### LEHIGH (2006 Stats)

**LEHIGH REPORT:** The Mountain Hawks will open their 2007 season with Saturday's game versus Villanova. Last year, Lehigh finished with a 6-5 record under first-year head coach Andy Coen and won a share of the team's eighth Patriot League championship.

The Mountain Hawks and top rival Lafayette were picked to finish at the top of the Patriot League this season in a close vote by league head coaches and sports information directors. Lafayette received six first-place votes and a total of 63 points and was picked to win the league. Lehigh was right behind, claiming five first-place votes and 62 points.

The 2007 season will mark a transition for the Mountain Hawks, who return just 26 letterwinners from last season. Lehigh returns three starters on offense, four on defense and two specialists.

Among the leading returners is senior quarterback Sedale Threatt, who was named the Patriot League Preseason Offensive Player of the Year. Threatt led the Patriot League in passer efficiency (144.66) last season and threw for over 2,000 yards and 14 touchdowns. He also totaled 310 rushing yards and a team-high eight scores.

In addition to Threatt's selection as the preseason offensive player of the year, Lehigh senior offensive lineman Mike Reese was named a preseason All-America selection by the *Sports Network*.

**MOUNTAIN HAWK HEAD COACH ANDY COEN:** In his first season as head coach at Lehigh in 2006, Andy Coen led the Mountain Hawks to a share of the program's eighth Patriot League championship. That accomplishment marked the sixth time that Coen has been a part of a league championship team, including three times at Lehigh and three times at the University of Pennsylvania.

Coen spent six years as an offensive line coach, including four years as the offensive coordinator, at Lehigh from 1994-99. He then moved on to Penn and was the offensive coordinator with the Quakers for six seasons. Penn's offense under Coen annually ranked at or near the top of the Ivy League statistical charts and the Quakers ranked in the top ten in scoring three times. In 2000, the Quakers set a school and Ivy League record for points in a season, then eclipsed that mark in 2002.

In his first stop at Lehigh, Coen was a part of three Patriot League championship teams, including the 12-1 1998 squad. That team set a school mark for the most wins in a season, while reaching the NCAA Division I-AA quarterfinals.

Coen's coaching career also includes stops at the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy, University of Minnesota, James Madison and Widener.

Entering this evening's game, Coen has a career record of 6-5 as he begins his second season at Lehigh.

### 2007 HONORS





**THE TALLY ON TALLEY:** Currently in his 23rd season on the Main Line, head coach Andy Talley can feel responsible for every facet of the Villanova football program, having started it from scratch in 1985. In his career at Villanova, Talley has recorded a 148-95-1 mark, making him the all-time winningest coach in Villanova history. Talley's 26-year overall coaching record currently stands at 176-113-2. During his career as the Wildcat mentor, Talley has guided Villanova to six NCAA playoff appearances (1989, 1991, 1992, 1996, 1997, 2002), four conference titles and two Lambert Meadowlands Trophies. In 1997, Talley garnered the Eddie Robinson Award and the AFCA/GTE National Coach of the Year Award.

**WILDCATS VERSUS THE PATRIOT LEAGUE:** Villanova has had a great deal of success versus Patriot League opponents. Entering play at Lehigh on Saturday, Villanova has recorded an impressive 18-3 mark versus teams from the Patriot League since becoming a I-AA program in 1985. As a I-AA program, the Wildcats are 9-0 versus Fordham, 5-0 against Bucknell, 3-0 versus Colgate, 1-1 against Lehigh and 0-2 versus Holy Cross. One of the three losses came in last year's 31-28 setback against Lehigh.

**LIMITED HISTORY:** Despite being just 50 miles from one another, Villanova and Lehigh will be meeting for just the ninth time when the two schools do battle on Saturday, Sept. 8 at Lehigh's Goodman Stadium. In fact, Saturday's meeting will be only the third one between Villanova and Lehigh since 1927. The two teams split the last two meetings. Villanova won in Bethlehem in 2004 by a score of 22-16, while the Mountain Hawks tallied 31-28 win at Villanova last season. This year's game is the second of a five-year contract between the teams.

