JAMES MADISON REPORT: The Dukes are the second top-ranked team that Villanova will play this season and enter Saturday's game with a 6-1 overall record and 4-0 mark in conference play. James Madison has defeated Massachusetts, Maine, Hofstra and Richmond in conference play and the team's only loss this year was to FBS opponent Duke.

James Madison is led by senior quarterback Rodney Landers who averages 113.9 yards per game rushing and 98.9 yards per contest passing. He has tallied 16 touchdowns on the season (eight rushing, eight passing) and accumulated 1,489 yards of total offense. Senior Rockeed McCarter is tied for the team lead with nine receptions and has a team-high three touchdown receptions. Griff Yancey has caught two touchdown passes and is also second on the team to Landers with seven rushing touchdowns.

Defensively, the Dukes have a +6 turnover margin (14-8), with 10 of the turnovers they have forced coming via interceptions. James Madison owns a +17.0 scoring margin for the year as well. Senior safety Marcus Haywood leads the team with 55 tackles and also has a team-high four interceptions.

JMU returns from a bye week and most recently defeated Richmond by a 38-31 score on October 11. In that game, the lead changed hands five times and the Dukes used some heroics at the end to emerge with the win. Eugene Holloman rushed eight yards for a touchdown with 59 seconds left and Landers found Yancey for a two-point conversion to tie the score 31-31. With just one second left in regulation play, Scotty McGee's 69-yard punt return for a touchdown won the game for James Madison.

DUKE HEAD COACH MICKEY MATTHEWS: Mickey Matthews has directed the James Madison University football program through an outstanding nine-year period and this season became JMU's all-time winningest football coach. Matthews has led teams to an NCAA championship (2004) and to three other playoff appearances (1999, 2006, 2007).

Matthews is in his 10th season as head coach at James Madison and currently owns a record of 70-45 (.609) at the school. He surpassed Challace McMillin's previous program mark of 67 victories (1972-84) in a 35-32 win over Appalachian State earlier this season. Matthews twice has been national coach of the year (1999, 2004) while at James Madison and he was the Atlantic 10 coach of the year in 1999.

In 2004, the Dukes were 13-2 and became the first team to reach the national championship game with three straight road wins. James Madison won at Lehigh, Furman and William & Mary before defeating Montana to win the national crown. The 13 wins were a team season record and the Dukes tied their regular season wins mark with a 9-2 pre-playoff record.

JMU reached the 2006 playoffs while going 9-3 and 2007 post-season play with an 8-4 record. The Dukes were eliminated in the first round of the playoffs last season by eventual national champion Appalachian State.

A four-year letterwinner as a collegiate player at West Texas State, Matthews began his coaching career in 1976 at Lamar (Texas) High School. His career included eight stops as an assistant coach before he took over the James Madison program in 1999. From 1996-98, Matthews was an assistant coach at Georgia when the school won bowl games at the Outback Bowl and Peach Bowl.

THE BOOK ON TALLEY: Currently in his 24th season at Villanova, head coach **Andy Talley** can feel responsible for every facet of the Villanova football program, having started it from scratch in 1985. During his Wildcat career, Talley has registered a 160-99-1 record, making him the all-time winningest coach in Villanova history. His 28-year overall coaching record currently stands at 188-117-2. Throughout his tenure at Villanova, Talley has guided the Wildcats to six NCAA playoff appearances (1989, 1991, 1992, 1996, 1997, 2002), four conference titles and two Lambert Meadowlands Trophies. In 1997, Talley garnered the Eddie Robinson Award and the AFCA/GTE National Coach of the Year Award after leading Villanova to a perfect 11-0 regular season and the No. 1 ranking in the country for the last six weeks of the regular season.

