MARYLAND REPORT: The Terrapins finished with a 9-4 record in 2006, including a 5-3 mark in ACC games. Maryland defeated Purdue 24-7 in the Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando, Florida for the team's first Bowl victory since 2004. The Terrapins return 41 letterwinners from last season's team, including seven starters on offense, six on defense and one specialist.

Senior running back Lance Ball is the leading returning offensive player for Maryland. Last season he averaged 62.7 yards per game on the ground, totaling 815 yards and eight touchdowns. He also made 11 catches for 60 yards and ranked second on the team in total offense.

The Terrapins will need to replace the production of quarterback Sam Hollenbach, who threw for 2371 yards and 15 scores last season. Hollenbach completed 61.9 percent of his passes and averaged 182.4 yards per game. Junior Jordan Steffy looks to be the leading candidate to start under center for Maryland.

Expected to lead the Terrapins from a defensive standpoint is defensive back Christian Varner. Varner registered 58 tackles (37 solo, 21 assisted) last season and also tallied one interception and three pass break-ups.

In the ACC preseason poll, the Terps were picked to finish fifth in the ACC Atlantic Division. Senior guard Andrew Crumme and sophomore wide receiver Darius Heyward-Bey were each named to the 2007 Preseason All-ACC team and Crumme earned Preseason All-America honors from ESPN.com.

TERRAPIN HEAD COACH RALPH FRIEDGEN: The 2007 season will mark the seventh for head coach Ralph Friedgen at his alma mater. In his first six years at Maryland, he has led the Terrapins to a 50-24 (.676) record and four bowl appearances that include two New Year's Day games. During his tenure the team won three straight bowl games for the first time in program history.

The 33rd head coach in school history, Friedgen has a reputation as one of the top offensive minds in the game. He ranks second all-time at the university with a .676 winning percentage and joins legendary coach Jim Tatum as the only two mentors to lead the team to three 10-win seasons and multiple New Year's Day games.

Friedgen was named National Coach of the Year in 2001, his first season at Maryland, when he led the Terrapins to their first ACC title since 1985. The program has won more games in his first six years at the helm (50) than in the 10 years prior to his arrival (37).

When he returned to College Park in 2001, Friedgen brought with him more than 32 years of experience as an assistant coach at places that include The Citadel, Georgia Tech and the NFL's San Diego Chargers. He has been the offensive coordinator for both a collegiate national champion (1990 with Georgia Tech) and a Super Bowl team (1994 with the Chargers).

Entering Saturday's game, Friedgen owns a career record of 50-24 in six seasons as a head coach.

2007 HONORS





TALLEY'S TENURE: Currently in his 23rd season on the Main Line, head coach Andy Talley can feel responsible for every facet of the Villanova football program, having started it from scratch in 1985. In his career at Villanova, Talley has recorded a 148-94-1 mark, making him the all-time winningest coach in Villanova history. Talley's 26-year overall coaching record currently stands at 176-112-2. During his career as the Wildcat mentor, Talley has guided Villanova to six NCAA playoff appearances (1989, 1991, 1992, 1996, 1997, 2002), four conference titles and two Lambert Meadowlands Trophies. In 1997, Talley garnered the Eddie Robinson Award and the AFCA/GTE National Coach of the Year Award.

STEPPING UP IN CLASS: Villanova will open its 2007 season at Division I-A and ACC member Maryland. The Maryland game will mark the 12th time that Villanova has played against a I-A opponent since the Wildcats restored football at the I-AA level in 1985. In the previous 11 games versus I-A competition, Villanova has tallied a 2-9 record. In its nine I-A losses, Villanova's average margin of loss has been 15.0 points per game.

WILDCATS VERSUS THE ACC: Saturday's opener at Maryland will be the 82nd game between Villanova and an ACC opponent. Of the 81 previous contests, 80 were when Villanova was a Division I-A (FBS) program. Saturday's game at Maryland will be the Wildcats second versus an ACC team as a I-AA program (FCS). In 1988, Villanova lost at home to Wake Forest by a score of 31-11. The 81 games versus ACC opponents include a 15-28-1 mark versus Boston College, 3-1-1 against NC State, 2-2 versus Wake Forest, 2-8 against Maryland, 1-3-1 versus Miami, 1-3 against Florida State, 1-1 versus Duke, 1-1 against Clemson and 0-5 versus Virginia Tech.

