**3RD SEASON STARTS THURSDAY AGAINST WYOMING/AIR FORCE WINNER**

New Mexico (28-3, 14-2 MWC) will try and extend one of the nation's longest current winning streaks Thursday when it opens play in the 2010 Conoco Mountain West Conference Championship.

The Lobos, who have won 14 in a row and are the No. 1 seed after capturing the MWC regular-season championship, will play either 8 seed Wyoming or 9 seed Air Force. The Cowboys and Falcons play Wednesday at 3 p.m. Mountain Time.

Tip-off Thursday is 1:02 p.m. Mountain Time from the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas. The game will be televised nationally on The mtn., channel 276 on Albuquerque Comcast and 616 on DirecTV.

The Lobos enter the week still ranked 8th by AP - their highest position since being No. 8 on Dec. 1, 1997 - and also No. 8 in the coaches' poll, up from No. 10. The highest ranking for a Steve Alford-coach came in his third season at Iowa. The Hawkeyes were No. 7 on Nov. 26, 2001, following a 4-0 start.

**ALFORD NAMED MWC COACH OF THE YEAR FOR 2ND YEAR IN A ROW**

After never earning coach of the year honors in his first 13 seasons at the Div. I level, New Mexico head coach Steve Alford has made it two in a row after leading UNM to consecutive Mountain West regular-season titles.

Alford joins Dave Bliss, who was feted by the Western Athletic Conference in 1993-94 and 1995-96, as the only UNM head coaches to be recognized twice.

Alford was a three-time Indiana Collegiate Conference coach of the year in 1993, '94 and '95 while at NCAA Div. III Manchester (Ind.) College.

**HOBSON VOTED MWC PLAYER & NEWCOMER OF THE YEAR**

New Mexico junior guard Darington Hobson was named the Mountain West Conference Player of the Year for his play throughout the 16-game league season.

Hobson led the MWC in rebounding (10.1 rpg), was 3rd in scoring (14.9 ppg) and 3rd in assists (4.8 apg). **Hobson was even better the last six weeks of the regular season when he averaged 18.2 points, 11 rebounds and 5.8 assists over the final 9 games.**

Hobson joins former Lobos Ruben Douglas (2002-03) and J.R. Giddens (2007-08) that have garnered MWC Player of the Year recognition. Giddens shared the award with BYU's Lee Cummarid.

**GARY ALL-MWC 1ST TEAM AND DEFENSIVE TEAM, MARTINEZ ON 2ND TEAM**

New Mexico junior guard Dairese Gary joins Hobson on the All-Mountain West Conference, giving UNM a pair of first-team selections for the first time since 1998 when Clayton Shields and Kenny Thomas were so honored in the Western Athletic Conference. Gary was also named to the All-MWC Defensive Team.

Senior Roman Martinez was named second team All-MWC while sophomore guard Phillip McDonald earned honorable mention.

**NEW MEXICO-WYOMING SERIES**

The schools would meet for the 122nd time. Wyoming has a slight 63-58 lead, but New Mexico has won two in a row and 6 of 7 under head coach Steve Alford. The lone loss came in last year's MWC Tournament quarterfinals in Las Vegas. The 6th-seeded Cowboys upset No. 3 seed UNM 75-67.

New Mexico is 2-3 all-time against Wyoming in conference tournament action. Last year's loss in Las Vegas is the only time they have met as members of the Mountain West.

The Lobos swept the season series this year, winning 70-68 in Laramie and 83-61 in The Pit. Darington Hobson averaged 17.5 ppg and 8.5 rpg against the Cowboys. UNM converted just 28% (14-50) of its 3-pointers in the two games.

**NEW MEXICO-AIR FORCE SERIES**

This would be the 66th meeting between UNM and Air Force. The Lobos have a 47-18 advantage in the series, including a sweep this season: 73-50 at the Academy and 59-56 in The Pit.

UNM has won 6 straight against the Falcons, all under Steve Alford. He is 7-0 against Air Force in his coaching career.

The Lobos and Falcons have only met one time in a conference tournament. UNM grounded Air Force 74-60 in the quarterfinals of the 1989 Western Athletic Conference Tournament in Salt Lake City.

## UNM'S CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The Lobos have a 27-23 record in 26 years of conference tournaments. The breakdown is 22-15 with two titles (1993 and '96) in 16 years in the Western Athletic Conference, but just 5-9 and one championship (2005) in 10 tries in the Mountain West.

**UNM has been one-and-done in the MWC tourney four straight years, seven of the past eight and eight of 10 overall. That means no current Lobo has been on the winning side of an MWC Tournament game.**

## NO. 1 SEED FOR JUST THE 2ND TIME

By winning this season's MWC regular-season title, New Mexico is the No. 1 seed for just the second time in 27 years of conference tournament play. The Lobos were the top seed in the 1994 Western Athletic Conference Tournament that was staged at the Delta Center in Salt Lake City. UNM beat San Diego State in the quarterfinals before losing to Hawai'i in the semis.

## UNM AT THE THOMAS & MACK

Not the most successful venue for New Mexico is the Thomas & Mack Center. That's because the Lobos are 4-14 in the facility since the Mountain West Conference commenced tournament play there in 2000. The wins came over Colorado State and Utah in the 2001 MWC Tournament and against UNLV in the regular season in 2005 and 2010.

As Alford tried to forecast the season, he thought UNM's predicted finish of fifth place in the Mountain West may be a notch too high. A .500 season seemed like a real possibility.

Now, Alford calls this year's Lobo squad the best team he has had in 19 seasons as a head coach "from a chemistry standpoint,"

### **WHY ONLY 10 PLAYERS??**

The departure of Rusher and Nweke left New Mexico with 11 scholarship players. True freshman Matt Staff (6-9) returned to Houston at the end of the fall semester for personal reasons. That left Alford with a roster of 10 players: 1 senior, 2 juniors, 4 sophomores and 3 freshmen.

### **12 PLAYERS AND JUST 4 CARS**

When Steve Alford arrived at UNM three years ago, he insisted that the team live together in on-campus housing just like any other student. That remains the situation today.

The 12 Lobos (including walk-on Kevin Nelson and UCLA transfer Drew Gordon) live in the Student Residence Center (SRC) right in the middle of the UNM campus. The SRC is a 14-building co-ed complex, comprised of 84 apartments with 6 single bedrooms each.

