LEHIGH REPORT: The Mountain Hawks enter Saturday's game with an 0-1 record after losing their first game at home to Central Connecticut State by a score of 28-21.

In the game against the Blue Devils, the teams traded touchdowns throughout the contest and neither team scored more than seven unanswered points. Central Connecticut scored late in the third quarter to close the scoring ahead of a scoreless final period.

Lehigh was limited to just 184 yards of total offense, including 64 rushing yards and 122 passing yards. Quarterback JB Clark went 7-of-29 with a pair of touchdown passes and three interceptions. Jake Drwal and Alex Wojdowski each had touchdown receptions in the game and John Kennedy returned a kickoff 92 yards for a touchdown to account for the first Mountain Hawks points.

Last season, Lehigh was 5-6 for the season and 4-2 in the Patriot League. The team returns 30 letterwinners from that team, with four offensive starters and six defensive starters returning.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH ANDY COEN: In his fourth season as head coach of the Mountain Hawks, Andy Coen comes into Saturday's game with a career record of 16-18 (.471) at the school. He has produced 33 All-Patriot League selections and 43 Patriot League Academic Honor Roll players in his time at the school.

Last season, Lehigh went 4-2 in Patriot League play and led the conference in sacks, net punting and kickoff return average. The Mountain Hawks also ranked in the top 30 in the country in each of those categories. In his first season as head coach in 2006, Coen guided Lehigh to a share of the program's eighth Patriot League title.

Coen is in his first stint as a collegiate head coach. He previously was an assistant coach at Lehigh from 1994-99 and was a part of three Patriot League championships teams. Prior to returning to Lehigh, he spent three years as the Offensive Coordinator at Penn.

2009 Game Notes

25th ANNIVERSARY: Villanova head coach **Andy Talley** is celebrating his 25th season on the Main Line in 2009. During his Wildcat career, Talley has registered a 166-110-1 record, making him the all-time winningest coach in Villanova history. His 29-year overall coaching record currently stands at 194-119-2. Throughout his tenure at Villanova, Talley has guided the Wildcats to seven NCAA playoff appearances (1989, 1991, 1992, 1996, 1997, 2002 and 2008), four conference titles and two Lambert Meadowlands trophies. In 1997, Talley garnered the Eddie Robinson Award and the AFCA/GTE National Coach of the Year Award after leading Villanova to a perfect 11-0 regular season and the No. 1 ranking in the country for the last six weeks of the season.

WILDCATS VERSUS THE PATRIOT LEAGUE: Villanova has had a great deal of success versus Patriot League opponents. Entering play against Lehigh on Saturday, Villanova has recorded an impressive 21-3 mark versus teams from the Patriot League since becoming a FBS (formerly I-AA) program in 1985. As a FBS program, the Wildcats are 9-0 versus Fordham, 5-0 against Bucknell, 4-0 versus Colgate, 3-1 against Lehigh and 0-2 versus Holy Cross.

HOME OPENERS: Saturday evening's game with Lehigh will be the 2009 home opener for the Villanova Wildcats. During head coach Andy Talley's career, the Wildcats have posted an 18-6 record in home openers. Villanova is 1-1 versus Lehigh in home openers (31-28 Lehigh win in 2006/ 33-14 Villanova victory last season).

SEPTEMBER SUCCESS: Dating back to the 1997 season, Villanova is 29-5 in the month of September versus FCS (formerly I-AA) competition. All total, the Wildcats are 30-10 in the month of September since 1997 with five of the 10 losses coming against FBS (formerly I-A) opponents.

PLAYING UP: Last Thursday's 27-24 win over Temple was Villanova's third-ever win against a FBS opponent since the Wildcats began playing at the FCS level in 1985. Villanova is now 3-11 all-time versus FBS competition. The three wins include a 37-19 win over Rutgers in 2002, a 23-20 double overtime win against Temple in 2003 and last Thursday's victory at Temple.

MOVING UP: Due in large part to its 27-24 season opening win over Temple, Villanova moved up two spots to No. 3 in both *The Sports Network* and the *Collegiate Commissioner's Association* Coaches polls.