SEASON OPENER: During the tenure of Wildcat head coach Andy Talley, Villanova has recorded a 13-9 mark in season openers. Of the nine losses, six have come against I-A opponents. In the history of Villanova football, the Wildcats have compiled a 56-48-3 record in season openers.

SAME TEAM DIFFERENT LEAGUE: After playing in the Atlantic 10 Conference from 1997-2006, Villanova begins its first season as a member of the Colonial Athletic Association in 2007. Other than the conference affiliation, not much has changed. The same teams that made-up the 12 team, two division Atlantic 10 Conference, will be the same teams that make-up the CAA. The biggest difference is the conference headquarter location. The Atlantic 10 offices are in Philadelphia, Pa., while the CAA headquarters are located in Richmond, Va.

FCS BEST: As a member of the CAA, Villanova plays in the most competitive FCS (formerly Division I-AA) conference in the country. Below are some CAA Football highlights.

LEADING THE WAY: The 2007 Villanova captains will be senior running back **Matt Dicken**, senior tight end **Matt Sherry** and junior defensive lineman **David Dalessandro**. All three earned their captain status by a vote of Wildcat players.

VILLANOVA PICKED FIFTH: In the pre-season Colonial Athletic Association poll, Villanova was picked to finish fifth in the South Division according to a poll of the league's head coaches and selected media members.

CALLING THE SIGNALS: Sophomore quarterback **Antwon Young** will be making his first career start when Villanova opens the 2007 season at Maryland on Saturday, Sept. 1. Young saw limited action as a true freshman in 2005 when he completed 7-of-12 for 76 yards. Last season, Young watched from the sidelines as a redshirt. Young, who is a 6-4, 215 pound sophomore from Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., replaces the graduated Marvin Burroughs. Last season as a senior, Burroughs completed 171-of-283 for 2,123 yards to go with nine touchdowns and nine interceptions. He also had 342 yards rushing and six rushing scores.

FAMILIAR FACES: When Villanova and Maryland meet on Saturday, there will be an assistant coach on each side that has coached at the opposing school. Current Wildcat wide receiver coach **Brian Flinn** was a graduate assistant at Maryland under Ralph Friedgen from 2001-02, while current Terrapin quarterbacks coach **John Donovan** was a graduate assistant for head coach Andy Talley from 1997-98. Flinn and Donovan were on the same coaching staff at Maryland during Flinn's two years at College Park.



BIG SHOES TO FILL: The position where Villanova was hit the hardest by graduation was along the offensive line as the 'Cats lost three starters. Two of the three departed seniors, center Christian Gaddis and guard Mike Costanzo were three-year starters, while Lav Bauta started at tackle after transferring from Duke for his fifth-year. Gaddis, who was a 2006 first team All-League honoree, is currently a free agent in the Buffalo Bills training camp. Entering play at Maryland, the expected starters along the offensive line include true freshman **Thomas Weaver** at center, junior **Pete Caroppolo** and sophomore **Brian Brannigan** at the guards with true freshman **Ben Ijalana** and junior **Izzy Bauta** at the tackle spots. Brannigan and Bauta started every game last season, while Caroppolo moves to the offensive side of the ball after playing defensive tackle last season.

HOMECOMING AFFAIR: Villanova has five players on its 2007 roster who hail from the state of Maryland. The five Maryland natives include **Salim Koroma** (Germantown, Md./ Northwest H.S.), **Sean Morrissey** (Rockville, Md./Our Lady of Good Counsel), **Will Thompson** (Glen Arm, Md./Loyola Blakefield H.S.), **J.C. Unitas** (Baldwin, Md./ St. Paul's School for Boys) and **Jacob Wade** (Silver Spring, Md./ Montgomery Blair). Koroma will see playing time as Villanova's punt returner and as a defensive back, while Morrissey will handle the long snapping duties for punts, field goals and extra points.

BLOCK PARTY: One player to keep an eye out for on special teams is junior **Darrel Young**. Throughout his first two years on the Main Line, Young excelled on special teams. In addition to leading the team in special team tackles, he also has three career punt blocks to his credit, including two last year and one in 2005. He recovered the 2005 block for his first career touchdown. Young is also expected to be one of the team's top defensive players from his linebacker position. As a sophomore last year, Young tallied 25 solo tackles, 19 assisted stops for 44 total tackles to go with four tackles for loss, one sack and a forced fumble.