The Lobos certainly look out for each other especially when it comes to transportation. That's because among the 12 players, only four of them have cars: Gordon, Nelson, A.J. Hardeman and Roman Martinez. So, there is a lot of ride-sharing.

### **LOBOS WIN 2ND STRAIGHT MWC REGULAR-SEASON TITLE**

After sharing the 2008-09 MWC championship with BYU and Utah with a 12-4 record, the Lobos won it outright in 2009-10 at 14-2. That's two losses to start the conference season followed by a 14-game winning blitz that carries into this week's tournament.

The defining and title-clinching triumph was a dramatic 83-81 victory at (13/11) BYU on Feb. 27, the Lobos' first win over the

Cougars in Provo since 2000. UNM also snapped BYU's 21-game winning streak at the Marriott Center.

New Mexico's last outright title came in 1994 when it was a member of the Western Athletic Conference. UNM also won WAC titles in 1964 (shared with Arizona State), '68, '74 and '78.

Only one other time has UNM won back-to-back conference titles and that was in 1944 and '45 when it claimed Border Conference championships during World War II.

### **AND QUITE A WELCOME HOME**

The day after UNM won at BYU to clinch the MWC regular-season title, approximately 1,000 fans waiting inside the Albuquerque International Sunport greeted the traveling party.

The crush of well-wishers was so extensive that some of the players needed a police escort just to get them to the team bus that was waiting to take them back to The Pit.

### **IT'S "RO SHOW" TIME**

Arguably one of the most respected student-athletes to represent the University of New Mexico, senior Roman Martinez played his last game at The Pit on March 3. A few highlights of his stellar career:

- New Mexico Gov. Bill Richardson proclaimed March 3, 2010 "Roman Martinez Day," in the state
- Thursday will be his 130th game played and 101st career start
- He turned 22 last Friday
- UNM has an 89-41 record in his four seasons
- 2009-10 Academic All-American and a preliminary candidate for a Rhodes Scholarship
- 3.48 cumulative grade-point-average and scheduled to graduate this May with a degree in business administration and an emphasis in marketing
- 1 of 3 Lobos with 1,000 career points, 500 rebounds and 150 3-pointers
- UNM career rankings: tied for 6th in games played (129), 7th in 3-point FGs made (194), 12th in rebounding (619) and 22nd in scoring (1,110)

## NEW LEVELS FOR WINNING ON THE ROAD

- 7 conference road wins (started 0-1, won last 7)
- 10 road wins in a season...old UNM record was 8 in 1972-73, 1977-78, 1995-96 and 2007-08...MWC record was 9 by BYU In 2008-09
- 11 wins away from Albuquerque (road and neutral sites)...old UNM record was 9 in 1963-64, 1992-93, 1995-96 and 1997-98

## MARTINEZ NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

Senior Roman Martinez was named to the 2009-10 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America® men's basketball teams, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America. The El Paso, Texas, native earned second team honors and is the first Lobo named since Rich Pokorski in 1975.

"It means a lot," said Martinez, who appropriately was working on a class project at the Albuquerque International Sunport when informed of the honor. "All the late nights of studying, working before and after practice, it means a lot to have something to show for it."

Martinez, a co-captain and the only senior for the nationally-ranked Lobos, carries a 3.48 cumulative grade point average in business administration with an emphasis in marketing and is on schedule to graduate in May.

Martinez is a two-time ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District VI honoree and has been named Academic All-Mountain West Conference each of the past three seasons. Earlier in the season, he was tabbed as one of 30 NCAA Division I Lowe's Senior CLASS Award candidates, given for notable achievement in classroom, character, community and competition. He was also a semifinalist for the Coach Wooden Citizen Cup, given for behavior as a player, plus contributions to the college community and society.

"It is a tribute to Roman," said Lobo head coach Steve Alford. "Not only is he a great player, but he is a tremendous student. When you start looking for ways to explain what a student-athlete is supposed to look like and emulate, it's Roman Martinez. We're very excited for him and it's also a great, great thing for our program to have an Academic All-American."

## HOBSON BREAKING NEW GROUND

Assists have been tracked at UNM since 1969 and no Lobo has ever led the team in scoring, rebounding and assists in the same season. However, junior guard Darrington Hobson currently leads in those categories at 15.8 ppg, 9.1 rpg and 4.5 apg.

Hobson had a rare double-double for rebounds (10) and assists (11) - plus 8 points - in the overtime win at Utah on Feb. 13. The last Lobo to pull that off was Luc Longley, who had a triple-double with 17 points, 14 rebounds and 10 assists against Penn State on March 28, 1990. Longley is the only UNM player to have a triple-double, and he did it twice.

Hobson has had 12 double-doubles this season, including 7 in the past 8 games. The last Lobo to have 13 d-d's in a season was Danny Granger in 2004-05. Kenny Thomas had 16 in 1997-98.

## LOBOS' HISTORY IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

The Lobos' first national ranking came during the 1964-65 season under head coach Bob King. UNM was 19-3 after a 70-66 win over Arizona on Feb. 20, 1965. The ranking was short-lived, however, as the Lobos lost their last five games to finish 19-8.

#### HEAD COACH STEVE ALFORD

Steve Alford, 45, is in his third season in charge of New Mexico hoops and his 19th year as a collegiate head coach. He was named UNM's 19th head coach on March 23, 2007. **Alford, who has never been an assistant coach in his collegiate career, was 26 when he became head coach at Manchester (Ind.) College.**

The two-time MWC Coach of the Year after leading the Lobos to consecutive MWC titles, Alford has a 382-207 (64%) career record, 74-24 (76%) at New Mexico. His teams have qualified for postseason play 13 times, produced 16 winning seasons and reached 20 wins on 11 occasions.

### TCU RECAP

Darlington Hobson had 20 points and 14 rebounds while Roman Martinez added 19 points in his final game at The Pit, leading No. 8 New Mexico to a 73-66 win over TCU to secure the Lobos' first outright conference title in 16 years.

Dairese Gary added 14 and made 4 of 6 from the free throw line in the final 30 seconds as the Lobos won their 14th straight game and clinched their first outright season title since winning the Western Athletic Conference in 1994.

