New Mexico Makes Third Straight Trip to NCAA Championships

OPENING DRIVE: The University of New Mexico men's golf team travels to Hot Springs, Va., for the NCAA Championships. The NCAA Championships will be played at the par-70, 6,679 yard Cascades Golf Course at The Homestead Resort on Tuesday, June 1 - Friday, June 4. The Lobos earned a berth in the NCAA Championships with their second place finish at the NCAA West Regional. Coach Glen Millican will take juniors Madalitso Muthiya and Jay Reynolds, sophomores Jay Choi and Spencer Levin and freshman Charlie Beljan with him to Hot Springs. The tournament will be 72-holes, 18-holes played each day, with only the top-18 teams playing on the final day. Tee times for the NCAA Championships begin each morning at 7:00 AM (EST).

THE COURSE: The NCAA Championships will be played at the 6,679 yard, par-70 Cascades Golf Course at The Homestead Resort in Hot Springs, Va.

RESULTS: Live scoring of the four day event can be found on the Golfstat website at www.golfstat.com. A recap of the NCAA Championships can also be found at the UNM website at golobos.com.

A LOOK AT THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: New Mexico will enter the NCAA Championships after a second place finish in the NCAA West Regional and is the 15th ranked team in the country. Other teams joining the Lobos are #1 Florida, #2 Clemson, #3 Georgia, #4 Arizona State, #5 UCLA, #6 Georgia Tech, #7 Oklahoma State, #8 Arizona, #9 Texas, #10 TCU, #11 USC, #13 Oklahoma, #17 Kentucky, #19 California, #21 BYU, #23 Washington, Auburn, North Carolina, Georgia State, Vanderbilt, Penn State, Rhode Island, SMU, Texas A&M, Purdue, Kent State, Wichita State, Pepperdine and Toledo. UNM is 36-31 against the teams in the NCAA Championships and have not been on the course with six of the teams.

UNM AT THE NCAA'S: This will be New Mexico's 20th consecutive appearance in the NCAA's and third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Championships. The last time the Lobos did not earn a berth in either a NCAA Regional or Championship was 1984. UNM has qualified for the NCAA Championships 28 times.

NEW MEXICO IN THE POLLS: The Lobos are ranked tied for 15th in the latest Golf Week/Sagarin Performance Index Poll (May 9). Florida maintains the top spot and is followed by Clemson. New Mexico also has two individuals in the top 100 of the rankings with Spencer Levin at 11 and Jay Choi at 69.

NCAA WEST REGIONAL: SUNRIVER, ORE. - The University of New Mexico men's golf team finished second at the NCAA West Regional. The Lobos with the top-10 finish will advance to the NCAA Championships in Hot Springs, Va., on June 1-4. New Mexico carded a final round 8-over par 296 and finished the tournament at 2-over par 866 on the par-72 7,597 yard Crosswater Course at Sunriver Resort. The Lobos fell one stroke short of UCLA who shot a final round 294 and finished the regional at 1-over par 865.

Individually for the Lobos sophomore Spencer Levin led the way with a final round 73 to finish the tournament at 2-under par (69-72-73 = 214) in a tie for sixth place. Sophomore Jay Choi also carded a final round 73 and finished at 1-over par (70-74-73 = 217) for the tournament in a tie for 13th place. Other Lobo results are freshman Charlie Beljan finished at 2-over par (74-66-78 = 218) in a tie for 18th place, junior Jay Reynolds finished at 6-over par (71-75-76 = 222) in a tie for 33rd place and Madalitso Muthiya finished at 14-over par (82-74-74 = 230) in a tie for 83rd place.

The individual champion was shared between Travis Johnson of UCLA and Chris Nallen of Arizona at 5-under par.

MWC CHAMPIONSHIPS: SUNRIVER, ORE. - The University of New Mexico men's golf team captured their second straight Mountain West Conference Championship winning on the first playoff hole over BYU. The Lobos forced the playoff coming back from a 3-stroke deficit with a final round of 286 on the par-72, 7,568 yard Crosswater Course at Sunriver Resort to finish the 54-holes at 3-over par (295-286-286 = 867). BYU (292-286-289 = 867), who entered the final round with a 3-stroke lead, shot a 1-over par 289 to force the playoff. On the first playoff hole UNM

edged BYU 17-16 and won their second consecutive MWC Championship.

