PLAYING THE CREAM OF THE CROP ... The Lobos 9-20 record this season does not reflect the talent of this team. One of the reasons UNM has lost 20 games is due to the fact of the strength of schedule head coach Ray Birmingham put together. Thus far, UNM has played three conference leaders (Arizona State-Big 12, Creighton-Missouri Valley and Gonzaga-West Coast), five 20 win teams (Arizona, Arizona State, Creighton, New Mexico State and Oklahoma State) and five teams ranked in the top-30 (Arizona, Arizona State, Creighton, New Mexico State and Oklahoma State), with Creighton also receiving votes. The bleeding doesn't stop there for the Lobos, however, as they still have No. 15 TCU and No. 10 Oklahoma on the schedule. Coach Birmingham is a believer in if you want to be the best you have to play the best, making no excuses for his team as he truly believes his youthful Lobo squad can hang with the best once they have gotten the experience. The Lobos came into the year with only one position player, shortstop Alex Allbritton, having any Division I experience.

FORMER LOBO YOUNG MAKES BRAVES BIG LEAGUE ROSTER ... From undrafted free agent out of UNM to a player on a big league roster, Matt Young has come a long way and deserves the shot he has earned. The Atlanta Braves are very excited about the prospect of Matt Young serving as a backup center fielder to Nate McLouth. Young caught the big league club's attention in 2008 when he hit .289 with 30 stolen bases for Double-A Mississippi. He had similar success in 2009 with Triple-A Gwinnett, as he hit .300 with 42 stolen bases. This will be Young's first stint in the majors, as he has spent the past six seasons in the minor leagues.

"It was all kind of a blur," Young said about making the club. "I don't remember what skip said, I just kind of had my head down and was smiling the whole time."

FORMER LOBO PACHECO MAKING MOST OF OPPORTUNITY WITH ROCKIES ... Former Lobo Jordan Pacheco had been turning heads in the Colorado Rockies spring camp this season. Pacheco made quite an impression this spring, as he had a strong push in making the Rockies opening day roster. In 16 games this spring, Pacheco batted .288 with eight RBIs and five runs scored. Pacheco just missed making the roster, however, as he found out March 27 that he would be optioned to Triple-A Colorado Springs to begin the season. It's still a great accomplishment for the former MWC Player of the Year, as he was slated to begin the season in Double-A on the Tulsa Drillers.

LAST SERIES: The Lobos were swept by Gonzaga in a three game series. Sophomore catcher Mitchell Garver had a nice showing in the series, as his bat continues to stay hot. For the series Garver batted .600 while scoring two runs and pounding out two doubles.

RIO GRANDE RIVALRY ... New Mexico dropped a 9-4 battle to New Mexico State March 8 in the Rio Grande Rivalry. UNM still leads the Rio Grande Rivalry 18-7.5 with 1.50 points remaining.

ON THE HORIZON ... UNM will be on the road once again as the Lobos battle the Gonzaga Bulldogs in a three-game series, beginning at 7:30 p.m. MT April 1. UNM will travel to TCU for a three-game weekend series against TCU beginning April 8.

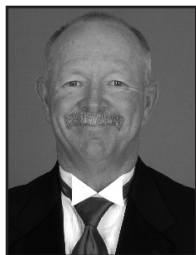

BIRMINGHAM ELECTED TO NJCAA HALL OF FAME ... The University of New Mexico head baseball coach Ray Birmingham was recently named a member of the 2011 National Junior College Athletic Association Hall of Fame. The NJCAA Baseball Coaches Association released this notification Jan. 21. Birmingham is one of three legendary coaches to receive the nod. Birmingham spent 19 successful years as head baseball coach at New Mexico Junior College. He enters his fourth year at UNM as baseball head coach. Birmingham guided UNM to the NCAA tournament for the first time in 48 years last season.

During his 19 seasons at NMJC he amassed a career mark of 765-255-2. He was named the WJCAC Coach of the Year several times (1995, 1997, 1998, 2002, 2005 - 2007), Region 5 Coach of the Year twice (2005, 2007) and was crowned the NJCAA Division I Coach of the Year in 2005. He guided the Thunderbirds to six conference titles, two Region 5 Championships and two appearances at the NJCAA Division I JUCO World Series where his clubs finished as national champions in 2005 and runner-up in 2007.

