The University of New Mexico football team bravely weathered a turbulent 2011, finishing with a 1-11 record to match its 2009 and 2010 performances. The Lobos had more coaching changes during the season (two) than they did wins. Bob Davie's hiring as New Mexico's 31st head coach Nov. 17 gives the team hope for a brighter future.

New Mexico finished in a three-way tie for sixth place with a 1-6 record in the Mountain West. The Lobos beat UNLV 21-14 and lost to Colorado State 14-10 for a combined plus-3 margin in points against the other sixth-place teams. The Rebels defeated CSU 38-35, leaving the Rams plus-1 in the two head-to-head battles. UNLV was minus-4. So if points are the deciding factor of who would be sixth among the trio (which, officially, it is not), you do the math.

Each of the three seasons under former coach Mike Locksley have been strikingly familiar. UNM came away with a home win in conference in November to avoid a win-less season in all three. In 2009 and 2011, the Lobos played two other games in which the outcomes were decided by five points or less, while New Mexico lost one game decided by two points in 2010. Statistically, the Lobos improved in the second halves of each of the seasons.

Turnovers and third-down defense again were key to UNM's struggles. The Lobos finished minus-8 in turnover ratio (13 takeaways and 21 giveaways) in 2011, and they allowed opponents to convert on 57 percent of their third-down attempts. Last season, the Lobos were minus-12 in turnover ratio (19 turnovers forced, 31 committed) and allowed foes to convert on 47 percent of their third-down plays. In 2009, UNM committed 26 turnovers and caused 20 for a minus-six ratio. It allowed other teams to convert 48 percent on third down.

While the Lobos were outscored in each quarter during the 2011 seasons, they were slowest coming out of the locker room. Foes combined to outpoint UNM 160-24 in the first quarter and 87-7 in the third quarter.

However, New Mexico did have Mountain West statistical leaders in WR Ty Kirk (5.22 receptions per game), WR Deon Long (80.9 receiving yards per game) and MLB Carmen Messina (11.8 tackles per game).

New Mexico 2011 Season Timeline



Feb. 2 — The Lobos signed 21 during 2011 recruiting signing period. Thirteen played a significant role for the Lobos during the season.

JC transfer CB Destry Berry, left, played in all 12 games for UNM, starting eight.

March 22 — UNM began spring drills, lasting through April 16 that culminated with the Cherry-Silver scrimmage.

July 26 — Lobo tight end Lucas Reed and kicker James Aho were named to the preseason All-Mountain West team during the conference's media day in Las Vegas, Nev. Reed and middle linebacker Carmen Messina were the UNM representatives at the event, along with coach Mike Locksley. The Lobos were picked to finish last in the preseason media poll.

Aug. 4 — UNM opened fall camp.

Aug. 7 — The Lobos moved their camp to Ruidoso and stayed there through Aug. 19.

Aug. 13 — Defense dominated the first scrimmage of camp that took place in Ruidoso, limiting the offense to 351 yards during 96 plays. The offense committed five turnovers (two interceptions and three fumbles), and the defense recorded seven sacks.



RB Demarcus Rogers (4), was stopped dead in his tracks by wolf safety Bubba Forrest during the scrimmage. Forrest finished with three tackles.

Aug. 20 — The Lobo offense battled the defense to an even scrimmage in a rematch at University Stadium.

Aug. 26 — Sophomore Tarean Austin was named starting quarterback for the season-opener against Colorado State.

Sept. 3 — UNM opened the season with a 14-10 loss to Colorado State.

Austin accounted for 283 yards of total offense in the loss, including 104 rushing yards - he was sacked nine times for 47 yards which left him officially with 57 rushing yards.

Sept. 17 — Texas Tech beat the Lobos 59-13, but WR Deon Long finished with 139 receiving yards (on three catches) and 258 all-purpose yards. That latter amount is the eighth best performance in school history.

Sept. 24 — Long, right, set UNM and Mountain West single-game records for all purpose yards with 378 during the Lobos' 48-45 overtime loss to Sam Houston State.



Long finished with 209 receiving yards and three TDs to earn MW Offensive Player of the Week honors. He added a 98-yard kickoff return for a TD.

QB B.R. Holbrook entered the game late in the third quarter and threw for 289 yards.

Sept. 25 — UNM fired Locksley, who compiled a 2-26 record in two-plus seasons. Defensive coordinator George Barlow became interim head coach.

Sept. 28 — Barlow promoted linebackers coach Toby Neinas to defensive coordinator for the rest of the season.

Nov. 12 — The Lobos defeated UNLV 21-14 to give Barlow his first victory as a head coach. Messina finished with 15 tackles and forced a fourth-quarter fumble to set up Holbrook for the game-winning drive. Messina earned MW Defensive Player of the Week honors.



