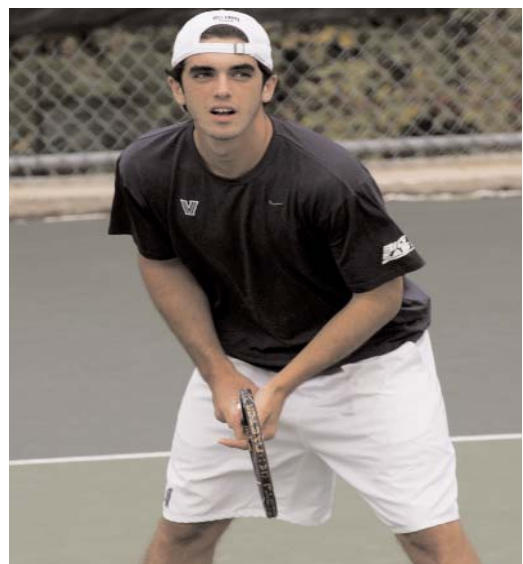

## MEET THE COACHES



**BRAD ADAMS**  
**MEN'S HEAD COACH**  
**4TH SEASON**

Brad Adams enters his fourth season as the head coach of the Villanova men's tennis program in 2009-10.

During his playing days as a Villanova Wildcat, Adams served as a co-captain during his senior season and compiled a career record of 25-37 at the No. 1 singles spot and a 23-23 record at No. 1 doubles before graduating in 2003. Adams earned his bachelors of arts degree from Villanova as a Political Science and Geography major and later went on to earn a master's degree in Geography from Binghamton University.

Adams took reins of the program from long-time coach Bob Batman in 2008 and brings a goal-oriented and focused coaching style to Villanova tennis.

Adams has led the men's tennis team to the BIG EAST Championship tournament twice since taking helm of the program. In 2008 and 2009, a No. 8 seeded Villanova team defeated No. 9 UConn to advance into the second round of play.

Steve Reiniger enters his thirteenth season as head coach of the Villanova women's tennis program in 2009-10.

Reiniger began his Villanova career as an assistant for the Wildcat men's and women's tennis teams under Bob Batman in 1994. He graduated from West Chester University in 1994 with a Bachelor's of Arts degree in philosophy. At West Chester, Reiniger played four years of varsity tennis, reaching the conference finals in singles and doubles during his last two seasons. As a senior, he was named his team's Most Valuable Player.

Reiniger is U.S.P.T.A. certified and has 17 years of teaching and coaching experience at a number of levels. He has taught at several clubs in Pennsylvania, including a stint as the teaching pro and director of junior development at Radley Run Country Club, the head teaching pro and the head platform tennis pro at the Merion Cricket Club. Reiniger is presently the director of tennis at the Whitford Country Club.

Reiniger resides in Collegeville, Pa. with his wife, Beth, a Villanova alumna, and their daughter Rachel and son David.

### 2010 WOMEN'S OUTLOOK

The Villanova men's tennis team will face both new and old rivals heading into the 2010 Spring campaign.

In their first match of the new year, the Wildcats will be looking for a solid start as they face UMBC and William & Mary opening weekend. Villanova will face the Tribe for the first time since 1996 when W&M tallied a 6-1 win over the Wildcats in Bermuda, and will head back to Old Dominion to face several opponents they saw in the ODU Sergio Tacchini Collegiate Invitational.

The men will see a nice break from the cold weather when they head to San Diego and La Jolla, Calif. to participate in the Point Loma Nazarene Tournament and the prestigious 121 Pacific Coast Doubles Championship, which is widely regarded as one of the most historic and competitive competitions in the nation.

March will provide the Wildcats with an opportunity to dominate in both BIG EAST and local competition. Schedule highlights include Quinnipiac on March 24th as well as BIG EAST rivals St. John's, Georgetown and Connecticut.

Villanova is led by tri-captains David Shaheen (Boca Raton, Fla.), Trenton Alenik (Las Vegas, Nev.) and John Magliano (Rye Brook, N.Y.). Shaheen, a junior, is looking to continue a successful fall 2009 campaign where he won his flight at Brown and was a semi-finalist at Old Dominion last year. Alenik, a junior, is also looking improve his record at Old Dominion where he finished as a semi-finalist in the Monarch's annual tournament.

