PENN REPORT: Saturday's game with Villanova will be the season opener for the Penn Quakers. Penn is coming off a 2007 season where they went 4-6 overall and 3-4 in Ivy League play. In the 2008 pre-season Ivy League coaches poll, Penn was picked to finish fourth. The Quakers did register one first place vote. Harvard and Yale tied for the top spot in the pre-season poll followed by Brown in the third position.

Penn returns 10 starters and 34 letterwinners from last year's squad. On defense, Penn returns three All-Ivy performers in senior linebacker Jay Colabella, senior corner Tyson Maugle and junior corner Chris Wynn. Colabella was a second team All-Ivy choice last year after tallying 46 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 quarterback sacks. Maugle was also a second team selection last year after recording 54 tackles, eight pass break-ups and two interceptions, while Wynn was a first team All-League honoree a year ago. Wynn ranked 10th nationally in interceptions last season with five to go with 11 pass break-ups and 28 tackles.

On offense, Penn will look to senior quarterback Rob Irvin to lead the way. As a sophomore in 2006, Irvin earned Honorable Mention All-Ivy recognition, but was sidelined for much of the 2007 campaign due to injury. In 2006, he completed 174-of-312 for 2,128 yards to go with 10 touchdowns and 12 interceptions. The running back duties will go to the sophomore duo of Michael DiMaggio and Bradford Blackmon. DiMaggio rushed for 376 yards last year and was a three time Ivy League Rookie of the Week selection. Junior Marcus Lawrence is the team's top returning receiver with 21 catches for 207 yards and two scores.

QUAKER HEAD COACH AL BAGNOLI: One of the winningest coaches in Ivy League history, Al Bagnoli is in his 17th season at Penn and his 27th overall as a collegiate head coach. Bagnoli spent 10 years at Union College from 1982-91 before taking over the Quakers program.

Bagnoli ranks second among all active FCS coaches in winning percentage with a career mark of .738. He also ranks second all-time in victories at Penn with 108 and is tops among all Ivy-League coaches since the start of formal league play in 1956. Only Princeton's Dick Coleman has a better winning percentage than Bagnoli since league play started, and Bagnoli is fourth all-time in victories at an Ivy League school.

During his tenure with the Quakers, Bagnoli has led the team to three undefeated seasons (1993, 1994, 2003). His 2003 squad won the Ivy League title and marked the second time that a Bagnoli team posted back-to-back undefeated seasons in Ivy League play.

Penn has been a dominant team at home under Bagnoli, going 62-15 at Franklin Field under his guidance. Twice during his time at the school the program has had at least a 16-game home winning streak, including a 19-game streak between 2000 and 20003.

In the 2006 season opener, Bagnoli recorded his 100th career win at Penn. He enters this Saturday's game with a 108-50 (.684) mark in his 17th season at Penn and a 194-69 (.738) record in his 27th season as a collegiate head coach.

THE BOOK ON TALLEY: Currently in his 24th season at Villanova, head coach **Andy Talley** can feel responsible for every facet of the Villanova football program, having started it from scratch in 1985. During his Wildcat career, Talley has registered a 156-99-1 record, making him the all-time winningest coach in Villanova history. His 28-year overall coaching record currently stands at 184-117-2. Throughout his tenure at Villanova, Talley has guided the Wildcats to six NCAA playoff appearances (1989, 1991, 1992, 1996, 1997, 2002), four conference titles and two Lambert Meadowlands Trophies. In 1997, Talley garnered the Eddie Robinson Award and the AFCA/GTE National Coach of the Year Award after leading Villanova to a perfect 11-0 regular season and the No. 1 ranking in the country for the last six weeks of the regular season.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION: Villanova will be making the second of six television appearances this Saturday at Penn. The game can be seen live on CN8. Other Wildcat television games this year include Sept. 27 versus Richmond, Oct. 25 versus James Madison, Nov. 8 versus New Hampshire and Nov. 22 at Delaware. All four remaining televised games will be shown on CN8.

PHILLY FLAVOR: Villanova and Penn will meet on the football field for the 13th time in history when the two teams square off on Saturday afternoon at Franklin Field. The Wildcats lead the all-time series by a 7-5 count and have won seven in a row over the Quakers. Penn's last win against Villanova came on Oct. 4, 1911. Penn won the first five meetings in the series from 1905-1911, before the Wildcats tallied their first win in the series in 1980 and have now won seven straight since that victory.

