WILLIAM & MARY REPORT: The Tribe enters Saturday's game with an identical 4-0 record (1-0 CAA) to the Wildcats and are the first of three straight nationally ranked opponents Villanova will face. William & Mary has averaged 29.0 points per game offensively while holding the opposition to just 15.8 points per contest.

Quarterback R.J. Archer has thrown for eight touchdowns and only two interceptions thus far on 70-of-117 passing for 779 yards. He has also run for 117 yards and a score. Archer's favorite targets have been wide receiver D.J. McAulay and tight end Rob Varno, who have 18 and 14 receptions, respectively. McAulay has caught three touchdown passes and Varno has one. Sophomore running back Jonathan Grimes leads the team's backs with 74.2 rushing yards per game and two scores.

Defensively, linebacker Jake Trantin leads the team in tackles with 29, including four tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. Defensive back B.W. Webb has a team-high three interceptions, including one that was returned 50 yards for a touchdown.

WILLIAM & MARY HEAD COACH JIMMYE LAYCOCK: The 2009 season marks the 30th in the head coaching career of Jimmye Laycock. In his first 29 seasons at his alma mater, Laycock has produced 19 years with a winning record and he has led his team to nine playoff appearances. Laycock ranks in the top 10 among all active FCS head coaches in career wins.

During his tenure, Laycock has seen 30 players receive a total of 76 All-America honors, while 11 players have become Academic All-Americans. In 2004, quarterback Lang Campbell received the Walter Payton Award and was a consensus first team All-American. Also in 2004, the Tribe set a school record with 11 victories, received an automatic NCAA bid and hosted a national semifinal game before ending the year with a No. 3 national ranking.

As a player at William & Mary, Laycock played football for coaching legends Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Entering Saturday's game, he has a career head coaching record of 193-138-2 (.583).

2009 Game Notes

25th ANNIVERSARY: Villanova head coach **Andy Talley** is celebrating his 25th season on the Main Line in 2009. During his Wildcat career, Talley has registered a 169-110-1 record, making him the all-time winningest coach in Villanova history. His 29-year overall coaching record currently stands at 197-119-2. Throughout his tenure at Villanova, Talley has guided the Wildcats to seven NCAA playoff appearances (1989, 1991, 1992, 1996, 1997, 2002 and 2008), four conference titles and two Lambert Meadowlands trophies. In 1997, Talley garnered the Eddie Robinson Award and the AFCA/GTE National Coach of the Year Award after leading Villanova to a perfect 11-0 regular season and the No. 1 ranking in the country for the last six weeks of the season.

NATIONAL EXPOSURE: This Saturday's game with William & Mary will be televised nationally on the Versus Network. The game will be the first-ever CAA regular season game to be televised nationally. It will also be the third time that Villanova football has played on national television. The team made its first-ever national TV appearance in 1987 when the season finale versus Holy Cross was on ESPN. Also, the 2002 semifinal playoff game against McNeese State was on ESPN.

TOUGH STRETCH: Beginning this week against No. 5 William & Mary, Villanova will play three straight games against Top 10 opponents. After this week's battle with The Tribe, the Wildcats will play at No. 6 New Hampshire next Saturday and at No. 7 James Madison on Oct. 17. There are six CAA teams ranked in the Top 25 this week. In addition to Villanova, William & Mary, New Hampshire and James Madison, Richmond is No. 1 and Massachusetts is No. 14.

STRONG BEGINNING: The Wildcats are 4-0 for the first time since 2003. That 2003 team started 6-0 before finishing 7-4 overall and 4-4 in league play.

HOME SWEET HOME: Entering play this Saturday against No. 5 William & Mary, the Villanova Wildcats are 14-1 in their last 15 home games. The lone loss came last year on a hail mary on the last play of the game against No. 1 James Madison. The 'Cats won the final two home contests of 2006, went 5-0 at home in 2007, 5-1 last year and are currently 2-0 at Villanova Stadium this year.

RECENT SUCCESS: Villanova trails William & Mary in the all-time series between the schools by a 14-11-1 count. However, the Wildcats have had the upper hand recently against the Tribe winning five of the last six, including the last four in a row.

