EVANSVILLE REPORT: The Aces have played three close games to start the season, with all three contests being decided by nine points or less. However, the team has lost all three matchups to Milwaukee (77-68), Samford (69-66) and Murray State (85-77).

The most recent game for Evansville was a road loss to Murray State. In the game, the Aces built a seven-point halftime lead on the strength of 59 percent (16-of-27) shooting in the first half, but could not recover from a 19-3 run by the Racers in less than four minutes midway through the second half. Evansville trailed 72-66 with 7:53 to play by the end of the run and never got closer than four points the rest of the way.

Sophomore forward Chelsea Falkenstein leads three players averaging in double figures for the Aces with 11.0 points per game and a team-best 6.0 rebounds per contest. She is shooting .440 (11-of-25) from the field on the young season and had made 4-of-8 three-pointers and 7-of-11 (.636) free throws. Freshman forward Samantha Heck has contributed 10.3 points and 5.0 rebounds per contest, while senior guard Amy Gallagher ranks third on the team with 10.0 points per game.

CHATTANOOGA REPORT: The Mocs are 1-3 entering the tournament this weekend, having defeated Austin Peay (76-66) while falling to East Tennessee State (85-61), No. 16 Georgia (74-57) and Kentucky (65-55).

Chattanooga has been outscored by an average of 10.2 points per game thus far and has averaged 20.5 turnovers per contest. On the other hand, the Mocs have a +2.8 rebounding margin over the competition and have both made and allowed 6.8 three-pointers per contest. The game against Georgia is the only home contest of the season thus far for Chattanooga.

Senior forward Shanara Hollinquest leads the team in both scoring and rebounding with 18.3 points per game and 9.3 rebounds per contest. She is shooting .531 (26-of-49) from the field and has made 21-of-29 (.724) three-pointers. Another player scoring in double figures is senior guard Jenaya Wade-Fray, who contributes 11.8 points per game and leads the team with nine three-pointers. Freshman guard Kayla Christopher leads the squad with 13 assists and is third in scoring with 8.0 points per contest. She and Hollinquest are tied for the team lead in steals with six.

KENNESAW STATE REPORT: All four games the Owls have played this season have come at home and the team is 2-2, with wins over Jacksonville State (66-51) and Longwood (72-61) in addition to losses to Georgia State (77-52) and Clemson (75-69).

On Tuesday night, Kennesaw State took on Clemson in its first-ever home game against an ACC opponent. The visiting Tigers led by as many as 11 points but the Owls cut the deficit to as few as two points in the closing minute of the contest. Clemson made four free throws in the final 24 seconds to seal the outcome.

Through the first four games of the season, Angie Smith and Gia Lockett have been the focal points of the Kennesaw State offense. Smith averages 16.5 points per game while Lockett scores 16.0 points per contest. The pair combines to score more than half their team's points, while Smith also has a team-high 3.5 assists per game. Meanwhile, Sametria Gideon (8.0 rpg.) and Montinique Nixon (7.3 rpg.) are the squad's top two rebounders. Both Gideon and Nixon have scored 6.8 points per game as well.

Now in his 32nd year as head coach of the Villanova women's basketball program, Harry Perretta has established himself as one of the most respected and knowledgeable coaches in the country. A true teacher both on and off the court, Perretta strives to have a positive influence on his student-athletes not only as basketball players, but also as people.

In his 32-year Villanova career, Perretta has tallied a career record of 574-344. His 574 wins place him 21st on the winningest active collegiate coaching list, and ranks him as the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basket-

ball for both men and women. Since the beginning of the 2000-01 season Perretta has compiled an impressive 166-99 record.

During the 2008-09 season, Perretta led the Wildcats to the NCAA Tournament for the ninth time in his Villanova career. This marks the ninth postseason appearance in the last 10 years for the Wildcats. After playing in the 2000 WNIT, Villanova went to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments from 2001-2004 before playing in the WNIT in 2005, 2006 and 2008. Picked to finish 10th in the pre-season Big East Conference coaches poll, the Wildcats tallied a 10-6 league mark and finished tied for fourth in the conference standings. For his efforts last year, Perretta was named the Big East Conference Co-Coach of the Year. This is the third time in his career that he has garnered Big East Coach of the Year distinction.