ANOTHER NUMBER ONE: For the second straight home game, Villanova will host the No. 1 team in FCS football when top ranked James Madison comes to town on Saturday, Oct. 25. In its last home appearance on Sept. 27, Villanova tallied a 26-20 win over then No. 1 Richmond by a score of 26-20. This was the program's first-ever win against a No. 1 ranked team. The Wildcats are 1-4 all-time versus No. 1 ranked teams.

HOME SWEET HOME: Entering this week's home contest against James Madison, Villanova has won nine straight games at Villanova Stadium. The team's last home loss came against Towson on Oct. 21, 2006. Villanova won its final two home games in 2006, all five home dates in 2007 and the first two home games this year for nine in a row.

CLOSE SERIES: Villanova and James Madison will be meeting for the 16 time when the two teams face-off at Villanova Stadium this week. The Dukes hold a slim 8-7-0 advantage in the series. James Madison has had the upper hand of late winning three of the last four in the series. In its last trip to Villanova in 2006, No. 4 James Madison was upset by the Wildcats by a score of 21-20.

FCS SUCCESS: Villanova's only loss this year came in the season opener at FBS opponent West Virginia. Dating back to last season, the Wildcats have won seven straight games against FCS opponents. Going back to the last four games of 2006, Villanova is 16-3 versus FCS teams.

JOIN THE LIST: Wildcat senior defensive end **Greg Miller** has been added to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The Buchanan Award is given to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The list, which currently stands at 16 players, will undergo one more revision in early November before the final list is announced at the conclusion of the regular season. The winner will be announced on Dec. 18 at the FCS awards banquet held the night before the FCS national championship game in Chattanooga, Tenn.

IT'S MILLER TIME: Senior defensive end **Greg Miller** is in the midst of a sensational senior season. Entering play this week versus James Madison, Miller has 27 total tackles, a team-high 11.5 tackles for loss, a team-best 5.5 quarterback sacks and a team-high tying two forced fumbles. Miller has accounted for 11.5 of Villanova's 42 tackles for loss and 5.5 of the team's 17 sacks.

FORTUNE 500: For the first time in two seasons, the Villanova offense eclipsed the 500-yard total offense mark in last week's win at Rhode Island. The Wildcats totaled 516 yards of total offense, including 261 yards passing and 255 yards rushing. Prior to this performance, the Wildcats last 500 yard total offense performance came against Penn on Sept. 23, 2006 when the 'Cats were credited with 542 total yards.

CLOSING IN: Villanova Head coach **Andy Talley** is two conference wins away from becoming the all-time winningest coach in the history of Colonial Athletic Association Football. The league has been in existence in one form or another since 1947. It was the Yankee Conference from 1947-96, the Atlantic 10 Football Conference from 1997-2006 and is currently the CAA. Talley currently has 95 all-time conference wins. Former New Hampshire mentor Bill Bowes leads the way with 97 victories.

HISTORY MAKING PLAY: In last Saturday's 44-7 win at Rhode Island, Villanova's first touchdown of the game came on an 84-yard pass from **Chris Whitney** to **Phil Atkinson**. This rates as the longest pass play in Villanova football history. The previous record of 83 yards was set in 1989 at Georgia Southern (Schulz to Brady) and in 1949 versus the University of Detroit (Connell to Sernyak).

ANOTHER BIG PLAY: In addition to the 84-yard touchdown pass, Villanova also had a 60-yard touchdown pass in the win at Rhode Island. With the scored tied at 7-7 late in the second quarter, quarterback **Antwon Young** hit **Angelo Babbaro** with a 60-yard scoring strike.

100-YARD RECEIVER: The offensive player of the game last Saturday for the Wildcats was senior wideout **Phil Atkinson**. In the 44-7 win at Rhode Island, Atkinson tallied five receptions for 108 yards and two touchdowns. This was his second career 100-yard receiving game. One of his two touchdown catches was an 84-yarder which represents the longest pass play in school history. Atkinson also had a 10 yard touchdown run, giving him three total touchdowns. After six games, Atkinson leads the Wildcats in receiving with 27 catches for 429 yards and three touchdowns.

