TOP STORIES

• Villanova moved its all-time record when opening the season at home to 63-3 (.955) with an 84-61 victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Friday night. The Wildcats are now 8-1 (.875) in season openers under Jay Wright and have won 41 in a row as the host on opening night.

• Friday's win over Fairleigh Dickinson was the Wildcats' 29th in a row at the Pavilion, a stretch that began with a 102-87 win over Notre Dame on Jan. 17, 2007. It is the longest consecutive run of success Villanova has had in the building on Ithan Avenue that opened on Feb. 1, 1986.

• Villanova is 28-7 (.800) in the month of November since Jay Wright became head coach in 2001.

• Tonight's game marks the start of the Philadelphia Big Five season. Villanova was 4-0 in the City Series last season and has taken 18 of its last 19 in against its city rivals La Salle, Penn, Saint Joseph's and Temple.

• Junior guard Corey Stokes dropped in 20 points to pace the Wildcats' attack in the win over FDU. It marked the fourth time in his college career that he had reached the 20-point plateau.

• Villanova heads south for its next action. It will meet George Mason in the opening round of the O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Classic on Thursday at 2:00 p.m. (ESPNU/ESPN 950).

Knight Work

Midway through the first half of Friday night's season opener against Fairleigh Dickinson, Villanova held a 10-point advantage and appeared to be pulling away from the Knights. But FDU went on a 19-10 run over the final 9:51 of the half to close the halftime gap to 35-34.

"They did a good job of extending their zone and we settled for more threes than we should have," stated Wright.

In the second half, though, Villanova leaned on its veterans and outscored FDU 49-27 in the final 20 minutes to wrap up an 84-61 win in the season opener.

"It wasn't pretty," stated Wright. "But that was a good experience for this group to go through together. We just don't have many collective experiences together."

Villanova responded on the glass, where it had been outrebounded 19-18 in the first 20 minutes. It took over the boards, collecting 28 in the second half to 17 for FDU.

Also vital to the cause was the fact that the Wildcats had 16 assists against just eight turnovers despite a lineup that featured six newcomers.

"We've had all this hype and it's new to us," stated Wright. "We have a chance to be a good team. But we have a lot of work to do between now and the end of the season to get there."

Reynolds Wrap

As he begins his senior season, Herndon, Va., native Scottie Reynolds, is in position to leave an impressive mark on the school's all-time record charts.

Reynolds has already dropped in 1,628 points in his Villanova career. That's a 15.2 ppg average in 107 games since he entered the program prior to the 2006-07 campaign as a McDonald's All-American.

There are only seven 2,000 point scorers in Villanova history. The group includes in order, Kerry Kittles (2,243), Keith Herron (2,170), Bob Schafer (2,094), current assistant coach Doug West (2,037), Howard Porter (2,026), Allan Ray (2,025) and John Pinone (2,024). Reynolds begins the new season in 15th place and needs just 179 points to move into the top 10 on that list.

Reynolds scored eight points in the win over Fairleigh Dickinson and Wright lauded his leadership, especially early in the second half.

"Scottie came out and used a head fake to get to the line," stated Wright. "That was a big play for us. He gives us great leadership and that was big for us in that second half."

The BIG EAST Coaches selected Reynolds pre-season first team all-conference and he is one of 50 players on the Wooden Award Watch List.

Fish Facts

Last season, Corey Fisher became the first Wildcat to be named BIG EAST Sixth Man of the Year. In 2009-10, his role has expanded as he assumes a leadership spot in the absence of the class of 2009, which included Dwayne Anderson, Shane Clark, Dante Cunningham and Frank Tchuisi.

Fisher contributed 13 points, four assists and four rebounds in 31 minutes of action in the win against Fairleigh Dickinson.

"(He) had four rebounds and just did a great job of setting an example for our younger guys," noted Wright.

The 6-1 Fisher was the New Jersey player of the year in 2007 and has started 33 of the 72 games he has played as a Wildcat. Over the course of his career he has averaged 10.0 ppg and was VU's third leading scorer last season.

Setting the Tone

As the only Wildcat in the frontcourt with significant experience, the coaching staff is leaning on junior Antonio Pena to help set a tone.

His return to the starting lineup, where he had made 39 starts prior to giving way to Shane Clark midway through 2008-09, produced a nine point, 10 rebound effort against FDU.

Pena added three assists and a pair of steals as well.

Stokes Strokes

He came to Villanova from St. Benedict's Prep in 2007 billed as one of the nation's premier young long range shooters. While it took him some time to settle in - he connected on just two of his first 27 attempts beyond the arc as a frosh - Stokes has since established himself as one of the BIG EAST's best long distance marksmen.

One season after setting a Villanova mark for highest 3-point percentage by a sophomore, Stokes' bombs helped ignite Villanova against Fairleigh Dickinson. He sank 5-of-10 from outside the arc and finished with 20 points and four rebounds.

