JAMES MADISON REPORT: The Dukes are 2-3 overall and 0-2 in the CAA entering Saturday's game. One of the team's losses was in overtime to FBS opponent Maryland in its season opener. JMU has been defeated on the road by Hofstra and at home by Richmond in conference play thus far.

James Madison averages 344.8 yards of offense per game, with 195.2 of those yards coming on the ground. Justin Thorpe, Corwin Acker and Jamal Sullivan have each gained over 200 yards rushing for the season and have combined for seven touchdowns. Thorpe and Drew Dudzik have split time at quarterback, with Dudzik throwing for 472 yards and six touchdowns on 28-of-50 passing. Rockeed McCarter is the top receiver for the Dukes and has made 17 catches for 287 yards and three scores. Mike Caussin has caught four touchdown passes out of his nine receptions.

On the defensive side, Arthur Moats has a team-high 41 tackles, including 13.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks.

JAMES MADISON HEAD COACH MICKEY MATTHEWS:

The all-time winningest coach in program history, Mickey Matthews has led the Dukes to six playoff appearances in his first 10 years at the helm. James Madison won the national championship in 2004 and reached the semifinals last season while posting a 12-2 record, including a perfect 8-0 mark in CAA play.

Matthews made a quick impact in his first season as Duke head coach in 1999. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year and the National Coach of the Year as James Madison earned a playoff berth. Matthews again earned National Coach of the Year acclaim in 2004 when the Dukes won the national title.

Matthews began his coaching career in 1976 at Lamar (Texas) High School. His career included eight stops as an assistant coach before he took over the James Madison program in 1999.

In his 11th season as head coach at JMU, Matthews has a career record of 78-49 (.614).

2009 Game Notes

25th ANNIVERSARY: Villanova head coach **Andy Talley** is celebrating his 25th season on the Main Line in 2009. During his Wildcat career, Talley has registered a 170-111-1 record, making him the all-time winningest coach in Villanova history. His 29-year overall coaching record currently stands at 198-120-2. Throughout his tenure at Villanova, Talley has guided the Wildcats to seven NCAA playoff appearances (1989, 1991, 1992, 1996, 1997, 2002 and 2008), four conference titles and two Lambert Meadowlands trophies. In 1997, Talley garnered the Eddie Robinson Award and the AFCA/GTE National Coach of the Year Award after leading Villanova to a perfect 11-0 regular season and the No. 1 ranking in the country for the last six weeks of the season.

THIRD IN A ROW: For a third straight week, Villanova will be playing a Top 25 opponent when the Wildcats travel to Harrisonburg, Va., on Saturday to take on the No. 16 ranked James Madison Dukes. The stretch began on Oct. 3 with a 28-17 win over No. 5 William & Mary. Last week, Villanova lost at No. 5 New Hampshire by a score of 28-24.

PLAYING THE BEST: Dating back to the 2007 season, Villanova is 6-6 against Top 25 opponents. This year, the Wildcats are 1-1 (defeat of #5 William & Mary/loss to #5 New Hampshire)

HARRISONBURG HISTORY: James Madison and Villanova will meet for the ninth time in Harrisonburg, Va., when the two teams do battle on Saturday, Oct. 17. Villanova owns an all-time record of 3-5 in games played at JMU's Bridgeforth Stadium. The Dukes have won the last three at home over Villanova including last year's NCAA quarterfinal playoff victory. Villanova's last win in Harrisonburg came in 2002 by a score of 30-26.

CHANGE OF FORTUNE: Villanova is looking to regain some momentum in the series against James Madison. The Dukes have had the upper hand in the series of late. Entering play this Saturday, James Madison has won five of the last six meetings against Villanova, including the last three in a row. Last season, the Dukes went 2-0 against the Wildcats. James Madison won the regular season contest at Villanova, 23-19, on a 35-yard hail mary pass on the last play of the game. James Madison also tallied a 31-27 home victory over the Wildcats in the quarterfinal round of the FCS playoffs.