GAINING GROUND: Villanova had its best rushing game of the year last Saturday at Rhode Island. In the win, the Wildcats rolled up 255 yards rushing on 45 carries for an average of 5.6 yards per carry. The Wildcats currently rank second in the CAA in rushing yards per game at 192.3. This week's opponent James Madison leads the league at 261.7 rushing yards per game.

GIVE BALL THE BALL: Sophomore running back **Aaron Ball** enters play this Saturday against James Madison ranked fifth in the CAA in rushing. After six games, Ball has gained 513 yards on 92 carries (5.6 yards per carry) and six touchdowns. In the last three games combined, Ball has recorded 50 carries for 355 yards (7.1 yards per rush) and four scores. In two of the last three games he has rushed for 100 yards, including 123 yards against Richmond and a career-high 137 yards rushing at William & Mary.

HIGH PERCENTAGE: Due to the second quarter shoulder injury to starting quarterback **Chris Whitney**, junior signal caller **Antwon Young** received significant playing time last Saturday at Rhode Island. Together, Whitney and Young combined to complete 15-of-20 (75.0%) for 261 yards and three touchdowns. Whitney was 10-of-12 for 163 yards and one touchdown, while Young was 5-of-8 for 98 yards and two scores. Each quarterback also threw a long touchdown pass. Whitney connected with Phil Atkinson on an 84-yard scoring strike, while Young hit Angelo Babbaro with a 60-yard touchdown pass. Whitney's status for Saturday's game with James Madison is unknown. He will be evaluated as the week progresses.



SACK ATTACK: The Wildcat defense tallied seven of their season total 17 sacks in last Saturday's win at Rhode Island. Junior defensive end **Damian Kelley** led the charge with two of the seven sacks. On the year, senior defensive end **Greg Miller** leads Villanova in sacks with 5.5. The 17 sacks lead the CAA.

THE RUNNING GAME: Something has to give this Saturday when No. 1 James Madison plays at No. 7 Villanova. The Dukes enter play leading the CAA in rushing at 261.7 yards per game, while the Wildcats lead the league in rushing defense at 80.0 yards per contest. Last week at Rhode Island, Villanova allowed the Rams just 24 yards on the ground. In the last three games, Villanova has allowed a total of 183 yards rushing (61.0 rushing yards per game in that span). Of Villanova's six opponents this year, only West Virginia (145 yards) and Penn (110 yards) have gone over the 100-yard rushing mark.

TOP OF THE CHARTS: Entering play this Saturday versus James Madison, the Villanova Wildcats lead the CAA in four team categories and three individual statistics.

POINT PRODUCER: Villanova senior kicker **Joe Marcoux** currently leads the CAA in three individual categories including scoring (8.0 points per game), field goals made (9) and field goal percentage (75.0%). After six games, Marcoux is 9-of-12 in field goal attempts and 21-of-22 in PATs for a team-best 48 points. Marcoux now has 183 career points which ranks him 10th on Villanova's all-time scoring list. With four more field goals, Marcoux will tie the school record for field goals in a season with 13. The record is currently held by Bill Hoffman in 1992 and Mark Kiefer in 1997.

PROVIDING A BOOST: The Villanova defense received a solid contribution last Saturday at Rhode Island from reserve defensive back **Justin Murrell**. Murrell registered three solo tackles, two tackles for loss, one sack and an interception that he returned 15 yards against the Rams. The tackles for loss, interception and sack were his first of the year.

DOMINANT ENDS: Villanova has received a strong contribution from its defensive ends this year. The trio of **Greg Miller**, **Tim Kukucka** and **Dave Dalessandro** has been dominant at times this year. After five games, these three have combined to record 60 total tackles, 20 tackles for loss, 9.5 quarterback sacks, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. By category, they have accounted for 58.8 percent of the team's sacks, 47.6 percent of the tackles for loss and 50.0 percent of the forced fumbles.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: On the current Villanova two-deep depth chart, there are nine freshmen or sophomores currently starting and eight true freshmen that appear on the depth chart.

