**RICHMOND REPORT:** The Spiders who are 3-1 overall and 2-0 in CAA play enter play this Saturday ranked No. 1 in the country. Richmond tallied 2,389 points to edge out James Madison (2,387 points) for the top spot in the latest *Sports Network* poll. Richmond was the pre-season choice to win the South Division of the CAA. Last year, the Spiders went 11-3 and advanced to the semifinal round of the FCS playoffs. Richmond returns 16 starters and 37 letterwinners from that team.

Richmond's three wins this season have come against then No. 15 Elon (28-10), Towson (45-14) and Maine (44-17). Their lone loss came at Virginia (16-0).

Offensively, the Spiders are paced by junior quarterback Eric Ward. After four games, he has completed 60-of-96 (62.5%) for 832 yards to go with seven touchdowns and two interceptions. Senior running back Josh Vaughan has gained 309 yards on 64 carries and two touchdowns. Ward's favorite target is sophomore wide-out Kevin Grayson who has registered 20 catches for 322 yards and one score. Redshirt freshman Tre Gray has added 13 receptions for 125 yards and one touchdown, while junior Jordan Mitchell has made a team-high three touchdown receptions.

On defense, sophomore linebacker Eric McBride leads the way with 26 total tackles. Sophomore defensive back Justin Rogers has recorded a team-high three interceptions and he has returned two of three picks for touchdowns. Rogers, who was the 2007 CAA Special Teams Player of the Year, is a game-breaker as a kick returner. He is currently averaging 24.1 yards per return. Last year, he ranked third in the nation at nearly 31 yards per return.

**SPIDER HEAD COACH MIKE LONDON:** A former standout defensive back at Richmond, this is the first season as head coach for Mike London at his alma mater. He becomes the 33rd head coach in Richmond history after spending six of the past seven seasons as a defensive coach at Virginia. He served as defensive line coach from 2001-04 and as the defensive coordinator in 2006-07, in between spending one year in the NFL coaching the defensive line for the Houston Texans.

London starred for Richmond from 1979-82 and played in the NFL for the Dallas Cowboys in 1983. He eventually began his coaching career back with the Spiders as a linebackers coach in 1988-89. London served in that same position and was also the recruiting coordinator at Richmond from 1994-96. His other stops as an assistant coach at the collegiate level have come at William & Mary (1990-93) and Boston College (1997-00).

In his years at Virginia, London guided one of the nation's top defensive units. Behind a defense ranked 23rd in the NCAA, Virginia ended the season 9-4 in 2007 with an appearance in the Gator Bowl. The Cavaliers were ranked sixth in sacks (3.3/game), while allowing the NCAA's 19th-fewest rushing yards (106.9/game) and the 16th-fewest points (19.7/game) last season. That performance came on the heels of the 2006 team that ranked 17th nationally in total defense, allowing just 289.5 yards/game - the fewest at UVa in 27 years.

London's appointment as head coach at Richmond marks the first time since Ed Merrick (1951-65) led the team that the program has had an alumnus as head coach.

**THE BOOK ON TALLEY:** Currently in his 24th season at Villanova, head coach **Andy Talley** can feel responsible for every facet of the Villanova football program, having started it from scratch in 1985. During his Wildcat career, Talley has registered a 157-99-1 record, making him the all-time winningest coach in Villanova history. His 28-year overall coaching record currently stands at 185-117-2. Throughout his tenure at Villanova, Talley has guided the Wildcats to six NCAA playoff appearances (1989, 1991, 1992, 1996, 1997, 2002), four conference titles and two Lambert Meadowlands Trophies. In 1997, Talley garnered the Eddie Robinson Award and the AFCA/GTE National Coach of the Year Award after leading Villanova to a perfect 11-0 regular season and the No. 1 ranking in the country for the last six weeks of the regular season.

**LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION:** For the second straight week, Villanova Football can be seen live on CN8. This Saturday's game with Richmond kick-offs on CN8 at 3:30 p.m. This will be the third of six television appearances this year for the Wildcats. Other Wildcat television games this year include Oct. 25 versus James Madison, Nov. 8 versus New Hampshire and Nov. 22 at Delaware. All three remaining televised games will be shown on CN8.