STAYING IN THE TOP 10: After losing last week at No. 5 New Hampshire, the Villanova Wildcats fell four spots from No. 2 to No. 6 in the latest FCS Top 25 polls. In the *Sports Network* Top 25, Villanova is one of seven CAA teams to be ranked, including four in the Top 10. The other six CAA schools ranked this week include Richmond at No. 1, New Hampshire at No. 4, William & Mary at No. 7, James Madison at No. 16, Massachusetts at No. 18 and Delaware at No. 23.

TOP 10 CONSISTENCY: For the 16th straight week, Villanova finds itself ranked in the Top 10 in the *Sports Network* Top 25. This is the fourth longest active FCS streak in regards to being in the *Sports Network* Top 10. Appalachian State leads the way with 55 consecutive weeks in the Top 10 followed by Northern Iowa at 36 and Richmond at 25.

CONFERENCE CALL: In the last 13 CAA games, the Villanova Wildcats are an impressive 11-2. Villanova won its final two league games in 2007, went 7-1 last season in conference play and are currently 2-1 this year.

THE FCS STORY: Dating back to the last four games of the 2006 campaign, Villanova is 25-6 against FCS (formerly I-AA) opponents. In addition, the 'Cats have won 16 of their last 19 games against FCS programs. All six losses have come against teams ranked in the Top 25.

THE GROUND GAME: If you like rushing football, James Madison's Bridgeforth Stadium is the place to be this Saturday when the Dukes and Wildcats square off. Villanova is the top rushing team in the CAA at 201.2 yards per game, while James Madison is second at 195.2 rushing yards per contest. Villanova has three players with 200 or more rushing yards led by quarterback **Chris Whitney** with 340 yards on the ground. Junior running back **Aaron Ball** has 319 rushing yards, while **Matt Szczur** has 235 rushing yards to his credit.

THE SPECIAL TEAMS STORY: Entering play on Saturday at James Madison, Villanova is ranked in the top four in the CAA in four different special teams categories. The Wildcats lead the league in kickoff coverage with an average of 61.2 and a net average 43.5 and they lead the league in PATs made with 25 and are tied for the lead in PAT percentage at 1.000. Villanova is third in the CAA in kickoff return average at 26.2 and rank fourth in punting in net average at 32.8. Last week at New Hampshire, Villanova blocked its first punt of the year when freshman Tamai Young was credited with his first career block.

FIRST QUARTER DOMINANCE: Villanova has owned the first quarter of games this season. After the first six contests of the year, the Wildcats are outscoring their opponent by a 52-16 count in first quarter of games this season. Villanova has also had a great deal of success in the third quarter outscoring its opponents 56-20.

CONVERTING OPPORTUNITIES: In the first six games of the season, Villanova has been very good at converting red zone opportunities into points. The Wildcats have been inside the red zone 22 times thus far this year and in those 22 trips Villanova has scored points 19 times for an 86.4 percent success rate. The 19 includes 15 touchdowns and four field goals.

PLAYING SMART: In the latest CAA statistics, Villanova leads the league in fewest penalties committed. The 'Cats have been called for 22 penalties (3.6 per game) for 196 yards for an average of 32.7 penalty yards per game.

THE TURNOVER STORY: Entering play this week at James Madison, Villanova ranks second in the CAA in turnover margin at +9. The Wildcats have forced 14 turnovers (4 fumbles/ 10 interceptions) and have committed just five turnovers (3 fumbles/ 2 interceptions).

ALL-PURPOSE PERFORMER: Junior wideout **Matt Szczur** is one of the most versatile performers in the country. Szczur's skill set was on display last Saturday at New Hampshire. In his team's 28-24 loss, Szczur tallied a career-high 283 yards of all-purpose offense, including 134 kickoff return yards, 83 receiving yards and 66 rushing yards. He currently leads the CAA in all-purpose yards per game at 144.0. After six games, Szczur is second on the team in receiving (20 receptions, 181 yards, 1 TD), third in rushing (29 carries, 235 yards, 3 TD) and first in kickoff returns (15 returns, 448 yards, 1 TD).

