### GAME ONE

No. 20 Villanova 38, Colgate 14  
Aug. 30, 2001 - Villanova, Pa.

VILLANOVA, PA - The Villanova football team won its sixth consecutive home opener, as senior running back Brian Westbrook had yet another record setting day in leading the Wildcats to a 38-14 victory over Colgate on Thursday, Aug. 30, at Villanova Stadium.

The game was stopped with 10:31 remaining in the fourth quarter due to lightning and was finally called after a 51-minute delay. Westbrook totaled 337 all-purpose yards and a career-high five touchdowns on the night for the 'Cats who improved to 1-0 on the season with the victory. In addition, he tied the NCAA I-AA record with his fifth career kickoff return for a touchdown and went over the 3,000 yard rushing mark for his career. With his outstanding contest, Westbrook vaulted himself into 21st place on the college football career list for all-purpose yards with 7,026.

After a Casey Hannon 24-yard field goal gave Villanova a 3-0 lead at the 10:26 mark of the first quarter, the Colgate offense marched down the field. A 13-play, 76-yard drive resulted in a two-yard rushing touchdown by Matt Kobelski to give the Raiders a 7-3 advantage.

With the Wildcats trailing 7-3, Westbrook returned the next kickoff 98 yards for a Villanova touchdown to help Villanova reclaim the lead at 10-7. Beginning with that score, the Wildcats went on to score 35 straight points with all five touchdowns coming via Westbrook.

Colgate would tack on a late score on a six yard touchdown pass from Rob Markett to Joe Parker, but it was too late as the Wildcats surged to a 38-14 victory.

Joining Westbrook in leading the Villanova offensive attack was junior quarterback Brett Gordon, who completed 19-of-33 passes for 175 yards and one touchdown.

In the loss for Colgate (0-1), Parker caught three passes for 28 yards and a score, while Markett came off the bench to complete all three of his pass attempts for 19 yards and a touchdown.

### GAME TWO

No. 18 Villanova 31, Northeastern 14  
Sept. 8, 2001 - Villanova, Pa.

VILLANOVA, PA. - On Saturday, Sept. 8 in front of 8,427 fans at Villanova Stadium, the Villanova football team scored early and often, putting up 31 first half points en route to a 31-14 victory over Northeastern. With Saturday's win, the Wildcats improved to 2-0 for the first time since the 1997 season.

Villanova broke the scoring open 9:42 into the first quarter when junior Brian White made a diving two-yard touchdown catch in the side of the end zone to give the 'Cats a 7-0 lead. The Wildcats added a 20-yard field goal by senior place kicker Casey Hannon to take a 10-0 lead after one quarter of play.

Senior running back Brian Westbrook controlled the second quarter, scoring twice on runs of one and 34 yards to give Villanova a 24-0 advantage. The Wildcats would score once more before the half on a 35-yard scoring strike from junior quarterback Brett Gordon to senior wide receiver Murle Sango, giving Villanova a commanding 31-0 lead at intermission.

The Northeastern defense clamped down on Westbrook and the Wildcat offense in the second half. The Huskies finally got on the board with 12:10 remaining in the third quarter on a 23-yard pass from Logan Galli to Kito Delgado to trim the margin to 31-7. Northeastern was able to tack on a late score on an Anthony Riley 20-yard touchdown run, but it was much too late as Villanova went on for a 31-14 victory.

Gordon completed his first 11 passes of the game and finished the contest 19-for-25 for 195 yards to go along with two touchdowns and one interception. On the receiving end of seven of his passes was Sango, who finished with 95 yards and one touchdown.

Westbrook kept up his stellar play, combing for 195 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns. He rushed for 122 yards on 21 carries, caught two passes for 22 yards and totaled 51 yards on a punt return.

For Northeastern in the loss, Delgado caught five passes for 100 yards and one touchdown. Riley was strong on the ground for the Huskies, carrying 18 times for 95 yards and one score.