DOUBLE FIGURE RECEIVERS: Entering play against James Madison, Villanova has four receivers who have double figures in receptions. Leading the way is senior **Phil Atkinson** with 27, followed by junior **Brandyn Harvey** with 21, sophomore **Matt Szczur** with 20 and sophomore **Angelo Babbaro** with 17 receptions.

TEAM LEADERS: The 2008 Villanova captains will be the senior defensive end duo of **Dave Dalessandro** and **Greg Miller**. This will be Dalessandro's second year in a captain role as he served as a tri-captain last season.

VILLANOVA PICKED FOURTH: Despite being ranked in the Top 25 in numerous pre-season national polls, the Wildcats were picked to finish fourth in the South Division of the CAA according to a poll of the league's head coaches and selected media members.

ALL-CONFERENCE RETURNEES: Two members of the 2008 Wildcats earned All-CAA distinction last year. Sophomore **Tim Kukucka** was a second team selection, while junior Osayi Osunde was a third team choice. Kukucka had 40 tackles, a team-high 12 tackles for loss and a team-best seven sacks last year, while Osunde led the Cats in tackles with 82. After six games in 2008, Osunde has 31 tackles and one interception, while Kukucka has 17 tackles, four tackles for loss, two sacks and one forced fumble.

OVERTIME HISTORY: During head coach Andy Talley's tenure, Villanova has played 13 overtime games and in those 13 contests are 9-4. The Wildcats have won seven of their last nine overtime games. Of the 13 overtime games, eight have been played at Villanova Stadium. Villanova is 1-0 this year in overtime (20-14 one overtime win at Penn on Sept. 20).

ON THE RADIO DIAL: All the Villanova football action this year can be heard on 950-AM ESPN Radio. This will be the third consecutive year that 950-AM will serve as the flagship station of Wildcat football. Play-by-play announcer Joe Eichhorn, who has been broadcasting Villanova football since 1988, returns to anchor the broadcasts. Joining Eichhorn for a 16th straight year is Ryan Fannon who will serve as the color analyst.

PLAYING ON SUNDAYS: There are five former Villanova Wildcats currently in the NFL. The five include running back **Brian Westbrook** (7th season with Philadelphia Eagles), wide receiver **Brian Finneran** (10th season in NFL, 9th with Atlanta Falcons), wide receiver/defensive back **Raymond Ventrone** (3rd season with New England Patriots), center **Christian Gaddis** (2nd season in the NFL, 1st with Cleveland Browns) and tight end **Matt Sherry** (rookie season with Cincinnati Bengals). Sherry injured his shoulder and is on the injured reserve list. Finneran and Westbrook will play against one another this week when the Falcons travel to Philadelphia to take on the Eagles.



CAA FOOTBALL TELECONFERENCE: Every Monday from August 25-Nov. 17, the CAA will conduct a teleconference from 10 a.m.-12:10 p.m. with each of its head coaches. Every coach will have a 10-minute slot to discuss his team and answer questions from the media. Members of the media are strongly encouraged to participate in the questioning. 2008 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

Game 1 No. 8 West Virginia 48, Villanova 21 Aug. 30, 2008 Morgantown, W. Va.

MORGANTOWN, W.Va.--Against a nationally-ranked FBS opponent, Villanova executed its game plan for much of the first half before succumbing to one of the most powerful offenses in the nation in a 48-21 defeat at the hands of No. 8 West Virginia before 60,566 at Milan Puskar Stadium. The Wildcats outgained the Mountaineers by a 399-354 edge in total offensive yards and won the battle of possession time in the game.

Junior **Antwon Young** threw for 218 yards and rushed for a touchdown and Villanova ran in all three of its scores on the afternoon. Sophomores **Aaron Ball** and **Chris Whitney** each rushed for a touchdown as well and the Wildcats finished with 133 net rushing yards.

