SEASON RECAP

The 2004-05 New Mexico women's golf team maintained the program's long-standing tradition of excellence with two tournament wins, a berth in the NCAA Central Regional and a top-20 ranking all season.

UNM took second at the Mountain West Championships and placed in the top 10 in seven of its nine tournaments. The Lobos won their second straight Landfall Tradition in October and captured the Lady Gamecock Classic in March. New Mexico has now won an impressive 12 tournament titles the past four seasons. At the prestigious NCAA Match Play Championships in November, the Lobos claimed the consolation title after winning three consecutive matches, becoming one of only five teams in the tournament to win at least three matches.

For its efforts on another outstanding regular season, UNM was rewarded with the No. 3 seed in the NCAA Central Regional, marking the 13th consecutive year the Lobos have earned a postseason bid. The Lobos came up just eight strokes shy of advancing to their second straight NCAA Championships appearance with a 13th-place finish at the regional. New Mexico's incredible run of 84 consecutive weeks ranked in the top 15 was halted with a No. 16 ranking after the NCAA Central Regionals. After a brief one-week absence, the Lobos re-entered the top 15 and finished the final *Golfweek* rankings at No. 15 for the season.

Individually, the Lobos were again the class of the Mountain West Conference, leading the all-conference team with three selections. It marks the fifth straight year that New Mexico has placed at least three student-athletes on the All-MWC team. Senior **Kailin Downs**, a two-time MWC Golfer of the Year, became the first four-time honoree in MWC history. Sophomore **Ashley Rollins** garnered honors for the second straight year while junior **Christine Fernandez** earned all-league accolades for the second time in her career and first at UNM. Fernandez was named to the All-WAC team when she was a freshman at the University of Tulsa.

Downs closed out her storied career with a 74.38 scoring average, the best in the history of UNM women's golf. The Bend, Ore., native also owns the sophomore (74.10) and junior (73.91) scoring-average marks at UNM, and came up just percentage points short of setting the senior record with a 74.67 average, which was still good for second in the Mountain West this season. She earned Mountain West Golfer of the Month honors in September and October, marking the sixth and seventh times she has won the award. Overall, Downs placed in the top five on 15 occasions during her career, including a second-place finish at the Gamecock Classic. She was also named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District VI Women's At-Large team for the second straight year.

Fernandez was second on the team with a 75.26 average, which was also good for fourth in the Mountain West. Rollins, the 2004 Mountain West Freshman of the Year, was seventh in the MWC with a 76.04 average while senior Christina Spence was ninth in the conference with a 76.54 average. Redshirt freshman **Giselle Claux** (78.19 avg.) started in six tournaments and freshman **Alexandra Phelps** (79.93 avg.) started four times for UNM this season.

In the final *Golfweek* rankings, the Lobos had four players ranked in the top 150. Downs led the way at 42nd, while Fernandez was 71st, Rollins was 128th and Spence was 149th.

The Lobos wrapped up another successful fall season after winning the Landfall Tradition for the second straight year and by placing in the top 10 in all five of its tournaments. The Lobos closed out the fall ranked eighth in the *Golf World* College Coaches Poll and 12th in the *Golfweek* rankings.

In their last tournament of the fall season, the Lobos placed ninth at the Collegiate Match Play Championship played in Howey-in-the-Hills, Fla. UNM defeated UNLV, 4-1, on the last day of the tournament to claim the consolation bracket title. After falling in the first round to Florida, the sev-

enth-seeded Lobos rattled off three straight victories in taking ninth place.

The annual Collegiate Match Play Championship features 16 seeded teams in a double-elimination bracket while playing in a match-play format. The Lobos defeated 15th-seeded North Carolina and sixth-seeded Tennessee on the second day of the tournament.

Before the Match Play Championship, the Lobos won their second straight Landfall Tradition title Oct. 29-31 in Wilmington, N.C. New Mexico also placed in the top 10 in its first three tournaments, taking second at the Dick McGuire Invitational, seventh at the Stanford Intercollegiate and eighth at the NCAA Fall Preview.

The Lobos began spring action Feb. 7-9 at the Regional Challenge in Palos Verdes, Calif., which featured a loaded field of ranked teams. UNM finished 10th in the tournament, but the tough competition braced the Lobos for the Gamecock Classic March 11-13 in Blythewood, S.C. UNM won the classic by 10 shots over No. 20 Furman in winning its second tournament title of the season. Downs took second and Spence placed sixth in leading the Lobos to victory.

