## New Mexico Heads to NCAA Championships Looking for More

**OPENING DRIVE:** The University of New Mexico men's golf team will travel to the NCAA Championships this week in Owings Mills, Md. The four day tournament will take place on June 1-4, with 18-holes played each day with a cut to 15-teams after three rounds. The Lobos are making their fourth straight appearance in the NCAA Championships but have not made the cut since 1997. Joining head coach Glen Millican at the NCAA Championships will be seniors Madalitso Muthiya and Miguel Griego and juniors Mark Anderson, Jay Choi and Spencer Levin.

**THE COURSE:** The NCAA Championships will be played at the par-70, 7,131 yard Caves Valley Golf Club in Owings Mills, Md. (outside Baltimore).

**TEE TIMES:** The Lobos are scheduled to tee off at 12:18 p.m. (EST) on Wednesday and 7:18 a.m. (EST) on Thursday. Tee times for the next two days will be determined by second round standings.

**TELEVISION COVERAGE:** The NCAA Championships will show the second, third and fourth round of the tournament on television. Coverage will be shown on the Golf Channel from 3-5 p.m. (EST) on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

**THE FIELD:** The field for the NCAA Championships is made up of 30 teams with 23 of them ranked in the top-30 according to the Golfweek Index. The field consists of Oklahoma State (1), Georgia (2), Georgia Tech (3), UNLV (4), New Mexico (5), Florida (6), Augusta State (7), Duke (9), Kentucky (11), Tennessee (12), BYU (13), Wake Forest (14), Arizona State (15), UCLA (16), Georgia Southern (17), Southern Cal (18), Texas (20), Alabama (21), Arizona (23), Washington (24), Georgia State (25), SMU (26), Tulsa (30), Purdue, Texas A&M, Coastal Carolina, Arkansas, San Diego State, Stanford and Missouri. The Lobos have a record of 53-21 against this years field and have played in a tournament against 26 of the 29 teams.

**NEW MEXICO IN THE POLLS:** The Lobos are ranked fifth in the latest Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index. UNM was ranked first in the index after opening the season with a victory at the Topy Cup. New Mexico trails only Oklahoma State, Georgia, Georgia Tech and UNLV.

Individually the Lobos have three players ranked in the top 100. Junior Spencer Levin is the third ranked golfer with a 68.73 scoring index. Levin has won three times and finished second in five tournaments this season. Sophomore Charlie Beljan is 56th with a 71.16 index rating and senior Madalitso Muthiya is 82nd with a 71.55 scoring index.

**LAST SEASON AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS:** HOT SPRINGS, Va. - The University of New Mexico men's golf team finished their season today with the third round of the NCAA Championships. The Lobos finished the day in 19th place and just missed the third round cut. UNM shot a 14-over par, 294 in the third round and finished at 36-over par (291-291-294 = 876) on the par-70, 6,679 yard Cascades Golf Course at The Homestead Resort. The 15 team cutline was set at 31-over par, leaving the Lobos just five strokes short. The overall team lead is held by UCLA who shot a tournament low 5-under par 275 in the third round and are now 7-over par (289-283-275 = 847) for the tournament. The Bruins lead second place Kentucky by five strokes.

Individually the Lobos were led in the third round by junior Jay Reynolds with a 2-over par 72, and finished the tournament tied for 69th at 10-over par (73-75-72 = 220). Sophomore Spencer Levin posted the best tournament score for the Lobos at 5-over par (72-70-73 = 215) in a tie for 27th. Other Lobo results are freshman Charlie Beljan tied for 81st at 11-over par (76-70-75 = 221), junior Madalitso Muthiya finished at 12-over par (70-76-76 = 222) in a tie for 87th and sophomore Jay Choi finished tied for 136th at 18-over par (77-77-74 = 228).

The individual tournament lead belongs to Ryan Moore of UNLV, who shot a third round 6-under, 64 and is 9-under par (67-70-64 = 201) for the tournament. Moore leads Chris Nallen of Arizona by two strokes.