POINT PRODUCTION: The Villanova offense has had a great deal of success versus William & Mary the last eight years. In the last eight meetings versus the Tribe, Villanova has scored 325 points for an average of 40.6 points per game. The Wildcats tallied 40 or more points in four of the eight games. Villanova won last year in Williamsburg by a score of 38-28. In William & Mary's last visit to Villanova Stadium in 2007, the Wildcats recorded a 63-24 victory.

FAMILIAR FACE: The William & Mary defense is led by third-year defensive coordinator Bob Shoop. In 1997, Shoop served as Villanova's defensive coordinator. During that 1997 season, Villanova went 11-0 during the regular season and finished the last six weeks of the season ranked No. 1 in the country. The Wildcats went on to finish 12-1 that year after advancing to the second round of the NCAA playoffs.

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT: In last Saturday's 56-7 win over Northeastern, the Villanova Wildcats were credited with 552 yards of total offense including 410 yards rushing and 142 yards passing. The 552 yards rate as the 10th best performance in school history.

OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY: En route to the 552 yards of total offense put up by the Wildcats last week, Villanova had 12 offensive possessions. The Wildcats scored touchdowns on eight of the 12 possessions with four of the eight scoring drives lasting six plays or less.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: Six different players scored a touchdown in Villanova's 56-7 win last Saturday against Northeastern. Sophomore running back **Lawrence Doss** and senior running back **Tony Canci** each tallied two touchdowns, while **Aaron Ball**, **Chris Whitney**, **Angelo Babbaro** and **Antwon Young** had one score each. After four games, Villanova has had nine different players score a touchdown.

IN A RUSH: The Villanova rushing attack was unstoppable in last Saturday's 56-7 win over Northeastern. In the victory, Villanova tallied 410 yards rushing on 53 carries for an average of 7.7 yards per carry. The 410 yards rank as the third most rushing yards in school history and this was just the fifth time in program history that the Wildcats have had 400 or more yards rushing. Before this performance, Villanova's last 400-yard rushing effort came on Oct. 26, 1991 when the 'Cats amassed 406 yards on the ground against William & Mary.

GAINING GROUND: Entering play this Saturday versus William & Mary, Villanova is averaging 228.0 rushing yards per game which ranks second in the CAA. The Wildcats have had two games this year of at least 300 yards rushing. In addition to the 410 yards rushing last week against Northeastern, Villanova posted 310 yards on the ground against Lehigh in week two. In the two home games this year, the Wildcats are averaging 360 rushing yards per contest.

CARRYING THE BALL: Junior running back **Aaron Ball** registered his fifth career 100-yard rushing game and first of the season in last week's win over Northeastern. Ball went over the 100-yard mark in the first quarter and finished the game with seven carries for 109 yards (15.6 yards per carry) and one touchdown. His score came on a 31-yard first quarter run. After four games, Ball has tallied 32 carries for 212 yards (6.6 yards per rush) and two touchdowns.

WEEK TO WEEK: In the 14-3 win at Penn on Sept. 19, the Villanova offense turned in one of its worst performances in recent memory with 187 total yards (128 yards rushing/ 59 yards passing) and just 13 first downs. A week later versus Northeastern, the Wildcats totaled 552 yards of total offense (410 yards rushing/ 142 yards passing) and 29 first downs. The Wildcats had more yards in the first quarter against Northeastern than they did the entire game at Penn.

REACHING THE CENTURY MARK: Senior wideout **Brandyn Harvey** recorded his second 100-yard receiving game of the year last Saturday versus Northeastern. In the win, Harvey made seven receptions for 102 yards. He also had a 100-yard receiving game at Temple in the season opener with nine receptions for 142 yards and a touchdown. For the year, Harvey has a team-best 20 receptions for a team-high 261 yards and two scores.

TWO FOR 100: With **Aaron Ball's** 109 yards rushing and **Brandyn Harvey's** 102 yards receiving last week against Northeastern, Villanova had a 100-yard receiver and a 100-yard rusher in the same game for the first time in four years. The last time Villanova accomplished this feat was in a 35-21 win over William & Mary in 2005. In that game, Moe Gibson had a 100-yard game on the ground and John Dieser tallied a 100-yard receiving effort.