In the final tuneup before the Mountain West Championships, UNM placed 11th at the PING/Arizona State Invitational. The Lobos regrouped three weeks later and had a strong showing at the MWC Championships, coming up just two strokes short of winning its fifth Mountain West crown in six years. New Mexico and UNLV shared the lead throughout the final round, and were tied after 16 holes, but the Rebels got the best of UNM on the last two holes to claim the title.

The Lobos, who have participated in every NCAA Regional since the field was expanded in 1993, got off to a fast start in the first round of the Central Regional Championships in Lubbock with their best single round in school history at a regional, shooting a 3-over 291 as a team to tie for second. The Lobos struggled on the second day, however, and fell to 16th place. UNM made a charge in the third round, tying for the second-best team score of the day, but it wasn't enough to propel the Lobos into the NCAA Championships.

Although the Lobos fell short of their goal in making it to their second straight NCAA Championships appearance, the 2004-05 season was highlighted by several outstanding individual accomplishments, two tournament victories and a berth in the NCAA Central Regionals. With their 13th consecutive postseason bid and 12 tournament titles the past four seasons, the Lobos have proved they are consistent winners who belong with the elite programs in the nation.

THE CLASS OF THE MOUNTAIN WEST - The Lobos are clearly the class of the Mountain West Conference when it comes to women's golf. UNM has won four of the six MWC Championships and finished the season as the highest ranked team in the league at No. 15 in the nation.

For the fifth straight year, New Mexico placed at least three student-athletes on the all-conference team. This year, the Lobos once again led the league with three selections as **Kailin Downs**, **Christine Fernandez** and **Ashley Rollins** earned all-league accolades. Downs became the first four-time honoree in Mountain West history, while Rollins garnered back-to-back honors.

The Lobos owned four of the top nine scoring averages in the MWC and Downs was named the MWC Golfer of the Month twice this season. Downs was second in the league with a 74.67 average, while **Christine Fernandez** was fourth at 75.26. **Ashley Rollins** was seventh, **Christina Spence** was ninth, **Giselle Claux** was 19th and **Alexandra Phelps** was 23rd in the conference.

PLAYER NOTES -

DOWN'S BECOMES FIRST FOUR-TIME ALL-CONFERENCE HONOREE IN MOUNTAIN WEST HISTORY - Senior **Kailin Downs** became the first player in the history of the Mountain West Conference to be named to the all-conference team four consecutive years after earning all-league honors at the 2005 Mountain West Championship awards banquet. Downs, one of the most prolific players in New Mexico history, closed her storied career as the all-time scoring average leader in the school record books with a 74.38 average.

Downs was named the Mountain West Golfer of the Month in October, marking the second time she has won the award this season and seventh in her career. She also garnered the award in September. Downs' key performance to earn the award came at the Landfall Tradition, where she placed second with a career-best score of 211. She also took third at the Dick McGuire Invitational. Overall, she placed in the top five on 15 occasions during her career, including a second-place finish at the Gamecock Classic March 11-13.

The Bend, Ore., product led the team and was second in the Mountain West with a 74.67 scoring average. She finished the season ranked 42nd in the country by *Golfweek*.

Downs, who was named a *Golfweek* second-team preseason All-American for the second consecutive year, established herself as one of the nation's premier collegiate golfers and solidified her national standing with an excellent summer of golf in 2004. She advanced to the round of 32 in match play at the 2004 U.S. Women's Amateur and won two of her three matches in helping lead Team USA past Japan in the 2004 Fuji Xerox U.S. vs. Japan Collegiate Golf Championships held July 16-18 in Ichihara, Japan.

Downs earned honorable mention All-America honors for the second straight season in 2003-04 after setting a new UNM junior record with a 73.91 scoring average. She also owns the sophomore record (74.1). Downs was the 2004 recipient of the Edith Cummings Munson Award, which is presented by the NGCA to an individual based on academic and athletic achievement. She boasted a 3.82 GPA in General Management to earn NGCA Scholar-Athlete honors for the third straight season and also earned a spot on the CoSIDA Academic All-America third team.