POINT PRODUCER: Villanova's leading returning scorer is senior running back **Matt Dicken**. Last season as a junior, Dicken averaged a touchdown every 9.4 carries. He finished the 2006 campaign with 432 yards rushing on 104 carries (4.2 yards per carry) and a team-best 11 touchdowns.

POSITION CHANGES: Three Wildcats made position changes during pre-season camp. Junior **Salim Koroma** moved from wide receiver to defensive back and is number two on the depth chart at corner. Koroma is also the team's starting punt returner. Junior offensive guard **Jonatahn Krohe** has moved to defensive tackle, while true freshman **Thomas Weaver** is switching from defensive tackle to center. Weaver is battling junior Michael Sheridan for the starting job at center.

STAFF CHANGES: Wildcat head coach Andy Talley will have three new assistant coaches in 2007. On offense, **Darrius Smith** joins the Wildcat staff as the team's running backs coach. He replaces Apollo Wright who left to become the Special Teams Coordinator at Florida International University. Smith comes to Villanova from Northeastern University where he coached from 2004-06. He has also had coaching stops at James Madison, Indiana University of Pennsylvania, New Mexico Highlands University and Frostburg State University. Talley also has two new graduate assistant coaches. **David Riede** will be the offensive assistant, while **Charles Alexander** will be the defensive assistant. Riede arrives at Villanova from Allegheny College where he coached from 2005-07, while Alexander comes from Clarion University where he was an assistant from 2005-07.

ALL-AMERICAN HISTORY: The Villanova football program has had a first team All-American in eight of the last 13 years. In the program's history, 23 different players have earned first team All-American distinction. Last season, senior safety Allyn Bacchus garnered third team All-American accolades.

RADIO INFORMATION: For a second consecutive year SportsTalk 950-AM WPEN will be the flagship station of the Villanova Football Radio Network. Play-by-play announcer Joe Eichhorn, who has been broadcasting Villanova football since 1988, returns to anchor the broadcasts. Joining Eichhorn for a 15th consecutive year is Ryan Fannon. All 11 Wildcat gridiron contests will be broadcast live, beginning with with a 15 minute pre-game show

OVERTIME HISTORY: During head coach Andy Talley's tenure at Villanova, the Wildcats have played in 10 overtime games and in those 10 games the Wildcats are 7-3. The Wildcats have not played an overtime contest since the 2003 season. With the double overtime win at Temple on Sept. 6, 2003, Villanova has won five of its last six overtime contests. Of the 10 overtime games, seven have been played at Villanova Stadium. Before the 2003 overtime game with Temple, the Wildcats last overtime contest came in 2001 against James Madison in week four when the 'Cats outlasted the Dukes, 45-44, in double overtime. The last overtime game before the James Madison contest came in 2000 when the Wildcats suffered a 48-41 loss to William & Mary. In 1999, Villanova played two overtime games. On Oct. 16, 1999, Villanova defeated UConn, 48-45, in triple overtime in a game played in Storrs, Conn. In the 1999 season finale at Villanova Stadium, the 'Cats rallied from a 45-24 deficit with 8:37 remaining against Delaware to win a 51-45 thriller in one overtime.

ACTING PROFESSIONAL: Six former Villanova products are currently on NFL rosters. Wide receiver **Brian Finneran** (Villanova 1994-97), who is currently in his eighth season with the Atlanta Falcons, injured his knee during spring workouts and will be on injured reserve for the 2007 season. Running back **Brian Westbrook** (Villanova 1997-2001) is in his sixth season with the Philadelphia Eagles as the franchise's starting running back. Westbrook became the first Wildcat player to be drafted since Howie Long in 1981 when he was selected in the third round of the 2002 NFL Draft. Safety **Raymond Ventrone** (Villanova 2001-04) is in his first year with the New York Jets after being a member of the New England Patriot organization the last two seasons. Ventrone spent 2005 on the Patriot practice squad and last year on the Patriot injured reserve list. Defensive tackle **Darrel Adams** (Villanova 2001-05) is currently in camp with the New York Jets, while center **Christian Gaddis** (Villanova 2002-06) is with the Buffalo Bills and wide receiver **J.J. Outlaw** (Villanova 2002-05) is a member of the Philadelphia Eagles. Westbrook and Finneran both won the Walter Payton Award, given to the top player in NCAA I-AA football, during their senior seasons at Villanova.