New Mexico also tied a school record for most wins - a 28-5 mark set in 1995-96.

Ronnie Moss led the Horned Frogs with 14 points while Edvinas Ruzgas and Zvonko Buljan each added 12 but TCU lost its fifth in a row to New Mexico.

The Lobos are absorbing every opponent's best shot lately, with six of the past seven games turning into a dogfight down the stretch. TCU led 29-23 late in the first half and proved to be the latest example.

The Horned Frogs stayed within striking distance throughout the second half, despite consecutive 3-pointers by Martinez that put New Mexico up 62-51 with 6:20 remaining, and got within 67-64 with a minute to play when Keion Mitchem hit a 3-pointer.

But Martinez scored inside and, after TCU's Greg Hill missed a long 3-point try, Gary began his march to the free throw line.

Hobson logged his 12th double-double of the season and seventh in the past eight games, but it was Martinez's night. As the only senior on a team that was picked fifth in the Mountain West back in the preseason, he has been the guts and glue for the Lobos.

"They picked us fifth two years in a row," Martinez declared after taking the microphone for a postgame ceremony.

Coach Steve Alford pulled Martinez out with 1.7 seconds to go, and he left to a rousing cheer, then hugged his coaches and teammates as he worked his way down the bench.

"Ro Mar-ti-nez," the crowd chanted.

At the final horn, cheering students rushed the court and lifted Martinez above the fray. Martinez held up a sign that proclaimed "Ro!" and held his index finger high as fans wearing "Ro Knows" T-shirts celebrated at his feet.

Most of the capacity crowd of 14,586 stayed to honor Martinez for his contributions to a Lobos program that went 15-17 during his freshman season. That led to former coach Ritchie McKay's firing and the arrival of third-year coach Steve Alford.

"This team took on the face and the heart of their senior leader," Alford said, drawing

## PIT GETTING \$60 MILLION RENOVATION

On Nov. 6, 2008, University of New Mexico Vice President for Athletics Paul Krebs outlined details of the \$60 million renovation to University Arena that are expected to be completed by the start of the 2010-11 season. **Images are available at [www.golobos.com](http://www.golobos.com).**

"Our goal is to create the best collegiate basketball venue in the nation," said Krebs.

Financing is coming from three sources: 1) \$25 million in debt service which is the responsibility of athletics; 2) \$18 million in state capital outlay which was committed several years ago; and 3) \$17 million from private fundraising given specifically for this project.

The focus of the design, led by the Albuquerque architectural firm of Molzen-Corbin & Associates, is to maintain and improve the fan experience but not change The Pit. The planning committee was charged with keeping The Pit intimate, respecting its history, keeping the mystique of the arena, maintaining great site lines and the current bowl seating mix and embracing new technology. As a result, the renovation includes:

- 60,000 square feet of new space
- Doubling the number of concessions points of sale
- Doubling the total number of rest rooms
- Expanding the concourse to enhance pedestrian traffic flow
- Extensive glasswork as well as increased ceiling height that will allow patrons to take advantage of views, including the Sandia Mountains and downtown Albuquerque
- New state-of-the art locker room facilities for both men's and women's basketball teams
- Addition of new weight room and training room dedicated to men's and women's basketball
- Addition of a Lettermen's lounge to provide access to UNM letterwinners from all sports
- Increase technology to enhance the fan experience, including video boards, ribbon boards and digital signage throughout the arena
- Extensive signage and graphics package to highlight the history of Lobo athletics
- Addition of 40 suites and more than 400 club seats
- New commissary to support improved concessions as well as club and suites
- The Lobo Store will nearly double its current size
- Ticket office will be expanded and relocated
- Exterior updated and upgraded

a big cheer.

The Lobos also trotted out the Mountain West trophy and cut down the nets at The Pit. After sharing last season's championship with BYU and Utah, they're keeping this one all to themselves.

### OUTSIDE BATHROOMS, CONCESSIONS DON'T DETER HOME CROWDS

Due to the ongoing renovations at The Pit, Lobo fans all season had to endure portable restrooms and concessions stands located outside in the winter air. No doubt the team's success help make the inconveniences tolerable, but the attendance numbers were impressive none the less:

- UNM had sell out crowds of 14,586 for its last five games, and nine times in 18 home games...average attendance in 2009-10 was 13,595, which is 93% of capacity in a renovated Pit

- The final sellout against TCU pushed UNM past the 12-million mark all-time at The Pit...total attendance is now 12,010,173 for 776 games since the arena opened on Dec. 1, 1966

### MEMORABLE ROAD TRIP

Two venues and cities the Lobos have had little previous success turned out to be fruitful stops in mid-February. Successive victories at UNLV and Utah moved New Mexico into the top spot in the MWC standings.

UNM quieted No. 23/25 UNLV 76-66 as it beat the Rebels for only the second time in the past 13 games at the Thomas and Mack. ***The victory was the Lobos' first against a ranked team on its home floor since a win at 2nd-ranked Arizona 70-68 on Dec. 21, 1999.***

Before a Feb. 13 game at Utah, the Lobos were 6-52 all-time against the Utes in Salt Lake City. UNM escaped with a 68-65 overtime victory as Steve Alford became the first New Mexico head coach to beat Utah twice on its home floor.

### A GREAT START FOR THE LOBOS

New Mexico won its first 12 games for only the third time in school history. Only one Lobo team started better than the 2009-10 squad, and that was 17-0 in 1967-68. The 12-game winning streak ties for the 3rd-longest in school history and is the best by a Lobo team since taking 14 in a row in 1977-78.

### 20 WINS AGAIN...AND THE FASTEST TEAM TO GET THERE

The win at TCU provided UNM and head coach Steve Alford with a third straight 20-win season, a feat last accomplished by the Lobos from 1996-99 when they did it four consecutive seasons.

It's Alford's 11th 20-win campaign in 18 full seasons as a head coach and New Mexico's 23rd, all coming since 1964.

Alford has more wins in his first three seasons at UNM (70) than any previous Lobo coach. The next closest is Dave Bliss, who won 62 from 1989-91.

As the calendar goes, this year's Lobo team reached 20 wins quicker than any other when it beat TCU in Fort Worth on Jan. 30. Previously, the earliest to come came on Feb. 14, 1978.