Last season, Downs was named the MWC Women's Golfer of the Month in September after winning her first career tournament at the 2003 Dick McGuire Invitational and Co-MWC Golfer of the Month in February after placing fourth at the Northrup Grumman Regional Challenge. Downs was the only player in the conference to earn Golfer of the Month honors twice in 2002-03 (September and April). As a freshman, Downs garnered Golfer of the Month honors in October of 2001.

ASHLEY'S ROLLIN' - Sophomore **Ashley Rollins**, who made a splash onto the collegiate golf scene her freshman season, earned All-Mountain West honors for the second straight year after tying for fourth at the conference championships, a career-best. A third-team preseason All-American by *Golfweek*, Rollins lived up to the hype in her first season as a Lobo, establishing a new freshman record at UNM with a 74.62 scoring average and finishing the season ranked No. 52. For her efforts, she was named the Mountain West Freshman of the Year and also earned All-MWC honors.

One of the top recruits in Coach Booth's tenure, Rollins made the cut at the 2003 U.S. Women's Amateur and won all four of her matches at the AJGA Canor Cup prior to attending UNM.

In her first action of the 2004-05 season, Rollins tied for 14th at the Dick McGuire Invitational with a 3-over 222. She was the team's highest finisher at the NCAA Central Regionals, tying for 20th place. Rollins finished the season with a scoring average is 76.04, good for seventh in the Mountain West. She closed the year ranked 128th by *Golfweek*.

FERNANDEZ EARNS ALL-CONFERENCE FOR SECOND TIME IN HER CAREER -

Junior **Christine Fernandez** was a welcome addition to the 2003-04 Lobo squad after transferring from the University of Tulsa. After starting in all but one tournament last season, Fernandez stepped up even more in her second year, and became one of the elite players in the Mountain West.

She was named to the All-Mountain West team for her fourth place finish at the conference championships, marking the second time she has earned all-conference accolades in her career. She was also named to the All-WAC team as a freshman at the University of Tulsa.

Fernandez finished the year ranked 71st by *Golfweek* with a 75.26 average, which was also good for fourth best in the MWC.

Fernandez tied for 17th at the Dick McGuire Invitational in her first action of the 2004-05 season, but she really stepped into the national spotlight with a great showing at the NCAA Fall Preview. In a tournament that featured 16 ranked teams, Fernandez shot a 1-over 214 to tie for fifth, which was her best 54-hole total as a Lobo. She led the Lobos with a 217 at the Stanford Intercollegiate, marking her third top-20 finish of the season.

Fernandez finished in the top 10 in three tournaments last season, including a career-best tie for second at the Dr. Thompson Invitational in Hawai'i, where she shot a season-low round of 68 in the second round. She also placed in the top 10 at the Las Vegas Founders Women's Collegiate Showdown and shot a season-low 219 to tie for ninth at the Mountain West Championships. The Las Vegas, Nev., native was the Lobos' top finisher at the 2004 NCAA Championships, carding a 7-over 295 to tie for 33rd.

SPENCE FINISHES STRONG IN SENIOR SEASON - Christina Spence, who garnered All-MWC accolades in 2002-03, worked her back into the starting lineup in 2004-05 and made the most of her senior season. Spence was ninth in the conference with a 76.54 scoring average in eight tournament appearances. She placed in the top 20 five times this season, including season-best sixth-place showing at the Gamecock Classic. In her last Mountain West Championships, Spence placed 11th. She finished the season ranked 149th by *Golfweek*.

NEW ADDITION - Redshirt freshman **Giselle Claux**, a native of Lima, Peru, joined the Lobos for the 2004 spring season after sitting out fall competition. A talented golfer with international experience, Claux competed for the Peruvian National Team in several Junior South American tournaments. She placed fourth at the 2003 Junior South American tournament in Montevideo, Uruguay.

Claux started in six tournaments in her first season of action at UNM. In her first collegiate tournament, she tied for 78th at the Dick McGuire Invitational. She dramatically improved in her second tournament, tying for 31st at the Stanford Intercollegiate.

Claux really came alive at the Collegiate Match Play Championships, winning all four of her matches in the No. 5 position against Florida, North Carolina, Tennessee and UNLV. In her first Mountain West Championships appearance, Claux placed a season-best 16th with a 235. She closed the year ranked 19th in the Mountain West with a 78.19 average.