Under Perretta's tutelage last season, senior forward Laura Kurz was a unanimous first team All-Big East selection, in addition to being named the Big East Co-Most Improved Player. Kurz finished her senior campaign averaging 17.4 points per game and 7.2 rebounds per contest. She was also named the Philadelphia Big Five Player of the Year.

Perretta registered his 14th career 20-win season in 2005-06 by leading the Wildcats to a 21-11 record. This was the fifth time in six years that Perretta led his team to a 20-win campaign. Also, in 2005-06, Perretta coached senior forward Liad Suez-Karni to first team All-Big East accolades.

In 2004-05, Perretta became the 26th Division I women's basketball head coach to win 500 games when the Wildcats defeated Pittsburgh, 70-49, on February 2. Villanova finished the season with a 19-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason with a WNIT berth.

One year earlier in 2003-04, Perretta led his team to a fourth-straight 20-win campaign and a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth where the Wildcats advanced to the second round. Perretta also coached his squad to a second-straight Philadelphia Big Five title in 2003-04. For his efforts, he was named Big Five Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

The 2002-03 season was a special one for Perretta and the Wildcats. In addition to an impressive 28-6 overall record and a 12-4 Big East Conference mark, Perretta led the Wildcats to their third Big East Conference Tournament championship and first since 1987 with an improbable 52-48 upset over previously unbeaten Connecticut. The win snapped Connecticut's NCAA Division I women's basketball record of 70-straight victories and ended Connecticut's streak of nine-straight conference tournament championships.

The 28 wins recorded in 2002-03 is the second most victories in school history. Villanova was rewarded for its season by earning a No. 2 seed in the 2002-03 NCAA Tournament which is the highest seed ever for a Philadelphia area women's basketball team. In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats recorded wins over St. Francis (Pa.), George Washington

and Colorado and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in the program's history. Also, during the 2002-03 season, Villanova went 4-0 in the Philadelphia Big Five to capture the City Series championship and he was named the Big Five Coach of the Year. Under Perretta's guidance, senior guard Trish Juhline led the Big East in scoring and garnered first team All-Big East acclaim for the second-straight year, while senior forward Katie Davis was named second team All-Big East and junior guard/forward Courtney Mix was a Big East Honorable Mention Team selection. In addition, Juhline was named the Big East Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

In 2001-02, Perretta guided Villanova to a 20-11 mark and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA's, Villanova received the No. 9 seed in the west region where they defeated Pepperdine in the first round before losing to No. 1 seed Oklahoma in the second round. Perretta helped Juhline become the first Wildcat since 1994-95 to be named first team All-Big East. Perretta was also instrumental in helping senior point guard Mimi Riley earn Big East Honorable Mention acclaim in 2001-02.

The 2000-01 season was a memorable one for Perretta, as he led his team to a 22-9 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the second round. In a 60-55 win over Temple on Dec. 2, 2000, Perretta won his 400th career game and with the 61-45 victory over Providence on Feb. 24, 2001, he became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women with career win number 414. For his efforts in 2000-01, Perretta was named the Philadelphia Big Five Co-Coach of the Year. Also that season, Perretta coached senior center Brandi Barnes to third team All-Big East distinction and Juhline garnered Big East Honorable Mention acclaim. In the Philadelphia Big Five, Mix was named Rookie of the Year.

In 1995-96, Perretta led his team to a 21-7 record and added to his already impressive resume when he earned Big East Coach of the Year honors along with the Philadelphia Big Five Coach-of-the-Year award. Already the winningest coach in Villanova women's basketball history, on January 8, 1995 against the Georgetown Hoyas, Perretta earned his 300th career win at the age of 39.

The dean of the Big East and Big 5 coaches, Perretta has brought the Wildcats national respect and success during his tenure at Villanova. Always a crowd favorite wherever he goes, he is one of the most animated and vocal coaches in the country, continually instructing his players during the course of a game. Year-in and year-out, his teams are feared for their aggressive play, disciplined style, defensive prowess and pre-game preparations of an opponent.

A teacher of basketball, Perretta also realizes the importance of the overall college experience. He and his staff follow closely each player's academic progress, and in his 32 years at Villanova, 99 percent of the student-athletes who has stayed all four years has received her degree. Perretta is also a firm believer of using the basketball experience to teach his players lessons on life. Upon graduation, it is a sure bet that Perretta's players will leave Villanova as better basketball players, in addition to being prepared to be a success in whatever career avenue they choose.

