PENN REPORT: For the second straight year, the Quakers play their season opener against Villanova at Franklin Field. Penn is coming off a year in which it went 6-4 and compiled a 5-2 record in Ivy League play. The team returns 33 letterwinners from last season, including eight offensive starters, seven defensive starters and three specialists.

Running back Mike DiMaggio is the team's top offensive returner after running for 585 yards and four touchdowns last season while averaging 4.4 yards per carry. The Quakers also bring back wide receiver Kyle Derham, who led the team with 29 receptions last year while totaling 404 yards and one score.

Defensively, linebacker Jake Lewko led the squad with 61 tackles in 2008, including 6.5 tackles for loss and two sacks. Defensive back Chris Wynn had a team-high five interceptions as well as nine pass break-ups.

PENN HEAD COACH AL BAGNOLI: One of the winningest coaches in Ivy League history, Al Bagnoli is in his 18th season at Penn and his 28th overall as a collegiate head coach. Bagnoli spent 10 years at Union College from 1982-91 before taking over the Quakers program.

Bagnoli ranks second among all active FCS coaches in winning percentage with a career mark of .738. He also ranks second all-time in victories at Penn with 108 and is tops among all Ivy League coaches since the start of formal league play in 1956. Bagnoli is fourth all-time in victories at an Ivy League school.

During his tenure with the Quakers, Bagnoli has led the team to three undefeated seasons (1993, 1994, 2003). His 2003 squad won the Ivy League title and marked the second time that a Bagnoli team posted back-to-back undefeated seasons in Ivy League play.

He enters this Saturday's game with a 114-54 (.684) mark in his 18th season at Penn and a 200-73 (.738) record in his 27th season overall.

2009 Game Notes

25th ANNIVERSARY: Villanova head coach **Andy Talley** is celebrating his 25th season on the Main Line in 2009. During his Wildcat career, Talley has registered a 167-110-1 record, making him the all-time winningest coach in Villanova history. His 29-year overall coaching record currently stands at 195-119-2. Throughout his tenure at Villanova, Talley has guided the Wildcats to seven NCAA playoff appearances (1989, 1991, 1992, 1996, 1997, 2002 and 2008), four conference titles and two Lambert Meadowlands trophies. In 1997, Talley garnered the Eddie Robinson Award and the AFCA/GTE National Coach of the Year Award after leading Villanova to a perfect 11-0 regular season and the No. 1 ranking in the country for the last six weeks of the season.

PHILLY FLAVOR: Villanova will be playing its second Philadelphia opponent of the season this weekend when the Wildcats travel to Penn for a Saturday night contest. In the season opener, Villanova registered a 27-24 win over Temple in a game played at Lincoln Financial Field. This will be the 14th meeting between Villanova and Penn. The Wildcats lead the all-time series by an 8-5 count and have won eight in a row over the Quakers. Penn's last win in the series came on Oct. 4, 1911. Penn won the first five meetings from 1905-1911, before the Wildcats tallied their first win in the series in 1980 and have won eight straight since that victory.

CLOSE CALLS: Even though Villanova has posted eight consecutive wins over Penn, the games between the two teams have been closely contested. In the last five meetings, Villanova's margin of victory has been just 8.0 points. In the last four games at Franklin Field, the margin of victory has been just 5.0 points.

PLAYING THE IVY LEAGUE: During head coach Andy Talley's tenure at Villanova, the Wildcats are a perfect 9-0 versus Ivy League competition. Talley has guided the Wildcats to a 7-0 mark versus Penn and a 2-0 record against Columbia. Talley has familiarity with the Ivy League having been an assistant at Brown University from 1973-78.

FRANKLIN FIELD FACTOR: Throughout its history, Villanova has had a great deal of success at Franklin Field. Entering play this Saturday at Penn, Villanova owns an all-time record of 11-3-1 at Franklin Field.

NON CONFERENCE FINALE: Saturday's game at Penn marks the final non conference game of the year for the Wildcats. Following this week's contest, Villanova will play eight straight CAA games beginning next week at home versus Northeastern.