Nov. 17 — The University of New Mexico named former Notre Dame coach and ABC/ESPN television analyst Bob Davie as its 31st head coach.

Dec. 3 — Messina collected a career-high 21 tackles to become the all-time Mountain West leader in stops with 454 during UNM's 45-0 loss to Boise State.

Dec 6. — Messina earned first-team All-Mountain West honors, his second first-team award in three years. Long was named to the second team, and Forrest collected honorable mention honors.

THE FINAL GUN

The Lobos extended their road losing streak to 22 games with a loss during their regular-season finale at Boise State. UNM has not won a road game since defeating New Mexico State 35-24 on Sept. 27, 2008. New Mexico hasn't defeated an opponent outside New Mexico since a 20-17 triumph at San Diego State on Oct. 20, 2007.

WHAT ABOUT BOB?

The University of New Mexico announced the hiring of Bob Davie as head coach on Nov. 17. Davie served as an analyst for ABC and ESPN since 2002. Prior to his television career, Davie compiled a 35-25 record as head coach at Notre Dame from 1997-2001. He led the Irish to three bowl games, including their first BCS game in 2001. Davie will not be involved in the game-planning for Saturday's contest.

The Lobos had been searching for a replacement for Mike Locksley, who was relieved of his duties Sept. 25. Paul Krebs, UNM Vice President for Athletics, announced that George Barlow, associate head coach and defensive coordinator, would serve as the interim head coach for the remainder of the season. Locksley finished his Lobo career with a 2-26 record. Barlow was acting head coach against UNLV in 2009 when Locksley served a one-game suspension.

UNM's 34-17 loss to the Rebels that game still went on Locksley's official record. Locksley failed to win a road game in his 28 tries as Lobo coach.

Barlow finished with a 1-7 record, leading UNM past UNLV 21-14 on Nov. 12.

BY THE NUMBERS

The Lobo offense started the season as a potent unit, averaging 383.8 yards through the first five games of the season, which was on pace to be the unit's highest output since 2005. UNM, however, mustered just 233.6 yards per game over its final seven outings to finish at 296.2 per game for the entire year.

The Lobo defense had a reversal of fortune. In its first seven games, New Mexico was giving up 532.0 yards per game, which was on pace to be the most in school history. The Lobos, however, improved over the last five games, allowing 436.2, to finish with an allowance of 492.1 yards per contest. UNM held two foes — Air Force (26) and UNLV (61) to fewer than 100 yards passing this season.

UNM was the least productive team in the nation on third down. The Lobos were 111th among 120 Football Bowl Subdivision teams on offense in third-down conversions with a 30.6 percent success rate (53 of 173). On defense, they were last, 120th, in third-down defense, allowing foes to convert 57.2 percent (87 of 152).

2011 NOTABLES

- The Lobos averaged 12.0 points per game, which was their lowest average since the 1968 team also scored just 12.0 points per game.
 - The 500 points allowed on defense marked the second consecutive season and the third time in history that UNM allowed 500 or more. The Lobos allowed 532 in 2010 and 518 in 1988.
 - UNM intercepted three passes in 2011, setting the school record for fewest passes picked off in a season. The old record was four, set last season.
 - Opponent's 72.6 passing completion percentage against UNM is an all-time high.
 - UNM failed to produce a 100-yard rusher for the second straight season, and its streak without one stands at 25 games. The last time a ball-carrier rushed for more than 100 yards was Demond Dennis' 133 yards in the Lobos' 29-27 win over Colorado State on Nov. 21, 2009.
 - New Mexico did not have a QB throw for 300 yards in 2011, and that streak without a 300-yard QB is up to 22 games. B.R. Holbrook threw for 323 yards against Texas Tech on Sept. 11, 2010. UNM did have more than 300 yards passing as a team against Sam Houston State (Sept. 24) this year, garnering 434 yards through the air.
 - The Lobos' 53 pass attempts against Sam Houston State were the most by a Mountain West team this season.
 - Linebacker Carmen Messina averaged 13.7 tackles in conference games only to lead the Mountain West. Fellow LB Dallas Bollema was 10th with an average of 7.3 tackles in conference games.
 - Messina was third in the league in tackles for loss, averaging 1.29 per game.
 - Messina's 21 tackles in the season finale at Boise State (Dec. 3) were the second most in the conference this season and tied for the seventh best total in the nation.
 - His 14 solo tackles at San Diego State (Nov. 5) tied for fourth nationally this year.
 - Senior James Aho was one of only two Mountain West kicker to convert all his extra-point attempts.
 - New Mexico had the Mountain West leader in receptions per game — Ty Kirk at 5.22 per game — as well as receiving yards per game — Deon Long at 80.9 yards per game.
 - Long's 378 all-purpose yards against Sam Houston State were the second most in the FBS this season.
 - His four TDs that game (three receiving, one kickoff return) tied for the most by a Mountain West player this season. The three TD catches tied for the most in the league this season.
- Long's 209 receiving yards against SHSU were the most in the MW, and he had the 17th best receiving day in the nation this season.
- Long's 80-yard TD receptions against UNLV (Nov. 12) tied for the longest in the Mountain West.
 - Long's 49.5 yards per catch vs. UNLV (two receptions for 99 yards) was the highest average by a WR in the league who had at least two receptions in a game. His 46.3 yards-per-catch average against Texas Tech was the second highest average (three receptions for 139 yards).
 - Long had a 98-yard kickoff return for a TD against the Bearkats, which was the second longest return in the conference this season.
 - Kirk's 13 receptions against Sam Houston State tied for the most in the MW and tied for 13th nationally.
 - Quarterback B.R. Holbrook's 80-yard pass to Long tied for the longest in the league in 2011.
 - QB Tarean Austin had 56 offensive plays in the season opener against Colorado State to tie for the most in the Mountain West this year (25 rushing, 31 passing).