During his career on the Main Line, he has led the Wildcats to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, national rankings in the Associated Press poll, Big East regular season and tournament championships in both 1985-86 and 1986-87, the 2003 Big East Tournament title, seven outright and four shared Big 5 titles, and fourteen 20-win or better seasons. In addition, one of his players, Shelly Pennefather, was recognized in 1987 as the nation's top women's basketball player, winning the Margaret Wade Trophy and earning Kodak All-America honors.

"This program is something I feel is my own, my own personal project," stated Perretta. "When I got here, there wasn't much to start with. Yet, all the players we have brought in have graduated, we've had All-Americans and gone to the Final Four (1982). The fact that we are considered one of the better teams in the country over the last 32 years makes me proud. I can honestly say that I wouldn't want to coach anywhere but Villanova."

Perretta began his career on the Main Line in 1978 at the age of 22, the youngest coach ever to head a women's program at Villanova. In his first season, he led the 'Cats to a 17-8 record and was a finalist for the AIAW small college coach of the year. During his career, Perretta and the Wildcats have had many highlights, including reaching the Final Four of the AIAW in 1982. The 1982-83 season saw Villanova begin play in NCAA Division I and in the Big East Conference. Since joining the Big East in 1982, Perretta has compiled a 197-162 conference record.

Perretta attended Lycoming College after earning All-Catholic League honors at Monsignor Bonner High School in Upper Darby, Pa. His playing career was cut short, however, by an ankle injury during his freshman year at Lycoming. Perretta spent the remainder of his college years assisting Lycoming's varsity and junior varsity programs as a coach, and he also aided the women's program. He received his bachelor's degree in social studies and a secondary teaching certificate in 1978. In 1995, he earned his Master's Degree in Education from Villanova.

Perretta is married to the former Helen Koskinen and they are the parents of an 11-year old son, Stephen William and a nine-year old son Michael John. Together, they reside in Drexel Hill, Pa.

2009-10 SEASON PREVIEW

Villanova will be looking to build off the momentum of last season when the Wildcats went 19-14 overall, finished tied for fourth in the Big East Conference with a 10-6 mark and earned an at large bid to the NCAA Tournament. To have success in 2009-10, Villanova will need to replace three of its top four scorers who accounted for 57.2 percent of the team's scoring from a year ago. The Wildcats will look to their seven returning letterwinners to lead the way this season.

FORWARDS

The Wildcats have the unenviable task of trying to replace two 1,000 point scorers at the forward spots as Laura Kurz and Lisa Karcic have both been lost to graduation. Both Kurz and Karcic are currently playing professionally in Greece. Kurz turned in an outstanding senior season last year for Villanova. She averaged a team-best 17.4 points per game, a team-high 7.2 rebounds per contest, a team-best 45.2 percent shooting from the floor, in addition to recording a team-high 42 blocked shots. Kurz also ranked third on the team in three-point field goals with 44 and she became just the second player in program history to score 1,000 points in just two seasons. For her efforts last year, Kurz was a unanimous first team All-Big East performer. She was also named the Philadelphia Big Five Player of the Year.

Karcic finished her Wildcat career ranked 20th all time in scoring with 1,031 points. As a senior last year, she averaged 6.5 points per game and 4.9 rebounds per contest and she finished second on the team in three-point field goals made with 45. Karcic ended her Main Line career with 190 made three-point field goals.

"We were hit hard at the forward position by graduation," said Wildcat head coach Harry Perretta. "Laura was such a great offensive player. She could score in so many ways and because of this we had a lot of options available to us on the offensive end of the floor. Lisa was a perfect mismatch player. Due to her three-point shooting ability we would play her at center and force the other team's post player to guard her on the perimeter. We will look to Amanda to be a leader at the forward spot this year. She will need to use her knowledge of the system to help the younger kids as they try and gain experience."

Villanova will look to a junior and three redshirt freshmen to fill the void at forward. Junior **Amanda Swiezynski (6-0, Exeter, N.H.)** showed good improvement late last season and looks ready for significant minutes this season. An intelligent player with great passing skills, Swiezynski has the ability to step outside and shoot the three-ball.