**SEPTEMBER SUCCESS:** Dating back to the 1997 season, Villanova is 23-4 in the month of September versus Division I-AA competition. All total, the Wildcats are 25-10 in the month of September since 1997 with six of the 10 losses coming against Division I-A opponents.

**LARGE AUDIENCE:** The attendance for last Saturday's season opener at Maryland was 50,389. This represents the second largest away crowd that Villanova has played in front of in the history of the program. The largest was at Air Force on Sept. 4, 1999, with an attendance of 50,409.

**YOUTHFUL WILDCATS:** Three true freshmen started for Villanova in Saturday's season opener at Maryland. On offense, true freshmen **Ben Ijalana** (off. tackle) and **Brant Clouser** (off. guard) started along the offensive line, while **Terence Thomas** started at linebacker. Counting special teams and reserves, Villanova used eight true freshmen against Maryland.

**PICKING THINGS UP:** In 11 games last season, Villanova registered four interceptions the entire season. In last Saturday's season opener at Maryland, the Wildcats tallied three interceptions. The three picks were credited to **Justin Murrell**, **Salim Koroma** and **Zach Mariacher**.

**HOUSE CALL:** Villanova's second touchdown of last Saturday's opener at Maryland came on a 42-yard interception return by junior corner **Salim Koroma**. This was the first time a Wildcat returned an interception for a touchdown since Rodney Badger had a 15-yard return for a score versus William & Mary on Oct. 29, 2005.

**SUPER SHERRY:** Villanova's top offensive player in Saturday's opener was senior tight end **Matt Sherry**. In the 31-14 loss, Sherry made a career-best five receptions for a career-high 68 yards and a 26-yard touchdown reception. For his career, Sherry has 57 receptions for 666 yards and five touchdowns.

**CAREER FIRST:** One of the three interceptions recorded last Saturday at Maryland was by senior **Zach Mariacher**. This was Mariacher's first career interception. Mariacher also had 10 tackles to go with his interception.

**DOMINANT DEFENDER:** Junior linebacker **Mike Holland** recorded his first career double digit game in Saturday's loss at Maryland. Holland finished with a game-high 11 total tackles including five solo stops and six assisted tackles.

**QUARTERBACK DEBUT:** Sophomore quarterback **Antwon Young** made his first collegiate start last Saturday at Maryland. In the 31-14 loss, Young completed 17-of-28 for 176 yards to go with one interception and a 26-yard touchdown pass. Young saw limited action as a true freshman in 2005 when he completed 7-of-12 for 76 yards. Last season, Young watched from the sidelines as a redshirt. Young, who is a 6-4, 215 pound sophomore from Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., replaces the graduated Marvin Burroughs. Last season as a senior, Burroughs completed 171-of-283 for 2,123 yards to go with nine touchdowns and nine interceptions. He also had 342 yards rushing and six rushing scores

**SAME TEAM DIFFERENT LEAGUE:** After playing in the Atlantic 10 Conference from 1997-2006, Villanova begins its first season as a member of the Colonial Athletic Association in 2007. Other than the conference affiliation, not much has changed. The same teams that made-up the 12 team, two division Atlantic 10 Conference, will be the same teams that make-up the CAA. The biggest difference is the conference headquarter location. The Atlantic 10 offices are in Philadelphia, Pa., while the CAA headquarters are located in Richmond, Va.

**FCS BEST:** As a member of the CAA, Villanova plays in the most competitive FCS (formerly Division I-AA) conference in the country. Below are some CAA Football highlights.

- \*\* 3 National Champions

**LEADING THE WAY:** The 2007 Villanova captains will be senior running back **Matt Dicken**, senior tight end **Matt Sherry** and junior defensive lineman **David Dalessandro**. All three earned their captain status by a vote of Wildcat players.

**VILLANOVA PICKED FIFTH:** In the pre-season Colonial Athletic Association poll, Villanova was picked to finish fifth in the South Division according to a poll of the league's head coaches and selected media members.