TOP OF THE MOUNTAIN

Lobo senior linebacker Carmen Messina ended his collegiate career with a flourish. The Addison, Ill., native recorded a career-high 21 tackles in the season finale against nationally ranked Boise State. That pushed his career total to 454, which established an all-time tackles record in the Mountain West. He came into the game tied with UNLV's Adam Seward (2001-04). Messina earned first-team All-MW honors in 2011, marking his second such honor in three years.

Messina was the Mountain West leader in 2011 with 142 tackles on the season. He finished the regular season tied for sixth place, nationally. Messina earned co-Defensive Player of the Week honors for his performance in UNM's 21-14 win over UNLV. He had 14 tackles, including one for loss, and he stripped Rebel QB Taylor Barnhill of the football with 2:35 left in a 14-14 game. Teammate Jaymar Latchison recovered to set up the Lobos' game-winning drive.

Messina had 76 tackles in his last five games and had double-digit tackles in seven straight and nine of his last 10 games. Messina totaled 27 games with double-digit tackles during his Lobo career.

Messina finished in third place on UNM's all-time tackles list, surpassing boyhood idol Brian Urlacher (442 career tackles). Messina came to UNM in part because it was Urlacher's alma mater. Messina currently ranks third among active leaders in career tackles in the Football Bowl Subdivision.

Interim head coach George Barlow said of Messina after the Oct. 29 Air Force game, "Carmen is the man; he is a ballplayer and the leader of this team. Every Saturday, he's going to give you what he's got. ... I'm happy to have him — love having him on the team — and he's the guy that I keep using as an example on this team."

OFFENSIVE NOTES

FIRST AND LONG

Lobo freshman transfer Deon Long finished the regular season as the leading wide receiver in yards per game in the Mountain West. Long averaged 80.9 yards per game to rank 41st nationally as well. Long tied with teammate Ty Kirk for the team lead in receptions with 47 and became the first Lobo freshman to lead the team in receptions since former All-America and NFL veteran Terance Mathis in 1985. Long finished the year with 47 receptions for 809 yards and four TDs after catching eight passes for 96 yards against Boise State in the regular-season finale. Long was voted second-team All Mountain West.

Long caught an 80-yard touchdown pass from B.R. Holbrook during the first play from scrimmage against UNLV on Nov. 12, his first play back after a one-game absence due to a toe injury. That catch alone nearly doubled the output Long had in his previous four games combined. Long has just six receptions for 41 yards during that four-game span. He missed the San Diego State (Nov. 5) and TCU games (Oct. 22), and played only the first quarter at Nevada because of the injury. Long finished the UNLV game with two receptions for 99 yards.

Long had a game for the record books on Sept. 24 against Sam Houston State. Long set UNM, MW overall and freshman single-game records with 378 all-purpose yards vs. the Bearkats (209 receiving, 2 rushing, 165 kick return, 2 punt return). Long's effort bested Mathis' old school mark of 358 yards, set in 1989 vs. San Diego State. The previous MW overall record of

NUMBERS FROM 2000-09 ARE UNPARALLELED IN LOBO HISTORY

The numbers attained by the Lobos last decade are unprecedented. UNM is 48-52 since 2002 with five bowl appearances. New Mexico appeared in only six bowls in its first 103 years of competition, but has been to five in the past eight years. The following figures go back to 1965, when the NCAA increased scholarship limits and two-platoon football began nationally:

375 all-purpose yards was held by Colorado State's Gartrell Johnson (vs. Fresno State in the 2008 New Mexico Bowl). Long's 378 yards shattered the previous MW freshman record by more than 100 yards, surpassing the 277 yards racked up by BYU's Curtis Brown against Utah State on Oct. 4, 2002. Long's 378 all-purpose yards were the second most by a player in the FBS this season.