Perhaps the biggest highlight of the Villanova women's tennis season comes from ten scheduled home matches to be played at the Villanova Tennis Complex. With home court advantage, the Wildcats will have plenty of momentum as they face familiar BIG EAST foe's as well as schedule highlights of Quinnipiac, UC San Diego, Point Loma Nazarene and Xavier.

The Wildcats will look for leadership from the senior captains of Courtney Reed (Sinking Spring, Pa.) and Carla Erskine (Boynton Beach, Fla.), who will also be playing in the top two singles positions as well. Sophomore Allison Solberg (Bradenton, Fla.) will round out the #3 singles spot going into the first weekend of BIG EAST competition.

Junior classmates Emily Urda (Sewickley, Pa.) and Katherine Monari (Madison, N.J.) will serve as understudies to the leadership provided by Reed and Erskine for the season. Both will look to improve on their singles and doubles record from 2009, while the newcomers of Weseigh Donadio (Winter Park, Fla.) and Sarah Kelly (Washington, Conn.) will be looking to contribute in doubles action for the Wildcats in 2010.

Sophomore Kristin Gobberg (Cary, Ill.) and Reed, both coming into opening weekend with solid performances over the winter months, will most likely take the first or second spot in doubles action.

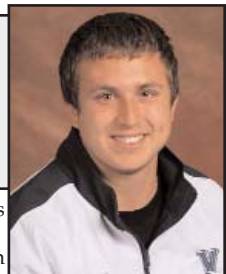

### Office of Academic Support

The Office of Academic Support is located in the Jake Nevin Field House. Dr. Dan Regan serves as the academic support faculty representative and works in conjunction with associate director Amy Morgan and assistant director Tara Nelson. Collectively, the Office of Academic Support provides comprehensive academic support to all Villanova student-athletes.

A computer facility, located in the Office of Academic Support, is available to all student-athletes. The facility offers fully equipped computer work stations with direct access to the campus network. For the convenience of the student-athletes, a laptop program has been established that allows student-athletes to borrow a laptop for an extended period of time, including weekend road trips during the respective season.

In an attempt to help freshmen adjust to college life, both academically and personally, all incoming student-athletes are required to participate in the Freshmen Mentoring Program. Each freshman is assigned to a graduate mentor who will assist them through an individualized academic monitoring program through the year by meeting on a weekly basis.

The Office of Academic Support also provides tutorial support for student-athletes in every academic discipline offered at the University. Tutorial sessions in math for Arts & Science majors, business calculus and math analysis are held weekly at the Academic Resource Center.

### Academic Resource Center

The Villanova Department of Athletics recently expanded Academic Support's domain into the newly renovated stadium press box. With the addition of a new infrastructure during the summer of 1999, the department's new Academic Resource Center (ARC) was formed with the intent of providing an efficient and comfortable learning environment to serve as an extension of the Office of Academic Support, which insures academic success for all student-athletes. The benefits of the ARC include:

- A more personally tailored academic support system.
- Computer equipped study hall housing 50-60 laptop computers.
- Internet and network access with each computer
- Increased space for freshmen-mentoring.
- Conference area for lectures and study hall.
- Private study areas

### Academic Excellence

Villanova student-athletes continue to excel in the classroom. During the Spring 2008 semester Wildcat student-athletes produced an overall grade point average of 3.06, marking the 12th straight semester with a collective GPA of at least 3.0.

Villanova University is located 12 miles west of the city of Philadelphia, Pa., birthplace of American independence. Philadelphia is an absolutely indispensable resource easily accessible for Villanova's student community. Buses and trains stop regularly on our campus, and you can be in Center City in a matter of minutes.

Philadelphia is also home to some of the country's most exciting professional sports teams. You can watch the Philadelphia Phillies play baseball at the brand new Citizens Bank Park, and the NFL's Philadelphia Eagles hit the gridiron at Lincoln Financial Field. Just across the street is the Wachovia Center, home to the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers and the NHL's Philadelphia Flyers. The Major Indoor Lacrosse League's Philadelphia Wings play at the Wachovia Spectrum. The Wachovia Center, the Wachovia Spectrum, Citizen's Bank Park, and Lincoln Financial Field are home to numerous other events, concerts and festivals.

