TOP STORIES

- Villanova will have some time to get re-acclimated to the famed Palestra in the next week. The Wildcats next three games will take place on the Penn campus, beginning with the Philly Hoop Group Classic contests this weekend followed by a meeting with the Quakers on Tuesday night (8:00 p.m./CN8). VU is 10-4 (.714) in the Palestra since Jay Wright assumed the coaching reins in 2001. Tonight's meeting with Towson marks the first time VU has faced a non-Big Five foe at the Palestra since Dec. 19, 1987 when it defeated Wake Forest 83-70 in the Josten's Classic.

- The Wildcats extended their Pavilion winning streak to 19 games with a 71-48 victory over Niagara on Tuesday evening in the Philly Hoop Group Classic last Wednesday night.

- Dante Cunningham's strong start to the season netted him Philadelphia Big Five co-player of the week honors along with Temple's Dionte Christmas.

- With its win over Monmouth, Villanova improved to 25-7 (.781) in the month of November in the tenure of head coach Jay Wright.

- The Wildcats will take on either Penn State or Rhode Island in the finale of the Philly Hoop Group Classic on Saturday evening. The winners in Friday evening's doubleheader - PSU faces URI in the first game that night - will meet at 8:30 p.m. with the losers squaring off at 6:30 p.m.

Halfway There

One of the priorities for coach Jay Wright and his staff as they review the DVD of each game is to assess just how close the 'Cats came to playing what they like to call "40 minutes of Villanova Basketball."

On Tuesday night, Villanova took a step towards that goal with a nearly flawless first 20 minutes in a 71-48 victory over Monmouth in a preliminary round Philly Hoop Group Classic game at the Pavilion.

"I thought we played a great first half," stated Wright. "It was our best half of defense that we have played so far this season."

Indeed, the Wildcats methodically stifled the Hawks en route to a 45-13 halftime advantage. Monmouth was just 5-of-21 from the field in the first 20 minutes while Villanova connected on 16-of-31 (.516) of its attempts from the field and turned the ball over just four times.

But the Wildcats weren't quite as effective in the second half and that was a point of emphasis for Wright after the game.

"This was good for us," he said. "We've got to learn to appreciate this grind. Part of the grind is learning to play 40 minutes. It's tough - when you're a kid, you're 18 to 22, and you have a 30 point lead the natural tendency is to relax. That's what we did. But we're trying not to be a normal team."

Take Note

Please note the start time for Villanova's contest at Penn on Tuesday is 8:00 p.m. The game was listed as a 7:00 p.m. start on many pre-season schedules.

Reynolds Wrap

Scottie Reynolds remains at the center of Villanova's offensive and defensive attacks as he enters his third season as a Wildcat. He picked up nine points in the win over Monmouth and now has 1,094 points in his Villanova career. He needs 26 points to move past John Olive (1,122) into 47th place on the all-time school scoring list.

Reynolds was named a pre-season All BIG EAST selection last month. On Nov. 7, it was announced that he is one of 50 players nationally included on the Wooden Award Preseason watch list.

One of Reynolds' great offensive strengths is his ability to get to the free throw line. He visited the stripe eight times on Tuesday night against Monmouth and sank seven. He is 23-of-25 (.920) at the line thus far this season, averaging better than six attempts per outing.

In 72 career games, Reynolds has attempted four or more free throws 52 times. In those games, Villanova is 38-14 (.730).

Last season Reynolds helped nurture young guards Corey Fisher and Corey Stokes after he benefitted from the guidance of former 'Cat guard Mike Nardi in 2006-07. Reynolds became the primary point guard for Villanova late in the season. He scored 92 points in the Wildcats five postseason games last season - an average of 18.4 ppg.

Reynolds also added three steals against Monmouth, giving him 108 for his career. That ties him for 27th place on the Villanova all-time list with the man he succeeded in wearing uniform No. 1, Kyle Lowry.

Dante's Inferno

Over the course of his career, Dante Cunningham has been one of Villanova's most dependable defenders, rebounders and leaders. His offense, though, has typically taken a back-seat to that of such gifted scorers as Reynolds, Randy Foye, Kyle Lowry, and Curtis Sumpter.

But if Wright has his way, that is in the process of changing.

"We need Dante to be a scorer," he says. "He has been a good scorer in some games but he hasn't done it consistently because he doesn't ask for it. As a coaching staff we have to demand it too. He can really score in a lot of ways."

Cunningham connected on 9-of-17 from the field and finished with a game-high 19 points in the win over Monmouth. He leads Villanova in scoring at 18.5 ppg. Nearly as impressive is the fact his 74 points have come in 112 minutes of action.

He is now 29-of-46 (.630) from the floor this season. His run of four straight double-digit scoring efforts to open the season matches his best four game scoring stretch in January of 2007.

"I have been working a lot in the off-season on my range and understanding where shots come from and where I can be comfortable on the court," stated Cunningham.

Cunningham also leads VU in rebounding at 6.8 rpg. He now has 562 career caroms, which ties him for 32nd place on the all-time Villanova caroms chart with Aaron Howard. His 119 career steals place him in 18th place in that category at VU.

Dwayne is Derailed

Anderson, who averaged 9.7 points and 7.0 rebounds per game after he was inserted into the starting lineup on Feb. 9, 2008, learned there is a stress fracture in his left foot on Nov. 13, one day before the start of his senior campaign.

"It's just going to be a matter of time with Dwayne," stated Wright. Anderson remains out of the lineup indefinitely.

Reggie's Been Ready

One of the quieter contributors to Villanova's early success has been junior guard Reggie Redding. The Philadelphia native has always been a dependable defender but he's made quiet offensive contributions in the early going.