TOUGH LEAGUE: Villanova is one of seven CAA schools to be ranked in the *Sports Network* Top 25, including five in the top 10. In addition to Richmond at No. 1 and Villanova at No. 3, other CAA programs ranked in the Top 10 include James Madison at No. 6, William & Mary at No. 7 and New Hampshire at No. 9. Massachusetts is No. 17 and Maine is ranked at No. 20. Of the four other teams ranked in this week's top 10, the Wildcats will play all four this season.

STAYING CLOSE: Villanova will not leave the city of Philadelphia until week six of the season when the 'Cats travel to New Hampshire on Oct. 10. The Wildcats opened up last week versus Temple at Lincoln Financial Field. After hosting Lehigh this week, Villanova returns to Philadelphia next week to play at Penn before returning to the Main Line for two straight home games.

CAA HONORS: Two members of the Villanova Wildcats earned player of the week accolades from the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). Senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** (Spring Valley, Calif.) was named the CAA Offensive Player of the Week, while redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** (Cleveland, Ohio) garnered CAA Special Teams Player of the Week distinction. In his team's 27-24 win over Temple, Harvey made a career-high nine receptions for a career-best 142 yards and one touchdown. Yako turned in a flawless performance in his first collegiate game. He went two-of-two in field goal attempts and three-for-three in PATs. His 32-yard field goal came as time expired to give the Wildcats a thrilling 27-24 comeback win over Temple.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION: In addition to earning CAA recognition, **Nick Yako** was also named the *College Sporting News* FCS national Special Teams Player of the Week.

SECOND HALF SENSATION: It was a tale of two halves for senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** in last Thursday's win at Temple. In the first half, he had one catch for 10 yards. In the second half, Harvey hauled in eight receptions for 132 yards and a touchdown giving him nine catches for 142 yards and one score for the game. Both the catches and receiving yards represent career-highs.

BEST FOOT FORWARD: Redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** couldn't have asked for a better start to his Villanova career. In his first career collegiate game versus Temple last Thursday, Yako went three-of-three in PATs and two-of-two in field goal attempts. One of his two field goals was a 32-yarder as time expired to give Villanova a thrilling 27-24 comeback win over the Temple Owls.

DOMINANT DEFENDER: Villanova received a strong performance from senior safety **Ross Ventrone** in last Thursday's season opening win against Temple. In the victory, Ventrone registered a team-high nine tackles, a fumble recovery and an interception. He returned the fumble 59 yards for his first career touchdown. The interception was his sixth career pick in 25 career games.

CAREER NIGHT: Junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** had the best statistical game of his career in last week's season opener at Temple. In his team's 27-24 win, Whitney completed a career-high 24 passes in 35 attempts for a career-best 278 yards and two touchdowns. This was Whitney's third career 200-yard passing game. Whitney will be making his 17th career start when Villanova hosts Lehigh this Saturday and he is currently 12-4 as a starter. Whitney has never lost to an opponent with a sub-500 record and all four of his losses have come against teams ranked in the Top 15 nationally. For his career, Whitney has completed 203-of-309 for 2,342 yards to go with 17 touchdowns and eight interceptions. He has also rushed for 600 yards on 219 carries and six scores.

FORCING MISCUES: In last Thursday's 27-24 win at Temple, the Villanova defense forced the Owls into five turnovers, including three interceptions and two fumbles. Villanova scored 13 of its 27 points off of Temple turnovers. Villanova committed just one turnover and had a +4 turnover margin for the game.



A NOSE FOR THE BALL: Early in his career, sophomore cornerback **Jimmy Pitts** has shown the ability to be a playmaker for the Villanova defense. Pitts made his first career start in week one versus Temple and tallied his third career interception. As a reserve last year who saw limited playing time, Pitts recorded two interceptions including returning one for a score. In addition to his interception against Temple, Pitts also posted five total tackles, including four solo stops.

PRE-SEASON FAVORITE: In the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) pre-season predicted order of finish, Villanova and defending National Champion Richmond earned a first place tie to win the South Division with nine first place votes each. The two schools were also chosen as the co-overall champions of the league. New Hampshire was picked to win the North Division title.