As for number of games required to reach 20 victories, the 2009-10 Lobos needed the third-fewest.

## GRANGER DONATES \$500,000 TO PIT RENOVATION

If you know that much about ex-Lobo Danny Granger, it doesn't come as a surprise that he is willing to dig deep into his pockets, pluck out \$500,000, and hand it over to the University of New Mexico in the school's quest to renovate University Arena.

Because Danny Granger loves The Pit. He loves Lobos basketball, too.

"This is something I've wanted to do ever since I got drafted," said the former UNM star, about to begin his fourth season in the NBA with the Indiana Pacers. "New Mexico is a second home to me and the University of New Mexico gave me a lot of opportunities and I attribute so much to them for all the things I've been able to make of myself.

"The Pit holds a special place in my heart for all the love The Pit showed, not just to me, but to the whole team. I want to give something back to the school because I'm a Lobo fanatic and this is a great way for me to do that."

Granger's donation of \$500,000 will come in five annual donations of \$100,000. It is part of the \$17 million UNM needs to raise from the private sector to reach the \$60 million price tag on The Pit's face-lift.

Larry Ryan, a UNM associate athletics director in charge of development, said Granger's donation will be one of the largest donations to ever come to UNM athletics from an individual.

Ryan said once final approval is granted by the UNM Board of Regents and the naming committee, Granger's name will become part of the renovated locker rooms in The Pit.

"I met with (UNM President David J. Schmidly) and he was telling me about some of the things he is planning to do at UNM," said Granger. "He is really planning some great things and I wanted to be a part of this one (Pit renovation)."

Granger played for the Lobos from 2004-05. He was All-Mountain West Conference in 2004 and 2005 and All-American (Basketball Times) in 2005 after leading UNM to the 2005 MWC tourney title. The Lobos stunned No.

15-ranked Utah 60-56 in the MWC championship game. Granger averaged 19.5 points as a Lobo in 2003-04 and 18.8 points in 2004-05.

Granger was noted for his all-around play on the court and for his humility and sportsmanship off the court.

One of the best insights into Granger, as a person and as a teammate, came during a practice session in which former Lobos coach Ritchie McKay was making point guard Javin Tindall run a few extra sprints to the far baseline and back.

McKay sent Tindall on the sprint by himself while the rest of the Lobos watched. When Tindall finished his solo run, McKay said, "Again." When Tindall returned to his waiting teammates, McKay said, "Again." This time Tindall did not sprint alone. Granger had joined him and ran along side his teammate. McKay did not say, "Again," when Granger and Tindall finished their sprint.

That was very much the type of player and teammate Granger was at UNM. Those qualities are also why Granger is putting some of his NBA money into renovating his former home court.

"The Pit needs to remain a special place," said Granger. "I was so amazed when I got to UNM. I had never played in a place like that before where the crowd can make such a huge difference."

Granger's success at the NBA level is no surprise to the thousands of Lobo fans who watched him star for UNM for two seasons.

Granger is all-around. The 6-foot-8 forward/wing can rebound, pass, defend, score inside, score outside and can put the ball on the floor.

He averaged 7.5 points and 4.9 rebounds his rookie NBA season in 2005-06. He scored 13.9 points and pulled down 4.6 rebounds per game in 2006-07. This past season his numbers jumped to 19.6 and 6.1. He shot .855 percent from the free throw line.

"My role has changed and increased every season," said Granger. "I'm expecting an even bigger role next season (2008-09).

And thanks, in part, to Danny Granger, the Lobos are closer to doing some great things to his old stomping grounds = The Pit.

### FOUR LOBOS NAMED MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior guard Dairese Gary became the fourth different Lobo to earn MWC Player of the Week honors for his play in road games against Colorado State and BYU in late February.

Sophomore forward A.J. Hardeman was recognized Jan. 18 for his performances against Utah (Jan. 13) and Wyoming (Jan. 16).

Junior G Darington Hobson picked up UNM's first honor Nov. 23 after the Lobos went 4-0 against New Mexico State, Nicholls State, Louisiana Tech and Miami (Ohio). He also shared the award after

the San Diego State victory on Feb. 6.

Senior F Roman Martinez was recognized twice, Dec. 7 after wins against Cal (Dec. 2) and New Mexico State (Dec. 5). He also shared the honor a week later following UNM road wins over San Diego and Texas A&M.

### UNM AMONG THE NATION'S YOUNGEST TEAMS

According to a survey by the University of Central Florida media relations office, only four schools have fewer upperclassmen than New Mexico in 2009-10. St. Louis and Washington State have one player in their junior-senior class while Arizona and Toledo list two. UNM, George Mason, UCF and Wyoming have three. There are 346 schools in NCAA Div. I this year.

The Lobos have one senior (Roman Martinez), two juniors (Dairese Gary and Darington Hobson), four sophomores and three freshmen on their 10-man scholarship roster in 2009-10.

### A BRIEF LOOK AT THE 2009-10 LOBOS

The Lobos lost their top three scorers in graduating seniors Tony Danridge (14.9), Daniel Faris (12.1) and super-sub Chad Toppert (10.8). They were also three of UNM's top-four rebounders, meaning New Mexico lost 51% of its scoring and 40% of its rebounding.

UNM returned six lettermen in Will Brown, Nate Garth, Dairese Gary, A.J. Hardeman, Roman Martinez and Phillip McDonald, and one redshirt in freshman Curtis Dennis.

**For the first time since 1985-86 (Johnny Brown), the Lobos have just one senior in Roman Martinez.** There are only two juniors in Gary and junior college transfer Darington Hobson. The remaining seven players are all freshmen and sophomores.

### LAST YEAR'S RUN TO THE TITLE

Picked to finish 5th in the Mountain West Conference, the 2008-09 Lobos won their final five games of the regular season - the clincher coming against Wyoming in Laramie - to tie BYU and Utah for the MWC championship at 12-4.

Just two years removed from a 4-12 league mark and losing in the MWC Tournament play-in game, New Mexico claimed its first conference crown in 15 years, since winning the 1994 Western Athletic Conference championship. Steve Alford was named MWC Coach of the Year.