THE RETURN GAME: All-purpose yardage isn't the only category that **Matt Szczur** leads the CAA in. He is also the conference leader in kickoff return average at 29.9 yards per return. The next closest player to him is Maine's Desmond Randall at 23.8 yards per return. Szczur has two career kickoff returns for touchdowns, including an 87-yard house call this year at Penn.

CAREER DAY: From a receiving standpoint, junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** had the best day of his Villanova career last Saturday at New Hampshire. In the game, he grabbed a career-high eight receptions for a career-best 83 yards and one touchdown. He currently ranks second on the team in receiving with 20 receptions for 181 yards and one touchdown.

2009 Game Notes

STOPPING THE RUN: The Villanova defense continues to be very good against the run. After six games, the Wildcats have given up just 539 rushing yards for an average of 89.8 rushing yards per game. In addition, opponents are averaging 2.8 yards per carry against Villanova. The 89.8 yards per game ranks the Wildcats fourth in the latest CAA statistics. Only two of the six teams that Villanova has played this year has managed to rush for over 100 yards (Temple: 139 yards; William & Mary 118 yards).

OUTSTANDING OSAYI: Senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** turned in his best game of the season last Saturday at New Hampshire. In the 28-24 loss, Osunde registered a season-high 10 total tackles to go with a career high 3.5 tackles for loss and a career-best 1.5 quarterback sacks. He currently ranks second on the team in total tackles with 41. Osunde has led Villanova in tackles the past two years.

LEADING THE WAY: Villanova is led in tackles by junior linebacker **Terence Thomas** who has a team-best 42 total stops. Thomas also leads the Wildcats in quarterback sacks with 4.5. Thomas has started every game of his Villanova career and will be making his 31st consecutive start this Saturday at James Madison. He has made 22 tackles in his last two games combined.

THREE FOR TWO: Three Wildcats are currently tied for the team lead in interceptions with two each. The trio includes senior safety **Ross Ventrone**, junior safety **Fred Maldonado** and sophomore corner **James Pitts**. As a team, Villanova has 10 interceptions which ranks third in the CAA. The Wildcats have had at least one interception in five of the six games this season.

REACHING THE CENTURY MARK: Senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** became the 20th player in Villanova history to record 100 career receptions last week at New Hampshire. After his six receptions for 69 yard performance last Saturday, Harvey currently has 105 career grabs which ranks 20th all-time at Villanova. He also has 1,584 receiving yards which ranks 11th. Harvey currently leads the 2009 Wildcats in receiving with 28 catches for 395 yards and three touchdowns.

RUNNING AWAY: The Villanova rushing attack is led by junior quarterback **Chris Whitney**. After six games, Whitney leads the team in rushing with 340 yards on 82 carries (4.1 yards per rush) and two touchdowns. His best effort of the year came against Lehigh when he rushed for a career-best 130 yards. Whitney will be making his 22nd career start this Saturday at James Madison. In his first 21 starts as Villanova's starting quarterback, Whitney has led the Wildcats to an impressive 16-5 mark. Whitney has never lost to an opponent with a sub-500 record and all five of his losses have come against teams ranked in the Top 15 nationally. In addition to his rushing stats, he has also completed 65-of-100 for 761 yards to go with seven touchdowns and one interception.

PERFECT PATS: Redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** leads the CAA in PATs with 25 made in 25 attempts. Yako is also 4-of-6 in field goals. After not attempting a field goal in two straight games, Yako went 1-of-2 last week at New Hampshire. He connected on a career-long 37-yard field goal and he missed a 23-yard attempt.

PRE-SEASON FAVORITE: In the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) pre-season predicted order of finish, Villanova and defending National Champion Richmond earned a first place tie to win the South Division with nine first place votes each. The two schools were also chosen as the co-overall champions of the league. New Hampshire was picked to win the North Division title.

ALL-CONFERENCE ACCOLADES: Four Wildcats were named to the pre-season first team All-CAA squad. On the offensive side of the ball, junior offensive lineman **Ben Ijalana** (Hainesport, N.J.) and junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** (Erma, N.J.) earned first team All-CAA honors. Defensively, senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** (Bloomsburg, Pa.) and senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** (Wall, N.J.) garnered first team All-Conference acclaim.