Long had career highs of 209 receiving yards and nine receptions, and he produced the first three TD receptions of his career against Sam Houston State. He also returned a kickoff 98 yards for a score and became the first Lobo to score four TDs in one game since Rodney Ferguson rushed for four TDs against SDSU in 2008. Long had 139 receiving yards on three catches against Texas Tech on Sept. 17. The West Virginia transfer put up 258 all-purpose yards against the Red Raiders, which were good enough for eighth place on the school's all-time single-game all-purpose yards list.

B.R. LEADER

Junior QB B.R. Holbrook surpassed the 2,000-yard passing mark for his career with his 162-yard effort against Wyoming on Nov. 19. He now has 2,279 for his UNM career after finishing with 1,490 yards this season.

He won his first game in 10 tries as UNM's starting quarterback during the Lobos' 21-14 victory over UNLV on Nov. 12. Holbrook threw for 274 yards, which matched his output in the previous four games combined. He threw a career-long 80-yard TD pass to Deon Long on the first play from scrimmage. Holbrook's yardage output vs. the Rebels was his highest total since the Sam Houston State contest. Holbrook entered that game with three minutes left in the third quarter and threw for 289 yards and two touchdowns in the final 18 minutes plus overtime.

THE 'GONG' SHOW

True freshman Crusoe Gongbay was one of the offensive bright spots this season. He led the team with 500 rushing yards, and the season total is the most since Rodney Ferguson's 1,105 rushing yards in 2008. The freshman also had 11 receptions for 83 yards.

Gongbay established a career high in rushing yards in back-to-back games, going for 93 on 13 carries against UNLV on Nov. 12 after picking up 68 yards against San Diego State on Nov. 5. In that game, he scored UNM's only touchdown for his fifth rushing TD of the season.

Gongbay was a mean, mean scoring machine on the ground for the Lobos from Sept. 17-Oct. 1. Gongbay scored on a pair of touchdown runs against New Mexico State (from 8 yards and 1 yard out) on Oct. 1, giving him four scores in three weeks. He also rushed for a touchdown each against Sam Houston State and Texas Tech.

It Really is The New Mexico Lobos

Did You Know?

C Erik Cook (7th round, Washington) was selected in the 2010 draft and marked the ninth time a Lobo has been drafted since 2005... UNM has had 13 players taken since 1998...New Mexico had at least one player drafted from 2005-2010 - the program's longest streak in the modern NFL Draft era.

TY GAME

Lobo junior wide receiver Ty Kirk tied Deon Long for the team lead with 47 receptions this season. He's in 10th place on UNM's all-time receptions list with 121, just one behind Dwight Counter (2000-03). He's also 16th on the school's all-time receiving list with 1,280 yards — 22 behind Pascal Volz (1996-97). Kirk's 5.22 receptions-per-game average led the MW.

The Arlington Heights, Ill., native zoomed past 1,000 receiving yards for his career with his personal bests of 127 yards and 13 catches against Sam Houston State. He had 11 catches for 90 yards against New Mexico State on Oct. 1.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

HONORABLE FORREST

Senior wolf safety Bubba Forrest earned honorable mention All-MW honors for his 85-tackle performance this season.

He recorded 51 tackles in his last six games, including 10 in the season finale at Boise State. He had nine during UNM's 21-14 win over UNLV on Nov. 12. The Carlsbad, N.M., native was second on the team in tackles, despite missing the Sept. 10 game at Arkansas. His 236 career tackles left him 23 away from the school's top 20.

'OL RELIABLE

Senior cornerback Anthony Hooks was New Mexico's most durable and consistent player during his career. He had 36 consecutive starts and 37 over his career to lead all current UNM players.

Hooks had 45 tackles in his last seven games, including a career-high nine tackles against New Mexico State on Oct. 1 to give him 154 for his career. He also recorded the first solo sack of his career against the Aggies. Hooks was fourth on the team in total tackles with 62.

BIG 'D' ON THE LOBO 'D'

Linebacker Dallas Bollema was supposed to ease into his sophomore year backing up on a unit that returned three starters. Instead, Bollema stole one of the starting spots, and the coaches' decision was justified.

