



2005 LOBO REVIEW

- The following was written by Alfredo V. Moreno, UNM assistant director for media relations:
- The University of New Mexico football program continued its historic run in 2005. Under eighth-year head coach Rocky Long, New Mexico solidified itself as one of the most consistent winners in the Mountain West Conference and the program maintained its unprecedented level of success.
- UNM went 6-5 in the regular season, notching its third-straight winning season and for the first time in program history, the fifth consecutive season with at least six wins. New Mexico's 14 fifth-year seniors never experienced a losing season in their college careers and led the Lobos to 34 wins since 2001, tying for the most ever in a five-year span at UNM. The Lobos also won 19 MWC games over the past five seasons, the second-highest total in the league.
- There were several banner victories this fall. The season-opening win over UNLV (24-22) gave the New Mexico a school-record sixth-straight conference victory and the following week's 45-35 upset at Missouri made Long the program's winningest coach. It was also the Lobos' first win on the road against a Big 12 opponent since 1983. UNM also beat Wyoming (27-24) for the sixth straight time, including three in a row in Laramie, and won its fifth straight game at San Diego State (47-24). New Mexico closed the road schedule with a come-from-behind 31-27 win at Utah, giving it consecutive wins in Salt Lake City for the first time.
- A record average crowd of 38,341 per game filled University Stadium to 99 percent capacity during the season, including a school and state record throng of 44,760 that cheered New Mexico to its third-straight victory over rival New Mexico State (38-21) on Sept. 17. A school record 17,404 season tickets were sold in 2005, marking the third consecutive year UNM has established a new standard for season tickets. Lobo fans reveled in the opportunity to watch some of the best players ever to don the cherry and silver in 2005. Senior DonTrell Moore made a remarkable return from ACL surgery on Feb. 3, setting the UNM career rushing record against NMSU and later becoming just the sixth player in NCAA history to rush for 1,000 yards four times in a career against Colorado State. Moore led the MWC with a career-best 118 rushing yards per game and scored a league-best 17 touchdowns.
- Meanwhile, senior Hank Baskett III caught 67 passes for 1,071 yards, giving the Lobos a 1,000-yard rusher and receiver for the first time in school history. Baskett recorded five 100-yard games on the year and led the Lobos upset at Missouri with a scintillating 10-catch, 209-yard and three-touchdown performance.
- Senior center Ryan Cook and senior tackle Terrance Pennington averaged career-best 10.5 and 6.5 knockdown blocks per game, respectively, helping The Hitmen pave the way for the No. 2 rushing attack in the MWC, while allowing just 19 sacks on the year.
- Defensively, senior linebacker Mike Mohoric led the team with a career-high 85 tackles, including a MWC season-high 20 stops in his final home game against Air Force. Fellow senior Gabriel Fulbright notched a team-high five interceptions from his cornerback position, matching the conference record with 14 in his career. Fulbright was the early season hero for the Lobos, securing victories against UNLV and Missouri with late game interceptions. Meanwhile, seventh-year senior Evroy Thompson enjoyed a career-year at defensive end with 9.5 tackles for loss, including 5.0 sacks, and a 28-yard fumble return for a touchdown at Missouri. Senior nose tackle Marcus Parker battled through a broken hand to record 8.0 tackles in the backfield and move into 10th all-time at UNM with 35 in his career.

LONG GETS SCHOOL RECORD FOR CAREER VICTORIES

- Rocky Long became UNM's winningest head coach on Sept. 10 when the Lobos grabbed a 45-35 decision at Missouri. It was Long's 42nd victory, pushing him past Roy Johnson, who was 41-32-6 from 1920-30.

POSTSEASON HONORS

- The University of New Mexico had a league best seven first team all-MWC selections in 2005, including senior tailback DonTrell Moore who was also named MWC Offensive Player of the Year. The seven first team honorees matches the most in program history, which was also accomplished in 2003.
- Moore, wide receiver Hank Baskett III, center Ryan Cook and offensive guard Robert Turner were voted first team all-MWC on offense, while cornerback Gabriel Fulbright, linebacker Mike Mohoric and defensive end Evroy Thompson were named to the first team defense. Linebacker Cody Kase was an honorable mention selection.