NEW ADDITION, Pt. 2 - Freshman **Alexandra Phelps**, a native of Albuquerque, contributed to her hometown Lobos in her first season. Phelps won the 2004 Class 5A state golf championship and also won the 2004 Albuquerque Women's City Championship. She earned the *Albuquerque Tribune* Lighthouse Award/Athlete of the Year for girl's golf in 2004. She played as an individual in the Dick McGuire Invitational and started in the NCAA Fall Preview and Stanford Intercollegiate. Phelps' top performance of the season came at the Gamecock Classic, where she tied for ninth place with a 236. Phelps finished the season ranked 23rd in the Mountain West with a 79.93 scoring average.

TOURNAMENT RECAPS -

LOBOS FINISH SEASON WITH 13TH PLACE FINISH AT NCAA CENTRAL REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS (May 5-7) - The 14th-ranked New Mexico women's golf shot a 12-over 300 in the final round of the NCAA Central Regional Championships, which tied for the second best team score of the day, but it wasn't enough to propel the Lobos into the NCAA Championships. Needing to finish among the top eight teams to advance to the NCAA Championships, New Mexico tied for 13th in the 21-team field with a 59-over 923 (291-332-300), eight strokes behind eighth-place Arkansas.

Ashley Rollins was UNM's highest finisher as she tied for 20th place with a 10-over 226 (72-80-74). Rollins carded a team-best 2-over 74 in the final round. Christine Fernandez was only one shot shy of Rollins in the third round, firing a 3-over 75. For the tournament, Fernandez posted scores of 71-83-75--229 (+13) to tie for 31st.

Closing out her storied career at the regional was senior Kailin Downs. One of the most prolific golfers in UNM history, Downs tied for 63rd with a 19-over 235 (72-84-79) in her last tournament. Christina Spence also closed out her career at the regional. Spence carded a 4-over 76 in her last round and finished 21-over for the tournament (76-85-76--237) to tie for 77th. Giselle Claux finished at 26-over (78-89-75--242), tying for 93rd.

No. 3 Auburn won the tournament with a 32-over 896 (294-309-293). Texas A&M, Missouri, Arizona State, Tulsa, Purdue, Michigan State and Arkansas also advanced to the NCAA Championships held May 17-20 at the Sunriver Resort in Sunriver, Ore.

UNM COMES UP JUST TWO STROKES SHORT OF MOUNTAIN WEST TITLE (April

21-23) - The No. 14 New Mexico women's golf team came just two strokes short of claiming its fifth Mountain West title in six years as No. 25 UNLV bested the Lobos to claim its second straight Mountain West championship. For the tournament, UNLV shot a 46-over 898 (295-298-305), while the Lobos shot a 48-over 900 (300-294-306). The teams shared the lead throughout the final round, and were tied after 16 holes, but the Rebels got the best of UNM on the last two holes to claim the title.

Christine Fernandez and Ashley Rollins each tied for fourth place with an 11-over 224. Rollins shot a 4-over 75 in the third round, while Fernandez carded a 7-over 78.

Senior Kailin Downs took 10th place with a 15-over 228 (78-75-75). Fellow senior Christina Spence placed 11th with a 16-over 72-79-78--229. Giselle Claux tied for 16th place with an 80-74-81--235 (+ 22).

LOBOS PLACE 11TH AT PING/ARIZONA STATE INVITATIONAL (April 1-3) - In

the final tuneup before the Mountain West Championships at the end of the month, the 12th-ranked New Mexico women's golf team placed 11th at the PING/Arizona State Invitational with a 303-299-305--907 (+43). No. 7 Arizona State and No. 2 UCLA each finished with an 870, but ASU walked away with the title by winning the tiebreaker, which was the score of the fifth player.

Individually, Christina Spence tied for 16th place with a 74-73-76--223 (+ 7), marking her eighth career top 20 finish. Ashley Rollins also placed in the top 20, shooting a 74-72-78--224 (+ 8) to tie for 20th.

Christine Fernandez fired a 13-over 229 (77-76-76) to tie for 46th, while senior Kailin Downs carded a 17-over 233 (78-80-75) to tie for 62nd. Alexandra Phelps finished in 84th with an 81-78-83--242 (+ 26). Playing as an individual, Giselle Claux tied for 75th with an 86-77-75--238 (+ 22).