**BIG SHOES TO FILL:** The position where Villanova was hit the hardest by graduation was along the offensive line as the 'Cats lost three starters. Two of the three departed seniors, center Christian Gaddis and guard Mike Costanzo were three-year starters, while Lav Bauta started at tackle after transferring from Duke for his fifth-year. Gaddis, who was a 2006 first team All-League honoree, is currently on the Buffalo Bills practice squad. Entering play at Lehigh, the expected starters along the offensive line include junior **Mike Sheridan** at center, true freshman **Brant Clouser** and sophomore **Brian Brannigan** at the guards with true freshman **Ben Ijalana** and junior **Izzy Bauta** at the tackle spots. Brannigan and Bauta started every game last season. Junior **Pete Caroppo** is expected to start at guard when he returns from an ankle injury. Caroppo is questionable for this week's game at Lehigh.

**BLOCK PARTY:** One player to keep an eye out for on special teams is junior **Darrel Young**. Throughout his first two years on the Main Line, Young excelled on special teams. In addition to leading the team in special team tackles, he also has three career punt blocks to his credit, including two last year and one in 2005. He recovered the 2005 block for his first career touchdown. Young is also expected to be one of the team's top defensive players from his linebacker position. As a sophomore last year, Young tallied 25 solo tackles, 19 assisted stops for 44 total tackles to go with four tackles for loss, one sack and a forced fumble.

**POINT PRODUCER:** Villanova's leading returning scorer is senior running back **Matt Dicken**. Last season as a junior, Dicken averaged a touchdown every 9.4 carries. He finished the 2006 campaign with 432 yards rushing on 104 carries (4.2 yards per carry) and a team-best 11 touchdowns. In the season opener at Maryland, Dicken carried the ball eight times for 19 yards.

**POSITION CHANGES:** Three Wildcats made position changes during pre-season camp. Junior **Salim Koroma** moved from wide receiver to defensive back and is number two on the depth chart at corner. Koroma is also the team's starting punt returner. In last Saturday's opener, Koroma tallied a 42-yard interception return for a touchdown. Junior offensive guard **Jonathan Krohe** has moved to defensive tackle, while true freshman **Thomas Weaver** is switching from defensive tackle to center. Weaver is battling junior Michael Sheridan for the starting job at center.

**STAFF CHANGES:** Wildcat head coach Andy Talley will have three new assistant coaches in 2007. On offense, **Darrius Smith** joins the Wildcat staff as the team's running backs coach. He replaces Apollo Wright who left to become the Special Teams Coordinator at Florida International University. Smith comes to Villanova from Northeastern University where he coached from 2004-06. He has also had coaching stops at James Madison, Indiana University of Pennsylvania, New Mexico Highlands University and Frostburg State University. Talley also has two new graduate assistant coaches. **David Riede** will be the offensive assistant, while **Charles Alexander** will be the defensive assistant. Riede arrives at Villanova from Allegheny College where he coached from 2005-07, while Alexander comes from Clarion University where he was an assistant from 2005-07.

**ALL-AMERICAN HISTORY:** The Villanova football program has had a first team All-American in eight of the last 13 years. In the program's history, 23 different players have earned first team All-American distinction. Last season, senior safety Allyn Bacchus garnered third team All-American accolades.

**RADIO INFORMATION:** For a second consecutive year SportsTalk 950-AM WPEN will be the flagship station of the Villanova Football Radio Network. Play-by-play announcer Joe Eichhorn, who has been broadcasting Villanova football since 1988, returns to anchor the broadcasts. Joining Eichhorn for a 15th consecutive year is Ryan Fannon. All 11 Wildcat gridiron contests will be broadcast live, beginning with with a 15 minute pre-game show

**OVERTIME HISTORY:** During head coach Andy Talley's tenure at Villanova, the Wildcats have played in 10 overtime games and in those 10 games the Wildcats are 7-3. The Wildcats have not played an overtime contest since the 2003 season. With the double overtime win at Temple on Sept. 6, 2003, Villanova has won five of its last six overtime contests. Of the 10 overtime games, seven have been played at Villanova Stadium. Before the 2003 overtime game with Temple, the Wildcats last overtime contest came in 2001 against James Madison in week four when the 'Cats outlasted the Dukes, 45-44, in double overtime. The last overtime game before the James Madison contest came in 2000 when the Wildcats suffered a 48-41 loss to William & Mary. In 1999, Villanova played two overtime games. On Oct. 16, 1999, Villanova defeated UConn, 48-45, in triple overtime in a game played in Storrs, Conn. In the 1999 season finale at Villanova Stadium, the 'Cats rallied from a 45-24 deficit with 8:37 remaining against Delaware to win a 51-45 thriller in one overtime.