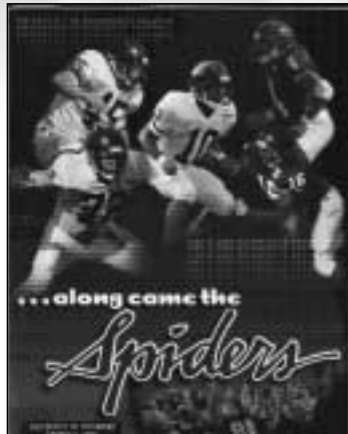

### GAME THREE

No. 14 Villanova 31, No. 17 Richmond 30  
Sept. 29, 2001 - Richmond, Va.

RICHMOND, VA. - Brett Gordon threw for 376 yards and four touchdowns as Villanova capped a 16-point rally in the fourth quarter to beat Richmond 31-30. A 30-yard field goal by Casey Hannon with one second left in the game brought the lead and the win for 14th-ranked Villanova (3-0, 2-0 Atlantic 10).

Richmond (0-3, 0-1 Atlantic 10) had led 30-15 with 11:39 left in the fourth quarter, on runs from David Edwards, Boyd Ouden and Sean Gustus. The Spiders rushed for 335 yards, but failed on a fourth-and-two attempt at Villanova's 25-yard line, their first failure in seven fourth-down attempts.

The Wildcats' Shaz Brown caught nine passes for 123 yards, and two touchdowns, to beat the 17th-ranked Spiders, who had previously suffered two narrow losses against I-A schools Virginia and Vanderbilt.

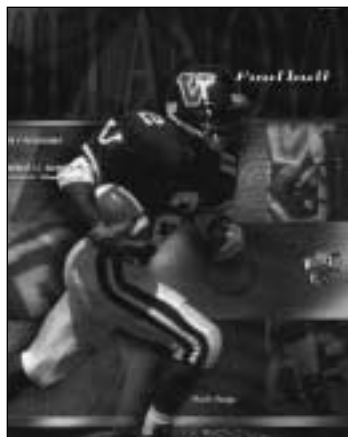

### GAME FOUR

No. 13 Villanova 45, James Madison 44 (2OT)  
Oct. 6, 2001 - Villanova, Pa.

VILLANOVA, PA. - Senior running back Brian Westbrook had a record-setting day on Saturday, October 6, breaking the Atlantic 10 all-time record for career touchdowns in Villanova's 45-44 double overtime victory over James Madison in an Atlantic 10 affair at Villanova Stadium. With Westbrook's third touchdown of the day, he broke the all-time Atlantic 10 record for touchdowns (69) held by New Hampshire's Jerry Azumah. Westbrook finished the day with 405 all-purpose yards (228 rushing, 42 receiving and 135 return yards) and five touchdowns. With his five touchdowns, Westbrook has now scored 72 career touchdowns. The Wildcats improved to 4-0 overall and 3-0 in Atlantic 10 play, while the Dukes fell to 1-4 overall and 0-4 in conference action.

With the score tied at 24-24 and only 2:34 remaining in the third quarter, Westbrook broke loose again scampering 29 yards for a Villanova score to give the 'Cats a 31-24 advantage at the end of three quarters of play.

Down by seven points with less than six minutes to go in regulation, the Dukes got another turnover as Trey Townsend picked off a Gordon pass for James Madison's fifth interception of the game. The Dukes seemed to be out of luck with a fourth down and 17 at the Villanova 22 with 3:12 to go in the contest, but an 18-yard reception by Alan Harrison kept the drive alive. Three plays later, the Dukes tied the game at 31-31 on a two-yard scoring pass from Matt LeZotte to Tahir Hinds to send the game into OT.

The Wildcats struck first in the first overtime session, as Westbrook scored his fourth touchdown of the game to give Villanova a 38-31 lead. James Madison came right back with a score of their own on a one-yard run by Robert Carson to tie the game at 38-38 and send the game into a second extra period.

Getting the ball first in the second overtime, the Dukes marched 25 yards on seven plays for a touchdown as LeZotte hit Harrison from six yards out. James Madison kicker Burke George missed the extra point, however, to keep the JMU lead at 44-38.

Villanova had one more chance to stay in the game with a fourth down and six from the James Madison seven. Gordon threw a pass towards the sideline and Westbrook made a spectacular six-yard diving catch to give the Wildcats a first down at the Dukes' one-yard line. From there, Westbrook capped off his day, by diving in the end zone from one-yard out to tie the game. Casey Hannon's extra point sealed the victory for the 'Cats as Villanova went on for a 45-44 victory.