CLOSE CALLS: Even though Villanova has posted seven consecutive wins over Penn, the games between the two teams have been closely contested. In the last four meetings, Villanova's margin of victory has been just 8.5 points. In the last three games at Franklin Field, the margin has been just 4.6 points.

IVY LEAGUE COMPETITION: During head coach Andy Talley's tenure at Villanova, the Wildcats are a perfect 8-0 versus Ivy League opponents. Talley has guided the Wildcats to a 6-0 mark versus Penn and a 2-0 record against Columbia. Talley has familiarity with the Ivy League having been an assistant coach at Brown University from 1973-78.

SEPTEMBER SUCCESS: Dating back to the 1997 season, Villanova is 27-5 in the month of September versus FCS (formerly I-AA) competition. All total, the Wildcats are 27-10 in the month of September since 1997 with six of the 10 losses coming against FBS (formerly Division I-A) opponents.

PLAYING AT FRANKLIN FIELD: Throughout its history, Villanova has had a great deal of success at Franklin Field. Entering play Saturday at Penn, Villanova owns an all-time record of 10-3-1 at Franklin Field.

NON CONFERENCE FINALE: Saturday's game at Penn marks the final non conference game of the year for the Wildcats. Following this contest, Villanova will play eight consecutive CAA games beginning next week at home versus Richmond. The Wildcats are currently 1-1 in non conference games with a loss at West Virginia and a home win over Lehigh.

MAGNIFICENT MARCOUX: The story of the game last Saturday versus Lehigh was the play of senior place kicker **Joe Marcoux**. In the 33-14 win over the Mountain Hawks, Marcoux outscored Lehigh by himself by a 15-14 count. Marcoux was a perfect 4-of-4 in field goals and he was 3-of-3 in PATs for 15 points. The four field goals represent a career-high and two of his four field goals came from 44-yards out which were career-longs. His other two field goals were from 22 and 23 yards.

CAA HONORS: For his efforts against Lehigh, **Joe Marcoux** was named CAA Special Teams Player of the Week. This is the first time he has earned this honor during his Wildcat career.

IT'S MILLER TIME: Villanova received a strong performance last Saturday in the Lehigh game from senior defensive end **Greg Miller**. In the 33-14 win, Miller tallied a team-high seven tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, one sack and one forced fumble. He also had a quarterback hurry on the interception that was returned for a touchdown. For his efforts, Miller was named the Villanova Defensive Player of the Game.

CAUSING TURNOVERS: The Villanova defense registered four interceptions in last Saturday's win over Lehigh. Four Wildcats had one interception each including **Salim Koroma**, **Fred Maldonado**, **Osayi Osunde** and **Ross Ventrone**. After tallying 17 interceptions last season, Villanova already has five interceptions to its credit this season. In last year's 34-14 win over Penn, Villanova tied a school record with seven interceptions.

DEFENSIVE SCORE: One of Villanova's four interceptions last Saturday versus Lehigh was returned for a touchdown. With 11:38 left in the second quarter, Wildcat junior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** returned an interception 56 yards for his first career touchdown. It was also Osunde's first career interception.

STREAKING TO A HALT: Due to an injured achilles suffered in the season opener at West Virginia, junior offensive guard **Brian Brannigan** was unable to play in last Saturday's win over Lehigh. This ended Brannigan's streak of 23 consecutive starts which included every game of his Villanova career. Junior **Jon Bugli** started in Brannigan's place. Brannigan is questionable for this Saturday's contest at Penn.

CHANGE UP FRONT: With **Brian Brannigan** unable to play last week, Villanova started a different offensive line for the first time in 12 games. The starting five of **Brian Brannigan**, **Brant Clouser**, **Mike Sheridan**, **Izzy Bauta** and **Ben Ijalana** started all 11 games last year and the season opener this season. Brannigan was replaced last Saturday by junior **Jon Bugli**.

BALL IN THE BACKFIELD: After two games, the bulk of the workload in the Wildcat backfield has gone to sophomore **Aaron Ball**. After two contests, Ball has 32 carries for 121 yards and two touchdowns. In game one at West Virginia, he registered 55 yards on 15 carries and a two-yard touchdown run. Last week in the Lehigh game, he had 17 carries for 66 yards and one score. Ball came on strong late last season when he combined to rush for 95 yards in a limited role in the final two games of the season (46 yards vs. Towson/49 yards vs. Delaware.)

