PROVIDENCE REPORT: Entering tonight's regular season finale, the Friars have lost four straight games and 11 of their last 12 outings. Providence would need a win tonight in order to still have a chance at clinching the final spot in the BIG EAST Tournament. The Friars are 13-15 overall this season and have a 3-12 record in conference play.

In its final home game of the season on Saturday, Providence was defeated 73-66 by Georgetown. The Hoyas shot 68 percent in the first half – making 6-of-7 three-pointers in the process – and built a 10-point lead at the intermission. Senior forward Shauna Snyder hit five three-pointers of her own and scored a game-high 25 points to lead the Friars. Sophomore guard Chelsea Marandola added 12 points as four different players scored in double figures for Providence.

Marandola and Snyder have been the most consistent scoring options for the Friars this season. Marandola leads the squad with 17.5 points per game and 7.2 rebounds per contest. She shoots 50 percent from the field and 90 percent from the foul line. Snyder ranks second on the team with a 13.2 scoring average.

For the season, Providence is averaging 65.6 points per game and allowing 69.4 points to the opposition. The Friars have a -5.6 rebound margin, shoot .412 from the field, .303 from three-point range and .689 from the foul line.

FRIAR HEAD COACH PHIL SEYMOUR: In his second season as head coach at Providence, Phil Seymore has shown that he has the program moving in the right direction. He guided his inaugural team in 2005-06 to a 7.5-game improvement over the previous year. This season, the Friars won their first six games of the year and stood at 12-4 midway through the season.

Seymore was previously an assistant coach with the Providence men's basketball team before taking over the reigns of the women's program. During his tenure with the men's squad, the Friars made the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and 2004. Seymore was also an assistant coach for three seasons at Richmond.

A graduate of Canisius College, Seymore began his career as a graduate assistant coach after averaging 16.8 points and 4.6 assists per game in two years as the team's starting point guard.

Entering tonight's game, Seymore has a career record of 21-34 in his second season at Providence.

After 28 years as head coach of the Villanova women's basketball program, Harry Perretta has established himself as one of the most respected and knowledgeable coaches in the country. A true teacher both on and off the court, Perretta strives to have a positive influence on his student-athletes not only as basketball players, but also as people.

In his 29-year Villanova career, Perretta has tallied a career record of 535-313. His 535 wins place him 21st on the winningest active collegiate coaching list, and ranks him as the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women. Over the past six seasons Perretta has compiled an impressive 134-57 record.

Perretta registered his 14th career 20-win season in 2005-06 by leading the Wildcats to a 21-11 record. This was the fifth time in the last six years that Perretta led his team to a 20-win campaign. Villanova earned a WNIT berth, giving the Wildcats their seventh-straight postseason appearance. After playing in the 2000 WNIT, Villanova went to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments from 2001-2004 before playing in the WNIT the last two seasons. Also, in 2005-06, Perretta coached senior forward Liad Suez-Karni to first team All-Big East accolades.

In 2004-05, Perretta became the 26th Division I women's basketball head coach to win 500 games when the Wildcats defeated Pittsburgh, 70-49, on February 2. Villanova finished the season with a 19-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason for the sixth-straight season with a WNIT berth.

One year earlier, Perretta led his team to a fourth-straight 20-win campaign and a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth where the Wildcats advanced to the second round. Perretta also coached his squad to a second-straight Philadelphia Big Five title in 2003-04. For his efforts, he was named Big Five Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

The 2002-03 season was a special one for Perretta and the Wildcats. In addition to an impressive 28-6 overall record and a 12-4 Big East Conference mark, Perretta led the Wildcats to their third Big East Conference Tournament championship and first since 1987 with an improbable 52-48 upset over previously unbeaten Connecticut. The win snapped Connecticut's NCAA Division I women's basketball record of 70-straight victories and ended Connecticut's streak of nine-straight conference tournament championships.

The 28 wins recorded in 2002-03 is the second most victories in school history. Villanova was rewarded for its season by earning a No. 2 seed in the 2002-03 NCAA Tournament which is the highest seed ever for a Philadelphia area women's basketball team. In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats recorded wins over St. Francis (Pa.), George Washington and Colorado and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in the program's history. Also, during the 2002-03 season, Villanova went 4-0 in the Philadelphia Big Five to capture the City Series championship and he was named the Big Five Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career. Under Perretta's guidance, senior guard Trish Juhline led the Big East in scoring and garnered first team All-Big East acclaim for the second-straight year, while senior forward Katie Davis was named second team All-Big East and junior guard/forward Courtney Mix was a Big East Honorable Mention Team selection. In addition, Juhline was named the Big East Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

In 2001-02, Perretta guided Villanova to a 20-11 mark and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA's, Villanova received the No. 9 seed in the west region where they defeated Pepperdine in the first round before losing to No. 1 seed Oklahoma in the second round. Under Perretta's tutelage, junior guard Trish Juhline became the first Wildcat since 1994-95 to be named first team All-Big East. Perretta also helped senior point guard Mimi Riley earn Big East Honorable Mention acclaim in 2001-02.