Villanova ate up more than 11 minutes on the clock in the first quarter and held West Virginia off the scoreboard until there was just 2:04 left in the period. After the Wildcats drove to the Mountaineers 19-yard line, Young was sacked on third down for an initial loss of 15 yards. He fumbled on the play and Mortty Ivy recovered the ball and returned it 30 yards to the Villanova 24-yard line to set up a score.

In the second quarter, Young's three-yard touchdown run with 6:47 to play in the half capped a 12-play, 80-yard drive and pulled the Wildcats to within 14-7. However, Alric Arnett caught his second touchdown pass of the game just over two minutes later and Pat McAfee kicked a 52-yard field goal as time expired to make the score 24-7 at the half.

White threw for a career-high five touchdowns and 208 yards while rushing for 63 yards. Arnett caught four passes and Jock Sanders had eight receptions for 62 yards and a pair of scores. The Mountaineers did the rest of their work on defense, recording six sacks to cause a loss of 42 yards.

Young finished 17-of-33 and also had two interceptions, while Whitney was 4-of-4 for 48 yards to go along with a late one-yard touchdown run with two seconds left in the game. Villanova drove 78 yards on 15 plays for its final points of the contest.

On the defensive side of the ball, senior Darrel Young led the Wildcats with nine tackles and sophomore Ross Ventrone had eight stops. Sophomore Frederick Maldonado had six tackles and also picked off a pass.

Game 2 No. 21 Villanova 33, Lehigh 14 Sept. 13, 2008 Villanova, Pa.

VILLANOVA, Pa.--Senior **Joe Marcoux** was one of the keys to a strong special teams and defensive effort and Villanova defeated Lehigh by a count of 33-14 in its home opener at Villanova Stadium. The Wildcats drew 11,101 for their first home game of the season, which fell on Parents' Weekend on campus.

Marcoux kicked field goals measuring 44, 23, 44 and 22 yards in going 4-for-4 on field goal attempts. The two 44-yard kicks also set new career highs. After a scoreless first quarter, Marcoux kicked a 44-yard field goal in the first minute of the second quarter to open the scoring with 14:12 left in the half.

Less than three minutes later, junior linebacker **Osayi Osunde** returned the first of four Villanova interceptions 56 yards for a 10-0 lead. Marcoux kicked a 23-yard field goal midway through the quarter to make the score 13-0 and the Wildcats later scored 17 unanswered points after the Mountain Hawks had cut the deficit to 13-7 late in the half.

Junior **Aaron Ball** ran in a one-yard score with 1:33 remaining before the intermission to put Villanova ahead 20-7 at the break. Ball finished the day with 66 yards on 17 carries and the Wildcats outgained Lehigh 371-238.

In his second game back after missing the last five games of 2007 with an injury, junior quarterback **Antwon Young** threw for 231 yards and a touchdown, going 22-of-35 with one interception. Classmate **Angelo Babbaro** had five catches for 46 yards and ran 10 times for 55 yards.

A 44-yard field goal by Marcoux early in the third quarter and a 20-yard touchdown pass by Young to senior **Phil Atkinson** with 23 seconds left in the period stretched the Villanova lead to 30-7.

Mountain Hawk quarterback J.B. Clark threw a six-yard pass for a touchdown to Sekou Yansane with 12:28 to play to make the score 30-14 and Marcoux closed the scoring with a field goal with 5:38 left.

Clark threw for 200 yards but finished 20-of-43 and was intercepted four times. In addition to the 56-yard return for a score by Osunde, the Wildcats had interceptions from sophomores **Ross Ventrone** and **Frederick Maldonado** and senior **Salim Koroma**.