UNM WINS SECOND TOURNAMENT OF THE SEASON WITH 10-SHOT WIN AT GAMECOCK CLASSIC (March 11-13) - The No. 13 New Mexico women's golf team won

its second tournament championship of the 2004-05 season by claiming the Gamecock Classic March 13 at the par-72, 5,966-yard University Club Golf Course. The Lobos won the tournament, which was hosted by South Carolina, by 10 shots over No. 20 Furman. UNM was 66-over par (308-313-309--930) for the tournament. The Lobos were also victorious at the Landfall Tradition in October.

Kailin Downs placed second by carding an 11-over 227 (75-73-79). She has now placed in the top five on 15 occasions during her career.

Christina Spence tied for sixth with a 19-over 235 (78-81-76), marking the top finish of the season for the Port Alberni, British Columbia native. Alexandra Phelps also had an impressive showing, placing ninth with a 77-79-80--236 (+ 20).

LOBOS TAKE 10TH PLACE AT REGIONAL CHALLENGE IN FIRST ACTION OF THE SPRING (Feb. 7-9) - The No. 8 New Mexico women's golf team finished in 10th place

at the 2005 Regional Challenge after shooting a 28-over 312 in the final round. For the tournament, the Lobos were 303-309-312--924 (+ 72), besting top programs such as No. 2 Arizona State, No. 16 Stanford and No. 17 Texas. No. 10 Pepperdine won the 14-team field, which featured 13 teams ranked in the top 25, with a 44-over 896 (296-296-304). The prestigious tournament was held at the par-71, 5,912-yard Palos Verdes Country Club.

Kailin Downs and Christine Fernandez each shot 17-over par with a score of 230 to tie for 30th place. Downs completed the tournament with scores of 72-78-80, while Fernandez shot 79-72-79.

Ashley Rollins (77-77-81) and Giselle Claux (75-82-78) also shared the same score, placing in a tie for 48th with a 22-over 235. Christina Spence shot the best round of the day for the Lobos on Wednesday with a 4-over 75. She finished the tournament with a score of 81-87-75--243 (+ 30), tying for 66th place.

LOBOS WIN CONSOLATION TITLE AT COLLEGIATE MATCH PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP (Nov. 14-16) - The 12th-ranked New Mexico women's golf team defeated UNLV, 4-1, to claim the consolation bracket title at the Hooters Collegiate Match Play Championship

in Howey-in-the-Hills, Fla. After falling in the first round to Florida, the seventh-seeded Lobos rattled off three straight victories in taking ninth place. The Lobos were one of only five teams in the tournament to win at least three matches. The Collegiate Match Play Championship features 16 seeded teams in a double-elimination bracket while playing in a match-play format.

UNM cruised past conference rival and 16th-seeded UNLV, winning four of the five matches. **Kailin Downs** did not lose a single hole in defeating Elena Kurokawa, 5 and 4, in the

LOBOS REPEAT AT LANDFALL TRADITION (Oct. 29-31) - The 14th-ranked New Mexico women's golf team captured its 11th tournament title in the last four years by repeating as champions of the Landfall Tradition Oct. 31. The Lobos won the 12-team field, which included seven ranked teams, with a score of 297-285-296-878 (+14), three strokes better than host UNC-Wilmington. UNM also won the Landfall Tradition, which was held at the par-72, 6,034-yard Jack Nicklaus Course, in 2003.

Kailin Downs narrowly missed winning her second tournament championship of her career, finishing in second place with a 5-under 211 (73-67-71), only two strokes behind Vanderbilt's Chris Brady. It marks the 14th time in Downs' career that she has finished in the top-five of a tournament.

Ashley Rollins carded her best three-round total of the season, tying for 16th place with a 4-over 220 (71-75-74). **Christina Spence** also placed in the top 20, shooting a 6-over 222 (75-72-75) to tie for 19th. **Christine Fernandez** tied for 28th with a 10-over 226 (78-72-76), while **Giselle Claux** carded a 15-over 231 (80-74-77) to tie for 40th.

NEW MEXICO PLACES SEVENTH AT STANFORD INTERCOLLEGIATE (Oct. 15-17) - The 11th-ranked New Mexico women's golf team finished in seventh place at the Stanford Intercollegiate at the par-70, 5853-yard Stanford Golf Course. The Lobos shot a 299 in the third round, finishing the tournament with a 295-287-299-881. No. 9 Arizona State won the tournament with a 282-282-288-852 (+11).