**NCAA WEST REGIONAL:** STANFORD, Calif. - The University of New Mexico men's golf team advanced to their fourth straight NCAA

Championship appearance with a second place finish at the NCAA West Regional. The Lobos shot the best round of the day, with only four players as they carded a 1-over par 281 on the par-70, 6,742-yard Stanford Golf Course. UNM finished the tournament at 9-over par (284-284-281 = 849) just three strokes behind tournament champion UNLV (281-277-288 = 846).

Individually the Lobos were led in the final round by junior Spencer Levin who moved up the leaderboard into a tie for sixth with a 3-under par 67 and finished at even par (72-71-67 = 210). Senior Madalitso Muthiya also finished tied for sixth at even par (69-71-70 = 210). Other UNM results were senior Miguel Griego finished tied for 15th at 3-over par (70-70-73 = 213), junior Jay Choi finished tied for 31st at 6-over par (73-72-71 = 216) and Charlie Beljan withdrew due to injury.

The individual championship went to Rob Grube of Stanford who shot a great final round of 5-under par 65 to finish at 6-under par three-strokes in front of Kevin Chappell of UCLA and Nathan Lashley of Arizona.

**MWC CHAMPIONSHIPS:** SUNRIVER, Ore. - The No. 5 University of New Mexico men's golf team won their third consecutive MWC Championship and a spot in a NCAA Regional, on Saturday. UNM shot a final round 2-under par 286 on the par-72, 7,568 yard Crosswater Course in Sunriver, Ore, and finished at 8-under par (285-285-286 = 856) for the tournament. The Lobos edged No. 4 UNLV by three strokes as the Rebels shot a blistering 10-under par 278 in the final round to finish at 5-under par for the tournament.

Junior Spencer Levin led the way for the Lobos but could not hold on to the individual lead. Levin fell one stroke short of Nick Becker of BYU who shot the best round of the tournament today with a 4-under par 68 to finish at 8-under par and win medalist honors. Levin shot a final round 2-under par 70 and finished at 7-under par (69-70-70 = 209) in second.

Other Lobo results were junior Jay Choi finished tied for fifth at 2-under par (70-74-70 = 214), sophomore Charlie Beljan tied for seventh at 1-under par (74-69-72 = 215), senior Madalitso Muthiya tied for 12th at 3-over par and senior Miguel Griego tied for 28th at 11-over par.

**MWC HONORS:** SUNRIVER, Ore. - University of New Mexico head men's golf coach Glen Millican picked up his second Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year award and junior Spencer Levin and sophomore Charlie Beljan were named to the MWC All-Conference team announced by the MWC at the MWC Championships on Saturday.

Millican in his fourth season led UNM to a third consecutive MWC Championship along with four regular season championships. The Lobos this season have been ranked in the top-5 all season including a number one ranking earlier this season. This season the Lobos have a 134-25-2 record. Millican also won the award in 2003.

Levin earned his second consecutive MWC All-Conference award. Levin finished second in the MWC Championships and has won three tournaments this season. Levin has a stroke average of 69.73, which ranks him second in the country. This season Levin has finished in the top-10 nine times in 11 tournaments.

Beljan also earned his second consecutive MWC All-Conference award. Beljan was the 2004 MWC Freshman of the Year and continued to play well in his sophomore campaign. Beljan is ranked 66th in the country and has a stroke average of 71.97. This season Beljan has finished in the top-20 seven times in ten events, including a tie for seventh at the MWC Championships.

**LEVIN SELECTED MWC CO-GOLFER OF THE MONTH FOR APRIL:**

New Mexico junior Spencer Levin and Colorado State senior John Hayes have been named Mountain West Conference Men's Co-Golfers of the Month for April. Levin had a stroke average of 70 over three rounds during the month, while Hayes posted a 69.83 average in six rounds played.