Yansane and Mike Fitzgerald each had five receptions for Lehigh and Matt McGowan ran for 29 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries. Tim Diamond had 14 total tackles (10 solo, four assisted) to lead all players and also finished with a 21-yard interception return, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa.--Backup quarterback **Chris Whitney** scored on a nine-yard run on the first possession of overtime as Villanova defeated local rival Penn, 20-14, at Franklin Field.

Penn blocked the extra-point attempt after Whitney scored, but the Quakers fumbled on their first play and Villanova's **Salim Koroma** recovered the ball to clinch the win for the Wildcats.

Villanova starting quarterback **Antwon Young** completed 16 of 26 passes for 172 yards and one touchdown, but also had four interceptions. Robert Irvin was 15-for-23 for 179 yards and a touchdown for the Quakers, who lost to the Wildcats for the seventh straight time since the series was resumed in 1999.

Penn led 14-7 on a 12-yard run by Michael DiMaggio with 9:56 left in the second quarter, but Villanova tied the score four plays later on a 38-yard pass play from Young to **Matthew Szczur**.

Neither team scored in the second half, although Villanova threatened on three occasions but was stopped by Penn's interceptions.

Whitney replaced Young late in the game and completed 1 of 2 passes for 10 yards and carried four times for 25 yards and a touchdown.

Villanova now has an 8-5 lead in the overall series, which started in 1905 - but the teams didn't play from 1912 to 1999.

Game 4 No. 19 Villanova 26, No. 1 Richmond 20 Sept. 27, 2008 Villanova, Pa.

VILLANOVA, Pa.--In its conference opener, No. 19 Villanova took the lead late in the first quarter and never looked back along the way to defeating a top-ranked opponent for the first time in school history. The Wildcats defeated No. 1 Richmond by a 26-20 count at Villanova Stadium.

Sophomore **Aaron Ball** ran for a career-high 123 yards and two touchdowns and senior **Joe Marcoux** matched a career high with four field goals to carry Villanova to its third straight win. The Wildcats had been 0-4 in their history against No. 1-ranked teams and had never played a top-ranked opponent at Villanova Stadium.

The Wildcats owned a 402-333 advantage in total offense thanks to their dominant running game, which produced a 226-83 edge in net rushing yards. Ball ran in for a three-yard score with 3:51 remaining in the opening period to give Villanova a 7-3 lead and then broke away for a 63-yard scoring run with 8:39 left in the second quarter to stretch the margin to 14-3. It was the first career 100-yard rushing game for Ball.

Later in the second quarter Joe Stewart caught an 8-yard touchdown pass from Eric Ward with 3:47 to play in the half to close the Spiders to within 14-10. The Wildcats preserved their lead by never returning the ball to Richmond in the half and Marcoux kicked a 21-yard field goal as time expired to send Villanova into the break with a 17-10 lead.

The Spiders did everything they could to get their offense going in the third quarter and held the ball for more than 11 minutes in the period. Richmond had two drives in the quarter that combined for 25 plays and 135 yards of offense but amounted to just a field goal. Andrew Howard converted a 35-yard attempt with 8:28 left in the period to make the score 17-13 but Marcoux answered with a 25-yard field goal less than four minutes later to bring the Wildcat lead back to a touchdown.

A drive by the Spiders that lasted 12 plays and went 75 yards wound up in Richmond turning the ball over on downs seven seconds into the fourth quarter. On its ensuing drive, Villanova consumed nearly seven minutes on the clock and capped a 15-play, 63-yard drive with Marcoux kicking a career-long 48-yard field goal with exactly eight minutes to play. The field goal was the sixth-longest in school history and Marcoux added a 29-yarder with 4:04 remaining.

The final rally attempt by the Spiders stalled late in the final period after Josh Vaughan ran in a seven-yard score to pull Richmond to within 26-20. The Spiders went 86 yards on 11 plays in just 2:45 but Brian Radford's onside kick went straight to Wildcat sophomore **Matt Szczur** at the Villanova 39-yard line with 1:13 left.