Christine Fernandez led the Lobos with a 73-72-72-217 (+7), which put her into a tie for 16th place. **Kailin Downs** tied for 18th place after carding an 8-over 218 (75-69-74). **Giselle Claux** tied for 31st place with a 12-over 222 (72-75-75), while **Ashley Rollins** tied for 48th place with a 16-over 226 (75-73-78). **Alexandra Phelps** finished the tournament with an 81-73-81-235 (+25).

LOBOS POST STRONG SHOWING AT NCAA FALL PREVIEW (Sept. 20-22) - The 10th-ranked New Mexico women's golf team finished in eighth place at the NCAA Fall Preview which was held at the par-71, 6,312-yard Meadows Course on the Sunriver Resort, site of the 2005 NCAA Championships. The Lobos shot 287-301-296-884 (+32) for the tournament, 10 shots ahead of No. 9 Stanford and 15 shots ahead of No. 4 USC. No. 3 Duke claimed the 21-team tournament - which featured 16 ranked teams and nine of the top 10 - with a 6-over 283-294-281-858.

Christine Fernandez jumped up seven spots on the final day to tie for fifth with a 1-over 68-75-71-214. **Kailin Downs** tied for 24th place with a 6-over 71-71-77-219. **Christina Spence** carded a 74-76-74-224 (+11) to tie for 48th while **Ashley Rollins** fired a 74-79-74-227 (+14) to tie for 62nd. **Alexandra Phelps** shot a 83-84-83-250 (+37) in her first collegiate tournament as a starter.

UNM'S BID FOR FOURTH STRAIGHT DICK MCGUIRE TITLE FALLS SHORT (Sept. 13-15) - New Mexico's bid for a fourth consecutive Branch Law Firm/Dick McGuire Invitational title came up short Sept. 15 as second-ranked Georgia claimed the 2004 tournament with a 2-under 874 (287-299-288). The 10th-ranked Lobos made a charge down the stretch and trimmed the Georgia lead to three strokes with five holes remaining, but the Bulldogs held off UNM, who ended up with a 5-over 881 (292-296-293). New Mexico took second place, one stroke ahead of third place and 18th-ranked Pepperdine (293-299-290-882).

Individually, Kelly Froelich of Georgia shot a UNM Championship Course record for 54 holes with a 10-under 209 (68-73-68) to win medalist honors. Froelich tied the UNM Championship Course third-round record Wednesday with a 5-under 68. Oklahoma State's Karin Sjodin took second with a 6-under 213 while Lobo senior **Kailin Downs** placed third with a 4-under 215. Downs, who shot a 2-under 71 in the final round, now has 13 top-five finishes for her career.

Three other Lobos finished in the top 20. Sophomore **Ashley Rollins** fired a 2-under 71 on Wednesday to move up 11 spots and place in a tie for 14th. Rollins finished the tournament with a 3-over 222 (75-76-71). Junior **Christine Fernandez** tied for 17th with a 4-over 223 (72-74-

77) and senior **Christina Spence** tied for 20th with a 5-over 224 (76-74-74). Redshirt freshman **Giselle Claux** tied for 78th with a 20-over 239 (73-86-80).

NEW MEXICO TO HOST 2008 DIVISION I NCAA WOMEN'S GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS

The NCAA has announced that the 2008 Division I Women's Golf Championships have been awarded to the University of New Mexico and will be played at The Championship Course. The event, scheduled for May 20-23, 2008, marks the fifth time that the NCAA Championships will be held in Albuquerque.

The UNM Championship Course, which was recently named one of the top 10 collegiate courses in the nation by *Golfweek* magazine, is no stranger to major tournaments. It was the site of the 1976, 1992 and 1998 NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championships as well as the 1991, 1995 and 2002 NCAA West Regionals. In 1987, the course hosted the NCAA Women's Championships, and was also the site of the 1994 NCAA Women's West Regional. The home course advantage helped the Lobos in 1987, as Caroline Keggi claimed UNM's only individual national title in golf.

"This is really exciting for our program," said New Mexico women's golf coach **Jackie Booth**, who is in her eighth year at UNM. "This will definitely help in recruiting our future classes, knowing that they will be able to play the site of the NCAA Championships every day."

Booth has experience coaching and hosting the NCAA Championships. When she was the head coach at New Mexico State, the Aggies hosted the 1988 NCAA Champi-



onships in Las Cruces.

"It was a great experience at New Mexico State - they really rolled out the red carpet for the event, and I'm expecting the university and the city will do everything they can in making this a first-class event for all the participants from across the country," Booth said. "It will be a lot of fun to have the biggest tournament of the season right in our back yard."