## ESPN.COM RANKS LOBOS' RECRUITING CLASS BEST IN THE MWC

ESPN.com named the Lobos' 2-member recruiting class of 6-11 Alex Kirk and 6-7 Tony Snell the best in the Mountain West Conference. ESPN.com's assessment of the early-signing period:

**Top player signed in the MWC:** Alex Kirk (Los Alamos, N.M./Los Alamos) is a finesse center-type who could be deadly in a pick-and-pop set and his passing skills are high-level as well.

**Why UNM's is the best in the MWC:** Kirk is the top player in the Lobos' class, but 6-6 Tony Snell (Phoenix, Ariz./Westwind Academy) is the most promising prospect. Snell has an intriguing skill set that could eventually lead him to being a point-forward type someday.

## **THE PIT AND THE ONGOING CONSTRUCTION**

One of college basketball's most famous and recognizable buildings, University Arena is the home of New Mexico basketball.

The 2009-10 season marked the 44th year of basketball in The Pit/Bob King Court, which was opened Dec. 1, 1966. UNM has an all-time mark of 631-145 (81%) in the building that resides 37 feet below street level. The Lobos have had a winning record in The Pit in 43 of their 44 years, including a school-record 41-game home winning streak from 1996-98.

Since the beginning of the 2004-05 season, the Lobos are 95-13 (88%) at home. What is even more impressive about UNM's home court is that more than 12 million fans have flocked into the sunken edifice to see their beloved Lobos play basketball. The Lobos have averaged nearly 15,500 fans the past 44 years, an amazing 95% of capacity.

A \$60 million renovation is currently underway and is expected to be completed by the start of the 2010-11 season. Due to the renovation, the mezzanine level was closed and no standing-room-only tickets were sold. Arena capacity for 2009-10 was decreased to 14,586 from 18,018. It will be around 17,000 when the project is finished prior to the 2010-11 season.

## **SEASON NO. 107**

The University of New Mexico men's basketball program is completing its 107th season in 2009-10. The Lobos first laced up the hightops on Feb. 2, 1900, when they lost 8-6 to the Albuquerque Guards. While this season is actually the 110th anniversary of that inaugural year, UNM did not field a team for various reasons in 1900-01, 1903-04, 1917-18 and 1920-21.

The Lobos have been playing continuously since the 1921-22 season and have compiled an all-time record of 1,338-1,021 (.567).

New Mexico was 418-495 (.458) from 1900-62, but has gone 920-526 (.635) over the past 48 seasons, an average of more than 19 wins per year. The Lobos have made 29 trips to the postseason during that span, including 11 appearances in the NCAA Tournament and 18 showings in the NIT.

## **NCAA MEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP RETURNS TO THE PIT**

On Sept. 21, 2009, the NCAA announced preliminary round sites for the 2011, 2012 and 2013 Men's Basketball Championship.

The University of New Mexico will host first and second round games in 2012. The dates are March 15 and 17, 2012. Four games will be played on Thursday, March 15 with two games scheduled for Saturday, March 17. UNM will be hosting the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship for the 10th time, but the first time since 2005.

A total of 37 NCAA Championship games have been played in The Pit since the first time in 1968, including the 1983 Final Four.

"It's great to see the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship return to Albuquerque and The Pit," said UNM Vice President for

Athletics Paul Krebs. "This would not have happened without the commitment from Gov. Richardson and the State Legislature. The NCAA men's basketball tournament was not coming back to The Pit without the renovations that are currently being made, so the return on the investment is already being seen."

## **2008-09 SEASON RECAP**

New Mexico's 106th season of men's basketball ended with a tough 70-68 loss at Notre Dame in the second round of the NIT. UNM finished 22-12, its 17th 20-win campaign in the past 26 seasons.

Picked to finish 5th in the Mountain West Conference preseason poll, the Lobos won their final five games of the regular season to tie BYU and Utah for the MWC title at 12-4. Just two years removed from a 4-12 league mark and losing in the MWC Tournament play-in game, New Mexico claimed its first conference crown in 15 years, since winning the 1994 Western Athletic Conference championship.

After a 73-62 loss at BYU on Feb. 17, the Lobos were 7-4 in the MWC and knew they had to run the table to give themselves a chance at a championship.

## **DANRIDGE WINS NATIONAL DUNK CONTEST**

Tony Danridge proved what all Lobo fans already knew: He's the best dunker in college basketball. On April 2, Danridge beat out seven other college seniors to win the vegas.com Slam Dunk contest at the 21st State Farm College Slam Dunk and 3-Point Championships at the Palace of Auburn Hills outside Detroit.

The 6-5 Danridge (San Bernardino, Calif.) beat Charlotte's Charlie Coley III in a dunk-off. Coley III had the first attempt in the dunk-off. He scored 48 points when he flew over judge Jalen Rose, who was seated in a director's chair in the lane, for the slam. Danridge answered with a full windmill left-handed slam that was good for 49 points (out of a possible 50) and the winner's belt.

The pressure was on Danridge and he delivered, much to the pleasure of UNM head coach Steve Alford who was courtside for the festivities.

## **DANRIDGE NAMED 1ST TEAM ALL-MWC, FARIS 2ND TEAM**

Senior Tony Danridge earned a spot on the All-Mountain West Conference first team. Fellow senior Daniel Faris was named to the second team while senior Chad Toppert and junior Roman Martinez received honorable mention recognition.

## **SENIORS IMPRESSIVE ON AND OFF THE COURT**

UNM's three seniors - Tony Danridge (San Bernardino, Calif.), Daniel Faris (Albuquerque) and Chad Toppert (Albuquerque) - all graduate in May of 2009 with their bachelor's degrees.

Danridge majored in University Studies, Faris in Mass Media/Communications and Toppert in Business. The trio participated in at least 123 games in their careers at New Mexico: Danridge (129), Toppert (127) and Faris (123). They combined to score 3,209 points.

# NEW MEXICO NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The University of New Mexico has a 6-12 record in 11 NCAA Tournament appearances. Here's a summary of the Lobos' NCAA Tournament showings:

**1968** -- New Mexico's first exposure in the NCAA Tournament came under head coach Bob King in 1968. King was named WAC Coach of the Year after capturing the WAC crown with an impressive 23-5 overall record. The Lobos were 7th in the national rankings and also had the advantage of playing on their home floor in the West Regional. UNM lost the first night to Santa Clara, 86-73, as its star center Greg (Stretch) Howard was ineligible to play due to the NCAA rule that did not allow transfers to play in postseason games. In the consolation game, UNM fell to intrastate rival New Mexico State, 68-62, a team it had beaten twice during the regular season. The Aggies had lost the night before to Lew Alcindor-led UCLA, which went on to win the national title.