Individually for the Lobos, freshman Charlie Beljan, sophomore Jay Choi and junior Madalitso Muthiya each shot a final round 71 to lead UNM on the final day. Beljan (71-71-71 = 213) and Choi (72-70-71 = 213) finished the tournament tied for fifth at 3-under par 213, while Muthiya (81-76-71 = 228) finished tied for 27th at 12-over par. Sophomore Spencer Levin (74-71-73 = 218) shot a final round 73 to finish ninth at 2-over par and junior Jay Reynolds (78-74-76 = 228) finished tied for 27th at 12-over par.

Medalist honors for the MWC Championships belong to Ryan Moore (70-69-67 = 206) of UNLV who carded a final round 67 to finish the tournament at 10-under par. Moore edged Nolan Martin of Colorado State and Mark Warman of San Diego State by 3-strokes.

BELJAN NAMED MWC FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR AND ALL-CONFERENCE: New Mexico's Charlie Beljan garnered MWC Freshman of the Year and MWC-All Conference honors after posting a 73.30 stroke average this season and recording four top 20 finishes. He tied for fifth at this at MWC Championship with a 54-hole total of three-under 213.

LEVIN NAMED MWC-ALL CONFERENCE: Sophomore Spencer Levin joined UNM at semester after transferring from UCLA. Levin earned Golf Week golfer of the week after winning the John Burns Intercollegiate at 11-under par. Levin this season has finished in the top 20 in five of the six tournaments he played in and has a stroke average of 70.28.

ASU THUNDERBIRD INVITATIONAL: TEMPE, ARIZ. - The University of New Mexico men's golf team fell out of a second place tie and finished fourth on the final day of the ASU Thunderbird Invitational. The Lobos shot a final round 282 on the par-72 7,027 Karsten Course and finished 24-under par (273-285-282 = 840) at the 16-team tournament, while host Arizona State led wire to wire and finished at 43-under par (270-278-273 = 821).

New Mexico was led by Spencer Levin who finished tied for 12th with a final round 68 to finish at 8-under par (66-74-68 = 208). Other individual scores for the Lobos were Charlie Beljan tied for 18th at 5-

under par (69-68-74 = 211), Jay Choi (71-70-71 = 212) and Jay Reynolds (69-73-70 = 212) each finished at 4-under par in a tie for 20th and Madalitso Muthiya finished tied for 48th at 2-over par (69-76-73 = 218).

Medalist honors went to Alejandro Canisares of Arizona State who led wire to wire and finished at 16-under par (65-66-69 = 200) holding off Ryan Moore of UNLV by two strokes.

NATIONAL INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT: TUCSON, ARIZ. - The University of New Mexico finished 11th at the National Invitational Tournament. The Lobos could not overcome a rough second round and finished the tournament at 29-over par (291-306-296 = 893) on the par-72, 7,094 yard OMNI Tucson National Golf Course.

Individually the Lobos were led by Jay Reynolds who shot a final round 71 to finish at 1-over par (72-74-71 = 217) in a tie for 16th. Other New Mexico individual results were Madalitso Muthiya tied for 44th at 9-over par (73-75-77 = 225), Ian Medlock tied for 47th at 10-over par (74-79-73 = 226), tied for 52nd was Miguel Griego at 11-over par (72-78-77 = 227) and Tyler Symons finished 58th at 19-over par (77-83-75 = 235).

The team championship went to Arizona State who held off host Arizona and shot a 54-hole total 856 (279-287-290) to win by two strokes. Medalist honors went to Ryan Moore who led wire-to-wire and finished at 9-under par (64-73-70 = 207), while Brock Mackenzie of Washington finished second at 7-under par.

HALL OF FAME INVITATIONAL: HOUSTON, TEXAS - The University of New Mexico dropped to sixth place on the final day of the Hall of Fame Invitational in Houston, Texas. The Lobos entered the final round tied for fourth, but shot a final round of 297 and tournament total 867 (290-280-297) on the par-72, 7,352-yard Redstone Golf Club to finish sixth.

Spencer Levin (72-68-77 = 217) and Jay Choi (72-71-74 = 217) led the Lobos finishing tied for 19th at 1-over par. Following Levin and Choi was Charlie Beljan (73-71-75 = 219) who finished tied for 28th at 3-over par, Jay Reynolds (77-70-73 = 220) finished at 4-over par in a tie for 32nd and Madalitso Muthiya (73-75-75 = 223) finished tied for 47th at 7-over par.