The Championship Course has been home to the William H.

Tucker Invitational for the past 34 years, as well as being home to three Western Athletic Conference Men's Championships (1979, 1982, 1989). Beginning in 1979, it has also been home to the prestigious Dick McGuire Invitational, a major tournament in women's collegiate golf.

Since it was officially opened in 1967, The Championship Golf Course has been one of the finest facilities of its kind nationwide. It has been nationally recognized by *Golf Digest* magazine as one of the top-25 public courses in the country, and in 1999 was named the top collegiate course open to non-members by the *New England Financial Journal*.

Like most class layouts, the Championship Course flashes a personality all its own. The 6,069-yard, par 73 course for the women boasts fairways that stretch out long and wide, bobbing up and down, both right and left - all factors that make it difficult to reach the rolling, well-manicured greens. Stray shots often land in the rough, loose desert sand, water or sagebrush.

"It's an honor for our course to be considered an NCAA site," said Booth. "I always felt like it was one of the top collegiate courses in the country. When I'm recruiting, I know that if they can play well on our course, they can play well anywhere. The size of the greens and the length of the course presents an immense challenge for any player."

While the UNM Championship Course is frequently in the national spotlight, the Lobo women's golf program has also established itself as one of the top programs in the country. New Mexico has always been a national power - it owns 13 conference championships, 12 NCAA Championships appearances and 12 consecutive NCAA Regional appearances - but in the last five years, the program has risen to elite status. UNM has won four of the five Mountain West Conference championships and has won 10 tournament titles in the last three seasons. Last year, the Lobos provided the program with one of the most successful seasons in school history - they claimed four tournament victories, placed in the top 10 in 10 of their 11 tournaments, and again led the Mountain West with four all-conference honorees. The Lobos were ranked in the top 10 for 33 consecutive weeks, peaking at a lofty No. 3, and finished the season ranked No. 6 in the final *Golfweek* standings. This season, the Lobos are once again among the nation's top teams, and are currently ranked 15th in the latest *Golfweek/Sagarin* rankings.

...**LOBO GOLF • CONFERENCE HISTORY...**

Since their membership in a conference, be it the InterMountain Conference, High Country Athletic, the Western Athletic or now the Mountain West, New Mexico has set the standard in conference action by capturing 13 titles in 25 years.

The Lobos have won four of the first six Mountain West Championships since the inception of the conference in 1999-2000. UNM also claimed four consecutive Western Athletic Conference titles from 1993-96.

New Mexico and UNLV shattered the record books at the 2003-04 MWC Championships, but the Rebels came out on top with a course-record 856. The Lobos shot a season-best 858, but it wasn't enough as UNLV dethroned UNM's run at the top of the conference.

Several Lobos had impressive individual showings at the championships. Junior **Shannon Johnson** tied for second, her best career finish, along with

fellow teammate **Katrina Leckovic**. Junior **Kailin Downs** tied a course record with a 66 in the last round to place in the top 10 for the third consecutive year.

When it came to the awards, however, UNM once again led the conference with four all-conference members. Downs and Leckovic made their third straight appearance on the team, Johnson made her second consecutive appearance, and freshman **Ashley Rollins** made her debut on the team. Rollins was also awarded the MWC Freshman of the Year.

The Lobos have dominated the conference's short history with numerous accolades. Coach **Jackie Booth** has been MWC Coach of the Year three times and three players have earned Freshman of the Year honors (**Kristi Larsen, Kailin Downs, Ashley Rollins**). UNM has been awarded the Player of the Year on three occasions. **Ryley Webb** won the inaugural honor in 2000, while Downs garnered the award in 2002 and 2003.

In their 24 year conference history, UNM players have captured Player of the Year honors five times and Freshman of the Year honors seven times. Lobo coaches have been named Coach of the Year six times.

Over the years, New Mexico women's golf has dominated conference tournament play, regardless of which conference it was members of at the time. Since 1976-77, when records were first kept, UNM has won the conference title an unprecedented 13 times and it has taken second on five occasions.

UNM's first conference championship arrived in 1982 as a member of the High Country Athletic Conference. The Lobos went on to win four more HCAC titles before joining the WAC in 1991. UNM claimed two InterMountain-AIAW Regional titles (1980, 1981) before joining the HCAC in 1982.
