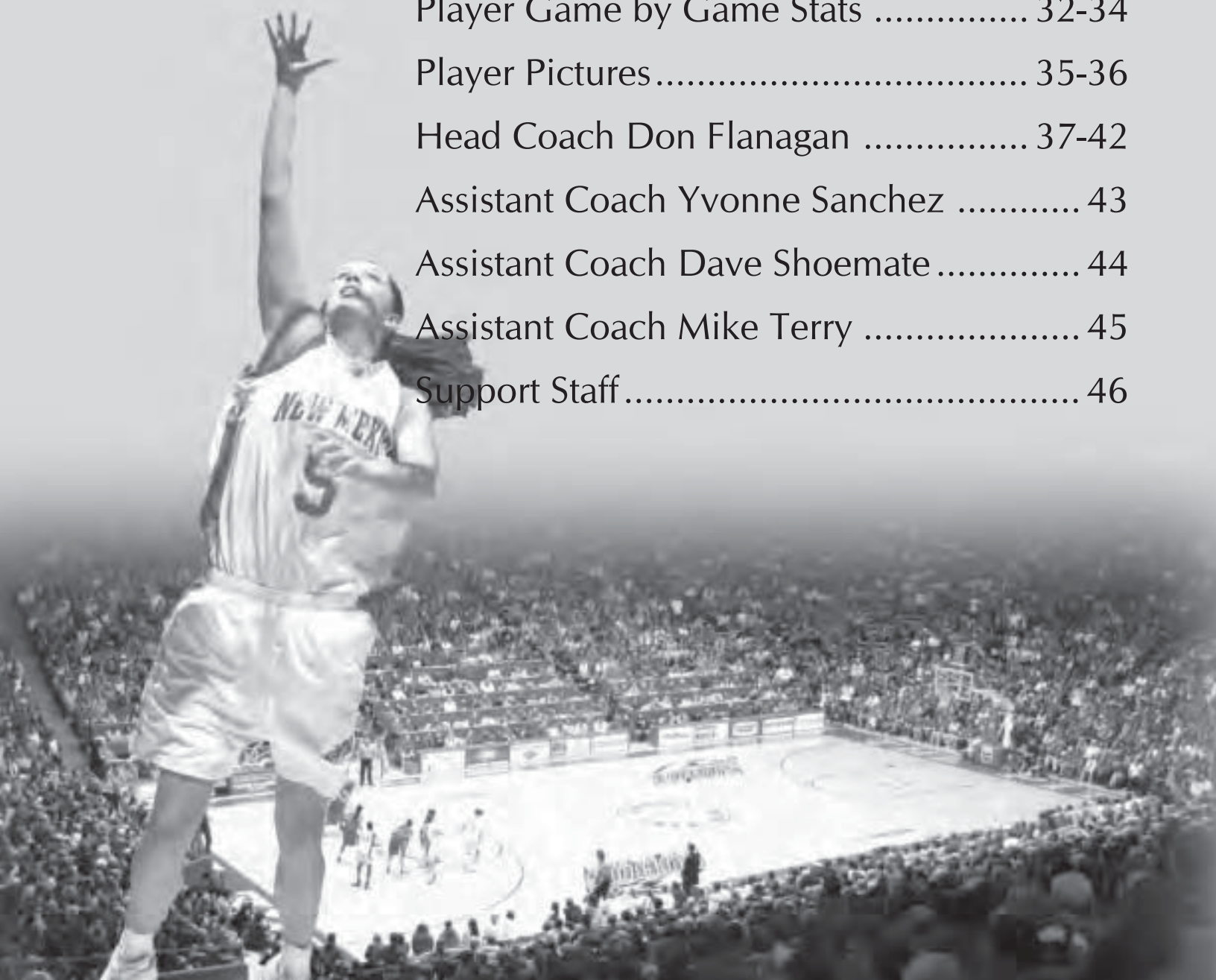

The University of New Mexico Lobos begin something of a new era in 2005-06. Although the Lobos are coming off four consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament and three straight Mountain West Conference tournament championships, UNM will be without four-year starters Mandi Moore and Lindsey Arndt.