Bollema, the Artesia, N.M., native and former teammate of current Oklahoma Sooners quarterback Landry Jones, was third on the Lobos in tackles with 68, despite not playing vs. Sam Houston State and TCU because of an injury.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

AHO LOTTA SUCCESS

The senior finished second all-time on the Lobos' list for field goals with 45, eight behind all-time leader David Margolis (1989-92) for the top mark.

The Roswell, N.M., scored 218 career points and moved into seventh place on the career scoring list at New Mexico. Aho ranks eighth in career field goal accuracy at 68.2 percent (45-of-66), just behind Colby Cason (1995-97). In fact, five of the top eight Lobo kickers in terms of career accuracy have come this century: No. 1 John Sullivan (2004-07, 29-of-35, 82.9 percent); No. 2 Vladimir Borombozin (2000-01, 27-of-33, 81.8 percent); No. 3 Kenny Byrd (2002-06, 33-of-41, 80.5 percent), No. 6 Zunker (29-of-41, 70.7 percent) and No. 8 Aho.

BOOM BOOM BEN

Sophomore punter Ben Skaer finished fifth in the MW in punting at 39.7 yards per attempt. He was credited with 73 punts in 2011, 12 fewer than he had in 2010.

Before Skaer had to finish the season kicking in the frigid weather against UNLV and on the road at Wyoming and Boise State, he was enjoying the most productive span of his career.

Skaer had seven punts and a 40.1-yard average against TCU on Oct 22. He punted five times for an average of 43.2 yards against Nevada on Oct. 15. That game was the third in a row in which Skaer averaged better than 43 yards per attempt.

The Waterloo, Ill., native had his best and fourth best days statistically during his two years as a starter against Sam Houston State and New Mexico State. Skaer averaged a career-best 44.2 yards per punt in six attempts vs. the Bearkats.

Skaer averaged 43.3 yards per punt in six tries against New Mexico State, but that might have been the better game of the two and the best game of his career. Skaer hit a season-long 56-yarder and landed four punts inside the Aggies' 20-yard line -- one at the 10 and the other three at the 3.

On the season, Skaer had 10 punts of more than 50 yards, and he sent 19 inside the opponent's 20.

NFL MUSINGS

While Ryan Cook and Marcus Smith were both cut in the preseason by the Minnesota Vikings and the Jacksonville Jaguars respectively, Cook was grabbed by the Miami Dolphins, giving the Lobos seven former charges in the National Football League. That numbers include offensive lineman Byron Bell, who finished with New Mexico last season. Bell, who wears No. 77 for the Carolina Panthers, currently is starting at right tackle.

Offensive lineman Erik Cook is in his second year with the Redskins, safety Glover Quin his third with the Houston Texans, and both linebacker Quincy Black and offensive lineman Robert Turner are in their fifth years with the Buccaneers and Jets respectively. Black intercepted a pass against the New Orleans Saints on Oct. 16. Offensive lineman Ryan Cook is in his first year with Miami after six with Minnesota.

The hallmark of the current Lobos in the NFL remains middle linebacker Brian Urlacher, who is in his 12th year with the Chicago Bears.

BACK TO FULL STRENGTH

Due to NCAA limitations, the Lobos have not been able to recruit a full class for the last three years, making them in essence 14 scholarship players shy this season. UNM could only sign 20 in 2009 and 2010, and just 21 in 2011. That was the final year of the NCAA sanctions and UNM will be able to return to the normal allotment of 25 in February of 2012.

In August, the university was officially notified that all criteria of the violation have been met, and UNM football is officially off probation.

MOUNTAIN WEST HISTORY FOR THE LOBOS

The Lobos are 43-55 all-time in the MW.

52ND SEASON AT UNIVERSITY STADIUM

The 2011 season is the 52nd for the Lobos at University Stadium. The first game was played Sept. 17, 1960, when UNM ripped the University of Mexico, 77-6. UNM is 146-146-3 all-time at University Stadium.

UNM HISTORY

The University of New Mexico is competing in its 113th season of football in 2011. The Lobos have an all-time record of 452-544-31. The school was founded in 1889. Three years later, the first football game was played on Oct. 7, 1892, when a team representing UNM played a squad from Albuquerque High School in a vacant lot north of the town's ice factory. The preps prevailed 5-0. The territory of New Mexico was not granted statehood until 1912.

MINI NOTES

*UNM and CSU played a scoreless first quarter, the first in a Lobo game since October 11, 2008 when UNM and BYU were scoreless after one quarter.

*The 24 combined points were the fewest in a home opener since 2006, when UNM lost to Portland State 17-6 at University Stadium.

*New Mexico scored a season-high 45 points against Sam Houston State, 28 vs. New Mexico State and 21 against UNLV, marking only the seventh time it has scored more than 20 points in its last 38 games.