ALL-AMERICAN DISTINCTION: Four Wildcats garnered pre-season All-American accolades by *The Sports Network*. Senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** and junior offensive tackle **Ben Ijalana** were named to *The Sports Network* pre-season first team All-American squad, while senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** and senior center **Brian Brannigan** were third team pre-season All-American selections.

LEADING THE WAY: The 2009 Villanova captains will be senior defensive tackle **Phil Matusz**, senior offensive lineman **Brian Brannigan** and senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde**.

WEEK IN AND WEEK OUT: Three junior members of the Villanova football team have started every game of their Wildcat career. Junior offensive tackle **Ben Ijalana**, junior offensive guard **Brant Clouser** and junior linebacker **Terence Thomas** will be making their 31st consecutive career start this week at James Madison. The trio started all 11 games as true freshmen, all 13 games a season ago and the first six games this season.

A NUMBERS GAME: Three Villanova starters have changed their uniform number this season. Senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** has switched from No. 91 to No. 23, junior defensive back **Fred Maldonado** went from No. 39 to No. 2 and sophomore wideout **Norman White** changed from No. 87 to No. 8.



ROSTER ADDITION: Villanova added a player two weeks into pre-season camp when freshman linebacker **Angel Clybourn** transferred in from the University of Cincinnati. The 6-1, 220 pound Clybourn will be eligible to play for the Wildcats immediately. He is expected to be a reserve at linebacker. Clybourn is a native of Mays Landing, N.J. and a graduate of the Blair Academy.

OVERTIME HISTORY: During head coach **Andy Talley's** tenure, Villanova has played 13 overtime games and in those 13 contests are 9-4. The Wildcats have won seven of their last nine overtime games. In Villanova's last meeting versus Temple, the Wildcats registered a 23-20 double overtime win.

TOP OF THE LIST: With his team's win over New Hampshire last November, Villanova head coach **Andy Talley** became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) football. Talley ended last season with exactly 100 career conference victories.

GAME 1 RECAP: NO. 5 VILLANOVA 27, TEMPLE 24

Sept. 3, 2009
Lincoln Financial Field
Philadelphia, Pa.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa.--Redshirt freshman **Nick Yako** kicked a 32-yard field goal as time expired and Villanova completed a late comeback with a 27-24 victory over Temple in the inaugural Mayor's Cup game played at Lincoln Financial Field. The Wildcats trailed by 10 points in the middle of the fourth quarter before coming back to tally their third-ever win against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent.

A six-yard pass from junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** with 1:24 to play tied the game at 24-24. On the fourth play of the ensuing drive by the Owls, junior strong safety **John Dempsey** picked off a pass at the 50-yard line and returned possession to Villanova. The interception was one of five turnovers gained by the Wildcats in the game.

Villanova started its final drive with 49 seconds left and began to set up for a field goal once the ball was in the red zone. Earlier in the quarter, the Wildcats comeback started when Yako kicked a 27-yard field goal with 9:58 to play that pulled Villanova to within 24-17. The Wildcats first-year kicker had a flawless collegiate debut with the two field goals and three extra points.

After the first field goal by Yako set Villanova up for an eventual game-tying possession, the Wildcats recovered a fumble on the seventh play of the next Temple drive. Dempsey forced a fumble on a first-and-10 play from the Villanova 30-yard line and junior linebacker **Marquis Kirkland** recovered the loose ball. The Wildcats took over at their own 35-yard line and the pass from Whitney to senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** capped a 12-play drive that took 4:29 off the clock and ended with 1:24 remaining.

Whitney passed for a career-high 278 yards on 24-of-35 passing. After going 7-of-14 in the first half, he recovered to go 17-of-21 in the second half along the way to notching his third career game with at least 200 yards passing. Harvey caught nine of the completions for a career-high 142 yards and the game's biggest touchdown.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Owls got on the scoreboard first on a 25-yard field goal with 4:39 left in the first half. A 75-yard touchdown pass from Vaughn Charlton to James Nixon with just 1:01 remaining before the intermission sent Temple into the locker rooms with a 10-0 halftime lead.