The 2000-01 season was a memorable one for Perretta, as he led his team to a 22-9 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the second round. In a 60-55 win over Temple on Dec. 2, 2000, Perretta won his 400th career game and with the 61-45 victory over Providence on Feb. 24, 2001, He became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women with career win number 414. For his efforts in 2000-01, Perretta was named the Philadelphia Big Five Co-Coach of the Year. Also that season, Perretta helped senior center Brandi Barnes earn third team All-Big East distinction and sophomore guard Trish Juhline garner Big East Honorable Mention acclaim. In the Philadelphia Big Five, freshman forward Courtney Mix was named

Rookie of the Year.

In 1995-96, Perretta led his team to a 21-7 record and added to his already impressive resume when he earned Big East Coach of the Year honors along with the Philadelphia Big Five Coach-of-the-Year award. Already the winningest coach in Villanova women's basketball history, on January 8, 1995 against the Georgetown Hoyas, Perretta earned his 300th career win at the age of 39. At the end of the 1994-95 season, he was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year.

The dean of the Big East and Big 5 coaches, Perretta has brought the Wildcats national respect and success during his tenure at Villanova. Always a crowd favorite wherever he goes, he is one of the most animated and vocal coaches in the country, continually instructing his players during the course of a game. Year-in and year-out, his teams are feared for their aggressive play, disciplined style, defensive prowess and pre-game preparations of an opponent.

A teacher of basketball, Perretta also realizes the importance of the overall college experience. He and his staff follow closely each player's academic progress, and in his 28 years at Villanova, 99 percent of the student-athletes who has stayed all four years has received her degree. Perretta is also a firm believer of using the basketball experience to teach his players lessons on life. Upon graduation, it is a sure bet that Perretta's players will leave Villanova as better basketball players and, in addition to being prepared to be a success in whatever career avenue they choose.

During his career on the Main Line, he has led the Wildcats to eight NCAA Tournament appearances, national rankings in the Associated Press poll, Big East regular season and tournament championships in both 1985-86 and 1986-87, the 2003 Big East Tournament title, seven outright and four shared Big 5 titles, and fourteen 20-win or better seasons. In addition, one of his players, Shelly Pennefather, was recognized in 1987 as the nation's top women's basketball player, winning the Margaret Wade Trophy and earning Kodak All-America honors.

"This program is something I feel is my own, my own personal project," stated Perretta. "When I got here, there wasn't much to start with. Yet, all the players we have brought in have graduated, we've had an All-American and gone to the Final Four (1982). The fact that we are considered one of the better teams in the country over the last 28 years makes me proud. I can honestly say that I wouldn't want to coach anywhere but Villanova."

Perretta began his career on the Main Line in 1978 at the age of 21, the youngest coach ever to head a women's program at Villanova. In his first season, he led the 'Cats to a 17-8 record and was a finalist for the AIAW small college coach of the year. During his career, Perretta and the Wildcats have had many highlights, including reaching the Final Four of the AIAW in 1982. The 1982-83 season saw Villanova begin play in NCAA Division I and in the Big East Conference. Since joining the Big East in 1982, Perretta has compiled a 190-137 conference record.

"It is hard to believe that I have been at Villanova for 28 years. It seems like yesterday that I was just beginning my career here," said Perretta. "When I think back over the years, it is amazing to me how many special people I have come in contact with. I have been very fortunate to have some great people play for me here at Villanova. I consider myself lucky that I have been able to coach at one place my entire career."

Perretta attended Lycoming College after earning All-Catholic League honors at Monsignor Bonner High School in Upper Darby, Pa. His playing career was cut short, however, by an ankle injury during his freshman year at Lycoming. Perretta spent the remainder of his college years assisting Lycoming's varsity and junior varsity programs as a coach, and he also aided the women's program. He received his bachelor's degree in social studies and a secondary teaching certificate in 1978. In 1995, he earned his Master's Degree in Education from Villanova.

Perretta is married to the former Helen Koskinen and they are the parents of a seven-year old son, Stephen William and a five-year old son Michael John. Together, they reside in Drexel Hill, Pa.