Levin finished tied for first with Anthony Kim of Oklahoma at the Aggie Invitational on April 16-17 in Bryan, Texas. Levin shot rounds of 67, 69 and 74 on the 7,235 yard, par 72, Traditions Golf Course. The victory for Levin was his third of the season and helped propel New Mexico to finish second as a team behind GolfWeek's top rated team in the country, Oklahoma State.

Hayes entered April with a 73.54 stroke average and only two sub-

70 scores in 26 rounds played. In his two tournaments played during April, Hayes lowered his season stroke average by almost a point (73.54 to 72.84), had three sub-70 rounds and posted his first two top 10 finishes of the year.

Hayes began the month tying for sixth place at the Arizona State Thunderbird Invitational in Phoenix, Ariz. He carded a three-round score of one-over 214 (69-73-72) on the 7,025 yard, par 71, Karsten Golf Course. This past weekend, Hayes continued his strong play at the Ping Golf Cougar Classic in Provo, Utah. He finished tied for fifth with a 54-hole score of 11-under 205 (71-65-69), including a career-best seven-under 65 in the second round.

**LEVIN NAMED BEN HOGAN FINALIST:** NORMAN, Okla. ~ Bank of America, in cooperation with Colonial Country Club, The Friends of Golf and the Golf Coaches Association of America, has announced Spencer Levin of New Mexico, UNLV's Ryan Moore and Georgia Southern's Aron Price as finalists for The Ben Hogan Award. The most prestigious award in men's college golf, The Hogan is presented annually to the top men's NCAA Division I, II or III, NAIA or junior college golfer taking into account all collegiate and amateur competitions during the last 12 months.

A junior from Elk Grove, Calif., Levin has claimed three tournaments this season: The Topy Cup, The Nelson and The Aggie Invitational. Currently ranked second nationally in stroke average at 69.73, he has also tallied three runner-up finishes to go along with three other top 10 showings.

Levin was the low amateur at last summer's U.S. Open Championship with a tie for 13th place. He won the Porter Cup, Scratch Players Championship, the California State Amateur and the Northern California State Amateur.

Additionally, Levin placed second at the Southern Amateur and Pacific Coast Amateur and advanced to the round of 16 at the U.S. Amateur. A second-team PING All-America selection last season, he competed on the U.S. World Team Amateur Championship and was named to represent the United States at this summer's Palmer Cup presented by Monster.

The three finalists are invited to attend The Hogan Award banquet on Saturday, May 14 at Colonial Country Club: the Saturday prior to the Bank of America Colonial - with the recipient announced that evening.

**AGGIE INVITATIONAL:** BRYAN, Texas - The No. 5 University of New Mexico men's golf team finished second at the 14-team Aggie Invitational. The Lobos shot a final round 292 on the par-72, Traditions Golf Course and finished at 8-over par (286-294-292 = 872). UNM fell two strokes behind team champion No. 1 Oklahoma State who finished at 6-over par (290-290-290 = 870).

Individually for the Lobos, junior Spencer Levin (67-69-74 = 210) finished in a tie for first with Anthony Kim of Oklahoma at 6-under par. Sophomore Charlie Beljan (71-71-71 = 213) finished right behind Levin in a tie for third at 3-under par. Senior Madalitso Muthiya (74-78-70 = 222) made the biggest move of the day from a tie for 38th to a tie for 18th at 6-over par, including a 2-under par 70 today. Other UNM results were junior Jay Choi (74-78-77 = 229) and senior Miguel Griego (76-76-77 = 229) tied for 40th at 13-over par.

**LEVIN NAMED TO PALMER CUP TEAM:** NORMAN, Okla. - Junior Spencer Levin of the University of New Mexico men's golf team will join Matt Every of Florida, Jeff Overton of Indiana and Pepperdine's Michael Putnam to represent the United States in the 2005 Palmer Cup presented by Monster. The annual Ryder Cup-style competition between American collegiate golfers and their counterparts from Europe will be played June 8-9 on the 7,201 yard, par 72 Whistling Straits Irish Course. Team USA leads the series, 4-3-1.