SEPTEMBER SUCCESS: Dating back to the 1997 season, Villanova is 29-5 in the month of September versus FCS (formerly I-AA) competition. All total, the Wildcats are 30-10 in the month of September since 1997 with five of the 10 losses coming against FBS (formerly I-A) opponents.

THE NATIONAL SCENE: Villanova is ranked second in both the *Sports Network* and FCS Coaches polls this. This is the team's highest ranking since being ranked second on October 20, 2003. The highest ranking in program history came in 1997 when the Wildcats were ranked No. 1 for the final six weeks of the season.

TOUGH ROAD: Villanova is one of seven CAA teams in this week's *Sports Network* Top 25. CAA teams occupy five of the top seven spots in the poll highlighted by Richmond at No. 1. The other CAA schools ranked this week include William & Mary at No. 5, New Hampshire at No. 6, JMU at No. 7, Massachusetts at No. 17 and Maine at No. 20.

TRAVEL FRIENDLY: Villanova will not leave the city of Philadelphia until week six of the season when the 'Cats travel to New Hampshire on Oct. 10. The Wildcats opened up at Temple at Lincoln Financial Field before hosting Lehigh last week in the home opener. Villanova returns to Philadelphia this week to play at Penn before returning to the Main Line for two straight home games.

IN A RUSH: In last week's win over Lehigh, Villanova dominated the Mountain Hawks on the ground. In the 38-17 win, the Wildcats amassed 310 rushing yards on 47 carries for an average of 6.6 yards per carry. This marks the fourth time in the last 11 years that the Wildcats have rushed for 300 yards or more, but it is the third time in the last five games that they have accomplished the feat.

TWO FOR A 100: Two Wildcats went over the 100-yard rushing mark in last Saturday's win over Lehigh. Junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** tallied his second career 100-yard rushing game with a career-best 130 yards rushing on 14 carries (9.3 yards per carry) and one touchdown, while junior wideout **Matt Szczur** posted his first career 100-yard game with 103 yards on five carries. The last time Villanova had two 100-yard rushers in the same game was in the 2008 regular season finale at Delaware (Aaron Ball -- 105 yards; Whitney-- 102 yards).

LONG RUSH: A big reason why **Matt Szczur** was able to eclipse the 100-yard rushing mark last Saturday versus Lehigh was due in large part to the 75-yard run he had in the first quarter. Szczur took a direct snap on Villanova's 23-yard line and scampered 75 yards before being tackled at the Lehigh two-yard line. The run ranks tied for the 23rd longest rush in program history.

DEFENSIVE SCORES: The Villanova defense has registered touchdowns in the first two games of the season. In the season opener at Temple, senior safety **Ross Ventrone** returned a fumble 59 yards for his first career touchdown. Last week against Lehigh, redshirt freshman defensive end **Marlon Johnson** was credited with a 19-yard fumble return for a score. Villanova has had four defensive touchdowns in the last two seasons.

GREAT START: Redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** has started his collegiate career in fine fashion. After two games, Yako is 3-of-3 in field goal attempts and 8-of-8 in PATs. In his first career game versus Temple he connected on a 32-yarder as time expired to give Villanova a thrilling 27-24 comeback win over the Temple Owls.

STATISTICALLY SPEAKING: In his first 17 starts as Villanova's starting quarterback, junior **Chris Whitney** has led the Wildcats to an impressive 13-4 mark. Whitney has never lost to an opponent with a sub-500 record and all four of his losses have come against teams ranked in the Top 15 nationally. For his career, Whitney has completed 214-of-325 for 2,448 yards to go with 19 touchdowns and eight interceptions. He has also rushed for 730 yards on 233 carries and seven scores. After two games this year, he is 35-of-51 for 384 yards to go with four touchdowns and no interceptions. He is also the team's leading rusher with 163 yards on 31 carries (5.3 yards per carry) and one touchdown.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL: Villanova has had just one turnover in the first two games of the season and that was a fumble in week one at Temple. The Villanova defense has forced six turnovers (3 int./3 fumbles) giving the Wildcats a +5 in turnover margin.