**CONFERENCE OPENER:** Saturday's game with Richmond will be the CAA opener for Villanova. Under the direction of 24-year head coach Andy Talley, the Wildcats are 13-7 in conference openers, including a 7-6 mark in conference openers played at home. This week game's will be the fourth time in history that Villanova has opened conference play against Richmond. The Wildcats tallied wins over the Spiders in the three previous openers (20-17 in 1989, 36-33 in 1992, and 35-30 in 1999).

**THE NATION'S BEST:** Richmond enters play this Saturday at Villanova ranked No. 1 in the latest *Sports Network* poll. This marks the first time that the Wildcats have hosted a No. 1 ranked team. In its history, Villanova has twice beaten a No. 2 ranked team (27-0 vs. Delaware in 1996/ 26-21 vs. Massachusetts in 1999). Villanova is 0-4 all-time versus No. 1 ranked teams.

**RECENT SUCCESS:** Entering play this Saturday, Villanova has won nine of the last 13 games played against Richmond, including winning four of the last six meetings. Overall, Villanova owns an 18-9 advantage in the series. The 18 wins are the second most by Villanova against any of the teams that currently make up the CAA. The Wildcats have defeated Delaware 20 times for the most victories against CAA foes.

**SPIDERS ON THE MAIN LINE:** Richmond has struggled at Villanova Stadium over the years. Entering play this Saturday, the Spiders are just 4-10 all-time in games played at Villanova.

**SEPTEMBER SUCCESS:** Dating back to the 1997 season, Villanova is 28-5 in the month of September versus FCS (formerly I-AA) competition. All total, the Wildcats are 28-10 in the month of September since 1997 with five of the 10 losses coming against FBS (formerly Division I-A) opponents.

**WHITNEY MAKES HIS MARK:** After starting quarterback Antwon Young was ineffective against Penn last Saturday, sophomore **Chris Whitney** came on in relief to help the Wildcats escape with a 20-14 overtime win. In eight offensive snaps, Whitney completed 1-of-2 for 10 yards to go with four carries for 25 yards and one touchdown. The touchdown came on a nine-yard run in overtime which proved to be the game-winning score. As a true freshman last year, Whitney started five of the six games he played in and completed 59-of-100 for 616 yards and had five touchdowns and three interceptions. He also added 100 yards on 71 carries and two rushing scores. In three games as a starter last year, the 'Cats were 3-2. Head coach Andy Talley has yet to name a starter for this week's game against Richmond.

**SECOND HALF SHUTOUT:** A big reason for Villanova's win last Saturday at Penn was due in large part to the play of the Wildcat defense in the second half. After giving up 14 points, 219 yards of total offense (137 yards passing/82 yards rushing) and 11 first downs in the first half, the Villanova defense shut the Quakers out in the second half and allowed just 78 yards of total offense (55 yards passing/23 yards rushing) and three first downs.

**SZCZUR FINDS THE END ZONE:** In the first 13 games of his Villanova career, sophomore wide receiver **Matt Szczur** has done just about everything for the Villanova Wildcats except score a touchdown. Szczur was able to take care of this last Saturday at Penn when he caught a second quarter 38-yard touchdown pass from Antwon Young for his first collegiate score. Earlier in the game, Szczur had a 50-yard touchdown catch taken away due to a block in the back penalty. After three games, Szczur has eight receptions for 114 yards and one touchdown, nine rushes for 51 yards, five punt returns for 43 yards and two tackles on special teams.

**FORCING THE ISSUE:** After three games in 2008, the Villanova defense has forced eight turnovers (6 interceptions/ 2 fumble recoveries). Of the eight, seven have come in the last two weeks. Last year, Villanova forced 25 turnovers (17 interceptions/ 8 fumble recoveries) and had a +12 turnover margin for the year.

**PICKING UP FROM LAST YEAR:** The Wildcat leader in interceptions last year was safety **Martel Moody** who was credited with three of his team's 17 interceptions in 2007. Moody added a fourth interception to his career total when he picked off a Penn pass last Saturday. Sophomore corner Fred Maldonado currently leads the team this season with two interceptions.