The redshirt freshmen trio of **Megan Pearson (6-0, West Chester, Pa.)**, **Laura Sweeney (6-2, Marlton, N.J.)** and **Emily Suhey (6-1, Boalsburg, Pa.)** will all be in the mix for playing time at the forward spots. Pearson is an outstanding three-point shooter who has great basketball instincts. Sweeney is a highly skilled performer who can score inside and outside, while Suhey is a tireless worker with a good feel for the game.

GUARDS

The position where Villanova has the most experience is at guard, as the Wildcats return three of their top four backcourt performers from a year ago, including **Maria Getty (5-9, Centerville, Ohio)**, **Kyle Dougherty**

(5-10, Sayre, Pa.) and **Tia Grant (5-11, Lido Beach, N.Y.)**. All three are fifth year seniors who bring a wealth of game experience to the young Wildcats. Villanova's top guard entering 2009-10 appears to be Getty. She has started 94 of the 95 games she has played in during her career. Last year, Getty led the team in three-point field goals made with 50 and she ranked second on the team in scoring at 8.3 points per game. She also finished second on the team in both assists with 65 and steals with 27.

Dougherty is a skilled player with good passing skills. She started 27 of the final 28 games at the point last year and looks to be the leading candidate to earn the starting point guard spot this season. Dougherty is a very accurate mid range jump shooter. Grant is one of the team's best all-around athletes. Her combination of size and quickness allows her to play the two-guard and small forward positions. Last season, she averaged 4.9 points per game and was one of the team's top three-point shooters connecting on 33-of-82 for 40.2 percent from long range.

Sophomore **Sara Jones (5-9, Philadelphia, Pa.)** will also be in the mix in the Wildcat backcourt rotation. Jones is a physical guard who has natural basketball instincts. She played in 25 games a season ago and should use the experience she gained to earn more minutes this year.

Villanova also has three incoming freshmen who will compete for playing time in the backcourt. The three include **Jesse Carey (5-10, Chalfont, Pa.)**, **Devon Kane (5-9, Springfield, Pa.)** and **Rachel Roberts (5-9, Marlborough, Conn.)**.

"The guard spot is without a doubt our most experienced position," said Perretta. "Maria, Tia and Kyle are all fifth-year seniors who know what it takes to play in the Big East on a nightly basis. We are going to rely on these three to be the foundation of the team this year. I am confident that they will have very good senior seasons."

CENTER

The center position will be held by the junior tandem of **Heather Scanlon (6-3, Drexel Hill, Pa.)** and **Shannon Elliott (6-2, Wilmington, Del.)**. Scanlon will provide the Wildcats with versatility at the center position. In addition to possessing strong post moves, Scanlon also has the ability to step outside and shoot the three-point shot. She also has a very high basketball IQ and is one of the team's top defenders. As a sophomore last year, she averaged 5.3 points per game and 3.5 rebounds per contest and she shot 42.3 percent from the floor.

Elliott started 24 of 32 games last year. She is an active player who plays hard all the time. A good rebounder, she also has shooting range that extends to the three-point line.

"I think we are in good shape at the center spot," stated Perretta. "Heather and Shannon give us a good two player rotation. Heather has a good feel for the game and is one of our best defensive players. Shannon always plays with a lot of energy and she is very active on the backboards. I also like the fact that both players can step outside and shoot the three."

SCHEDULE

Villanova play a 29-game schedule in 2009-10, including 16 Big East Conference contests and four Philadelphia Big Five match-ups.

The 2009-10 campaign tips-off on Monday, Nov. 16, with a road contest at Sacred Heart. Villanova returns two days later on Nov. 18 for its home opener against Big Five foe Penn. The Wildcats will also play at Massachusetts on Nov. 22. Villanova will spend its Thanksgiving holiday at the University of Tennessee Chattanooga Tournament. Evansville will be the team's first round opponent. Kennesaw State and host Tennessee Chattanooga round out the tournament field.

December begins on the road at Lehigh (Dec. 5) before the Wildcats return to the Main Line for back-to-back home games against Saint Joseph's (Dec. 9) and Binghamton (Dec. 11). Villanova will play two Big Five road contests in three days before the Christmas holiday. The 'Cats are at Temple on Dec. 20 and at La Salle on Dec. 22.

Villanova will host the Wildcat Holiday Classic on Dec. 28 and Dec. 29. The first round pairings include Villanova versus San Francisco and Drexel versus Loyola (Md.). Villanova's last non conference game will be played on Jan. 21 when the Wildcats host George Washington.