LOBOS DRAFTED ... The New Mexico baseball team has seven student-athletes that have been drafted by Major League Baseball. During Birmingham's tenure at UNM, New Mexico has had 13 players drafted and 16 have played professional baseball. UNM had a record six players drafted in 2009. The current Lobos who have been drafted are; Austin House (Texas), Alexis Garza (Houston), Gera Sanchez (Texas), Sam Wilson (Texas), DJ Peterson (Tampa), Jake McCasland (San Francisco) and Cory Maltz (Tampa Bay).

Young Lobos Not All That Young On The Mound

Birmingham says pitching might be New Mexico's strength in demanding 2011 season

It's a season in which Lobo baseball coach Ray Birmingham might test his patience more than ever before.

Even if you have the patience to scroll down New Mexico's 2011 baseball roster looking for a senior, you will see exactly what Birmingham is talking about.

Amazingly, on UNM's 32-man roster there is one senior -- Richard Olson, a hard-throwing, right-hander.

"This year we need patience by myself, patience from my staff and patience from everyone involved with this program," said Birmingham. "These kids are young, but I promise you they are going to be something special and do special things as Lobos. They just need some time to grow up."

There are two other major-league reasons Birmingham, a seasoned barker of the diamond and post-game locker rooms, might have to bite his tongue a few times between innings one and nine.

Birmingham will have no returning starters at any position, although shortstop Alex Allbritton was a starter in 2010 at third base.

The schedule Birmingham has laid out in front of his Lobo pups is more suited to something you might throw at the New York Yankees -- or maybe the TCU Horned Frogs, the super-loaded team picked to win the Mountain Conference race as the No. 1 preseason pick in the nation.

So, what's up, Ray? Why you throwing all these UNM pups into the blender?

"You either have a coach trying to protect his job by winning a whole lot of games, or you have a coach on a mission to get somewhere," said Birmingham, whose 2010 Lobos snapped a 48-year NCAA postseason drought. "We're on a mission. We're trying to get somewhere."

Birmingham has never been shy about where he wants to take his Lobos -- to the NCAA World Series in Omaha. He got his foot in that NCAA door last year and beat a good Stanford team before falling to Minnesota in extra innings and losing an elimination game to No. 6-ranked Cal State Fullerton.

The Lobos reached the postseason in 2010 because of a bold schedule and 38 wins. The

Lobos were competitive in the 2010 NCAA tourney because their schedule prepared them to be competitive. That preparation is there again to test one of the youngest teams in the nation.

"I could schedule a 40-win season and not come close to making the playoffs," said Birmingham. "Our schedule is the second toughest in the nation (College Baseball 360) and that's what we want. You don't rise to the top level of baseball playing soft."

"We are trying to prepare young kids for a high level of competition. You don't reach that level by playing directional schools. We're here to play the best."

Of course, this type of schedule is a bit of a gamble. It all depends on how these Lobo youngsters mature and come back from the inevitable losses. Here's where the story of UNM baseball 2011 takes a weird twist.

Drum roll, please -- the strength of the 2011 Lobos is on the mound!

"I don't know if a Lobo coach has ever been able to say that," said Birmingham. "I don't know if that's ever happened. But this season pitching looks to be our forte and that's fine with me because that's what you need to have."

It's probably also fine with Birmingham because this Lobo coach has a long history of developing hitters and throwing out a spider web on defense. Birmingham's Lobos led the nation in hitting in 2009. In 2010, Lobo senior Justin Howard led the nation in hitting and UNM and the Lobos, the top hitting team in the Mountain West Conference, fielded 12 Lobos hitting .300 or better.

Most of those Lobos are gone for 2011. That's part of the problem that comes with developing a program off raw talent. Birmingham puts some polish on that talent and the Major League Draft takes a bit out of your roster.

That's fine, too. Birmingham wants his Lobos to grab a degree and maybe a cup of coffee or two at the Major League level. He just calls in some more raw talent, pulls out his polishing rags, and gets to work.

ON THE MOUND

The Lobos took a big hit in losing arms like Willy Kesler and Kenny Toves. But there are some lively arms returning to throw heat, breaking balls -- and lots of strikes. "Our pitching should be our strength," said Birmingham. "This pitching staff will continue to grow and become one of the best in the country. It needs to mature, but their physical ability is unbelievable."

The pitching staff includes Gabe Aguilar, Oscar Almeida, Steven Florez, Ronnie Galosic, Alexis Garza, Quay Grant, Austin House, Rudy Jaramillo, Cory Maltz, Bobby Mares, Jonathan Mata, Will Mathis, Jake McCasland, Jacob Nelson, Richard Olson, Gera Sanchez and Sam Wilson.