**TURNING IT OVER:** In 11 games all of last year, the Villanova Wildcats turned the ball over just 13 times. The 13 turnovers included seven interceptions and six fumbles. After just three games this year, Villanova has already committed nine turnovers, including already equalling last season's total of seven interceptions.

**FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH:** On the current Villanova two-deep depth chart, there are nine freshmen or sophomores currently starting and eight true freshmen that appear on the depth chart.

**EXPECTED RETURN:** The Wildcat offensive line should receive a boost this week with the return of starting guard **Brian Brannigan**. After starting the first 23 games of his Villanova career, Brannigan missed the last two games due to an achilles injury suffered in the season opener at West Virginia. Brannigan is probable for this Saturday's game versus Richmond.

**STRONG PERFORMANCE:** Sophomore linebacker **Marquis Kirkland** made his first career start last Saturday at Penn and provided an effort that was worthy of being named the Wildcat Defensive Player of the Game. In the 20-14 overtime win, Kirkland tallied 10 total tackles and one tackle for loss. Kirkland, who currently ranks third on the team in tackles with 15, started in place of the suspended Mike Holland.

**DOMINANT DARREL:** After three games, the Wildcats are being led in tackles by senior safety **Darrel Young** who has made 18 total stops, including 10 solo tackles. After playing linebacker the first three seasons, Young has moved to safety this year. Last season he finished second on the team in tackles with 78.



**MOVE THE STICKS:** Entering play versus Richmond on Saturday, Sept. 27, the Villanova Wildcats are averaging 23.6 first downs per game. Villanova has shown good balance in getting first downs. Of the 71 first downs, 34 have come by pass, 34 have come on the ground and three via penalties.

**CHANGE UP FRONT:** With **Brian Brannigan** unable to play last week, Villanova started a different offensive line for just the second time in 14 games. The starting five of **Brian Brannigan, Brant Clouser, Mike Sheridan, Izzy Bauta** and **Ben Ijalana** started all 11 games last year and the season opener this season. Brannigan was replaced the last two weeks by **Jon Bugli**. Brannigan is expected back for this Saturday's game versus Richmond.

**SPREADING THE WEALTH:** Villanova has scored nine touchdowns the first three games of the season. Six different players have scored for Villanova this year, including three players with two touchdowns each. The three players include **Antwon Young, Chris Whitney** and **Aaron Ball**. Senior kicker **Joe Marcoux** leads the team in scoring with 20 points.

**MOVING UP THE LIST:** Senior kicker **Joe Marcoux** enters play this week with 155 career points to his credit which ranks him 16th all-time in school history. With two more points, he will move into the top 15 on the list. Former receiver **Brian White** (1999-02) is currently 15th with 156 career points.

**RECEIVING THREATS:** After three games, nine different Wildcat have caught a pass, including six who have made five or more receptions. Senior **Phil Atkinson** leads the way with 13 catches followed by **Brandyn Harvey** with 11 and **Angelo Babbaro** with 10.

**TEAM LEADERS:** The 2008 Villanova captains will be the senior defensive end duo of **Dave Dalessandro** and **Greg Miller**. This will be Dalessandro's second year in a captain role as he served as a tri-captain last season.

**VILLANOVA PICKED FOURTH:** Despite being ranked in the Top 25 in numerous pre-season national polls, the Wildcats were picked to finish fourth in the South Division of the CAA according to a poll of the league's head coaches and selected media members.

**ALL-CONFERENCE RETURNEES:** Two members of the 2008 Wildcats earned All-CAA distinction last year. Sophomore **Tim Kukucka** was a second team selection, while junior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** was a third team choice. Kukucka had 40 tackles, a team-high 12 tackles for loss and a team-best seven sacks last year, while Osunde led the 'Cats in tackles with 82.

**BIG SHOES TO FILL:** In addition to returning two All-Conference performers, Villanova also lost two players who garnered All-Conference acclaim in 2007. Tight end **Matt Sherry** was a first team honoree, while **Matt Dicken** was a third team selection. All Sherry did last year was catch a team-best 37 balls for a team-high 461 yards and five touchdowns en route to being first team All-CAA and first team All-East. For his efforts, Sherry was a sixth round draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals. In his final two seasons in a Villanova uniform, Dicken registered 1,354 yards rushing and 15 touchdowns. In 2007, he had 922 yards rushing and five touchdowns.