In Big East play, Villanova will play each conference opponent once with the exception of Providence who the Wildcats will play home and home. Villanova will host Seton Hall, Georgetown, Syracuse, Pittsburgh, Providence, Marquette, Connecticut and Rutgers. The Wildcats will play at Notre Dame, Cincinnati, DePaul, St. John's, South Florida, West Virginia, Louisville and Providence.

LAST TIME OUT: Villanova suffered its first loss of the season on Sunday afternoon, 55-47, on the road at Massachusetts. The game was close throughout, but the Wildcats missed six of their last seven shots from the field and the Minutewomen hit seven free throws in the final 45 seconds to seal the outcome. After a burst of three-point shooting helped Villanova to take a 24-16 lead with 7:56 left in the first half, the Wildcats struggled to make shots the rest of the way and fell behind for good with 6:26 remaining in the second period. Senior guard **Tia Grant**, junior center **Heather Scanlon** and redshirt freshman forward **Laura Sweeney** all scored 12 points in the game. Scanlon pulled down a team-high nine rebounds and Sweeney had eight boards but Villanova wound up making just 9-of-38 three-pointers (.237) in the game after a 6-of-13 (.462) start from downtown in the first half. The Wildcats shot .283 (17-of-60) from the field overall and were 4-of-4 at the foul line.

ROAD WARRIORS: Villanova is in the midst of playing five of its first six games of the season away from home. After playing in this weekend's tournament in Chattanooga, the Wildcats have a road game next Saturday (Dec. 5) at Lehigh before finally returning home for two home games in three days on Dec. 9 and Dec. 11. After that, it's back on the road for two more games, as Villanova will end up playing in the friendly confines of The Pavilion just three times in its first 10 outings of the 2009-10 campaign.

TOURNAMENT TIME: It has been customary over the years for Villanova to play in a tournament during the Thanksgiving weekend, and it is not hard to see why the Wildcats prefer such a schedule. Villanova has won seven of the last 10 Thanksgiving tournaments it has participated in, with the most recent title coming in 2007 at the Odwalla Classic hosted by the University of San Francisco. The program has an all-time record of 64-33 (.660) in regular season tournament action. Below is a list of the seven tournaments the Wildcats have won over the last decade.

MAKING INTRODUCTIONS: Villanova has never faced two of the three other teams that are taking part in this weekend's Double Tree Classic. The one team that the Wildcats have played against is host Chattanooga, which defeated Villanova in the first round of the 2005 WNIT by a 50-40 score at McKenzie Arena. The Wildcats have never faced Evansville or Kennesaw State.

HOT AND COLD: In its 55-47 loss to Massachusetts last Sunday afternoon, Villanova experienced feast and famine from behind the three-point line. The Wildcats made six of their first 13 shots from beyond the arc and used that accuracy to establish an eight-point lead (24-16) with 7:56 left in the opening period. That was where the strong shooting touch ended, however, as Villanova went just 3-of-25 (.120) from long distance the rest of the game and finished 9-of-38 (.237) overall from three-point range in the game. The Wildcats scored one fewer point (23) in the last 32:04 of the contest than they did in the first 7:56 while establishing their largest lead of the game.

DEFENSIVE DUELS: Offense has been hard to come by for both Villanova and its opposition in the first three games. The Wildcats are only scoring 47.0 points per game thus far in 2009-10, though they have held other teams to just 44.0 points per contest. In its home opener, Villanova defeated Penn by a 44-28 score in the lowest-scoring Wildcat game (combined points) in more than 30 years.

REBOUND REWIND: Junior center **Heather Scanlon** has pulled down a team-high nine rebounds in each of the last two games and leads the Wildcats so far this season with 6.3 rebounds per game for the year. Scanlon is one of three Villanova players averaging at least 4.0 rebounds per game on the young season. Redshirt freshman forwards **Laura Sweeney** (5.7 rpg.) and **Megan Pearson** (4.3 rpg.) are the others.

THREE AT A TIME: Senior guard **Kyle Dougherty** spent time this past summer working on her three-point shot, and the results showed in the last game against UMass. Dougherty scored a season-high nine points against the Minutewomen, all of which came on three 3-pointers. Those were the first shots Dougherty has made from long distance in her Villanova career. Another Wildcat who scored all her points on three-pointers against Massachusetts was senior guard **Tia Grant**, who tied for the team lead with 12 points. Grant hit 4-of-11 from behind the arc in the game and has a team-high seven triples through the first three games of the year.