**1974** -- The 1974 WAC championship team finished 22-7 and 18th in the polls. The Lobos traveled to Pocatello, Idaho, and defeated Idaho State, 73-65 in the first round. From there it was on to Tucson for the West Regional where the Lobos lost a heartbreaker to San Francisco in the last 22 seconds, 64-61. UNM redeemed itself the following night by winning the consolation game over Dayton, 66-61. The Flyers had taken UCLA into triple overtime the previous night.

**1978** -- A 13-1 conference mark (24-3 overall) earned the Lobos a Western Athletic Conference title and a trip to Tempe, Arizona. UNM's first-round opponent was Cal State Fullerton, which became that year's Cinderella team. Had the Lobos defeated the Titans, they would have returned home to Albuquerque for the West Regional and 18,000 hometown fans. But in one of the biggest upsets of the year, unranked Fullerton dumped 4th-ranked New Mexico 90-85. The Titans advanced to Albuquerque where they upset San Francisco then lost to Final Four participant Arkansas by one point in the regional final.

**1991** -- New Mexico made its first appearance in 13 years by receiving an at-large bid with a 20-9 record. Seeded 14th in the East Region, New Mexico faced No. 3 seed Oklahoma State in the first round at College Park, Md. The game was tied at halftime, 26-26, however, the Cowboys' second-half defense was too much for the Lobos in the 67-54 loss. Luc Longley had 16 points and 9 rebounds in his final collegiate game. OSU advanced to the Sweet 16 before falling to Temple.

**1993** -- The Lobos received an automatic bid to the tournament by winning the WAC Tournament in Salt Lake City. Entering the tournament with a 23-7 record, UNM was ranked 21st by the Associated Press and received a No. five seed. The Lobos drew 12th-seeded George Washington as its first-round opponent in the West Region at Tucson, Ariz. New Mexico was in trouble before the team bus ever got to the McKale Center. Several Lobos, including starters Khari Jaxon and Steve Logan, were afflicted by food poisoning from a meal eaten the night before. That malady and the Colonials' brawn proved to be the difference in the 82-68 defeat. George Washington eventually lost to national runnerup Michigan in the Sweet 16.

**1994** -- UNM advanced to the NCAA West Regional in Sacramento, Calif., on the strength of its regular-season WAC title. The 23-6 Lobos were a No. 10 seed and faced the 16-11 Virginia Cavaliers, the No. 7 seed. Five minutes into the second half, New Mexico appeared primed to snap its three-game NCAA Tournament victory drought and

advance in the tourney for the first time since 1974. Outplaying the stronger Cavaliers, UNM forged a 41-26 lead five minutes into the second half on the strength of freshman Charles Smith. That's when the 3-pointers stopped falling. After making 6 of its first 15, UNM missed its last 10. The Lobos still led 54-49 with 2:46 remaining. However, in the last two minutes UNM turned it over once and missed its last five shots, including three game-tying 3-pointers in the final 12 seconds. The result was a tough 57-54 loss and an early exit. Smith led UNM with 20 points.

**1996** -- The Lobos' four-game, 22-year victory drought in the NCAA Tournament came to a resounding halt in the East Regional in Rich-

mond, Va. UNM won the WAC Tournament in Albuquerque and took a gaudy 27-4 record and an AP ranking of No. 23 into the tourney. New Mexico was a No. 7 seed and faced 10th-seeded Kansas State in the first round. UNM trailed early but rallied for a 31-30 halftime lead. It was still close at 43-41 when the Lobo defense took over. K-State was held to just one field goal the final 13:34 of the game as UNM closed with a 26-7 run and a convincing 69-48 victory. Sophomore forward Clayton Shields had 25 points and 10 rebounds. KSU shot just 29% (15-52) from the floor.

The Lobos' were rewarded by playing No. 2 seed and fourth-ranked Georgetown in the second round. New Mexico's magic continued in the first half against the Hoyas as it was a 35-32 ball-game in the Lobos' favor at intermission. Georgetown All-America Allen Iverson, the Hoyas' superior strength and foul trouble to UNM freshman center Kenny Thomas crippled the Lobos' chances in the second half. Iverson scored 19 of his 25 points in the final 20 minutes and Thomas picked up two personals in the first three minutes as the lead slipped away. Georgetown prevailed 73-62 to advance to the Sweet Sixteen. Shields led the Lobos again with 19 points. Due to foul trouble, Thomas was limited to only 37 minutes in the two tournament games. UNM finished with a 28-5 ledger, setting a school-record for victories.

**1997** -- The Lobos were sent to the East Region for the second straight year, playing at the Civic Arena in Pittsburgh, Pa. UNM received an at-large berth as a No. 3 seed, the highest for the Lobos since the NCAA began the seeding process in 1979. New Mexico got past No. 14 seed Old Dominion in the first round, 59-55. Kenny Thomas' rebound and two free throws with two seconds remaining sealed the victory. Thomas had 15 points and 8 rebounds while freshman Lamont Long added 14 points and 9 boards.

UNM met No. 6 seed Louisville in the second round and came within a basket of advancing to the Sweet Sixteen for only the second time in school history. Trailing 64-63, the Lobos forced a Louisville turnover with 16 seconds remaining. UNM's set play coming out of the timeout broke down, and point guard David Gibson was forced to take an awkward shot driving to the basket, which missed. It marked the first time in 23 games that UNM led at halftime and lost. It was also the first time in 20 contests that New Mexico fell while holding an opponent to less than 70 points. Thomas, who fouled out with three personals in the second half, his third and fourth in a span of 22 seconds, and his fifth occurring during a Louisville free throw, had just 8 points and 3 rebounds. Senior Charles Smith had 16 points and 7 rebounds in his final game as a Lobo. Long again led UNM in rebounds with 8.

**1998** -- The Lobos took a 23-7 record into their fifth NCAA Tournament in the past six seasons. UNM was sent to the South Region in Lexington, Ky., where it was a No. 4 seed, and faced Butler University in the first round.