**OVERTIME HISTORY:** During head coach Andy Talley's tenure, Villanova has played 13 overtime games and in those 13 contests are 9-4. The Wildcats have won seven of their last nine overtime games. Of the 13 overtime games, eight have been played at Villanova Stadium. Villanova is 1-0 this year in overtime (20-14 one overtime win at Penn on Sept. 20).

**ON THE RADIO DIAL:** All the Villanova football action this year can be heard on 950-AM ESPN Radio. This will be the third consecutive year that 950-AM will serve as the flagship station of Wildcat football. Play-by-play announcer **Joe Eichhorn**, who has been broadcasting Villanova football since 1988, returns to anchor the broadcasts. Joining Eichhorn for a 16th straight year is **Ryan Fannon** who will serve as the color analyst.

**PLAYING ON SUNDAYS:** There are five former Villanova Wildcats currently in the NFL. The five include running back **Brian Westbrook** (7th season with Philadelphia Eagles), wide receiver **Brian Finneran** (10th season in NFL, 9th with Atlanta Falcons), wide receiver/defensive back **Raymond Ventrone** (3rd season with New England Patriots), center **Christian Gaddis** (2nd season in the NFL, 1st with Cleveland Browns) and tight end **Matt Sherry** (rookie season with Cincinnati Bengals). Sherry injured his shoulder and is on the injured reserve list.

**CAA FOOTBALL TELECONFERENCE:** Every Monday from August 25-Nov. 17, the CAA will conduct a teleconference from 10 a.m.-12:10 p.m. with each of its head coaches. Every coach will have a 10-minute slot to discuss his team and answer questions from the media. Members of the media are strongly encouraged to participate in the questioning. ## 2008 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

### Game 1 No. 8 West Virginia 48, Villanova 21 Aug. 30, 2008 Morgantown, W. Va.

**MORGANTOWN, W.Va.**--Against a nationally-ranked FBS opponent, Villanova executed its game plan for much of the first half before succumbing to one of the most powerful offenses in the nation in a 48-21 defeat at the hands of No. 8 West Virginia before 60,566 at Milan Puskar Stadium. The Wildcats outgained the Mountaineers by a 399-354 edge in total offensive yards and won the battle of possession time in the game.

Junior **Antwon Young** threw for 218 yards and rushed for a touchdown and Villanova ran in all three of its scores on the afternoon. Sophomores **Aaron Ball** and **Chris Whitney** each rushed for a touchdown as well and the Wildcats finished with 133 net rushing yards.

Villanova ate up more than 11 minutes on the clock in the first quarter and held West Virginia off the scoreboard until there was just 2:04 left in the period. After the Wildcats drove to the Mountaineers 19-yard line, Young was sacked on third down for an initial loss of 15 yards. He fumbled on the play and Mortty Ivy recovered the ball and returned it 30 yards to the Villanova 24-yard line to set up a score.

In the second quarter, Young's three-yard touchdown run with 6:47 to play in the half capped a 12-play, 80-yard drive and pulled the Wildcats to within 14-7. However, Alric Arnett caught his second touchdown pass of the game just over two minutes later and Pat McAfee kicked a 52-yard field goal as time expired to make the score 24-7 at the half.

White threw for a career-high five touchdowns and 208 yards while rushing for 63 yards. Arnett caught four passes and Jock Sanders had eight receptions for 62 yards and a pair of scores. The Mountaineers did the rest of their work on defense, recording six sacks to cause a loss of 42 yards.

Young finished 17-of-33 and also had two interceptions, while Whitney was 4-of-4 for 48 yards to go along with a late one-yard touchdown run with two seconds left in the game. Villanova drove 78 yards on 15 plays for its final points of the contest.

On the defensive side of the ball, senior Darrel Young led the Wildcats with nine tackles and sophomore Ross Ventrone had eight stops. Sophomore Frederick Maldonado had six tackles and also picked off a pass.