*The Lobos' 42-28 loss to in-state rival NMSU marked the third consecutive win for the Aggies. UNM hadn't lost three straight games to the team down south since 1966-68.

*UNM's shutout losses at TCU and at home vs. Air Force were the first back-to-back blankings since 1988.

*Redshirt freshman Martize Barr has started on both offense (WR) and defense (lobo back) for the Lobos this season.

UNM VS. THE NATIONALLY RANKED

The Lobos now have a 7-49 record against nationally-ranked teams. The breakdown is 5-23 at home, 4-22 in University Stadium, 2-25 on the road, and 0-1 at neutral sites. UNM's last win against a nationally-ranked opponent came on Oct. 25, 2003 when the Lobos defeated No. 23 Utah 47-35 in Salt Lake City. The last home defeat of a nationally-ranked squad was also Utah, when the Utes were No. 8. That win was a 23-21 nail-biter on November 5, 1994.

The Lobos lost to Arkansas (No. 13/14) and Boise State (No. 9/8) this season.

TALE OF THE TAPE

THE GILDAN NEW MEXICO BOWL VI

The sixth annual New Mexico Bowl will kick off the collegiate bowl season for the third straight year, but is making a change in its lineup. The game is slated for a noon MT/2 p.m. ET kickoff at University Stadium in Albuquerque, N.M. on Saturday, Dec. 17. For the sixth straight year, the game is scheduled to include a team from the Mountain West Conference, and for the first time, a Pac-12 team is scheduled to be the opponent. In November of 2010, the New Mexico Bowl and the Pac-10 announced an agreement for the Pac-12 to participate in the New Mexico Bowl beginning in 2012. That agreement has been amended for the partnership to begin in the 2011-2012 bowl season.

In the first four New Mexico Bowls, the Mountain West and Western Athletic Conferences squared off, with the MW winning three of four. In the fifth annual game, the New Mexico Bowl welcomed UTEP, a Conference USA member, which fell to departing MW member BYU.

GEORGE BARLOW

**Interim Head Coach • 3rd Year at UNM
• Marshall '90**

George Barlow was named interim head coach on Sept. 25 after Mike Locksley was relieved of his duties. Barlow began his third season as an assistant coach and first year as defensive coordinator. He was in charge of the Lobo secondary in 2009-10.

In 2010, junior safety Bubba Forrest registered a 100-tackle season with two interceptions while earning honorable mention all-conference honors.

Now in his 21st season as a collegiate assistant, Barlow came to UNM after 10 seasons at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Va. He was assistant head coach and defensive coordinator/safeties coach at JMU for five seasons from 2004-08. He coached the defensive line in 2002-03 and running backs from 1999-2001.

The Dukes spent most of the 2008 season as the No. 1 team in the Football Championship Subdivision. They finished 12-2, falling to Montana in the national semifinals.

Barlow's 2008 defense ranked among the top-25 in the FCS in sacks (34) and total defense (307.1 ypg).

JMU was second in the FCS in sacks (4 per game) and fourth in rushing defense (84.8 ypg) in 2006, ranked eighth in total defense in 2005 (287.8 ypg) and was second nationally in rushing defense (86.8 ypg) in 2004.

In 1999, Barlow coached Curtis Keaton, who ran for team season records of 1,719 yards and 20 TDs and was picked by the Cincinnati Bengals in the fourth round of the NFL Draft.

Barlow also tutored tailback/return specialist Delvin Joyce, who in 2000 became the first Division I-AA player to reach the 1,000-yard career mark in rushing, receiving, punt returns and kickoff returns.

Prior to James Madison, Barlow spent three years at Oklahoma under John Blake, coaching outside linebackers and strong safeties in 1998 and serving as a defensive graduate assistant in 1996-97.

Barlow was the defensive coordinator at West Virginia State in 1995 and defensive line coach at Hutchinson (Kan.) Community College in 1994. He started his coaching career in 1991, spending three seasons as a defensive assistant at his alma mater, Marshall.

Barlow was an all-conference safety at Marshall, where he played from 1986-90. The Thundering Herd was national runner-up in 1987.

Barlow, who was also a sprinter on the Marshall track team, graduated in 1990 with a degree in business administration and a concentration in finance and business law.

Barlow has a daughter, Kierstin Paige.

Neither team scored in the third quarter, and Colorado State missed a golden opportunity to tie when Ben Deline missed a chip-shot 28-yard field goal.