The Lobos' cupboard is not bare though, as they return 10 players, including three starters, off last year's 26-5 squad. The 2005-06 Lobos will need to use that depth and experience to contend for a MWC title and their fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament.

"We lost two key players to graduation, one at the point position and one at the four position, which will be difficult to replace," head coach Don Flanagan said. "I believe we have the experience and players to fill those spots but I think we will have to do it by committee."

The returning members played on one of the best teams in school history last year. New Mexico won a school-record-tying 26 games, captured a share of its second straight Mountain West Conference regular season title with a 12-2 record, became the first team in conference history to win three consecutive MWC tournament championships and made its school-record fourth straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

For the 2005-06

Lobos to be successful all members will have to continue to improve their games. Flanagan expects the skill, strength and quickness to be improved this season after a good off-season, individual workouts and practice. The only concern for this group is who will become the vocal leader and how they mesh together with 10 returning players and three newcomers all looking for playing time.

"I am looking forward to seeing how this group plays together," Flanagan said. "Our goal every season is to be competitive in the conference, win the conference tournament and get a bid to the NCAA Tournament."

The leadership of the 2005-06 Lobos will come from their senior class of Abbie Letz, Jana Francis and Judy Vogt. Letz has seen considerable playing time all three years at UNM and was one of two players to start in every game last season. Francis and Vogt also bring starting experience from last season last season.

Letz is the most experienced player on the team, playing in every game in her three-year college career, including 51 starts. A good outside shooter, Letz can shoot from almost anywhere on the floor. She also possesses size at the guard position, which allows her to take smaller guards into the post. Letz will be asked to become more of a scorer and leader in her final year.

"Abbie comes into the season physically ready," Flanagan said. "We are depending on Abbie to be

a leader for us and use her physical skills and shooting range to help us score from the guard position."

Francis came into her own in 2004-05, scoring more points last season than she had in her first two seasons combined. She will also be asked to take on more of a scoring role hoping to fill the void left inside by Lindsey Arndt. Francis has the game to play both in the post or to step outside for a 3-point shot.

"Jana is our only post player who can step out and shoot the 3-point shot," Flanagan said. "She has to help us with her shooting, because her range allows for more space in the post area."

Vogt, a former transfer, begins her third season as a Lobo. Vogt is one of UNM's best defensive players and usually draws the assignment of defending the opponent's top guard. She is not just a defensive specialist though as her offensive game continues to improve every season. In 2004-05, Vogt hit a number of clutch shots for New Mexico and with her off-season work Vogt should be counted on to score more this season.

"Judy is going to be an important part of our team this season," Flanagan said. "She is an outstanding defender who will defend the best player, but she is also going to be the back-up at the point guard position."

The junior class of Katie Montgomery, Julie Briody,

though, is capable of filling the role as she showed last year in Moore's absence at Air Force, when she had 18 points, six rebounds and four assists. Montgomery is a good ball handler and makes smart decisions, finishing third in the MWC in assists/turnover ratio and seventh in assists. Montgomery is also an excellent shooter as she led the MWC in 3-point field goal percentage at 44.6 percent last season.

"Katie is going to take over at point guard," Flanagan said. "I want her to continue to look for her shot as well as distribute the ball, because I think she is capable of giving us more scoring at that position than we have had in the past."

Briody is a good all-around player who can get to the basket and shoot from long range. She worked extremely hard

Timi E-Nunu and Wande Olude bring ball handling, outside shooting and a physical presence. Montgomery will take over the point guard role, Briody is a quick guard with range, while E-Nunu and Olude provide a physical presence in the post.

Montgomery could have the most pressure of any player this year as she takes over the point guard duties left behind by Moore, the all-time assists leader in both the MWC and at UNM. Montgomery,

on her game this summer and could be prime for a breakout season.

"Julie is an aggressive player who can penetrate and get to the foul line," Flanagan said. "She needs to continue to work on her consistency, though, at both the offensive and defensive end, but she has the ability to score."

Olude is the strongest player on the Lobo squad and will have to become more of a presence inside this season. She worked extremely hard on her conditioning and offensive game in the summer and looks to be in the best shape of her life. With the departure of Arndt and Jenny Shettters, Olude will have the opportunity to see considerable time in the post.