MULTIPLE OPTIONS: After two games, it looks as if quarterback **Antwon Young** has plenty of receiver options to choose from. Led by **Brandyn Harvey's** eight catches, six different Wildcat receivers have made at least five receptions. Following Harvey, **Angelo Babbaro** and **Phil Atkinson** have seven catches, **Mikey Reynolds** and **Matt Szczur** have six receptions and Norman White has five catches. The impressive thing about these six receivers is that two are sophomores (Szczur/Babbaro) and two are true freshmen (Reynolds/White).

TEAM LEADERS: The 2008 Villanova captains will be the senior defensive end duo of **Dave Dalessandro** and **Greg Miller**. This will be Dalessandro's second year in a captain role as he served as a tri-captain last season.



THE EXPERIENCE FACTOR: One reason why hopes are high surrounding the 2008 Villanova football team is due to the fact that Wildcats return 17 starters and 33 letterwinners from last year's squad that went 7-4 overall and 5-3 in CAA play.

VILLANOVA PICKED FOURTH: Despite being ranked in the Top 25 in numerous pre-season national polls, the Wildcats were picked to finish fourth in the South Division of the CAA according to a poll of the league's head coaches and selected media members.

ALL-CONFERENCE RETURNEES: Two members of the 2008 Wildcats earned All-CAA distinction last year. Sophomore **Tim Kukucka** was a second team selection, while junior linebacker Osayi Osunde was a third team choice. Kukucka had 40 tackles, a team-high 12 tackles for loss and a team-best seven sacks last year, while Osunde led the 'Cats in tackles with 82.

BIG SHOES TO FILL: In addition to returning two All-Conference performers, Villanova also lost two players who garnered All-Conference acclaim in 2007. Tight end **Matt Sherry** was a first team honoree, while **Matt Dicken** was a third team selection. All Sherry did last year was catch a team-best 37 balls for a team-high 461 yards and five touchdowns en route to being first team All-CAA and first team All-East. For his efforts, Sherry was a sixth round draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals. In his final two seasons in a Villanova uniform, Dicken registered 1,354 yards rushing and 15 touchdowns. In 2007, he had 922 yards rushing and five touchdowns.

OVERTIME HISTORY: During head coach Andy Talley's tenure at Villanova, the Wildcats have played 12 overtime games and in those 12 contests the Wildcats are 8-4. Last year, Villanova was 1-1 in overtime games (32-24 four overtime loss at Massachusetts/ 24-17 win over Maine). The Wildcats have won six of their last eight overtime games. Of the 12 overtime games, eight have been played at Villanova Stadium.

ON THE RADIO DIAL: All the Villanova football action this year can be heard on 950-AM ESPN Radio. This will be the third consecutive year that 950-AM will serve as the flagship station of Wildcat football. Play-by-play announcer Joe Eichhorn, who has been broadcasting Villanova football since 1988, returns to anchor the broadcasts. Joining Eichhorn for a 16th straight year is Ryan Fannon who will serve as the color analyst.

PLAYING ON SUNDAYS: There are five former Villanova Wildcats currently in the NFL. The five include running back **Brian Westbrook** (7th season with Philadelphia Eagles), wide receiver **Brian Finneran** (10th season in NFL, 9th with Atlanta Falcons), wide receiver/defensive back **Raymond Ventrone** (3rd season with New England Patriots), center **Christian Gaddis** (2nd season in the NFL, 1st with Cleveland Browns) and tight end **Matt Sherry** (rookie season with Cincinnati Bengals). Gaddis was with the Buffalo Bills last year and was released during the Bills final cut this year before being pick-up by the Cleveland Browns. Sherry injured his shoulder and is on the injured reserve list.

CAA FOOTBALL TELECONFERENCE: Every Monday from August 25-Nov. 17, the CAA will conduct a teleconference from 10 a.m.-12:10 p.m. with each of its head coaches. Every coach will have a 10-minute slot to discuss his team and answer questions from the media. Members of the media are strongly encouraged to participate in the questioning. 2008 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

Game 1 No. 8 West Virginia 48, Villanova 21 Aug. 30, 2008 Morgantown, W. Va.

MORGANTOWN, W.Va.--Against a nationally-ranked FBS opponent, Villanova executed its game plan for much of the first half before succumbing to one of the most powerful offenses in the nation in a 48-21 defeat at the hands of No. 8 West Virginia before 60,566 at Milan Puskar Stadium. The Wildcats outgained the Mountaineers by a 399-354 edge in total offensive yards and won the battle of possession time in the game.

