

## CAPSULE OF POTENTIAL VILLANOVA BASEBALL DRAFT PROSPECTS

### Jordan Ellis (RHP, 6-2, 198, Bryn Mawr, Pa.)

Coach Godri on Jordan Ellis: “Jordan is our top draft eligible pitcher. Things didn’t go his way down the stretch this season but his body of work over four years in college should give him a chance. Jordan has a pro arm and pro potential and I hope that he gets picked on the first day. He would become the latest in our long line of front-line pitchers to go into the draft.”

### Derek Shunk (SS, 6-2, 215, Yardley, Pa.)

Coach Godri on Derek Shunk: “Derek kind of mirrors Mike Loree from last year in that the body of work over four years has earned him the chance to play at the next level. When you play for four years I think that scouts see you so much that there is a tendency for them to want to tell you what you can’t do instead of focusing on what you can do. Derek is an accomplished player and an outstanding college baseball player at any level. He is our all-time hits leader and he has done more than just deserving a chance to play at the next level. He has earned the opportunity and I am confident that the incredible numbers he put up in the BIG EAST Championship and his great finish to the end of the season will give him that chance.”

### James Dolbier (RF, 6-3, 203, Lebanon, N.J.)

Coach Godri on James Dolbier: “James is a left-handed hitter with good power. I think he is still a raw tool in some people’s minds. I know that there were some clubs that tracked him really hard starting with the Louisville series and going right through the end of the season. He also had what I consider to be a strong showing in the BIG EAST Championship. He hit a grand slam in the first game and showed some power. He had a collision in the outfield and played hurt the last three games. I hope that some teams will do what they say that they will with James.”