Facing 4th-and-1 from their own 45 with just over two minutes to go, Rams' coach Steve Fairchild opted to go for it in his own territory, but Rod Davis and Carmen Messina stopped Chris Nwoke for no gain, giving the Lobos one last shot at the win. UNM got to the 10 yard line and Austin rushed the ball to the 5, but a holding penalty negated with would have been a 1st-and-goal at the five. Two plays later Nordly forced his fourth fumble and effectively ended the game.

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP) — Tyler Wilson threw for 259 yards and accounted for a pair of touchdowns as No. 14 Arkansas defeated New Mexico 52-3 on Saturday.

Marquel Wade also returned a kickoff 85 yards for a touchdown for the Razorbacks (2-0), who now have three special teams' touchdowns in their first two games. Joe Adams returned a pair of punts for touchdowns in the first game.

Wilson's second touchdown was a 7-yard plunge into the end zone late in the first half. However, the junior didn't return in the second half with concussion-like symptoms and didn't appear on the sidelines until midway through the third quarter.

The Lobos (0-2), who allowed nine quarterback sacks and lost three fumbles in a season-opening loss to Colorado State, struggled offensively against the Razorbacks. They were outgained 641-255 in total yardage.

Tarean Austin completed 15 of 28 passes for New Mexico, but he managed only 162 yards against a defense that allowed only 79 yards through the air in its opening win.

Despite the lopsided final score, the Razorbacks appeared anything like the efficient offensive team that opened with a win over Missouri State last week. In that victory, Wilson guided Arkansas to 303 yards of offense in four possessions — totaling 24 points.

Wilson started quickly against New Mexico, guiding the Razorbacks 70 yards in 4 plays. He capped the drive with a 12-yard touchdown pass to Jarius Wright to go up 7-0.

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — TCU compiled 264 rushing yards and Casey Pachall threw for two touchdowns in a shutout win of New Mexico 69-0 Saturday.

TCU (5-2, 3-0 Mountain West) broke the school record for most points scored in a single game, topping the previous high of 68 scored against Austin College in 1932.

New Mexico (0-7, 0-2) fumbled the ball away on its first two possessions — by running backs James Wright and Crusoe Gongbay, respectively, concluding in short-yardage rushing touchdowns by Matt Brown and Luke Shivers. Following a New Mexico punt, Pachall hit Logan Brock from six yards out to lead 20-0 at the end of the first quarter.

TCU scored touchdowns on three of its four possessions in the second quarter to lead 41-0 at halftime.

In the second half, TCU reached the end zone three times rushing. TCU broke the school record for points when Ross Evans kicked the extra point following a 9-yard touchdown run by Rick Settle with 52 seconds remaining.

UNM's Demarcus Rogers had 51 yards rushing on 17 carries to provide the only positive aspect of the Lobos' offense on the afternoon.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) — Mike DeWitt scored a career-high four touchdowns, three in the first half, leading Air Force to a 42-0 victory over New Mexico on Saturday.

Air Force (4-4, 1-3 Mountain West) played most of the game without quarterback Tim Jefferson, who went out with an undisclosed injury in the first quarter. But backup Connor Dietz stepped in with a big performance, collecting 87 yards and a touchdown on six carries.

DeWitt finished with 64 yards on 15 carries and backfield mate Asher Clark added 75 yards on 10 carries.

For the Lobos (0-8, 0-3), Crusoe Gongbay rushed for 63 yards on 10 carries.

The Falcons scored their first touchdown when Austin BrieHL recovered a teammates' fumble in the end zone. DeWitt scored three straight touchdowns, going in from 4, 12 and 3, before Dietz sprinted in from 39 yards with a minute remaining in the first half to put Air Force up 35-0 at halftime.

UNM linebacker Carmen Messina recorded a season-high 15 tackles as the Lobo defense managed to hold Air Force to 361 yards of offense, the fewest UNM has allowed since the season opener against Colorado State (270).

Ronnie Hillman, the FBS's leading rusher, ran for 141 yards and a touchdown for the Aztecs (5-3, 2-2 Mountain West).

The Lobos (0-9, 0-4), one of only two winless FBS teams, stretched their losing streak to 12 games. New Mexico's last win came Nov. 6, 2010 against Wyoming.

Kazee, who entered with five career rushing TDs, had never scored more than one in a game. Hillman, who came in averaging 151 yards per game, scored on a 1-yard run.

Chad Young added a 3-yard scoring run for the Aztecs. San Diego State's five rushing touchdowns were its most in more than 15 years.

Ryan Lindley completed 16 of 24 passes for 271 yards as the Aztecs gained 486 yards. The Lobos had just 162 yards of offense.

Crusoe Gongbay scored on a 6-yard run just before halftime for New Mexico. It was the first time in eight games New Mexico has held an opponent to less than 42 points.