That's a lot of arms with a variety of pitches. Jaramillo is the top returnee with 66.1 innings pitched in 2010, good for a 5.83 ERA and a 4-2 record. Olson tossed 53.2 innings with a 4.19 ERA and a 4-3 mark. Mares got in 34.1 innings for a 4.46 ERA.

House, Almeida, Sanchez, Aguilar and Nelson each reached the mound in 2010. They have D-I experience and have worked hard to improve. Birmingham also is looking for quick help from some young arms. Jake McCasland of Farmington is such an arm.

McCasland had a 1.41 ERA for Piedra Vista High. The 6-foot-2 righty was ranked in the Top 100 prospects in the western U.S. He picked UNM over LSU, Arizona, Oklahoma, and Hawaii.

"Jake will be big-time special," said Birmingham. "I think he'll be a top draft pick by the time he graduates. He already has college size and he can throw it. He might be going to the plate for us, too. The kid can hit."

In The Field

The Lobos are building here -- thanks to graduation and thanks to the pro boys raiding New Mexico's roster. Rafael Neda could have returned behind the plate for UNM and brought back his .362 bat. Neda went pro, as did Matt Honeycutt, who hit .353 in 2010.

Richard Olson -- Lobos lone senior in 2011

It would have been nice to build a lineup behind some proven hitters, but Birmingham has to rebuild behind the bat of Allbritton (.255), Mitchell Garver (.364), DJ Peterson (.310), Ben Woodchick (.259) and John Michael Twichell (.247), who is recovering from an elbow injury.

Allbritton appears to have locked down the shortstop position to replace Danny Gonzalez, one of UNM's best-ever defensive shortstops. After that, UNM has a lot of young -- some unproven -- talent biting at the bit to prove they can crack Birmingham's lineup.

It hurts to lose Neda behind the plate, but not that much. Birmingham expects Mitchell Garver (La Cueva High) to make an immediate impact both in handling the pitching staff and pounding balls offered from other pitching staffs. "Garver will be as good, if not better, than Neda," said Birmingham.

Nelson has experience and the bat to lock down first base. Birmingham says Nelson needs to keep improving his defense. Kyle Stiner, a transfer from Paradise Valley CC (Ariz.) has the early edge at second base. "He's a player," said Birmingham.

Over on the hot corner at third, DJ Peterson, one of those young, unproven, freshmen, is the frontrunner. "He'll be a Lobo great when he's through here," said Birmingham.

The outfield is an open door for Lobos looking for early playing time. Sam Wilson, a 6-foot-1 freshman from Eldorado High, is looking strong in centerfield. Twichell, when healthy, could slide into another spot in the outfield. Trey Porras, Logan Lippert and Quay Grant are three JC transfers, who are using their collegiate experience to separate themselves from some of the first-year Lobo outfielders.

"We don't have a single returning starter at any spot, but I think this team will rise to a high level," said Birmingham. "You just never know how young kids are going to react and that unknown is something I think about quite a bit."

"We have a lot of first-year puppies at the D-I level, who have to keep their heads on straight and not worry about anything but playing the game the right way."

"If they do that, they'll turn into wolves."

LAST TIME OUT ... 0-3 in a series against Gonzaga ... Lobos go 0-3 in a weekend series on the road against Gonzaga April 1-3.

Friday, April 1 - Gonzaga 132, UNM 0

You have to figure if the first five Lobos in the batting order combine for seven hits, the University of New Mexico is bound to score some runs. That wasn't the case at Gonzaga's Patterson Complex where the Lobos were shutout 3-0 Friday night.

The top of the Lobos' batting order -- Kyle Stiner, Ben Woodchick, Mitchell Garver, DJ Peterson and Luke Campbell -- combined for seven hits, but failed to plate a run over nine innings. The Lobos totaled eight hits on the night while Gonzaga was only a hit better with nine. Neither team committed an error in a quick game that lasted two hours and 19 minutes.

One thing the Bulldogs did that the Lobos didn't do was bundle a few key hits together to produce some runs. Gonzaga got the only runs it would need in the first inning when Eric Lane singled and Billy Moon and Royce Bolinger followed up with doubles. Moon knocked in Lane and Bolinger's blast sent Moon home.

Gonzaga got an insurance run in the bottom of the third when Moon and Bolinger singled and Moon scored on a sacrifice fly by Marco Gonzalez.