NOTES ON THE DECORATED

- Moore and Ryan Cook were two of the three repeat first-team all-MWC selections in 2005. Cook is the first Lobo center ever to earn first team all-conference honors three times in a career.
- Seniors Hank Baskett III, Gabriel Fulbright, Mike Mohoric, Evroy Thompson and junior Robert Turner each earned first team honors for the first time in their careers. Fulbright was a second team selection the last two years, while Baskett and Turner were honorable mention picks in 2004. Mohoric and Thompson were honored by the league for the first time.
- UNM has had at least two first team all-MWC offensive linemen each of the last three years - a first for the league. New Mexico offensive linemen have earned first team honors seven times, tying Colorado State for the most in MWC history. All seven awards have come since 2003.
- Baskett is the first Lobo WR to earn first team all-conference honors since Pascal Volz in 1997 (WAC). Baskett, Volz, Terance Mathis (1986-87, '89), Ricky Martin (1978), Preston Dennard (1974 & '76) and Ace Hendricks (1968) are the only UNM receivers to be named first team all-conference.
- Mohoric is the fourth UNM linebacker to earn first team all-MWC honors in the past five years. Gary Davis (2001), Charles Moss (2002) and Nick Speegle (2004) were the other three.
- The four first team selections on offense and three first team selections on defense match the most in school history. UNM also had four first team honorees on offense in 1934, '62, '71, '76 and 2003. Three defensive players also earned a spot on the first team defense in 1982, '83, '93 and 2004.

FIRST TIME FOR 1,000 RUSHING AND 1,000 RECEIVING

- The 2005 season marked the first time that the University of New Mexico produced a 1,000-yard rusher and a 1,000-yard receiver in the same season.
- Senior TB DonTrell Moore rambled for 1,298 yards, claiming the MWC rushing title for the second time in his career.
- Senior WR Hank Baskett caught 67 passes for 1,071 yards and 9 TDs, one of the most productive seasons ever by a Lobo receiver.

MOORE NAMED OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- Senior TB DonTrell Moore became New Mexico's first Mountain West Offensive Player of the Year. The last Lobo to garner conference offensive player of the year honors was Graham Leigh in 1997.
- The third running back since the inception of the MWC to be named Offensive Player of the Year (1999-Kevin McDougal, Colorado State/2001-Luke Staley, BYU).
- Moore is the second New Mexico running back (Mike Williams was co-MVP of the WAC in 1978) and sixth Lobo ever to receive conference Offensive Player of the Year honors. Quarterbacks Stan Quintana (1964), Rocky Long (1971), Stoney Case (1994) and Leigh were the other four.
- First player in UNM and Mountain West Conference history named first team all-conference four times.
- Unanimous first team pick three times and the only unanimous selection on offense, defense or special teams in 2005.
- Moore (2002 MWC Freshman of the Year) and former BYU running back Luke Staley are the only players ever to be named the MWC's top freshman and Offensive Player of the Year in their career. Staley was the voted the 1999 MWC Freshman of the Year and top offensive player in 2001.



ANOTHER RECORD FOR SEASON TICKETS, AVERAGE ATTENDANCE

- A school-record 17,404 season tickets were sold in 2005, marking the third consecutive year UNM has established a new standard for season tickets. To put that number in perspective, the Lobos averaged just 15,822 fans per game in 1991. A total of 15,729 season tickets were purchased in 2004.
- UNM averaged 38,341 fans to a University Stadium facility that seats 38,634, or 99.2% of capacity.
- A school and state-record crowd of 44,760 packed the stadium for the New Mexico State game on Sept. 17. That number was possible because UNM sells standing-room-only tickets and spots on the grass hill in the southeast corner of the stadium

GOOD REPRESENTATION IN POSTSEASON BOWL GAMES

- Six Lobo seniors competed in postseason all-star games, including Ryan Cook and Hank Baskett in the 2006 Senior Bowl. They were the 11th and 12th Lobos to play in the game since Stan Quintana was first chosen in 1966, however, it was the first time that UNM sent more than one player to the highly-regarded postseason game.

Additionally, Baskett, Cook, Moore and Pennington were all invited to the NFL Combine.

AIR FORCE RECAP

- Shaun Carney threw over New Mexico's defense and fullback Jacobe Kendrick ran through it as Air Force snapped a three-game losing streak with a 42-24 win over New Mexico. The 230-pound Kendrick scored on runs of 2 and 10 yards and Carney picked apart the Lobos' secondary for 186 yards and a touchdown as the Falcons dealt a big blow to New Mexico's bowl hopes. The loss was the third for New Mexico at home in MWC games this season.
- Carney also scored in the fourth quarter on a 1-yard run. Carney ran for 94 yards and Kendrick had 89 as the Falcons had 278 yards on the ground and 464 total. New Mexico lost starting quarterback Chris Nelson in the third quarter with a shoulder injury and had to go with third stringer Bryan Clappitt the rest of the game.
- Halfback DonTrell Moore, who rushed for 143 yards - his 26th career 100-yard game - scored on an 11-yard TD run that got New Mexico within 21-16 with 6:34 left in the third quarter. But the Lobos had no other offensive threat and could not slow down Air Force's option.
- Nelson was hurt in the drive that led to Moore's score. He was hit hard while scrambling for a first down on a fourth-and-2 to the Falcons' 33-yard line. Nelson had started in place of Kole McKamey, the starter most of the season who has been out the last two weeks with a bad back. McKamey started the game in street clothes, but went into the locker room and suited up after Nelson went out. McKamey didn't get into the game.
- Air Force, which had lost seven of its last eight games, sealed the win on Kendrick's 10-yard TD with 9:54 left in the game. That came

