, while

scattering six hits and walking only one, to collect his second consecutive complete game and third win of the season. It was just the fourth time in Herrera's career that he threw a complete game or a shutout. The seven strikeouts tied for the third most in a single game in his career.

COLLEGE BASEBALL FOUNDATION PLACES HERRERA ON NATIONAL HONOR ROLL: One day after being named the MWC Pitcher of the Week, junior Danny Ray Herrera was placed on the College Baseball Foundation's National Honor Roll of the Week. Herrera was one of 35 honorees, including 27 pitchers.

FOOTE NAMED MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Junior center fielder Matt Foote was named the Mountain West Conference Player of the Week for the first time in his career. From Albuquerque, N.M., Foote hit .375 (6-for-16) at the plate with two doubles, three RBI and six runs scored last week, as New Mexico collected two wins, both coming in a three-game series at Arizona. He started the week off with a 1-for-4, one RBI, one run scored performance in a loss to Texas Tech. In game one vs. Arizona, he went 1-for-4 with an RBI and run scored. Foote drove in the go-ahead run in the top of the fourth, then scored the game-winning run in the Lobos' 6-5 win. In game two he was 1-for-3 with another run scored in UNM's 7-3 victory. In the final game of the series, Foote went 3-for-5 with an RBI, three runs scored and a stolen base in a 19-16 loss. His three hits and three runs scored were both career highs. Defensively, Foote had 12 putouts and an assist with no errors from centerfield.

RETURNING HOME: It didn't take sophomore catcher Drew McDonald long to make the trip back home. McDonald, a Tucson native, transferred to New Mexico this semester after spending the first year and a half of his collegiate career at Arizona. McDonald saw limited time at Arizona last season and didn't want to split time this year, making the move to Albuquerque, where he has started five of the first eight games.

McDonald didn't disappoint any of his friends or family either, going 3-for-8 (.375) with three RBI to lead the Lobos to two wins. The first win, 6-5 on Friday, ended a 23-game losing streak to Arizona.

SNAPPING THE STREAK IN STYLE: The Lobos ended a 23-game losing streak to the University of Arizona, dating back to 1997, on Friday, Feb. 17 with a 6-5 win on the Wildcats' home field. The win, also the first by UNM in Tucson since 1993, was no easy feat but Arizona head coach Andy Lopez gave UNM all the credit in a statement for the College Baseball Foundation's Feb. 23 National Notebook.

"Tip your cap to New Mexico," said UA's Andy Lopez, "they got five straight hits off of Mark Melancon and I don't think that's ever happened to him. I know it hasn't since he's been here."

The next day, New Mexico rode the back of junior lefty Danny Ray Herrera to a 7-3 win. Herrera limited UA to season-low three runs with six strikeouts and just one walk.

HOME SWEET HOME: Albuquerque native, freshman Zach Arnett put on a show in his home debut as a Lobo last Tuesday. Arnett, who was hitless in his first collegiate appearance on the road, went 3-for-5 with two RBI against Texas Tech. Starting Sunday's game at Arizona, Arnett again went 3-for-5 with a RBI. For the week, he was 6-for-10 (.600) with a triple and three RBI. He also had a perfect fielding percentage with 14 putouts, three assists, turned one double play and caught one runner stealing.

PRIZED PITCHING: The Lobo pitching staff got off to an incredible start, allowing just 10 runs in their first four games. Last season, they allowed 10 or less over a four-game stretch just once. Their opponents averaged 9.25 runs per game against UNM last season.

To start a season, the last time New Mexico allowed 10 runs in their first four games was in 1969. Since then, the Lobos have allowed less than 20 runs in their first four games only seven times with five of them coming in the 1970s. The most recent season which saw the Lobos

give up less than 20 in the first four games was 2000, which allowed 11.

CARLSON AND PACHECO NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS: Junior Chris Carlson and sophomore Jordan Pacheco were named Louisville Slugger Preseason All-Americans, selected by Collegiate Baseball prior to the 2006 season. Carlson was honored on the first team as a designated hitter while Pacheco made the second team as a second baseman.

The tandem made school history last year as the New Mexico baseball program produced two All-Americans in the same season for just the fifth time. Carlson earned first-team accolades as a DH, while Pacheco was chosen to the third team as a second baseman. Carlson is the first Lobo to garner first-team honors since Travis Young in 1996. The Topeka, Kan., native, who played his first season for UNM in 2005 after transferring from Kansas State, also became just the third player in program history to earn All-America and Academic All-America honors in the same season (Travis Young, 1996; Dusty Young, 2003). He was named a second-team Academic All-American earlier this week for his 3.80 GPA in General Management.

On the field, Carlson stepped right into the heart of the Lobo order and made an immediate impact, establishing himself as one of the top sluggers in the nation. He led the Mountain West Conference in runs (66), slugging (.764) and walks (38), and was ranked in the top five in batting (.395), on-base percentage (.478), hits (87), doubles (24), homers (15) and total bases (168). Carlson, the Mountain West Player of the Week on March 14, was also named to the All-MWC and All-MWC Tournament teams this season.

With his third-team selection, Pacheco became the first freshman in UNM history to garner All-America honors. A product of Albuquerque's La Cueva High School, the second baseman had an outstanding season in his first year as Lobo, ranking among the MWC leaders in batting (.408), homers (15), runs (65) and hits (95). Pacheco, an All-Mountain West selection, was one of 64 players nationally and one of only two freshmen named to the Dick Hower National Player of the Year watch list.