THE EXPERIENCE FACTOR: A main reason why hopes are high surrounding the 2009 Villanova squad is that the Wildcats return 15 starters and 31 letterwinners from last year's NCAA quarterfinal team that went 10-3 overall and 7-1 in CAA play.

ALL-CONFERENCE ACCOLADES: Four Wildcats were named to the pre-season first team All-CAA squad. On the offensive side of the ball, junior offensive lineman **Ben Ijalana** (Hainesport, N.J.) and junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** (Erma, N.J.) earned first team All-CAA honors. Defensively, senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** (Bloomsburg, Pa.) and senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** (Wall, N.J.) garnered first team All-Conference acclaim.

ALL-AMERICAN DISTINCTION: Four Wildcats garnered pre-season All-American accolades by *The Sports Network*. Senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** and junior offensive tackle **Ben Ijalana** were named to *The Sports Network* pre-season first team All-American squad, while senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** and senior center **Brian Brannigan** were third team pre-season All-American selections.

LEADING THE WAY: The 2009 Villanova captains will be senior defensive tackle **Phil Matusz**, senior offensive lineman **Brian Brannigan** and senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde**.

1,000 YARD RUSHER: As a sophomore last year, running back **Aaron Ball** became just the third Wildcat in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. Ball played in all 13 games in 2008 and tallied 1,081 yards rushing on 215 carries (5.0 yards per carry/ 83.2 yards per game) and 13 touchdowns. The other two Villanova players to rush for 1,000 yards in a season were Brian Westbrook who did it three times (1998, 2000, 2001) and Curtis Sifford in 1996. Ball's 1,081 yards ranks as the third best single season rushing mark in school history.

IRON MEN: Three junior members of the Villanova football team have started every game of their Wildcat career. Junior offensive tackle **Ben Ijalana**, junior offensive guard **Brant Clouser** and junior linebacker **Terence Thomas** will be making their 26th consecutive career start this week against Lehigh. The trio started all 11 games as true freshmen, all 13 games a season ago and the season opener at Temple.

TOP TACKLER: Linebacker **Osayi Osunde** returns for his senior season after leading the Wildcats in tackles the last two seasons. As a sophomore in 2007, Osunde made a team-best 82 total tackles. Last year as a junior, he had a team-high 75 tackles to go with five tackles for loss, two interceptions, two forced fumbles and one sack. For his efforts last year, Osunde was a first team All-CAA choice. He was named to the pre-season first team All-CAA squad this year and to the first team pre-season *Sports Network* All-American team. He was also named to the Buck Buchanan Watch List. The Buchanan Award is given to the top defensive player in FCS football. He was credited with six total stops in week one versus Temple.

SACK ATTACK: Senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** has 16 career quarterback sacks to his credit. Last year, Kukucka was named second team All-CAA when he registered a team-best 7.5 sacks to go with 39 tackles and a team-high tying 15 tackles for loss. Kukucka, who was named to the 2009 first team All-CAA pre-season squad, was also a second team All-Conference choice in 2007. In week one at Temple, Kukucka had four solo stops, one tackle for loss and a forced fumble.

MR. VERSATILITY: You would be hard-pressed to find a more versatile player in the country than junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur**. Throughout the course of the game, Szczur will play wide receiver, running back, quarterback, serve as a return man and also be one of the team's top special team players. Last year, he had 32 catches for 511 yards and four touchdowns and 78 carries for 449 yards (5.8 yards per rush) and three scores. He also had five punt returns for 43 yards and four kickoff returns for 146 yards, including a 91-yard return for a score versus Colgate in the first round of the NCAA playoffs. In that playoff game against Colgate, Szczur scored three touchdowns including a receiving score, a rushing score and a kick return for a touchdown. Szczur was a second team All-CAA choice in 2008 and has been named to the pre-season first team in 2009. In week one at Temple, Szczur registered four catches for 31 yards, three carries for five yards and four kickoff returns for 119 yards including a 53-yard return.

CHECK THE PROGRAM: Three Villanova starters have changed their uniform number this season. Senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** has switched from No. 91 to No. 23, junior defensive back **Fred Maldonado** went from No. 39 to No. 2 and sophomore wideout **Norman White** changed from No. 87 to No. 8.