In the second half, senior free safety **Ross Ventrone** returned a fumble 59 yards for a touchdown to get the Wildcats on the board just 52 seconds into the third quarter. It was the longest fumble return for a touchdown by a Villanova player in at least the last 12 years and was the second turnover gained by Ventrone in the game. He also registered his sixth career interception earlier in the contest.

Senior running back **Tony Canci** recorded his first career touchdown on a five-yard pass from Whitney with 22 seconds left in the third quarter. At that point the score was 17-14 in favor of Temple, but the Owls stretched their lead nine seconds in the final period on a 44-yard pass from Charlton to Michael Campbell.

Villanova began the season as one of eight teams from the powerhouse Colonial Athletic Association ranked in the top 25 of the preseason Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Coaches Poll. Tonight's win by the Wildcats marked the fourth straight season that a CAA team has defeated an FBS opponent. The CAA has had a representative in the FCS championship game in five of the last six years.

VILLANOVA, Pa.--Led by an unstoppable ground game, Villanova (2-0) produced two 100-yard rushers and cruised to a 38-17 win over Lehigh (0-2) on Saturday night in its home opener at Villanova Stadium. The Wildcats ran for 310 yards and defeated the Mountain Hawks in their first home game for the second straight year.

Junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** ran for a career-high 130 yards and junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** tallied his first career 100-yard rushing game to lead the Villanova offense. Whitney had 14 carries for 130 yards and a touchdown and also completed 11-of-16 passes for 106 yards and two scores.

Whitney ran in for a 21-yard score on the game's opening drive to get the Wildcats started, and Szczur broke free for a 75-yard run to the Lehigh two-yard line on the next drive to set up an eventual 29-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** that made the score 10-0 with 5:17 remaining in the first quarter.

Villanova stretched the margin to 24-7 at halftime and maintained their lead throughout the second half. Whitney threw touchdown passes to junior running back **Angelo Babbaro** and sophomore wide receiver **Norman White** in the game.

In addition to his 103-yard rushing performance, Szczur caught four passes for 35 yards and had a 16-yard kickoff return. Babbaro caught three passes for 40 yards.

Lehigh got on the board with 9:33 left in the second quarter on a 1-yard run by Jaren Walker that capped an 11-play drive. The Mountain Hawks managed just 55 yards on the ground as the Wildcats finished the game with a 417-252 edge in total yards. Starting quarterback JB Clark completed 20-of-31 passes for 130 yards and Chris Lum was 7-of-11 for 67 yards and a touchdown. Craig Zurn caught a game-high six passes for 72 yards.

A 10-7 lead for Villanova late in the second quarter quickly expanded when the Wildcats registered back-to-back touchdowns just 16 seconds apart. Babbaro caught a 13-yard pass from Whitney with 4:54 left in the opening half to finish a nine-play, 60-yard drive. On the next Lehigh possession, redshirt freshman **Marlon Johnson** returned a fumble recovery 19 yards for a touchdown with 4:38 left in the period.

Johnson's fumble recovery came on the only turnover of the game and marked the second straight game that Villanova returned a fumble for a touchdown.

In the second half, the Mountain Hawks scored first on a 41-yard field goal by Tom Randazza with 10:02 left in the third quarter. The Wildcats answered just over a minute later with a 39-yard scoring run from junior running back **Aaron Ball** and White had a 14-yard reception for a touchdown with 13:54 left in the fourth period. Ball finished with 57 yards on nine carries and the one score.

Lehigh scored the game's final points with 1:05 left on a 2-yard touchdown pass Chris Lum to Alex Wojdowski.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa.--Junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** ran back the game's opening kickoff 87 yards for a touchdown and No. 2 Villanova then settled into a scrappy defensive battle against Penn at Franklin Field, eventually coming away with a 14-3 victory. The win marked the first time since 2003 that the Wildcats have won their first three games to open a season.