UNM won 79-62, however, all did not look good early in the second half. Kenny Thomas, who finished with just three points and five rebounds, was on the bench with three fouls. Senior point guard David Gibson had to leave the game with 18:16 left after suffering a concussion and a broken right middle finger on a drive to the basket. The score was tied at 40-40 when the Lobos went on a 12-0 run to salt the game away. Some unlikely heroes stepped up. Senior post Ben Baum scored a season-high 14 points, making all three of his 3-point attempts, and tied a career-high with six rebounds. Freshman guard Tom Starkey, who had played just 35 minutes in nine games

before the tournament, scored five points and grabbed a career-high seven rebounds in a career-best 13 minutes. Freshman guard Kevin Henry, normally the 2-guard, was forced to the point in the second half when Gibson went out. Henry responded with 14 points, while setting career-highs for FTs made (9), FT attempts (10) and assists (5). Sophomore Lamont Long led UNM with 22 points.

The Lobos advanced to the second round for the third straight season where they met Syracuse. UNM could never crack the Orangemen's 2-3 zone in the 56-46 setback. New Mexico converted just 14 of 55 shots (25.5%) overall and 6 of 25 from 3-point. Thomas had 12 points and 12 rebounds. Long added 11 points and 11 caroms.

**1999** - The Lobos advanced to their fourth straight NCAA Tournament and seventh in the decade of the '90s. That streak was in serious jeopardy earlier in the season. Following a road loss at Hawai'i, the Lobos were 17-6 and had dropped four of five decisions. An upswing ensued, however, as UNM closed the regular season by winning five of its last six. Add an improbable run to the championship game of the WAC Tournament, and UNM locked up its 10th tournament berth.

Advancing as an at-large selection, New Mexico took a 24-8 record in the tournament. Surprisingly, the Lobos were kept in the West Region where they faced Missouri in the first round in Denver. Lamont Long's 8-foot jumper with six seconds left provided the margin in the 61-59 victory. Long paced UNM with 17 points and a season-high 12 rebounds. Senior Kenny Thomas had his finest showing in the NCAA Tournament with 20 points, 10 rebounds and four blocks before fouling out with 1:31 to go. New Mexico joined Cincinnati, Kansas, Kentucky, Purdue, Stanford and Utah as the only schools to win at least one NCAA Tournament game every year since 1996.

UNM fell to eventual national champ Connecticut 78-56, in a second-round matchup. UConn raced to a 17-0 lead and never looked back. The Huskies were ranked third in the polls and came in as the West's No. 1 seed. The Lobos shot a season-low 26.3% (15-57) from the floor and only 19% (4-21) from 3-point. After a stellar performance in the first round, Thomas was held without a field goal for the only time in his 123-game collegiate career. He finished with one point and 11 rebounds. Damion Walker came off the bench to lead the Lobos with 21 points.

**2005** - After a six-year absence, New Mexico returned to the NCAA Tournament for the 11th time in school history off a strong run through the Mountain West Conference Tournament. This was also the first appearance in the NAAs for head coach Ritchie McKay, either as a player, an assistant, or a head coach. Despite posting a 26-7 record, the second most wins in school history, the Lobos were given a No. 12 seed in the Syracuse Regional.

UNM traveled to Nashville where it took on fifth-seeded Villanova. The Wildcats came in with a 22-7 record and were the 22nd-ranked team in the country. The Lobos managed just 11 points on 18% shooting in the first half and trailed by as much as 24, but they made a furious second half comeback attempt. The Lobos pulled to within 52-47 with 29 seconds left, but they couldn't overcome their dismal start, falling to the Wildcats, 55-47. Danny Granger led New Mexico with 15 points and Mark Walters had 14 - all in the second half.

# HEAD COACH STEVE ALFORD



Steve Alford is in his third season as the head coach at the University of New Mexico. He was named UNM's 19th head coach on March 23, 2007, after spending the previous eight seasons as the head coach at the University of Iowa.

Alford, 45, has a 382-207 (65%) career record in 19 seasons as a collegiate head coach. His teams have qualified for postseason play 13 times, produced 16 winning seasons and reached 20 wins on 11 occasions.

In eight seasons at Iowa, Alford compiled a 152-106 record with a school-record seven consecutive winning seasons, and six postseason appearances. The Hawkeyes won two Big Ten Conference tournament titles (2001 and '06). Iowa was 17-14 in 2006-07. It was 9-7 in the Big Ten, tied with NCAA teams Illinois and Purdue for fourth place.

Prior to Iowa, Alford posted a 78-29 record in four seasons (1992-95) at NCAA Division III Manchester (Ind.) College and a four-year (1996-99) record of 78-48 at

Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State). The Bears defeated Wisconsin and Tennessee to advance to the Sweet 16 of the 1999 NCAA Tournament before losing to top-ranked Duke in the regional semifinals. In 1997 Alford led the Bears to a 24-9 record (second in the Missouri Valley Conference) and a trip to the National Invitation Tournament.

The Bears were 16-12 in Alford's first season at the Division I level in 1995-96. In 1997-98 Southwest Missouri won 12 of its final 18 games, posting a final record of 16-16 while advancing to the title game of the MVC postseason tournament for the second straight season. Alford joined the collegiate coaching ranks at Manchester College in 1992, taking over a team that had lost its first eight games. After winning four of 20 games that season, Alford led Manchester to a 20-8 mark in his first full year of 1992-93.

The following season Manchester was 23-4 followed by a 31-1 mark in his fourth and final season. Manchester won three straight conference tournament titles from 1993-95, advancing to the NCAA Division III Tournament all three seasons.

Manchester advanced to the 1995 NCAA Division III championship game before suffering its first defeat in 32 games to place second in the nation. Alford was named Indiana Collegiate Conference coach of the year in 1993, 1994 and 1995 and his record was 74-13 over his final three seasons.

A native of New Castle, Ind., Alford was a prep standout for his father, Sam Alford, at New Castle Chrysler High School. He earned Indiana's Mr. Basketball Award in 1983 after averaging 37.7 points per game as a senior.

During his collegiate career at Indiana, Alford started all but five of 125 games, helping the Hoosiers post a four-year mark of 92-35. Alford served as head coach Bob Knight's team captain in 1987 when Indiana posted a 30-4 overall record and won the national championship.