ROSTER ADDITION: Villanova added a player two weeks into pre-season camp when freshman linebacker **Angel Clybourn** transferred in from the University of Cincinnati. The 6-1, 220 pound Clybourn will be eligible to play for the Wildcats immediately. He is expected to be a reserve at linebacker. Clybourn is a native of Mays Landing, N.J. and a graduate of the Blair Academy.



OVERTIME HISTORY: During head coach **Andy Talley's** tenure, Villanova has played 13 overtime games and in those 13 contests are 9-4. The Wildcats have won seven of their last nine overtime games. In Villanova's last meeting versus Temple, the Wildcats registered a 23-20 double overtime win.

TOP OF THE LIST: With his team's win over New Hampshire last November, Villanova head coach **Andy Talley** became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) football. Talley ended last season with exactly 100 career conference victories.

The four include running back **Brian Westbrook** (8th season with the Philadelphia Eagles), wide receiver **Brian Finneran** (11th NFL season/10th with the Atlanta Falcons), tight end **Matt Sherry** who is currently on the Cincinnati Bengal injured reserve list and linebacker **Darrel Young** who is a rookie with the Washington Redskins and is a member of the practice squad.

GAME 1 RECAP: NO. 5 VILLANOVA 27, TEMPLE 24

Sept. 3, 2009
Lincoln Financial Field
Philadelphia, Pa.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa.--Redshirt freshman **Nick Yako** kicked a 32-yard field goal as time expired and Villanova completed a late comeback with a 27-24 victory over Temple in the inaugural Mayor's Cup game played at Lincoln Financial Field. The Wildcats trailed by 10 points in the middle of the fourth quarter before coming back to tally their third-ever win against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent.

A six-yard pass from junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** with 1:24 to play tied the game at 24-24. On the fourth play of the ensuing drive by the Owls, junior strong safety **John Dempsey** picked off a pass at the 50-yard line and returned possession to Villanova. The interception was one of five turnovers gained by the Wildcats in the game.

Villanova started its final drive with 49 seconds left and began to set up for a field goal once the ball was in the red zone. Earlier in the quarter, the Wildcat comeback started when Yako kicked a 27-yard field goal with 9:58 to play that pulled Villanova to within 24-17. The Wildcats first-year kicker had a flawless collegiate debut with the two field goals and three extra points.

After the first field goal by Yako set Villanova up for an eventual game-tying possession, the Wildcats recovered a fumble on the seventh play of the next Temple drive. Dempsey forced a fumble on a first-and-10 play from the Villanova 30-yard line and junior linebacker **Marquis Kirkland** recovered the loose ball. The Wildcats took over at their own 35-yard line and the pass from Whitney to senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** capped a 12-play drive that took 4:29 off the clock and ended with 1:24 remaining.

Whitney passed for a career-high 278 yards on 24-of-35 passing. After going 7-of-14 in the first half, he recovered to go 17-of-21 in the second half along the way to notching his third career game with at least 200 yards passing. Harvey caught nine of the completions for a career-high 142 yards and the game's biggest touchdown.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Owls got on the scoreboard first on a 25-yard field goal with 4:39 left in the first half. A 75-yard touchdown pass from Vaughn Charlton to James Nixon with just 1:01 remaining before the intermission sent Temple into the locker rooms with a 10-0 halftime lead.

In the second half, senior free safety **Ross Ventrone** returned a fumble 59 yards for a touchdown to get the Wildcats on the board just 52 seconds into the third quarter. It was the longest fumble return for a touchdown by a Villanova player in at least the last 12 years and was the second turnover gained by Ventrone in the game. He also registered his sixth career interception earlier in the contest.

Senior running back **Tony Canci** recorded his first career touchdown on a five-yard pass from Whitney with 22 seconds left in the third quarter. At that point the score was 17-14 in favor of Temple, but the Owls stretched their lead nine seconds in the final period on a 44-yard pass from Charlton to Michael Campbell.

Villanova began the season as one of eight teams from the powerhouse Colonial Athletic Association ranked in the top 25 of the preseason Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Coaches Poll. Tonight's win by the Wildcats marked the fourth straight season that a CAA team has defeated an FBS opponent. The CAA has had a representative in the FCS championship game in five of the last six years.