Szczur fielded Trevor Charlston's 57-yard kickoff to start the night at the Villanova 13-yard line and brought it all the way back for his second career kickoff return touchdown - both have come on the first play of a game. Redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** kicked the extra point and then launched a 64-yard kickoff that the Quakers were only able to return to their own 23-yard line.

The immediate tally of points for the Wildcats and the stark difference in the opening possessions for each team - Penn gained just eight yards while going three-and-out on their first drive - certainly was not a harbinger of things to come, however.

Villanova wound up having possession of the ball for less than five minutes in the entire first quarter and would not score again until late in the third period. In the interim, the Quakers got their only points of the game on a 22-yard field goal by Andrew Samson with 12:46 left in the second quarter. The kick ended a 14-play, 66-yard drive that lasted nearly seven minutes and was indicative of Penn's ability to hold the ball throughout the game. Both teams had 12 drives on the night but the Quakers owned an edge of nearly 11 minutes in possession time.

As a result, the Wildcats ran just 50 offensive plays for a total of 187 yards. The team had averaged 387 yards of offense per game in its first two contests of the season. Penn didn't do much better against Villanova's equally opportune defense, running 62 plays and picking up 239 yards. Both sides committed two turnovers.

In the second half, senior quarterback **Antwon Young** threw a five-yard touchdown pass to senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** with 3:34 remaining in the third quarter to expand the Wildcat lead and close the scoring for the night. This was the fourth straight year that the Quakers have not scored after halftime against Villanova.

Young needed only four carries to run for a game-high 36 yards in the defensive duel. His longest rush was a 24-yard run on 3rd-and-11 from the Wildcat 21-yard line on the play that culminated with Harvey's touchdown reception. Young also threw a 14-yard pass to sophomore wide receiver **Norman White** on the drive, which covered 10 plays and 78 yards in 3:47.

Villanova gained 128 yards on the ground as Young and Szczur shared carries with junior running backs **Aaron Ball** and **Angelo Babbaro**. Young and junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** each completed 3-of-7 passes on a night when the Wildcats totaled just 59 yards in the air. Whitney also threw the team's first interception of the season and lost a fumble.

Although its offense matches up with anyone in the country on just about any night, the Villanova defense matched Penn play-for-play in a typically stalwart game between the local rivals. The Wildcats sacked quarterback Keiffer Garton six times and accumulated 10 total tackles for loss. Senior defensive back **Ross Ventrone** picked off his second interception of the season and junior linebacker **Terence Thomas** set a career-high with 10 tackles and two sacks. Senior defensive end **Tim Kukucka** and junior **Mario Johnson** had two and 1.5 sacks, respectively, while Kukucka also registered a blocked kick.

VILLANOVA, Pa.--Junior running back **Aaron Ball** ran for over 100 yards in the first quarter alone and No. 2 Villanova ran for a season-high 410 yards in a 56-7 win over Northeastern on Saturday afternoon at Villanova Stadium. The Wildcats improved to 4-0 for the first time since 2003 and won their conference opener for the third straight year.

Ball ran for 109 yards and a touchdown on just seven carries and six different players scored touchdowns for Villanova, which registered individual 100-yard rushing and 100-yard receiving performances in the same game for the first time since 2005 against William & Mary. Senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** caught seven passes for 102 yards to join Ball as the '100-100' tandem in the game.

The rushing total for the Wildcats was their highest since 1991 and the third-highest single-game total in school history. Villanova has had just five games with even 300 yards rushing since 1999, but four of those games have come in the last seven outings dating back to last season.

On the third offensive play of the game, Ball ran 31 yards up the middle for a touchdown that got the Wildcats off and running. After the Huskies punted on their first possession, Villanova put together a 13-play drive in just 4:28 that culminated in a one-yard touchdown run by junior running back **Angelo Babbaro**.

The Wildcats extended their lead to 21-0 before the end of the first period when senior quarterback **Antwon Young** threw a one-yard pass for a touchdown to senior running back **Tony Canci** with 1:40 remaining in the period. Canci had two catches for 15 yards, both of which were touchdown receptions.