Sophomore quarterback **Chris Whitney** made his first start of the season after entering last weekend's game at Penn late in the contest. He threw for 176 yards on 14-of-22 accuracy with one interception and also gained 61 yards on the ground with 17 net rushing yards. Szczur, junior **Brandyn Harvey** and senior **Phil Atkinson** all had four receptions for the Wildcats, with Szczur accounting for a team-high 56 receiving yards.

Senior **Greg Miller** made eight tackles in the game, which included 5.5 tackles for losses totaling 23 yards. He was credited with 2.5 sacks and also forced a fumble, as did sophomore **Terence Thomas**. Thomas had 1.5 sacks and 10 total tackles while senior **Salim Koroma** led the team with 11 stops (four solo, seven assisted).

Villanova last played a No. 1-ranked team on October 1, 2005 when it was defeated 45-17 at New Hampshire. The last time any top-ranked squad played at Villanova Stadium was during the Wildcats undefeated regular season in 1997, when they spent part of the year as the nation's No. 1 team and reached the second round of the NCAA Championship before finishing the year with a 12-1 record.

Game 5 No. 14 Villanova 38, William & Mary 28 Oct. 4, 2008 Williamsburg, Va.

WILLIAMSBURG, Va.--Strong special teams play was complemented by an offense that was in top form in the first half and Villanova ran out to an early lead in an eventual 38-28 win over William & Mary at Zable Stadium. The visiting Wildcats scored the game's first 35 points and never looked back in winning their fourth consecutive game.

Villanova reached the end zone on five of its first seven possessions of the game and led 35-0 after sophomore **Chris Whitney** found classmate **Matt Szczur** for an 11-yard touchdown pass with 51 seconds remaining in the second quarter. The Wildcats scored 21 points off turnovers in the half thanks to scoring drives that began after a blocked field goal, fumble recovery and blocked punt.

With the ball in its hands during the opening half, Villanova was nearly unstoppable. Whitney completed 17-of-21 passes in the half for 163 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while also rushing in for a score. The Wildcats generated 297 yards of offense and converted on 6-of-9 third-down situations before the break, while the Tribe had just 139 yards of offense and were 0-of-6 on third downs.

Whitney opened the scoring with 7:42 left in the opening quarter when he threw a five-yard touchdown pass to senior tight end **Stephen Pimm**, who recorded his first career touchdown reception.

It was a half full of firsts before intermission and the game turned in the second quarter when Villanova had back-to-back scores just 49 seconds apart. True freshman running back **Lawrence Doss** caught his first career pass for a 15-yard touchdown with 12:52 left in the second quarter. On the second play of the next William & Mary drive, sophomore **Marquis Kirkland** forced a fumble that was recovered by classmate **Frederick Maldonado** and returned to the Tribe 32-yard line. From there, sophomore **Aaron Ball** rushed for a 32-yard touchdown on the first play of the ensuing Wildcat drive to spot Villanova a 21-0 lead.

The Wildcats blocked two kicks in the same game for the first time since 2004 and also recorded both a blocked field goal and blocked punt in the same game for the first time since 2002. The drive that ended with Pimm's touchdown began on a blocked 32-yard field goal attempt by junior **Osayi Osunde** that sophomore **Ross Ventrone** recovered. In the second quarter, junior **Damian Kelley** blocked a punt that was recovered by freshman **Mikey Reynolds** at the William & Mary 18-yard line. Whitney ran in for a 1-yard score four plays later.

Despite the early surge, Villanova had to hang tough in the closing minutes of the game to win in Williamsburg for only the second time since 1997. Jonathan Grimes returned a kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown with 37 seconds left in the first half to make the score 35-7 and Michael Alvarado blocked a field goal attempt as time expired to give William & Mary a bit of momentum going into the second half. Scoring drives early in the third and fourth quarters eventually allowed the Tribe to score 21 unanswered points and pull to within 35-21 on R.J. Archer's 3-yard run with 11:50 left in the game.