after the Falcons' defense held New Mexico on fourth-and-1 at the Air Force 28.

- Air Force took a 10-0 lead on a career best 49-yard field goal by Scott Eberle and a 46-yard screen pass from Carney to Kirkwood. The touchdown was set up by Brad Meissen's interception of a Nelson pass that bounced off Lobo receiver Hank Baskett and into the hands of Falcon safety Brad Meissen.
- Meissen returned the interception 10 yards to the New Mexico 45 and one play later Kirkwood took the screen pass and went in untouched. It was the 14th touchdown pass by the Falcons this season, a school record since the AFA started running the option in 1980.
- New Mexico tied it at 10-10 in the second quarter on a 15-yard TD run by Marcus Smith and a 40-yard field goal by Kenny Byrd.
- The Falcons then mounted an 80-yard, 11-play drive that took just 2:13 and ended with Kendrick's first touchdown with 18 seconds left in the first half.

AIR FORCE POSTGAME NOTES

- The Lobos lost to Air Force at home for first time since 1995
- The Lobos have lost 3 straight home games for the first time since a four-game slide in 1998
- UNM finished with a losing record at University Stadium (2-3) for the first time since 1998 (2-4)
- New Mexico suffered 4 MWC losses for the first time since 2000 when it went 3-4
- The Lobos had won 6 straight games in the month of November...the last loss was 37-35 at home to UNLV in 2003
- New Mexico set an average attendance record for the third straight season, averaging 38,341 fans in 5 games in 2005
- The Lobos were outscored 66-8 in the 4th quarter of its last four home games, and 79-15 in the final period of all homes games in 2005
- DonTrell Moore rushed for 143 yards on 28 carries with 1 TD and a 2-point conversion...it was his 7th 100-yard rushing game of the season and the 26th of his career
- Moore finished his career 13th all-time in NCAA rushing with 4,973 career yards...he is tied with Tony Dorsett for 11th place all-time with 356 career points (for non-kickers) and he moved into 25th place all-time with 5,947 all-purpose yards
- Senior LB Mike Mohoric had a career-high 20 tackles
- Junior QB Chris Nelson suffered a broken right collarbone in the 3rd quarter...Nelson was making his second career start for an injured Kole McKamey (back)
- Sophomore QB Bryan Clappitt, the former walk-on made his first career appearance in place of Nelson...Clappitt had made two appearances this season as the PAT/FG holder

HISTORIC WIN AT UTAH

- Trailing 27-19 at halftime at Utah on Nov. 12, the Lobos rallied to win 31-27, thus taking consecutive wins over the Utes in Salt Lake City for the first time
- UNM had been out-scored 37-3 in the second half of MWC home losses to BYU and Colorado State, but held the Utes scoreless after halftime while scoring 12 points and rallying for the 31-27 victory...the last time the Lobos pitched a shutout in the second half was the 2003 regular-season finale at Wyoming, a game UNM won 26-3
- The Lobos tied a school record with 9 sacks for 62 yards in losses, and eight of those came in the decisive second half...Utah had not allowed a sack the previous two games...UNM also had nine dumps against BYU (1980), UTEP (2001) and Wyoming (2002)...eight different Lobos combined on the nine sacks
- The UNM defense found the end zone twice, a 31-yard interception return by LB Quincy Black and a decisive 2-yard fumble return by

- The last time New Mexico's defense registered two TDs in a game was in a 30-29 victory at Wyoming in 2001 when Stephen Persley and David Crockett returned interceptions for scores
- After the Utes gained 300 yards of offense - including 264 yards passing and four TDs - and nearly 10 yards a play in the first half, UNM limited the home team to 141 yards on 42 plays in the second half (3.3-yard average)

- Rallying to win in the fourth quarter doesn't happen very often...since 2003, UNM had been 1-11 when trailing after three quarters...the lone win came against Texas Tech in 2004 when the Lobos were down 24-21, but won 27-24...New Mexico is now 7-36 in this situation under Rocky Long