The team championship went to Arizona who finished at 846 (277-283-286), six strokes in front of second place Oklahoma State.

Chris Nallen (66-66-70 = 202) of Arizona won medalist honors leading wire to wire and finished at 14-under par. Alex Boren (71-68-69 = 208) of Oklahoma State was second at 8-under par.

SOUTHERN HIGHLANDS COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIP: LAS VEGAS, NEVADA - The University of New Mexico men's golf team finished in 11th place at 15-over par (302-283-294 = 879) with a final round of 879 at the difficult Southern Highlands Collegiate Championship hosted by UNLV. Arizona State won the team championship with a 16-under par 848 (279-276-293 = 848) just two strokes in front of Florida.

Spencer Levin led the Lobos for the third consecutive tournament finishing 27th at 3-over par (75-67-77 = 219). Freshman Charlie Beljan moved up 11 spots to tie for 28th at 4-over par (76-72-72 = 220) with a final round of 72. Other Lobo scores were Ian Medlock tied for 32nd at 6-over par (75-72-75 = 222), tied for 40th was Jay Choi at 7-over par (76-77-70 = 223) and Jay Reynolds tied for 59th with a score of 228 (79-72-77).

Medalist honors went to Camilo Villegas of Florida who finished at 11-under par (67-69-69 = 205) to edge Bill Haas of Wake Forest at 10-under par (68-67-71 = 206).

HERB WIMBERLY INTERCOLLEGIATE (JV): LAS CRUCES, N.M. - The New Mexico JV men's golf team finished in fifth place Tuesday afternoon at the Herb Wimberly Invitational hosted by New Mexico State University. The Lobos shot a 9-over 873 (288-296-289) for the tournament, while Wichita State took first place, shooting a 23-under 841. Chris Stroud of Lamar took medalist honors with a 14-under 202.

Individually, Madalitso Muthiya tied for third with a 6-under 210 (68-71-71) to lead the Lobos. Miguel Griego also finished in the top 10 with a 1-under 215 (76-70-69).

Tyler Symons placed in a tie for 37th with an 8-over 224 (74-76-74), while Jeb Grueneberger tied for 49th with a score of 73-79-75 = 227. Chase Thomas took 61st with a 72-79-82 = 234.

SPENCER LEVIN NAMED GOLF WEEK PLAYER OF THE WEEK: University of New Mexico men's golfer Spencer Levin has been named Player of the Week by Golfweek magazine. Levin, a sophomore transfer from UCLA, won medalist honors at last week's John Burns Intercollegiate in Honolulu with a 15-under par 201 (67-65-69). Playing on the par-72, 6,917 yard Leilehua Golf Course, Levin led the tournament wire to wire, helping the Lobos to a third-place finish in the 22-team field.

JOHN BURNS INTERCOLLEGIATE: WAHIAWA, HAWAII - The University of New Mexico men's golf team could not hold on to its two day lead and finished in third place at the 22-team John Burns Intercollegiate. The Lobos shot a final round 285 and tournament total 27-under par 840 (276-279-285) to finish seven strokes behind Arizona (285-272-276 = 833).

Individually for the Lobos, transfer Spencer Levin won medalist honors with a 15-under par 201 (67-65-69) on the par 72, 6917 yard Leilehua Golf Course. Levin led the tournament wire to wire and finished one stroke in front of Nolan Martin of Colorado State.

Other individual results for New Mexico were Jay Choi tied for 13th at 6-under par (68-70-72 = 210), tied for 33rd and playing as an individual was Charlie Beljan at 3-under (69-71-73-213), Jay Reynolds tied for 41st at 1-under (68-78-69 = 215), Ian Medlock tied for 65th at 4-over (73-72-75 = 220) and Tyler Symons was 8-over (73-72-79 = 224) to finish tied for 82nd.

PING-ARIZONA INTERCOLLEGIATE: The University of New Mexico men's golf team opened the spring season with a second place finish at the PING-Arizona Intercollegiate. The Lobos finished 18-under par (275-269-290) ten strokes behind champion and tournament host University of Arizona.