The low amateur at the 2004 U.S. Open with a tie for 13th - the best by an amateur at the Open since 1971, Levin has earned two individual titles - the Topy Cup and a first-place tie at The Nelson - as well as three runner-up, one fourth-place and a sixth-place finish this season. A junior from Elk Grove, Calif., Levin was a second-team PING All-America selection last season and currently ranks second in the nation with a 69.70 stroke average. In amateur competition last summer, Levin won the California State Amateur, Porter Cup and Scratch Players Championship while finishing second at the Pacific Coast Amateur, Southern Amateur and U.S. World Amateur Team Championship. He was named a semifinalist for The Ben Hogan Award.

The lone returnee from the 2004 U.S. Palmer Cup team, Every was a first-team PING All-America and All-SEC selection last season. Every won the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate - the third victory of his career - in the fall and has five top 10 finishes this season. He advanced to the quarterfinals of the U.S. Public Links and qualified for the U.S. Amateur. A junior from Dayton Beach, Fla., Every ranks fifth at Florida in career

wins and ninth in top-10 finishes.

A senior from Evansville, Ind., Overton will be representing his country for the second-straight season after winning two matches while leading the United States to victory at the USA vs. Japan Collegiate Golf Championship last summer. He fired an 11-under-par 61 - one stroke behind the NCAA record of 60 - en route to his sixth-career championship at the Xavier Invitational in the fall. A semifinalist for The Ben Hogan Award, Overton has also carded three runner-up finishes and two other top five showings this season. Big Ten Player of the Year and a second-team PING All-America selection last season, Overton advanced to the semifinals of the U.S. Amateur, placed second at the Porter Cup and won the New Year's Invitational and Indiana State Amateur.

The MVP of last summer's USA vs. Japan Collegiate Golf Championship, Putnam has earned medalist honors once this season along with two second-, three fifth- and an eight-place finish this season. A Tacoma, Wash., native, Putnam is Pepperdine's leader in career stroke average and is on pace to break his own single-season record of 71.00. A semifinalist for the Ben Hogan Award, he was named second-team PING All-America last season as well as All-West Coast Conference, Cleveland Golf Academic All-America and West Coast Conference All-Academic. Putnam captured the 38th Annual Pacific Coach Amateur last summer.

**LOBOS START QUICK:** New Mexico opened the spring with two straight victories but has struggled a bit of late. The Lobos are currently 115-24-2 on the season with a first place finish at the Topy Cup, the Nelson Invitational, Arizona Intercollegiate, John Burns Intercollegiate and a second place finish at the Tucker.

**LEVIN NAMED BEN HOGAN SEMIFINALIST:** NORMAN, Okla. - Junior Spencer Levin of the University of New Mexico men's golf team has been named one of 10 semifinalists for the 2005 Ben Hogan Award by Bank of America, in cooperation with Colonial Country Club, The Friends of Golf (FOG) and the Golf Coaches Association of America (GCAA). The most prestigious award in men's college golf, The Hogan is presented annually to the top men's NCAA Division I, II or III, NIAA or junior college golfer taking into account all collegiate and amateur competitions during the last 12 months.

Levin has finished in the top-10 in seven of nine tournaments the Lobos played in this season. Last summer Levin was low amateur at the U.S. Open finishing in the top-15. Levin also won the California State Amateur, Scratch Players Championship, Porter Cup Championship and was a member of the U.S. World Team.

Other semifinalists include former NCAA medalist Alejandro Cañizares of Arizona State; East Tennessee State's Rhys Davies; Oklahoma State's Pablo Martin; U.S. Amateur, U.S. Public Links and NCAA Champion Ryan Moore of UNLV; Indiana's Jeff Overton; Aron Price of Georgia Southern; Pepperdine's Michael Putnam; Matthew Rosenfeld of Texas; and Georgia Tech's Nicholas Thompson.

The Hogan Award selection committee will announce three finalists on April 20. The three finalists will attend The Hogan Award banquet on Saturday, May 14 at Colonial Country Club the Saturday prior to the Bank of America Colonial - with the recipient announced that evening.