2009 Game Notes

SOLID IN THE SECONDARY: Sophomore cornerback **Jimmy Pitts** has shown the ability to be a playmaker for the Villanova defense. Pitts made his first career start in week one versus Temple and tallied his third career interception. Last week against Lehigh, Pitts was credited with four solo tackles, two tackles for loss and a forced fumble. As a reserve last year who saw limited playing time, Pitts recorded two interceptions including returning one for a score.

PRE-SEASON FAVORITE: In the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) pre-season predicted order of finish, Villanova and defending National Champion Richmond earned a first place tie to win the South Division with nine first place votes each. The two schools were also chosen as the co-overall champions of the league. New Hampshire was picked to win the North Division title.

THE EXPERIENCE FACTOR: A main reason why hopes are high surrounding the 2009 Villanova squad is that the Wildcats return 15 starters and 31 letterwinners from last year's NCAA quarterfinal team that went 10-3 overall and 7-1 in CAA play.

ALL-CONFERENCE ACCOLADES: Four Wildcats were named to the pre-season first team All-CAA squad. On the offensive side of the ball, junior offensive lineman **Ben Ijalana** (Hainesport, N.J.) and junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** (Erma, N.J.) earned first team All-CAA honors. Defensively, senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** (Bloomsburg, Pa.) and senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** (Wall, N.J.) garnered first team All-Conference acclaim.

ALL-AMERICAN DISTINCTION: Four Wildcats garnered pre-season All-American accolades by *The Sports Network*. Senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** and junior offensive tackle **Ben Ijalana** were named to *The Sports Network* pre-season first team All-American squad, while senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** and senior center **Brian Brannigan** were third team pre-season All-American selections.

LEADING THE WAY: The 2009 Villanova captains will be senior defensive tackle **Phil Matusz**, senior offensive lineman **Brian Brannigan** and senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde**.

1,000 YARD RUSHER: As a sophomore last year, running back **Aaron Ball** became just the third Wildcat in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. Ball played in all 13 games in 2008 and tallied 1,081 yards rushing on 215 carries (5.0 yards per carry/ 83.2 yards per game) and 13 touchdowns. The other two Villanova players to rush for 1,000 yards in a season were Brian Westbrook who did it three times (1998, 2000, 2001) and Curtis Sifford in 1996. Ball's 1,081 yards ranks as the third best single season rushing mark in school history. After two games this season, Ball has 78 yards rushing on 18 carries (4.3 avg.) and one score.

WEEK IN AND WEEK OUT: Three junior members of the Villanova football team have started every game of their Wildcat career. Junior offensive tackle **Ben Ijalana**, junior offensive guard **Brant Clouser** and junior linebacker **Terence Thomas** will be making their 27th consecutive career start this week at Penn. The trio started all 11 games as true freshmen, all 13 games a season ago and the first two games this season.

TOP TACKLER: Linebacker **Osayi Osunde** returns for his senior season after leading the Wildcats in tackles the last two seasons. As a sophomore in 2007, Osunde made a team-best 82 total tackles. Last year as a junior, he had a team-high 75 tackles to go with five tackles for loss, two interceptions, two forced fumbles and one sack. For his efforts last year, Osunde was a first team All-CAA choice. He was named to the pre-season first team All-CAA squad this year and to the first team pre-season *Sports Network* All-American team. He was also named to the Buck Buchanan Watch List. The Buchanan Award is given to the top defensive player in FCS football. After two games in 2009, Osunde owns a team-best 12 total tackles.

SACK ATTACK: Senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** has 16 career quarterback sacks to his credit. Last year, Kukucka was named second team All-CAA when he registered a team-best 7.5 sacks to go with 39 tackles and a team-high tying 15 tackles for loss. Kukucka, who was named to the 2009 first team All-CAA pre-season squad, was also a second team All-Conference choice in 2007. Kukucka has seven tackles and a tackle for loss after two weeks this season.