Individually, the Lobos were led by transfer Spencer Levin playing in his first tournament for New Mexico. Levin shot an 11-under par 202 (70-63-69) on the par-71, 6,793 yard Arizona National Country Club to finish in a tie for third. UNM also placed two other golfers in the top-15 in Jay Reynolds and Jay Choi. Reynolds finished tied for ninth at 5-under par (69-68-71), while Choi finished 3-under par (66, 69, 75) in a tie for 12th. Other Lobo individual results: Tyler Symons playing as an individual finished tied for 28th at 1-over par (71, 74, 69), Ian Medlock shot a 2-over par 215 (71, 69, 75) to finish tied for 33rd, Madalitso Muthiya finished tied for 37th at 4-over par (70, 71, 76) and Charlie Beljan playing as an individual finished tied for 67th at 14-over par (72, 74, 81).

Medalist honors went to Chris Nallen of Arizona who led wire-to-wire and finished at 18-under par (63-64-68). Michael Putnam of Pepperdine was second at 13-under par (68-65-67).

WELCOME SPENCER LEVIN: Spencer Levin is a sophomore transfer from UCLA. Levin in his first tournament led the Lobos to a second place finish at the difficult PING-Arizona Intercollegiate. Levin in his first tournament put himself in the UNM record books, firing the second lowest 18 hole score in school history at 63 and tied for the fourth lowest 54-hole total at 202. The transfer also led UNM to the lowest team score for 18-holes at 269 and the second lowest 54-hole total at 834.

BARONA CUP: The University of New Mexico men's golf team finished the fall season in fourth at the Barona Collegiate Cup on the par 72, 7088 yard, Barona Creek Golf Club. UNM shot a 54-hole total of 850 (276-290-284), and finished 14-strokes behind tournament champion Colorado State.

Individually for UNM, Madalitso Muthiya led the way at 6-under par (69-71-70 = 210) to finish tied for 14th. Charlie Beljan finished 17th at 5-under par (67-74-70 = 211), Jay Reynolds finished at 2-under par (70-72-72) tied for 30th, Ian Medlock shot a 1-under par 215 (70-73-72) to finish tied for 32nd and Tyler Symons finished 68th at 7-over par (75-75-73 = 223). Finally Miguel Griego played as an individual and shot a 221 (73-74-74) to finish in a tie for 52nd.

Medalist honors went to Chris Baryla of UTEP with a 17-under par 199 (69-63-67), while Jimmy Cunningham of Denver finished three strokes back at 14-under par (68-69-65).

Colorado State was the tournament champion at 28-under par with a score of 836 (273-282-281), while UTEP finished second at 22-under par (284-280-278).

IV AT WNMU FALL INTERCOLLEGIATE: The University of New Mexico men's junior varsity golf team won the nine-team WNMU Fall Intercollegiate by 20-strokes over Odessa College. The Lobos finished the tournament with a 7-under par 849 (286-277-286) on the par-71, 6,539 yard Alto Lakes Country Club and the par-72, 6,874 yard, Inn of the Mountain Gods Course.

Individually for the Lobos, Jay Choi won medalist honors for the second time in his short career with a 10-under par 204 (69-67-68). Choi won the tournament by five strokes over teammate Jeff Lanier who carded a 5-under par 209 (72-66-71). Other UNM scores were Jim Anderson who finished tied for 13th at 221 (72-75-74) and Chase Thomas who finished at 222 (77-69-76) to tie for 15th. Jeb Grueneberger (76-DQ-73) and Jeff Briggs (73-DQ-83) also played for UNM but were disqualified.

CLUB GLOVE INTERCOLLEGIATE: The University of New Mexico men's golf team shot a final round 301 to finish at 911 (312-298-301) in ninth place at the 13-team Club Glove Intercollegiate.

Individually for New Mexico, Jay Reynolds led the way finishing 11 over par (75-78-74 = 227) to tie for 28th. Other scores for the Lobos: Ian Medlock tied for 35th at +13 (80-75-74 = 229), Jay Choi (78-76-77 = 231) and Charlie Beljan (79-76-76 = 231) tied for 42nd at +15 and Tyler Symons tied for 48th at +17 (82-71-80 = 233)

The Club Glove Intercollegiate title went to host Pepperdine with a 54-hole total of 871, while Arizona State finished nine strokes back in second.

Individual medalist honors went to Michael Putnam of Pepperdine (67-73-75 = 215) with a playoff win over David Inglis of Tulsa (70-74-71 = 215).