2009 Game Notes

MR. TOUCHDOWN: Entering the 2009 season, fifth-year senior **Tony Canci** had never scored a touchdown during his Villanova career. After four games this year, Canci has four receptions with three of the four resulting in touchdowns. Canci had two receiving scores last Saturday against Northeastern. During his scholastic career at Sun Valley High School, Canci tied a Pennsylvania state record with eight touchdowns in a game.

THE CAA BEST: After four games in 2009, the Villanova defense has registered eight interceptions which leads the CAA. Five of the eight have come in the last two games. Leading the way for the Wildcats in the interception department is senior safety **Ross Ventrone** and sophomore corner **James Pitts** who have two each. One of Ventrone's interceptions was returned for a touchdown.

SOLO ACT: Junior safety **John Dempsey** led the Villanova defensive charge in last week's win over Northeastern. Dempsey finished the game with a team-best seven tackles with all seven being solo stops. The seven solo tackles ties a career-high. After four games, Dempsey ranks third on the squad in tackles with 20 and is first in tackles for loss with five.

NO ONE'S PERFECT: Redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** had his first miss of the year two weeks ago at Penn. Yako had started his collegiate career going 3-of-3 in field goal attempts and 9-of-9 in PATs. The perfection streak came to a close when he missed a 40-yard field goal versus the Quakers. Entering play this week versus William & Mary, Yako is 3-of-4 in field goal attempts and 18-for-18 in PATs.

RUNNING AT HOME: Junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** has had a great deal of success with the running game at Villanova Stadium this year. In the team's two home contests this year, Whitney has tallied 24 carries for 228 yards (career-high 130 vs. Lehigh/ 98 vs. Northeastern) and two scores and is averaging 114.0 rushing yards per game at home. In his first 19 starts as Villanova's starting quarterback, Whitney has led the Wildcats to an impressive 15-4 mark. Whitney has never lost to an opponent with a sub-500 record and all four of his losses have come against teams ranked in the Top 15 nationally. He currently leads the team in rushing with 276 yards on 53 carries (5.2 yards per carry) and two touchdowns. He has also completed 45-of-69 for 506 yards to go with five touchdowns and one interception.

PRE-SEASON FAVORITE: In the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) pre-season predicted order of finish, Villanova and defending National Champion Richmond earned a first place tie to win the South Division with nine first place votes each. The two schools were also chosen as the co-overall champions of the league. New Hampshire was picked to win the North Division title.

ALL-CONFERENCE ACCOLADES: Four Wildcats were named to the pre-season first team All-CAA squad. On the offensive side of the ball, junior offensive lineman **Ben Ijalana** (Hainesport, N.J.) and junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** (Erma, N.J.) earned first team All-CAA honors. Defensively, senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** (Bloomsburg, Pa.) and senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** (Wall, N.J.) garnered first team All-Conference acclaim.

ALL-AMERICAN DISTINCTION: Four Wildcats garnered pre-season All-American accolades by *The Sports Network*. Senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** and junior offensive tackle **Ben Ijalana** were named to *The Sports Network* pre-season first team All-American squad, while senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** and senior center **Brian Brannigan** were third team pre-season All-American selections.

LEADING THE WAY: The 2009 Villanova captains will be senior defensive tackle **Phil Matusz**, senior offensive lineman **Brian Brannigan** and senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde**.

WEEK IN AND WEEK OUT: Three junior members of the Villanova football team have started every game of their Wildcat career. Junior offensive tackle **Ben Ijalana**, junior offensive guard **Brant Clouser** and junior linebacker **Terence Thomas** will be making their 29th consecutive career start this week against William & Mary. The trio started all 11 games as true freshmen, all 13 games a season ago and the first four games this season.

TOP TACKLER: Linebacker **Osayi Osunde** returns for his senior season after leading the Wildcats in tackles the last two seasons. As a sophomore in 2007, Osunde made a team-best 82 total tackles. Last year as a junior, he had a team-high 75 tackles to go with five tackles for loss, two interceptions, two forced fumbles and one sack. For his efforts last year, Osunde was a first team All-CAA choice. He was named to the pre-season first team All-CAA squad this year and to the first team pre-season *Sports Network* All-American team. He was also named to the Buck Buchanan Watch List. The Buchanan Award is given to the top defensive player in FCS football. After four games in 2009, Osunde owns a team-best 24 total tackles.