Alford concluded his college career as Indiana's all-time scoring leader with 2,438 points and he became the first player to win the Indiana MVP award four times. He is also Indiana's career leader in steals and three-point field goal percentage. Alford was a consensus first team all-America selection and the Big Ten MVP as a senior.

Alford earned first team all-Big Ten honors in each of his final three seasons and also earned all-America honors as a junior. He was named to the NIT all-tourney team as a sophomore when the Hoosiers finished second to UCLA. His career free throw percentage of .897 (535-596) ranked fourth best in NCAA history and he led the nation in free throw percentage as a freshman.

Alford was named to the all-tournament team at the 1987 NCAA Final Four and to the NCAA tournament all-decade team for the 1980s. He set an NCAA Final Four record when he made 7 of 10 3-point baskets in the 1987 championship game victory over Syracuse. In 1997, Alford was inducted into the Indiana University Athletics Hall of Fame and in 2001 he was one of 15 players selected to Indiana's all-Century team. He was one of five players named to ESPN's Big Ten Conference Silver Anniversary team in 2004. The Sporting News recently published Legends of College Basketball, a publication that recalled the careers of the 100 greatest Division I college basketball players. Alford was No. 35 on the list.

Following his freshman season at Indiana, Alford was selected to play for the United States basketball team at the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. Alford shot 64.4% percent from the field, averaged 10.3 points per game and was second on the team in assists as the U.S. collegians won the gold medal.

Alford was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2009. If you are wondering what took so long for Alford's induction, there is a 26-year waiting period after high school graduation so he was a first ballot selection. In fact, Alford was just the eighth honoree to be selected in his first year of eligibility. Joining Alford in the 2009 class were NBA coaches Gregg Popovich (Merrillville) and Scott Skiles (Plymouth).

Alford was born Nov. 23, 1964, in Franklin, Ind. He holds a bachelor's degree in business from Indiana University. Alford is married to the former Tanya Frost, whom he has known since the two were schoolmates in grade school in New Castle. The Alford's have three children: Kory, Bryce and Kayla.

- In his third season at Iowa in 2002, Alford guided Iowa back to the Big Ten Tournament title game...Iowa set a Big Ten Tournament record with seven straight wins during the 2001 and 2002 events
- In 2006, Alford led Iowa to its second Big Ten Conference tournament championship with three straight wins over Minnesota, Michigan State and Ohio State

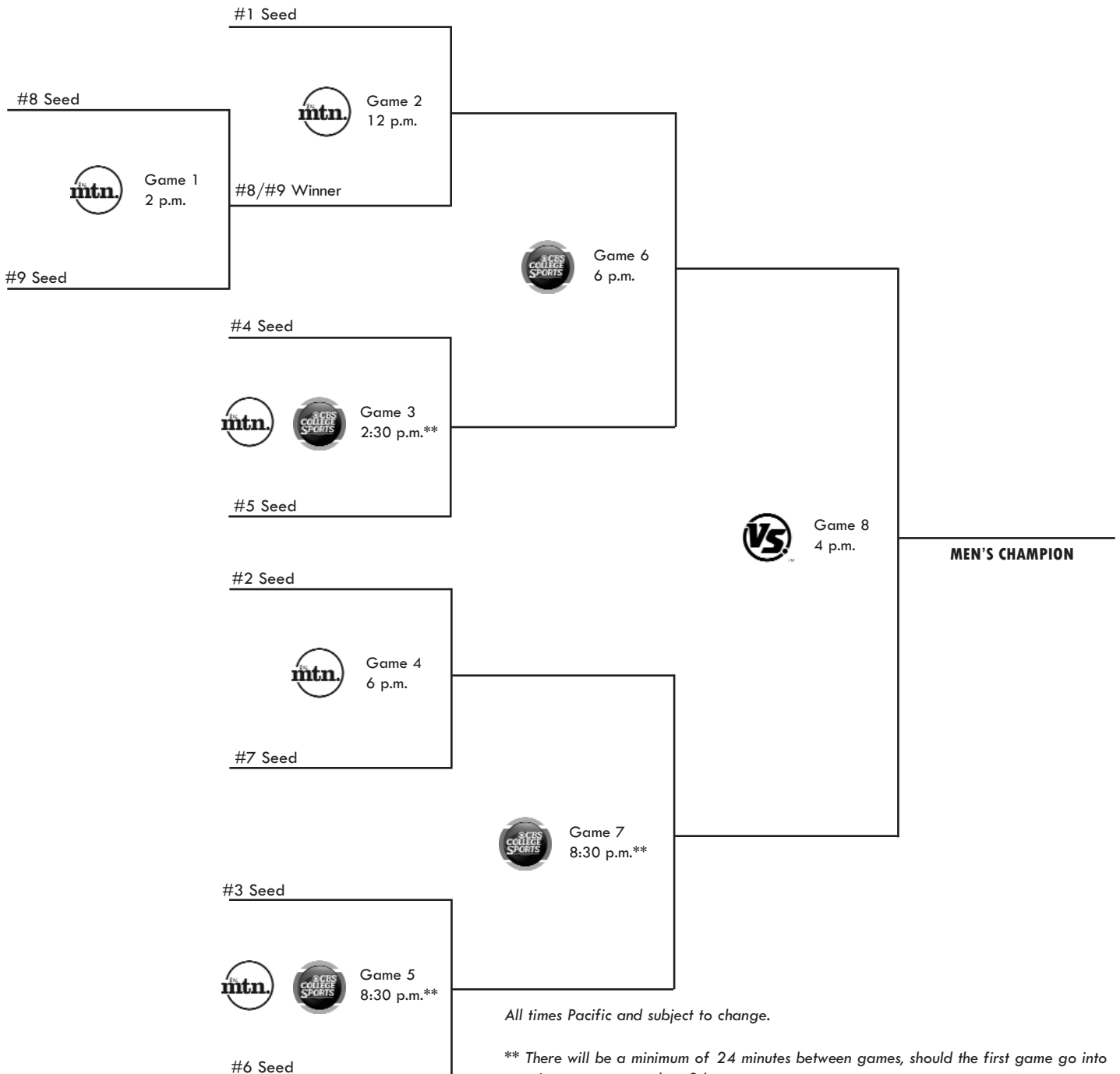