HARD WORKERS: The trio of senior guards **Maria Getty** and **Tia Grant** and junior forward **Amanda Swiezynski** have spent very little time on the bench so far this season. Each player is averaging more than 30 minutes per contest, with Getty leading the way at 36.0 minutes per game. Swiezynski has played 32.3 minutes per outing and Grant is on the floor for an average of 31.7 minutes per contest. All three players have started every game this season and together account for 42 percent of the team's scoring and 67 percent of the team's assists.

PLENTY OF OPTIONS: A trend that bears watching for the Wildcats this season is the team's ability to run its offense through just about any of the players on the roster. In the first three games of the season, Villanova has five different players averaging 6.3 points per contest, even though the team itself is only scoring 47.0 points per game. The scoring load is even more balanced among the team's top three scorers. Redshirt freshman forward **Laura Sweeney** has a team-high 27 points, while senior guards **Maria Getty** and **Tia Grant** each have 26 points.

GRAND LARCENY: Villanova has played very strong defensively so far this year. The team has tallied 30 steals in just three games and had 13 steals in each of its first two games of the season. The 10.0 steals per game the team is averaging is nearly double the rate the Wildcats came up with steals at last season. In 2008-09, Villanova tallied 168 steals in 33 games for an average of 5.1 swipes per contest. Redshirt freshman forward **Laura Sweeney** has a team-high eight steals -- including at least two in all three of her games -- while senior guard **Maria Getty** is second with six takeaways. Junior center **Heather Scanlon** and redshirt freshman forward **Megan Pearson** have five steals apiece.

THE THREE POINT STORY: In recent years, Villanova has been known for its three-point shooting prowess. If the first three games are any indication, it looks as if the Wildcats will be firing from behind the arc again this season. After three games, the Wildcats are 26-of-94 (27.7%) from three-point range. Villanova attempted a season-high 38 triples in a loss at Massachusetts last Sunday. That total represented the most attempts from long distance for the team since the Wildcats took a school-record 44 three-pointers against La Salle in the 2008-09 season opener. So far this season, Villanova has attempted 94 shots from three-point range and 69 from inside the arc.

BIG ADVANTAGE: Not only do the Wildcats usually make a high number of three-pointers of their own, but they also do an effective job preventing three-pointers by the opposition. So far this season, Villanova has outscored its opponents by a 78-21 margin from three-point range. The Wildcats are limiting other teams to just .219 accuracy (7-of-32) from long distance

EXPERIENCED BACKCOURT: Villanova has three fifth-year seniors on the roster and all three are backcourt players. The three include **Maria Getty**, **Tia Grant**, and **Kyle Dougherty**. All three of these fifth-year seniors are starters. Last season, Getty averaged 8.3 ppg., Grant averaged 4.9 ppg., and Dougherty averaged 1.6 ppg. In a 44-28 win over Penn in the team's home opener last week, Getty led the Wildcats with 15 points (6-of-13 shooting / 3-of-6 three-pointers) to go along with four assists and her second straight game with three steals.

TRADING RED FOR THE BLUE AND WHITE: Three Villanova players will become active this season after redshirting last year as true freshmen. The three include **Megan Pearson**, **Laura Sweeney** and **Emily Suhey**. Pearson was a standout at nearby Archbishop Carroll High School where she earned first team All-Catholic League honors as both a junior and a senior. She was also a first team All-State performer as a senior. Sweeney attended Cherokee High School in Marlton, N.J. A first team All-State selection, Sweeney scored 2,037 career points and grabbed 1,285 career rebounds. Suhey is a native of Boalsburg, Pa., where she attended State College High School. A second team All-State honoree as a senior, Suhey is the second all-time leading scorer at her high school with over 1,500 career points.

BIG EAST PREDICTED ORDER OF FINISH: At the annual BIG EAST Women's Basketball Media Day at ESPN Zone this morning, the results of the Preseason Coaches' Poll were released, with Villanova being chosen to finish 13th in the BIG EAST standings in the regular season. The Wildcats received 78 points in the poll.

Villanova is coming off a 2008-09 season in which it finished 19-14 overall and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats went 10-6 in regular season BIG EAST play last year and finished in fourth place in the regular season conference standings. The results of the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches Poll are below.