**NATIONAL INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT:** TUCSON, Ariz. - The University of New Mexico men's golf team moved up one spot in the final round of the 14-team National Invitational Tournament to finish in sixth. The Lobos shot a final round 6-under par, 282 on the par-72, 7,094 yard OMNI Tucson National Golf Course, and finished at 16-under par (280-286-282 = 848) for the tournament. TCU led wire-to-wire for the team championship at 26-under par.

Individually the Lobos were led by senior Madalitso Muthiya who finished tied for 12th at 5-under par (70-70-71 = 211). Also finishing

under par was sophomore Charlie Beljan tied for 19th at 3-under par (73-69-71 = 213) and junior Spencer Levin tied for 31st at 1-under par (71-75-69 = 215). Other UNM results were junior Jay Choi tied for 37th at even par (70-73-71 = 216) and senior Jay Reynolds tied for 70th at 10-over par (69-72-85 = 226).

The individual title went to Matt Bortis of Arkansas at 12-under par edging out Michael Putnam of Pepperdine and Matthew Rosenfelds of Texas by one stroke.

**HALL OF FAME INVITATIONAL:** HOUSTON, Texas - The University of New Mexico men's golf team finished third at the 19-team Hall of Fame Invitational. The Lobos shot a 3-over par 291 in the final round and finished at 1-over par 865 (292-282-291) on the par-72, 7,352 yard Redstone Golf Club. The team championship went to top ranked Oklahoma State who finished at 18-under par.

Individually UNM was led by junior Spencer Levin who shot a final round 3-under par 69 to finish tied for fourth at 5-under par (70-72-69 = 211). Other Lobo results were sophomore Charlie Beljan tied for 11th at 2-under par (69-71-74 = 214), junior Jay Choi tied for 20th at 2-over par (76-68-74 = 218), senior Madalitso Muthiya tied for 68th at 11-over par (77-76-74 = 227) and junior Mark Anderson tied for 72nd at 12-over par (80-71-77 = 228).

Medalist honors went to UNLV's Ryan Moore, who finished at 10-under par.

**SOUTHERN HIGHLANDS CHAMPIONSHIP:** LAS VEGAS, Nev. - The University of New Mexico men's golf team finished in a tie for 10th place at the Southern Highlands Collegiate Championship. Competing against 15-teams all ranked in the top-25, the Lobos struggled on the final round and finished the tournament at 32-over par (303-289-304 = 896). The team championship went to host UNLV who ran away with the tournament at 9-under par (294-281-280 = 855).

Individually UNM was led by junior Spencer Levin who finished 1-under par (73-67-75 = 215) tied for sixth. Other Lobo results are junior Jay Choi tied for 40th at 9-over par (76-71-78 = 225), sophomore Charlie Beljan tied for 50th at 10-over par (76-74-76 = 226), junior Mark Anderson tied for 60th at 15-over par (79-77-75 = 231) and senior Miguel Griego tied for 76th at 26-over par (78-83-81 = 242).

Medalist honors went to Daniel Im of UCLA who finished tied with Mark Anderson of South Carolina at 7-under par, but won the tournament in a playoff.

**ARIZONA INTERCOLLEGIATE:** TUCSON, Ariz. - The University of New Mexico men's golf team came storming back in the final round and a half to win the 16-team Arizona Intercollegiate by two strokes. The Lobos shot the second best 18-hole total in school history in the third round with a 13-under par 271 on the par-71, 6,793 yard Arizona National Golf Course. UNM finished the tournament at 12-under par (289-280-271 = 840) two strokes better than conference rival BYU.

Individually the Lobos had three players finish in the top-10. Spencer Levin finished in second one stroke back at 10-under par. Levin shot rounds of 70, 67 and 66 to finish one stroke behind Arizona State's Alejandro Canizares who led wire to wire. Jay Choi finished tied for 7th at 3-under par (72-72-66) with a third round 5-under par 66. The final Lobo in the top-10 was Miguel Griego in ninth at 2-under par with rounds of 72, 70 and 69.