MR. VERSATILITY: You would be hard-pressed to find a more versatile player in the country than junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur**. Throughout the course of the game, Szczur will play wide receiver, running back, quarterback, serve as a return man and also be one of the team's top special team players. Last year, he had 32 catches for 511 yards and four touchdowns and 78 carries for 449 yards (5.8 yards per rush) and three scores. He also had five punt returns for 43 yards and four kickoff returns for 146 yards, including a 91-yard return for a score versus Colgate in the first round of the NCAA playoffs. In that playoff game against Colgate, Szczur scored three touchdowns including a receiving score, a rushing score and a kick return for a touchdown. Szczur was a second team All-CAA choice in 2008 and has been named to the pre-season first team in 2009. After two games in 2009, he ranks second on the team in rushing (108 yards on eight carries), second in receiving (eight catches for 66 yards) and is the team's top kickoff return man with an average of 27.0 yards per return. Last week in a win over Lehigh, Szczur recorded his first career 100-yard rushing game with 103 yards on five carries.

CHECK THE PROGRAM: Three Villanova starters have changed their uniform number this season. Senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** has switched from No. 91 to No. 23, junior defensive back **Fred Maldonado** went from No. 39 to No. 2 and sophomore wideout **Norman White** changed from No. 87 to No. 8.

ROSTER ADDITION: Villanova added a player two weeks into pre-season camp when freshman linebacker **Angel Clybourn** transferred in from the University of Cincinnati. The 6-1, 220 pound Clybourn will be eligible to play for the Wildcats immediately. He is expected to be a reserve at linebacker. Clybourn is a native of Mays Landing, N.J. and a graduate of the Blair Academy.



OVERTIME HISTORY: During head coach **Andy Talley's** tenure, Villanova has played 13 overtime games and in those 13 contests are 9-4. The Wildcats have won seven of their last nine overtime games. In Villanova's last meeting versus Temple, the Wildcats registered a 23-20 double overtime win.

TOP OF THE LIST: With his team's win over New Hampshire last November, Villanova head coach **Andy Talley** became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) football. Talley ended last season with exactly 100 career conference victories.

GAME 1 RECAP: NO. 5 VILLANOVA 27, TEMPLE 24

Sept. 3, 2009
Lincoln Financial Field
Philadelphia, Pa.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa.--Redshirt freshman **Nick Yako** kicked a 32-yard field goal as time expired and Villanova completed a late comeback with a 27-24 victory over Temple in the inaugural Mayor's Cup game played at Lincoln Financial Field. The Wildcats trailed by 10 points in the middle of the fourth quarter before coming back to tally their third-ever win against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent.

A six-yard pass from junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** with 1:24 to play tied the game at 24-24. On the fourth play of the ensuing drive by the Owls, junior strong safety **John Dempsey** picked off a pass at the 50-yard line and returned possession to Villanova. The interception was one of five turnovers gained by the Wildcats in the game.

Villanova started its final drive with 49 seconds left and began to set up for a field goal once the ball was in the red zone. Earlier in the quarter, the Wildcat comeback started when Yako kicked a 27-yard field goal with 9:58 to play that pulled Villanova to within 24-17. The Wildcats first-year kicker had a flawless collegiate debut with the two field goals and three extra points.

After the first field goal by Yako set Villanova up for an eventual game-tying possession, the Wildcats recovered a fumble on the seventh play of the next Temple drive. Dempsey forced a fumble on a first-and-10 play from the Villanova 30-yard line and junior linebacker **Marquis Kirkland** recovered the loose ball. The Wildcats took over at their own 35-yard line and the pass from Whitney to senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** capped a 12-play drive that took 4:29 off the clock and ended with 1:24 remaining.