### GAME FIVE New Haven 17, No. 12 Villanova 14 Oct. 12, 2001 - Villanova, Pa.

VILLANOVA, PA. - Under the lights at Villanova Stadium on Friday night, Oct. 12, the 12th ranked Villanova Wildcats were defeated for the first time in 2001, 17-14, by the New Haven Chargers. With the loss, Villanova fell to 4-1 overall on the season. New Haven improved to 4-2 overall with the victory.

Trailing 17-7 after three quarters of play, the 'Cats' offense finally caught fire. Villanova drove nine yards on 60 plays in 3:53, scoring on a one-yard plunge by Gordon to cut the New Haven lead to 17-14. The key play in the drive was a 16-yard pass from Gordon to wide receiver Brian White, taking the ball down to the one-yard line.

Turnovers continued to plague Villanova, however, as Williams intercepted a pass thrown by Scott Lukash who replaced Gordon just plays earlier as Gordon left with bruised ribs.

The Wildcats got the ball back at their own 20-yard line with 2:41 remaining following a Charger punt. Villanova surged into New Haven territory on a 13-yard pass from Gordon to Shaz Brown, which took the ball down to the 39-yard line. Four plays later, on a fourth down and 10 from the 38, Gordon passed the ball to White, who was stopped two yards short of the first down giving the Chargers a 17-14 victory.

In the loss for Villanova, Gordon completed 26-of-35 passes for 295 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. The highlights of the day for the Wildcats came by way of Sango and freshman Phil DiGiacomo. Sango caught eight passes for 118 yards and one touchdown. DiGiacomo caught six passes for 45 yards and rushed three times for 13 yards.

Westbrook played sparingly in the game on an injured ankle. He rushed only 14 times from 64 yards and caught three passes for nine yards.

### GAME SIX No. 24 Maine 44, No. 20 Villanova 40 Oct. 20, 2001 - Orono, Maine

ORONO, MAINE - Maine quarterback Jake Eaton threw for four touchdowns including a pair in the second half as the Black Bears overcame a 19-point third-quarter deficit to beat Villanova, 44-40.

Trailing 40-21 late in the third, Maine scored the first of three unanswered touchdowns when Eaton found Paris Minor for a nine-yard catch.

Maine (5-1, 4-1 Atlantic 10) followed up with a nine-play, 65-yard scoring drive capped by a one-yard run by Royston English. Maine recovered a fumble by Villanova's Gary Johnson on the ensuing kickoff, and Eaton connected with Stefan Gomes on the next play. Kicker Chris DeVinney's conversion gave Maine a 41-40 lead with nine minutes left.

DeVinney added a 35-yard field goal as Maine's defense held Villanova scoreless in the fourth quarter. Eaton finished the day 26-for-35 for 353 yards. Minor hauled in 10 passes for 171 yards for Maine.

The loss by Villanova (5-2, 3-1) overshadowed another impressive performance by tailback Brian Westbrook, who accounted for 297 all-purpose yards and scored four times for the Wildcats.

His all-purpose yardage total makes him the all-time leader in career all-purpose yards in Atlantic 10 Conference history. Villanova quarterback Brett Gordon completed 26 of 35 for 406 yards. The Villanova offense tallied a season-high of 510 yards and 28 first downs.

### GAME SEVEN

Villanova 47, Massachusetts 13  
Oct. 27, 2001 - Villanova, Pa.

VILLANOVA, PA. - On Saturday, Oct. 27 at Villanova Stadium, the Villanova football team celebrated Homecoming by defeating Massachusetts by the score of 47-13. The victory, a dominating effort on both sides of the ball for the Wildcats, improved Villanova's record to 5-2 overall on the season and 4-1 in the Atlantic 10. The Minutemen fell to 1-6 overall and 1-4 in conference play with the loss.

Entering the fourth quarter of play, Westbrook had 188 all-purpose yards in the game (96 rushing, 40 receiving, 52 return), placing him just 26 yards shy of Jerry Azumah's I-AA career all-purpose yards record of 8,376 which he registered at New Hampshire from 1994-98.