Other Lobo results were Mark Anderson tied for 25th at 4-over par (75-72-70), Charlie Beljan tied for 50th at 9-over par (77-71-74) and Jeb Gruenberger playing as an individual finished 84th at 29-over par.

**SPENCER LEVIN SIXTH AT WESTERN REFINING ALL-AMERICAN:** EL PASO, TEXAS - Junior Spencer Levin of the University of New Mexico men's golf team finished tied for sixth at the 54-hole Western Refining College All-American Golf Classic. Levin entered the final round in second place, but struggled on the final 18-holes to finish in

a tie for sixth among 30 of the top college golfers in the country. Levin shot a 4-under par 209 (70-64-75) on the 6,817 yard par-71 El Paso Country Club.

The champion of the tournament was Nicholas Thompson of Georgia Tech who won a playoff against Matthew Rosenfeld of Texas. Both players finished the tournament at 9-under par.

**LEVIN HELPS U.S. WIN EISENHOWER TROPHY:** Spencer Levin represented the United States at the World Amateur Team Championships in Puerto Rico on Oct. 28-31. Levin helped the United States to their second consecutive World Team Amateur championship. Levin finished the tournament in second place at 10-under par. Ryan Moore was low individual at 12-under par and Lee Williams finished tied for 25th at 2-under par.

**LEVIN NAMED MWC GOLFER FOR OCTOBER:** Junior Spencer Levin was named Mountain West Conference Men's Golfer of the Month for October, collecting the award for the second straight time. Levin won the September award after capturing medalist honors at the Topy Cup in Japan with an 11-under 205. For the month of October, Levin tied for first and finished second in two tournament appearances, while carding six consecutive rounds under-par. Each of his three single round scores of 65 during the month tie for the ninth-best round in UNM history.

Levin opened the month with a second-place finish at the William H. Tucker Invitational in Albuquerque, N.M., Oct. 1-2. His three day total of nine-under 207 (71-65-71) on the par 72, Championship Course was two shots off medalist honors and helped the Lobos to a second-place finish. At the Nelson Invitational in Stanford, Calif., Oct. 22-24, Levin tied for the individual crown after setting a school record with a 54-hole total of nine-under 198 (65-65-68) on the par 69, 6,444-yard Stanford Golf Course. Levin was also part of the school record 54-hole team score of 830 that captured the team title by five strokes over fellow MWC member UNLV.

Levin lowered his stroke average by 0.89 in October and currently leads the MWC with a 67.78 stroke average.

**NELSON INVITATIONAL RESULTS:** The University of New Mexico men's golf team won the 16-team Nelson Invitational in Stanford, Calif. The Lobos shot a final round 284 and finished the tournament with a school record 54-hole total of 830 (277-269-284) on the 6,444 yard, par-69 Stanford golf Course. UNM edged UNLV by five strokes to win their second championship of the season.

Junior Spencer Levin won his second tournament of the year as he shared medalist honors with Steve Tiley of Georgia State. Levin shot a one-under par 68 on the final day and finished the invitational with a school record 54-hole score of 198 (65-65-68).

Senior Jay Reynolds also finished in the top-10 in a tie for fourth. Reynolds finished at even-par (68-67-72). Other Lobo results were senior Miguel Griego tied for 16th at five-over par (73-69-70), while junior Jay Choi (75-68-74) and sophomore Charlie Beljan (71-70-76) both tied for 42nd at 10-over par.

**SCHOOL RECORDS FALL:** The Lobos set three school records at the Nelson Invitational in Stanford. Two team records were broken with an 18-hole score of 269 in the second round was the best 18-hole score in school history and the 830 54-hole score was also the best in school history. Junior Spencer Levin also set a school record of his own with a 54-hole score of 198 beating Michael Letzig's 199.