A NUMBERS GAME: Three Villanova starters have changed their uniform number this season. Senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** has switched from No. 91 to No. 23, junior defensive back **Fred Maldonado** went from No. 39 to No. 2 and sophomore wideout **Norman White** changed from No. 87 to No. 8.

ROSTER ADDITION: Villanova added a player two weeks into pre-season camp when freshman linebacker **Angel Clybourn** transferred in from the University of Cincinnati. The 6-1, 220 pound Clybourn will be eligible to play for the Wildcats immediately. He is expected to be a reserve at linebacker. Clybourn is a native of Mays Landing, N.J. and a graduate of the Blair Academy.

OVERTIME HISTORY: During head coach **Andy Talley's** tenure, Villanova has played 13 overtime games and in those 13 contests are 9-4. The Wildcats have won seven of their last nine overtime games. In Villanova's last meeting versus Temple, the Wildcats registered a 23-20 double overtime win.



TOP OF THE LIST: With his team's win over New Hampshire last November, Villanova head coach **Andy Talley** became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) football. Talley ended last season with exactly 100 career conference victories.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa.--Redshirt freshman **Nick Yako** kicked a 32-yard field goal as time expired and Villanova completed a late comeback with a 27-24 victory over Temple in the inaugural Mayor's Cup game played at Lincoln Financial Field. The Wildcats trailed by 10 points in the middle of the fourth quarter before coming back to tally their third-ever win against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent.

A six-yard pass from junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** with 1:24 to play tied the game at 24-24. On the fourth play of the ensuing drive by the Owls, junior strong safety **John Dempsey** picked off a pass at the 50-yard line and returned possession to Villanova. The interception was one of five turnovers gained by the Wildcats in the game.

Villanova started its final drive with 49 seconds left and began to set up for a field goal once the ball was in the red zone. Earlier in the quarter, the Wildcats comeback started when Yako kicked a 27-yard field goal with 9:58 to play that pulled Villanova to within 24-17. The Wildcats first-year kicker had a flawless collegiate debut with the two field goals and three extra points.

After the first field goal by Yako set Villanova up for an eventual game-tying possession, the Wildcats recovered a fumble on the seventh play of the next Temple drive. Dempsey forced a fumble on a first-and-10 play from the Villanova 30-yard line and junior linebacker **Marquis Kirkland** recovered the loose ball. The Wildcats took over at their own 35-yard line and the pass from Whitney to senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** capped a 12-play drive that took 4:29 off the clock and ended with 1:24 remaining.

Whitney passed for a career-high 278 yards on 24-of-35 passing. After going 7-of-14 in the first half, he recovered to go 17-of-21 in the second half along the way to notching his third career game with at least 200 yards passing. Harvey caught nine of the completions for a career-high 142 yards and the game's biggest touchdown.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Owls got on the scoreboard first on a 25-yard field goal with 4:39 left in the first half. A 75-yard touchdown pass from Vaughn Charlton to James Nixon with just 1:01 remaining before the intermission sent Temple into the locker rooms with a 10-0 halftime lead.

In the second half, senior free safety **Ross Ventrone** returned a fumble 59 yards for a touchdown to get the Wildcats on the board just 52 seconds into the third quarter. It was the longest fumble return for a touchdown by a Villanova player in at least the last 12 years and was the second turnover gained by Ventrone in the game. He also registered his sixth career interception earlier in the contest.

Senior running back **Tony Canci** recorded his first career touchdown on a five-yard pass from Whitney with 22 seconds left in the third quarter. At that point the score was 17-14 in favor of Temple, but the Owls stretched their lead nine seconds in the final period on a 44-yard pass from Charlton to Michael Campbell.

Villanova began the season as one of eight teams from the powerhouse Colonial Athletic Association ranked in the top 25 of the preseason Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Coaches Poll. Tonight's win by the Wildcats marked the fourth straight season that a CAA team has defeated an FBS opponent. The CAA has had a representative in the FCS championship game in five of the last six years.