At the 13:44 mark of the fourth quarter, Jamison Young forced a fumble on a sack of quarterback Matt Guice. The fumble was recovered by Mike Tesei, giving Villanova the ball on their own 43-yard line. On a second and one from the 43, Gordon found receiver Shaz Brown down field for a gain of 53 yards to the three-yard line. A three-yard Westbrook touchdown, his second running score of the day and third touchdown overall, gave the Wildcats a 47-13 advantage.

Westbrook finished the day with 199 all-purpose yards, placing him just 15 yards away from Azumah's record. He recorded 103 rushing, 40 receiving, and 54 return yards on Saturday, to go along with three touchdowns. The 100-yard rushing game was Westbrook's fourth of the season and 17th of his career.

On defense for Villanova, Young finished the contest with three sacks and two forced fumbles. Kwesi Solomon was outstanding for the 'Cats as well, tallying one sack, two tackles for a loss and his first collegiate touchdown.

### GAME EIGHT

Villanova 38, New Hampshire 35  
Nov. 3, 2001 - Durham, N.H.

DURHAM, N.H. - Brian Westbrook scored three touchdowns and broke the NCAA I-AA career all-purpose yardage record as Villanova beat New Hampshire 38-35 in an Atlantic 10 game played in Durham, N.H.

Entering the game with 8,362 all-purpose yards, Westbrook added 242 more and broke the 8,376-yard record held by New Hampshire's Jerry Azumah on a 14-yard run in the first quarter.

New Hampshire was trailing 38-35 with under two minutes left when Bo Geer forced Westbrook to fumble at the Villanova 41-yard line.

New Hampshire (4-5, 2-5) drove the ball to the 17, but facing 4th-and-6, Ryan Day's pass to David Bailey was knocked down by Clarence Curry at the goal line.

Villanova (6-2, 5-1) built a 13-0 lead on a pair of 1-yard runs by Westbrook in the first half before New Hampshire closed it to 13-7 on a 5-yard pass play from Day to R.J. Harvey.

Villanova led 22-7 at halftime after a 25-yard field goal by Casey Hannon, but New Hampshire trimmed the deficit to 22-14 when Michael Taylor scored in the third.

Day's 15-yard pass to Stephan Lewis made it 25-20 just 11 seconds into the fourth. Villanova responded 2:20 later with Westbrook's third score.

Recording a tremendous all-around game for Villanova was Westbrook, who had 256 all-purpose yards. On the ground, he gained 103 yards on 14 carries, for his sixth 100 yard rushing game of the season and 12th of his career.

### GAME NINE

No. 23 Villanova 54, No. 3 Hofstra 34  
Nov. 10, 2001 - Hempstead, N.Y.

HEMPSTEAD, N.Y. - Brian Westbrook scored five touchdowns as Villanova ended Hofstra's seven-game winning streak, 54-34, to take over first place in the Atlantic 10 Conference.

Westbrook's TDs came on runs of 1, 2, 30 and 46 yards and he also caught a 42-yard TD pass from Brett Gordon. He carried 26 times for 287 yards and had three receptions for another 57 yards for the Wildcats (7-2, 6-1).

Gordon also threw touchdown passes of 45 yards to Brian White and 25 yards to Cameron Cross and wound up 18-for-24 for 247 yards. Cross also grabbed a 23-yard pass from Scott Lukash for another score and had seven catches for 86 yards.

Rocky Butler of Hofstra (8-2, 7-2) connected on 28 of 50 passes for 358 yards and two touchdowns. The two touchdowns gave him a single-season school record of 28, one more than Gio Carmazzi had in 1997. Butler also scored on a 4-yard run in the second quarter.

Kahmal Roy, who caught a 9-yarder to tie the score at 7-7 in the first quarter, finished with 10 catches for 114 yards, breaking another school record. Roy has 1,206 passing yards for the season, erasing the old mark of 1,194 set in 1994 by Wayne Chrebet, now with the New York Jets.