2006-07 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Villanova is coming off a 92-49 loss at No. 3 Connecticut. The Huskies scored the first six points of the game en route to a 17-5 advantage. Connecticut would go to halftime with a commanding 45-17 lead. The Wildcats scored the first six points of the second stanza, before the Huskies used a 16-0 run to lead 61-23 with 14:47 to play. In the loss, Villanova was led by junior **Stacie Witman** and sophomore **Lisa Karcic** who had 17 points each. Witman added a career-high four assists, while Karcic tallied five rebounds and two blocks. Connecticut was paced by freshman center Tina Charles who had 21 points and 13 rebounds and junior guard Mel Thomas who had 16 points. For the game, Villanova shot 32.1 percent from the floor (18-of-56), 28.2 percent from three-point range (11-for-39) and 50.0 percent from the foul line (2-of-4), while the Huskies made 36-of-70 from the field (51.4%), 4-of-9 from three-point range (44.4%) and 16-of-21 from the charity stripe (76.2%). Connecticut dominated the backboards, out-rebounding the Wildcats by a 53-24 margin. Connecticut had six turnovers, while the Wildcats had 14 turnovers.

SEASON FINALE: Due to Villanova not qualifying for the Big East Tournament, Monday night's contest with Providence will be the final game of the 2006-07 season. The top 12 teams in the Big East make the Big East Tournament with the bottom four teams in the standings being left out.

FRIARS STILL ALIVE: Monday is the final night of competition in the 2006-07 Big East regular season schedule. Entering play Monday night, there are four teams still alive to make the Big East Tournament which starts on Saturday, March 3 in Hartford, Conn. One of the teams still alive is Providence, the team Villanova will host on Monday evening. To earn a spot in the conference tournament, Providence needs to beat Villanova and hope that St. John's loses at home to Marquette and Georgetown loses at home to Pittsburgh. St. John's is the only team that controls its own destiny. If the Red Storm defeat Marquette, they will earn the 12th and final spot in the Big East Tournament regardless what the other teams do.

SENIORS SAY GOOD-BYE: Two Villanova seniors will play their final collegiate game on Monday, Feb. 26 versus Providence. Fifth-year senior **Jackie Adamshick** and four-year senior **Clarisse Garcia** will end their career at The Pavilion on Monday night. A walk-on, Garcia appeared in 12 games during her Wildcats career. She will graduate in May with a Communications degree. Adamshick has started 88 of 120 career games and has tallied 1,357 points (7th all-time in school history) 694 rebounds (7th all-time in school history), 160 assists and 64 steals. She graduated last May with a Finance degree and is currently pursuing her MBA at Villanova.

PROVIDENCE SUCCESS: Entering play on Monday night, Villanova has defeated Providence six consecutive times and in eight of the last nine meetings. The Friars last win in the series came with a 62-49 win on Jan. 9, 2002.

END OF THE ROAD: Villanova finished the 2006-07 Big East road schedule with an 0-8 mark. The Wildcats were also 3-11 in overall away games.

OFF TARGET: In the last four games, Villanova has shot poorly from three-point range. In losses to ND, Rutgers, Cincinnati and Connecticut, the 'Cats have made just 28-of-122 (22.9%) from behind the arc. Villanova did make 11 three-point field goals in Saturday's loss to Connecticut, but the Wildcats needed 39 attempts to make the 11 three-point field goals.

UNLUCKY 13: Entering play versus Providence on Monday, Feb. 26, the Villanova Wildcats are riding a 13-game losing streak. This losing streak is the longest in the program's history. The previous longest streak was eight consecutive losses during the 1989-90 season. The Wildcats last win came in a 70-64 double overtime victory against West Virginia on Jan. 6.

SEASON OF STRUGGLES: The 1-14 Big East record for the Wildcats is the worst conference mark since the 1989-90 squad was also 1-14 after 15 league games. That year, the team started 0-7 before winning its first conference contest, and then lost eight straight Big East games to finish 1-15 in the league.

DOUBLE FIGURE SCORER: Junior forward **Stacie Witman** has scored in double figures in eight consecutive games (15 vs. Louisville, 18 vs. Georgetown, 11 vs. Pitt, 26 vs. Seton Hall, 16 vs. Notre Dame, 14 vs. Rutgers, 12 vs. Cincinnati and 17 vs. UConn). Over the last 10 games, Witman has averaged 15.9 points per contest. Witman has played in 18 games this season and is averaging 12.6 points per game and 5.3 rebounds per contest. In just Big East Conference games, she leads the Wildcats in scoring with a 14.3 points per game average. Witman missed 10 games in November and December due to a stress fracture in her lower left fibula.

TRIPLE THREAT: Entering play against Providence on Feb. 26, Villanova has outscored its opponents by a 654-267 margin from three-point range. The Wildcats are currently 218-of-676 (32.2%) from three-point range, while their opponents are 89-of-307 (29.0%) from long distance. **Lisa Karcic** leads the team in three-point field goals with 55.

AMONG THE BEST: Villanova averages 7.7 three-point field goals made per game this season, a figure that ranks as ninth best in the nation among 310 Division I programs. The Wildcats are second in the BIG EAST to the 8.0 three-pointers made per contest by DePaul.