Whitney ran for 98 yards on 10 carries and completed 7-of-11 passes for 84 yards and one touchdown. Young was 4-of-6 for 58 yards and a touchdown and also ran eight times for 35 yards and one score. Six of the eight touchdowns for Villanova in the game came on the ground, including a pair of scores for sophomore running back **Lawrence Doss**, who ran for 36 yards on eight carries.

Late in the second quarter, Whitney threw a 14-yard pass to Canci for a touchdown that made the score 28-0 entering the intermission. Villanova had eight of its 12 drives result in a touchdown, with four of the scores coming on six plays or less.

Northeastern got on the board in the third quarter when Alex Dulski threw a 48-yard pass for a touchdown to Jordan Batts for the Huskies only points of the game. Dulski completed 16-of-31 passes for 138 yards, with Batts being the favorite target. Batts caught seven passes for 92 yards and the touchdown. Dulski was picked off three times as well, as the Wildcats increased their interception total to eight through the first four games.

Villanova resumed its quick pace of scoring just 32 seconds after the Huskies lone touchdown when Whitney ran in from 45 yards on the second play of the ensuing Wildcat drive. Young ran in for a one-yard score near the end of the quarter to stretch the margin to 42-7 after three periods.

VILLANOVA, Pa.--In a battle of top five teams on Saturday afternoon, No. 2 Villanova struck for a touchdown on the first offensive play of the game and went on to a 28-17 victory over No. 5 William & Mary at Villanova Stadium. The Wildcats won their sixth straight home game and improved to 15-1 on their home turf since the middle of the 2006 season.

Entering the game, it figured that something had to give between the Tribe defense and the Villanova running game. William & Mary had allowed a total of 27 yards on the ground in its last two games; the Wildcats ran for 410 yards in their last game. The answer was an improved passing game for Villanova, although the team still managed three rushing touchdowns on short yardage situations.

The Wildcats proficiency through the air set the tone, though. Junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** and senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** connected for a 57-yard touchdown on the first offensive play of the game and Villanova never looked back as it improved to 5-0 for the first time since 2003. The Wildcats capitalized on two Tribe turnovers in the first half to take a 21-6 lead into the intermission.

A three-yard touchdown pass from R.J. Archer to Chase Hill with 4:18 left in the game and a successive two-point conversion from Archer to Rob Varno pulled the Tribe to within 28-17 in the waning minutes of the game, but Villanova recovered William & Mary's ensuing onside kick and held the ball until there was less than one minute remaining in the contest.

Whitney threw for 146 yards on 10-of-13 accuracy and also ran for 31 yards on 10 carries. Villanova converted only 3-of-10 third-down opportunities but still was able to get into good scoring position in the red zone. All three rushing touchdowns for the Wildcats in the game came on runs of five yards or less.

Junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** ran in for a five-yard touchdown on the opening play of the second quarter to cap an 80-yard drive and later scored on a four-yard run in the third quarter that gave Villanova some breathing room with a 28-9 lead. His first running score ended a drive that started nine plays earlier following an interception by junior linebacker **Marquis Kirkland** in the end zone.

Late in the second quarter, junior running back **Angelo Babbaro** ran in from three yards with 1:53 left to finish a quick three-play drive that started at the Tribe's 29-yard line after sophomore defensive back **James Pitts** recovered a fumble and returned it 20 yards to set up the eventual score for the Wildcats. Pitts had also tipped the ball in the end zone that Kirkland intercepted earlier in the period.

Villanova's defense limited William & Mary to just a pair of field goals in the opening half. All-American kicker Brian Pate blasted a 44-yard field goal with 6:08 left in the half and made a 28-yard attempt as time expired.

The Tribe started the second half with the ball at their own 40-yard line after the Wildcat kickoff went out of bounds, but gained just 48 yards on a 15-play drive that consumed nearly half the third quarter and eventually led to a 29-yard field goal by Pate which made the score 21-9.