Kazee's first TD capped a 66-yard drive in late in the first quarter and San Diego State took a 14-0 lead with 4:26 before halftime on Kazee's 3-yard run.

New Mexico, which had been shut out in its last two games, had its only sustained drive of the game on its next possession. The Lobos went 80 yards on nine plays with Crusoe Gongbay scoring on a 6-yard run just before halftime to cut the San Diego State lead to 14-7.

But the Aztecs used short fields on their first two possessions of the third quarter to set up Kazee's last touchdown and Hillman's 13th rushing TD of the season.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) — Demarcus Rogers scored a 2-yard touchdown with 1:15 left Saturday as New Mexico defeated UNLV 21-14 for its first victory of the season.

The Lobos ended a 12-game losing streak, dating to last season.

Rogers' run capped a 34-yard drive set up by Jaymar Latchison's fumble recovery with 1:58 remaining.

New Mexico (1-9, 1-4 Mountain West) opened the game with an 80-yard touchdown catch-and-run from wide receiver Deon Long, then Rogers added a 1-yard touchdown midway through the first quarter as the Lobos topped their first-quarter scoring output for the entire season.

New Mexico middle linebacker Carmen Messina stripped Barnhill of the football at the UNLV 34 with 2:35 left in the game and the score tied at 14.

Holbrook completed a 27-yard pass to Quintell Solomon to get the Lobos to the 7, and Rogers ran the ball twice to get in the end zone. Solomon had career highs of six receptions and 94 yards.

LARAMIE, Wyo. (AP) — Brett Smith rushed for two touchdowns and threw for another in leading Wyoming past New Mexico 31-10 on Saturday.

The Cowboys (7-3, 4-1 Mountain West) became bowl eligible for the second time under third-year coach Dave Christensen.

Smith, who entered the game the front-runner among NCAA freshman quarterbacks in total offense, rushed 12 times for 140 yards, which was his first 100 yard game of his short career. He scored on runs of 69 and three yards.

He also completed 23 of 38 passes for 212 yards and a 26-yard TD pass on a blustery day when wind chills hovered around 10 degrees.

The game occurred three days after New Mexico (1-10, 1-5) hired former Notre Dame coach Bob Davie as its new head coach.

Davie replaced Mike Locksley, who was fired midseason after a nearly three-year tenure that was mostly marked by losses and off-field problems.

Davie witnessed an offense that had trouble moving the ball and was hampered by penalties. Furthermore, New Mexico's defense allowed 462 yards of offense to Wyoming.

B.R. Holbrook threw for 162 yards and rushed for a touchdown to lead New Mexico, which saw its losing streak on the road extended to 21 games. The Lobos haven't won outside of New Mexico since Oct. 20, 2007, when they won at San Diego State.

New Mexico grabbed a 10-7 lead on a 5-yard run by Holbrook and a 29-yard field goal by James Aho in the second quarter.

UNM senior middle linebacker Carmen Messina recorded 11 tackles to tie for the all-time Mountain West lead in career tackles with 433. He tied UNLV's Adam Seward (2001-04).

BOISE, Idaho (AP) — Let the Bob Davie era begin at New Mexico.

That's about the only positive way for the Lobos to think in the aftermath of Saturday's 45-0 blowout loss to No. 9 Boise State.

The loss gives the Lobos (1-11, 1-6) a third straight season with only one win and extends their road losing streak to 22 games, the nation's longest such skid.

The offense was held to just 197 yards and only crossed midfield twice, while the defense had no answers for Kellen Moore and the rest of the Boise State's high-scoring offense.

Despite the lopsided statistics and score, interim coach George Barlow found reason for hope in 2012, when Davie, the former Notre Dame coach and television analyst, takes over.

"The thing you like about these kids is when things were going as bad as they were, they were still playing hard," said Barlow, who posted a 1-6 record after taking over in September for Mike Locksley.

Kellen Moore threw three touchdowns in the final home game of his brilliant career, and senior Doug Martin ran for two more as the Broncos rolled up 543 total yards on offense.

Boise State (11-1, 6-1) scored on its first five possessions and built a 31-0 halftime lead, clearing the way for Moore and the other members of Boise State's remarkable senior class to exit the field one last time midway through the third quarter with a 38-0 lead.

New Mexico linebacker Carmen Messina set a new Mountain West record for tackles Saturday. On his first tackle in the first quarter, Messina eclipsed the mark of 434 tackles held by Adam Seward from UNLV. Messina finished with 21 tackles in the game and wrapped his career with 455 tackles.

B.R. Holbrook was 16 of 28 for 145 yards and was sacked twice for New Mexico. Deon Long led the Lobos with eight catches for 96 yards.