**MIGUEL GRIEGO ENJOYING SENIOR SEASON:** Senior Miguel Griego is playing the best golf of his college career to start the 2004-05 season. Griego who saw limited action on the course last year has finished in the top-16 in the first three tournaments this season. Griego was under par in five of his nine rounds in those tournaments, including

a career-best 67 in the second round of the Topy Cup.

**LEVIN NAMED MWC GOLFER FOR SEPTEMBER:** Junior Spencer Levin of the UNM men's golf team was named Mountain West Conference Men's Golfer of the Month for September after taking medalist honors and leading the Lobos to the team title at the Topy Cup in Japan. New Mexico defeated Auburn, Texas and Arizona in the first fall tournament.

Levin began the 2004 fall season with a first place finish at the Topy Cup in Fukushima, Japan September 7-9. He captured the title by four strokes after carding three straight under-par rounds of 68-71-66. His 54-hole total of 11-under, 205 on the par-72, 7,086 Tanagura Country Club course is the eighth-best round in UNM history.

**LEVIN INVITED TO ALL-AMERICAN TOURNAMENT:** Junior Spencer Levin was invited to play in the Western Refining College All-American Golf Classic on Nov. 22-23 in El Paso, Texas. The tournament is a special invite only, where only the top-30 golfers in the country are invited. Levin will participate in the tournament for the first time in his career after being named a second team All-American last year and a preseason All-American this season.

**TUCKER RESULTS:** The University of New Mexico men's golf team finished second at the 50th annual William H. Tucker Invitational. The Lobos could not overcome a six-stroke deficit and fell two strokes short of Arizona. UNM shot an even-par round of 288 today and finished the tournament at 7-under par (286-283-288 = 857), while Arizona carded a 4-over par 292 today and finished the tournament at 9-under par (279-284-292 = 855).

Individually, junior Spencer Levin was just outdistanced by UNLV's Ryan Moore. The two were tied at 10-under with three holes to play, but Levin bogeyed No. 16 and Moore birdied No. 18 for a two-stroke win. Levin shot a 1-under par 71 today and finished at 9-under par (71-65-71 = 207), while Moore shot the low round of the day with a 7-under par 65, which included six consecutive birdies, and finished at 11-under par (71-69-65 = 205).

The Lobos had three other players in the top-20, with senior Miguel Griego tied for 11th, sophomore Charlie Beljan tied for 13th and senior Jay Reynolds tied for 16th. Griego was 1-under par today and ended the tournament at even par (70-75-71 = 216). Beljan carded a round of even par today and was 1-over par (71-74-72-217) for the tournament. Reynolds ended today's round 3-over par and finished the tournament at 2-over par (75-69-74 = 218). Other Lobo results are senior Madaliso Muthiya finished tied for 46th at 7-over par (74-75-74 = 223), junior Mark Anderson, playing as an individual, finished tied for 59th at 9-over par (76-77-72 = 225) and junior Jeb Gruenberger, playing as an individual, finished tied for 91st at 19-over par (73-78-84 = 235).

**TOPY CUP RESULTS:** The University of New Mexico men's golf team won the Topy Cup in Fukushima, Japan. The Lobos shot a third round 5-under par 283 on the par-72, 7,086-yard Tanagura Country Club and finished the tournament at 17-under par (285-279-283 = 847). UNM barely outdistanced Auburn by three strokes as the Tigers shot a third round 12-under par 276 and finished at 14-under par. Tohoku Fukushi finished 21-strokes back at 4-over par in third.

Junior Spencer Levin took home medalist honors with a final round 6-under par 66. Levin who led after the opening round and fell to third yesterday, finished at 11-under par (68-71-66 = 205) winning by 4-strokes. Senior Miguel Griego and sophomore Charlie Beljan also finished in the top-10. Griego finished tied for third at 2-under par (71-67-72 = 210), while Beljan finished tied for eighth at 6-under par (72-71-71 = 214). Other Lobo results were senior Jay Reynolds (74-73-76 = 223) and junior Mark Anderson (79-70-74-223) both finished tied for 32<sup>nd</sup> at 7-over par.