The 6-5 product of Bayonne, N.J., has toiled long hours to round out his game and those efforts could be seen on Friday night as well. He added four rebounds and got to the line three times, converting all three. As a career .865 free throw shooter, the more time spent there the greater a contribution Stokes can make.

Last season, Stokes was fourth on the Wildcats in scoring with a 9.3 ppg average. In just over two seasons, Stokes has already converted 121 3-point field goals.

Two Sign Letters

A pair of high school senior standouts have inked national letters of intent to join the Villanova Wildcats in the early signing period. Guard James Bell, 6-5, of Montverde (Fla.) Academy and forward Markus Kennedy, a 6-9 Philadelphia native who is currently enrolled at Winchendon (Mass.) Academy, have signed letters of intent and will enroll at Villanova in the fall of 2010.

"These are two outstanding young players we are excited to add to our Villanova basketball family," stated head coach Jay Wright.

Bell is a dynamic wing player who has excelled at Montverde Academy playing for coach Kevin Sutton. ESPN lists Bell as the No. 43 senior in the class of 2010.

"James is a great athlete from an outstanding program at Montverde Academy," stated Wright. "His coach, Kevin Sutton, has done a terrific job teaching James the game and we are excited to have him join us. James is a tough, athletic guard who will add another dimension to our team."

Kennedy is from Philadelphia and emerged as a coveted prospect over the last two seasons playing prep basketball in the state of New Jersey. He is now at Winchendon Academy, where he will soon begin his senior season.

"Markus is a Philly guy and he brings us interior size and toughness," stated Wright. "One of the things we came to appreciate about Markus is his understanding of the game. We believe Markus can be an outstanding rebounder at this level and a skilled offensive player in the post. We're thrilled to have another Philly guy in our family."

O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Classic

Villanova returns to Puerto Rico for the first time since 1997 when it travels to San Juan to play in the O'Reilly Auto Parts Classic. The Wildcats will play three games, beginning Thursday against George Mason.

Redding Out for Semester

One of the Wildcats' two returning starters from their 2009 NCAA Final Four team, senior guard Reggie Redding, will not be in uniform for the Wildcats during the first 10 games of the regular season as the result of a violation of the university's student code of conduct.

Redding, a Philadelphia native who averaged 7.1 points and 4.9 rebounds per contest as a junior, is eligible to return at the end of the university semester on December 18. The Wildcats face Fordham at the Izod Center in New Jersey on Dec. 19.

Philadelphia Big Five

The Philadelphia tradition known as the Big Five resumes in 2009-10 with a full round-robin slate of games.

Villanova earned the outright City Series crown with a 4-0 mark in 2008-09 and has been at the top of the Big Five standings, either in tandem with a rival or alone, for each of the past five seasons.

The action gets underway in the first week of the Wildcats season. The full lineup of matchups includes:

- Nov. 16 - PENN (Nova Nation All-Access)
- Nov. 28 - LA SALLE (ESPN2)
- Dec. 9 - at Saint Joseph's (ESPN2)
- Dec. 13 - at Temple (CBS College Sports)

In addition, Villanova will meet the sixth Division I basketball school in the city when it plays host to Drexel on Dec. 2 at the Pavilion.

Polling Data

Villanova entered the campaign ranked No. 5 by the Associated Press and No. 6 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. That marks the highest the 'Cats have been ranked nationally entering a season since 2005-06, when they were fifth in each poll.

Pavilion Power

Villanova has made the most of its campus home, the Pavilion since it opened on Feb. 1, 1986. The Wildcats own an all-time mark of 213-54 (.798).

The Wildcats have captured the last 29 games played in the building on Ithan Avenue. The streak began on Jan. 17, 2007 with a 102-87 win over Notre Dame and included a perfect 13-0 mark in 2008-09.

Villanova is 81-12 (.871) in the Pavilion in the Jay Wright era, which got underway in the 2001-02 campaign. It is 151-22 (.873) in the Pavilion since the start of 1994-95.

Wildcats in the Spotlight

Villanova will once again be in the national spotlight in 2009-10, with a minimum of 20 regular season appearances on national television, including two on CBS and six on ESPN. In addition, the 'Cats will be five times on ESPN Regional Television, which airs locally on My 17 in Philadelphia.

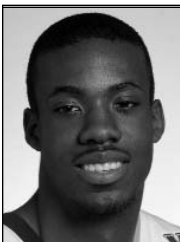

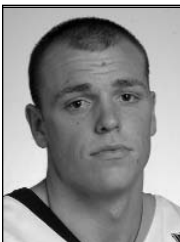

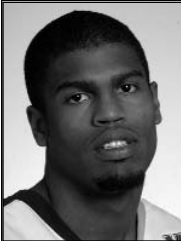