MEDLOCK NAMED GOLF WEEK PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Ian Medlock of the New Mexico men's golf team was named the *Golf Week* men's player of the week in the Sept. 18 issue. Medlock received the award after his first place finish at the William H. Tucker Intercollegiate with a 54-hole total of 211 (-5).

INVERNESS INTERCOLLEGIATE: The University of New Mexico men's golf team dropped one spot to finish in sixth at 54 over par with a 54-hole total of 906 (296, 310, 300) at the 15-team Inverness Intercollegiate golf tournament. The Lobos finished twenty strokes behind tournament champion UCLA (294-300-292 = 594) at the par 71, 7255 yard, Inverness Club in Toledo, Ohio.

Individually for New Mexico, Jay Reynolds led the way finishing 12 over par (72-76-77 = 225) and tie for 13th. Other scores for the Lobos: Jay Choi tied for 27th at +15 (79-75-74 = 228), Madalitso Muthiya tied for 32nd at +16 (74-76-79 = 229), Tucker champion Ian Medlock tied for 38th at +17 (74-83-73 = 230) and Charlie Beljan tied for 54th at +22 (76-83-76 = 235)

Individual medalist honors went John Merrick of UCLA who finished at +3 (71-74-71 = 216), while Brad Heaven of Toledo finished one stroke back.

IV AT FALCON INVITE: The University of New Mexico junior varsity men's golf team could not hold onto their 36-hole lead and finished third at the 18-team Gene Miranda Falcon Invitational. The Lobos shot a final round 303 to finish at six over par (287-280-303 = 870), 11 strokes behind team champion Texas-San Antonio, who finished at five under par (282-287-290 = 859).

Individually for New Mexico, Tyler Symons led the way moving up from seventh to tie for third at two under par (72-69-73 = 214). Jeb Grueneberger also finished in the top 20 with a tie for 16th at two over (72-68-78 = 218). Other UNM JV scores: Miguel Griego tied for 23rd at +4 (73-73-74 = 220), Chase Thomas finished at +5 (73-70-78 = 221) tied for 26th and Anderson finished at +8 (70-75-79 = 224) tied for 40th.

Individual medalist honors went to the 36-hole leader Mike Mezei of the University of Texas-San Antonio at nine under (66-71-70 = 207), with Luke Swilor of Utah finishing three strokes back.

TUCKER RECAP: The University of New Mexico men's golf team could not overcome a ten-stroke deficit and finished second at the 54-hole William H. Tucker Intercollegiate. The Lobos shot a final round of 289 and a 54-hole total of 867 (291, 287, 289) to finish just two strokes behind team champion Arizona State who finished the tournament at 865 (282, 286, 297).

The Lobos were led by Madalitso Muthiya (70, 71, 74 = 215) who finished tied for fourth at one under par. Jay Reynolds also finished in the top ten tied for eighth at 216 (73, 71, 72). Other New Mexico scores: Jay Choi (74, 73, 72) and Charlie Beljan (76, 72, 71) tied for 17th and Miguel Griego finished tied for 50th with 225 (74, 77, 74).

The New Mexico junior varsity finished 13th with a score of 894 (299, 294, 301). Individually for the New Mexico junior varsity, Ian Medlock won medalist honors with a three round total of 211 (72, 69, 70) to finish five under par. He becomes the second straight player from the University of New Mexico to win the individual title at the Tucker. Other scores for the junior varsity: Jim Anderson finished tied for 80th at 229 (74, 76, 79), Jeff Lanier finished at 231 (79, 74, 78) for 78th and both Tyler Symons (74, 75, 83) and Chase Thomas (79, 79, 74) tied for 82nd with scores of 232.

**Third Season
New Mexico '98**

Glen Millican is in his third season as the head coach of the UNM men's golf team. There are only a handful of coaches like Millican who have led their team to the NCAA Championships in their first three years.

Millican has been at the helm of the program since June 25, 2001, and is only the seventh head coach in its history. And when he was chosen, it was clear that he should be the one to guide Lobo golfers. Why?

First of all, Millican was a three-year letterwinner for UNM from 1994-1998. He also had seven top-ten finishes in 27 career tournaments for the Lobos and placed 11th at the 1997 WAC Championships. He also was a 1997 Academic All-American, posting a 3.34 GPA in working towards his degrees in general management and human resources. Millican also earned his MBA in 2000 from UNM's Anderson School of Management.