Villanova broke a 27-27 tie, by scoring 27 unanswered points. Lukash's 23-yard pass to Cross on a fake field goal put the Wildcats ahead for keeps with 8:05 left in the third quarter.

Gordon then fired a 45-yard TD pass to White on the first play of the final quarter to boost the margin to 41-27. Westbrook followed with touchdown sprints of 30 and 46 yards to turn the game into a rout.

Butler then closed the scoring with a 33-yard touchdown throw to Marques Colston, who finished with nine catches for 150 yards. Villanova had a total offense of 582 yards and Hofstra wound up with 549 for a combined 1,131.

### GAME 10

Villanova 19, Delaware 14  
Nov. 17, 2001 - Villanova, Pa.

VILLANOVA, PA. - Playing in the final regular season home game of his Villanova career, senior placekicker Casey Hannon (Lebanon, N.J.) kicked four field goals to lead the Wildcats past Delaware, 19-14, in an Atlantic 10 football matchup. Villanova improved to 8-2 on the year, 7-1 the Atlantic 10 as Delaware fell to 4-6 overall, 4-5 in the conference.

Villanova quarterback Brett Gordon (Ambler, Pa.) completed 32-of-44 passes for 311 yards and one touchdown and running back Brian Westbrook (Fort Washington, Md.) ran for 137 yards on 28 carries (190 all-purpose yards) to lead the Wildcats offense.

Villanova's defense, led by Kwesi Solomon (Philadelphia, Pa.) with four solo tackles, two sacks and one forced fumble, rewarded the Wildcats with another opportunity to add to their halftime lead. Gordon completed two passes for 27 yards to set up a 42-yard Hannon field goal. Hannon's second field goal of the day put Villanova ahead, 13-7, at intermission.

The Wildcats added to their lead in the third quarter at the 2:39 mark with a 19-yard field goal by Hannon. The Blue Hens staged a late comeback and cut the lead to 16-14 with 5:41 remaining when senior halfback Butter Pressey scored on a seven-yard carry. The Blue Hens put together a 15-play drive covering 86 yards in 6:27.

Villanova junior Shaz Brown returned the kickoff 58 yards to the Delaware 27-yard line and four plays later Hannon booted his fourth field goal of the day from 36-yards out to seal the victory. With the win, the Wildcats earned a share of the 2001 Atlantic 10 Championship.

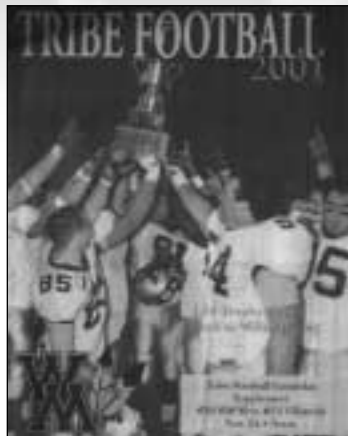

WILLIAMSBURG, VA. - Marques Bobo intercepted a pass with 25 seconds remaining as William & Mary beat Villanova 47-44, despite a record-setting performance by the Wildcats' Brian Westbrook. William & Mary's victory created a four-way tie for the Atlantic 10 championship and denied Villanova (8-3, 7-2 A-10) an automatic bid to the Division I-AA playoffs.

Westbrook had 332 all-purpose yards to give him 9,512 for his career, breaking the NCAA all-divisions record of 9,301 yards set by Brian Shay of Division II Emporia State from 1995-1998.

William & Mary's David Corley completed 15 of 21 passes for 301 yards and two touchdowns, and Jonathan Smith ran for two scores. Rich Musinski set a William & Mary season record with 1,242 receiving yards, breaking the mark of 1,180 yards set by Mark Compher in 1990.

Brett Gordon of Villanova was 25-of-41 for 258 yards and five touchdowns, with two coming to Brian White.

William & Mary led 34-28 at the half and added two touchdowns in the third quarter before Villanova scored twice in the fourth stanza and succeeded on 2-point conversions each time.

The Wildcats began their final drive at their 9-yard line with 3:05 left. Gordon completed two passes to Shaz Brown and Westbrook and had three runs to advance to the Villanova 39. On third down, Bobo intercepted Gordon's pass and returned it 31 yards to the Villanova 18.