Junior **Antwon Young** threw for 218 yards and rushed for a touchdown and Villanova ran in all three of its scores on the afternoon. Sophomores **Aaron Ball** and **Chris Whitney** each rushed for a touchdown as well and the Wildcats finished with 133 net rushing yards.

Villanova ate up more than 11 minutes on the clock in the first quarter and held West Virginia off the scoreboard until there was just 2:04 left in the period. After the Wildcats drove to the Mountaineers 19-yard line, Young was sacked on third down for an initial loss of 15 yards. He fumbled on the play and Mortty Ivy recovered the ball and returned it 30 yards to the Villanova 24-yard line to set up a score.

In the second quarter, Young's three-yard touchdown run with 6:47 to play in the half capped a 12-play, 80-yard drive and pulled the Wildcats to within 14-7. However, Alric Arnett caught his second touchdown pass of the game just over two minutes later and Pat McAfee kicked a 52-yard field goal as time expired to make the score 24-7 at the half.

White threw for a career-high five touchdowns and 208 yards while rushing for 63 yards. Arnett caught four passes and Jock Sanders had eight receptions for 62 yards and a pair of scores. The Mountaineers did the rest of their work on defense, recording six sacks to cause a loss of 42 yards.

Young finished 17-of-33 and also had two interceptions, while Whitney was 4-of-4 for 48 yards to go along with a late one-yard touchdown run with two seconds left in the game. Villanova drove 78 yards on 15 plays for its final points of the contest.

On the defensive side of the ball, senior Darrel Young led the Wildcats with nine tackles and sophomore Ross Ventrone had eight stops. Sophomore Frederick Maldonado had six tackles and also picked off a pass.

NOTES: The Wildcats played against an FBS opponent for the 13th time since the program was restored in 1985 ... Villanova is 2-11 in these games, with the wins coming against Rutgers (2002) and Temple (2003) ... Today's game marked the first of the 13 meetings in which the Wildcats faced a nationally-ranked opponent.

2008 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

Game 2 No. 21 Villanova 33, Lehigh 14 Sept. 13, 2008 Villanova, Pa.

VILLANOVA, Pa.--Senior **Joe Marcoux** was one of the keys to a strong special teams and defensive effort and Villanova defeated Lehigh by a count of 33-14 in its home opener at Villanova Stadium. The Wildcats drew 11,101 for their first home game of the season, which fell on Parents' Weekend on campus.

Marcoux kicked field goals measuring 44, 23, 44 and 22 yards in going 4-for-4 on field goal attempts. The two 44-yard kicks also set new career highs. After a scoreless first quarter, Marcoux kicked a 44-yard field goal in the first minute of the second quarter to open the scoring with 14:12 left in the half.

Less than three minutes later, junior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** returned the first of four Villanova interceptions 56 yards for a 10-0 lead. Marcoux kicked a 23-yard field goal midway through the quarter to make the score 13-0 and the Wildcats later scored 17 unanswered points after the Mountain Hawks had cut the deficit to 13-7 late in the half.

Junior **Aaron Ball** ran in a one-yard score with 1:33 remaining before the intermission to put Villanova ahead 20-7 at the break. Ball finished the day with 66 yards on 17 carries and the Wildcats outgained Lehigh 371-238.

In his second game back after missing the last five games of 2007 with an injury, junior quarterback **Antwon Young** threw for 231 yards and a touchdown, going 22-of-35 with one interception. Classmate **Angelo Babbaro** had five catches for 46 yards and ran 10 times for 55 yards.

A 44-yard field goal by Marcoux early in the third quarter and a 20-yard touchdown pass by Young to senior **Phil Atkinson** with 23 seconds left in the period stretched the Villanova lead to 30-7.

Mountain Hawk quarterback J.B. Clark threw a six-yard pass for a touchdown to Sekou Yansane with 12:28 to play to make the score 30-14 and Marcoux closed the scoring with a field goal with 5:38 left.

Clark threw for 200 yards but finished 20-of-43 and was intercepted four times. In addition to the 56-yard return for a score by Osunde, the Wildcats had interceptions from sophomores **Ross Ventrone** and **Frederick Maldonado** and senior **Salim Koroma**.

Yansane and Mike Fitzgerald each had five receptions for Lehigh and Matt McGowan ran for 29 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries. Tim Diamond had 14 total tackles (10 solo, four assisted) to lead all players and also finished with a 21-yard interception return, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.