**NOTES:** The Wildcats played against an FBS opponent for the 13th time since the program was restored in 1985 ... Villanova is 2-11 in these games, with the wins coming against Rutgers (2002) and Temple (2003) ... Today's game marked the first of the 13 meetings in which the Wildcats faced a nationally-ranked opponent.

## 2008 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

### Game 2 No. 21 Villanova 33, Lehigh 14 Sept. 13, 2008 Villanova, Pa.

**VILLANOVA, Pa.**--Senior **Joe Marcoux** was one of the keys to a strong special teams and defensive effort and Villanova defeated Lehigh by a count of 33-14 in its home opener at Villanova Stadium. The Wildcats drew 11,101 for their first home game of the season, which fell on Parents' Weekend on campus.

Marcoux kicked field goals measuring 44, 23, 44 and 22 yards in going 4-for-4 on field goal attempts. The two 44-yard kicks also set new career highs. After a scoreless first quarter, Marcoux kicked a 44-yard field goal in the first minute of the second quarter to open the scoring with 14:12 left in the half.

Less than three minutes later, junior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** returned the first of four Villanova interceptions 56 yards for a 10-0 lead. Marcoux kicked a 23-yard field goal midway through the quarter to make the score 13-0 and the Wildcats later scored 17 unanswered points after the Mountain Hawks had cut the deficit to 13-7 late in the half.

Junior **Aaron Ball** ran in a one-yard score with 1:33 remaining before the intermission to put Villanova ahead 20-7 at the break. Ball finished the day with 66 yards on 17 carries and the Wildcats outgained Lehigh 371-238.

In his second game back after missing the last five games of 2007 with an injury, junior quarterback **Antwon Young** threw for 231 yards and a touchdown, going 22-of-35 with one interception. Classmate **Angelo Babbaro** had five catches for 46 yards and ran 10 times for 55 yards.

A 44-yard field goal by Marcoux early in the third quarter and a 20-yard touchdown pass by Young to senior **Phil Atkinson** with 23 seconds left in the period stretched the Villanova lead to 30-7.

Mountain Hawk quarterback J.B. Clark threw a six-yard pass for a touchdown to Sekou Yansane with 12:28 to play to make the score 30-14 and Marcoux closed the scoring with a field goal with 5:38 left.

Clark threw for 200 yards but finished 20-of-43 and was intercepted four times. In addition to the 56-yard return for a score by Osunde, the Wildcats had interceptions from sophomores **Ross Ventrone** and **Frederick Maldonado** and senior **Salim Koroma**.

Yansane and Mike Fitzgerald each had five receptions for Lehigh and Matt McGowan ran for 29 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries. Tim Diamond had 14 total tackles (10 solo, four assisted) to lead all players and also finished with a 21-yard interception return, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

## 2008 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

### Game 3 No. 19 Villanova 20, Penn 14 (ot) Sept. 20, 2008 Philadelphia, Pa.

**PHILADELPHIA, Pa.**--Backup quarterback **Chris Whitney** scored on a nine-yard run on the first possession of overtime as Villanova defeated local rival Penn, 20-14, at Franklin Field.

Penn blocked the extra-point attempt after Whitney scored, but the Quakers fumbled on their first play and Villanova's **Salim Koroma** recovered the ball to clinch the win for the Wildcats.

Villanova starting quarterback **Antwon Young** completed 16 of 26 passes for 172 yards and one touchdown, but also had four interceptions. Robert Irvin was 15-for-23 for 179 yards and a touchdown for the Quakers, who lost to the Wildcats for the seventh straight time since the series was resumed in 1999.

Penn led 14-7 on a 12-yard run by Michael DiMaggio with 9:56 left in the second quarter, but Villanova tied the score four plays later on a 38-yard pass play from Young to **Matthew Szczur**.

Neither team scored in the second half, although Villanova threatened on three occasions but was stopped by Penn's interceptions.

Whitney replaced Young late in the game and completed 1 of 2 passes for 10 yards and carried four times for 25 yards and a touchdown.

Villanova now has an 8-5 lead in the overall series, which started in 1905 - but the teams didn't play from 1912 to 1999.