The response by Villanova after the third William & Mary field goal of the game was typical of how the game unfolded. The Wildcats drove 85 yards on 10 plays in under five minutes for another touchdown. Whitney threw a 31-yard pass to sophomore wide receiver **Norman White** and a 20-yard pass to sophomore **Mikey Reynolds** on the drive before Szczur's second touchdown run of the day.

GAME 6 RECAP: NO. 5 NEW HAMPSHIRE 28, NO. 2 VILLANOVA 24

Oct. 10, 2009
Cowell Stadium
Durham, N.H.

DURHAM, N.H.--A pair of field goals in the fourth quarter were the difference in the game and No. 2 Villanova lost its first game of the season by a 28-24 margin to No. 5 New Hampshire at Cowell Stadium. After the visiting Wildcats rallied from a 15-point deficit in the first half to take a 24-22 lead, the hosts of the same name went on top for good in the fourth quarter and fended off another comeback bid by Villanova.

In the last six minutes of the game, Villanova started three drives inside its own 20-yard line and each time were unable to get across midfield while working against the dwindling clock. On the first play of a drive that started with 5:42 remaining, New Hampshire intercepted a pass at the Wildcats 11-yard line, returned it back to the line of scrimmage at the six-yard line and eventually kicked their third and final field goal of the game with 4:11 left to close the scoring.

Following the ensuing kickoff, Villanova started from its own 16-yard line but moved only 19 yards on seven plays before turning the ball over on downs. New Hampshire went three-and-out and Villanova got the ball back for the final time at its own four-yard line with just 1:30 remaining. The Wildcats went 31 yards on 10 plays before once again turning the ball over on downs with only 22 seconds remaining and no timeouts left.

Junior wide receiver **Matt Szczur** had first a receiving touchdown and then a long rushing score in between a field goal by redshirt freshman kicker **Nick Yako** as Villanova scored 17 unanswered points in the second and third quarters to turn a 22-7 deficit into a 24-22 lead. Yako's field goal came as time expired at the end of the first half and trimmed the margin to 22-17 at the intermission. Szczur's 58-yard touchdown run with 10:58 to play in the third quarter gave Villanova its first lead of the game.

As usual, Szczur filled a number of roles for Villanova in the game and racked up 283 all-purpose yards. He caught eight passes for 83 yards, ran the ball five times for 66 yards and also returned five kickoffs for a total of 134 yards. Szczur accounted for two of the three touchdowns by the Wildcats in the game and senior quarterback **Antwon Young** ran for an 18-yard score in the second quarter that got Villanova on the board after it fell into an early 10-0 hole.

Young ran the ball nine times for 39 yards and a score while also completing 7-of-15 passes for 62 yards. Junior quarterback **Chris Whitney** threw for 109 yards on 10-of-18 accuracy with one touchdown and one interception. His 26-yard touchdown pass to Szczur with 10:12 left in the second quarter began the first Villanova comeback of the day. Whitney completed nine of his first 11 pass attempts but was just 1-of-7 after that before Young returned for the final two Wildcat possessions.

New Hampshire quarterback R.J. Toman threw for 292 yards on 15-of-28 passing with one touchdown and one interception. He was able to find tight end Scott Sicko downfield at the right times and Sicko tallied 135 receiving yards on just three catches. In the fourth quarter, Toman found Sicko for a 50-yard pass that brought the Wildcats to the Villanova 16-yard line and set New Hampshire up for the field goal that gave them the lead for good.

Senior wide receiver **Brandyn Harvey** made six receptions for 69 yards for Villanova, which had a nearly-even split between rushing and receiving yards. The Wildcats gained 181 yards on the ground and 171 through the air. Junior running back **Aaron Ball** ran for 57 yards on 14 carries and Whitney picked up 33 net yards on 19 rushes.

On the defensive side of the ball, senior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** had a team-high 10 tackles for Villanova, including seven solo tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. Junior defensive back **Fred Maldonado** had an interception for the Wildcats, his second of the year and the team's 10th. Villanova has thrown just two interceptions of its own through six games.