VILLANOVA, Pa.--Led by an unstoppable ground game, Villanova (2-0) produced two 100-yard rushers and cruised to a 38-17 win over Lehigh (0-2) on Saturday night in its home opener at Villanova Stadium. The Wildcats ran for 310 yards and defeated the Mountain Hawks in their first home game for the second straight year.

Junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** ran for a career-high 130 yards and junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** tallied his first career 100-yard rushing game to lead the Villanova offense. Whitney had 14 carries for 130 yards and a touchdown and also completed 11-of-16 passes for 106 yards and two scores.

Whitney ran in for a 21-yard score on the game's opening drive to get the Wildcats started, and Szczur broke free for a 75-yard run to the Lehigh two-yard line on the next drive to set up an eventual 29-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** that made the score 10-0 with 5:17 remaining in the first quarter.

Villanova stretched the margin to 24-7 at halftime and maintained their lead throughout the second half. Whitney threw touchdown passes to junior running back **Angelo Babbaro** and sophomore wide receiver **Norman White** in the game.

In addition to his 103-yard rushing performance, Szczur caught four passes for 35 yards and had a 16-yard kickoff return. Babbaro caught three passes for 40 yards.

Lehigh got on the board with 9:33 left in the second quarter on a 1-yard run by Jaren Walker that capped an 11-play drive. The Mountain Hawks managed just 55 yards on the ground as the Wildcats finished the game with a 417-252 edge in total yards. Starting quarterback JB Clark completed 20-of-31 passes for 130 yards and Chris Lum was 7-of-11 for 67 yards and a touchdown. Craig Zurn caught a game-high six passes for 72 yards.

A 10-7 lead for Villanova late in the second quarter quickly expanded when the Wildcats registered back-to-back touchdowns just 16 seconds apart. Babbaro caught a 13-yard pass from Whitney with 4:54 left in the opening half to finish a nine-play, 60-yard drive. On the next Lehigh possession, redshirt freshman **Marlon Johnson** returned a fumble recovery 19 yards for a touchdown with 4:38 left in the period.

Johnson's fumble recovery came on the only turnover of the game and marked the second straight game that Villanova returned a fumble for a touchdown.

In the second half, the Mountain Hawks scored first on a 41-yard field goal by Tom Randazza with 10:02 left in the third quarter. The Wildcats answered just over a minute later with a 39-yard scoring run from junior running back **Aaron Ball** and White had a 14-yard reception for a touchdown with 13:54 left in the fourth period. Ball finished with 57 yards on nine carries and the one score.

Lehigh scored the game's final points with 1:05 left on a 2-yard touchdown pass Chris Lum to Alex Wojdowski.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa.--Junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** ran back the game's opening kickoff 87 yards for a touchdown and No. 2 Villanova then settled into a scrappy defensive battle against Penn at Franklin Field, eventually coming away with a 14-3 victory. The win marked the first time since 2003 that the Wildcats have won their first three games to open a season.

Szczur fielded Trevor Charlston's 57-yard kickoff to start the night at the Villanova 13-yard line and brought it all the way back for his second career kickoff return touchdown - both have come on the first play of a game. Redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** kicked the extra point and then launched a 64-yard kickoff that the Quakers were only able to return to their own 23-yard line.

The immediate tally of points for the Wildcats and the stark difference in the opening possessions for each team - Penn gained just eight yards while going three-and-out on their first drive - certainly was not a harbinger of things to come, however.

Villanova wound up having possession of the ball for less than five minutes in the entire first quarter and would not score again until late in the third period. In the interim, the Quakers got their only points of the game on a 22-yard field goal by Andrew Samson with 12:46 left in the second quarter. The kick ended a 14-play, 66-yard drive that lasted nearly seven minutes and was indicative of Penn's ability to hold the ball throughout the game. Both teams had 12 drives on the night but the Quakers owned an edge of nearly 11 minutes in possession time.

As a result, the Wildcats ran just 50 offensive plays for a total of 187 yards. The team had averaged 387 yards of offense per game in its first two contests of the season. Penn didn't do much better against Villanova's equally opportune defense, running 62 plays and picking up 239 yards. Both sides committed two turnovers.