BASKETT CATCHES AND CATCHES

- Ignited by an All-America performance at Missouri that netted Hank Baskett MWC Offensive Player of the Week honors and a lot of national attention, the senior had one of the best seasons in school history for a Lobo receiver:

- ✓ Tied a school record with 3 TD receptions at Missouri
- ✓ 10 catches for 209 yards at Missouri to become just the 3rd Lobo to surpass 200 receiving yards in a game...the 209 yards are tied for the 6th-most in an NCAA Div. I-A game in 2005
- ✓ "Baskett, we didn't think that he was that great," Missouri defensive end Xzavie Jackson said after the game. "That's a great player."
- ✓ 67 receptions, 1,071 yards (16.0 ypc) and 9 TDs in 2005...in the UNM season record book, Baskett finished tied for 4th in TD catches and 6th in receptions and yards
- ✓ Baskett finished 3rd in the MWC and 14th in the nation in receiving yards per game (97.4) and 5th in the MWC and 30th in receptions per game (6.1)
- ✓ a career-high 11 catches for 141 yards against BYU
- ✓ 17 career receiving TDs ranks 2nd all-time at New Mexico...3rd at UNM with 2,288 career yards and 5th with 140 receptions
- ✓ Had 36% of UNM's receptions on the season (67 of 187) and 49% of the yards (1,071 of 2,171)

OFFENSIVE NUMBERS IMPROVE

- The Lobo offense had a much better season compared to last year. Scoring was up more than 10 points a game, while total offense increased by nearly 100 yards a game, most all of that coming from the passing game.

- There was a lot of balance in the attack as UNM averaged 200 yards rushing and 197.4 yards passing. Averages of more than 200 yards running and throwing for an entire season have happened just three times: 1986 (200.3 rush and 238.8 pass), 1994 (210.6 rush/261 pass) and 1995 (216 rush/202 pass).
- The total offense average of 397.4 yards came close to being the most productive for a Rocky Long-coached Lobo team. The best is 400.5 in 2003.

McKAMEY LED THE WAY ON OFFENSE

- Prior to the injury that sidelined him for the Utah game, junior **QB Kole McKamey** was leading the offensive resurgence. A look at McKamey's season stats from the past two seasons:

- McKamey is 12-8 in his career as the Lobos' starting quarterback
- His 62.3 completion percentage ranks 1st for a single season at UNM
- He has averaged 65.3 yards on the ground in his last 11 games, including 100+ yards versus Wyoming (152), Navy (138), New Mexico State (152) and BYU (102)
- Against New Mexico State, McKamey became the first Lobo to record at least 150 yards rushing and 150 yards passing in a game. He finished with 152 yards on 14 carries, tying a career-high set against Wyoming on Nov. 20, 2004.
- McKamey is the only player in New Mexico history to surpass 100 yards rushing and 100 yards passing in a game three times.

TURNOVERS TELL THE STORY

- You can pile up all the offensive numbers you want, but the telling stat remains turnovers. The Lobos found that out all too well in the Oct. 1 loss at TCU when UNM turned it over six times, resulting in 28 Horned Frog points in a 49-28 loss, and the 35-25 loss to Colorado State. The Lobos committed four miscues in the second half against the Rams, leading to 17 points.
- Five errors (three interceptions and two fumble) came in the redzone. UNM only did that one time in 2004 and committed that egregious mistake just five times from 2002-04.
- The Lobos' TO margin in six wins was +10 (7 giveaways to 17 takeaways) while in the five losses it was -11 (14 giveaways to 3 takeaways)
- UNM's turnover margin was -0.09 (20 takeaways to 21 giveaways), ending a string of six consecutive seasons where it was no worse than break-even
- The Lobos finished 2004 2nd in the MWC and tied for 13th nationally with a turnover margin of +0.75 (28 takeaways to 19 giveaways in 12 games). That's UNM's best margin since +0.91 (12 giveaways to 22 takeaways) in 1996.

- In 2003-04, the Lobos were definitely the opportunists when it came

to taking advantage of the other team's mistakes. UNM scored 154 points (17 TDs, 11 FGs, 1 safety) after turnovers while opponents scored only 74 points following UNM errors.

SIMPLE FORMULA: FEWER TURNOVERS MEANS MORE WINS

- Since Rocky Long started at New Mexico, the Lobos have a 14-1 record when they do not turn the ball over. The only loss came in the 1999 season opener, a 13-10 setback at UTEP. UNM has won 13 straight since.
- The Lobos are 36-9 under Long when committing fewer turnovers than the opponent - 18-1 since 2003 - but 5-33 when UNM has more giveaways.