THE GOOD HANDS PEOPLE: In the most recent NCAA statistics, the Wildcats rank second in the country in fewest turnovers per game with an average of just 12.1. The national leader in the category is Marist, which averages 11.8 turnovers per contest. Villanova has ranked near the top of the national statistics in fewest turnovers per game five times in the last six years.

CHARTING JACKIE: Entering play versus Providence on Feb. 26, senior forward **Jackie Adamshick** ranks seventh on Villanova's all-time scoring list with 1,357 points. In the season opener at Delaware, she became the 19th player in program history to score 1,000 career points. Adamshick reached the milestone with a free throw at the 9:58 mark of the first half with her eighth point.

ACADEMICALLY SPEAKING: Senior **Jackie Adamshick** has been named to the *ESPN The Magazine* first team Academic All-District II Team. By earning first team All-District honors, Adamshick will appear on the national ballot for Academic All-American distinction. Adamshick earned a finance degree last May and is currently enrolled in Villanova's MBA program.

TEAM LEADER: Senior **Jackie Adamshick** currently leads Villanova in six different categories. The Allentown, Pa., native is her team's leader in scoring (13.0 ppg.), rebounding (8.0 rpg.), minutes played (34.0 mpg.), assists (73), field goals attempted (377) and free throws attempted (73).

HITTING THE BOOKS: Of the 24 varsity sports at Villanova University, the Villanova women's basketball team finished with the highest grade point average of any Wildcat team with an impressive 3.447 gpa. 14 of the 15 players on the roster posted a 3.00 grade point average or better during the fall semester. This past summer, Villanova ranked 22nd among all Division I women's basketball schools for the 2005-06 season with a 3.300 team grade point average.

EXPERIENCING THE REAL WORLD: The second semester will be a busy one for junior forward **Stacie Witman**. In addition to her basketball schedule, Witman will also be fulfilling her student teaching requirement this semester. Witman, who will be teaching high school math at nearby Archbishop Carroll High School, began her student teaching on Tuesday, Jan. 16. Since returning to action on Dec. 28 versus Loyola (Md.) after missing 10 games due to a stress fracture in her lower left fibula, Witman has scored in double figures in 12 of the 17 games, including four games of 20+ points, and is averaging 12.6 points per contest.

PLAYING TOGETHER: One of the trademarks of a Harry Perretta coached team is the concept of playing team basketball. Judging by the stats, this year's team is no different than Perretta's other Villanova squads when it comes to playing team basketball. After 28 games, Villanova has had an assist on 64.1 percent of its field goals (360 of 561). Villanova currently has eight players with 20 or more assists led by senior forward **Jackie Adamshick** who has a team-best 73.

YOUTHFUL GROUP: Of the nine players who make up Villanova's rotation, seven are freshmen and sophomores. The only senior in the rotation is forward **Jackie Adamshick** who leads the team in minutes played (34.0 mpg.), scoring (13.0 ppg.) and rebounding (8.0 rpg.). Four of the nine players made their collegiate debut this season, including redshirt freshmen **Kyle Dougherty**, **Maria Getty** and **Tia Grant** and true freshman **Heather Scanlon**.

WEARING RED: Two members of the Villanova freshmen class will redshirt the 2006-07 season. **Shannon Elliott**, a 6-2 forward/center from Wilmington, Del., and **Amanda Swiezynski**, a 6-0 forward from Exeter, N.H., will have four years of eligibility beginning in 2007-08. Villanova also has a transfer sitting out the season. **Laura Kurz**, a 6-2 forward from Lower Gwynedd, Pa., transferred to Villanova from Duke University. Kurz will sit out this season and have two years of eligibility remaining.

PHILLY'S FINEST: Now in his 29th season as the head coach of the Wildcats, Harry Perretta has amassed 535 victories and a career .635 winning percentage. He is the winningest head coach in the history of Philadelphia Big Five basketball for both men and women. Perretta ranks ahead of former Temple men's basketball coach John Chaney (516 wins), former Villanova men's mentor Al Severance (417), former Temple men's coach Harry Litwack (373) and former Villanova men's coach Rollie Massimino (357).

Note: The win totals only represent victories at a Big Five school.

A RUN OF SUCCESS: The Wildcats have had one of the most successful stretches in program history over the past six seasons. From 2000-06, Villanova averaged 22.1 wins per season and tallied a record of 136-59 (.697). The highlight of the six seasons came in 2002-03 when the team went 28-6, captured the Big East championship and advanced to the NCAA Elite 8 for the first time ever. The Wildcats have played in the postseason each year during the six-year stretch, including four trips to the NCAA Tournament and two appearances in the WNIT.