The Saint Joseph's Prep product averages 9.8 ppg and is connecting on .556 of his field goal attempts thus far in 2008-09. He also averages 4.5 rpg from the guard position.

Stokes Strokes

One of the keys to Villanova's late charge in 2007-08 was the development of guard Corey Stokes. After a slow start, Stokes emerged as a dependable offensive weapon from the perimeter in helping the 'Cats advance to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.

The native of Bayonne, N.J., has overcome a sprained left thumb suffered in a Nov. 17 victory over Fordham to provide plenty of offensive firepower to the Villanova attack. He returned from a one-game absence in the starting lineup - a result of the thumb injury - to drop in 18 points and collect a career high seven rebounds in the triumph over Monmouth.

Stokes' scoring average has risen to 14.0 ppg and he is a sizzling 13-of-22 (.591) from beyond the arc thus far. A year ago as he acclimated himself to the BIG EAST, the product of St. Benedict's Prep did not drain his 13th 3-point field goal until Jan. 26 in a loss to Notre Dame.

He is also connecting on .552 of his total field goal attempts.

In addition to his scoring, Stokes is averaging 4.5 rpg. As a rookie last season, he averaged 2.4 caroms per outing.

In the early going Villanova has displayed an ability to get to the free throw line. It has already attempted 108 free throws, converting 85 (.787). Its opponents have attempted 74 free throws. In 2007-08, VU's opponents attempted 57 more free throws than did the Wildcats.

Shane Steps Up

After sitting out 10 days and the season opener after arthroscopic surgery on his right knee, senior forward Shane Clark has begun to round into form. On Tuesday night the Philadelphia native was a perfect 4-of-4 from the field in a season-high 22 minutes for 10 points.

Clark is now 8-of-11 from the field in three games this year and averages 6.7 ppg off the bench.

'Cats Sign Trio of Standouts

A trio of nationally prominent seniors have inked national letters of intent to attend Villanova University in the fall of 2009, it was announced today. The group includes forward Isaiah Armwood from Montrose Christian Academy (Rockville, Md.); guard Maalik Wayns of Philadelphia's Roman Catholic High School and power forward Mouphtaou Yarou, a native of Benin in the republic of West Africa who also attends Montrose Christian Academy.

ESPN.com ranks the class as No. 2 in the nation.

"We are as excited about this class as any we have brought to Villanova," stated head coach Jay Wright. "This group offers us a unique combination of frontcourt and backcourt talent with exceptional skill and incredible character. The loyalty each of these young men has shown to our program through this process is heartwarming to all of us in the Villanova Basketball Family."

Armwood, 6-8, is a versatile forward who has been a fixture for national prep powerhouse Montrose Christian Academy. He averaged 12 points and eight rebounds as a junior before being sidelined by a left knee injury. It is expected that he will be a key performer in his final prep season for Montrose. He is listed as the No. 35 ranked prospect on ESPN's Top 100 list.

"Isaiah is an athletically gifted wing player who has played four years for coach Stu Vetter at Montrose Christian Academy," stated Wright. "He has been well-schooled in the fundamentals. We expect him to make an immediate impact at Villanova with his quickness and athleticism."

Wayns is a 6-1 guard who averaged 22.4 points, 5.1 assists and 4.8 rebounds per game as a junior at Roman Catholic High School. Last summer, he represented the United States as a member of USA Basketball's 18-and-under team that competed in Argentina. He is ranked by espn.com as the No. 22 senior in the country.

"Maalik Wayns is the leader of this class," said Wright. "He was the first one of this group to commit to us and he encouraged his friends Isaiah and Moof' (Yarou) to join him at Villanova. Maalik will be the next in the line of great Villanova guards. We're so proud to have another Roman Catholic Cahillite with us on the Villanova campus."

Rounding out the group of fall signees is Yarou, a 6-9 power forward

who in a short period of time in the United States has emerged as one of the nation's most coveted big men - the No. 27 rated senior prospect in the nation according to espn.com. He enjoyed a breakthrough summer on the AAU circuit and will play this season for Vetter at Montrose Christian Academy.

"Moof' is as skilled a power forward as any frontcourt recruit we have had at Villanova," Wright stated. "He is very intelligent, extremely hard working and will be playing for a legendary coach this season in Stu Vetter at Montrose Christian Academy. Moof' will make an immediate impact on our team with his rebounding and shot blocking ability."

Philadelphia Big Five

The Big Five has been part of the Philadelphia basketball scene since 1955 and the City Series will again be a part of Villanova's schedule. The Wildcats, who have won or shared the city crown in each of the past four seasons, will play four games against their local rivals in December. The list includes:

Happy at Home

Villanova will play home games at three sites in 2008-09: the Pavilion, Wachovia Center and Wachovia Spectrum.

The Wildcats have played before a sellout crowd of 6,500 at the Pavilion for 86 consecutive regular season games. The last time they failed to do so came during a snow storm in December of 2000.

Villanova is 42-4 (.913) in the building on Ithan Avenue since 2005. It is now 203-54 (.790) all-time in the Pavilion. Since the start of the 1994-95 season, VU is 141-22 (.865) in the Pavilion. The 'Cats are 71-12 (.855) in Pavilion home games under Jay Wright.

The Wildcats will host three BIG EAST games at the Wachovia Center in Philadelphia this season, beginning on Jan. 10 (Louisville). VU then returns to the Center on Feb. 7 against Syracuse and Feb. 28 when it welcomes Georgetown to the building. Villanova has averaged better than 19,000 in attendance in its Center games since 2005.