In 1998, Millican was an assistant coach under head coach J.T. Higgins, and he helped guide the team to success

in the classroom and on the links. In each of his six semesters as assistant coach, the team posted a GPA higher than 3.0. That success continued last year, as two Lobos were Academic All-Americans, while three Lobos were Academic All-Mountain West Conference selections.

In Millican's first three seasons at the helm he has won seven tournament titles, including back-to-back Mountain

West Conference Championships. Millican was also named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2003 and guided Michael Letzig to the Mountain West Conference Player of the Year. He has led the Lobos to three consecutive NCAA Championship tournaments. Individually under Millican, UNM has won medalist honors at 10 tournaments, including three in 2003-04.

In his first year as head coach, Millican guided the Lobos back to the Big Dance for the 11th time in 13 years.

And Millican's squad won three tournaments to tie a school record, set in the 2000-01 season.

The 28-year-old Millican became just the seventh mentor for Lobo golf since World War II, and he was welcomed with open arms into the small fraternity with which he has much in common. Millican joins the ever-growing family tree of former players who have returned to coach their alma mater. Dwaine Knight, a player in 1968-69, coached the Lobos to prominence from 1977-86. John Fields, a player from 1978-81, succeeded Knight from 1987-97. Then it was Millican's turn, as he earned the first head coaching job of his career at UNM.

While an assistant coach at UNM, Millican was involved in several aspects of fundraising and recruiting, as well as using his experience on the links to evaluate and teach the game. During his tenure, the Lobos were consistently listed in the top-20, achieving a ranking as high as eighth in 2001, and qualified for the 2000 NCAA Championships. A total of four players earned Academic All-America accolades and two were named All-America for their performance on the course.

Additionally, the Lobos featured the conference Freshman of the Year in both 1999 (Wil Collins) and 2000 (Michael Letzig), as well as the 2001 Hogan Award winner (Collins). All 10 seniors who came to term while Millican was on board graduated, and the team GPA was above 3.00 in each of his six semesters on staff, with a high of 3.30 in the Spring of 2000. The Lobos had some dominating performances on the course as well. The team shattered the school scoring mark at

the John Burns Inter-collegiate in February, with an 832 (-32), 10 strokes better than the previous UNM record.

During his three years as an assistant, Lobo golf made tremendous strides in improving the state of the program. The Top-100 Club, UNM's golf booster arm, raised over \$250,000 and the Patty Howard Golf Complex was constructed, giving both the men's and women's teams new administrative offices.

Millican's best showing as a Lobo golfer was a seventh-place tie at the 1994 Red River Classic as a freshman. His career stroke average was 75.06 in 80 rounds of play. He had a low 18-hole round of 67 and a low 54-hole round of 214 (-2) at the 1996 Red River Classic. He also won the 1997 Albuquerque City Championship. Millican is a 1993 graduate of North Garland HS in Garland, Texas.

Millican is married to the former Megan Precek. The couple have a daughter, Ryley Nicole, who was born January 28, 2002.

One name not on the list below is Roy Johnson, the athletics director and head men's basketball coach at UNM during the 1920's and 1930's.

Johnson's tenure as the head coach of the New Mexico golf team is not specifically documented, but like any athletics program at UNM during the Johnson era, it seems a safe bet to assume his role in the development of the Lobo golf program was vital. 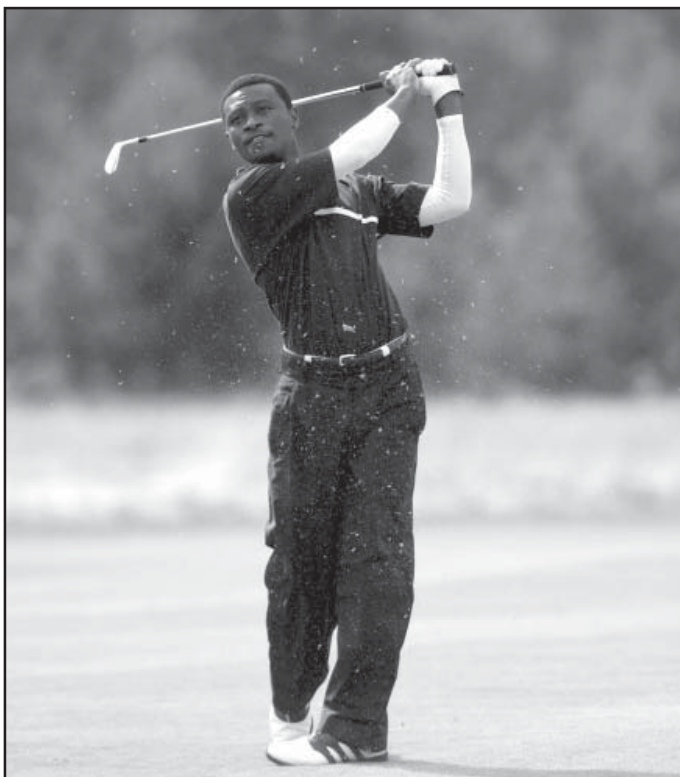