In the second half, senior quarterback **Antwon Young** threw a five-yard touchdown pass to senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** with 3:34 remaining in the third quarter to expand the Wildcat lead and close the scoring for the night. This was the fourth straight year that the Quakers have not scored after halftime against Villanova.

Young needed only four carries to run for a game-high 36 yards in the defensive duel. His longest rush was a 24-yard run on 3rd-and-11 from the Wildcat 21-yard line on the play that culminated with Harvey's touchdown reception. Young also threw a 14-yard pass to sophomore wide receiver **Norman White** on the drive, which covered 10 plays and 78 yards in 3:47.

Villanova gained 128 yards on the ground as Young and Szczur shared carries with junior running backs **Aaron Ball** and **Angelo Babbaro**. Young and junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** each completed 3-of-7 passes on a night when the Wildcats totaled just 59 yards in the air. Whitney also threw the team's first interception of the season and lost a fumble.

Although its offense matches up with anyone in the country on just about any night, the Villanova defense matched Penn play-for-play in a typically stalwart game between the local rivals. The Wildcats sacked quarterback Keiffer Garton six times and accumulated 10 total tackles for loss. Senior defensive back **Ross Ventrone** picked off his second interception of the season and junior linebacker **Terence Thomas** set a career-high with 10 tackles and two sacks. Senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** and junior **Mario Johnson** had two and 1.5 sacks, respectively, while Kukucka also registered a blocked kick.

VILLANOVA, Pa.--Junior running back **Aaron Ball** ran for over 100 yards in the first quarter alone and No. 2 Villanova ran for a season-high 410 yards in a 56-7 win over Northeastern on Saturday afternoon at Villanova Stadium. The Wildcats improved to 4-0 for the first time since 2003 and won their conference opener for the third straight year.

Ball ran for 109 yards and a touchdown on just seven carries and six different players scored touchdowns for Villanova, which registered individual 100-yard rushing and 100-yard receiving performances in the same game for the first time since 2005 against William & Mary. Senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** caught seven passes for 102 yards to join Ball as the '100-100' tandem in the game.

The rushing total for the Wildcats was their highest since 1991 and the third-highest single-game total in school history. Villanova has had just five games with even 300 yards rushing since 1999, but four of those games have come in the last seven outings dating back to last season.

On the third offensive play of the game, Ball ran 31 yards up the middle for a touchdown that got the Wildcats off and running. After the Huskies punted on their first possession, Villanova put together a 13-play drive in just 4:28 that culminated in a one-yard touchdown run by junior running back **Angelo Babbaro**.

The Wildcats extended their lead to 21-0 before the end of the first period when senior quarterback **Antwon Young** threw a one-yard pass for a touchdown to senior running back **Tony Canci** with 1:40 remaining in the period. Canci had two catches for 15 yards, both of which were touchdown receptions.

Whitney ran for 98 yards on 10 carries and completed 7-of-11 passes for 84 yards and one touchdown. Young was 4-of-6 for 58 yards and a touchdown and also ran eight times for 35 yards and one score. Six of the eight touchdowns for Villanova in the game came on the ground, including a pair of scores for sophomore running back **Lawrence Doss**, who ran for 36 yards on eight carries.

Late in the second quarter, Whitney threw a 14-yard pass to Canci for a touchdown that made the score 28-0 entering the intermission. Villanova had eight of its 12 drives result in a touchdown, with four of the scores coming on six plays or less.

Northeastern got on the board in the third quarter when Alex Dulski threw a 48-yard pass for a touchdown to Jordan Batts for the Huskies only points of the game. Dulski completed 16-of-31 passes for 138 yards, with Batts being the favorite target. Batts caught seven passes for 92 yards and the touchdown. Dulski was picked off three times as well, as the Wildcats increased their interception total to eight through the first four games.

Villanova resumed its quick pace of scoring just 32 seconds after the Huskies lone touchdown when Whitney ran in from 45 yards on the second play of the ensuing Wildcat drive. Young ran in for a one-yard score near the end of the quarter to stretch the margin to 42-7 after three periods.