**ACTING PROFESSIONAL:** four former Villanova products are currently on NFL rosters. Wide receiver **Brian Finneran** (Villanova 1994-97), who is currently in his eighth season with the Atlanta Falcons, injured his knee during spring workouts and will be on injured reserve for the 2007 season. Running back **Brian Westbrook** (Villanova 1997-2001) is in his sixth season with the Philadelphia Eagles as the franchise's starting running back. Westbrook became the first Wildcat player to be drafted since Howie Long in 1981 when he was selected in the third round of the 2002 NFL Draft. Safety **Raymond Ventrone**, who (Villanova 2001-04) is in his first year with the New York Jets, is currently a member of the team's practice squad. Before joining the Jets, he was a member of the New England Patriot organization the last two seasons. Ventrone spent 2005 on the Patriot practice squad and last year on the Patriot Physically Unable to Perform List. Center **Christian Gaddis** (Villanova 2002-06) is a rookie with the Buffalo Bills and is on the Bills practice squad. Westbrook and Finneran both won the Walter Payton Award, given to the top player in NCAA I-AA football, during their senior seasons at Villanova.

## 2007 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

### Game 1 Maryland 31, Villanova 14 Sept. 1, 2007 College Park, Md.

**COLLEGE PARK, Md. (AP)** -- Keon Lattimore ran for 106 yards and three touchdowns and Jordan Steffy played exceptionally well in his first start as Maryland's quarterback, and the Terrapins downed Villanova in a 31-14 victory Saturday night.

Lattimore also caught six passes for 33 yards. The senior averaged 5 yards on his 21 carries and moved over 1,000 yards rushing for his career.

Steffy went 19-for-24 for 174 yards and ran for 47 yards and a touchdown.

But there was a scary moment in the third quarter. After a handoff to Lattimore, Steffy crumpled in the backfield. A cart came to take him off the field, but he left on his own power before third-string quarterback Chris Turner took over.

The problem turned out to be a right leg cramp, and Steffy returned for Maryland's next series.

Up 10-7, the Terrapins opened the third quarter with an 11-play, 66-yard touchdown drive. Five plays after Steffy ran for 2 yards on a fourth-and-1 from the Villanova 42, Lattimore scored on a 14-yard run.

On Maryland's next possession, Steffy left in the middle of a 57-yard touchdown drive that Lattimore concluded with an 18-yard run for a 24-7 lead.

Then, after a Maryland interception, Steffy moved the Terrapins 87 yards and scored on a 10-yard TD run with 12:46 left.

That ended a night Steffy had been waiting for since he arrived at Maryland as a freshman in 2004. Before facing the Wildcats, the red-shirt junior had thrown only 37 passes and had gone two years since his last completion.

Steffy's play against Villanova belied his inexperience. First, he moved the Terrapins 46 yards for a field goal. Then he directed a 90-yard march in which he passed for 28 yards and ran for 22. The drive ended with Lattimore dragging two tacklers into the end zone on a 12-yard run.

The Wildcats then moved 84 yards on eight plays, closing to 10-7 on Antwon Young's first career touchdown pass, a 26-yarder to Matt Sherry. Young went 17-for-28 for 176 yards in his first college start. The Wildcats finished with 11 yards rushing on 22 carries.

Villanova got a touchdown with 54 seconds left when Salim Koroma picked off a Turner pass and took it 42 yards to the end zone.

Sherry wound up catching five passes for 68 yards and the one score in the contest. While Young threw for 176 yards, the Wildcats were limited to just 11 yards of offense on the ground. In addition to the pick by Koroma late in the game, Zach Mariacher and Justin Murrell also had interceptions for Villanova.