Whitney passed for a career-high 278 yards on 24-of-35 passing. After going 7-of-14 in the first half, he recovered to go 17-of-21 in the second half along the way to notching his third career game with at least 200 yards passing. Harvey caught nine of the completions for a career-high 142 yards and the game's biggest touchdown.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Owls got on the scoreboard first on a 25-yard field goal with 4:39 left in the first half. A 75-yard touchdown pass from Vaughn Charlton to James Nixon with just 1:01 remaining before the intermission sent Temple into the locker rooms with a 10-0 halftime lead.

In the second half, senior free safety **Ross Ventrone** returned a fumble 59 yards for a touchdown to get the Wildcats on the board just 52 seconds into the third quarter. It was the longest fumble return for a touchdown by a Villanova player in at least the last 12 years and was the second turnover gained by Ventrone in the game. He also registered his sixth career interception earlier in the contest.

Senior running back **Tony Canci** recorded his first career touchdown on a five-yard pass from Whitney with 22 seconds left in the third quarter. At that point the score was 17-14 in favor of Temple, but the Owls stretched their lead nine seconds in the final period on a 44-yard pass from Charlton to Michael Campbell.

Villanova began the season as one of eight teams from the powerhouse Colonial Athletic Association ranked in the top 25 of the preseason Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Coaches Poll. Tonight's win by the Wildcats marked the fourth straight season that a CAA team has defeated an FBS opponent. The CAA has had a representative in the FCS championship game in five of the last six years.

GAME 2 RECAP: NO. 3 VILLANOVA 38, LEHIGH 17

VILLANOVA, Pa.--Led by an unstoppable ground game, Villanova (2-0) produced two 100-yard rushers and cruised to a 38-17 win over Lehigh (0-2) on Saturday night in its home opener at Villanova Stadium. The Wildcats ran for 310 yards and defeated the Mountain Hawks in their first home game for the second straight year.

Junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** ran for a career-high 130 yards and junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** tallied his first career 100-yard rushing game to lead the Villanova offense. Whitney had 14 carries for 130 yards and a touchdown and also completed 11-of-16 passes for 106 yards and two scores.

Whitney ran in for a 21-yard score on the game's opening drive to get the Wildcats started, and Szczur broke free for a 75-yard run to the Lehigh two-yard line on the next drive to set up an eventual 29-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** that made the score 10-0 with 5:17 remaining in the first quarter.

Villanova stretched the margin to 24-7 at halftime and maintained their lead throughout the second half. Whitney threw touchdown passes to junior running back **Angelo Babbaro** and sophomore wide receiver **Norman White** in the game.

In addition to his 103-yard rushing performance, Szczur caught four passes for 35 yards and had a 16-yard kickoff return. Babbaro caught three passes for 40 yards.

Lehigh got on the board with 9:33 left in the second quarter on a 1-yard run by Jaren Walker that capped an 11-play drive. The Mountain Hawks managed just 55 yards on the ground as the Wildcats finished the game with a 417-252 edge in total yards. Starting quarterback JB Clark completed 20-of-31 passes for 130 yards and Chris Lum was 7-of-11 for 67 yards and a touchdown. Craig Zurn caught a game-high six passes for 72 yards.

A 10-7 lead for Villanova late in the second quarter quickly expanded when the Wildcats registered back-to-back touchdowns just 16 seconds apart. Babbaro caught a 13-yard pass from Whitney with 4:54 left in the opening half to finish a nine-play, 60-yard drive. On the next Lehigh possession, redshirt freshman **Marlon Johnson** returned a fumble recovery 19 yards for a touchdown with 4:38 left in the period.

Johnson's fumble recovery came on the only turnover of the game and marked the second straight game that Villanova returned a fumble for a touchdown.

In the second half, the Mountain Hawks scored first on a 41-yard field goal by Tom Randazza with 10:02 left in the third quarter. The Wildcats answered just over a minute later with a 39-yard scoring run from junior running back **Aaron Ball** and White had a 14-yard reception for a touchdown with 13:54 left in the fourth period. Ball finished with 57 yards on nine carries and the one score.

Lehigh scored the game's final points with 1:05 left on a 2-yard touchdown pass Chris Lum to Alex Wojdowski.