After that score, however, the Wildcats consumed more than five minutes of clock during a 13-play drive that ended with a 23-yard field goal by senior **Joe Marcoux** with 6:15 remaining and restored a three-possession lead. Archer's six-yard run with 4:20 to play closed the scoring at 38-28.

Whitney finished 20-of-27 for 186 yards and two scores and Ball established a career high for the second straight game with 137 rushing yards. Whitney also ran for 60 yards on 19 carries, Szczur finished with a game-high seven receptions for 78 yards and senior **Phil Atkinson** caught five passes.

2008 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

Game 6 No. 7 Villanova 44, Rhode Island 7 Oct. 18, 2008 Kingston, R.I.

KINGSTON, R.I.--A sluggish offensive start eventually gave way to a dominant performance and No. 7 Villanova scored 44 unanswered points to beat Rhode Island by a 44-7 score at Meade Stadium.

Senior **Phil Atkinson** had three touchdowns and sophomore **Angelo Babbaro** registered a pair of scores for the Wildcats, who eclipsed 40 points for the first time this season. Atkinson matched his career-high with the three touchdowns and went over 100 yards receiving for the first time this season. He finished with five catches for 108 yards and two touchdowns, while also running in for a 10-yard score.

The Rams held possession for more than 11 minutes in the first quarter and forced Villanova to go three-and-out on their first two drives. With 4:42 remaining in the period, Derek Cassidy capped a nine-play, 80-yard drive with a 21-yard rushing touchdown to put Rhode Island in front, 7-0.

That touchdown seemed to wake up the Wildcats own offense and Villanova needed just two plays to tie the game 39 seconds later. Sophomore **Chris Whitney** threw an 84-yard touchdown pass to Atkinson and the floodgates were open the rest of the way. The 84-yard play was both a career-long pass for Whitney as well as a career-long reception for Atkinson. Neither player had had a play of longer than 50 yards in their careers.

The Wildcats scored in all four quarters for the second time this season and led for good after junior **Antwon Young** threw a 60-yard pass for a touchdown to Babbaro with 3:41 remaining in the first half. Babbaro also had a one-yard score on the ground 28 seconds before intermission to send Villanova into the break with a 21-7 lead. Five of the six Wildcat scoring drives in the game took six or fewer plays and occupied less than two minutes of clock time. Villanova's average field position starting their drives was their own 44-yard line.

At the start of the second half, the Rams kicked off and Babbaro returned the kickoff 53 yards to set the Wildcats up at the Rhode Island 34-yard line. Sophomore **Aaron Ball** rushed for a touchdown on the first play of the ensuing Wildcat drive as Villanova led 28-7 thanks to scoring 21 points in fewer than four minutes.

Atkinson's second touchdown of the day with five minutes left in the third period was a 10-yard rush and he caught a three-yard touchdown pass from Young with 7:15 remaining in the game. The final points came on a safety with 6:24 to play. The Wildcats held the ball for more than 12 minutes in the fourth quarter.

Whitney was 10-of-12 for 163 yards and a touchdown before yielding to Young the rest of the way. Young finished 5-of-8 for 98 yards and a pair of scores while also running twice and picking up 10 yards.

Ball finished with 95 yards on just 10 carries and Villanova gained 255 yards on the ground. It marked the third straight game with over 200 rushing yards for the Wildcats and the team's 516 yards of total offense was its highest since recording 542 yards in a 27-20 win over Penn on September 23, 2006.

Sophomore **Louis Adeyemi** had a career-high 50 yards rushing on seven carries and true freshman **Lawrence Doss** carried seven times for 30 yards. Babbaro finished with 141 all-purpose yards (14 rushing, 74 receiving, 53 kickoff return).

Defensively, senior **Darrel Young** had a team-high nine tackles and junior **Osayi Osunde** had seven tackles and a forced fumble. Junior **Damian Kelley** made four tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss and two sacks.