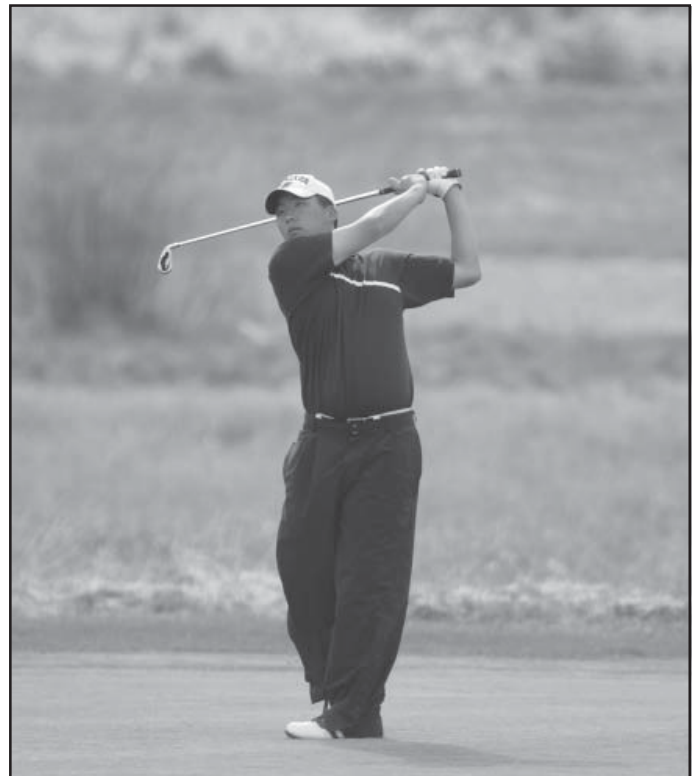

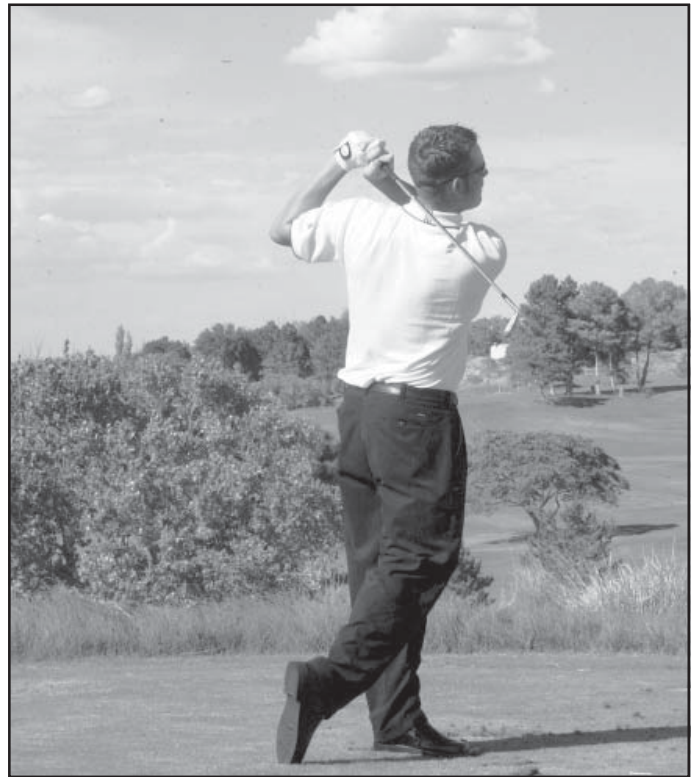