There is also Philadelphia's famous South Street for shopping and strolling. Philadelphia's excellent restaurants are world-famous; equally famous is the city's more casual cuisine, like cheesesteaks, hoagies and soft pretzels.

Philadelphia also contains one of the country's largest concentration of colleges, with over 30 campi located within a 15-mile radius of Villanova. This gives students an opportunity to take advantage of libraries, cultural offerings, and other facilities as well as giving them thousands of students and peers with whom to share good times.

## THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1842 by the friars of the Order of St. Augustine, Villanova is a comprehensive Roman Catholic institution that welcomes students of all faiths. The University offers a wide variety of degree programs through four colleges: the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the Villanova School of Business, the College of Engineering, and the College of Nursing, as well as the Villanova Law School.

## AN EXCELLENT ACADEMIC REPUTATION

The oldest and largest Catholic university in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Villanova is one of 262 institutions and one of 18 Catholic colleges or universities in the nation to have a chapter of Phi Beta Kappa, the prestigious liberal arts honor society. For more than a decade, Villanova University has finished first in its region (Northern Universities - Master's: Top School) in *US News and World Report's* ranking of America's best colleges and universities.

## THE STUDENTS

Villanova's more than 6,000 undergraduates come from 49 states plus the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands and 60 foreign countries. Ninety-nine percent of the most recently accepted first-year students ranked in the top 30 percent of their high school class, and the middle 50 percent range for the SAT is 1340-1430/1600.

## THE FACULTY

Villanova's 545 full-time faculty members, 90 percent of whom hold the highest degree in their field, teach classes that average 22 students. The student : faculty ratio is 13:1.

## THE CAMPUS

Located in a suburban community 12 miles (or 20 kilometers) west of Philadelphia, the picturesque 254-acre campus features more than 60 buildings, including a library with more than 800,000 volumes, an 11,800 seat stadium, state of the art academic facilities, and 26 residence halls.

## THE EXPERIENCE

Villanova students may choose to study abroad for a summer, semester, or year; compete on one of 11 men's or 13 women's NCAA Division I level (football is Division IAA) sports teams, immerse themselves in Campus Ministry, and take part in any of more than 130 campus organizations.

## Financial Assistance

For the academic year 2007-2008, Villanova offered more than \$56 million in need-based assistance to full-time undergraduate students.

## ACCREDITATION

Villanova and its programs have received accreditation through the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, the AACSB International, the American Chemical Society, the American Bar Association, the Association of American Law Schools, the Pennsylvania State Board of Nurse Examiners, the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology, the National Catholic Education Association, and the Computing Sciences Accreditation Board. ### Getting to Villanova

**From New York and New England:** Take the New Jersey Turnpike (95) to Exit 6 (Pennsylvania Turnpike (276) Exit). Take the Pennsylvania Turnpike (276) Westbound to Exit 20 (Mid-County Interchange) I-476 South/Chester. Follow I-476 South to Exit 13 (Villanova/St. Davids). At the bottom of ramp turn right onto Route 30 East, also known as Lancaster Avenue. Proceed east on Route 30 (Lancaster Avenue) for one-half mile and at the fifth traffic light you will see Villanova's main parking lot on the right. To reach the Main Gate entrance, turn left at the next light (Ithan Avenue) to second drive on left, directly across from the The Pavilion Sports Complex.

**From the West:** Take the Pennsylvania Turnpike (76) to Exit 326 - Valley Forge (formerly Exit 24). Take I-76 (Schuylkill Expressway) to Exit 331A(I-476 South/Chester) to Exit 13 (US 30 St. Davids/Villanova) to Route 30 East, also known as Lancaster Avenue. Take Route 30 East (Lancaster Avenue) for one-half mile and at the fifth traffic light you will see Villanova's parking lot on the right.

**From the South:** Take I-95 North to Exit 7 (I-476 (Blue Route) North-Plymouth Meeting). Take I-476 (Blue Route) North to Exit 13 (Villanova/St. Davids) Lancaster Avenue) to Route 30 East, also known as Lancaster Avenue. Proceed east on Route 30 (Lancaster Avenue) for one-half mile and at the fifth traffic light you will see Villanova's main parking lot on the right. To reach the Main Gate entrance, turn left at the next light (Ithan Avenue) to second drive on left, directly across from the The Pavilion Sports Complex.