"Wande improved her strength and conditioning this summer," Flanagan said. "She is a physical player who needs to learn how to sustain her strength and stamina over a period of time."

E-Nunu is an athletic forward who continues to improve every season. She is a good defender and rebounder improving her offensive play and

capable of coming in and scoring.

Marsh is the leading returning scorer and rebounder for New Mexico after averaging 13.0 points and 5.5 rebounds a game in 2004-05. She was named the MWC newcomer of the year, was a third team all-MWC selection, was named to the MWC all-tournament team and became the first freshman ever to be named MWC Tournament MVP. Marsh grew into her role last season as she finished the season scoring in double figures in 17 of the last 18 games. She also broke the UNM single-season mark for free throw attempts and was third in free throws made. Marsh will be asked to anchor the post area in 2005-06.

"Dionne is bigger, stronger and faster this year compared to last year," Flanagan said. "She has worked on her shooting and is trying to extend her range and become a more complete player."

conditioning in the off-season.

"Timi, like Wande, improved her strength and conditioning this summer," Flanagan said. "She continues to improve every year on her offense and defense."

The depth for New Mexico doesn't stop there though, as the Lobos return three sophomores in Dionne Marsh, Lindsay Black and Brandi Kimble. Marsh was a force in the post as she gained experience, while Black and Kimble showed they are

bigger role this season.

"Lindsay is a much improved player this season," Flanagan said. "She is better defensively and I think she will be able to score for us this season."

Kimble is an athletic guard who is capable of getting a shot at anytime. She played in 19 games last season as she tried to comeback from a knee injury she suffered as a senior in high school. Kimble, like Black, improved her game this summer and is expected to see more playing time this season.

"Brandi looks to be 100 percent this season," Flanagan said. "She is much improved as well and looks like a different player on the floor."

The Lobos also return Morgan Saso as a redshirt freshman and welcome three new freshmen in Rachel Majewski, Angela Hartill and Kyle Lardner.

"This group of freshmen are talented players," Flanagan said. "They are physically ready and will add depth to our team."

Another tough non-conference schedule awaits the Lobos this season with the preseason WNIT as UNM hosts Oral Roberts in the first round and could play teams such as California, Oklahoma, Connecticut and Boston College should they advance. New Mexico will also have road games at Texas, Arizona State and New Mexico State. The home portion of the schedule brings Marist, Oklahoma State, Idaho, Creighton, North Dakota State and Louisiana-Monroe for tournament games and Minnesota, Oklahoma and New Mexico State for single games at The Pit.

"It is one of the toughest, if not the toughest, non-conference schedule we have played," Flanagan said. "We are not only playing the WNIT but have road games at Texas and Arizona State as well as home games against Minnesota, Oklahoma, Creighton and Oklahoma State."

Mountain West Conference season opens at home game Utah on January 5. The MWC race will be as tight as ever with seven of the nine teams returning at least three starters. For the third consecutive year the season will end at the Pepsi Center in Denver, Colo., with the MWC Tournament.

"Our conference is going to be extremely difficult this year," Flanagan said. "It is difficult every year but with the addition of a top 25 team like TCU it could be the toughest it has ever been."

**GENERAL INFORMATION:** A shooting guard who has played in every game her first three seasons...capable of shooting the ball from anywhere on the floor...will take on more of a leadership role this season.

**2004-05:** Started in all 31 games...hit a career-high seven free throws for a season-high and conference career-high 17 points against San Diego State...scored 16 points on a season-high four 3-point

field goals against Arizona State to earn MWC Player of the Week honors on Dec. 20...recorded her first career double-double against Air Force with 10 points and a career-high 11 rebounds, including a career-high six defensive rebounds...scored in double figures 12 times with eight coming in MWC games.

**2003-04:** Played in every game and started 19...grabbed at least five or more rebounds in 10 games...12th in the conference in 3-point field goal percentage (.318)...scored a season-high 14 points on 5-of-11 shooting at home against Colorado State...hit a 3-point shot late in the game to help seal victories against Utah and Colorado State at home and at UNLV...opened the MWC Tournament with 12 points and seven rebounds against Air Force.