MORE OFFENSE NOTES

- Under Rocky Long, the Lobos are 25-7 when rushing for 200 yards or more and 22-5 when exceeding 225...the losses came against Colorado State (254 yards) in 1999, Utah State (263) in 2002, Texas Tech (235) in 2003, and BYU (244) and Air Force (227) in 2005
- UNM had 17 points in the fourth quarter at Missouri, the most in the final period since scoring 21 in a 42-28 loss at Texas Tech in 2003
- The Lobos marched on one of the longest scoring drives in school history en route to their second TD vs. New Mexico State...the 19-play, 91-yard odyssey ran 9:30 off the clock...the plays and time of possession are the longest in head coach Rocky Long's tenure...the drive was possible after a roughing the punter penalty against NMSU
- The Lobos led the MWC in time of possession, averaging 32:40 out of a possible 60 minutes.

FULBRIGHT TO THE RESCUE

- Senior **CB Gabriel Fulbright** was a one-man drive stopper as he tied for the MWC lead with 5 interceptions. Surprisingly, the picks all came in the first three games of the season. He finished tied for 3rd all-time at UNM with 14 career thefts. A look at Fulbright's big interceptions in 2005:

UNLV (1): It came with 1:20 left in the game and UNM clinging to a 24-22 lead. The Rebels had just scored and recovered an onside kick. Fulbright snared the errant throw at the Lobo 35. New Mexico was able to run out the clock for the win.

at Missouri (2): His first pick came in the first quarter at the Mizzou 46. His second was a game-saver again. The Lobos had just taken a 38-35 lead on a 40-yard Kenny Byrd FG with 4:22 left. In zone coverage just like UNLV, Fulbright intercepted with 3:15 remaining in the game. Four plays later, the Lobos iced it on a 9-yard TD pass from Kole McKamey to Hank Baskett.

New Mexico State (2): Both interceptions led to points. His first came late in the first half. UNM had just punted following an 80-yard NMSU bomb that trimmed the Lobo lead to 21-7. Fulbright's 18-yard return led to a 36-yard Byrd FG with 1 second left before halftime. On the Aggies' first pass attempt of the second half, Fulbright returned it 36 yards to the NMSU 18. Three plays later, DonTrell Moore scored from 3 yards out and a 31-7 Lobo advantage.

DEFENSE NOTES

- Senior DE Evroy Thompson's 28-yard scoop and score at Missouri was the Lobos' third fumble return for a touchdown in a span of 12 games...in 2004, Josh Bazinet returned a fumble 70 yards at Oregon State and Gabriel Fulbright returned Utah QB Alex Smith's dropped ball for a 68-yard score...Thompson added 8 tackles, 2 tackles for loss, a sack and 2 QB hurries as he earned MWC Defensive Player of the Week honors for the second time in his career

- UNM recovered just 5 fumbles, the lowest season total since stats became official in 1946...the previous low was 10 on several occasions
- New Mexico finished 2nd in the MWC in sacks in 2005 with 36...TCU was first with 41...that ended a five-year run where the Lobos led the MWC in sacks
- The Lobos have finished no worse than 2nd in the MWC in rushing defense since 2000...they were 2nd in 2005 at 130.8 yards a game
- Since the start of the 2001 season - a span of 61 games - opponents have been held to less than 100 yards rushing 31 times...only 9 times in the past 68 games has an opponent reached 200 yards on the ground: Missouri (242), TCU (272) and Air Force (278) in 2005, Utah (278), Air Force (239) and Navy (269) in 2004, Air Force (261) and New Mexico State (262) in 2002 and Utah (255) in 2001

INSTANT REPLAY MAKES DEBUT IN MWC

- The instant replay system was utilized for all MWC intra-conference contests. Visiting institutions for non-conference, crossover games have the option of using replay under the home team/conference's plan.
- The two main principles are: A standard of indisputable video evidence for any on-field call to be changed; and a review must have a direct, competitive effect on the game, such as a change of possession, scoring play, etc.
- The MWC's plan is based primarily on the experiment conducted last season by the Big Ten and is not an "NFL-style" approach. The determinations whether to interrupt play and either confirm or overturn a call on the field will be made by the Replay Official. He will be aided by an Assistant Replay Official and a Video Technician. A unique element of the MWC system is the inclusion of a coaches challenge. The MWC was the only I-A conference to experiment with that component in 2005.
- For televised contests, a feed from the production truck was utilized as the video source for the replay system. In-house stadium video was utilized for games that were not televised.

BLOCK PARTY

- The Lobos have blocked 16 punts since the start of the 2000 season. Seven have been returned for scores. The Lobos established a school record with five blocks in 2000. The alterations:
