MEDIA & TRAVEL INFORMATION

THE 2002-2003 MEDIA GUIDE

The 2002-03 Villanova University women's basketball media guide was prepared by the Villanova University Office of Media Relations to assist the media in their coverage of Villanova women's basketball. Requests for additional information, photographs and player interviews should be directed to Dean Kenefick, Assistant Athletic Director for Communications, Villanova University, Villanova, PA 19085. (610) 519-4120 (office) or (610) 259-2422 (home).

GAME CREDENTIALS AND INFORMATION

Requests for media credentials, photographer's passes, broadcast services and parking should be made no later than 5 p.m. on the day prior to each home game to Dean Kenefick, Assistant Athletic Director for Communications. Passes can be picked up in the Office of Media Relations or at the pass gate at The Pavilion.

GAMEDAY SERVICES

All working media will be seated at press row, opposite the team benches. The media room will open approximately one hour prior to each game. Notes, rosters, media guides, game protocol sheets and game programs will be available in the room. Several telephones are available, upon request. Halftime stats and complete post-game packages will be distributed.

BROADCAST POLICY

Permission to broadcast Villanova women's basketball games in The Pavilion must be obtained from Dean Kenefick, Assistant Athletic Director for Communications, no later than two weeks prior to game day. A fee of \$75 per phone line will be charged and checks can be made payable to "Villanova University." All requests must be made in writing and on company letterhead. Unless otherwise stated, there will be no electronic media timeout during games.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Following a 10-minute "cooling off" period, Villanova head coach Harry Perretta and Villanova players will be available to the media at the north (student) end of the playing court. By Villanova University policy, the locker room is closed to all members of the media. Post-game requests for opponents should be arranged through the opponent SID. On the road, Villanova players and coaches will be available in areas designated by the host SID.

NON-GAMEDAY INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Villanova players and coaches must be arranged through Dean Kenefick, Assistant Athletic Director for Communications. Twenty-four-hour notice is required on all non gameday interviews. All interviews will be arranged through the Office of Media Relations.

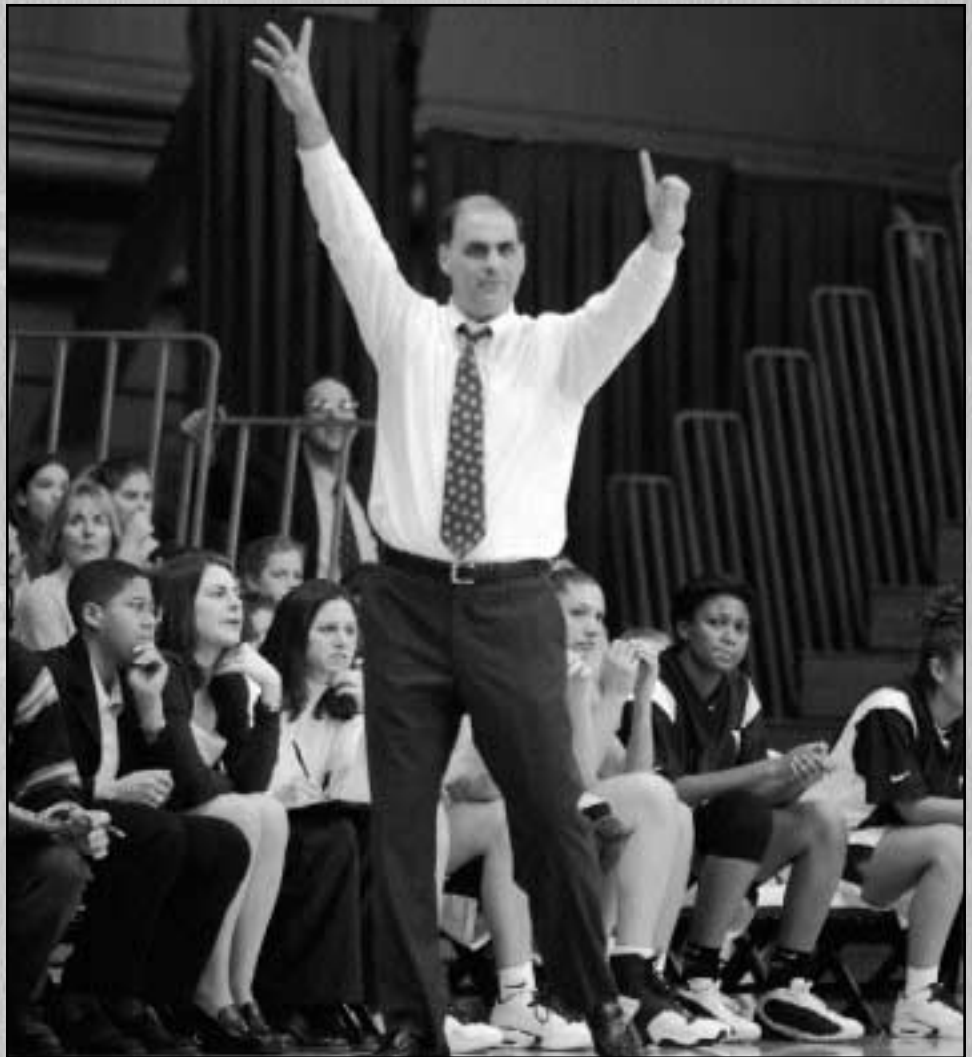

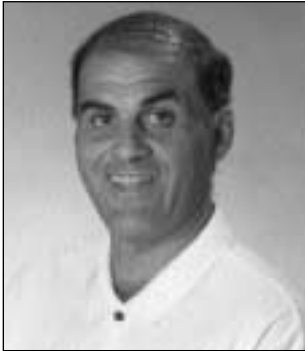

COACHING STAFF



HEAD COACH HARRY PERRETTA



After 24 years as head coach of the Villanova women's program, Harry Perretta has established himself as one of the most respected and knowledgeable coaches in the country. A true teacher both on and off the court, Perretta strives to have a positive influence on his student-athletes not only as basketball players, but also as people.

In his 24-year career on the Main Line, Perretta has tallied a career record of 437-256. His 437 wins place him 27th on the winningest active collegiate coaching list, and ranks him as the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women.

Last season, Perretta guided Villanova to its second-straight 20-win season and a second-consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA's, Villanova received the No. 9 seed in the west region where they defeated Pepperdine in the first round before losing to No. 1 seed Oklahoma in the second round. Under Perretta's tutelage last year, junior guard Trish Juhline became the first Wildcat since 1994-95 to be named first team All-Big East. Perretta also helped senior point guard Mimi Riley earn Big East Honorable Mention acclaim in 2001-02.

The 2000-01 season was a memorable one for Perretta, as he led his team to a 22-9 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament, where they advanced to the second round. In a 60-55 win over Temple on Dec. 2, 2000, Perretta won his 400th career game, and with the 61-45 victory over Providence on Feb. 24, 2001, Perretta became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women with career win number 414. For his efforts in 2000-01, Perretta was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Co-Coach of the Year, marking the third time in his career that he has won this award. Also that season, Perretta helped senior center Brandi Barnes earn third team All-Big East distinction and sophomore guard Trish Juhline garner Big East Honorable Mention acclaim. In the Philadelphia Big 5, freshman forward Courtney Mix was named Rookie of the Year.

In 1999-00, Perretta led an inexperienced and injury-riddled team to a 15-15 overall record and a berth in the WNIT where they lost to Michigan State in the first round. Also, that year, Perretta helped senior forward Jenea Skeeters earn second team All-Big East honors and freshman Trish Juhline gain Big East All-Rookie team honors.

Under Perretta's guidance in 1997-98, Jenny Higgins was named the Big East Conference Most Improved Player, in addition to earning third team all-conference acclaim, while Jenn Beisel garnered second team All-Big East distinction.

In 1995-96, Perretta led his team to a 21-7 record and added to his already impressive resume when he earned Big East Coach of the Year honors along with the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach-of-the-Year award. This was the second time in his career that Perretta garnered both of these awards. Over the past seven seasons, Perretta has guided the Wildcats to an 125-79 overall record and a 73-47 Big East Conference mark.

Already the winningest coach in Villanova women's basketball history, on Jan. 8, 1995 against the Georgetown Hoyas, Perretta earned his 300th career win at the age of 39. At the end of the 1994-95 season, he was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year. Despite claiming seven previous Big 5 championships, this was the first such award for Perretta from the Big 5.

The dean of the Big East and Big 5 coaches, Perretta has brought the Wildcats national respect and success during his tenure at Villanova. Always a crowd favorite wherever he goes, he is one of the most animated and vocal coaches in the country, continually instructing his players during the course of a game. Year-in and year-out, his teams are feared for their aggressive play, disciplined style, defensive prowess and pre-game preparations of an opponent.

A teacher of basketball, Perretta also realizes the importance of the overall college experience. He and his staff closely follow each player's academic progress, and in his 24 years at Villanova, every one of his student-athletes has

received her degree. Perretta is also a firm believer of using the basketball experience to teach his players lessons of life. Upon graduation, it is a sure bet that Perretta's players will leave Villanova as better basketball players, in addition to being prepared to be a success in whatever career avenue they choose.

During his career on the Main Line, he has led the Wildcats to national rankings in the Associated Press poll, Big East regular season and tournament championships in both 1985-86 and 1986-87, four outright and four shared Big 5 titles, and 11 20-win or better seasons. In addition, one of his players, Shelly Pennefather, was recognized in 1987 as the nation's top women's basketball player, winning the Margaret Wade Trophy and earning Kodak All-America honors.

"This program is something I feel is my own, my own personal project," stated Perretta. "When I got here, I didn't have much to start with. Yet, all the players we have brought in have graduated, we've had an All-American and gone to the Final Four (1982). The fact that we are considered one of the better

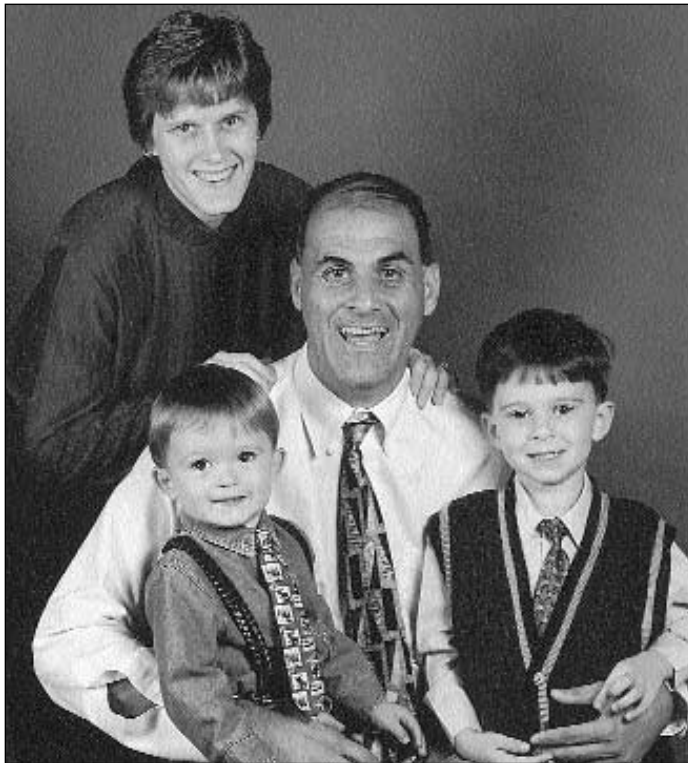
teams in the country over the last 24 years makes me proud. I can honestly say that I wouldn't want to coach anywhere but Villanova."

Perretta began his career on the Main Line in 1978 at the age of 21, the youngest coach ever to head a women's program at Villanova. In his first season, he led the 'Cats to a 17-8 record and was a finalist for the AIAW small college coach of the year. During his career, Perretta and the Wildcats have had many highlights, including reaching the Final Four of the AIAW in 1982. The 1982-83 season saw Villanova begin play in NCAA Division I and in the Big East Conference. Since joining the Big East in 1982, Perretta has compiled a 199-144 conference record.

"It is hard to believe that I have been at Villanova for 24 years. It seems like yesterday that I was just beginning my career here," said Perretta. "When I think back over the years, it is amazing to me how many special people I have come in contact with. I have been very fortunate to have some great people play for me here at Villanova. I consider myself lucky that I have been able to coach at one place my entire career."

Perretta attended Lycoming College after earning All-Catholic League honors at Monsignor Bonner High School in Upper Darby, Pa. His playing career was cut short, however, by an ankle injury during his freshman year at Lycoming. Perretta spent the remainder of his college years assisting Lycoming's varsity and junior varsity programs as a coach, and he also aided the women's program. He received his bachelor's degree in social studies and a secondary teaching certificate in 1978. In 1995, he earned his master's degree in Education from Villanova.

Perretta is married to the former Helen Koskinen and they are the parents of a 4-year-old son, Stephen William and a 2-year-old son, Michael Joseph. Together, they reside in Drexel Hill, Pa.

Returning for his seventh season on the Wildcat staff in 2002-03 is Associate Head Coach Joe Mullaney, Jr. During his first two years, Mullaney was an assistant coach before being elevated to associate head coach in 1998-99. Prior to arriving at Villanova, Mullaney was the head women's basketball coach at St. John's University for 12 seasons. During his tenure at St. John's, Mullaney compiled a 168-173 mark, including leading his 1987-88 team to the Big East Tournament championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Besides his on-court coaching duties and pre-game scouting of opponents, Mullaney is also Villanova's recruiting coordinator.

Before his tenure at St. John's, Mullaney was the head women's basketball coach at Providence College, where he guided the Lady Friars to a 66-27 mark from 1980-83.

Throughout his coaching career, Mullaney has recorded three 20 or more win seasons and in 1990-91 he was named the Big East Conference Coach of the Year.

Mullaney began his coaching career in 1978-79 when he served as the head boys basketball coach at Warwick Veterans Memorial High School in his hometown of Warwick, R.I. Following his one-year stint at the high school level, Mullaney became the assistant men's coach at Rhode Island College from 1979-80, before taking over the reigns of the Providence women's program.

He is a 1978 graduate of Providence College where he earned a bachelor of science degree in business administration. During his playing days, Mullaney participated in two NCAA Tournaments and the NIT semi-finals once.

Mullaney and his wife, Kathy, reside in Downingtown, Pa., with their four children, Meghan (22), Amie Beth (20), Patrick Joseph (15) and Sean Connor (11). His daughter, Meghan, graduated from Villanova in 2002, and Amie is currently a junior at Villanova.