Both teams got solid efforts out of their starters. New Mexico's Jake McCasland pitched 6.2 innings allowing seven hits and striking out two. He was relieved by Austin House, who gave up no runs and two hits in 1.1 innings.

Gonzaga's Ryan Carpenter got the win going seven innings allowing six hits while striking out seven Lobos and giving up a single walk. Bulldogs' Cody Martin came in to mop up the final two innings and continued to shut out the young Lobos in notching the save.

The two teams go at each other again on Saturday and Sunday with both games slated for 2 p.m. (MT) starts.

UNM's Stiner went 2-for-4 and Garver went 2-for-3 and were the only Lobos to have multi-hit games. Gonzaga also had nice plate production from the top of its lineup as batters No. 2 through No. 5 combined for eight hits. Lane (No. 2), Moon (No. 3) and Bollinger (No. 4) combined for seven hits and were key to Gonzaga's run production.

The Lobos left two runners on base in the first, second, sixth and eighth innings.

The loss was the third straight for the 9-18 Lobos, who are on a challenging eight-game road swing. After UNM's three-game visit with Gonzaga, the Lobos visit nationally ranked TCU for a three-game Mountain West series set for April 8-10.

Saturday, April 2 - Gonzaga 17, UNM 4

The Lobos' struggles on the road continued in game two of their three-game series against Gonzaga, as UNM lost 17-4 to the Bulldogs.

Neither team scored in the first two innings of the game. By the fourth inning, the Lobos were down 6-2, however, and were never able to climb back out of the hole, as Gonzaga kept pouring on the runs. UNM wouldn't score again until the ninth, adding two, after the game had all but been decided.

Gonzaga's starting left-handed pitcher Tyler Olson kept the Lobos quiet as his team built a solid lead during his 6 1/3 innings of work. When Olson left the game during the seventh inning, the Bulldogs had already built an 11-2 lead over the Lobos.

UNM's starting sophomore pitcher Bobby Mares wasn't as solid as Gonzaga's Olson, as he left the game after 4 1/3 innings, giving up nine runs on ten hits while picking up the loss.

Contributing to the Lobos' runs were junior right fielder Ben Woodchick (solo-homer in the third) and junior left fielder Luke Campbell (solo-homer in the fourth). The Lobos other two runs in the ninth were unearned, as Woodchick and sophomore Mitchell Garver scored due to a fielding error by Gonzaga's shortstop Steven Halcomb.

The Lobos fall to 9-19 overall with the loss, while Gonzaga improves to 15-8-1 on the season.

The Lobos are young and still learning how to play on the road against tough teams. They look to rebound against Gonzaga tomorrow at 2:00 p.m. MT in the final game of the series in Spokane, Wash.

Tomorrow's game will feature left-hander Rudy Jaramillo (2-2, 4.37 ERA) for the Lobos versus lefty Marco Gonzalez (3-2, 2.92 ERA) of the Bulldogs.

Sunday, April 3 - Gonzaga 6, UNM 2

The Lobos dropped their third and final game versus the Gonzaga Bulldogs by a score of 6-2 this afternoon.

The Lobos lost due to a lack of run production. There wasn't much UNM could do against Gonzaga, however, because the Bulldogs' starting left-hander Marco Gonzalez was dealing. Gonzalez held the Lobos scoreless through eight innings before serving up a two-run bomb to UNM's designated hitter Luke Campbell in the ninth. Gonzalez picked up the win for the Bulldogs, after throwing a complete game in which he gave up two runs on four hits while striking out eight.

Rudy Jaramillo hung right with Gonzalez in the beginning, as he had the Bulldogs shut out through four innings. Gonzaga would score one off Jaramillo in the fifth and add four more by the seventh. Jaramillo would be replaced in the eighth in favor of Gera Sanchez. Jaramillo threw for seven innings, surrendering five runs, four earned, on six hits to go along with two strikeouts while picking up the loss.

The Lobos were down 6-0 going into the ninth inning. With two outs, the Bulldogs' Gonzalez was still pitching as UNM's Campbell stepped to the plate. Gonzalez was looking for the shutout, and figured to have it, until Campbell broke it up, sending a two-run blast to left center. It wasn't enough for the Lobos, however, as Gonzalez got UNM's freshman first baseman DJ Peterson to fly out to end the game.

With the loss, the Lobos fall to 9-20 on the season, while the Bulldogs improve to 16-8-1.

Next up for UNM is a weekend series against conference rival TCU, beginning at 5:30 p.m. MT on April 8 in Fort Worth Texas.