The Lobos also had two All-Americans in 1980 (Duffy Ryan, Keith Hagman), 1985 (Jim Fregosi, Dean Duane), 1993 (Luke Ogelsby, Mark Gulseth) and 2003 (Chris Alexander, Dusty Young). Carlson and Pacheco are the ninth and 10th All-Americans in UNM head coach Rich Alday's tenure.

PACHECO ON WALLACE WATCH LIST: Sophomore Jordan Pacheco was one of 120 baseball student-athletes on the 2006 Wallace Watch released Monday by the College Baseball Foundation in Lubbock, Texas. The Brooks Wallace Award is presented annually to the national college baseball player of the year. The 2005 winner, third baseman Alex Gordon of Nebraska, has signed to play professionally for the Kansas City Royals.

The Wallace Watch will be trimmed to 12 semi-finalists by late May. Then the selection committee will narrow the list to three finalists following the NCAA Super Regionals at a press conference in Omaha. The finalists, their head coaches, and their parents will be invited to Lubbock for a schedule of special events tied to the award banquet, which will again be nationally televised by Fox Sports Network.

Dedicated to the memory of former Texas Tech shortstop and assistant coach, Wallace was a slick-fielding shortstop at Texas Tech from 1977 to 1980. A 4-year starter, he was named All-Southwest Conference and All-District Six his senior year when he led the Red Raiders to their first-ever appearance in the Southwest Conference Tournament. After playing two years in the Texas Rangers organization, he returned to Texas Tech and served as a graduate assistant and later as an assistant coach. In the summer of 1984 he was diagnosed with cancer and fought the disease courageously until his death on March 24, 1985, at age 27. The Plano, Texas, native was married to the former Sandy Arnold and they had one daughter, Lindsay Ryan.

The selection committee for the Wallace Award is comprised of a

national panel of preeminent coaches, sports information directors, former winners and beat media who most closely follow the sport. Screening Committee members will evaluate the candidates and will continue their review throughout the entire baseball season. The list will expand and contract during the regular season and additional Wallace Watch candidates may be added as the season progresses. Voting for the three finalists and the Wallace Award winner will be conducted by confidential balloting, with totals tabulated by the J.W. Anderson & Associates accounting firm in Lubbock.

MWC PRESEASON AWARDS, RANKINGS ANNOUNCED: The honors continue to roll in for junior Chris Carlson and sophomore Jordan Pacheco as both were named on the All-Mountain West Conference Preseason team today as selected by the coaches in the MWC and select media. Both were tabbed Louisville Slugger Preseason All-Americans last month.

Despite returning seven starters (10 letterwinners overall) and finishing fourth last year, the Lobos were picked to finish fifth out of seven teams in the conference. In its first year of competition in the MWC, TCU has been picked to win the regular season championship. In a vote of the seven MWC head coaches and a select media panel, the Horned Frogs received 11 of a possible 13 first-place votes and 89 points, while San Diego State and UNLV (one first-place nod) each received 66 points to finish tied for second in the poll.

BYU garnered the other first-place vote and tallied 64 points for a fourth-place standing in the poll, while New Mexico (36 points) was fifth, Utah (28 points) sixth and Air Force (15 points) seventh. SDSU placed four players on the preseason all-MWC team, followed by BYU, New Mexico and Utah with two each, and UNLV with one.

TCU, ranked as high as No. 19 in national preseason polls, returns seven starters from last year's NCAA Tournament squad, including NCBWA preseason second team All-American Chad Huffman (Jr., IF), 2005 all-Conference USA Freshman Team selections Matt McGuirk (So., OF) and Andrew Walker (So., C), as well as Sam Demel (So., RHP). The Horned Frogs were 41-20 overall last season (20-10 C-USA) and were co-champions at the Conference USA postseason tournament.

San Diego State returns six starters, including preseason all-league picks Jordan Swaydan (Sr., C), Lance Zawadski (Jr., SS), Quintin Berry (Jr., OF) and 2005 MWC Pitcher of the Year Bruce Billings (Sr., RHP). The Aztecs were 26-35 last season (17-13 MWC) finishing third in the regular season standings. UNLV won its third consecutive MWC Tournament crown last season, and will be led by preseason all-conference selection Ryan Bird (Sr., OF), 2005 All-MWC team member Mike Cruz (Sr., 3B) and Chris Bonnell (Jr., 1B). The Rebels return five starters from last year.

BYU returns five starters from last year's second-place MWC squad that finished 21-9 (39-19-1 overall), including preseason all-conference selections Ben Saylor (Sr., 1B) and Jeff Hiestand (Sr., OF). Utah returns 13 letterwinners, including 2005 All-MWC picks Jay Brossman (Jr., 3B) and Josh Cooper (Sr., RHP), from last year's squad that finished fifth in the MWC (10-20, 19-36 overall). Air Force has six starters back, including returning team batting leader Karl Bolt (Jr., 1B).

The conference season begins April 6-7, with the MWC Championship scheduled for May 23-27 at Earl E. Wilson Stadium in Las Vegas, Nev.

LOBOS SIGN 17 FOR 2007 SEASON: The Lobo baseball program announced the signing of 17 athletes to National Letters of Intent today. Head coach Rich Alday and his staff found top-notch talent from around the world at both the high school and junior college level.

"We have signed a lot of pitchers to basically rebuild our staff," Alday said. "You can never have enough pitching and we are really excited about the group of guys coming in. We also have some talented young athletes coming in to fill voids in our defense, especially at short and behind the plate. We've also signed a couple utility guys who will add depth. We are really excited about the recruiting class as a whole this year and expect to see great things from them."

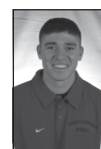
